### The Lead

The Fairfield University men's lacrosse team hits the road for the first time in 2016, traveling to Piscataway, N.J. to challenge Rutgers. Faceoff at High Point Solutions Stadium is slated for 3 p.m.

### Fairfield's Last Time Out

Tyler Behring made a career-high 23 saves in goal, but the Stags were upended by visiting Bucknell by a 13-8 count on Saturday, Feb. 20. TJ Neubauer led the offense with three goals and an assist.

In addition to Neubauer's hat trick, the Stags benefitted from two Joe Rodrigues goals as well as markers from Charlie Schnider, Colin Burke and the first career tally from Nico Panepinto. Burke, who is the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week, also handed out two assists.

Behring's 23-save performance marked the best in the nation since Detroit's Jason Weber turned away 28 offerings from Mercer on March 4, 2015. It was also the most saves by a CAA netminder since Austin Kaut made 25 stops for Penn State against Massachusetts on March 19, 2011.

In front of Behring, Matt Borda led the defensive effort with three ground balls and two caused turnovers. Logan Williamson also collected three ground balls.

To go along with his four-point day, Neubauer had a team-best four ground balls as Fairfield nabbed 17 to Bucknell's 36. The Bison were bolstered in that department by a 19-6 advantage at the faceoff 'X'.

Bucknell was guided on the offensive end by three goals and two assists from Sean Doyle. Will Sands added a goal and two helpers, and Tommy O'Connor netted a pair for the unbeaten Bison.

## Head Coach Andy Copelan

**Eighth Season • Bucknell '03**  
**2015 CAA Coach of the Year**

The 2016 season is Andy Copelan's eighth at the helm of the Fairfield University men's lacrosse team. He has posted a 64-43 (.598) record with the Stags and owns a nine-year NCAA Division I head coaching record of 82-58 (.586).

Copelan was named the program's third head coach in varsity history on August 25, 2008 and has returned the Stags to the national conversation. Fairfield ranked as high as 18th in the polls last spring, having entered the national ledger in each of the last four seasons and six of Copelan's first seven years on the sidelines.

Copelan led the Stags into a new era in 2015, as Fairfield joined the nationally-prominent Colonial Athletic Association. The Stags made an immediate impact on the CAA, winning the regular season title and hosting the 2015 CAA Championship on newly-constructed Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium. Copelan was tabbed as the CAA Coach of the Year for his efforts, leading Fairfield to a 9-6 record and producing 11 All-CAA honorees, including Rookie of the Year Will Fox '18.

2015's group of 10 graduating seniors was the winningest four-year class in Fairfield history, compiling 41 total wins and a .661 winning percentage - both program records for a four-year class during the varsity era (1993-present).

Following this past season, TJ Neubauer '16 was drafted into the professional ranks as the 34th overall pick in the MLL Collegiate Draft by the Rochester Rattlers. The midfielder was the second-highest draft choice in Fairfield history and represents the ninth Stag to have played for Copelan to join the MLL as a draftee or signee.

Fairfield made four consecutive ECAC postseason appearances from 2011-14, including three trips to the ECAC Championship Game. Along the way, the program has earned several landmark victories. Copelan's 2013 club recorded the Stags' first-ever victory over the nation's top-ranked team with an overtime triumph at No. 1 Denver, and the 2010 Fairfield team topped a Notre Dame club that went on to reach the NCAA National Championship Game. All told, the Stags have bested at least one ranked opponent in each of Copelan's seven seasons at Fairfield.

Copelan has seen his student-athletes excel in the classroom as well. During his stay at the helm, every student-athlete that has completed his eligibility has also earned a degree from Fairfield. The Stags had 39 student-athletes earn All-ECAC Academic Team honors under Copelan's tutelage, including a program-high 10 honorees in 2014. In 2015, Drew Federico '15 was named to the CAA All-Academic Team, with Max Buchanan '15 and Tristan Sperry '15 collecting USILA Scholar All-America distinctions.

Signs of the Stags' return to national prominence were immediate when Copelan took the reins for the 2009 season. His first team went 7-6 overall to earn the program's first winning record since 2005 and a winning mark (4-3) in the ECAC Lacrosse League for the first time since joining the league in 2006. Fairfield has continued its upward trend under Copelan; the Stags have never closed the year with a sub-.500 record overall or in conference play during his tenure.

Fairfield is the second head coaching stop on Copelan's resume, who was the youngest head coach in the nation when he was hired to lead Marist College in 2004. In his first season with the Red Foxes, he was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Coach of the Year following a MAAC Regular Season Championship and the program's first winning season in six years. In 2005, he led Marist to its first-ever NCAA postseason berth.

His two-year run with the Red Foxes produced nine All-MAAC honorees, including 2004 Offensive Player and Rookie of the Year Keith Detelj and 2005 Rookie of the Year Dan Needle.

After his stint at Marist, Copelan held an assistant coaching position at the University of Maryland from 2006-08, rising to the offensive coordinator position for his last campaign with the Terps. Maryland reached the NCAA Tournament in each of Copelan's three seasons, highlighted by a trip to the 2006 Final Four. Copelan also served as the recruiting coordinator for Maryland in his final two seasons, with great success. Inside Lacrosse ranked the Terps' 2007 incoming class as the second best in the nation, and the 2008 class was dubbed as a third-best in the country. Individually, Copelan helped the Terps to secure six of 2008's top-50 high school recruits.

## KEEPING UP WITH THE COMPETITION

## Scouting Rutgers

After posting a 5-10 record last spring, Rutgers has had a strong start to the 2016 campaign with wins over St. John's (19-11) and Army West Point (13-11). The Scarlet Knights' 2-0 record has them unranked but receiving votes in both the USILA Coaches' and Cascade/Maverik Media Polls.

Adam Charalambides has already netted an NCAA-leading 10 goals for Rutgers – he had six goals and an assist against St. John's and found the back of the cage four times against Army West Point. Charalambides shares the team high of 11 points with 2015 First Team All-Big Ten pick Scott Bieda, who has accumulated six goals and five assists this season.

2015 All-Big Ten Honorable Mention Zack Sikora has returned to the Rutgers midfield, totaling two goals and nine ground balls thus far in his senior season.

Max Edelmann has played all 120 minutes in goal for the Scarlet Knights. He ceded 11 goals in each prior contest and has made 20 saves to tally a .476 save percentage.

The lone All-Big Ten performer lost to graduation for Rutgers was 2015 Specialist of the Year Joe Nardella, who ranked second in the nation with a .670 win percentage at the faceoff 'X'.

## Stags vs. Scarlet Knights

Fairfield and Rutgers renew their all-time series for the first time since 2009. The Stags went 4-0 against the Scarlet Knights when the teams clashed annually as ECAC Lacrosse League foes from 2006-09. Rutgers' lone win against Fairfield was a 7-6 triple-overtime decision in 2004 – the first meeting between the clubs.

## Stiff Competition

The Stags' first three opponents of 2016 (Richmond, Bucknell, Rutgers) are a combined 8-0 entering Saturday's slate of games. Bucknell is ranked No. 20 in the two most prominent national polls, with Rutgers unranked but receiving votes on both ledgers and Richmond unranked but under consideration in the Cascade/Maverik Media Poll.

Per the current national rankings, this run is just one of several difficult three-game stretches for the Stags. From March 5-12, Fairfield will challenge No. 19/RV Stony Brook, No. 17/17 Georgetown and No. 7/7 Yale.

## Fairfield vs. Ranked Opponents

Fairfield has defeated at least one ranked opponent (in the USILA Coaches' Poll) in each of Andy Copelan's seven prior seasons at the helm - including a win at then-No. 1 Denver during the 2013 season.

Based upon the Feb. 22 rankings, the Stags will have five more chances during the regular season to extend this streak. The upcoming schedule includes meetings with No. 7 Yale, No. 12 Hofstra, No. 13 Towson, No. 17 Georgetown and No. 19 Stony Brook.

## Behring Down

Tyler Behring's career-high 23 saves against Bucknell last Saturday marked the top single-game total in the nation this season. The last Fairfield goalkeeper to accumulate 23 or more saves was Sam Peterson '97 – the Stags' all-time leader in saves – who did so on many occasions en route to an NCAA record 19.58 saves per game in his Fairfield career (1,077 saves in 55 games). Behring is the first CAA goalkeeper with 23 saves since Austin Kaut made 25 stops for Penn State against Massachusetts on March 19, 2011.

In the young 2016 campaign, Behring's 19.00 saves per game lead the nation and his .633 save percentage ranks eighth.

A 2015 Second Team All-CAA honoree, Behring registered a 6.32 goals-against average and a .624 save percentage in 503:22 between the posts last season; his numbers in both categories would have led all of Division I if he had logged enough minutes to qualify.

## Five for Five

Charlie Schnider began his senior season with a five-point outing. The co-captain of the Stags netted a hat trick and dished out two assists in Fairfield's 11-10 loss to Richmond on Feb. 15.

He added a goal and an assist against Bucknell this past Saturday to boost his season total to seven points.

## An Immediate Impact

Colin Burke racked up four points in his collegiate debut - scoring three goals and handing out an assist in the Stags' season opener against Richmond. He was lauded for his efforts as the inaugural CAA Rookie of the Week for the 2016 season. Burke added a goal and two assists last Saturday against Bucknell.

## Mr. Consistent

With his hat trick against Bucknell last Saturday, TJ Neubauer extended his goal- and point-scoring streak to 15 games dating back to the Stags' win over Manhattan on Feb. 21, 2015. There are only seven active goal-scoring streaks in Division I longer than Neubauer's 15-game stretch. His three goals against the Bison ran his career total to 82 markers, ranking ninth all-time in program history.

A First Team All-CAA selection last spring, Neubauer was tabbed as a Preseason All-America Honorable Mention, Preseason All-CAA and Preseason All-NEILA before the start of his senior campaign. He was also a fourth-round selection of the Rochester Rattlers in January's MLL Collegiate Draft.

## Becoming a 'Regular' Occurrence

The 2015 CAA regular season championship was the Stags' second consecutive regular season title. Fairfield won the 2014 ECAC Lacrosse League regular season crown in the league's final year of existence.

## Overtime Odds & Ends

Fairfield's double-overtime win against Delaware last April marked the Stags' return to their winning ways when a game exceeds 60 minutes of action; the March 2015 loss at No. 6 Yale ended a six-game winning streak for Fairfield in overtime contests. The Stags are 8-3 in overtime games under Head Coach Andy Copelan.

# Game 1: Fairfield vs. Richmond

## Stags Edged by Richmond, 11-10, in 2016 Opener

Schnider and Burke each net hat tricks on Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium

**FAIRFIELD, Conn.** – The Fairfield University men's lacrosse team opened its 2016 campaign with an 11-10 loss to visiting Richmond on Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium. The contest was a matchup between the defending regular season champions of their respective conferences – the Stags of the CAA and the Spiders of the SoCon.

"Honestly, all that today's loss means is that we're not going undefeated this year," said Head Coach Andy Copelan. "It's never how you start a season, it's how you finish."

Copelan's Stags were edged by Holy Cross, 10-9, to open the 2015 season and went on to win the CAA regular season crown. Dating back to the 2014 campaign, Fairfield's last eight losses have been decided by one goal.

In today's action, Charlie Schnider led the Stags (0-1) on the offensive end with three goals and two assists. Colin Burke also recorded a hat trick and picked up an assist in his collegiate debut. Jake Knostman, Joe Rodrigues, TJ Neubauer and Conor Dalton added goals for the hosts, and Drew Murray joined the scoring column with an assist.

Tyler Behring made 15 saves in goal for the Stags.

After Fairfield grabbed a 2-1 lead on goals from Schnider and Burke (man-up), Richmond put together the stretch that ultimately decided the game. The Spiders ran off the next five goals, keeping the Stags off the board for a span of 17:28 to build a 6-2 advantage. Dalton converted a man-up chance in the final minute to send the Stags into the locker room with momentum, though trailing Richmond by a 6-3 count.

The Spiders controlled the action in the first half, winning 9-of-11 faceoffs. That mark, guided by Peter Moran at the 'X', also propelled that hosts to a 17-4 advantage in ground balls.

The Stags improved in both categories after the intermission, corralling 14 ground balls to Richmond's 11 in the second half and nearly splitting the draws – Richmond won seven with the Stags coming away with five.

"There's no quit in that locker room. The guys came out in the second half and fought tooth and nail," said Copelan, the reigning CAA Coach of the Year. "We won the ground ball battle in the second half, which obviously was one of our shortcomings in the first half."

The Stags' offense also found its stride in the second half, with Neubauer, Schnider and Burke each netting a third-period goal. However, the Spiders answered each marker with one of their own within the next two minutes. The parity was enough to keep Richmond in front, 9-6, entering the final 15 minutes of play.

Schnider completed his hat trick with a man-up goal – assisted by Burke – to start the scoring in the fourth quarter. Burke rounded out his hat trick with 9:48 to go, pulling Fairfield to within one goal at 9-8. Richmond would tack one on at 7:42, but this time Rodrigues had the answer with a mark just 17 seconds later.

The Spiders' final tally was insurance goal that proved to be the difference. Mitch Goldberg buried his fifth goal of the day at 6:08 to extend the margin to 11-9. Knostman provided the answer for Fairfield at 4:59, but neither team would score again as the 11-10 tally held up as a final.

Goldberg led the Richmond offense with five goals and an assist. Benny Pugh went the distance between the posts and made six saves.

The Stags continue their home slate this Saturday, Feb. 20 for a visit from Bucknell. Faceoff on Conway Field is slated for noon. The Bison are 2-0 on the young season with a 13-5 home win over Delaware last Saturday, Feb. 6 and an 11-10 victory over Bryant on Sunday, Feb. 14 in a contest played indoors in Taunton, Mass. due to inclement weather.

"We've got the pieces right now, but we're still trying to put things together," Copelan added. "But I believe in that group of guys. I wish we could be 1-0, but we'll move on."

## Bucknell Stops Stags, 13-8

Tyler Behring makes a career-high 23 saves for Fairfield

**FAIRFIELD, Conn.** – Tyler Behring made a career-high 23 saves in goal for the Fairfield University men's lacrosse team, but the Stags were upended by visiting Bucknell by a 13-8 count on Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium. TJ Neubauer led the offense with three goals and an assist.

"There's certainly things to work on which made today an uphill climb," said Head Coach Andy Copelan. "But, with all that said, we had a one-goal lead at halftime and we just weren't able to close. We just have to continue to get better."

In addition to Neubauer's hat trick, the Stags benefitted from two Joe Rodrigues goals as well as markers from Charlie Schnider, Colin Burke and the first career tally from Nico Panepinto. Burke, who is the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week, also handed out two assists.

Behring's 23-save performance marked the best in the nation since Detroit's Jason Weber turned away 28 offerings from Mercer on March 4, 2015. It was also the most saves by a CAA netminder since Austin Kaut made 25 stops for Penn State against Massachusetts on March 19, 2011.

A Second Team All-CAA honoree last season, Behring also picked up one ground ball and recorded a caused turnover. He made 15 saves in Monday's meeting with Richmond.

"We believe in Tyler. He's dependable and we know what we're going to get from him," said Copelan of his junior goalkeeper.

In front of Behring, Matt Borda led the defensive effort with three ground balls and two caused turnovers. Logan Williamson also collected three ground balls.

In addition to his four-point day, Neubauer had a team-best four ground balls as Fairfield nabbed 17 to Bucknell's 36. The Bison were bolstered in that department by a 19-6 advantage at the faceoff 'X'.

Bucknell was guided on the offensive end by three goals and two assists from Sean Doyle. Will Sands and a goal and two helpers, and Tommy O'Connor netted a pair for the unbeaten Bison. Christian Klipstein protected the Bucknell cage and came away with six saves.

The Stags will now hit the road for the first time in 2016 with a trek to Rutgers next Saturday, Feb. 27 for a 3 p.m. faceoff. The Scarlet Knights are 2-0 this spring after wins over St. John's and Army West Point.

Fairfield will then have a short turnaround as action returns to Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium on Tuesday, March 1 for a visit from Massachusetts-Lowell.
