Last Time Out

Host Drexel broke open a 9-6 game at the intermission with 12 second-half goals to pull away from the Stags in a 21-9 decision last Saturday in Philadelphia. **Dylan Beckwith** led the way with three goals and three assists.

Patrick Drake also netted a hat trick for Fairfield for the third time in his rookie campaign. **Jack Brennan**, **Matt Sharpe** and **Taylor Strough** each added one goal for the Stags. Rounding out the scoring were **Brendan Quinn** and **Brian Reda** with one assist apiece.

On the other end of the field, **Sean McKee** made a career-high 15 saves in his first start of the season in the cage. The squad in front of him was led by **George Elmquist**, **Andrew Murrow**, **Sean Sweeney** and LSM **Jake Tymon** with one caused turnover apiece.

The effort on the draw was led by **Liam Lynch** with four faceoff wins. **Will Kirshner** came away with two restarts and **Bill McMenamin** won one.

2015 CAA Coach of the Year

The 2019 season is Andy Copelan's 11th at the helm of the Fairfield University men's lacrosse team. He has posted an 87-76 (.534) record with the Stags and owns an 13-year NCAA Division I head coaching record of 105-91 (.537).

Copelan was named the program's third head coach in varsity history on August 25, 2008 and has returned the Stags to the national conversation. Fairfield has entered the USILA national rankings in seven of Copelan's completed 10 years on the sidelines and defeated a nationally-ranked foe in eight of his 10 prior campaigns with the Stags.

Copelan led the Stags into a new era beginning in 2015, as Fairfield joined the nationally-prominent Colonial Athletic Association. The Stags made an immediate impact on the CAA, winning back-to-back regular season titles. Fairfield hosted the 2015 CAA Championship on newly-constructed Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium. In 2016, the Stags advanced to the CAA Championship Game.

Copelan was tabbed as the CAA Coach of the Year in 2015. In four seasons with the Association, the Stags have collected 22 All-CAA honors, highlighted by 2015 Rookie of the Year recognition for Will Fox '18 and 2016 Rookie and co-Player of the Year nods for Colin Burke '19.

Fairfield student-athletes also continue to gain the national and regional spotlight. Burke and TJ Neubauer '16 were USILA All-America Honorable Mentions in 2016 with Neubauer also garnering All-New England First Team distinction for the third straight season.

Neubauer was also drafted by the Rochester Rattlers in the fourth round of the Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft. Neubauer was the highest-drafted Stag since Greg Downing '07 was tabbed as the sixth overall pick and only First Round selection in program history in 2007. Neubauer was the 10th Stag during Copelan's tenure to be drafted or signed as a free agent into the MLL ranks.

The 2014 edition of the club boasted a final record of 12-4, tying the program's single-season wins mark. The campaign began with a record-setting 7-0 start and included the team's first-ever ECAC Lacrosse League Regular Season Championship and a trip to ECAC Championship Game.

Fairfield made four consecutive ECAC postseason appearances from 2011-14, including three trips to the ECAC Championship Game. Along the way, the program earned several landmark victories. Copelan's 2013 club recorded the Stags' first-ever victory over the nation's top-ranked team with an overtime triumph at No. 1 Denver, and the 2010 Fairfield team topped a Notre Dame club that went on to reach the NCAA National Championship Game.

Copelan has seen his student-athletes excel in the classroom as well. During his stay at the helm, every student-athlete that has completed his eligibility has also earned a degree from Fairfield. The Stags have won the CAA Team Excellence Award in each of the last two seasons, recognizing their academic performance as the CAA team with the highest GPA. Individually, Will Fox was recognized in 2018 as a USILA Scholar All-American and a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award.

Signs of the Stags' return to national prominence were immediate when Copelan took the reins for the 2009 season. His first team went 7-6 overall to earn the program's first winning record since 2005 and a winning mark (4-3) in the ECAC Lacrosse League for the first time since joining the league in 2006.

Fairfield is the second head coaching stop on Copelan's resume, who was the youngest head coach in the nation when he was hired to lead Marist College in 2004. In his first season with the Red Foxes, he was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Coach of the Year following a MAAC Regular Season Championship and the program's first winning season in six years. In 2005, he led Marist to its first-ever NCAA postseason berth.

His two-year run with the Red Foxes produced nine All-MAAC honorees, including 2004 Offensive Player and Rookie of the Year Keith Detelj and 2005 Rookie of the Year Dan Needle.

After his stint at Marist, Copelan held an assistant coaching position at the University of Maryland from 2006-08, rising to the offensive coordinator position for his last campaign with the Terps. Maryland reached the NCAA Tournament in each of Copelan's three seasons, highlighted by a trip to the 2006 Final Four.

Copelan also served as the recruiting coordinator for Maryland in his final two seasons, with great success. Inside Lacrosse ranked the Terps' 2007 incoming class as the second best in the nation, and the 2008 class was dubbed as a third-best in the country. Individually, Copelan helped the Terps to secure six of 2008's top 50 high school recruits.

As a student-athlete, Copelan was a four-year varsity letterwinner at Bucknell University. He earned All-Patriot League accolades for his performance on the field in 2003 and was named to the league's Academic Honor Roll in each of his seasons with the Bison.

The Matchup: Fairfield vs. UMass

Scouting UMass

The University of Massachusetts Minutemen rose to #15 in the nation in both major national polls after a 14-10 triumph over #9/11 Towson this past Saturday. The reigning CAA Champions are currently 8-4 with a 2-1 conference mark. Three of the Minutemen's four losses have come in overtime, including their lone CAA setback two weeks ago at Hofstra and a March 2 loss to the defending National Champions, then-#4 Yale, in New Haven.

UMass is the CAA's second-highest scoring offense and ranks 19th in the nation with 12.58 goals per game. Individually, Chris Connolly is the club's top scorer with 46 points and has dished out 26 assists for a CAA-best 2.64 helpers per game, which ranks ninth nationally. Rookie attackman Gabriel Procyk is the Minutemen's top goal scorer with 27, and Jeff Trainor adds 28 total points with 16 goals and 12 assists.

Tom Meyers handles faceoff duties for UMass to the tune of a .617 winning percentage and 8.08 ground balls. Meyers ranks second in the CAA on the dot only behind Towson standout Alex Woodall.

Reigning CAA Player of the Year Isaac Paparo helms the nation's stingiest defense, allowing just 8.42 goals per game. Paparo leads the CAA with 26 caused turnovers and leads non-faceoff men with 56 ground balls. Goalkeeper Sean Sconone is one of the nation's best, leading Division I with a .618 save percentage and 8.09 goals-against average. He is also second in the CAA and 15th nationally with 12.67 saves per game.

All-Time Series (UMass leads 10-4)

UMass has won the last two meetings in the all-time series to take a 10-4 advantage. The teams are 2-2 in the CAA regular season, and also competed as conference foes from 2006-09 in the ECAC Lacrosse League. The Stags and Minutemen have met twice in the postseason - the 2015 CAA Semifinals and the 2002 NCAA Championship First Round.

The Century Club

Already the 17th member of Fairfield's 100 Point Club, Dylan Beckwith netted three goals with three assists last Saturday at Drexel to run his career total to 110 points.

Beckwith is currently eighth all-time in assists with 56 and, with 54 goals to his credit, he is the ninth player in program history with 50+ career goals and 50+ career assists.

This spring, Beckwith leads the Stags with 55 points. His point total and his current mark of 28 assists both rank eighth on Fairfield's single-season charts. His current pace of 4.58 points per game leads the CAA and slots him 16th nationally. If maintained throughout the 2019 season, it would be the second-best single-season scoring average in Fairfield history.

Causing Trouble

In the March 23 loss to Villanova, **George Elmquist** wrought havoc on the Wildcats' offense with five caused turnovers to tie the Fairfield program record. He matched the feat on April 6, pressuring visiting Towson into five turnovers.

Elmquist is the third different Stag to cause five turnovers in a game, joining Matt Scanlon – who also did it twice – and Matt Petre. His 21 caused turnovers this season rank fifth on Fairfield's single-season charts.

Caused turnovers have only been tracked officially by the NCAA since 2010, though Fairfield's internal records date back to the 2004 campaign.

First Timers

Ten Stags have scored their first career goal during the 2019 season: rookies **Kyle Borda, Brian Crawley, Patrick Drake, Brendan Dreyer, Cooper Mazurczak, Brian Reda** and **Tyler Wuchte** along with upperclassmen **Adam Aronowitz, Cole Barnard** and **Brian Cosgrove**.

In addition, **James Corasaniti** and **Trevor Ford** have notched their first career points with one assist apiece.

Mind the Gap

The 18-5 win at the New Jersey Institute of Technology on March 19 marked the Stags' largest margin of victory since Fairfield raced past Manhattan by a decisive 18-4 count on Feb. 22, 2014.

Not Settled in Sixty

Fairfield's back-to-back overtime wins over Bryant and Utah were the 25th and 26th overtime contests in the Stags' varsity history. Fairfield is 15-11 all-time when a game goes beyond 60 minutes and 10-5 in overtime under Head Coach **Andy Copelan**.

Prior to this season, the Stags last played back-to-back overtime games in 2012, when three consecutive outings went into an extra session. During that span, Fairfield defeated Bryant, 9-8, in double overtime on Feb. 25, then knocked off Hofstra, 10-9, in triple overtime on Feb. 28 and ended the stretch with a 10-9 overtime win at UMBC on March 3.

It Ain't Over...

The Stags have trailed in the fourth quarter in three of their five wins in 2019. Fairfield erased multiple-goal deficits in the final frame en route to victories over Sacred Heart and Utah, and overcame a one-goal margin to down host Bryant. The 12-8 setback against Villanova is Fairfield's only loss this spring after being tied during the fourth quarter.

In the comeback at Bryant, **Taylor Strough** netted the equalizer with only nine seconds to go. The victory marked the latest in regulation that the Stags trailed in an eventual win since Feb. 21, 2004 at Providence with Garrett Bamann scoring the equalizer with six seconds left.

Built Ford Tough

Travis Ford scored a career-high five goals in the March 5 win over Siena. After missing the Stags' opener against Saint Joseph's, Ford has scored a goal in all 10 of his 11 appearances this season, including seven multi-goal and nine multi-point outings.

'X' Marks the Spot

In the win at Sacred Heart on Feb. 23, **Frankie Labetti** went 21-for-26 at the faceoff X to tie the Fairfield single-game wins record established by Peter Vlahakis '04. Labetti also set a new Fairfield record with 15 ground balls against the Pioneers, passing the mark of 14 set by Vlahakis in 2002 and matched by Will Fox '18 last season.

With 73 ground balls this spring, Labetti has moved up to ninth on Fairfield's single-season list. In addition, Labetti's three goals in 2019 tie the record for goals by a "FOGO" established by Vlahakis in 2001.

One Game Isn't Everything

After beginning 2019 with a loss to Saint Joseph's, the Stags are 15-12 in season openers all-time and 5-6 in their 11 campaigns led by **Head Coach Andy Copelan**. However, the first game of the spring has not always been an indicator of the season that lies ahead for the Stags. Out of Fairfield's 13 seasons to conclude with a record above .500, the Stags have started seven of them at 1-0 and six of them at 0-1.

Family Traditions

In addition to brothers and current teammates **Travis and Trevor Ford**, the 2019 roster also boasts the younger brothers of several former Fairfield Lacrosse players. **Kyle Borda's** brother **Matt Borda** was a defenseman for the Stags from 2014-17, and **Sam Murphy's** older brother **Jack Murphy** appeared in the cage for Fairfield from 2012-14.

Furthermore, **Brendan Quinn** (Maevae) and **Brian Reda** (Meghan) both have older sisters who were a part of the 2015 MAAC Championship for Fairfield Women's Lacrosse.

Coach Cope Hits the Century Mark

The April 6, 2018 win at Hofstra was the 100th career victory as a head coach for **Andy Copelan**. Now up to 105 career victories, Copelan is one of 29 active Division I head coaches with 100 or more wins.

Copelan ranks second all-time in Fairfield varsity history with 87 wins leading the Stags. He is six wins shy of matching Ted Spencer's mark of 93 wins earned in his 13-year tenure from 1996-2008. Copelan's .534 win percentage (87-76) is the best in program history.

Up Next

The CAA regular season concludes next Friday, April 26, when Hofstra visits Conway Field at Rafferty Stadium for Senior Night. Festivities will begin at approximately 6:45 p.m. prior to a 7 p.m. opening faceoff with the Pride.
