Team Information
A&T: North Carolina A&T is nationally ranked and they are the No. 1 team in all three major black college polls. The Aggies are coming off the most points they've scored in conference play (65) since scoring 76 against Howard in 2001.
Florida A&M: Florida A&M had last week off after defeating Delaware State for its first win of the season. The Rattlers have played well at home, losing to N.C. Central by three before beating Del State.
A&T Coach Rod Broadway: Broadway (UNC '77) is in his fifth season at A&T and holds a 34-18 (.654) record. Broadway also spent four seasons apiece at N.C. Central and Grambling, and has an overall record of 102-41 (.713). He is the 26th active FCS coach with 100 career wins.
FAMU Alex Wood : Alex Wood is in his first season as the Rattlers coach. Before coming to FAMU, Wood served as the interim head coach at the University of Buffalo in 2014. He was Buffalo's offensive coordinator the previous three seasons. As the head coach of James Madison he led the Dukies to the NCAA playoffs in 1995.

AGGIES SEEK A FIRST AGAINST FAMU IN TALLAHASSEE

- ▶ North Carolina A&T enters its 92nd season of football.
- ▶ The Aggies just won the school's 12th conference title and the seventh since joining the MEAC in 1971.
- ▶ The Aggies are coming off their most lopsided win in the conference since beating S.C. State 66-14 in Charlotte on Nov. 18, 2000. It was the most points scored in a conference game under the Rod Broadway era.
- ▶ The Aggies now travel to place where they have not had much success. The Aggies are just 6-20-1 in the city of Tallahassee. The Aggies were fortunate on their last trip to FAMU in 2013. A missed extra point in regulation sent the game into overtime where Tarik Cohen scored to lead A&T to a 20-13 win.
- ▶ In the history of the series, N.C. A&T has never won two straight games in Tallahassee. In fact the Aggies have won in Tallahassee just three times since 1994. The Aggies are 7-3 in their last 10 road games.
- ▶ The Aggies were 4-1 on the road last season. If they win Saturday, they will clinch another winning season on the road. N.C. A&T has not had back-to-back winning seasons on the road since the 1992, 93 seasons.
- ▶ There are some Aggie players who are closing in on some milestones. Sophomore punt returner Khris Gardin has 488 punt return yards on the season. That puts him 42 yards shy of breaking Curtis Deloatch's single-season school record of 530 punt return yards set in 2001.
- ▶ Junior wide receiver Denzel Keyes is tied for the conference lead in touchdown receptions with seven. He is four TD receptions shy of breaking the single-season record held by Craig Thompson. His 14 career TD receptions puts him six behind Thompson's career record of 19.
- ▶ Tarik Cohen is now only 251 yards shy of breaking Mike Mayhew's school rushing record set a year before he came to N.C. A&T in 2013. Cohen has 3,271 career yards and 34 total touchdowns, which puts him eight TD's shy of the school record.

N.C. A&T AGGIE PRIDE FOOTBALL ACHIEVEMENTS

- ▶ The Aggies are 480-418-45 as they enter their 92nd season.
- ▶ The Aggies have 131 wins in their 44-year history in the MEAC. The third most among teams who have played in the MEAC.
- ▶ A&T has won 12 conference championships (5 CIAA, 7 MEAC). The Aggies seven MEAC championships is tied for third all-time amongst MEAC schools with on Florida A&M (8) and S.C. State (14) having more. The Aggies are tied with Bethune-Cookman.
- ▶ The Aggies have made tremendous strides in their academic progress rate over the past five years. They have gone from a multiyear score of 829 in 2008-09 to a 934 in 2013-14. The football team's single-year score was 958 in 2013-14.
- ▶ The Aggies had 34 MEAC All-Academic team members in 2014.
- ▶ One hundred thirty-five men have been named to the All-MEAC first team. It ranks second among MEAC teams in the history of the conference.
- ▶ An Aggie has been named MEAC offensive player of the year nine times, defensive player of the year seven times, coach of the year five times and rookie of the year twice.
- ▶ A&T traditionally ranks among the top-15 schools in FCS in attendance. The Aggies homecoming amongst the biggest in FCS, selling out routinely at the Aggies home facility Aggie Stadium (21,500).
- ▶ The Aggies have one Pro Football Hall of Famer in Elvin Bethea who was inducted into the hall in 2003. Bethea played defensive lineman for the Houston Oilers.

N.C. A&T BY THE NUMBERS

4 — The number of two-sport stars the Aggies have on their football team including WR Denzel Keyes who has started games for the men's basketball and WR Caleb Gabriel who is the 100 meter champion in the MEAC.

5 — Tarik Cohen had three rushing touchdowns against Howard on Oct. 24. It marked the fifth time in his career he had three rushing TD's in a single game.

6 — Is the number of times punt returner Khris Gardin has returned a punt 40 yards or more this season.

8 — The Aggies are 7-1 against FCS opponents on the road in their last seven games with the only loss coming at N.C. Central last season.

14 — N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway

was 1-9 in his first 10 road games as Aggies coach. The Aggies are 10-4 since under Broadway in the last 14 road games including being 7-3 over the last 10.

17 — Tarik Cohen has this many 100-yard games in his career, which is a school record. He has three 200-yard games. He has gone over 100 in his last four games.

21 — The last time the Aggies gave up more than 21 points at home to a MEAC foe was a 42-24 win over Delaware St. on Oct. 15, 2011.

25 — A&T has forced at least one turnover in 25 straight games against FCS or Division II opponents. Only FBS school UNC did not turn the ball over against A&T in the last 26 games.

27 — Consecutive

starts for rover Landis Shoffner, who has the longest current streak on the team.

28 — It's the number the last three backs who have gone over 1,000 yards in a season have worn. Mike Ferguson, Mike Mayehw and Tarik Cohen all rank among the top rushers of all time at A&T.

32-1 — At N.C. A&T Rod Broadway is virtually unbeatable when leading at halftime. Under Broadway the Aggies are 29-2 when leading after three quarters. N.C. A&T's only loss when leading at halftime under Broadway came in 2011 to Norfolk State.

251 — Tarik Cohen needs that many yards to break Mike Mayhew's all-time rushing record at N.C. A&T. Cohen is just a junior.

UNIVERSITY NOTES

- North Carolina A&T receives its origins from being a land-grant institution in 1890. Today, the university is celebrating its 125-year anniversary as a land-grant institution. Over those 125 years, the university has become a university known for its innovation including its nanoengineering program.
- The slogan for the Aggies 125th is Our Future, Our Pride.
- A&T stands for Agricultural and Technical. It is considered an historically black college or university because of its heritage as being a school started for African Americans. Every school in the MEAC is considered an HBCU.
- Enrollment at N.C. A&T exceeds 11,000 students making it the largest historically black college or university in the nation. A&T has a retention rate of 79 percent or approximately 6,300 students. The Aggies welcomed more than 2,400 students during the fall of 2015.
- Academically, the university is best known for its College of Engineering program. The COE ranks No. 1 for the number of degrees awarded to African Americans. U.S. News and World Report ranks the COE in the top third of the Best Undergraduate Engineering Programs.
- The School of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences is the largest among the nation's HBCU's.
- If you are around an Aggie long enough you may hear the chant "Aggie Pride" shouted several times. The loud chant of Aggie Pride stems from the Aggies proud history in the civil rights movement with A&T Four, four young men who sparked the modern-day civil rights movement by staging a sit-in at the counter of the downtown Greensboro Woolworth's where they were refused service on Feb. 1, 1960.
- Aggies have also ran for president, flown in space shuttles and occupied positions of influence in corporations.
- Among the famous A&T alumni are civil rights activist Jesse Jackson, Challenger astronaut Ronald McNair and billionaire business woman Janice Bryant Howroyd.

TEAM NOTES

A&T IS UNANIMOUS NO. 1

- North Carolina A&T became unanimous No. 1 black college football team in the nation last week after its big win over Bethune-Cookman.
- The Aggies were ranked No. 1 in the Sheridan Broadcasting Network, the poll that determines the black college national champion. He was also No. 1 in the BOXTOROW poll and the Heritage Radio Sports Network. The Aggies have been among the Top-5 teams in at least one of those polls 15 straight weeks.
- The Aggies also entered the national polls last week. The Aggies entered the FCS STATS poll at No. 24. The Aggies were last ranked nationally in that poll the last week of last season before losing to N.C. Central.
- The Aggies also made its debut in the NCAA FCS Coaches poll at No. 24. It was the first time the Aggies were ranked in the coaches poll since the 2004 season when it was ran by USA Today and ESPN.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Running back Tarik Cohen has also earned several preseason honors. He was named third-team preseason All-American by STATS. Boxtorow also named him a preseason All-American and College Sporting News put him on their Fab 50 list. He was also named MEAC preseason offensive player of the year.
- Cohen was also placed on the STATS Walter Payton Watch List prior to the season for the best offensive player in FCS football. Dallas Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo, former New York Giants running Dave Meggett and former Tennessee Titan Steve McNair are amongst the former winners.
- The Aggies were picked to win the MEAC in 2015. The Aggies went eight straight seasons (2005-12) without being predicted to finish in the top 5 of the MEAC. A&T also had four players — RB Tarik Cohen, DL Marquis Ragland, PK Cody Jones and CB Tony McRae — named to the conference's preseason first team.

WINNING SEASONS

- North Carolina A&T clinched its fourth straight winning season with its win over Howard. The last senior class that had four straight winning seasons was the 2001 class.
- Before the 2012 season, the Aggies had gone through eight straight losing seasons, the longest string of losing seasons in school history. The Aggies streak of 10 straight winning seasons between 1955-64 is the longest in school history. N.C. A&T has 49 winning seasons. They are currently in season No. 92 in the history of Aggies football.

NORTH CAROLINA RECRUITING

- The Aggies have done really well in in-state recruiting. Sixty-nine of the 97 Aggies on the active roster are from North Carolina.
- Eight Aggies on the current roster played in the 2015 East-West All-Star game at Greensboro Grimsley High School's Jamieson Stadium. East-West game features the best high school players in North Carolina.
- Out of the 22 players that started on offense and defense last week versus Bethune-Cookman, only three of those players — free safety Zerius Lockhart, defensive end Malik Hampton-Prioleau and outside linebacker Marcus Albert — are from outside the state of North Carolina.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

- The Aggies coaching staff has more than 160 years of combined experience. Head coach Rod Broadway, offensive coordinator Chip Hester, defensive coordinator Sam Washington and defensive line coach Damon Frenchers all have more than 20 years of coaching experience.
- Broadway, outside linebacker coach Trei Oliver, offensive line coach Keith Wagner and running backs coach Shawn Gibbs have been coaching together for more than 10 years.
- The newest coach's to the Aggies staff are quarterback coach Chris Barnette, inside linebacker coach Thomas Howard who are in their first season as A&T coaches, but both men come to the program with previous experience.

HOME DOMINANCE

- The Aggies are on a six-game winning streak at home and have won nine straight games at home against MEAC opponents. The Aggies last home loss to a MEAC foe came against Delaware State on Oct. 19, 2013.
- The Aggies have outscored their last seven opponents at home 325-70. They have outscored their last seven MEAC opponents at home 274-77. The Aggies are 16-2 at home against conference foes under head coach Rod Broadway.
- A&T was just 5-21 at home over the five years prior to Broadway's arrival.

A&T AVOIDS THE FLAGS

- The Aggies are the least penalized team in the MEAC so far this season. The Aggies have had fewer penalties than each of their seven opponents this season. The Aggies have committed only 31 penalties this season. Twice this season, they have only had two penalties in a game.
- Nationally, the Aggies are ranked fourth in fewest penalties and they are fourth in fewest penalty yards (270). They are also eighth in fewest penalties per game (4.4) and ninth in fewest penalty yards per game (38.6). The Aggies committed seven penalties per game last season.

A&T ON OFFENSE

SCORING 60

- The Aggies finished off Howard 65-14 on Oct. 24. It marked the first time in school history the Aggies have scored 60 or more points in two separate games during the same season. The Aggies have scored 250 points this season. The school record is 420 points scored in 1993. The Aggies went over 40 points five times that season.

A&T SCORING

- N.C. A&T is outscoring its opponents 132-51 in the second half and 56-21 in the fourth quarter. N.C. A&T is also big in the second quarter, outscoring its opponents 87-35.
- In 12 games since being shutout by S.C. State in the Atlanta Football Classic in the Georgia Dome on Oct. 14, 2014, the Aggies are averaging 34.4 points per game.

STILL OPERATIONAL

- The Aggies offense is ranked 101st out of 123 FCS teams ranked nationally. The pass offense is ranked 113th.
- Despite those numbers, the Aggies have the No. 1 scoring offense in the MEAC. They are averaging 35.7 points per game, which is good enough for 19th in the nation.
- A&T is also helped by its rushing offense which is averaging 182 yards per game and have benefited from excellent field position. The Aggies average field position this season has been their own 40-yard line.
- In the last 25 games, the Aggies have rushed for more than 100 yards in 23 games. The Aggies had rushed for 100 yards in nine straight games before Hampton held the Aggies to 92 yards on Oct. 3.

THIRD DOWN WARRIORS

- There is another reason why the Aggies offense have been effective this season despite their ranking nationally.
- The Aggies have converted 46.3 percent of its third downs this season.
- The Aggies are ranked 18th in the nation and No. 1 in the MEAC in 3rd down conversion percentage.
- Out of the 50 third downs the Aggies have converted this season, 23 of them have come on 3rd-and-5 or longer. The Aggies are 23-for-66 (.348) on 3rd-and-long.
- The Aggies are an amazing 17-for-19 (.895) when the down and distance is either 3rd-and-1 or 3rd-and-2 this season. All of those conversions have come via the run.

QUICK & COHEN & ASSOCIATES

- RB Tarik Cohen and QB Kwashaun Quick accounted for 71 percent of the Aggies running game last season. They also accounted for 35 of the 45 N.C. A&T offensive touchdowns.
- Two-thousand fifteen has not been much different for the running duo. The duo is accounting for 81 percent of the Aggies rushing attack and they have accounted for 18 of the team's 27 offensive touchdowns including a touchdown pass from Cohen at Norfolk State.
- The two have carried the ball a combined 217 times out of the 313 times the Aggies

THE QB'S

SHARING TIME

- Kwashaun Quick was suspended for spring practice and the first game of the season for violating team rules. That left Lamar Raynard as the starter against Shaw where he played the vast majority of the snaps before the game got out of hand.
- Quick has started four times while Raynard has started three times. To date, Raynard has taken 257 snaps from center while Quick has taken 201 snaps. Broadway has indicated the two will share the position this season.

FRESHMEN STARTING SEASON OPENERS

- A freshman starting the season opener for the Aggies has not been an unusual occurrence. Redshirt freshman Lamar Raynard made the start in the season opener against Shaw. Raynard is 3-0 this season as the Aggies starter.

QUICK MILESTONES

- For his career, Quick had a superb game versus Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 17. In the game he rushed for 47 yards and threw for 63 on 8-for-9 passing. For his career he now has 2,000 yards passing and 1,000 yards rushing making him the first quarterback in school history to throw for 2,000 and rush for 1,000 yards.
- He ran for 85 yards against Howard on Oct. 24, marking the ninth time in his career he has rushed for more than 60 yards.
- Quick is 12-4 as the A&T starter. In 2013, he helped the Aggies top then Division I FCS power Appalachian State 24-21 in Boone. It was the first time in almost thirty years that an in-state school beat App State in Boone.

- He eventually earned an invitation to the campus of ESPN in Bristol, Conn. The ESPN producers asked Cohen to come out and be a part of the three-hour Saturday morning SportsCenter. Cohen was on for two segments. During the first segment he performed his backflip while catching the football feat three times flawlessly. He even caught the ball with one hand while doing the backflip. The second segment included a sit-down interview with the ESPN host Matt Barrie. Cohen's flips earned thousands of social media hits.

BEST TWO-YEAR AGGIE RUSHING PERFORMANCES

Tarik Cohen has rushed for 2,488 yards over the first two years of his career. No Aggies has ever rushed for this many yards combined as a freshman and sophomore. Cohen's two-year performance is second all-time in A&T history.

TARIK AGAINST THE CONFERENCE

- Cohen went up against Bethune-Cookman for the first time in his career and came away with 116 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. He has now played against every team in the conference and the result has been the same. Production.
- Cohen has played in 18 conference games and has rushed for 2,236 yards and 22 touchdowns on 355 carries in those games. He is averaging 6.3 yards per carry against MEAC teams for his career.
- His best game against a MEAC foe was a 210-yard, three-touchdown performance at FAMU on Oct. 26, 2013. His worst game was a 49-yard performance against S.C. State in the Atlanta Football Classic on Oct. 4, 2014.

MOVING ON UP

Tarik Cohen is now second on the Aggies all-time rushing list as he passed James White and Maurice Hicks with his 107-yard performance at Hampton on Oct. 3. He needs just 134 yards to become just the second player in school history to compile 3,000 career rushing yards.

- Thompson has taken the majority of the backup carries with 25 carries to Williams' 11.

THE WR'S

DO-IT-ALL RECEIVERS

Three receivers on N.C. A&T's roster participate in other sports on campus. After football season, Denzel Keyes goes immediately to the basketball court and plays for the A&T men's basketball team. Keyes has started six games for men's basketball. Gabriel is a sprint champion who won the MEAC championship in the 100 meters in May. Meanwhile Kevin Francis qualified for NCAA regionals in the 100 meter hurdles.

INJURY BUG

The Aggies lost some wide receivers during camp thanks to broken arms. Xavier Griffin went out during the first week of camp with a broken arm after reaching back for a fumble. Griffin was expected to start at one of the wide receiver positions. A week later Michael Weaver, Jr., broke his arm thanks to a hit going across the middle.

• Senior Kevin Francis also is out with a knee injury after turning it awkwardly against Shaw in Week 1.

THE KEYES TO THE OFFENSE

• Denzel Keyes has caught at least one pass in 19 out of his last 20 games. The only exception was N.C. A&T's loss at N.C. Central in last season's season finale in Durham. He was targeted four times in the game. During this span, Keyes has caught four or more passes six times.

• Keyes is tied for the conference lead in touchdown receptions with seven. He needs four more TD receptions to break the Aggies single-season record of 10. Keyes also has 14 career TD's, which puts him six behind the career record.

• Eleven of Keyes' 14 career touchdowns have come after the Aggies have entered the red zone which goes to their trust him to throw it up and let him catch it against smaller corners.

AGGIE OFFENSIVE LINE YOUTHFUL EXPECTATIONS

• Despite being picked to win the MEAC, the Aggies have one of the youngest offensive lines in the conference.

• The Aggies currently start one true freshman, one redshirt freshman and three redshirt sophomores. It leaves the Aggies with an inexperience but bright future upfront.

SIZE MATTERS

• The Aggies like to recruit tall, lanky offensive linemen that can bend and move quickly.

• The average size of the Aggies top six offensive linemen, Brandon Parker, Joshua Mattocks, Darriel Mack, Shawn Best, Marcus Pettiford and Wes Cole is 6-foot-5, 305 pounds.

CHANGING STARTERS

• The Aggies have made some changes along the offensive line the past two games.

• Darriel Mack has started the last four games at center in place of Nicholas Dease who made the start at right guard against Howard. Marcus Pettiford has started the last four games at right tackle.

THE AGGIE 'D' BACK ON TRACK

• The Aggies defense has never finished lower than 16th nationally in the four previous years Broadway has coached at A&T. The run defense has never finished any lower than 24th in the nation.

• The Aggies are ninth nationally against the run up six spots from last week. In total defense the Aggies are ranked eighth nationally up seven spots after holding Howard to only 31 yards rushing. The Aggies lead the MEAC in run defense and total defense.

• In 48 games in the Broadway era, the Aggies have held opponents to under 100 yards rushing 26 times including five times this season. They posted a streak of seven straight games from Oct. 20, 2012 to Sept. 14, 2013. The Aggies have held four opponents to under 100 yards of offense since 2011.

• It has been hard to convert third downs against the N.C. A&T defense this season. The Aggies have allowed opponents to convert only 25 percent of their third downs. The Aggies rank second in the nation in third down conversion defense and they are second in the conference behind S.C. State.

• Teams have garnered only 96 first downs against the Aggies this season, which are the second fewest first downs allowed in the MEAC and it ranks the Aggies 14th nationally.

• The Aggies defensive coordinator over the past five seasons has been Sam Washington. Washington's defense plays best at home, allowing just 14.7 points per game at home. They allow only 12.0 per home contest to MEAC opponents.

PASSING ATTACK

• Bethune-Cookman became just the ninth team in the 51-game Broadway era to have 400 or more yards of offense.

• The Wildcats 358 yards passing were the most yards passing surrendered during Broadway's five-year stint at N.C. A&T

• It was also the most yards thrown against N.C. A&T since Florida A&M threw for 377 yards in a 24-21 win over A&T on Nov. 3,

SPREADING OUT THE TACKLES

• The Aggies leading tackle is defensive back Tony McRae with 34.

• The Aggies are tackling people, they have just decided to distribute the tackles evenly. The Aggies have nine players with 20 or more tackles.

• The Aggies have had five different leading tacklers throughout the season. Over the past four weeks a freshman has led the Aggies tackle. McRae, Denzel Jones and Angelo Keyes are the top -3 tacklers with recording more than 30.

THE D-LINE

WELCOME TO RAGLAND

Marquis Ragland earned first-team All-MEAC honors last season and was a part of the preseason first-team defense for the MEAC. Ragland also blocked three kicks last season, which ranked him seventh in the nation. Ragland is amongst the Aggies leading tacklers from his nose guard position. He leads the team in QB hurries with five.

DON'T FORGET THE OTHER KEYES

Wide receiver Denzel Keyes gets a lot of attention because of his leaping ability and great hands. Denzel is tied for the MEAC lead in touchdown receptions while ranking 11th in the nation.

• Apparently, his brother has the same hunger for the end zone. Keyes made two key interceptions last season to help win games. He intercepted a pass at Elon to secure a 17-12 win before returning an INT for a touchdown in a 33-20 win at Delaware State. On Oct. 24, however, Angelo Keyes scored his second career touchdown when he scooped up a fumble and ran in for touchdown from 42 yards out.

DEEP D-LINE

The Aggies have tremendous depth along the defensive line. Six of the eight players on the Aggies two-deep has started at least two games. Defensive End Sam Blue is a Rutgers transfer and D'Anthony Ross who does not appear on the two-deep earned significant playing time in 2014. The Aggies starting defensive line has a combined 84 games of experience.

THE LINEBACKERS

ALBERT RETURNS

Outside linebacker Marcus Albert missed the 2014 season to work on academics. As a freshman, he made 21 tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss. Albert started two games as a freshman.

THE ROVER BATTLE

There is an excellent battle for the Aggies starting rover position. Lorenz Suttles, who started at strong side linebacker last season, served as the backup on Saturday against Shaw. His competition is not too shabby in Greensboro native Landis Shoffner. Shoffner led the Aggies in tackles last season, breaking D'Vonte Grant's three-year run.

JONES' STREAK ENDS

Fifth-year middle linebacker Denzel Jones did not play against Hampton on Oct. 3. It marked the first time Jones failed to play since the beginning of last season. His streak of 15 straight games came to an end after an injury he endured at Elon on Sept. 19.

REYNOLDS BECOMES A STARTER

Redshirt freshman Julius Reynolds has started the last two games for the Aggies in place of true freshman Deion Jones. Reynolds led the Aggies in tackles in each of his two starts. He had a team-leading six tackles at Hampton (Oct. 3) and seven tackles at Norfolk State (Oct. 10).

THE DB CREW

TONY, TONY, TONY

Cornerback Tony McRae enters his final season with A&T. He has seven career interceptions. He also has 27 career passes defended. Last year, he became a starter for the first time after serving as an understudy his first two seasons.

McRae, a first-team All-MEAC selection in 2014 and a preseason selection in 2015, made the most of his opportunity to start. McRae was 13th in the nation in passes defended after intercepting five passes and breaking up 11. He was 15th in the nation in interceptions. He has not registered a national ranking this season.

REPLACING MATTOCKS

Donald Mattocks finished his career last year, but not before earning All-American and all-conference honors after picking off seven passes in 2014. He also broke up nine passes. Senior Marquis Boyan replaced Mattocks and has not been beat for a pass more than 20 yards all season. Redshirt sophomore Tard McCoy has also seen action at the corner position along with redshirt freshman Marquis Willis.

DB POWER

The Aggies secondary has not had the type of turnover success it had last season, but their coverage of receivers has still been excellent. The Aggies rank 39th in the nation in pass defense and they are 50th in the nation in passing efficiency defense. The Aggies were 24th in the nation in pass defense last season and second in passing efficiency defense.

THE SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMS

KICKING IT WITH CODY

Cody Jones became the Aggies first first-team All-MEAC kicker since Yonnick Matthews earned the honor in 2003. Jones made 15 of 19 field goals and 45 of 47 on extra points. Jones led the MEAC in field goals made and field goal percentage (.789). Jones also handled the Aggies punting duties after Dominic Frescura went down with an injury five games into the season. Jones averaged 39.2 yards per punt.

Jones did not play against Elon on Sept. 19 and instead was replaced by punter Steve Sawicki. Sawicki missed his only field goal attempt but hit both extra points.

This season Jones leads the conference in extra points made with 22. He is also tied for the conference lead in extra point percentage as he has hit all 22 of his extra points.

He is 17th in the nation in field goal percentage (.833) as he has hit 5 of 6 this season. He is second among kickers in scoring and third among all players in the conference in scoring.

NEW PUNTER

After a few bad punts at North Carolina, freshman Steve Sawicki took over the punting duties for A&T.

- Sawicki came in and punted the ball five times in the game for 213 yards (42.6 per punt).
- Sawicki has punted the ball 25 times since taking over the job for an average 38.3 per punt. Eight have gone inside the 20, six have been fair caught and three have gone for touchbacks. He has one 50-yarder to his credit.

GARDIN VARIETY

Sophomore Khrist Gardin is second in the nation in punt return yardage. He is averaging 24.2 yards per return to also lead the conference in that category.

Gardin had a career game when the Aggies played Hampton on Oct. 3. Gardin returned the ball four times for 203 yards and a touchdown that went 71 yards and was the game winner.

Gardin could have had the NCAA record but needed five returns to be eligible to break the single-game record for yards per punt return. Gardin, who has been returning punts since he was a true freshman, is averaging 12.7 yards per return on 58 returns.

SPEEDY RETURNERS

The Aggies have tremendous talent in speed in return men. Tony McRae returned a kick 95 yards for a touchdown last season against Alabama A&M and earned second-team all-conference honors as a returner to go along with his first-team honor as a corner.

McRae also returned a kick 91 yards for a touchdown in 2013 in a 24-21 win over Appalachian State.

Caleb Gabriel got into the act on Sept. 5 by returning a kickoff 92 yards against the Bears. It marked the third straight year the Aggies have opened the season with a kickoff return.

Gabriel earned co-special teams player of the week by the MEAC for his performance against Shaw, while Gardin was named MEAC and national special teams player of the week for his performance against Hampton. Tarik Cohen has also returned kicks for the Aggies.

Rod Broadway enters his fifth season as the head football coach at North Carolina A&T. The Aggies football program has made tremendous strides under Broadway's first four years of stewardship. A year before Broadway's arrival, the Aggies were 1-10. In his first season, they improved four games to 5-6. The next two seasons the Aggies put together consecutive 7-4 seasons. In his fourth season, the Aggies went 9-3 overall and 6-2 in the MEAC to capture a share of the MEAC title, the Aggies first title in 11 years. He is 34-18 (.654) over his first four years as the Aggies head man.

The three straight winning seasons are the programs first since posting winning seasons from 1999-01. The Aggies had 11 players earn all-conference honors in 2014, the most in school history. Of those 11 players, seven earned first-team honors. Broadway also saw seven of his players earn some type of All-American honor, which included center Ronald Canty earning Associated Press and American Football Coaches Association All-American recognition. One of his prized recruits Tarik Cohen became a national figure and social media sensation during the 2015 offseason when he was showcased online catching a football, sometimes two, while coming out of a backflip. Cohen was also made an appearance on ESPN SportsCenter doing a backflip while catching a football. On the field, Cohen has been named the MEAC's rookie of the year and its co-offensive player of the year, making him the second Aggie under Broadway to earn the honor.

The Aggies were even able to get off to a 3-0 start in 2013, including an upset win over three-time FCS national champion Appalachian State in Boone, N.C. It was the first time the Mountaineers had lost to an in-state opponent at home since 1984. The Aggies also finished the season with the No. 1 rush defense in the

nation and No. 4 overall defense in the country. 2013-14.

Broadway has turned the Aggies into a winner despite numerous obstacles he inherited when he arrived on campus in February of 2011. Broadway took over a program mired in NCAA sanctions stemming from a low graduation rate. As a result, Broadway has taken on the task of building a winner despite having reduced practice hours, fewer scholarships and little to no spring practice. Instead of making excuses, Broadway changed the football culture at A&T. He revitalized A&T's program with a stingy defense and a stringent focus on accountability on the football field and in the classroom.

One of his first initiatives was to make his players proud of the A&T legacy. Before each home game, they visit the statue (on campus) of four men and former A&T students (David Richmond, Franklin McCain, Joseph A. McNeil and Jibreel Khazan formerly known as Ezell Blair, Jr.) largely credited with ushering in the modern day civil rights movement with their famous Feb. 1, 1960 sit-in at a Greensboro F.W. Woolworth's lunch counter.

His focus on academic excellence resulted in 34 football players earning a 3.0 grade point average or better during the 2012 fall semester. Twenty-one players were named A&T scholar athletes in 2013 and 23 earned the honor in 2014.

In addition, A&T's annual academic progress rate score, the score that measures progress toward degree, improved to 944 in single year 2011-12, releasing the Aggies from NCAA sanctions. The single-year score improved to 948 the following year and increased to 958 in

The foundation for the Aggies' resurgence on the field has been defense. In three years, the Aggies overall defense has ranked no lower than 24th nationally. A&T's run defense has never finished lower than 16th. The Aggies held six different opponents to under 100 yards rushing in 2013. Overall, nine players earned either first, second or third-team All-MEAC honors and Cohen was a Jerry Rice finalist for best FCS freshman in the nation.

The prior year opponents went an amazing 17 straight quarters without scoring an offensive touchdown against the Aggies defense. The Aggies were also No. 1 nationally in pass defense efficiency in 2012. The second year under Broadway also produced two first-team All-MEAC performers in cornerback D'Vonte Graham and left tackle William Ray Robinson III. Three more defensive players earned second-team honors in defensive tackle Chris Neal, linebacker D'Vonte Grant and safety Travis Crosby.

In his first year, Broadway became the first Aggie head coach in school history to produce a 2,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver.

Mike Mayhew, the Aggies 1,000-yard back in 2011, was named MEAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year. Wallace Miles, the 1,000-yard receiver, signed an NFL free agent contract with the Detroit Lions. Defensively, Grant became a Jerry Rice Finalist for best freshman in the Division I-FCS after he led the Aggies in tackles. Mayhew, Robinson, Nathan Isles, Ayodeji Olatoye, Desmond Lawrence and Miles have

all earned invites to NFL camps. Isles, Miles and Olatoye signed free agent contracts with NFL teams. Miles still plays in the CFL.

Broadway came to A&T with an impressive history of winning championships with a brand of football that is exciting offensively and punishing defensively. In his last two head coaching positions – N.C. Central and Grambling State – each school came away with a Black College National Championship.

Broadway has compiled a 102-41 (.713) record over 12 years as a head coach. Before taking over the difficult task of rebuilding an Aggies program with just 14 wins in the previous seven seasons before his arrival, Broadway spent four seasons (2007-10) at Grambling State. The Tigers went 35-12 under his leadership.

The year before he arrived at GSU, the Tigers went 3-8. During his first season there in 2008, the Tigers finished second in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and made an appearance in the SWAC Championship Game. Five players received either All-American or All-SWAC honors, and Broadway was a finalist for the nationally-recognized Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. Wide receiver Clyde Edwards earned FCS Fabulous 50 All-American honors and running back Frank Warren was named SWAC Freshman of the Year.

Year two led to even more improvements for the GSU program. The Tigers ascended to the top of the SWAC with a 9-0 record and a 41-9 win over Jackson State in the SWAC Championship Game. GSU's 2008 season also produced an 11-2 overall mark, a No. 24 national ranking in the Sports Network Division

I-FCS poll and a Black College National Championship.

Defense was the catalyst for the Tigers' success as they finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in turnover margin, pass efficiency defense and had a No. 7 ranking in rush defense. In addition, three players earned All-American honors, nine were named All-SWAC and five players earned Louisiana Sports Writers Association recognition. Accolades for Broadway included being named SWAC Coach of the Year and The Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C., Coach of the Year.

In 2009, GSU continued to play well. The Tigers finished 7-4 overall and 5-2 in the SWAC. The next season resulted in a 9-2 mark that was complemented by an 8-1 SWAC record. During his career at GSU, Broadway also showed he had a hankering for winning rivalry games. He went 3-1 against archrival Southern. He also owns the best winning percentage in program history, even better than legendary GSU head coach Eddie Robinson.

Before his stint at GSU, Broadway turned N.C. Central into a Division II national power. His four-year stint (2003-06) at N.C. Central produced a 33-11 record, back-to-back CIAA titles for the first time in 50 years and the Eagles made two consecutive appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. The 2006 season was the highlight of Broadway's tenure at NCCU.

Broadway led the Eagles to an 11-1 season and the top seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Region. After fielding the No. 1

rated offense in the CIAA and the 15th ranked defense nationally, individual honors included two players being named Associated Press Little All-Americans.

There were also 12 players named All-CIAA, 10 Eagles earned Daktronics All-Southeast Region recognition and four members from the 2006 team were named SBN All-Americans, including freshman quarterback Stadford Brown, who was also named SBN Player of the Year. During his stint at NCCU, Broadway also put together a 16-game regular-season winning streak and led the Eagles to their first-ever victory over a SWAC opponent with a win over Southern in 2006.

Broadway began his collegiate coaching career at East Carolina University in 1979. His other coaching positions included stays at Duke University (1981-94), the University of Florida (1995-00) and the University of North Carolina (2001-02). As an assistant at UNC, Broadway helped the Tar Heels to a No. 15 national ranking in total defense and an appearance in the Peach Bowl.

At Florida, he served as a member of the Steve Spurrier's staff. In 1996, he helped the Gators win an NCAA National Championship. Broadway's stay also included four SEC Championships and six bowl appearances. The Gators defense led the SEC in sacks four straight seasons (1996-99), and the team set a school record for fewest rushing yards allowed, as offenses produced just 70.7 yards per game.

A 1977 graduate of UNC, Broadway played on the Tar Heels defensive line from 1974-77.
