University of MarylandEastern Shore Halls of
Fame.

In addition to his three tours at FAMU, Townsend served as Athletic Director at Maryland-Eastern Shore, Delaware State and the University of Buffalo, helping UB transition from Division III to Division One.

2015 Florida A&M University RATTLER FOOTBALL PREVIEW

A position-by-position outlook on the 2015 FAMU Football Team

Rattler Football fans have endured their version of Death Valley Days, as their beloved football team has struggled the past four years.

Hope springs eternal in the heart of the sports fan, and FAMU partisans are excited and anxious after watching the 15 days of spring training under new head coach Alex Wood.

Wood, who accepted the head coaching post last December 23, promised then that the Rattlers would play with discipline and tempo, and the Spring Game showed fans glimpses of making good on that pledge.

The Offense at a Glance

Offensively, the Rattlers will go no-huddle, perhaps bringing back a version of the now fabled Gulf Coast Offense of the 1990s, with a twist, featuring equal helpings of the run game along with the pass.

Junior quarterback Carson Royal (6-2, 200, Jr., Yulee, Fla.) emerged as the top candidate to replace four-year starter Damien Fleming, thanks to a solid spring training, capped by a sharp performance in the Spring Game, as he passed for 215 yards and 2 TDs.

Royal should face some stiff challenges in the fall though, from junior Kenny Coleman (6-1, 190, Jr., Hazelhurst, Miss.), plus heralded freshman Ryan Stanley (6-2, 205) from Pembroke Pines, Fla., (Flanagan High) a two-star prospect.

The Rattler receiving corps could be as talented as any since legendary RAC Boys of the Gulf Coast Era, with sophomore Brandon Norwood (6-1, 190, So., Atlanta, Ga.) and Tallahassee junior Montavious Williams (5-10, 175), who caught a 70-yard TD bomb in the Spring Game, leading the way, along with Iowa State transfer **Tad Ecby** (6-0, 205, Houston, Tex.), plus a trio of freshmen recruits led by Alvin Harper, Jr., son of the former Dallas Cowboys/Washington Redskins star receiver by the same name.

FAMU's ground game, which has struggled the last few years with line problems, coaching changes and health of the

runners, looked much improved in the spring.

Sophomore **Gerald Hearns** (5-9, 205, So., W. Palm Beach, Fla.), the team's top rusher a year ago, and redshirt junior **Tysean Holloway** (6-0, 205, Jr., Asheville, N.C.) head a cast of talented performers which should blossom in Coach Woods' scheme, but watch for Iowa State transfer **Devondrick Nealy** (5-11, 195, Sr., Monticello, Fla.) to make some moves too out of the Rattler backfield.

But the promise of sizzle on offense will go nowhere without some mean hombres up front opening holes and keeping quarterbacks upright.

Junior guard **Keonte Cash** (6-1, 290, Jr.), a Miami native who has started every game in his collegiate career, should team with senior center **Mateo Kambui** (6-2, 295, Wichita, Kan.), guard **Osman Aguilera** (6-4, 295, So., Miami, Fla.), and tackles **Patrick Dalton** (6-6, 300, So., Fayetteville, Ga.) and **T.J. Jones** (6-5, 295, Jr., Myrtle Beach, S.C.) to form a solid front for FAMU.

Also in the line mix early on will be **Jason Akins** (6-3, 280, R-Fr., Fayetteville, Ga.), Joshua
Addison (6-4, 320, R-Fr., Miami, Fla.), **Gerald Harrison** (6-4, 295, R-Fr., Tallahassee, Fla.) and
Loubens **Polinice** (6-3, 275, R-Fr., Daytona
Beach, Fla.).

The Case for the Defense

Coach Wood also promised an aggressive, pressure defensive unit that will play with a high motor, and the spring showed flashes that the **GanGreen Defense** would be quick and hard-hitting.

The defensive line will be rebuilt in a 4-3 scheme, with senior stalwart **Michael Lovejoy** (6-4, 265, Pensacola, Fla.) providing the anchor at one tackle, heading a crew of talented strongmen which includes with **Daikwon Fuse** (6-3, 275, So., W. Palm Beach,

Fla.), Calvin Darville (6-5, 255, Jr., Belle Glade, Fla.), Danzell Williams (6-1, 275, R-So., Wildwood, Fla.), Romario Chisholm (6-3, 275, Jr., Orlando, Fla.), Adarrius Smith (6-2, 235, So., Fleming Island, Fla.), Melvin Bracy (6-4, 265, Jr., Palm Beach, Fla.), and Trevor Bone (6-4, 290, R-Jr., Winter Springs, Fla.).

Senior All-America candidate **Akil Blount** (6-3, 243, Sr., Pittsburgh, Pa.) heads the bevy of talented Rattler linebackers will show off their pugilistic tendencies in the new 43 defensive scheme..

Playing wingmen to Blount in the linebacker group will be fellow senior **Kashawn Butler** (6-2, 230, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.), who made some memorable hits in the Spring Game, along with junior **Curtis Alexander** (6-2, 245, Quincy, Fla.) and Tallahassean **Luke Helms** (6-2, 230, Jr.), plus newcomers **Khalil Harris** (6-2, 240, Fr., Gulfport. Miss.) and **Jonathan Cobb** (6-1, 220, Jr., Jacksonville, Fla.).

The Rattler secondary will be full of aces with the return from academic exile of junior corner **Patrick Aiken** (5-9, 185, R-Jr., Pembroke Pines, Fla.), who will battle returning veterans **Braxton Brown** (5-11, 185, R-Jr., Houston, Tex.), **Neil Cunningham** (6-1, 220, Jr., Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.), **Rashad Guyton** (5-8, 185, R-Jr., Madison, Fla.), **Jules Dornevil** (5-11, 185, Jr., Naples, Fla.), **John Boston** (5-11, 190, R-Sr., Oviedo, Fla.) and **Jacques Bryant** (6-0, 190, Jr., Tallahassee, Fla.), plus newcomers **Orlando McKinley** (5-8, 175, Fr., Atlanta, Ga.), and **Bryan Dunlap** (5-11, 185, So., Jacksonville, Fla.) for playing time.

Specialists

Special Teams will be in search of a placekicker as All-America Chase Varnadore graduated in the spring, and redshirt **Corey Irwin** left the program in May. Junior **Colby Blanton** (6-0, 205, Jr., Jacksonville, Fla.), one of the MEAC's top punters at 39.6 per kick

careerwise at FAMU, also on deck to handle kickoffs, field goals and extra points,.

The Schedule

The 2015 schedule will be challenging as always with seven road games, three straight to open the season against USF (Sept. 5), Samford (Sept. 12) and the league opener against South Carolina State (Sept. 17) in a Thursday night TV game.

FAMU opens a four-game home schedule on Sept. 26 against Tennessee State in the Sports Hall of Fame Game.

The Rattlers will open October with an Oct. 3 road game at Savannah State, before playing their next three games in Bragg Stadium against North Carolina Central (Oct. 10), Delaware State (Oct. 17 for Homecoming) and North Carolina A&T (Oct. 31).

In November, FAMU closes with three road games - at Hampton (Nov. 7), at Morgan State (Nov. 14) and in Orlando against Bethune-Cookman (Nov. 21).

@ FAMU officially opened the Alex Wood Era last weekend against the USF Bulls, with a tough 51-3 setback in Tampa.

DEFENSE LED THE WAY

- @ The FAMU Defense played valiantly against USF, holding the Bulls to a field goal in the first period, and 16 total points in the first half.
- @ USF did turn things into a runaway with a 35-point second half, as the Bulls capitalized on a worn down FAMU defense, and good field position coming from a struggling Rattler offense.
- @ Senior All-America candidate LB Akil Blount led the Rattlers with 11 total tackles and one tackle for 13 yards in losses.... LB Kashawn Butler finished with seven tackles and defensive back Jules Dornevil rounded out the top three with six (6) solo tackles... Safety Jacques Bryant had an interception.

OFFENSE GETS OFF SLOWLY

- @ FAMU was able to overcome their early struggles to generate some offensive success in the second half to finish with 182 total yards (170 yards passing, 12 rushing).
- @ Starting quarterback Carson Royal was sacked three times, throwing for 35 yards on

- six completions of nine attempts. He was lifted in the second half after cramps hampered his mobility, for junior Kenny Coleman.
- @ The Mississippi native threw for 135 yards on 14 of 29 passing, with two interceptions, while rushing for a team-high 23 yards on six carries.
- @ Coleman did direct the Rattlers to points, as Colby Blanton's 21-yard field goal capped a 14-play, 71-yard drive late in the third period.
- @ Blanton's field goal was the first of his collegiate career, which has seen the Jacksonville junior star as the FAMU punter the last two years.... Blanton also booted 10 punts Saturday against USF, good for a 39.5 average, with a long boot of 51 yards.... His 10 punts tied a single-game school record set by Vince Coleman versus Miami in 1980.
- @ All-purpose runner Devondrick Nealy had a busy night for the Rattlers as a return man and on offense... The transfer from Iowa State compiled 130 all-purpose yards, getting 56 on four (4) pass receptions; 53 yards on two (2) kickoff returns; 19 yards on three (3) punts returns, and two (2) net yards rushing on 14 tries....

ALEX WOOD

Head Football Coach * Florida A&M University

University of Iowa, 1978 * First Season

At first glance, Florida A&M University head football coach Alex Wood looks more like an erudite college professor than a football coach.

But beyond the personable, mild-mannered, intellectual persona that Wood projects to the public, is a fiercely competitive firebrand, who stresses discipline and accountability from his players both on and off the field.

A native of Massillon, Ohio, Wood was a product of the storied Ohio high school program that was once led by the legendary Paul Brown, who went on to coach the Cleveland Browns and later found the Cincinnati Bengals.

"I wasn't a supremely gifted athlete," Wood recalls. "But I worked hard, worked out hard, lifting weights. I was known as a tough guy, a try hard guy."

Wood, who was a walk-on running back and special teams performer at the University of Iowa, eventually earned a scholarship with the Hawkeyes.

It was in the crucible of his years as a dedicated and determined young athlete, that the idea of

continuing in the game of football was born.

"Many of my coaches in high school and college inspired me during my playing career," Wood recalls. "Denny (Dennis) Green was one of my coaches at Iowa. He was an excellent coach, and he was also the first African American coach I ever had.

"I knew I didn't have the talent for the NFL," Wood said, "but I wanted to get something back for what I had put into the game, so I moved into coaching.

"Coaching keeps me in the game (football). I interact with other coaches, work clinics, growing and learning so I can pass along that knowledge. That in turn, allows me to teach the fundamentals of football, instill discipline, to teach life lessons, and place emphasis on character and perseverance," said Wood.

"Seeing some of those former players years later, some who may not been great athletes, but who have become great men is very rewarding, knowing you helped make a difference, that you touched the lives of young men," he concluded.

FLORIDA A&M HEAD COACH ALEX WOOD

Wood, came to Florida A&M from the University of Buffalo, where he was offensive coordinator the last four seasons (2011-14), and interim head coach for the last half of the 2014 season.

During that four-year run, the Bulls averaged 35 points and over 4,000 yards in offense, finding a perfect balance between the run and pass.

His offensive philosophy was no doubt influenced by his various work stops in college, which ranged from championship teams at Miami (Fla.), and tours in FCS at James Madison and Southern (La.), to the professional level, in Minnesota, Cincinnati and Arizona.

Offensively, Rattler fans can expect to see a no huddle, hurry up pro style attack, that will utilize multiple personnel groupings and multiple formations, seeking that critical balance between the run and the pass, while pressuring opposing defenses with a relentless pace.

"We will snap the ball with 17 seconds on the play clock, seeking to average 95 plays or more every game. This will allow us to keep opponents vanilla, and not allow them to substitute much," promises Wood.

Rattler fans got a taste of an up tempo, fastbreak offense during the Gulf Coast Offense days under coach Billy Joe (1994-2004), and the possibilities of a return of those high-flying days has many FAMUans breathless with anticipation headed into 2015.

"The no-huddle is something we've always done, at first late in games, or when things were stagnant, to pump some life back into the offense.

"But now it is a full-time venture, with emphasis on a balanced philosophy. We don't want to be one dimensional, and being able to establish the run allows us to use play action more effectively as well," Wood added.

Defensively, stopping the run, which has been a challenge for the Rattlers in recent years, will be the top priority of Wood's GanGreen Defense.

"On offense, we want to be equally effective in the run game and through the air, while on defense, we want to make teams one dimensional, and stopping the run will be the key to success on that side of the ball."



Wood will employ multiple fronts on defense, with an aggressive, pressure style, that will cover well in the secondary, and seek to confuse the quarterback.

"We will play with pace on defense too, running to the ball like scalded dogs, being sound in our tackling and looking to create takeaways" Wood says.

With Fall training camp just days away, the first-year Rattler coach turned his expectations for the team in 2015, sounding very much like the 37-year coaching veteran he is.

"I expect us to play hard, play smart, play and a complete game with great excitement for four quarters," Wood said of his charges, who were in the final stages of a summer training regime that began in mid May.

The summer work regimen for the players placed equal emphasis on athletic training and academic excellence, and according to Wood, it was the first complete summer session the program has ever had.

"We are coming out of the summer training energized," Wood said. "I'm really looking forward to our seniors providing leadership for us this year, and they should be the most hungry to have a good year."

Rattler fans and opponents can expect Alex Wood to put his mark on the FAMU Football Program, such that it reflects the tenets of hard work, discipline and character that he has espoused over his long and fruitful career.
