Florida A&M hosts Savannah State for the second weekend of MEAC play this Saturday and Sunday at Moore-Kittles Field. The Rattlers enter the series with an 11-5 record, the best start to a season since Jamey Shoupp took over the program in 2014, but have dropped their last two contests. FAMU has an 8-4 record against SSU in the last two seasons, and has outscored the Tigers 73-57 in those two years. Florida A&M won the MEAC Championship in 2015 and Savannah State last won in 2013. The Tigers enter the series coming off a sweep of Mount St. Mary's by scores of 9-1, 6-5, and 9-8. FAMU has six everyday players hitting .328 or better. Kaycee Reese leads the team with a .409 batting average, while Brian Davis leads the team with seven extra-base hits (four doubles and three homeruns) and 18 RBI. This will be the Rattlers' first home conference series of the season.

## Shouppe Nearing 100 Wins

As he enters his fourth season with the Rattlers, Head Coach Jamey Shouppe is closing in on 100 career wins. Shouppe's 80 wins in his first three seasons are the most wins in the first three seasons as a head coach in FAMU history. In 2016, the Rattlers recorded just their third 30+ win season since becoming a Division I program in 1980, and the first since the Rattlers went 31-21 in 2003. Shouppe needs just 20 wins in 2017 to reach the century mark. Below is a breakdown of win totals each season:

## Shouppe Chasing 3-Year Win Total

As Head Coach, Jamey Shouppe continues to build the Florida A&M program, improving from year to year. The Rattlers have won or tied for the MEAC Southern Division title in each of his first three seasons and won the MEAC Championship in 2015, clinching the school's first ever NCAA Tournament berth. In his first three seasons at the helm, Shouppe tied the record for most wins over any consecutive three-year period since FAMU became a Division I program. With 27 wins this season, Shouppe would hold sole possession of the record with 81 wins in three consecutive seasons. With records only going back to the 2000 season, the 2016 team finished 1<sup>st</sup> in school history in seven offensive categories (homeruns, RBI, total bases, slugging %, hit-by-pitch, on base %, and runs scored) and 2<sup>nd</sup> in four (walks, batting average, hits, and doubles). **Overall Record: 91-77, 50-25 MEAC**

Jamey Shouppe is in his 4<sup>th</sup> season at the helm of the Florida A&M baseball program. In 2015, Shouppe won the program's first MEAC Championship since 1994 and led the Rattlers to their first NCAA Regional appearance in school history. Shouppe is a two-time MEAC Coach of the Year, winning the award in 2014 and 2016.

Shouppe's second season was a historic one as he guided the Rattlers to their first ever NCAA Regional appearance. FAMU went to the Gainesville Regional after winning the MEAC Championship for the first time since 1994. Shouppe was named the Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach following an 8-2 Championship Game win over Bethune-Cookman. During the 2015 campaign, Florida A&M defeated North Carolina Central 9-4 at Fenway Park, which was part of an HBCU Celebration weekend that was organized by the Boston Red Sox and the Boston Area Church League, Inc. The game in Fenway Park marked the first game in history between two HBCU programs played in a MLB ballpark with conference standings on the line. In 2015, FAMU won the MEAC Southern Division outright for the first time since 1997. The 2015 pitching staff also saw a program first as it finished with a sub-5.00 team ERA for the first time.

The 2016 season was also one to remember as the Rattlers set several school records. FAMU recorded just its 3<sup>rd</sup> 30-win season since becoming a Division I program in 1980. For the 3<sup>rd</sup> straight season, the Rattlers set a program record for conference wins after finishing 19-5 in MEAC play. Shouppe's 80 wins in his first three seasons are the most wins in the first three seasons as a head coach in FAMU history. Shouppe also tied the most wins in program history over any consecutive three-year period. The Rattlers won the MEAC Southern Division back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history. Florida A&M finished the year with a strength of schedule ranked 18<sup>th</sup> nationally, and finished with an RPI ranking ahead of schools such as Auburn, UCF, Stetson, South Florida, and Virginia Tech. FAMU set a program record with 416 runs scored, and finished the season ranked in the top 50 nationally in nine different offensive categories.

One of the biggest highlights of Shouppe's first season was a 4-3 win over then No. 6 Florida in Gainesville, arguably the biggest win for the MEAC in 2014. The win marked the first over the Gators in the history of the Florida A&M baseball program. FAMU also ended losing streaks over Jacksonville (20), North Florida (13) and Bethune-Cookman (13) during the 2014 season.

Shouppe came to Florida A&M after spending 21 years as the Pitching Coach at Florida State. Taking over a program coming off back-to-back seven-win season with over 45 losses each year, this was a prized catch for the Rattler program.

As the Pitching Coach/Recruiting Coordinator at Florida State he produced 10 ACC team ERA pitching titles, coached 63 pitchers that were drafted, including six first round picks, coached 26 first team All-Americans, and made nine College World Series appearances.

Professionally, he played with the Houston Astros from 1982-1985 after being drafted in the eighth round of the 1982 draft.

A Florida State graduate with a degree in Physical Education, Shouppe also earned a Master's degree from Nova University in Fort Lauderdale. A Chattahoochee, FL native, Jamey and his wife Karen, a former Florida State cheerleader, have three children: Jake, Kasey and Jared.

Bryan Henry is in his third season as the Florida A&M Pitching Coach after being named to the position in 2015. The Tallahassee native brings a wealth of baseball knowledge to the Rattler coaching staff after being an All-ACC Pitcher at Florida State including ACC Pitcher of the Year in 2007. Henry also spent seven seasons in the Arizona Diamondbacks organization, including two seasons at the Triple A level.

Fighting through injuries to the pitching staff in 2016, FAMU finished ranked in the top three of the MEAC in ERA, opposing batting average, saves, runs allowed, earned runs allowed, walks allowed, fewest doubles and fewest triples allowed. Florida A&M faced some of the toughest competition in 2016 as the non-conference strength of schedule was ranked 18th nationally. The Rattlers finished with a team ERA of 3.27 in conference games, which ranked second in the MEAC. Seven different FAMU pitchers also finished the season with a sub-4.00 ERA in conference play including Ricky Page, who was 4-1 against the MEAC and posted a 1.58 ERA with 47 strikeouts to just 11 walks.

In 2015, his first season as the Florida A&M Pitching Coach, he helped direct the Rattlers to their lowest team ERA (4.71) in program history. The 4.71 team ERA ranked third in the MEAC. It marked the first time in school history FAMU had finished the season with a team ERA below 5.00. The pitching staff also combined to finish with the eighth most single-season strikeouts (284) since 2000, in just 48 games. Senior, left-handed, pitcher Marcus Roberts set the program record with a 0.89 ERA in 27 appearances and just allowed two earned runs on the year. Five pitchers finished the 2015 season with a sub-3.00 ERA and the staff finished with a 3.28 ERA against conference opponents.

Henry also served as an assistant coach for the USA Baseball National Team Development Programs with the 14U team in 2014.

Henry, who spent the 2013-14 school year on the Florida State University coaching staff, was a highly-decorated baseball player on the high school and collegiate levels, who also gained valuable seasoning in the game as a professional player in the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

A three-sport letter winner at Tallahassee's Florida High School, performing in basketball, swimming and baseball, Henry was the 2003 Florida Class 2A State Baseball Player of the Year, getting selected in the 2003 Major League Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Henry bypassed the Pirates' offer and continued his budding baseball career at nationally-renowned Florida State University, where he was mentored by then-pitching coach and current FAMU head baseball coach, Jamey Shoupe.

At FSU, Henry soon became the ace of the Seminole pitching staff, blossoming into a three-time First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) selection (2005-06-07).

He had a spectacular turn as senior in 2007, earning All-American honors and ACC Pitcher of the Year accolades, riding that momentum into the that year's June Major League Draft, where he was taken in the 12<sup>th</sup> round by the Arizona Diamondbacks.

Henry played seven (7) professional seasons in the Diamondbacks' system, including two years with the Triple A (AAA) Reno Aces, helping the club win the 2012 International League championship.

In 2010, he was a USA Baseball team selectee, playing in the Pan-American qualifier in Puerto Rico where he allowed just one run in six innings.

Henry and his wife, Laura Lee, are the proud parents of a son, Andrew and daughter Brylee.

Anthony Robinson is in his second season on the Florida A&M Baseball coaching staff in 2015. Robinson will coach third base, work primarily with the outfielders and assist with the hitters.

A native of Tallahassee, Robinson's ties to the Rattler baseball program began in high school as he played at Florida A&M Developmental Research School where he excelled in both baseball and basketball. Robinson was a two-sport letterman at FAMUDRS and a state basketball champion in 1994 and 1995.

Robinson earned a baseball scholarship and played baseball for Florida A&M under former Head Coach Joseph Durant from 1996-1999. Robinson primarily played third base while at FAMU, and earned MEAC Freshman of the Year honors in 1996. He was also named to the MEAC All-Tournament Team in 1996 and 1997 and was voted Second-Team All-MEAC at third base his senior season in 1999.

He comes to FAMU having coached on various different levels of baseball, including Babe Ruth 13U All-Star Team (2001), Lincoln High School Freshman/Varsity (2002) and Florida High School baseball teams from 2003-2013. From 2001-2005 he served as the Assistant Head Coach for the Varsity Boys' Basketball team at Florida High and the Head Coach for the Varsity Boys' basketball team from 2006-2011. Before arriving at FAMU, Robinson was the Head Coach for the Varsity Girls' Basketball team at Florida High from 2013-2015.

Robinson graduated from Florida A&M in 2001 with a BS degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation. He and his wife, Anicia, are the proud parents of two boys, Anthony II and Amare.





## Assistant Coach Alec Wong 1<sup>st</sup> Season at FAMU FAMU C/O 2016

Alec Wong enters his first season as the Volunteer Assistant Coach with the Florida A&M Baseball program after spending the last two seasons playing second base for the Rattlers. He started 96 games at second base over his two seasons at FAMU, earned three different MEAC Player of the Week honors and is working with the Rattler hitters and infielders. Wong is a Rockledge, FL native graduating from Rockledge High School and attended Polk State in Winter Haven, FL before attending Florida A&M.

As a Senior in 2016, Wong was named to the All-MEAC First Team at second base. He earned MEAC Player of the Week two times during his senior season (2/22 & 5/16). In 2016, one of two players to start in all 52 games. Finished ranked 48th nationally, second in the MEAC and on the team with a .378 batting average. He led the MEAC and was 24th nationally in runs scored (57), second in the MEAC, in hits (73), third on the team with 12 doubles and had one triple with five home runs. His .504 OBP% led the MEAC and ranked 12th nationally. In his season opening series against Marshall he hit .750 (9-for-12) with a home run, double, four runs scored, six RBI, SLG% 1.083 and was 2-2 on stolen bases. Wong scored the tying run in the fifth inning and the winning run in the 10th inning of the 5-4 series finale win at NC Central (5/8).

In 2015, he started the first 44 games of his junior season at second base before suffering a torn ACL & MCL in his left knee on May 13 against Savannah State in the opening game of the MEAC Tournament. Wong finished 2015 second in the MEAC with 129 assists and was fourth on the team with a .271 batting average. His eight doubles and 27 runs scored were both tied for second on the team. He also recorded four home runs on the year, including a walk-off home run against NC A&T on March 28, and was second on the team with 68 total bases.

As a graduate student at Florida A&M, Wong is working towards earning his MBA.
