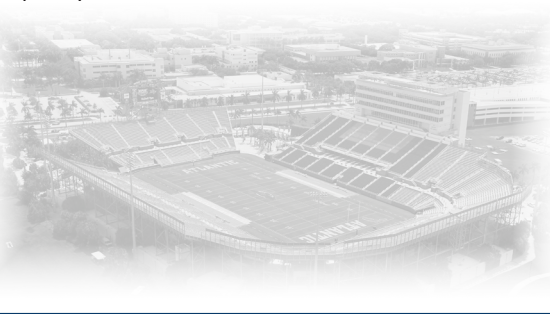

CHARLIE PARTRIDGE

Head Coach

Charlie Partridge was named Florida Atlantic University's Head Football Coach on December 17, 2013 becoming just the fourth person to hold that title, since the program's inception in 2001. Partridge, a south Florida native, returned home to lead a program that completed its first season as a member of Conference USA and became eligible for a bowl game in 2013.

Partridge came to FAU after a one-year stint at the University of Arkansas where he coached three different defensive linemen to all-

conference honors. Defensive ends Chris Smith and Trey Flowers were second-team All-SEC, and defensive tackle Darius Philon was voted to the SEC All-Freshman team. Smith ranked third in the SEC with 8.5 sacks, the eighth-highest single-season total in school history, and ranked seventh in the conference with 11.5 tackles for loss. Flowers ranked second in the SEC with 13.5 tackles for loss, and his three forced fumbles were fourth in the conference. Philon tied for fourth in the SEC with two forced fumbles in conference play and finished the year leading the UA defensive linemen with 46 tackles, including 9.0 for loss and 3.0 sacks.

Partridge also worked with the Razorback specialists, helping tutor kicker Zach Hocker and punter Sam Irwin-Hill. Hocker, who ended his career holding six school records, was a second-team All-SEC selection after he was 28-of-28 on PATs and 13-of-15 on field goals. Hocker made three field goals of more than 50 yards, including a 54 yarder that ranked as the eighth-longest field goal in school history. Irwin-Hill, in his first season at Arkansas, ranked fourth in the SEC and 15th in the NCAA with an average of 44.3 yards per punt. Irwin-Hill boomed a 79-yard punt that is seventh all-time at Arkansas and was tied for the second-longest punt in the NCAA during the 2013 season. Arkansas' net punting average of 39.02 yards ranked fifth in the SEC and 21st in the NCAA.

Prior to Arkansas, Partridge spent five seasons at Wisconsin where he helped the Badgers win three-straight Big Ten championships and to become the first Big Ten team to play in three-straight Rose Bowls since Michigan following the 1976-

78 seasons. Before the 2011 season, he was promoted to associate head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach after three seasons as the Badgers' defensive line and specialists coach.

In 2012, Wisconsin led the Big Ten and ranked third in the NCAA with a three-and-out percentage of 41.72, and the Badgers' 5.23 three and outs per game topped the Big Ten and was fourth in the country. The Badgers' defense was 13th in the NCAA in total defense and tied for 19th in the country in scoring defense. Wisconsin also ranked 21st in the nation in third-down conversion defense in addition to being third in the conference in sacks and 21st in the NCAA in rush defense and pass efficiency defense and 23rd in the country in pass defense.

The Badgers also produced two of the top nine sack artists in the conference, with defensive end Brendan Kelly tied for seventh with an average of 0.45 sacks per game and defensive end Tyler Dippel's 0.42 per-game average tied for ninth. Defensive

backs Devin Smith and Marcus Cromartie both ranked in the top seven in the Big Ten in passes defended with Smith fifth and Cromartie tied for seventh. In addition, Smith also tied for third in the conference in interceptions. Linebacker Chris Borland tied for third in the Big Ten in forced fumbles and fourth in the conference in fumble recoveries, and linebacker Mike Taylor ranked fifth in the Big Ten with an average of 1.15 tackles for loss per game.

The 2011 Wisconsin defensive line typically rotated at least eight linemen every game, even after losing starting defensive end David Gilbert to a season-ending injury after the fourth game. They were a key component in Wisconsin finishing among the top 15 nationally in both scoring and total defense.

The 2010 season was highlighted by the play of J.J. Watt, who won the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Watt was the leader of Wisconsin's defense, finishing the season tied for seventh in the country in tackles for loss with 21.0. A consensus first-team All-Big Ten selection, Watt tied for second in the Big Ten in sacks with 7.0

and tied for third with three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He tied for second on the team in tackles with 62, led the team with 10 quarterback hurries and also broke up eight passes, blocked three kicks and grabbed one interception. A second-team All-American by Walter Camp, Rivals.com and CBSSports.com, Watt was named Lott IMPACT Defensive Player of the Week three times during the season. He was selected 11th overall by the Houston Texans in the 2011 NFL Draft, the highest for a Wisconsin defensive player since 1992.

In 2009, the UW defensive line exceeded all expectations after losing three senior starters from the prior year. The headliner of the group was senior defensive end O'Brien Schofield, who ranked second in the country with 24.5 tackles for loss, the second-highest total in school history. He also tied for seventh in the country and third in school history with 12.0 sacks, while Watt pitched in with 15.5 tackles for loss. The duo's 40.0 combined tackles for loss were the most by a pair of teammates in the country in 2009.

The defensive line also was instrumental in transforming Wisconsin's rush defense into one of the best in school history. The Badgers led the Big Ten and ranked fifth in the country in rushing defense, allowing just 88.2 yards per game on the ground, the second-best season average in school history. Wisconsin held each of its last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, the longest streak in the country and the longest streak in school history.

In his first year at Wisconsin, Partridge led a veteran line. The three senior starters, Matt Shaughnessy, Mike Newkirk and Jason Chapman, all earned All-Big Ten accolades while Schofield, in his first season as a starter at defensive end, tied for the team lead in sacks. Following the season, Shaughnessy was a third-round draft pick by the Oakland Raiders.

In his work with the specialists, Partridge led four-year starters placekicker Philip Welch and punter Brad Nortman to leave their mark on Wisconsin's record book. Welch, a first-team Freshman All-American

in 2008, finished his career ranked second in school history in points with 384, field goals made with 59 and field goal percentage at .776. Nortman, a two-time honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, was third in school history with a 42.1 career average.

Before his time at Wisconsin, Partridge spent five years at Pitt. For his first four seasons, he coached the defensive line before switching to tutor the Panthers' linebackers in 2007. He also had special teams coaching responsibilities for the last three seasons, including the last two as special teams coordinator.

Pitt ranked No. 5 nationally and led the Big East in total defense in 2007, allowing just 297.7 yards per game. In addition, the Panthers led the conference and were No. 3 in the country in pass defense, surrendering only 167.3 yards per game. Pitt was fourth in the Big East and 20th in the NCAA with 2.92 sacks per contest. The Panthers' signature defensive effort that year came when they shut down high-powered and No. 1-ranked West Virginia in a 13-9 win that eliminated

the Mountaineers from national title contention. Defensive lineman Joe Clermond was a second-team All-Big East selection.

Partridge's special teams units flourished at Pitt. In 2006, his first season as special teams coordinator, Pitt led the Big East in net punting with a 37.54 average and kickoff returns at an average of 24.14 yards per return. Punter Adam Graessle was an All-Big East selection, and kick returner Lowell Robinson led the conference and finished ninth nationally with a 27.9-yard average. ESPN's 2006 college football "play of the year" selection was a 73-yard punt return for a touchdown by Pitt's Darrelle Revis against West Virginia. Revis was drafted 14th overall in the first round by the New York Jets in the 2007 NFL Draft.

Prior to his years at Pitt, Partridge served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach at Eastern Illinois in 2002 and helped lead the team to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs after sharing the Ohio Valley Conference title.

Partridge worked for head coach Dan McCarney at Iowa State from 1998-2001. He

was a defensive graduate assistant in 1998-99 and worked with outside linebackers. He became the program's director of football operations in 2000.

Partridge was an NSCA All-American at Drake, where he played defensive line. Brian Wright came to FAU in January of 2012 and was elevated to Interim Head Coach in October of 2013. Upon the hiring of Charlie Partridge, Wright elected to stay with the program to build what he had begun as FAU's offensive coordinator. He was named Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach by Partridge in December of 2013.

As the Interim Head Coach, Wright drew the team together "realizing it was about the team, the family and being better men" to capture the four-consecutive games, including a victory over Tulane who would earn a New Orleans' Bowl berth at season's end. Wright's reign as interim head coach came to an end with a perfect 4-0 record and the team becoming bowl eligible for the first time since 2008. FAU's offense, led by sophomore quarterback Jaquez Johnson, outscored its last four opponents 151-40, averaged 428.8 yards per game, including a single-game average

240.5 yards on the ground. Defensively, the Owls finished the regular-season ranked No. 11 nationally and with a program record 32 single-season sacks---up from an average of one per game in 2012. Half of the sacks, 16, were recorded in the team's last four games.

Wright accepted the added responsibility as head coach much like he had attacked the task of building an offensive coaching staff upon coming to FAU in 2012 and the task of converting FAU to an up-tempo attack as opposed to the pro-style which had been the Owls' mainstay since inception. To make his task more difficult, he had to do so with just three-starting newcomers returning. By game two the starting quarterback position was solidified. Wright and the offensive staff made great strides by playing to the strengths of each individual and not forcing or sticking to one answer. It began with the quarterbacks. In 2012, senior QB Graham Wilbert improved his efficiency by 68% moving from 91.72 as a junior to 134.62 as a senior. He reduced his

interceptions to six after tossing double-digits in 2011. More importantly for the team, Wilbert spread the ball to eight different receivers for a score after tossing just seven touchdowns the previous season. Wright's system allowed Wilbert to look for answers all over the field which opened the door for the senior to have career games with a season high 403 passing-yards against in-state rival FIU. He used the knowledge of the new system to hurt opponents with the short pass while also finding receivers with 50, 60 and 75 yard passes. Protecting the quarterback was a key to the team's success. FAU was T-104 nationally in sacks allowed prior to Wright's arrival. They improved that rank by 21 spots in 2012 providing more options for the offense to work. To off-set this loss of NFL draftee Alfred Morris, Wright and the offense saw seven individuals carry the ball more than once and not one ended the season with negative yardage and as a unit, they tallied just 38 yards less than the previous season with a

dominate running back. Much of that success can be attributed to fewer sacks eliminating the negative 179 yards lost by the previous season's quarterbacks. To exemplify the total improvement, FAU moved up 22 spots in the national ranking for total yards by improving its average yards per game by 102 yards per game.

Since coming to FAU in 2012, Wright has improved the Owls' total offensive ranking nationally from its season ending 120, out of 123 schools, to a No. 83 spot at the end of the 2013 regular-season. In 2011 the Owls finished with a national rank of 119 in scoring offense. By 2013 that rank had climbed 40 spots to No. 79, including the use of 12 different scoring options. The most prolific was Johnson who rushed for 10 touchdowns, the most of any quarterback in the history of FAU. He was responsible for 22 scores in 2012 which list him among the program's top-10 all-time career scorers with two remaining seasons to play.

In 2013, Wright led the Owls to their third-consecutive season averaging 20+ points per game. FAU has had a similar span from 2007-09 and played in two bowl games during that stretch but did so under two different coordinators. Wright's up-tempo offense was directed by second year starter Jaquez Johnson, who much like his first season under center, concluded his campaign ranked nationally in 14 categories, including No. 56 nationally in passing efficiency. Johnson, will play his final season in 2014 and is in position to break nearly every FAU quarterback record and is listed in 3-of-5 rushing all-time categories. Wright also had the opportunity to see Lucky Whitehead flourish in 2014. The senior receiver led C-USA in receptions and was No. 18 nationally in all-purpose yards. Johnson and Whitehead's ability to connect and the team's scoring success can be attributed to its ground game. Under Wright's direction the team has averaged 154.6 rushing yards per game. Using multiple backs, the

Owls set an all-time program high 2,225 yards in 2013 and tallied the program's second most in 2014 with 1,963.

At Montana State

Brian Wright spent his first two seasons at Montana State debunking the notion that the transition to a new offensive system is inherently difficult. Wright's two Bobcat offenses, led by dynamic quarterback DeNarius McGhee, averaged 440.6 yards per game, easily the most productive two-year span in school history. After leading the Big Sky in scoring offense, total offense and passing offense in 2010, Wright's unit topped the league in scoring offense and total offense in Big Sky games in 2011. Wright handed the reigns, in his first season at MSU, to redshirt freshman quarterback McGhee, who was named Big Sky Offensive Co-MVP, a first at MSU since 1984, and National Freshman of the Year by one organization.

Roc Bellantoni joined the staff in December of 2014 with the task of replacing a defense that had flourished the year before behind the efforts two linebackers and a corner who continued their careers on NFL rosters. Not an easy request, but he did so behind the efforts of returning all-conference selections D'Joun Smith, at corner, and Andrae Kirk, at linebacker. Both players had been consistent

starters during their four-year playing career and both were accustomed to adjustments with Bellantoni being their fourth defensive coordinator in four seasons. Kirk led the Owls in tackles with 103 tackles and became the program's all-time tackle assists leader, while Smith had a team leading eight passes defended and 53 tackles. Often times, the duo were two of the three seniors on the field. Kirk ended the season ranked No. 3 among C-USA tacklers and No. 60 nationally. Smith was No. 16 nationally in kick returns and No. 43 in recovered fumbles. Bellantoni used a steady stream of players throughout 2014 both to gain experience for the younger players and to keep fresh players on the field. The defensive side of the ball also worked through injuries, losing and experienced defensive lineman and a linebacker to season ending injuries. Named Conference USA Recruiter of the Year by Scout.com

Freshman Nate Terry provided game ending heroics hauling in a 20-yard pass as the time ran off the clock to give FAU the 41-37 victory. It was Terry's first collegiate catch. Special teams were a highlight of the Owls in 2014. Senior Lucky Whitehead returned a punt 73 yards for a score in the final game of 2014. Whitehead, who is just the sixth Owl to return a punt for a TD, ended the season ranked No. 4 among C-USA in all-purpose yards and No. 18 nationally, 7th in kick return yards. agent where he was a member of the 2012-13 play-off roster. Allen began recruiting in the spring of 2010 and moved from wide receivers to quarterbacks as the team began preparation for 2011. The quarterback position came out of the spring undecided with no clear-cut leader among the four. As preseason camp opened questions remained, Graham Wilbert was named the starter a week before

the opener. Wilbert suffered a mid-season set back allowing David Kooi the opportunity to step forward only to see sophomore Stephen Curtis take advantage by surpassing Kooi for the No. 2 spot upon Wilbert's return. Allen worked with the inexperienced unit and saw flashes of winning football among the four who had a total of 13 collegiate pass attempts entering the 2011 season. In 2012, the FAU Alum moved once more to tight ends coach. The new offensive system required more of the position than in years past and Allen and his corps responded. At season's end junior Nexon Dorvilus earned second team All-SBC and the team's Student Athlete of the Year Award while sophomore Alex Deleon earned the program's first Iron Owl Award for his off-season efforts in the weight room and in conditioning drills. Both awards exemplify the hard work and dedication that the tight ends bring to their lives, not just to the sport of football. On the field, the duo combined for 14 starts, 43 catches 378 yards and six scores. Dorvilus ended the season tops among all receivers with five touchdowns and third on the team with

301 receiving yards. In 2013, Allen's deep unit was able to provide more protection than in years past while hauling in 20% of the team's receptions. Dorvilus was responsible for six touchdown receptions which was tied for the team lead, despite sharing his time with two other tight ends. The unit accounted for nearly half of the team's TD receptions (7 of 16). Dorvilus earned honorable mention All-Conference for his efforts. Allen remained with the program in 2014 as Partridge assembled his staff but moved to director of player personnel/external relations, a position that would best allow Partridge to lean on Allen's knowledge of the area, the local high schools and their coaching staffs, as well as the developing FAU players and NFL Scouts. With the recruiting foundations laid, Allen will move back to a full-time coaching position where he can have a direct game-day impact and will focus on the run game. The Owls will return four backs in 2015 with game experience as well as a quarterback that has been a major ground game contributor.

The following season, the Oklahoma native traveled to Hawaii where the team dealt the University of Hawaii its only home-field loss in 2004. FAU finished 9-3 in 2004, including a five-game win streak to open the season, all on the road due to hurricanes. Allen concluded his four-year career with 8,100 yards, 50 touchdowns and a program-best 135.1 efficiency rating. He remains a leader in nearly every category and in some cases is listed No. 2 behind alum Rusty Smith.

Miller took over a 2014 line that returned just one every day starter. Miller's opening day line was left tackle Reggie Bain, a true freshman, left guard Mikingson Marsaille, one of squad's biggest players who had seen limited action the year before due to injury, senior Braden Lyons, a senior moving from right end to center, a position he had never played, redshirt-sophomore Dillion DeBoer, who had started the final six games of his freshman campaign, at right guard, and senior Eric Minemyer, who drew his first start after switching back and forth to tight end. By season's end, 11 guys had seen playing time, Bain earned freshman All-America honors by 247Sports.com, and true freshman Joe Gold had served as the center in seven games allowing Lyons to move back to his natural spot at right tackle. The unit better known as the "Atlantic Wall" blocked for 10 different ball carriers who amassed 1,962 yards, just shy of the program record setting 2012 campaign. Quarterback Jaquez Johnson threw for a career high 2,215 yards and 17 TDs. In the first season under Miller, the Owl

quarterbacks were brought down 21 times in 806 opportunities. Holding opponents to just 21 sacks was a five year low.

At New Mexico State

Bart Miller created a new offensive system for the Aggies which yielded 34 points per game and an average of 300 yards per game while rushing for 180 yards per game through the squad's last five games. He took over a line that had allowed 45 sacks and improved that protection by more than half to just 20 in 400+ opportunities. The 2013 line averaged 23 knockdowns per game. His center was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List and two offensive linemen earned a spot on the All-Independent Team.

As the offensive line coach at the University of Wisconsin, Miller was named one of the Big Ten's Best Assistants in 2012 by ESPN.com, after taking over an offensive line in September that ranked 103 nationally in rushing averaging only 101 yards per game,

Miller coached NFL draft picks and 2012 All-Big Ten honorees Ricky Wagner, Ryan Groy and Travis Frederick, while helping to re-establish a physical standard of excellence throughout the unit - resulting in 586 total knockdown blocks in 13 games and four games with over 300 yards rushing in 2012. The Badgers were one of the least penalized teams in the nation, ranking 5th in penalties against and 4th in turnovers

allowed.

In 2011, as a graduate assistant for the Badgers, Miller worked directly with the offensive line and tight ends, helping lead one of the best offenses in the country, averaging 44.1 points per game, 470 total yards per game and 235.6 rushing yards per game. nationally. Whitehead ended his senior campaign as a first team All-Conference USA selection. The program's first -- fist team selection since joining the league in 2013. He was ranked among league leaders in receptions (2), receiving yards (10), kick returns (7) and all-purpose yards (4). Nationally, he was listed in eight categories, including in the top-40 in all-purpose yards (18), combined kick returns (16), kick-returns (36), punt returns (3) and receptions per game (27). Strickland joined the staff in May of 2015 with the task of building a secondary unit vacated by third round draft selection D'Joun Smith.

At Wisconsin

Strickland guided the Badgers' junior CB Darius Hillary to second-team All-Big Ten honors for a 2014 season in which he finished with 41 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss and five pass breakups. Strickland's unit helped the Badgers to field the nation's No. 4-ranked passing defense in 2014. Wisconsin allowed just 168.0 passing yards per game, a number that dropped to 159.8 yards per game in Big Ten play. Opponents completed just 49.0 percent of their passing attempts against the Badgers, a mark that also ranked No. 4 nationally. Wisconsin continued to be especially strong against the pass on third down, allowing opponents to convert just 25.9 percent of their third-down attempts through the air. Opponents completed only 41.4

percent of their passes for an average of 5.8 yards per attempt on third down against the Badgers' defense.

In 2013, the Badgers' defense ranked No. 17 in the country against the pass, giving up just 202.5 yards per game through the air, and ranked in a tie for 13th in the FBS in yards allowed per passing attempt at 6.2. Wisconsin allowed opponents to convert just 25.2 percent of their third-down attempts through the air, the fourth-best mark in the nation. The Badgers ranked No. 3 nationally both in terms of completion percentage (40.7 percent) and yards per attempt (4.37) by opponents on third down.

Strickland's unit also was key in the Badgers matching Michigan State for the national lead in the fewest plays of 10-plus yards allowed with just 125 in 13 games.

Strickland mentored true freshman CB Sojourn Shelton to an impressive debut season, with Shelton tying for third in the Big Ten with four interceptions. His four picks

ranked No. 3 nationally among true freshman, trailing only Virginia Tech teammates Kendall Fuller (6) and Brandon Facyson (5). Shelton's four interceptions were the second-most ever by a UW freshman and the most by a true freshman in school history.

In Strickland's first season, three of the Badgers' four starters in the secondary received 2012 All-Big Ten honors in senior CB Devin Smith, who tied for the Big Ten lead in interceptions, senior CB Marcus Cromartie and junior SS Dezmen Southward.

Strickland spent the 2010 and 2011 seasons as a graduate assistant working with the defense. He returned to Wisconsin in 2009, serving as the team's defensive quality control coordinator.

He is also ranked No. 8 in rushing yards for a QB in the entire NCAA during his sophomore campaign. Wilbert returned for his second season as a GA to assist with building one of the more dynamic offenses in FAU football history. Wilbert's completion rate of 64.4% set a new FAU record while he posted an impressive 138.67 passing efficiency in Sun Belt Conference play. The Californian threw for 4,319 career yards and is listed among the top-five FAU record holders in several categories.

Wilbert, who tossed his first collegiate

touchdown at Auburn, a 17-yard connection with current Washington Redskin running back Alfred Morris, served as FAU's offensive captain for every game in 2011 and 2012. 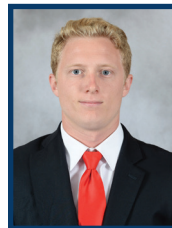

Founded in 1961, Florida Atlantic University is a comprehensive public university that is currently serving more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students at sites strategically located along the state's southeastern coastline. Long known as an outstanding teaching institution, FAU is undergoing rapid development as a center of cutting-edge research, particularly in the biomedical arena. This process has been accelerated by the University's partnerships with four internationally known biomedical research organizations, The Scripps Research Institute, the Vaccine and Gene Therapy Institute, the Torrey Pines Institute for Molecular Studies and the Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience. Additionally, FAU's Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine recently welcomed its third class of students.

Through a well-developed network of partner campuses, FAU serves students at locations and sites throughout its six-county service region in southeast Florida as well as through distance learning. FAU's student body, which ranks as the most ethnically and culturally diverse in Florida's State University System, includes men and women of both traditional and non-

traditional age. Modern student housing is available on the Boca Raton and Jupiter campuses, and all campuses offer attractive and varied dining facilities. The University community is served by an excellent library system that has more than 3.6 million items, including books, periodicals, government documents, microforms, maps, media and other materials as well as a wealth of electronic resources, including more than 374,000 full-text electronic books and 18,000 full-text electronic journals, plus access to several hundred proprietary databases.

A member of Conference USA, FAU has 19 men's and women's intercollegiate teams, including an NCAA Division I football team that has won two bowl games. The Boca Raton campus is home to a new 30,000-seat football stadium.

FAU's 10 academically distinguished colleges are the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters, the College of Business, the College for Design and Social Inquiry, the College of Education, the College of Engineering and Computer Science, the Graduate College, the Harriet L. Wilkes Honors College, the Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine, the Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing and the Charles E. Schmidt College of Science.

The University currently offers more than 180 undergraduate and graduate degree programs and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Additionally, the University holds membership in the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges and the Council of Graduate Schools.

FAU has fully funded Eminent Scholar Chairs in disciplines that include the arts and humanities, brain science, community education, engineering, growth management, Holocaust and Judaic studies, international business, marine biology, nursing, philosophy and social science.

FAU is committed to serving the educational needs of persons of retirement age through non-credit courses offered by the Lifelong Learning Society, which is believed to be the largest and most successful organization of its kind in the United States. JOHN KELLY

PRESIDENT



John Kelly was named president of Florida Atlantic University by unanimous vote of the FAU Board of Trustees on January 17, 2014, becoming the seventh president in the University's 50-year history. He oversees an institution that serves more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students on six campuses and sites along more than 100 miles of Florida's east coast. One of the largest employers in South Florida, FAU has more than 3,000 employees, including 1,000 dedicated faculty members, and an operating

budget in excess of \$700 million. The University has an annual economic impact of \$6.3 billion and is conducting millions of dollars' worth of funded research in such critically important fields as drug discovery, biotechnology, ocean engineering and marine science.

President Kelly came to FAU from Clemson University, where he held a succession of leadership positions over a 28-year period. During that time, Clemson advanced from 78th to 20th in the U.S. News & World Report rankings of all public universities. At FAU, President Kelly is leading a multifaceted campaign to take the University to national prominence as a center of world-class education, cutting-edge research and transformative community engagement. He initiated a year-long collaborative process involving faculty, students, alumni, administrators, staff and friends of the University that culminated in

creation of a new 10-year strategic plan titled "The Race to Excellence." This comprehensive plan builds upon FAU's existing strengths and identifies emerging opportunities.

Highlights of President Kelly's first year in office include announcement of a record-breaking \$16 million gift from the Schmidt Family Foundation to build a premier academic/athletic facility on the Boca Raton campus — the largest single gift in the University's history. He also announced an agreement with Scripps Florida and the Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience to establish a unique partnership on the Jupiter campus. The program offers FAU students the rare and valuable opportunity to work side by side with some of the world's most distinguished biomedical researchers, including Nobel Laureates.

Active on the national level, President Kelly has served on the boards of the Administrative

Heads Section of the National Association of State Universities and Land-grant Colleges (now the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities) and the American Distance Education Consortium.

He began his academic career in 1982 as an assistant professor at Texas A&M University. Three years later, he went to Clemson, rising through the ranks to become professor and department head by 1991. He was named vice president for public service and agriculture in 1997 and vice president for economic development in 2010.

President Kelly holds a bachelor's degree from Clemson and both a master's degree and a Ph.D. from The Ohio State University. He is married to FAU First Lady Carolyn Kelly, and they are the parents of Carly, 13, and Stella, 1½.

PAT CHUN

VICE PRESIDENT AND DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Pat Chun is in his fourth year at the helm of the Florida Atlantic Department of Athletics. He was named director of athletics July 2, 2012 and quickly guided the Owls through an aggressive period of growth

capitalizing on the limitless potential of Florida Atlantic. He was elevated to vice president by John Kelly in June of 2014.

At Florida Atlantic, Chun provides leadership for 19 varsity sports with over 450 student-athletes as well as 150 staff members. The overarching goal has been student-athlete success and their respective development

academically, athletically and socially.

Transformational work began immediately. In November of 2012, Chun engineered FAU's move into Conference USA. The Owls made their historic move into the new conference on July 1, 2013.

A monumental step towards the goal of student-athlete success occurred with the launch of the program's first strategic plan in the history of the department of athletics. This was done through the collective efforts of the athletics senior leadership team, coaches and staff. The strategic plan also identified the core values of the department: excellence, innovation, teamwork and integrity.

A major step in bolstering the athletics program has been the hiring of experienced coaches in alignment with the ideal of student-athlete success. Since his arrival, Chun has hired six head coaches, including head football coach Charlie Partridge.

As part of Florida Atlantic's Athletic Department's commitment to build

relationships within the South Florida community. On December 2, 2015, FAU announced the largest single gift in university history, which would be directed to the design and construction of a new athletics facility to be named the Schmidt Family Complex for Academic and Athletic Excellence.

Chun also has helped bring numerous outside sporting events to Boca Raton including the annual Boca Raton Bowl, televised nationally by ESPN.

At the conclusion of his third year with the Owls, the department's effort towards the core values began to show with a record number of student athletes earning a 3.0 G.P.A. (50%), two teams (baseball and softball) advancing to NCAA postseason play and a cultural shift that showed leadership in community outreach.

Prior to Florida Atlantic, Chun spent 15 years at The Ohio State University working at his alma mater. In his last role

at Ohio State, Chun provided leadership and oversight for all facets of the external relations division from 2009-12. Chun also served as the daily administrative liaison with the football program.

On a national level Chun was selected in 2013 and currently serves on the NCAA Division I baseball selection committee. Locally, he serves on the YMCA of South Palm Beach County Board of Trustees. Chun is currently a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

A native of Strongsville, Ohio, Chun is a graduate of Holy Name High School. He earned a bachelor's degree from The Ohio State University and a master's degree from Duquesne University. He and his wife, Natalie, have three daughters (Vanna, Kennedy and Gretta).

CONFERENCE USA 2015-16

Conference USA enters its third decade in 2015-16 as it continues to compete and promote the success of its student-athletes. The league has adapted to the ever-changing landscape of collegiate athletics over its first 20 seasons, but the commitment to excellence, integrity, leadership and its student athletes in competition, academics and community is unwavering.

Conference USA enjoys a far-reaching fan base with its 14 members: Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion, Rice, Southern Miss, UAB, UTEP, UTSA and WKU.

Debuting in 1995, Conference USA teams have combined for 88 bowl appearances in football, 102 NCAA Tournament appearances in basketball, including three Final Fours, 63 NCAA baseball appearances including six College World Series berths, 79 NCAA soccer

tournament appearances including four trips to the College Cup, and 35 individual national champions in track and field and cross country.

Success is not limited to athletic achievement, however, as 197 Conference USA student-athletes have garnered Academic All-America honors, 691 have achieved academic all-district laurels and thousands of student-athletes have earned a college degree.

Conference USA sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball).

The league promotes the scholar-athlete ideal, honoring outstanding academic achievement with numerous conference-sponsored awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and

the Commissioner's Academic Medal as well as sport-specific All-Academic teams.

C-USA annually awards postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Awards, Scholar-Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award. Additionally, Conference USA presents a Spirit of Service Award three times each year, recognizing student-athletes who excel on the field, in the classroom and give back to the community through significant service efforts and participation.

In addition to the numerous NCAA Tournament berths, C-USA has sent four men's soccer teams to the NCAA College Cup, three softball teams to the Women's College World Series and three volleyball teams to the NCAA Sweet 16. The league has also had 35 national champions in NCAA track and field competition, one national champion in diving, and numerous NCAA individual and team competitors in cross country, golf, swimming, tennis, and track and field. Overall, Conference

USA teams and individuals have made more than 1,900 NCAA appearances.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in academic performance of student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 20 years, nearly 30,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

C-USA ON TV

C-USA enjoys significant television exposure through partnerships with FOX Sports Media Group, CBS Sports Network, ESPN and American Sports Network (ASN). The multi-tiered selection process that is rooted in partnering with all four networks has substantially increased the number of

national and regional appearances for football, men's and women's basketball, and all other conference sports.

C-USA membership include institutions within eight of the Top 40 media markets and four in the Top 25 according to Nielsen. C-USA home markets this year will include more than 13 million TV households, a 30 percent increase from two years ago.

C-USA DIGITAL NETWORK

The C-USA Digital Network officially launched in August of 2011. Network programming includes live streaming of non-televised events, video on demand, a weekly C-USA studio show, podcasting, regular-season and championship event highlights, and conference-produced feature stories. In its first year, 1,164 events were streamed live and 8,126 videos were posted and available on the C-USA Digital Network, and those numbers have more than doubled. Monthly and yearly subscriptions provide fans access to events offered on all of the C-USA member

institution's athletic websites as well as C-USA network programming.

C-USA IN THE COMMUNITY

The conference's current footprint is concentrated with 14 members in 10 states and a combined area population of more than 30 million. With a commitment to community involvement, the conference developed several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations. Individually, student-athletes are recognized each season through the Spirit of Service award.

GOVERNANCE

Conference USA has significant representation in the NCAA governance structure. The presidents of the member institutions serve as the league's Board of Directors.

A PROUD HISTORY

Conference USA was formed in 1995 and quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. The conference unveiled its name, logo and commissioner April 24, 1995, in Chicago. The league's charter members were Charlotte, Cincinnati, DePaul, Houston, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, Saint Louis, Southern Miss, Tulane, UAB and USF. Eleven of the institutions began athletic participation in 1995, while Houston joined competition in the fall of 1996.

The league's headquarters were established in Chicago and, after nine years, relocated to the current office in Irving, Texas. Britton Banowsky was named Commissioner in October 2002, succeeding Mike Slive, the league's first commissioner.

C-USA added East Carolina (September, 1996) and the United States Military Academy (March, 1997) as football members. ECU began league competition in 1997; Army in 1998 and UAB began football play in 1999. The league brought in

TCU and ECU (1999) for all sports and they began competition in 2001. USF started C-USA football in 2003. Marshall, Rice, SMU, Tulsa, UCF and UTEP became full-time Conference USA members for all sports in 2005.

In 2013, charter member Charlotte returned to C-USA and was joined by new members FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion and UTSA. WKU joined the league on July 1, 2014.
