FLORIDA ATLANTIC AT WKU

Only team in America - Florida Atlantic University's football team was the only team in the country to play two Top 20 teams in back-to-back weeks to open the 2019 season. FAU opened with No. 5 Ohio State and played No. 18 UCF the following week.

Scoring 21 on Ohio State - The Owls opened the 2019 season at Ohio State, 8-0, and were successful finding the end zone, more so than any opponent since.

The Owls are averaging 33.11 yards per game.

Seeing Red - The FAU offense has been nearly immaculate in the red zone, scoring on all but two of its 37 attempts (94.5%) this season. That number is good for eighth in FBS and No. 1 among C-USA schools.

The Take Away - Florida Atlantic is 6-3

on the season. The Owls are bowl eligible for the fifth time in program history (began in 2001 and were first eligible to play for an FBS Bowl in 2007). It is the second time since Lane Kiffin came to FAU in 2017.

The Road Victory - The Owls' 41-31 win over Ball State was the first non-conference road win since 2013 at USF. Outside the state of Florida, the last non-conference road win was in 2010 at UAB. The Owls are 4-1 on the road in 2019 with the lone loss coming at Ohio State.

Cover Corners - FAU's opponents have paid the price for testing its boundary coverage. Cornerback James Pierre notched two interceptions in the Owls' win over Western Kentucky; Meiko Dotson already has two such performances on the year. The seven interceptions between them is the most among any pair of C-USA teammates.

Tight End Duo - Senior tight ends Harrison Bryant and John Raine have snagged a combined 70 receptions through nine games,

Harrison Bryant Named Preseason C-USA

Florida Atlantic University senior tight end Harrison Bryant was named to the 2019 Conference USA Football Preseason Team, as announced by the league on July 12. The team was chosen by the league's 14 head coaches.

Bryant is expected to return and hold down his role as the Owls' starting tight end for the third consecutive season. Bryant started each of the team's 12 games a year ago and finished his junior campaign with the second most receiving yards and the second most receiving touchdowns on the team. The Georgia native uses his size to provide protection, and consistent hands to make him a quarterback favorite. He has played in 35 games over the last three seasons, improving his production in each. Bryant has a career total of 1,133 yards receiving and nine scores.

"I want to thank the coaches that selected me for this award as well as my teammates, coaches and support staff that has helped me grow on and off the field the past four years," said Bryant.

Notes on the Preseason Team

- Bryant is the first FAU tight end to be selected to a C-USA preseason team
- Six of FAU's previous preseason selections have been drafted or signed a NFL free agent contract
- Four previous selections are currently on an NFL contracts
- The only year FAU did not have a player selected for the preseason team (2017), the squad finished 11-3 and captured the league title

C-USA Media Predicts a Third Place Eastern Division Finish for the FAU Owls

Florida Atlantic University football has been picked to finish third among the Conference USA Eastern Division members, by the league's selected media members, announced C-USA on July 16.

The Owls, who received three first place votes, finished 2018 with a 5-7 record and posted a 3-5 mark in C-USA play. FAU is predicted to finish behind Marshall, picked to win the East with 14 first place votes, and FIU, which had nine votes.

FAU will host both Marshall and FIU in 2019. The Owls will play host to Marshall on Friday, Oct. 18 at 6:30 p.m. and will host FIU, in the 18th Annual Shula Bowl, on Saturday, Nov. 9 at 6 p.m. CBS Sports Network will carry the Marshall contest while STADIUM is scheduled to broadcast the Shula Bowl, an event that the Owls have won 12 of the 17 meetings, including a 49-14 victory a year ago, in Miami.

The Owls are expected to be led by seniors Harrison Bryant (TE), who was a preseason C-USA selection, and Rashad Smith (LB). The duo represented FAU at the 2019 Football C-USA Media Day event held in Dallas, Wednesday, July 17 and Thursday, July 18.

FAU will open its season Saturday, August 31 at Ohio State. The noon game will be broadcast on Fox. The C-USA season opener is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 28 at Charlotte. That Charlotte contest will be the first FAU game to air on NFL Network. It also marks the first time the Owls ended a conference season versus the same opponent that they opened league play with the following season. Regardless of the back-to-back league encounters, both teams will be vying for the opportunity to play in the Saturday, Dec. 7 C-USA Championship game.

THE LATEST NEWS/TRENDS

Back-to-Back C-USA Top Recruiting Classes - Lane Kiffin surprised prognosticators his first season with the quality of recruits attracted in such a short span. The question seemed to be whether he repeat in years to come. With the opportunity to recruit to FAU for a full season and with the success of the 2017 team, the Owls accumulated the No. 1 recruiting class in C-USA. Following a 5-7 season, those same prognosticators anticipated a drop. With his cards held close to the vest and no official announcement of signees, the Owls once again built a class tabbed as C-USA's best. Recently, Rivals tweeted its top-five high school football states: 1. State of south Florida, 2. Florida, 3. Texas, 4. California, 5. Georgia. FAU's summer roster has 83 members from the state of Florida, including 23 from the state of "south Florida" (Broward and Miami-Dade Counties).

In Two Seasons – In two seasons at FAU under the direction of Lane Kiffin the Owls tallied a 16-10 mark, broke 54 records (either program, conference or NCAA) and were one of just two schools to have two running backs drafted in 2019 (FAU and Alabama). Kiffin orchestrated this while building a new staff each of the three years. Just Kevin Smith (running backs) and Clint Trickett (tight ends) have been on staff as an assistant coach each of the first two seasons. Both DJ McCarthy (wide receivers) and Jeff Norrid (offensive line) have been with the program for one season each as analyst and have stepped into the role of assistant coach in 2019. Charlie Weis, Jr (offensive coordinator), Jaron Fairman (special teams coordinator) and Wes Neighbors will begin their second season as coordinators/assistant coaches. It will be Fairman's third season with the Owls. His first was as an analyst. The Owls welcome Glenn Spencer (defensive coordinator/LBs), Lance Thompson (DL/recruiting coordinator and **Jason Jones** (cornerbacks) to the staff in 2019.

Owls' Defense – Glenn Spencer joined the Owls in the spring of 2019 with a heavy task: Return the Owls' defense to its stingy 2017 nature and do so after losing four of the team's top seven tacklers to graduation, three of which are vying for an NFL roster spot. The Owls will return Rashad Smith who led the Owls with 86 total tackles and four interceptions.

Making the Grades - PFF College rated C-USA returning tight ends, with senior **Harrison Bryant** leading the class by a substantial margin with an 87.0 percentage. The next highest with more than 25 targets, is Jordan Myers from Rice at 73.5 percent.

Academically – 28 members of the football team earned a 3.0 GPA or above during the spring semester: Justin Agner, Hosea Barnwell V, Bryan Beck, Anthony Bennett, Ean Biancardi, James Brunson, Harrison Bryant, Khantrell Burden, Dante Cousart, William Davis, Collen Dell, Junior Diaz,

Aussie Connection – Confidence in the kicking game was not something the Owls headed into the offseason with. The Owls looked down under for the answer by signing punter Matt Hayball. Hayball, whose more natural bo2015ot is a rugby style, tallied nine punts in game one, with a long of 70 yards. His 47.2 yard average was critical in the first half, a half that saw his number called eight times. In the Owls' 19-year history, just one other player has used a rugby style. Mickey Groody (2007-11) adopted the style late in his career to avoid pressure. The only other international kicker to dot FAU's roster was Greg Joseph (2013-17) was born in South Africa, but grew up in Boca Raton and played American football in high school at nearby American Heritage-Delray.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

tops among all FBS tight end duos. Raine has five TDs, Bryant one.

First Among Linebackers - While Akileis Leroy didn't rush the passer much in 2018, he's dominating in that role this year. The junior has 6.5 sacks in nine games - tied for first among FBS linebackers. He also is 19th nationally in tackles for a loss with 1.4 per game. In all, he is listed in the nation's top-100 four times (FF 18, Sacks 34, 19 TFL, TT 96).

Academic All-American Nominations - Four Owls have been nominated for Academic All-American: Harrison Bryant (Sr., TE), Ray Ellis (Graduate Student, DL), Junior Diaz (Graduate Student, C) and Dante Cousart (Graduate Student, WR/PR).

Making the Grade - Quarterback Chris Robison completed 80.5 percent of his passes against Ball State, the third highest mark of his career.

Protecting the Ball Equals Wins - Robison struggled to protect the ball as a freshman. In his first campaign, he had tossed three INT through three games and ended the year with 12. He has lessened the mistakes in 2019, to just four, including two at the the end of a half. Through 20 starts, the Owls are 7-1 when he throws no INTs and 4-8 when opponents record a pick.

Right Place, Right Time, All Game - That's the only way to describe linebacker Rashad Smith's early-season play. He recovered two fumbles against Ball State, increasing his season total to three. He added an interception versus Wagner and another versus MT. Smith has the most turnovers created among FBS linebackers and is No. 2 nationally in fumbles recovered.

Surpassing a High - Wide receiver John Mitchell came into the year with only 129 career receiving yards. He nearly eclipsed that number in the Ball State game alone, breaking out to the tune of 124 yards and three touchdowns on eight receptions. He currently is third on the squad with 45.78 yards per game. He has 29 catches for 412 yards and four TDs. For his carrer, Mitchell has 41 receptions for 540 yards and five scores

Four Score - USF graduate transfer DeAngelo Antoine followed John Mitchell's program-record tying Week Three performance – three touchdowns – with a record-breaking one of his own. Against Wagner, Antoine snagged an FAU-high four scores, along with 173 yards and 11 catches.



Breaking in the Backs - Florida Atlantic has a rich tradition of freshmen running backs taking the stage and freshman running back Larry McCammon III is next in line, although he has been slowed by injury. Here is a look at FAU freshman running back history:

Larry McCammon, 2019: 89 attempts for 315 yards and seven touchdowns; averaging 3.5 yards per carry, 39,38 yards per game and has a long carry of 20.

Devin Singletary, 2016: 152 attempts for 1021 yards and 12 touchdowns; averaged 6.7 yards per carry, 85.1 yards per game and had a long of 66. Appeared in 12 games.

Buddy Howell, 2014: 50 attempts for 253 yards and one touchdown; averaged 5.1 yards per carry, 84.3 yards per game and had a long of 22. Appeared in three games.

Jay Warren, 2013: 71 attempts for 340 yards and two touchdowns; averaged 4.8 yards per carry, 34 yards per game and had a long of 47. Appeared in 10 games.

Alfred Morris, 2008: Seven attempts for 23 yards and zero touchdowns; averaged 3.3 yards per carry, 2.1 yards per game and had a long of nine. Appeared in 11 games.

Doug Parker, 2001: 158 attempts for 572 yards and eight touchdowns; averaged 3.6 yards per carry, 57.2 yards per game and had a long of 30. Appeared in 10 games.

Year One versus Year Two - Quarterback Chris Robison is improving mightily in his second year as the Owls' starter. He tied an FAU record with five passing touchdowns against Wagner, totaling nine versus Wagner and Ball State. Among FBS passers with at least 13 touchdowns, Robison is listed among the nation's best in 10 categories statistically.

Breakout Speed - Sophomore Malcolm Davidson shows breakaway speed and has used that speed to break into the starting lineup. Davidson has the longest carries despite being sidelined with injury early on. He is first on the team with 61 attempts, and first with 364 yards. Davidson averages 6.0 yards per carry and he has added five touchdowns. His longest run of the year is a 57-yard score versus Middle Tennessee. His freshman season was filled with specials teams work with two NFL back playing in front of him. He did not play versus WKU.

Recovering the Ball - Senior linebacker Rashad Smith led the team in sacks in 2017 with 6.0. He led the team in 2018 with four interceptions. He tallied a program-tying three fumble recoveries just three games into 2019. Smith is listed No. 1 nationally in fumble recoveries, and has added two interceptions and 2.5 sacks in 2019.

Becoming a Leader – Senior safety Da'Von Brown transformed himself in the offseason, knowing the Owls needed a leader. Brown dove into his playbook in the offseason, learned the new system under a new defensive coordinator (his fourth in as many years), and drew his first collegiate start versus Ohio State and his second versus UCF. Brown backed up his vocal leadership with eight tackles including one for a loss of a yard at OSU. He added six versus UCF and eight at Ball State, with a forced fumble and eight stops in the FAU win over Middle Tennessee. He is cur-



rently third on the squad with 49 TT.

C-USA Selects

Deangelo Antoine was named Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week, as announced by the league on Monday. Sept. 23rd. Antoine's honor is the second C-USA Player of the Week award in as many weeks and after as many victories for the Owls. Last week, Rashad Smith got the nod for his defensive efforts and this week it is was bestowed to the offensive side.

Antoine, the first FAU wide receiver to earn C-USA player of the week honors, joined the Owls after a four-year playing career at USF, where he saw time at both receiver and defensive back. Last week, the graduate transfer was asked to move from wide receiver to slot and the move was not a only breakout, it was record-breaking. Antoine, who has also been named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness, found the end zone in 36% of his catches, as he went for 11 receptions for 173 yards and four touchdowns.

His four TDs marked just the eighth time in C-USA's 25-year history that a player has caught four or more TDs in a game. Two players have caught five and Antoine is the sixth player to catch four in a game and the first since 2016. The four TDs one-upped the bar set by teammate John Mitchell, who had three a week ago at Ball State, and set a new single-game record for FAU, breaking the previous mark of three set by Cortez Gent in 2008 and equaled by Mitchell. Antoine's TD receptions were for 37, 17, 28 and 57 yards and most were made after the catch. Antoine's efforts helped FAU towards a 42-7 win over Wagner.



Rashad Smith, a senior linebacker, has been named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week, as announced by the C-USA office on Monday, Sept. 16.

Smith's performance in the Owls' win over Ball State could best be described as opportunistic. Smith, from Florida City, Florida, tallied six tackles, including a sack for a loss of eight yards, a tackle

for a loss of two yards, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries, including one in the end zone to prevent a Ball State score. The victory marked the first time since 2013 that the Owls recorded a non-conference road victory.

Smith began the contest with the Owls' first tackle and it was for a loss. He assisted on FAU's second tackle of the day, which again prevented BSU from gaining even one yard and following an incompletion, the Owls had forced a three-and-out. On BSU's seventh play of the day they met once more with Smith via a fumble recovery and a four-yard return at the Ball State 31, which set up the first scoring drive of the game, putting FAU on the scoreboard first. Smith's third tackle ended a four-yard run. His fourth was two plays later stopping BSU at the 24.

Potentially his biggest play of the day concluded the scoring drive that BSU began at their 17 and then marched 76 yards down field. On 1st and 10 at the 17, BSU rushed for 13 yards before FAU senior safety Da'Von Brown made a tackle and forced the ball free and into the end zone, where a trailing Smith dove on the ball. The Owls would use that game-swinging momentum to drive 80 yards, score and take a 28-17 lead. In BSU's opening drive of the four quarter, Smith would record a tackle and force a fumble, which FAU recovered and again used to score. His last tackle of the day, an assist, was part of BSU's last drive as Smith has been asked to play nearly every defensive play in FAU's first three games.



Akileis Leroy, junior linebacker from Albany, Georgia, has been named Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week after his performance in FAU's 35-24 win at WKU last Saturday.

Leroy had a career high 12 tackles, including five solo, two sacks for a loss of 21 yards, a pass breakup and a forced fumble against a WKU team that had lost just one C-USA game on a on a last-minute field goal a week prior. Saturday's game saw several lead changes and momentum shifts. Leroy's single most-important tackle came midway through the second quarter with the Hilltoppers holding a 14-0 lead. On second and six at the WKU 36, Leroy recorded his second sack of the game and it was a big one. The sack, which head coach Lane Kiffin called the single biggest game-changer, was for a loss of 11 yards and he forced a fumble on the play freeing the ball for cornerback Chris Tooley to scoop and score from 25 yards out. The play breathed life into the Owls. FAU used his momentum-shifter to battle back, outscoring the Hilltoppers 35-10 in the last three quarters.

Leroy is the third Owl to receive C-USA recognition in 2019. Wide Receiver Deangelo Antoine claimed the first and fellow linebacker Rashad Smith the second honor.

Painting the Field with Receptions - Deangelo Antoine caught four TD receptions versus Wagner. He is one of only six FBS players with four receiving touchdowns in a single game this season. His game also marked the eighth time in C-USA history that a player caught four or more TDs in a game. Two players have caught five and Antoine is the sixth player to catch four in a game and the first since 2016. Antoine earned C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts (9/23/19).

Production X 3 - FAU's offense was consistently productive against Charlotte, scoring at least 10 points in each of the first three quarters. The last time it did that was Week 7, 2017, a 69-31 victory over North Texas. The Owls are outscoring opponents 263-210 through eight games. They have been outscored by 28 points in the first quarter but make up the rest of the game by nearly a 20 point margin in each of the remaining three quarters.

One-Two Punch - Sophomore running back Malcolm Davidson broke out for 113 all-purpose yards and two scores in Week 5 at Charlotte, forming a dangerous one-two punch with freshman Larry McCammon. Week 6, versus Middle Tennessee, Davidson had 149 yards, to average 131 yards per C-USA game to that point. The duo has combined for 12 rushing touchdowns this season. It was James Charles and Chauncey Mason who took over in the WKU Contests with a combined total of 125 yards

Pierre for Two- Corner James Pierre recorded two drivestoping interceptions versus WKU to help the Owls' efforts in a 35-21 win in Bowling Green. For his efforts, Pierre was named as College Football Madness C-USA defensive player of the week.

The Owls' most consistent defender. In 2018, tallied a team-high 86 tackles, including 5.5 for a loss of 16, one sack, a team-high four INTs and one fumble recovery, at FIU. Has picked up 2019 moved down to 2nd on the team with 66 tackles. Defense includes 3 FR, 1 FF, 1 QBH, 2 INT and 2.5 sack.



Vocal leader who has made the transition from a special teams player to an everyday starter. Leads the team with 13 tackles for a loss of 54 yards, including 4.5 sacks for a loss of 33 yards, including 6.5 sacks. Has 55 tackles in 2019. Has a team leading 67 tackles.



Lane Kiffin was named Florida Atlantic University's head football coach on Dec. 13, 2016 and stated in his introductory press conference that "to do the impossible, you must see the invisible."

Few saw the invisible; however Kiffin's extensive college and professional coaching experience allowed him to see what FAU could be, the impossible. That December day he began his task to accelerate the development of the university's ambitions to transform college football in South Florida all while continuing the Owls' football team's classroom successes.

By the first Wednesday in February, Kiffin had assembled one of the best and most highly-acclaimed coaching staffs in the country. That staff built the highest-rated recruiting class in Conference USA. The returning players had begun to learn the "fourth quarter program" and collectively the staff was not done seeking out players that would contribute in 2017.

Spring practice began, which was the first opportunity for the staff work with the returning players on the practice field. They evaluated and hit the recruiting trails once more, filling gaps and building a future. That process continued through preseason camp when the Owls were joined by several transfers and the team was assembled.

FAU would stumble in a six-hour Navy game and then travel to Wisconsin, where they remained for five days due to a hurricane and its damage to South Florida. Upon returning, the Owls defeated Bethune-Cookman to garner Kiffin his first win. A trip to Buffalo that dealt FAU its third loss may have been the team's turning point, as FAU then tallied a program-high 10 consecutive convincing victories, the second longest active streak in the coun-

try. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. Along the way, 41 individual or team records were amassed, and an FAU-record 21 players earned All-Conference USA recognition. Devin Singletary, who rushed for 32 touchdowns, the third most all-time nationally, became the first FAU player to receive AP All-America honors and was named C-USA's MVP. The Owls captured their second conference title, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained). Individually, Singletary led the nation in touchdowns and points scored, Jalen Young was No. 2 in interceptions and Azeez Al-Shaair was No. 5 in total tackles. Kiffin was named Palm Beach County Coach of the Year in March of 2018 for his efforts in guiding the team to its 11-3 mark, C-USA crown and Boca Bowl victory.

Kiffin, who remained on the National Coach of the Year ballot through much of the season, brought unparalleled attention to FAU. While every game was televised, he became a regular on "ESPN's Game Day" as did "phathead" images and videos of a "Lane Train" moving through campus.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to a SEC Title and to the National Championship game. Hurt was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the year and the SEC Freshman of the Year. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, the Earl

Campbell Tyler Rose Award, a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and the Davey O'Brien Award, presented annually to the nation's top quarterback. Hurts completed 240 passes for a total of 2,780 yards compared to just nine INTS. He tossed 23 touchdowns and scored another 13 with his feet and was a 1,161-yard rusher.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns. Henry's 2,219 yards was also the fifth-most rushing yards in a single season in college football history.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a schoolrecord 3,487 passing yards and 3,837 yards of total offense while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. He ranked tied for fourth nationally in total QBR (83.7) and seventh in passing efficiency (157.9). Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Kiffin's offense ranked 17th nationally in total offense per game (484.5) while scoring an average of 36.9 points per game. The passing game averaged a school-record 277.9 yards per game (3,890) to rank 28th nationally and fourth in the SEC. Amari Cooper won the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's best receiver, after catching a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise

Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year. Quarterback Matt Barkley, who won the Wuerffel Trophy, set conference records for passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Kiffin led the Trojans to a 10-2 record in 2011 and a sixth-place finish in the final Associated Press poll. The team finished first in the Pac-12 South with a 7-2 mark. His 2011 USC offense produced a 3,500-yard passer, a pair of 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher. Three Trojans earned First Team All-America honors (Matt Kalil, Robert Woods and T.J. McDonald) and five were named Freshman All-Americans.

In his first year as the head coach at USC, Kiffin led the Trojans to an 8-5 record (5-4 Pac-10). Before his arrival, the Trojans were averaging 26.5 points per game in scoring offense and 389.1 yards per game in total offense. In his first two seasons, those numbers increased to 31.0 points per game and 431.5 yards in 2011 and 35.8 points and 456.8 yards in 2012.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures. Tennessee improved from 17.3 to 29.3 points per game while going from 268.8 to 383.5 yards per game in total offense.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including

two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). During his first tenure with the Trojans, USC captured two national championships and compiled a 65-12 record. Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

He took over as USC's offensive coordinator in 2005 and led the Trojans to a scoring average of 49.1 points per game and 579.8 yards per game of total offense during his two years as offensive coordinator. Kiffin started at USC in 2001 as the tight ends coach and then coached the wide receivers during his remaining five years.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as offensive line assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

Kiffin attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.







- Ohio State (1-0) needed four plays on the opening drive, with a 51-yard run for the score
- After the Owls were held to a three-andout, a long punt return gave OSU a short field
- Two plays later, a 25-yard touchdown pass doubled the lead, and the next Buckeye drive ended in 31-yard passing score for to make it 21-0
- A fourth 1st quarter score for OSU came on a 29-yard pass
- Akileis Leroy smothered the Buckeyes' quarterback to eventually force a punt late in the period
- James Charles moved the chains as the Owls took possession into the 2nd quarter
- OSU was forced into a second straight punt when a Korel Smith blitz flushed the QB out of the pocket and Leighton McCarthy pushed him out of bounds for a sack
- Matt Hayball boomed a 70-yard punt to pin OSU to their own 11
- Again, Leroy continued to be a presence in the backfield, picking up the Owls' second sack of the day. On the next play, Damian Horton got pressure to earn a OB hurry
- FAU recorded with the first turnover of the game, as a backwards pass was mishandled and Quran Hafiz came up with the fumble recovery midway through the 2nd
- Jaylen Joyner was the next defensive lineman with a hurry, leading to another OSU punt
- The next Buckeye drive also ended in a turnover, as on a rush, Leroy forced a fumble, recovered by Rashad Smith
- That gave FAU good field position, at the OSU 25, and Chris Robison found Harrison Bryant for back-to-back completions, of six yards and seven yards, to move it to the 12
- Vladimir Rivas put the Owls on the board, splitting the uprights with a 28-yard field goal with 33 seconds left to go in the half
- FAU got the ball to start the 3rd, and picked up back-to-back 1st downs on a screen pass to Larry McCammon III (12 yards) and a catch by John Raine (14 yards)
- Robinson found Bryant on a beautiful leaping snag for 26 yards, and coupled with a roughing-the-passer penalty on the same play, the Owls had a 1st down on the OSU 12

- The longest FAU gain of the afternoon came when Robison floated a pass to "Pico" Tavaris Harrison for 38 yards

 Bryant hauled in a 16-yard pass to move within the 10
- Three plays after that, Robison got his first TD pass of the day, a three-yard completion to Raine. Rivas' extra point pulled the Owls back to within three scores 42-21
- With OSU milking the clock, James Pierre stuffed a QB rush for a loss of five
- The Owls' defense held the Buckeyes to a field goal attempt, which was good from 46

- The Knights quickly turned the new possession into a 57-yard touchdown pass to go up 14-0 with 9:36 left in the first quarter
- The Owls went three and out on their second possession of the game. UCF took over on their own 29-yard line
- FAU's defense forced the first three and out of the day for UCF. FAU took over at its own 25-yard line

- After another quick FAU drive, the Knights added to their lead, going ahead 41-6. Marcel Southall blocked the extra point attempt
- A Robison pass was picked off by the Knights, which UCF quickly converted into a 28-yard touchdown
- Larry McCammon scored his second career touchdown on a three-yard rush, followed by Robison finding Dante Cousart for a successful two-point conversion, completing the scoring for the night

- The first two Cardinal plays were for naught: Rashad Smith hit a receiver as soon as he caught the first pass for a loss, and he and Ray Ellis bottled up a back right at the line of scrimmage
- After a completion on 3rd down from Chris

Robison to Tavaris Harrison, the Owls went for it on their own 34. Larry McCammon III went for eight yards on 4th-and-1 to move the chains

- Smith continued to shine, picking up a fumble on a missed connection when Ball State was attempting a reverse
- That gave the ball to the Owls on the BSU 31. The drive began on a six-yard successful shovel pass to Deangelo Antoine; then, Robison found John Mitchell for nine yards and a first down, to the 16
- The Owls then continue to move the ball in chunks: James Charles on the ground for four yards and five; Robison got three on a keeper for the first down; and then Robison put FAU on the board with a four-yard slant to John Raine for the score
- After forcing a BSU punt, the Owls to the edge of Cardinal territory with first down catches by Raine and Dante Cousart, and across midfield on an eightyard jet sweep by Antoine

 first down; however, his second saw a BSU forced fumble, scoop and score to

- Then a wide-open connection from Robison to Mitchell, for 33 yards, knotted up the game
- The Owls' defense held firm despite a 51-yard quarterback run to take it into the red zone. A two-yard rush and two incompletions came before a 30-yard Cardinal field goal
- Facing a long 3rd down after back-to-back losses, Robison again hooked up
 with Mitchell in space for 22 yards. That gave the senior wideout 75 yards in
 the game, not just the most in a game in his career, but more than in any prior
 season in total
- With BSU driving late in the half, Leighton McCarthy came up with an eightyard sack, his second of the season (and the second of the day for the Owls,
 following Tim Bonner's a handful of plays earlier). The drive would end as the
 Cardinals missed a 40-yard field goal attempt
- Again the Owls got near midfield, Robison to Mitchell for 17 more (giving him 92 yards in the first half)
- An 11-yard completion to Harrison preceded an 18-yard run by McCammon, down to the BSU 26
- McCammon then went for five, and eight, the latter another first down that put
 the ball into the red zone, to the 13
- On 3rd-and-6 from the nine-yard line, a facemask penalty on BSU at the edge
 of the goal line made for an automatic first down at the four
- Robison scrambled and then again found Mitchell for his second score of the day, and gave FAU the lead heading into the locker room
- After the Owls forced a half-opening punt, Robison found Harrison Bryant in stride for a 52-yard catch-and-run on their first play
- With just over 11 minutes on the clock, Robison went to Mitchell for four yards, giving him exactly 100 on the day
- The Owls fell a yard short on a 4th down conversion attempt, turning it over to the Cardinals
- BSU was on the precipice of regaining the lead, but Da'Von Brown punched out the ball from the running back inside the five, and Smith fell on it in the end zone for his second recovery of the day
- FAU went deep on the first play, Robison to Harrison for 48 yards, and five plays later, McCammon punched it in from the one for an 11-point lead at 28-17
- The Owls' defense continued to succeed, as Akileis Leroy notch the Owls' third sack of the day, the very play before James Pierre picked off the BSU QB
- Another sack by McCarthy pinned the Cardinals back and forced another punt Robison and Mitchell extended the lead, with Mitchell outleaping his defender and pulling it away from him for his third score, a 24-yard touchdown
- FAU had scored 20 straight points, but BSU put together a quick five-play drive and touchdown to cut it to 34-24 with 0:36 left in the 3rd
- Smith came up with a crucial sack early in the 4th, forcing a fumble on the hit
 as well, recovered by Ellis to force the Cardinals' fourth turnover of the day
- First down passes to Bryant (10 yards) and Harrison (22) set up Charles' first touchdown of his FAU career, a four-yard score for a 17-point lead
- The Cardinals cut back into the deficit late, scoring with 3:52 to go to make it 41-31

 After that, the Owls were able to run out the clock, including McCammon getting the final first down. He finished a yard shy of the century mark on the ground in the win

Stats and Records

- Mitchell's stat line for the day read: eight catches, 124 yards and three touch downs (he was at 6-96 and two scores at the half)
- His first touchdown was the first since his freshman year ironically, a 33-yard score as well, on Nov. 5, 2016 against Rice – and second, at that point, of his career
- When he hit the century mark for the first time in his career, he became the
 first receiver for the Owls to do so since Oct. 15 of last year (Harrison Bryant
 against North Texas, 138 yards)
- The senior wideout tied the school mark, becoming just the second FAU
 receiver with three catches for scores in a game (Cortez Gent vs. FIU on Nov.
 29, 2008)
- Smith became just the fourth Owl ever with two fumble recoveries in a game (the last was Frantz Joseph on Nov. 8, 2008)
- Overall, the Owls' defense picked up five sacks among 10 tackles for loss and the four turnovers (Smith's two fumble recoveries, and his forced fumble pounced on by Ellis, and the interception by Pierre)
- Brown, Leroy and Zyon Gilbert led the way with eight tackles apiece, while Ellis and Smith each had six
- At 366 yards in the air, Robison notched the third 300-yard passing game of his young career (slotting in between 471 vs. Air Force and 339 vs. Old Dominion, both last season). He was 33-for-41 on Saturday for 80.5 percent
- Robison's four touchdown passes set a new career high and finished one away from the school record
- After Mitchell amongst the receivers was Harrison (4 catches, 87 yards) and Bryant (3 for 80)
- McCammon set a new career best with 99 rushing yards on 25 carries and scored for the third straight game (one each in all three career games for the freshman). He added four receptions for 23 yards out of the backfield as well

- He completed 25-of-36 passes and became just the second player in school history to throw five touchdown passes, joining Rusty Smith, who accomplished the feat three times
- Antoine's four TD catches broke the previous school record of three, originally set by Cortez Gent against FIU on Nov. 29, 2008 and tied last week by John Mitchell
- Antoine became just the eighth player in Conference USA history to catch at least four TD passes in a game and the first since 2016. He finished with 11 receptions for 173 yards on the night

 Antoine took a reverse 66 yards the team's longest play of the year thus far
 to the CLT 3, and Larry McCammon punched it in on the very next snap
- The extra point attempt went off the upright, but FAU held the early 6-0 lead
- The Owls' defense forced another three-and-out, with Bonner notching a sack on 3rd down
- Charlotte regained the ball two plays later on an interception
- After a high snap for a loss of 10, another high snap resulted in a sack for Ray Ellis, pushing the 49ers six more yards back. That would eventually lead to the third 49er punt in as many possessions
- Chris Robison's first completion of the day went over the middle to a wideopen Harrison Bryant for 33 yards
- Malcolm Davidson rushed for 12 yards to make it 3rd-and-1. A penalty pushed the Owls back 15 yards, but McCammon tip-toed the sideline on a screen pass for 16 to move the chains
- A swing pass to Davidson went for 30 yards down to the three, and Davidson
 was rewarded with the carry for the score, the first of his collegiate career
- Robison then found John Mitchell for the successful conversion and a 14-0 lead midway through the first
- Charlotte cut the FAU lead in half with a 79-yard drive, ending in a 24-yard pass, making it 14-7 with 3:29 to go in the opening period
- Coming out of the quarter break, Nick Tronti took over behind center and rushed for back-to-back gains of 23 and six yards. Two plays later, Vladimir Rivas' field goal attempt from 31 yards was good and extended the lead to 17-7
- The Owls' defense held on the 49ers' first drive of the second, again coming up with a three-and-out. Just before the punt was a four-yard TFL by Leighton McCarthy
- On second down, FAU recorded their fourth play of 30 or more yards of the day, a 47-yard connection from Robison to Mitchell. That marked 10 completions in a row for Robison
- The drive ended on a missed field goal from 31 yards
- Charlotte was on the move, but an overthrown pass into the end zone resulted in the first interception for Meiko Dotson in his FAU career
- The 49ers cut it to three late in the half on a one-yard touchdown pass
- After the Owls took over, on 3rd-and-long, Davidson found a hole and gained 19 on the ground to keep a late-in-the-half drive alive
- The next snap saw Robison and Tavaris Harrison team up for 25 yards on a catch-and-run to take it into the red zone
- And with just 25 seconds left in the half, Robison fired a bullet into the end zone, to Harrison again, for an 18-yard score
- Zyon Gilbert came up with the Owls' second pickoff of the day with the clock ticking down in the half
- FAU punted on their first series after the break; Charlotte scored to cut it to three once again
- three once again
 The Owls responded with a 57-yard quick strike, Robison to Bryant, to take it
- to the CLT 6. Two plays later, Davidson rumbled in for his second touchdown of the day.

 The team's civit play over 30 yards was Pobison to Antoine for 41, putting
- The team's sixth play over 30 yards was Robison to Antoine for 41, putting them on the doorstep again. That also put Robison up and over 300 yards on the day
- Ellis recorded his second sack of the day to force a long third down for the 49ers; a series later, Dotson picked off his second pass
- Midway through the period, the Owls marched downfield while taking nearly
 three minutes off the clock. A five-play drive, all rushes, culminated in a oneyard score by James Charles. Coupled with Rivas' extra point, the lead bal
 looned to 45-21
- Charlotte put in a touchdown with 13 seconds left to cap a 10-yard drive for the final score

Stats and Records

- Saturday marked Robison's third straight 300-yard pass game, and fifth in two seasons
- The redshirt sophomore was an efficient 20-for-27 for 312 yards and two scores Just five games into his second season, he has already equaled his touchdown passing total of 12 from a year ago
- Bryant was tops among eight different FAU receivers that caught a pass, both in receptions (six) and yards (96)
- · Mitchell and Antoine each caught four passes, for 70 and 55 yards, respectively.

- Coupled with his 66-yard rush, Antoine paced the squad with 123 all-purpose yards
- Davidson blitzed past his career high in rushing (64 against UCF earlier this season) with a game-high 83 on 13 carries, for an average of 6.4 per. He was right behind Antoine with 113 yards from scrimmage
- After Davidson and Antoine on the ground, it was Charles (53 yards) and Tronti (39)
- The Owls' defense filled up the stat sheet with eight tackles for loss, three sacks, nine quarterback hurries, three interceptions and five pass breakups. They also held Charlotte's vaunted rushing attack to just 52 yards on the day (and 1,9 yards per carry). C-USA's leading rusher, Benny Lemay, gained only 46 yards on 11 carries
- Defensive backs Da'Von Brown and Ahman Ross led the way with six and five tackles, respectively. For Ross, that represents a new career high

- Later in the opening frame, Meiko Dotson picked off his third pass of the year
 The Owls' offense found some rhythm early in the second. Chris Robison
 found Harrison Bryant for 25 yards down to the 3-yard line, and two plays
 later, he connected with John Mitchell from four yards out for the score and the
 lead
- MT regained the advantage, 13-9, on a quarterback keeper, but FAU responded with a 37-yard field goal by Vladimir Rivas to cut it to one. That was the score at the half
- On that drive, Mitchell again hauled in a long pass of his own, going for 30
- After the FAU defense forced a three-and-out and punt on the first MT series
 of the second half, they marched into the red zone on the legs of Malcolm
 Davidson, with carries of 25 and 10 yards
- The drive stalled, but Rivas gave the Owls the lead back (for what would be for good) with a field goal from 26 yards

 defense held for a three-and-out, including a tackle for loss by William Davis
 and quarterback hurry for Hosea Barnwell V
- For the second straight possession, the Owls got good field position, starting on the ODU 36

- After another empty offensive possession for the Owls, punter Matt Hayball boomed a punt 77 yards to pin the Hilltoppers on their own two, with that distance setting a new all-time FAU record

- The FAU defense, led by Leroy again, would put the team's first points of the

- The Owl offense responded by pounding it on the ground, as six of the first seven plays on the ensuing possession were of the rushing variety, including a 25-yard gain by James Charles, and a 16-yard rush for Chauncey Mason to take it inside the 10

- Tooley also had the last defensive touchdown for the Owls, two seasons ago against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 16, 2017), another scoop and score
- Leroy recorded a new career high of 12 tackles, including two sacks, and had a
 pass breakup and the forced fumble
- Rashad Smith joined his fellow linebacker in double digits with 10 stops, including one for a loss. Quran Hafiz was next on the ledger with eight tackles, while Gilbert had seven
- Robison finished the game 18-for-29 for 208 yards; along with Robinson and Tronti, the team as a whole threw for 259 yards
- The 1-2 punch of Charles and Mason combined for 124 yards on just 20 carries. Both set career highs in the process: Charles had nine totes for 64 yards, averaging 7.1 per rush, Mason carried it 11 times for 60 yards, a healthy per-carry himself of 5.5


