HIGHLIGHTS:

- FGCU leads the all-time series with NJIT, **3-1** -- which included a sweep last season. The Eagles scored an 84-71 win in Fort Myers on Jan. 21 and an 80-73 victory in Newark on Feb. 16.
- FGCU leads the series at Alico Arena, **2-0**. In the first-ever meeting, NJIT rallied from a 21-point deficit to force overtime in an eventual 82-78 loss on Jan. 14, 2016.
- All-time, NJIT is **12-18** against ASUN opponents -- which does not include an **0-2** mark in the ASUN tournament. The Highlanders also hold a **4-11** record in conference road games.
- NJIT has lost its last nine ASUN road contests since a 73-58 win at Jacksonville, Feb. 16, 2016.
- In its last game, NJIT fell by an 80-67 count at Stetson on Thursday. The Highlanders held a 46-38 with 17:11 left in regulation before the Hatters rallied for a 42-21 sprint to the finish.
- Anthony Tarke** netted a game-high 23 points, which also tied his career high (third time). He has now scored in double digits in 11-straight games, averaging 17.8 ppg, 6.4 rpg in the span.
- Shawndale Jones** finished with 11 points and four rebounds. The ASUN's fifth-leading freshman scorer (7.9 ppg) is now averaging 13.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg over his last four affairs.
- NJIT played its second-consecutive game without ASUN leading rebounder, **Abdul Lewis** -- who left early with a hip injury on Jan. 3 at Brown. He has not been ruled out for Saturday.
- With a win, NJIT will snap a 15-game, road losing streak that started after the Highlanders' notched a 64-61 win at Stony Brook on Dec. 28, 2016. NJIT is **0-7** on the road this season.
- With a win, NJIT will be at least .500 through 18 games for the fourth time in program history.

FGCU GRABS PRESEASON TOP SPOT; GOODWIN & AMINU COLLECT INDIVIDUAL HONORS

LAKEPOINT, GA -- After winning back-to-back ASUN Conference Men's Basketball Championship titles, FGCU was voted the favorites to three-peat in the Preseason Coaches & Media Polls. Lipscomb, which finished second during the regular season last year, was voted second in both polls, while North Florida followed the Bisons in third.

FGCU senior guard Brandon Goodwin was the unanimous selection for Preseason Player of the Year by the league's head coaches. He was a unanimous ASUN Newcomer of the Year last season and capped off his incredible year with ASUN Championship MVP honors after leading the Eagles to their third ASUN Men's Basketball Championship crown. Goodwin scored 18.2 PPG last season.

North Florida's Wajid Aminu took home the ASUN Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award. The reigning ASUN Freshman of the Year had 36 blocks last season, 20 of them coming in conference play. That mark set a new UNF freshman single-season record. He also corralled 6.5 rebounds per game.

NJIT rounded out the final selection by the league's head coaches and media poll.

Senior (G/F **Chris Jenkins**) on NJIT's roster, after losing four senior starters. Seven of the 13 Highlanders are underclassmen.

Years as NJIT Head Coach for **Brian Kennedy**, who started as top assistant at NJIT for his first four seasons on staff.

Years as member of the ASUN after two seasons as an independent. NJIT was in the Great West Conference from 2009-13.

Career rebounds per game for **Abdul Lewis**, which ranks 14th in the nation among active D-I career rebounders.

Consecutive double-digit scoring games for **Anthony Tarke**, during which time the sophomore is averaging 17.8 ppg.

THOU SHALT STEAL:

NJIT ranks 30th in the nation and first the ASUN in steals per game at **8.2** -- a total that is 0.6 spg higher than the second best mark in the conference held by Jacksonville (7.6)... The Highlanders boast four players in the Top 18 of the ASUN in spg, as freshman **Zach Cooks** leads the team and ranks tied for fourth (1.7), sophomore **Anthony Tarke** sits 11th (1.4), junior **Diandre Wilson** places tied for 13th (1.2) and junior **Reilly Walsh** rounds out the group at 18th (1.1).

DEFENSE WINS...

NJIT ranks second in the ASUN in scoring defense, allowing 73.6 points per game (FGCU leads at 70.1 ppg)... The Highlanders' efforts included holding high-scoring Drexel (79.0) to 53 points on Nov. 25, LIU Brooklyn (82.9) to 69 points on Nov. 28 and UMass Lowell (83.1) to 65 on Dec. 3. *Last year, NJIT finished second in the ASUN at 74.8 ppg.*

TARKE DIRTY TO ME!

Sophomore **Anthony Tarke** has led NJIT in scoring in nine of the last 11 contests while scoring in double-digit in all 11 affairs -- averaging **17.8 ppg** (196) and **6.4 rpg** (70) in the span... At Rutgers (Dec. 12), the Gaithersburg, Md., native recorded game-highs in both points (19) and rebounds (12) for his first double-double of the season and fourth of his career. He then notched a season-high 21 points in back-to-back games against Iona (Dec. 9) and Colgate (Dec. 12)... *Going back to last season, Tarke has led NJIT in scoring in 13 of the last 20 (65.0%) games, averaging 15.7 ppg (296) in the span.*

- He currently ranks 4th in ASUN in bpg (0.9), 6th in ppg (15.2), 11th in rpg (5.7) & 11th in spg (1.3).
- He was named ASUN Player of the Week for Dec. 11-17, averaging 19.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg in 2 G.
- The preseason ASUN All-Conference selection and member of the 2017 ASUN All-Freshman finished his first NCAA campaign ranked sixth in the ASUN in FG% (.522), ninth in spg (1.1), tied for ninth in o-rpg (1.6) 18th in rpg (4.7) and 24th in ppg (9.9).
- His total of 307 points was the most by an NJIT freshman since **Damon Lynn** scored 500 points in 2013-14. Tarke also led all freshmen in scoring in ASUN conference play at 12.5 ppg.

FAB FIVE NEWCOMERS:

NJIT "Fab 5" newcomers this season are averaging a combined **30.6** points per game -- which accounts for **40.2%** of the team's nightly average. The quintet consists of freshmen **San Antonio Brinson**, **Zach Cooks**, **Shawndale Jones** and **David Kachelries** and junior transfer **Diandre Wilson**.

- **Diandre Wilson**, who drained a career-high 23 points at Buffalo (12/28), is averaging 12.9 ppg in his last seven affairs. During the span, he's shot 13-for-29 (.448) from deep. Overall, the Fort Lauderdale native ranks seventh in the ASUN in three-point field-goal percentage (.414), eighth in free-throw percentage (.725), 13th in steals per game (1.2) and 19th in ppg (11.1).
- **San Antonio Brinson** started the season injured after sustaining a concussion in the preseason. He has carved out a more of a niche in the rotation over the past five games, during which time he has averaged 2.0 ppg (10) and 2.0 rebounds per game (10). The Augusta, Ga., native posted a career high in rebounds (9), blocks (3) and minutes (15) against Bryn Athyn on Dec. 22.
- **Zach Cooks** is averaging 7.2 ppg this season -- a figure that ranks sixth among all ASUN freshmen -- and 8.8 ppg over his last six contests on .513 shooting. The Lawrenceville, Ga., ranks tied for fourth in the ASUN in steals per game (1.7), 15th in assists per game (2.3) and tied for 37th in ppg (7.2).
- **Shawndale Jones** has come on strong since Dec. 9, averaging 11.0 ppg (88) over his last eight contests. During the span, he's shooting .479 (34-for-71) from the floor while averaging 5.0 rpg (40). The Pittsburgh native is now the Highlanders' fourth-leading scorer and the ASUN's fifth-leading freshman scorer at 7.9 ppg for the season.
- **David Kachelries** hasn't played a ton of minutes this season, but has been a very effective source of scoring when on the floor -- averaging 3.5 ppg in only 7.0 mpg this season.

The four freshmen alone are averaging **19.5 ppg** for the season -- or **25.6%** of NJIT's scoring output per game. Last season's class of four freshman averaged **13.5 ppg** (9.9 of which belonged to current sophomore **Anthony Tarke**).

AB-NORMAL!:

Junior **Abdul Lewis** had a monster performance against LIU Brooklyn on Nov. 28 in which he posted game-highs in points (23) and rebounds (18) while dishing out a team-high four assists. The Newark native was one point shy of his career-high scoring output set at Florida Gulf Coast on Jan. 21, 2017, and one rebound short of his NJIT single-game record of 19 set Jan. 19, 2017 at Stetson.

- Lewis leads the ASUN in rpg (8.6) -- a figure that ranks 68th in Division I. He also sits 14th among all active D-I players in career rebounding average at 8.5 rpg. He has led (or co-led) NJIT in rebounds in nine of his 15 games this season. He also leads the ASUN in offensive rebounding (3.1) and ranks 11th in FG% (.470), 12th in bpg (0.7), 20th in apg (1.9) and 23rd in ppg (9.9).

- The 6'10" big also ranks third in the conference in double-doubles (4) after starting his season with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds against Wagner (Nov. 11) and 10 points and a game-high 15 rebounds against Lafayette (Nov. 14)... He logged five double-doubles in his first year at NJIT in 2016-17, one short of Tim Coleman's team-high

- Going back to last season, the South Alabama transfer is averaging 12.0 ppg (323) and 9.2 rpg (249) over his last 27 contests.

- Last year, Lewis also set the NJIT single-season rebounding record (264).

DON'T FORGET ABOUT 'DRE:

Junior **Diandre Wilson** led NJIT in scoring with a career-high 23 points at Buffalo on Dec. 28. He has led the Highlanders in points in two of the last five affairs. Over his past seven contests, the junior is averaging 12.9 ppg (90) while shooting .420 (29-for-69) from the floor and .448 (13-for-29) from deep. Twice this season, he scored 10+ points in four-straight games (Nov. 22-30; Dec. 12-28).

- The transfer from Mott Community College (Flint, Mich.) currently ranks seventh in three-point field-goal percentage (.414), eighth in free-throw percentage (.725), 13th in steals per game (1.2) and 19th in ppg (11.1).

- In his college career, he is averaging 18.7 ppg between Mott (NJCAA) and NJIT.
- It took just two games for Wilson make his presence felt at the D-I level, as he scored a game-high 20 points versus Lafayette on Nov. 14 -- shooting an impressive 7-for-9 from the floor, 3-for-4 from deep.

- The native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., scored 1,253 career points in his two seasons at Mott.

- Last year, he ranked 11th in the nation with 22.3 ppg en route to being honored as a NJCAA All-American First-Team selection. Wilson scored in double-figures in 29 games and posted six 30-plus-point efforts in guiding Mott to a 25-7 record and a trip to the NJCAA District 10 Tournament semifinals.

- As a freshman in 2015-16, he led the nation in free throw attempts (290) and ranked 19th in scoring (19.5 ppg).

ONCE BITTEN, TWICE SHY:

Sophomore **Shyquan Gibbs** committed one turnover against Colgate on Dec. 12 -- snapping a streak of five-consecutive games without a TO from Nov. 28 through Dec. 9. During the remarkable streak, the point guard played 123 minutes and handed out 10 assists. *Still, over the past 12 games, he's recorded 23 assists with just six turnovers in 283 minutes.*

- Gibbs currently ranks fifth in the ASUN in assists-to-turnover ratio (2.3).
- He would lead the ASUN in three-point field-goal percentage (.500; 16-for-32) if he had enough attempts to qualify.

CONFERENCE OPENERS:

With the 98-87 win over USC Upstate on Jan. 6, NJIT recorded its first victory in a conference opener since joining the ASUN for the 2015-16 season. The Highlanders previous win to kick-off league play came in a 57-52 victory over Utah Valley on Jan. 5, 2013, when NJIT participated in the now-defunct Great West Conference... All-time, the Highlanders are now 4-3 in conference openers.

After calling Fleisher Athletic Center "home" for the past 50 years, NJIT has a new court in the state-of-the-art Wellness and Events Center (WEC) beginning with the 2017-18 season -- and have started 8-2... The WEC is a three story, 220,000-square-foot building that features a 3,500-seat basketball arena that compares favorably with many Division-I mid-major facilities throughout the country. The design of the \$102 M building features a number of flexible spaces that can be quickly configured to support the numerous and varied missions of the university community. Designed and engineered by AECOM and built by Torcon, the exterior design reinforces the university's position as a leader in engineering and technology education, featuring a 52-foot-high glass wall on the north facade that offers an excellent view of the adjacent athletic field as well as NJIT's academic campus. Previously, the Highlanders played in Fleisher Athletic Center since 1967 and posted an 8-4 record there last season and an 87-60 mark during its Division-I era.

FORWARD THINKING:

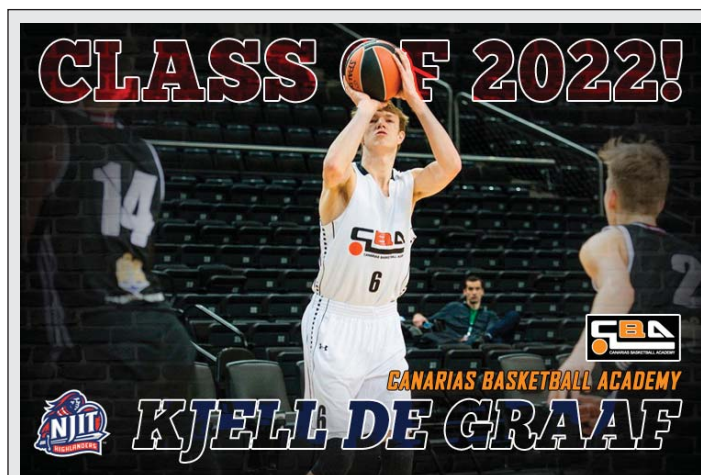
Two Highlanders -- junior F **Abdul Lewis** and sophomore F **Anthony Tarke** -- were among the three forwards selected to the Preseason ASUN All-Conference Team... In his first season with NJIT, Lewis averaged 9.7 ppg to go along with 8.5 rebounds per game -- a total that ranked second in the ASUN. The transfer from University of South Alabama set program records for single-season rebounds (264) and single-game rebounds (19). A two-time ASUN Newcomer of Week as a sophomore, Lewis' growth was evidenced by the fact he averaged 13.4 ppg and 8.5 rpg over 14 games in ASUN play... Tarke, the first-ever Highlander selected to the postseason ASUN All-Freshman Team, became the focus of the offense following the season-ending injury to Damon Lynn on Jan 21, 2017. Over his last 14 games, the Gaithersburg, Md., native averaged 14.0 ppg while shooting .565 (74-for-131 FG). Among ASUN freshman, Tarke ranked second in per-game averages for points (9.9), rebounds (4.7), steals (1.1) and blocks (0.5). He finished with 307 points, the highest scoring total by an NJIT freshman since Lynn scored 500 points in 2013-14... The only other frontcourt player honored was Lipscomb center **Rob Marberry**.

HIGHLANDERS SIGN KJELL DE GRAAF FOR 2018:

NJIT men's basketball head coach Brian Kennedy announced that Kjell De Graaf has signed a national letter of intent to attend NJIT and play basketball for the Highlanders beginning in the fall of 2018.

De Graaf, a 6-foot-10 native of Rotterdam, Netherlands, is currently playing for the Canarias Basketball Academy in Gran Canaria, Spain. This season, he is averaging 14.5 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per game while shooting 45-percent from three-point territory for the Elite A Team.

"We are very excited to have Kjell join our family here at NJIT," said Kennedy. "He is regarded as one of the highest rated scholar-athletes in all of Europe and plays at the prestigious school, The Academy in Spain/Gran Canaria."

The Academy, considered the top prep school in Europe both academically and athletically, has sent over 80 players to Division-I schools in recent years.

A very good student, De Graaf is interested in NJIT's Honors Program and in studying either chemical engineering or biomedical engineering. He is currently a post-graduate student after spending his first two years of high school at The Thornbecke Voortgezet Onderwijs (Holland) and his last two at The Canterbury School (Gran Canaria, Spain).

De Graaf has also played on the Netherlands Junior National Team since he was 14 years old and was a member of the 14u European Championship team in 2013. He committed to NJIT after also considering Fordham, New Mexico, Old Dominion, Bucknell and Gonzaga.

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT: FGCU EAGLES

FORT MYERS, FL – The NJIT Highlanders (8-9, 1-1 ASUN) look to move above .500 in conference play with a tilt against first-place Florida Gulf Coast (11-8, 2-0 ASUN) on Saturday night at Alico Arena in Fort Myers. Opening tip is set for 7 p.m.

NJIT fell, 80-67, at Stetson on Thursday, while FGCU remained perfect in league play with a 75-58 victory over USC Upstate.

With a win, the Highlanders will snap a 15-game road losing streak that dates back to last season. NJIT's last road win was a 64-61 triumph at Stony Brook on Dec. 28, 2016.

Saturday is a matchup of the top two scoring defenses in the ASUN with FGCU allowing a league-best 70.1 ppg, while the Highlanders rank second at 73.6 ppg.

All-Time Series

The Eagles lead the all-time series by a 3-1 count after capturing both meetings a year ago.

FGCU won by an 84-71 score in Fort Myers and posted an 80-73 victory in Newark last season.

On Feb. 16, 2017 in Newark, Florida Gulf Coast outscored the Highlanders by a 43-31 margin in the second half en route to the 80-73 victory.

The last meeting in Fort Myers was on Jan. 21, 2017 and FGCU shot 53.6% from the floor on their way to the 84-71 win. The Eagles led wire to wire in the game and led by as many as 19 in the first half.

In that contest, the Highlanders lost all-time leading scorer Damon Lynn to a torn Achilles just 4:45 into the game.

From The Eagles Nest

FGCU knocked down six threes in the first half and built a 38-17 halftime advantage in Thursday's 75-58 win over USC Upstate.

The Eagles led by as many as 29 in the second half.

With the win, head coach Joe Dooley's squad has won four in a row after dropping four straight prior to the current stretch.

Florida Gulf Coast shoots a league-best 48.5% from the field and ranks tied for second in the ASUN in points per game (79.2) while shooting 35.4% from beyond the arc, a total that sits third in the conference.

Along with leading the ASUN in scoring defense, Eagles' opponents are shooting just 41.2% from the floor and 30.4% from deep, both totals are tops in the league.

After advancing to each of the past two NCAA Tournaments, FGCU was picked as the preseason favorite in both the coaches and media polls.

Goodwin leads the Eagles and ranks third in the ASUN in scoring at 17.0 ppg, while junior guard Zach Johnson checks in at 13.7 ppg and Terrell averages 12.3 ppg.

Terrell and Goodwin are tied for the team lead in rebounding at 5.6 boards per game.

Terrell ranks second in the ASUN in three-point percentage (48.0%) and sits fifth in field goal percentage (54.6%).

Dooley is in his fifth season at the helm of the Eagles and has posted a 102-54 mark (.654) to date. The West Orange, N.J., native has posted four straight 20-win seasons to go along with the pair of afore-mentioned NCAA Tournament berths.

Prior to coming to FGCU, Dooley spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach at Kansas and won the 2008 National Championship.

Florida Gulf Coast burst onto the national scene as

In the second half, the Highlanders shot just 28.8% (8-of-28) from the floor.

Tarke matched his career-high with 23 points to lead three Highlanders in double figures as freshman guard Shawndale Jones chipped in with 11 points and junior guard Diandre Wilson added 10.

Freshman guard Zach Cooks contributed six points, five assists, four rebounds and three steals off the bench for head coach Brian Kennedy's squad.

Tarke has led NJIT in scoring in nine of his last 11 games and is averaging 17.8 points per game during that stretch.

The Gaithersburg, Md., native had previously scored 23 on Jan. 14, 2017 and Feb. 9, 2017 against North Florida.

SECOND-HALF SURGE LEADS STETSON PAST NJIT

Anthony Tarke's Game-High 23 Points Not Enough in an 80-67 Loss; Highlanders Remain Winless on Road

DELAND, FL -- Stetson utilized a 28-8 run early in the second half to storm back for an 80-67 victory over NJIT on Thursday at the Edmunds Center in DeLand, Fla. Senior Devine Myles scored a team-high 20 points in guiding the Hatters (9-9, 1-1) to their first ASUN win of the season.

Sophomore Anthony Tarke netted a game-high 23 points to pace the Highlanders, who fell to 8-9 and 1-1 in conference play. The Gaithersburg, Md., native has now led NJIT in scoring in nine of the last 11 contests, during which time he has averaged 17.8 points per game.

NJIT held a 41-34 lead at the half and led by as many as eight points in the second half. Once the Highlanders went up 46-38 with 17:11 left in regulation, the home team began to swarm – transforming an eight-point deficit in to a 12-point lead over a span of 10:27.

The run started with a three-pointer by senior B.J. Glasford and culminated with a Myles layup to give the Hatters a then-game-high 66-54 advantage. Glasford later hit a back-breaking triple with one second left on the shot clock after the Highlanders had pulled back within six, 72-66, with 1:34 remaining. Ultimately, Stetson went ahead for good on a trey by freshman Christian Jones that snapped a 49-49 tie with 13:20 to go.

After starting the game hot from the floor, the Highlanders were hurt by cold shooting in the second half. NJIT connected on just 8-of-28 (28.6%) attempts after the break. Additionally, the team was held without a field goal over a span of 3:36 from the 5:45 to

the 2:09 mark of the final session – spoiling a chance for a late comeback. In all, the Highlanders were outscored 46-26 in the second half.

Freshman Shanwdale Jones (11 points) and junior Diandre Wilson (10 points) were NJIT's only other double-digit scorers. Tarke was joined by junior Mohamed Bendary in grabbing a team-high six rebounds.

Freshman Zach Cooks scored six points, but filled the stat sheet with a game-high-tying five assists, four rebounds and a game-high-tying three steals.

NJIT, which was out-rebounded by a 34-28 margin, played its second-consecutive game without the ASUN's leading rebounder, senior Abdul Lewis.

Three other Hatters joined Myles in double figures. Glasford and junior Leo Goodman both finished with 15 points while senior Angela Rivera added 10 points to supplement a team-high five assists.

The Hatters finished the game shooting at 56.1-percent (32-for-57) and 47.1-percent (8-for-17) from downtown. Meanwhile, the Highlanders ended the night at 39.7-percent (23-for-58) and 41.4-percent (12-for-29) from beyond the arc.

Interestingly, the Hatters started five seniors while the Highlanders only senior, Chris Jenkins, did not appear in the game.

The Highlanders were a bit sluggish out of the gates, turning the ball over three times in the first two minutes

leading to an early 7-0 Hatters' advantage.

But NJIT received key contributions from the second unit. In addition to the performances of Cooks and Jones, junior Donovan Greer hit a pair of three-pointers to help the Highlanders sustain the slow start.

The Highlanders started to pull away late in the first half. Down 30-29 with 4:34 to go in the stanza, NJIT netted five-consecutive points on a triple by Tarke and layup by Jones to kick-start a 12-4 half-ending run.

Tarke paced all scores at the break with 12 points on 5-of-12 shooting. Jones recorded seven points and three rebounds off the bench, again sparking the Highlanders along with his classmate Cooks – who registered five points, three rebounds and a team-high three assists after his insertion into the game.

Myles also led Stetson in scoring in the first period, pouring in eight points to guide a balanced attack.

Both teams shot well in the first half, as the Hatters connected on 16-of-30 (53.3%) field goals while the High-

landers drained 15-of-30 (50.0%) of their shots. NJIT held an edge in three-point marksmanship at 7-for-18 (38.9%) compared to 2-of-7 (28.6%) for Stetson.

NJIT next travels to Fort Myers to take on Florida Gulf Coast (11-8, 2-0) on Saturday night at Alico Arena. Tip-off time is scheduled for 7 p.m. The Eagles were selected as the ASUN pre-season favorite in both the media and coaches poll.

NJIT is 1-3 all-time against FGCU. The Highlanders are also 0-2 at Alico Arena, though they rallied from a 21-point deficit to force overtime in an eventual 82-78 loss on Jan. 14, 2016.

Last season, the Highlanders dropped an 84-71 affair in Fort Myers. Perhaps more significantly, the team lost leading scoring Damon Lynn for the season to a torn Achilles just 4:45 into the game.

NJIT will remain in search of its first road win of the season. Additionally, the Highlanders will be looking to snap a 15-game, road-losing streak that stretches back into last season.

2017-18 NJIT MEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

After calling Fleisher Athletic Center "home" for the past 50 seasons, the NJIT men's basketball team will officially become a tenant of the state-of-the-art Wellness and Events Center (WEC) for its 2017-18 season opener on Nov. 11.

Not only will the Highlanders be revealing this brand new arena when they play host to Wagner, they will also be unveiling a much different look on the floor.

"2017-18 presents a new era for NJIT basketball," said NJIT Head Coach Brian Kennedy. "We have graduated arguably the top class in the school's history headlined by All-American Damon Lynn and All-ASUN player Tim Coleman. They have been replaced by a solid recruiting class that will be called on to contribute right away along with our returning players."

The Highlanders lost four senior starters from last season, including the program's all-time leading scorer (Lynn) and all-time leading rebounder (Coleman). They also bid adieu to a venue in which the team posted an 8-4 record last season and an 87-60 mark during its Division-I era.

Just as it was not an easy process to erect the WEC, it will not be easy to replace Lynn's 2,153 career points or Coleman's 762 career rebounds. Yet, the key for the 2017-18 NJIT Highlanders men's basketball team may be summed up in one word: depth.

The Highlanders' high hopes heading into the 2016-17 season took a large hit when Lynn tore his Achilles just four games into conference play. Despite an impressive 8-8 start through a grueling non-conference schedule, NJIT finished 11-19 overall and seventh in the ASUN.

If there could be a "silver lining" to Lynn's absence, it came in the form of valuable, on-the-job experience for several key newcomers.

Two of those newcomers, junior Abdul Lewis (Newark, NJ) and sophomore Anthony Tarke (Gaithersburg, MD) were both impressive enough in their NJIT debuts to garner preseason All-ASUN honors this October. Another, freshman Shyquan Gibbs (Hillside, NJ), took over as the starting point guard for the last 12 games of the season and received a significant education in nearly 32 minutes per game during the span.

Added to the mix this season is the highest-rated recruiting class in the history of the program consisting of San Antonio Brinson (Augusta, GA), Zach Cooks (Lawrenceville, GA), David Kachelries (Emmaus, PA) and Shawndale Jones (Pittsburgh, PA).

In addition, the program added a high-scoring junior college transfer in Diandre Wilson (Fort Lauderdale, FL), who ranked 11th in the nation while averaging 22.3 point per game as a sophomore at Mott Community College in St. Flint, Mich., in 2016-17.

"We will definitely have one of the youngest teams in Division-I basketball this year," said Kennedy, whose roster features just one senior compared to seven underclassmen. "But we will be talented and will play a deep roster led by Abdul Lewis and Anthony Tarke, who are both entering their second year with the program."

FRONT COURT

With a pair of preseason All-ASUN selections, NJIT could have one of the best frontcourts in the conference. In fact, Lewis and Tarke were two of just three forwards to receive such honors.

Lewis, a 6-foot-10 product of Newark East Side High School, lived up to expectations in his first season at NJIT after transferring from University of South Alabama. He finished the season averaging 9.7 ppg and 8.5 rebounds per game while setting program records for single-season rebounds (264) and single-game rebounds (19). A two-time ASUN Newcomer of Week as a sophomore, Lewis' growth was evidenced by the fact he averaged 13.4 ppg and 8.5 rpg over 14 games in ASUN play.

Tarke, the first-ever Highlander selected to the postseason ASUN All-Freshman Team, became the focus of the offense following the Lynn injury. Over his last 14 games, he averaged 14.0 ppg while shooting .565 (74-for-131 FG). Among ASUN freshman, Tarke ranked second in per-game averages for points (9.9), rebounds (4.7), steals (1.1) and blocks (0.5). He finished with 307 points, the highest scoring total by an NJIT freshman since Lynn in 2013-14 (500).

Junior Mohamad Bendary (Jersey City, NJ) continues to show improvement while providing size (6'9") off the bench. The St. Anthony's product scored 16

points over the final two games last season. Additionally, athletic sophomore Taj Price (Newark, NJ) will look to provide more depth in the low post.

The recruiting class as well as the frontcourt received a significant boost with the April signing of freshman San Antonio Brinson. The 6-foot-8, 200-pound forward arrived at NJIT as one of the highest-rated recruits in program history after attending South Kent School (CT).

BACKCOURT

Lynn's injury last year left a big void in the backcourt. Perhaps the biggest beneficiary was point guard Shyquan Gibbs, a product of Bob Hurley's legendary program. The St. Anthony High School (Jersey City, NJ) valedictorian finished his first collegiate season ranked 12th in the ASUN in assists-to-turnover ratio (1.6) and 25th in steals per game (0.7). More impressively, he averaged 6.8 ppg while shooting .457 (22-for-48 FG) over his last nine affairs.

Versatile junior Reilly Walsh (Staten Island, NY) proved last season that he could also facilitate the offense. The 2017 ASUN All-Academic selection averaged 8.0 ppg over his last three affairs and poured in a career-high 15 points in the final game of the season in the quarterfinal round of the ASUN tournament at Lipscomb.

NJIT also features a pair of accomplished long-range shooters. Senior Chris Jenkins (Hillside, NJ) has placed in the top 13 in the ASUN in three-pointers per game during each of his first two seasons at NJIT after transferring from Hofstra University. Although injured a majority of last season, junior Donovan Greer (Houston, TX) scored 11 points in his Highlanders debut at Lipscomb on Feb. 4 after averaging 8.8 ppg as freshman at San Jacinto College-Central (Pasadena, TX) in 2015-16.

Junior Diandre Wilson provides another scoring threat in Coach Kennedy's arsenal, as the NJCAA All-American first-team honoree scored 1,253 career points in two seasons at Mott CC.

The three freshmen guards are expected to carve their way into the rotation. Zach Cooks figures to handle a share of the point guard duties. He displayed both excellent ball-handling and play-making abilities while at Berkmar High School in Lilburn, Ga.

Shawndale Jones is a 6-3 combo guard who athleticism shined not only on the hardwood, but also on the gridiron as a WR/CB at The Kiski School in

Saltsburg, Pa. In its recap of all ASUN early signings, *Hoopseen.com* commented that Jones "could be the steal of the class."

David Kachelries, described as playing with an incredibly high motor, finished his high school career as Emmaus' all-time leading scorer with 1,910 points.

OUTLOOK

Last year, NJIT got a glimpse of the future in the final two games of the regular season. After initially struggling to adjust on the fly following Lynn's injury, the Highlanders reinvented their identity in time to post impressive, back-to-back wins against Stetson and USC Upstate.

This crash course provided valuable experience for a youthful roster that features just one senior and just 40 combined starts at NJIT from its upperclassmen.

Another positive factor could be a home-court advantage developed in the new, 3,500-seat basketball arena that will compare favorably with many mid-major facilities throughout the country. After traveling for 11 of their 16 non-conference contests a year ago, the Highlanders play nine of 15 non-conference games at the WEC this season.

Still, the young squad will be put to task early with another challenging schedule that features road games at West Virginia, Seton Hall, Rutgers and Buffalo and home tilts against the likes of Drexel, LIU Brooklyn and Iona.

How the Highlanders fare in the ASUN after being selected eighth in the preseason coaches and media poll will largely depend on the pace of their learning curve in advance of the conference opener on Jan. 6 against USC Upstate.

"I'm excited about the make-up of our roster and the opening of the WEC provides tremendous opportunities for our students and athletes here at NJIT," said Kennedy. "We have significant challenges ahead of us this season, but we certainly have the building blocks in place for the future as we continue to grow the program."

Brian Kennedy, 51 was introduced as the 11th head men's basketball coach in program history on April 15, 2016, after serving as the NJIT's top assistant under Jim Engles for four seasons (2012-16).

Coach Kennedy, whose involvement with the sport of basketball literally covers his entire life, is the son of the late Bob Kennedy, a former college and high school coach and the nephew of Pat Kennedy, who was a Division I head coach for 31 years at Iona, Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson.

The Kennedy family business, the Hoop Group, began in the Trenton, NJ, CYO in 1963 with summer basketball camps and moved in 1969 to Cherry Valley, PA, and the Pocono Invitational began.

In 1991, the Hoop Group acquired the Eastern Invitational camp and renamed it the Hoop Group Elite Camp. A few years later, the Hoop Group began running grassroots tournaments and the subsequent years have seen numerous alumni go on to play in the NBA, including Kobe Bryant, Amar'e Stoudemire 2010 #1 overall pick John Wall, 2011 #1 pick Kyrie Irving and 13 other first-round picks that year.

Numerous legendary coaches have lectured at the camp, including the late Jim Valvano and Hall of Famers Lou Carnesecca, Rollie Massimino, Hoop Group Skills Camp Director Bob Hurley, Bob Knight, and Herb Magee.

Brian Kennedy, who played at both Princeton and Monmouth (1990 graduate), took over the family business after graduating from Monmouth in 1990 and was President and co-founder when it was rebranded from the Pocono Invitational to the Hoop Group and became the largest basketball instructional organization in the world.

He entered the college coaching ranks in 1997 as an assistant coach at DePaul on the staff headed by his uncle Pat. There, he was part of one of major college basketball's great turn-arounds, as the Blue Demons, who won fewer than five games the year before he arrived, made the NIT quarterfinals in 1999 and then the NCAA Tournament in 2000 as a team ranked in the Top 25.

"BK" as he is known to his many friends, was involved in all aspects of the DePaul program and was a leader in efforts that brought in a group named as the nation's top recruiting class in 1998 by The Sporting News.

Among the players he helped bring to DePaul five future NBA players: Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons, Steven Hunter, Paul McPherson, and Andre Brown.

He stepped aside from coaching from 2002 through 2009, when he worked on Wall Street in the financial sector.

He returned to the Hoop Group as Athletic Director, serving in that capacity from 2009 until 2012, when he joined the staff at NJIT.

In his first year as an assistant, the Highlanders captured their first Division I league title when they were regular season champions of the old Great West Conference.

As with DePaul in his first turn as a college coach, Kennedy spearheaded the recruiting efforts for NJIT and he faced a major task in his first recruiting year, with all three double-figure scorers from the 2012-13 Great West champions graduating in May 2013.

Kennedy's first recruiting class (Class of 2017) has gone down as the best to

date in the history of the program were vital to the Highlanders men's basketball reaching unprecedented success.

The extremely inexperienced 2013-14 team finished with a 13-16 record. But over the three seasons, the squads won a combined 52 games -- including 20 win seasons in 2014-15 (21-12) and in 2015-16 (20-15). In fact, in each of those two seasons, the Highlanders advanced to the semifinals of the national *CollegeInsider.com* Postseason Tournament (CIT).

In addition, the Highlanders won their first-ever game over a ranked opponent when they upset #17/#16 Michigan in December 2014 and scored their first-ever win over a BIG EAST Conference opponent when they topped St. John's in December 2015.

Two members of that first recruiting class put their names all over the NJIT record books. Damon Lynn, who was picked second-team all-state (all groups) by the Star-Ledger as a senior at Union Catholic High School, became the program's all-time leading scorer on Nov. 11, 2016, and finished his career with 2,153 points. He currently ranks fifth in Division-I history with 434 career three-pointers.

Tim Coleman came in the same class, entering NJIT after graduating from St. Anthony High School in Jersey City, NJ, where he played for Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame coach Bob Hurley. At St. Anthony, Coleman was a contributor on teams that won New Jersey state Tournament of Champions crowns following his sophomore and junior seasons.

Coleman carried that success into his NJIT career, as he finished as the program's all-time leading rebounder (762) and fourth all-time scorer (1,462). He departed the NCAA ranks as the only active Division-I player with at least 1,400 points, 750 rebounds, 225

assists (244), 150 steals (154) and 135 blocks (135).

Coleman and Rob Ukawuba, also part of BK's inaugural recruiting class, are now both playing professionally in the National Basketball League of Canada.

Brian Kennedy is the proud father of four children: daughters Taylor, Tatum, and Kelly; and son Brian, Jr.

JEFF RAFFERTY

SPRINGFIELD '97 | 2ND SEASON AT NJIT

Jeff Rafferty joined the NJIT staff after serving nine years at the University of Delaware -- where he earned the title of Associate Head Coach for the 2013-14 season... The 1997 graduate of Springfield College enjoyed one of his highlight seasons in 2013-14, when the Blue Hens finished 25-10, tying for the second-most wins in program history, and made the 2014 NCAA Tournament as the #13 seed in the East Regional...Rafferty's work in helping to build the UD program was recognized by FOXSports.com as one of the Top 10 Mid-Major Assistant Coaches in the country in 2008 and by RecruitDirt.com as the top assistant coach in the CAA in 2012... Prior, he was an assistant coach at the University of New Hampshire and for four years as the top assistant at UMass Lowell (then Division II). In his time at UML, the River Hawks were a combined 94-30 and made back-to-back trips to the D-II national Elite Eight in 2003 and 2004... He coached in NCAA Division III at Union College (2000-01) and at his alma mater, Springfield, which was a combined 40-17 and reached the Division III Sweet Sixteen in his second season on staff. He began his coaching career with an internship with the NBA's Boston Celtics and coached in 1997-98 at one-time NJIT opponent Texas Pan American.



STEPHEN SAUERS

ALBANY '90 | 1ST SEASON AT NJIT

Stephen Sauers joined NJIT in August 2017 with 25 years of coaching experience at the Division-I level. A 1990 graduate of University of Albany, Sauers spent the last two seasons as head coach for Canarias Basketball Academy in Gran Canarias, Spain, after two seasons as top assistant at UC-Riverside (2013-15). Sauers played basketball for his father -- Hall of Fame Coach Richard "Doc" Sauers -- at Albany, where he was a two-year starter, captain and team MVP as a senior. He helped lead the Great Danes to a four-year record of 77-34 and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen (1990). He then started his coaching career at Marist as a Graduate Assistant Coach (1990-91), and moved up the ladder to Assistant Coach (1993-96), Senior Assistant Coach (1996-01) and Associate Head Coach (2001-04). He left the Red Foxes to serve as head coach at United States Military Academy Prep School in 2004-05, guiding the team to a school-best 16 wins. After a stint with the Hoop Group, he returned to the college ranks as Director of Basketball Operations and Basketball Camps for Seton Hall for two seasons (2006-08). He later returned to Pirates as Interim Assistant Coach and Director of Basketball Operations from 2010-13 after a stint as an Assistant Coach at Iona College (2008-10).



KIM WAITERS

ROBERT MORRIS '11 | 3RD SEASON AT NJIT

Kim Waiters enters his third season in his first full-time college coaching position after joining NJIT as an assistant in July 2015... In his two seasons in Newark, the Highlanders have gone 41-27 with back-to-back appearances in the semifinals of the CIT... Waiters got involved with coaching when he was an undergraduate at Robert Morris (PA) University, working as a student assistant... After graduating in 2011 with a bachelor's of Business Management, Waiters became the Director of Skills Camps at the Pocono Invitational, a prestigious overnight camp that began operation in 1963... From the Pocono Invitational, Waiters headed to The Hoop Group, the largest basketball instruction organization in the world. He directed 10 Premier Grassroots AAU team tournaments and 16 high school events featuring premier teams from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and Maryland. "Kim is an outstanding person who has the potential to be one of the top young basketball coaches in the country," said former NJIT Head Coach Jim Engles. "He is a tremendous addition to our coaching staff, a tireless recruiter, terrific relationship builder and someone who believes in the values that align with both the NJIT community and our men's basketball program."



JOE GUTOWSKI

ROANOKE '13 | 1ST SEASON AT NJIT

Joe Gutowski joined the NJIT men's basketball staff in August 2017 as Director of Basketball Operations. After starting his coaching career as an assistant for Christiansburg High School in Christiansburg, Va., Gutowski entered the college ranks in 2014-15 as an Assistant Coach and Recruiting Coordinator for Muhlenberg College men's basketball program in Allentown, Pa. Beginning in March 2015, Gutowski worked for The Hoop Group, the largest basketball instruction organization in the world. He became the Director of The Hoop Group Skills Camp in the Pocono Mountains after spending multiple years working within the Skills, Elite, and Team Tournaments Divisions. Gutowski graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's in Health and Physical Education from Roanoke College in Salem, Va. Gutowski was named to the Dean's List, received the Daniel Poe Klein Scholarship and was honored as Virginia AHPERD Major of the Year Award winner. He replaces Andrew McGlynn, who served two seasons at the post before being named Director of Basketball Operations for La Salle University.

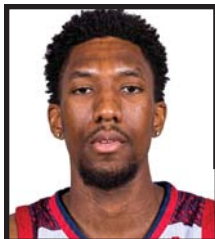

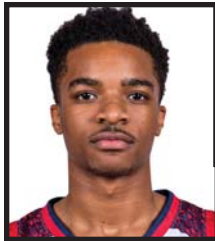

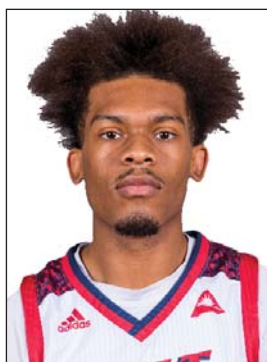
