MEDIA SERVICES

DIA INTERVIEW PROCEDURE

To facilitate the schedules of Division of Intercollegiate Athletics coaches and administrators and to expedite media requests, the University of Illinois Sports Information Office requires media personnel to arrange interview requests through the Sports Information staff. This interview procedure is designed to enhance the availability of DIA staff members to answer questions from the media at a time which best facilitates each individual's schedule.

In most situations, student-athletes are not available on the day of scheduled intercollegiate competition until after the event is completed. Players have been instructed not to talk to media who haven't coordinated their requests through Sports Information. The team locker room and training room are off limits to media personnel.

PRESS BOX

ENTRANCE TO PRESS BOX Enter the press box through Gate 10 via the press elevator located in the Northwest corner of Memorial Stadium (press box side of the field). Press level for all working media is level 8.

MEDIA WILL CALL (Assembly Hall Box Office): Credentials that are not mailed may be picked up at the "Press Will Call" at the box office of the Assembly Hall. Will Call opens two hours before kickoff. Persons picking up credentials will be required to provide photo identification. All credentials are non-transferable.

WORKING PRESS DECK (level 8): This level is reserved for print media, originating and non-originating radio, network television and sports information personnel. Wireless internet is available free of charge to working media.

PHOTO DECK (level 5): This deck, located on the West Balcony level, offers a limited area for all broadcast video photographers who are covering the game. This area also will be used by network television and Illini Productions. Food service for media utilizing this area is in the main press box (level 8) or in the photo tent.

PHOTO TENT (field level/SE corner): This area offers a field-level workroom for photographers covering the game. In addition to work tables and power outlets, wireless internet service is provided. This area contains pregame and halftime food service for photographers. Photo vests are obtained here and are required to shoot from the field.

SUITES AND CLUB SEATS (levels 6/7): This level contains individual suites and an indoor club seating for the 77 Club. Levels 6 and 7 are not accessible to the media.

SIDELINES

The University of Illinois follows NCAA and Big Ten rules regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and they must wear both a sideline credential and a photo vest at all times. Violators of the policy will be escorted from the stadium.

HOME-GAME CREDENTIALS

Media and photography credential and parking applications will be accepted on-line at *fightingillini*. com/media. Season credential requests should be made by Friday, August 17. Single-game credential requests should be made two weeks prior to each game to ensure mail delivery, or no later than Monday before each game for will call or pregame day pickup. Illinois sports information staff will review each application and individuals will receive an e-mail notification following that review. Please note that in the event of heavy demand for credentials for a particular game, requests will be prioritized according to published circulation numbers. Spouses, dates, non-workers and children will not be permitted in the press box. Media agencies violating this policy could have future credential requests denied. The press box is open to the media four hours prior to kickoff.

SIDELINE: Photographers with game-day sideline credentials must enter through the press box entrance on the northwest side of Memorial Stadium (Gate 10). To secure a photo vest, photographers must go to the photo tent in the SE corner of the playing field. Game credential alone will not gain admittance to the sidelines during the game. You must have a photo vest! Refreshments are available for photographers in the photo tent before each game and at halftime. Wireless passwords also can be obtained in the photo tent.

Media Agencies and Representatives shall not transmit or display any real-time video or audio, while the event or live network presentation of the event is in progress. Photographs or any text-based accounts or descriptions of the event (including without limitation, any web log, blog, online journal or other web-based publication) during the event is only allowed with the advance written permission of the Illinois Division of Intercollegiate Athletics.

WEB SITES

Media credentials are issued only for individuals who are affiliated with web sites for national or regional television and news media organizations, e.g. USA Today Online, ESPN, CNN/SI, CBS Sportsline, Rivals.com, Scout.com, etc., for institutions that are conference members and non-conference opponents, and for the Big Ten Conference. The University of Illinois reserves the right to deny media credentials to any individual whose web site is not affiliated with an official news-gathering organization.

PARKING

Media parking is located in Lot 32, which is located on the SW corner of First and Kirby, south of Memorial Stadium. Entrance to the parking lot is off First Street. Parking credentials should be requested at the same time game-day working credentials are requested. If time permits (at least six working days), both credentials will be mailed. Those who request parking passes the week of the game must pick them up by 5 p.m. Friday at the UI Sports Information Office (1700 S. Fourth St., Champaign), or at the Media Will Call location in the Assembly Hall Box Office.

HOTEL ROOMS

The Sports Information Office has a limited number of rooms reserved in the Champaign-Urbana area. Please contact SID office manager **Jennifer Funderburk**, 217-333-1391, at least two weeks in advance. These rooms will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

TELEPHONES

Telephone lines in the press box must be ordered at least two weeks in advance of the game(s) for which they are needed. The orders should be addressed to AT&T (800/321-8152 or 800/443-9370 fax), during regular business hours. No telephone lines or instruments are available through the UI Sports Information Office. The stadium address is 1402 South First Street, Champaign, IL 61820.

Photographers are encouraged to use wireless access in the photo tent rather than installing phone lines.

WIRELESS ACCESS

Media members and photographers will have access to the internet during games through a wireless network. All wishing to use wireless internet should present their credential to a sports information representative in the press box or photo tent to receive a wireless password.

PREGAME AND POSTGAME SERVICES

Play-by-play, halftime and complete final statistics, quote sheets, and pregame and postgame notes are all regular services on game day. Coach Tim Beckman and selected Illinois players will be available approximately 10-15 minutes after the conclusion of the game and will be brought to the interview room (located on the ground floor of the football facility in the northeast corner of Memorial Stadium). A member of the UI SID staff will escort media members to the Illinois interview area and will leave the press box with approximately seven minutes remaining in the game. Media will be escorted to the postgame interview area through the team entrance after the team has exited the field. Those interested in audio-taping grouped interviews should connect their recorders to the distribution amplifier provided. Output from the device is microphone level, terminated in 1/8" twoconductor plugs and jacks, or three-pin standard microphone male connectors. The visiting SID will lead media down to the visitor's interview area, located in the visiting locker room in the northwest corner of the stadium.

WEEKLY PRESS LUNCHEON

The best time to interview Coach Tim Beckman is each Monday at his weekly press luncheon at 1:20 p.m. CT in the 8th Level Media Area of Memorial Stadium. The press conference also can be accessed via teleconference. Contact the sports information office for the conference phone number. Media parking is in the NW Assembly Hall parking lot. The DIA is not responsible for any parking tickets received. Illinois offers a weekly football satellite feed, with comments from Coach Tim Beckman's weekly press conference on Mondays beginning Aug. 27 and running every week (except for bye weeks) of the season. For satellite coordinates and exact time, contact sports information at (217) 333-1391.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Monday: 1:50-2:20 pm, Press Level Memorial Stadium. Selected players along with approved requested players. Player requests must be received by SID staff by noon on Sunday.

Tuesday: After practice. Offensive players not involved with press conference on Monday. Player requests should be submitted to SID by noon on Monday.

Wednesday: After practice. Defensive players not involved with press conference on Monday. Player requests should be submitted to SID by noon on Tuesday.

Phone Interviews - Monday afternoon and after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. Requests should be submitted to SID by noon a day prior to the interview.

First-year freshmen will be available once Big Ten games begin at the discretion of Coach Beckman.

Please arrange interview requests in advance with Kent Brown, Derek Neal or Ben Taylor in the Sports Information Office, 217-333-1391. We will make every effort to fulfill your request, however, the student-athletes' academic and athletic requirements take priority.

COACH INTERVIEWS

Coach Beckman and coordinators are available for media interviews Mondays during the regularly scheduled press conference. Coach Beckman will begin his portion at approximately 1:20 pm, with players and requested coordinators beginning at approximately 1:50 pm. Offensive assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesdays and defensive assistant coaches will be available after practice on Wednesdays.

Coach Beckman is also available for interviews immediately before practice Tuesday and Wednesday by appointment. Contact the SID to arrange, preferably at least 24 hours in advance. Phone interviews with Coach Beckman may also be arranged through the SID following the Big Ten coaches' teleconference call that begins at noon each Tuesday during the season.

Please arrange interview requests in advance with Kent Brown in the Sports Information Office, 217-333-1391.

BIG TEN TELECONFERENCE

The 41-station Illini Sports Network brings Illinois football to fans across the state and Midwest with Brian Barnhart, Kurt Kittner and Steve Kelly calling the action.

In 2012, Barnhart will begin his 11th season as the "Voice of the Illini" after a long stint in professional baseball, including two years as the play-by-play voice of the Anaheim Angels. Barnhart serves as the voice of the Illini Sports Network, providing play-by-play coverage of football and men's basketball and as the host of the statewide "Tim Beckman Show" call-in program every Wednesday night at 7:05 p.m.

A native of nearby Tolono, Barnhart graduated Liberty University before beginning a 15-year career in professional baseball in 1986. In 1998, Barnhart was named the play-by-play announcer for the Angels and spent two full seasons with the American League club before returning to the Champaign-Urbana area in 2000. He currently is a new and sports announcer at WDWS-AM 1400 in Champaign. During the 2007 season, Barnhart was honored by the Illinois Broadcasters Association with the "Silver Dome Award for Best Sports Play-by-Play" for his call of Illinois'

football upset of No. 1 Ohio State. In 2008, Barnhart was named "Sportscaster of the Year" in the state of Illinois by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association.

Former Illini All-American quarterback Kurt Kittner joined the Illini Sports Network in 2007 and is in his sixth season as expert analyst. Kittner lettered at Illinois from 1998-2001, leading the Illini to a the Big Ten title, a 10-win season and a trip to the Sugar Bowl in 2001. The three-time team MVP was the signal caller for the most proficient offenses in school history. Kittner was a two-time All-Big Ten selection, won 24 games in an Illinois jersey and finished 12th in the Heisman Trophy voting in 2001. The Schaumburg, Ill. native was a fifth-round draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons.

Along with Barnhart and Kittner on the broadcast again this fall is Kelly, a veteran Illini sportscaster who handles pregame, halftime and postgame host duties. Kelly has covered Illini athletics for over two decades on television and radio. He hosts the popular "Sports Talk" show on WDWS-AM 1400 in Champaign and also hosts "Gameday" extended coverage of Illini athletics on WDWS and Lite Rock 97.5.

The statewide Illini Sports Network is managed by the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics, including distribution, sales operations, affiliate relations and programming. ISN programming includes Illinois football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball and baseball, along with the "Illini Today" series. The "Tim Beckman Show" can be heard statewide on the Illini Sports Network every Wednesday beginning Aug. 29 at 7:05 p.m.

2012 PRESEASON NOTES

- A new head coach, Tim Beckman, takes over in 2012 for the Fighting Illini, the 123rd year in the program's history.
- Illinois finished the 2011 season on high note, defeating UCLA, 20-14, in the 2011 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl
 to finish with a record of 7-6.
- The Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl win over UCLA, combined with the 38-14 win over Baylor in the 2010 Texas Bowl, gave Illinois bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.
- Illinois opens the 2012 season looking to reach a bowl game for the third consecutive season, something that hasn't been done since making five straight bowl appearances from 1988-92.
- Illinois returns seven starters on the offensive side of the ball OL Michael Heitz, OL Hugh Thornton, OL Graham Pocic, WR Darius Millines, WR Spencer Harris, QB Nathan Scheelhaase and the TE tandem of Evan Wilson and Jon Davis.
- The defense also returns seven starters DE Michael Buchanan, DT Akeem Spence, DT Glen Foster, LB Jonathan Brown, CB Terry Hawthorne and safeties Supo Sanni and Steve Hull.
- The Illini return both punters from 2011, traditional punter Justin DuVernois and rugby-style punter Ryan Lankford, as well as long-snapper Zak Pedersen.
- Illinois returns five of its top seven tacklers from a defense that ranked seventh nationally in 2011. Brown led the way last season with 108 stops, ranking sixth in the Big Ten in tackles per game (9.0). Spence was fourth on the team with 69 stops, Buchanan fifth with 64, Hawthorne sixth with 60 and Hull seventh with 58 tackles.
- Offensively, 100 percent of the Illini's passing production returns in 2012. However, less than 50 percent of
 the team's receiving and rushing production returns with the loss of wide receiver A.J. Jenkins and running
 backs Jason Ford and Troy Pollard to graduation.

THE BECKMAN ERA BEGINS

- Tim Beckman takes over in 2012 as the 23rd head football coach at the University of Illinois. Beckman
 came to Illinois after three years as head coach at Toledo, where he led the Rockets to two bowl appearances
 and a Mid-American Conference West Division co-championship. Beckman took over for Ron Zook, who was
 released following the 2011 regular season after seven seasons at Illinois.
- Beckman assembled a diverse and dynamic staff for 2012. It is composed of Tim Banks (defensive coordinator/safeties), Billy Gonzales (co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers), Chris Beatty (co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks), Luke Butkus (offensive line), Steve Clinkscale (cornerbacks), Keith Gilmore (defensive line), Alex Golesh (tight ends/specialists/recruiting coordinator), Tim Salem (running backs/special teams coordinator) and Mike Ward (linebackers). All three coordinators come to Illinois from BCS schools Banks from Cincinnati, Gonzales from LSU and Beatty from Vanderbilt. Golesh, Ward and Clinkscale all were on Beckman's staff at Toledo, while Salem was at Central Florida prior to coming to Champaign-Urbana. Butkus is an Illinois alumnus who was working in the NFL with the Seattle Seahawks, while Gilmore was retained from the previous Illini staff.

HOME COOKING

• After having a school-record eight home games, including five straight to start the season, in 2011, the Illini will have seven games inside the friendly confines of Memorial Stadium in 2012. The Illini start the season with four of their first five games at home, beginning with the season-opener against Western Michigan on Sept. 1. The Illini have an all-time record of 252-212-14 at Memorial Stadium entering the 2012 season.

RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

Illinois junior linebacker Jonathan Brown, senior defensive end Michael Buchanan and senior cornerback
Terry Hawthorne all return in 2012 after earning All-Big Ten honors a season ago. Brown was a second-team
selection by the media and honorable mention by the coaches, while Buchanan was a second-team pick by
both sets of voters. Hawthorne was an honorable mention selection by both panels last season.

TEAM NOTES

- Illinois had six games decided by one score in 2011, going 4-2 in those games. The Illini had three
 consecutive three-point wins against Arizona State, Western Michigan and Northwestern early in the season
 and also had a six-point win over UCLA in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl along with two losses by one score,
 losing at Purdue by seven and at Penn State by three.
- With only 64 penalties for 549 yards in 2011, the Illini ranked 30th nationally in fewest penalties per game (4.9) and 27th nationally in fewest penalty yards per game (42.2). The Illini were penalty-free against Arkansas State, the first time in 18 years that the Illini played a game without being flagged.
- Illinois' win over Arizona State on Sept. 17 marked the program's first victory over an AP-ranked opponent since topping No. 1 Ohio State on Nov. 10, 2007. The Illini had dropped nine straight games to ranked teams prior to that game. It also was the Illini's first win over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 25 Louisville, 34-10, on Sept. 22, 2001.
- Illinois' 53-point margin of victory against South Dakota State on Sept. 10 was its largest since 1944, when the Illini defeated Illinois-Normal (Illinois State), 79-6. Illinois' 56 points were its most at home since 2002, when the Illini scored 59 against Arkansas State.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** made big improvements in 2011, upping his completion percentage from 58.7 to 63.2 from his freshman to sophomore seasons. He also topped his 2010 totals in passing yardage (1,825 to 2,110), passing efficiency (132.0 to 133.4) and rushing touchdowns (five to six).
- After tossing four touchdowns and seven interceptions in the first six starts of his career, Scheelhaase threw 26 touchdowns and only nine interceptions from the midpoint of 2010 to the end of 2011.
- Tight end **Jon Davis** emerged during the second half of his freshman season in 2011, hauling in 19 of his 22 receptions in the last seven games, including a career-high five catches against Wisconsin, to earn third-team freshman All-America and first-team freshman All-Big Ten honors.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Illinois defense was dominating in 2011. The Illini finished the season ranked third nationally in pass defense (162.3 ypg), fourth in tackles for loss (7.9 per game), sixth in sacks (3.2 per game), seventh in total defense (286.2 ypg) and 15th in scoring defense (19.6 ppg).
- Illinois gave up only 11 scores and 65 total points after 28 turnovers in 2011 (eight TDs, three FGs). Since the start of 2010, the Illini have held opponents to 90 points (nine TDs, nine FGs) following 44 turnovers.
- LB **Jonathan Brown** was a monster during the second half of 2011, totaling 78 tackles, 13.5 TFLs, 4.0 sacks, two PBUs, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and three hurries in the final seven games of 2011. He ranked sixth in the nation and second in the Big Ten in TFLs per game (1.63).
- CB **Terry Hawthorne** turned the tide of the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl with his 39-yard interception return for TD late in the third quarter that gave Illinois a 10-7 lead. It was the second pick-six of Hawthorne's career (Minnesota, 2009). In the home finale vs. Wisconsin on Nov. 19, Hawthorne had a career-high 15 tackles and forced a fumble. For the season, Hawthorne led the team in interceptions (3) and passes defended (11).

BIG YEAR FOR FIGHTING ILLINI ATHLETICS

The Fighting Illini saw huge success across the board during the 2011-12 academic year.

- Mike Thomas was hired as the 18th Director of Athletics at Illinois on Aug. 10, 2011, and immediately made a splash by hiring new head coaches for football (Tim Beckman), men's basketball (John Groce) and women's basketball (Matt Bollant) during his first eight months on the job.
- Illinois finished 21st in the Learfield Sports Director's Cup, the second-best finish in program history. The Director's Cup measures the overall success of college athletic programs.
- The men's gymnastics team won the 2012 NCAA Championship, the program's first since 1989, while the women's volleyball team was the national runner-up after spending much of the season ranked No. 1.
- Four Illini programs won Big Ten titles in 2011-12. Men's gymnastics and men's golf both won their fourth consecutive conference titles, men's tennis won its first Big Ten title since 2005 and women's soccer won its second-ever Big Ten Tournament title.
- Illini individuals won six NCAA titles in 2011-12. Andrew Riley made history at the NCAA Track & Field
 Championship, becoming the first male ever to double as NCAA champ in the 100m and 110m hurdles.
 Women's track freshman Ashley Spencer (400m outdoor), gymnasts C.J. Maestas (rings) and Paul Ruggeri
 (vault), and golfer Thomas Pieters all won individual national titles as well.
