MEDIA SERVICES

DIA INTERVIEW PROCEDURE

To facilitate the schedules of Division of Intercollegiate Athletics coaches and administrators and to expedite media requests, the University of Illinois Athletic Communications Office requires media personnel to arrange interview requests through the Athletic Communications staff. This interview procedure is designed to enhance the availability of DIA staff members to answer questions from the media at a time which best facilitates each individual's schedule.

In most situations, student-athletes are not available on the day of scheduled intercollegiate competition until after the event is completed. Players have been instructed not to talk to media who haven't coordinated their requests through Athletic Communications. The team locker room and training room are off limits to media personnel.

PRESS BOX

ENTRANCE TO PRESS BOX Enter the press box through Gate 10 via the press elevator located in the northwest corner of Memorial Stadium (press box side of the field). Press level for all working media is Level 8.

MEDIA WILL CALL (State Farm Center Box Office): Credentials that are not mailed may be picked up at the "Press Will Call" at the box office of State Farm Center (formerly known as Assembly Hall). Will Call opens two hours before kickoff. Persons picking up credentials will be required to provide photo identification. All credentials are non-transferable.

WORKING PRESS DECK (Level 8): This level is reserved for print media, originating and non-originating radio, network television and athletic communications personnel. Wireless internet is available free of charge to working media.

PHOTO DECK (Level 5): This deck, located on the West Balcony level, offers a limited area for all broadcast video photographers who are covering the game. This area also will be used by network television and Illini Productions. Food service for media utilizing this area is in the main press box (Level 8) or in the photo tent.

PHOTO TENT (field level/SE corner): This area, underneath the southeast corner of the Horseshoe, offers a fieldlevel work room for photographers covering the game. In addition to work tables and power outlets, wireless internet service is provided. This area contains pregame and halftime food service for photographers. Photo vests are obtained here and are required to shoot from the field. These vests must be returned following the game.

SUITES AND CLUB SEATS (Levels 6/7): These levels contain individual suites and an indoor club seating for the 77 Club. Levels 6 and 7 are not accessible to the media.

SIDELINES

The University of Illinois follows NCAA and Big Ten rules regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and they must wear both a sideline credential and a photo vest at all times. Violators of the policy will be escorted from the stadium.

HOME-GAME CREDENTIALS

Media and photography credential and parking applications will be accepted online at fightingillini. com/media. Season credential requests should be made by Friday, August 16. Single-game credential requests should be made two weeks prior to each game to ensure mail delivery, or no later than Monday before each game for Will Call or pre-game day pickup. Illinois athletic communications staff will review each application and individuals will receive an e-mail notification following that review. Please note that in the event of heavy demand for credentials for a particular game, requests will be prioritized according to published circulation numbers. Spouses, dates, nonworkers and children will not be permitted in the press box. Media agencies violating this policy could have future credential requests denied. The press box is open to the media four hours prior to kickoff and will close three hours after the conclusion of the Illinois press conference.

SIDELINE: Photographers with game-day sideline credentials must enter through the press box entrance on the northwest side of Memorial Stadium (Gate 10). To secure a photo vest, photographers must go to the photo tent in the southeast corner of the playing field. Game credential alone will not gain admittance to the sidelines during the game. You must have a photo vest! Refreshments are available for photographers in the photo tent before the game and at halftime. Wireless passwords also can be obtained in the photo tent.

LIVE BLOGGING

Media Agencies and Representatives shall not transmit or display any real-time video or audio, while the event or live network presentation of the event is in progress. Photographs or any text-based accounts or descriptions of the event (including without limitation, any web log, blog, online journal or other web-based publication) during the event is only allowed with the advance written permission of the Illinois Division of Intercollegiate Athletics.

WEB SITES

Media credentials are issued only for individuals who are affiliated with web sites for national or regional television and news media organizations, e.g. USA Today Online, ESPN, CNN/SI, CBS Sportsline, Rivals.com, Scout.com, etc., for institutions that are conference members and non-conference opponents, and for the Big Ten Conference. The University of Illinois reserves the right to deny media credentials to any individual whose web site is not affiliated with an official news-gathering organization.

PARKING

Media parking is located in Lot 32, which is located at the southwest corner of First and Kirby, south of Memorial Stadium. Entrance to the parking lot is off First Street. Parking credentials should be requested at the same time game-day working credentials are requested. If time permits (at least six working days), both credentials will be mailed. Those who request parking passes the week of the game must pick them up by 5 p.m. Friday at the UI Athletic Communications Office (1700 S. Fourth St., Champaign), or at the Media Will Call location in the State Farm Center Box Office.

HOTEL ROOMS

The Athletic Communications Office has a limited number of rooms reserved in the Champaign-Urbana area. Please contact Athletic Communications office manager **Jennifer Funderburk**, 217-333-1391, at least two weeks in advance. These rooms will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

TELEPHONES

Telephone lines in the press box must be ordered at least two weeks in advance of the game(s) for which they are needed. The orders should be addressed to AT&T (800/321-8152 or 800/443-9370 fax), during regular business hours. No telephone lines or instruments are available through the UI Athletics Communications Office. The stadium address is

1402 South First Street, Champaign, IL 61820. Photographers are encouraged to use wireless access in the photo tent rather than installing phone lines.

WIRELESS ACCESS

Media members and photographers will have access to the internet during games through a wireless network. All wishing to use wireless internet should present their credential to an athletic communications representative in the press box or photo tent to receive a wireless password.

PREGAME AND POSTGAME SERVICES

Play-by-play, halftime and complete final statistics, quote sheets, and pregame and postgame notes are all regular services on game day. Coach Tim Beckman and selected Illinois players will be available approximately 10-15 minutes after the conclusion of the game and will be brought to the interview room (located on the ground floor of the football facility in the northeast corner of Memorial Stadium). A member of the UI Athletic Communications staff will escort media members to the Illinois interview area and will leave the press box with approximately seven minutes remaining in the game. Media will be escorted to the postgame interview area through the team entrance after the team has exited the field. Those interested in audio-taping grouped interviews should connect their recorders to the distribution amplifier provided. Output from the device is microphone level, terminated in 1/8" two-conductor plugs and jacks, or three-pin standard microphone male connectors. The visiting team personnel will lead media to the visitor's interview area, located in the visiting locker room in the northwest corner of the stadium.

WEEKLY PRESS LUNCHEON

The best time to interview head coach Tim Beckman is each Monday at his weekly press luncheon at 1:20 p.m. CT in the 8th Level media area of Memorial Stadium. The press conference also can be accessed via teleconference. Contact the Athletic Communications Office for the conference phone number. Media parking is in the northwest Assembly Hall parking lot. The DIA is not responsible for any parking tickets received. Illinois offers a weekly football satellite feed, with comments from head coach Tim Beckman's weekly press conference on Mondays beginning Aug. 26 and running every week (except for bye weeks) of the season. For satellite coordinates and exact time, contact Athletic Communications at (217) 333-1391.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Monday: 1:50-2:20 pm, Press Level Memorial Stadium. Selected players along with approved requested players. Player requests must be received by Athletic Communications staff by noon on Sunday.

Tuesday: After practice. Offensive players not involved with press conference on Monday. Player requests should be submitted to Athletic Communications by noon on Monday.

Wednesday: After practice. Defensive players not involved with press conference on Monday. Player requests should be submitted to Athletic Communications by noon on Tuesday.

Phone Interviews - Monday afternoon and after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. Requests should be submitted to Athletic Communications by noon a day prior to the interview.

First-year freshmen will be available once Big Ten games begin at the discretion of Coach Beckman.

Please arrange interview requests in advance with Kent Brown, Derek Neal or Ben Taylor in the Athletic Communications Office, 217-333-1391. We will make every effort to fulfill your request, but the student-athletes' academic and athletic requirements take priority.

COACH INTERVIEWS

Coach Beckman and coordinators are available for media interviews Mondays during the regularly scheduled press conference. Coach Beckman will begin his portion at approximately 1:20 pm, with players and requested coordinators beginning at approximately 1:50 pm. Offensive assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesdays and defensive assistant coaches will be available after practice on Wednesdays.

Coach Beckman is also available for interviews immediately before practice Tuesday and Wednesday by appointment. Contact Athletic Communications to arrange, preferably at least 24 hours in advance. Phone interviews with Coach Beckman may also be arranged through Athletic Communications following the Big Ten coaches' teleconference call that begins at noon each Tuesday during the season.

Please arrange interview requests in advance with Kent Brown in the Athletic Communications Office, 217-333-1391.

BIG TEN TELECONFERENCE



In 2013, Barnhart will begin his 12th season as the "Voice of the Illini" after a long stint in professional baseball, including two years as the play-by-play voice of the Anaheim Angels. Barnhart serves as the voice of the Illini Sports Network, providing play-by-play coverage of football and men's basketball and as the host of the statewide "Tim Beckman Show" call-in program every Monday night at 6:30 p.m.

A native of nearby Tolono, Barnhart graduated Liberty University before beginning a 15-year career in professional baseball in 1986. In 1998, Barnhart was named the play-by-play announcer for the Angels and spent two full seasons with the American League club before returning to the Champaign-Urbana area in 2000. He currently is a news and sports announcer at WDWS-AM 1400 in Champaign. During the 2007 season, Barnhart was honored by the Illinois Broadcasters Association with the "Silver Dome Award for Best Sports Play-by-Play" for his call of Illinois'

football upset of No. 1 Ohio State. In 2008, Barnhart was named "Sportscaster of the Year" in the state of Illinois by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association.

Former Illini All-American quarterback Kurt Kittner joined the Illini Sports Network in 2007 and is in his seventh season as expert analyst. Kittner lettered at Illinois from 1998-2001, leading the Illini to a the Big Ten title, a 10-win season and a trip to the Sugar Bowl in 2001. The three-time team MVP was the signal caller for the most proficient offenses in school history. Kittner was a two-time All-Big Ten selection, won 24 games in an Illinois jersey and finished 12th in the Heisman Trophy voting in 2001. The Schaumburg, Ill. native was a fifth-round draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons.

Along with Barnhart and Kittner on the broadcast again this fall is Kelly, a veteran Illini sportscaster who handles pregame, halftime and postgame host duties. Kelly has covered Illini athletics for over two decades on television and radio. He hosts the popular "Sports Talk" show on WDWS-AM 1400 in Champaign and also hosts "Gameday" extended coverage of Illini athletics on WDWS and Lite Rock 97.5.

The statewide Illini Sports Network is managed by Fighting Illini Sports Properties and encompasses all sponsorship and operational elements. ISN programming includes football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball and baseball, along with the "Illini Today" daily report. The "Tim Beckman Show" can be heard statewide on the Illini Sports Network every Monday beginning August 26th at 6:30 p.m.

2013 PRESEASON NOTES

- Head coach Tim Beckman will begin his second season at Illinois in 2013. Beckman was 21-16 in three years at Toledo before going 2-10 in his first season in Champaign-Urbana.
- The Fighting Illini will open the 2013 season on Aug. 31, when FCS foe Southern Illinois comes to Memorial Stadium for an 11 a.m. kickoff. Illinois is 12-0 all-time against FCS teams (formerly I-AA), with an average margin of victory of 30 points per game. All but one of those wins have been by at least 21 points, including last year's 44-0 drubbing of Charleston Southern.
- Illinois is set to host Wisconsin under the lights at Memorial Stadium on Oct. 19 at 7 p.m. CT. The Fighting Illini are 14-8 all-time in night games at Memorial Stadium and had won four in a row before last year's 52-24 loss to Louisiana Tech.
- Senior OT Corey Lewis was one of the feel-good stories of 2012 for the Fighting Illini. Thanks to the NCAA granting Lewis a rare sixth year of eligibility, the story will continue into 2013 for Lewis and the Illini. After missing over two-and-half years (over 1,000 days and 34 games) recovering from five different knee surgeries, Lewis saw his first game action since 2009 last season at Ohio State on Nov. 3 (25 snaps). After returning against the Buckeyes, Lewis also saw plenty of action in the last three games against Minnesota, Purdue and Northwestern. With a bachelor's degree in communication already in hand, Lewis emerged from spring practice as the projected starter at right tackle heading into 2013.
- Senior QB Nathan Scheelhaase enters his final season already on several Illinois career lists. The three-year starter begins 2013 ranked fifth on the UI career in total offense list (7,091 yards), sixth in career passing yardage (5,296), sixth in career passing efficiency (124.5), sixth in career completions (488), eighth in career passing attempts (801) and 18th in career rushing yardage (1,795), second among quarterbacks, at Illinois.
- Scheelhaase will begin 2013 with 36 career starts under his belt, tied for the 14th-most of any FBS player heading into the season and tied for the third-most by a quarterback behind only Georgia's Aaron Murray (41) and Nebraska's Taylor Martinez (39).
- Scheelhaase led Illinois to bowl victories in each his first two seasons (2010 Texas Bowl and 2011 Kraft Fight
 Hunger Bowl), making him one of only two QBs in Big Ten history to start and lead their teams to bowl wins
 during both his freshman and sophomore seasons. After missing a bowl in 2012, Scheelhaase is looking to
 end his UI career with a third bowl win, something no Illini QB has done previously.
- Senior LB Jonathan Brown has put up monster numbers over the last two years when healthy. Brown was leading the Illini with 59 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2012 before having his season cut short due to a shoulder injury. That followed a breakout 2011 season, when he earned All-Big Ten honors with 108 tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He ranked sixth in the nation in TFLs per game (1.63) and led the Big Ten in TFLs per game during conference play (2.07). A member of preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award, Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy, Brown sat our spring practice rehabbing the shoulder and is expected to be healthy for fall camp.
- Sophomore LB **Mason Monheim** will look to follow up a stellar freshman season that saw him earn second-team freshman All-America honors by Phil Steele. Monheim started the final 10 games of the season and led Illinois with 86 tackles on the season, the most among all Big Ten freshmen by a wide margin. Monheim ranked 15th in the conference in tackles per game (7.2), while no other B1G freshman was in the top 50.
- Junior punter **Justin DuVernois** enters 2013 as a Ray Guy Award candidate after averaging 41.9 yards per punt in 2012, fourth-best in the conference and 3.6 yards per kick better than 2011. As a team, Illinois led the Big Ten and ranked 23rd nationally in net punting in 2012, averaging 39.2 yards per kick.
- Entering 2013, Illinois has streaks of 49 games and 134 attempts without missing a PAT, the fifth- and sixth-longest active streaks in the nation, respectively. The last time the Fighting Illini did not convert a PAT kick was on Sept. 5, 2009, against Missouri.

NIKE REBRAND IN THE WORKS

Illinois athletics is in the midst of a large-scale, 18-month brand evaluation program with Nike. The collaboration begin in January 2013 and will result in an updated brand identity for 2014, including logos, marks, uniforms and equipment for football and all 19 Fighting Illini sports. In the meantime, the football team will be wearing a new primary orange helmet for the 2013 season. This year's orange helmet features a navy blue Block I logo on the sides in place of the slant ILLINOIS wordmark, along with navy facemasks and the traditional blue-white-blue center striping. The 2013 secondary helmet will remain the navy blue matte finish with orange Block I logo and no stripes that was introduced for the 2012 season.

NEW DAKTRONICS SCOREBOARD INSTALLED

When the 2013 season kicks off, Fighting Illini fans will see a new Daktronics video display at Memorial Stadium. The south end zone features a new HD video display measuring 36 feet tall by 96 feet wide, nearly four times larger than the previous display. In addition, a new supplemental ribbon display hangs below the video display in the south end that measures over 50 feet wide, and two LED ribbon displays measuring more than 420 feet in length are attached to the fascia between the seating decks on each side of the field. Additional video displays measuring 17 feet by 10 feet are mounted to the northeast and southeast towers.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

The football team once again excelled in the classroom during the 2013 spring semester, with 51 players earning at least a 3.0 grade-point average, 12 more than Spring 2012 and nine more than fall 2013. As a team, the Illini posted a 2.87 cumulative GPA, up from a 2.70 in fall 2012 and 2.71 posted in spring 2012. In addition, 16 Fighting Illini football players earned degrees in 2013, 18 earned Academic All-Big Ten status, and four were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars — DL Houston Bates, OL Corey Lewis, OL Tyler Sands and QB Nathan Scheelhaase.

ILLINI HOLD LIFT FOR LIFE FUNDRAISER

Fighting Illini players raised nearly \$5,000 for acoustic neuroma, which ended the career of former Illini offensive lineman **Andrew Carter**, with their second annual Lift for Life fundraiser through Uplifting Athletes on June 21, 2013. Acoustic neuroma is a rare, slow-growing tumor of the nerve that connects the ear to the brain. Uplifting Athletes is a network of university chapters run by current football student-athletes. Each chapter adopts a rare disease that has personal meaning to their team. Football players hold special events, fundraising campaigns or awareness drives to support research for their adopted cause. **Corey Lewis**, Illinois' senior offensive tackle, serves as president of the UI chapter of Uplifting Athletes and helped organize the event, which featured the entire Fighting Illini team participating in a strongman compeitioin at Memorial Stadium. ILLINOIS NFL DRAFT FACTS

- Illinois led all Big Ten schools with four players selected in the 2013 NFL Draft.
- Illinois has had four players chosen in each of the last four drafts (2010-2013)
- At least three Illini have been drafted in each of the last five drafts (2009-2013)
- 16 Illinois players have been drafted since 2010, including 10 in the first three rounds (most in the Big Ten)
- Despite not having a first-rounder in 2013, Illinois has had five first round draft picks since 2008, which is the most of any Big Ten team.
- Akeem Spence was the eighth Illini in the last six years to enter the draft with eligibility remaining. All eight were taken in the first four rounds, including four first-rounders.
- Four Illini defensive linemen have been drafted in the last three years - Corey Liuget (first round, 2011), Whitney Mercilus (first round, 2012), Akeem Spence (fourth round, 2013) and Michael Buchanan (seventh round, 2013)
