2013 SEASON IN REVIEW

4-8 overall, 1-7 Big Ten (5th – Leaders Division)

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- The 2013 Fighting Illini doubled their win total from 2012, going 4-8 overall and 1-7 in Big Ten Conference play to finish fifth in the Leaders Division.
- The revamped Illinois offense, directed by new offensive coordinator **Bill Cubit**, made huge improvements. The Illini jumped at least 50 spots in the national rankings from 2012 to 2013 in first downs, passing offense, long scrimmage plays, total offense, passing efficiency and scoring offense, with the biggest turnaround an 95-place jump in first downs per game.

- Sophomore CB/KR/PR **V'Angelo Bentley** became the first player in 124 years of Illinois football history to return a kickoff and a punt for a TD in the same season. He had a 67-yard punt return for TD against Ohio State and a school-record 100-yard kick return TD against SIU in the season-opener. He led the Big Ten and ranked seventh nationally in punt return average (15.8 ypr).
- Sophomore RB **Josh Ferguson** broke the Illinois record for single-season receiving yards by a running back with 535 on 50 catches (10.7 ypc). His 44.6 receiving yards per game ranked second in the nation for a running back. Ferguson led the Illini in rushing yards (779) and total touchdowns (11), was second on the team in receiving yards (535), and ranked ninth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (112.6).
- Senior LB **Jonathan Brown** ranked second in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in tackles per game (9.9), racking up 119 stops on the season. Brown ranked fourth in the conference in TFLs (15.0), racking up 45.5 during his Illinois career, good for third on the school's all-time TFLs list.
- Senior WR **Steve Hull** turned in one of the best seasons for a receiver in school history in his first season playing the position. Hull, who spent his first three years at Illinois as a starting safety, exploded for 40 catches, 653 yards and six TDs over the last four weeks of the season, the most receiving yards in the nation during that span. He had a career-high 224 yards receiving at Indiana on Nov. 9, the second-best single-game total in school history, and finished the season with 993 yards on 59 catches to earn honorable mention All-Big Ten status.
- Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** led the Big Ten and ranked in the top 25 nationally in total offense (295.2 ypg, 22nd), passing yards per game (272.7, 19th), completions per game (23.9 cpg, 11th) and completion percentage (66.7, 15th), while also breaking the UI single-season passing efficiency record (140.7).
- Scheelhaase finished his Illinois career as the school's all-time leader in total offense (10,634 yards, 7th-most in Big Ten history), ranked second in career completions (775), completion percentage (63.0) and rushing yards by a QB (2,066), and third in passing yardage (8,568), touchdown passes (55) and passing efficiency (130.2).
- Scheelhaase finished Illinois career with 48 starts, tied for the most career starts in Illinois history with Tim Simpson (1988-91) and Jeff Allen (2008-11), both offensive linemen.
- Scheelhaase ended 2013 as the only active player in the nation with over 8,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards. He and former Illini Juice Williams are the only two players in Big Ten history to reach those benchmarks in their careers.

BIG TEN HONORS

Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** and senior LB **Jonathan Brown** were named second-team All-Big Ten by media who cover the conference, while conference coaches listed the pair as honorable mention. Senior WR **Steve Hull** earned honorable mention recognition from both the coaches and media, while junior DE **Houston Bates** was an honorable mention pick by the media. Scheelhaase also picked up his third consecutive Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honor.

OFFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

- The 2013 Illini offense finished in the top five in school history in passing yards per game (third, 287.7 ypg), points per game (fourth, 29.7 ppg) and total offense per game (fourth, 426.7 ypg).
- Illinois led the Big Ten and ranked 16th nationally and third in the Big Ten in third-down conversion percentage (81-of-170, .476).
- The Orange and Blue's 50 passing plays of 20-plus yards ranked 33rd nationally and their seven passing plays of 50-plus yards led the Big Ten and ranked 19th nationally.
- In 124 years of football, Illinois has had 600-plus total yards in a game 11 times. Two of those 11 times came in 2013: 612 at Indiana and 601 vs. Miami (Ohio). Coming into the year, Illinois had not reached 600 yards of total offense since 2007 (655 yards at Minnesota on 11/3/07).
- Illinois scored a school-record 161 points over its first four games, eclipsing the previous record of 158 points in the first four games of 1914, when the Illini won Big Ten and national titles.

SPECIAL TEAMS TEAM NOTES

- Illinois has streaks of 61 games and 174 attempts without missing a PAT kick, which both rank as the third-longest streaks in the nation. The last time the Illini did not convert a PAT kick was Sept. 5, 2009, against Missouri.
- The 2013 Illini team has both a punt return and kickoff return for touchdown (both by **V'Angelo Bentley**), marking the first time an Illinois team has had multiple return TDs in the same season since 2007.
- As a team, the Illini ranked 16th in FBS in punt returns (12.95 ypr), up 112 spots from 2012, when they averaged 1.56 ypr to rank 118th. Illinois posted its most punt return yards as a team since 2004, with 272 (22.7 yards per game). The 2004 Illini squad had 284 in 11 games (25.8 ypg).

COREY LEWIS: THE COMEBACK KID

Senior OT **Corey Lewis** was one the feel-good stories in college football in 2013. After missing more than two-and-half years (34 games) recovering from three ACL tears and five different knee surgeries, Lewis saw his first game action in over 1,000 days at Ohio State on Nov. 3, 2012, and played in the season's final four games. With a bachelor's degree in communication already in hand and a sixth year of NCAA eligibility granted, Lewis made his first career start in the 2013 season-opener against Southern Illinois, more than five years after first setting foot on campus. He started all 12 games in 2013, playing a huge role in Illinois' offensive resurgence. The icing on the cake for Lewis came at Indiana, when he pounced on a loose ball in the end zone for a touchdown, his first career points.

SWEET HOME CHICAGO

- Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field on Sept 14, a 34-24 loss to No. 19/23 Washington in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994, in front of 39,472.
- The game against Washington was Illinois' first in the city of Chicago since the 48-27 victory over Northwestern at Wrigley Field on Nov. 20, 2010.

FORMER ILLINI IN SPACE

- Former Illini defensive back and current NASA astronaut **Mike Hopkins** followed the 2013 Fighting Illini from outer space, literally. Hopkins and crewmates Oleg Kotov and Sergey Ryazanskiy launched from Baikonur, Kazakhstan, at 3:58 p.m. CT on Sept. 25, and arrived at the International Space Station six hours later. Hopkins remained on board as a flight engineer on Expedition 37/Expedition 38, until March 2014. During its time on the station, the crew conducted science experiments and maintenance.
- Each week during the season, Hopkins set the team a video from the International Space Station congratulating the previous week's special teams player of the game and giving the team a message for the upcoming game. In May 2014, after his return to Earth, Hopkins delivered the University of Illinois commencement speech at Memorial Stadium.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

The Illini once again excelled in the classroom. Twenty-one players earned degrees in 2014 after 16 did so in 2013 and 15 in 2012. For four consecutive semesters at least 40 football student-athletes have posted at least a 3.0 grade-point-average: 42 in fall 2012, a program-record 51 in spring 2013, 43 in Fall 2013 and 41 in Spring 2014. As a team, the Illini posted a 2.84 cumulative GPA in fall 2013 and a 2.90 in spring 2014, up from 2.71 and 2.87, respectively, a year ago. In addition, 21 Fighting Illini earned Academic All-Big Ten status in fall 2013, up from 18 in 2012. The Illini also were active in the community, hosting free weekly youth clinics during the season and making regular visits to local schools and hospitals throughout the year.

GAME NOTES

- With today's win, the Illini have won 16 consecutive home openers, including the first two season openers under head coach Tim Beckman. Illinois is now 4-0 all-time against SIU, 13-0 all-time against FCS teams and 14-0 against the other public universities in the state.
- Illinois scored its first two touchdowns of the season in the span of 29 seconds in the second quarter (Josh Ferguson 53-yard TD reception, forced fumble and Donovan Young 2-yard rushing TD).
- Illinois had two 100-yard receivers (Lankford – 115, Ferguson – 103) for the first time since A.J. Jenkins (148) and Darius Millines (119) against Arkansas State on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Nathan Scheelhaase turned in a career-high 416 passing yards, which ranks as the 10th-best single-game total in school history and surpasses his previous personal best of 391 yards. His 416 yards also rank as the fifth-most ever by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium and the first 400-yard game since Juice Williams broke the Memorial Stadium record with 462 passing yards against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008.
- Sophomore V'Angelo Bentley notched the longest kickoff return by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history with his 100-yard kickoff return, matching the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.

- The Illini converted 9-of-15 third downs, while holding Cincinnati to 3-of-13 on third down conversions and 0-of-2 on fourth down, including the game-changing goal-line stop in the third quarter. Illinois averaged 11.8 yards on its nine third-down conversions, with seven of the nine going for nine yards or more.
- The Orange and Blue held the Cincinnati offense under 20 points for only the second time in the past 18 games, dating back to Nov. 26, 2011. The only other team to achieve the feat was Rutgers in a 10-3 Scarlet Knight victory on Nov. 17, 2012.
- Illinois registered 40-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when they topped Purdue 44-10 on Oct. 30 and fell to Michigan 67-65 on Nov. 6.
- The Illini racked up 522 yards of total offense, marking their first 500-yard game since Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana. They also notched 210 yards on the ground, their first 200-yard rushing game since Sept. 8, 2012, at Arizona State.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase finished 26-of-37 with 312 yards, marking the first time he has passed for 300 yards in back-to-back games in his career. The last Illinois quarterback to accomplish the feat was Juice Williams at Michigan (310, 10/4/2008) and vs. Minnesota (462, 10/11/2008).

- Senior Miles Osei threw a career-long 35-yard pass to junior Matt LaCosse for his first pass completion of the season and fifth of his career. The play also marked a career-long reception for LaCosse.
- Senior linebacker Jonathan Brown led the Illini for the third-straight game with a season-high 15 tackles, including his first full sack and 1.5 TFLs. It marked his most tackles since posting 17 against Ohio State on Oct. 15, 2011.

Scheelhaase threw for 321 yards, his most in a Big Ten game since passing for 391 vs. Northwestern on Oct. 1, 2011.

- Illinois snapped its 20-game Big Ten losing streak and won a conference game for the first Big Ten win since a 41-20 win over Indiana on Oct. 8, 2011.
- The Illini defense took the field after four Illini turnovers but held Purdue to zero points on those four possessions. Purdue twice took over inside the Illinois 30 yard line, and the Illini defense held the Boilers to a missed field goal and a turnover on downs.
- Purdue piled up 150 yards and two touchdowns on its first two drives, but the Illini defense stiffened thereafter. Illinois held the Boilers to just 133 yards and five first downs over the game's final 48:19. Purdue recorded only three first downs in the second half and Illinois recorded twice as many first downs (22-11) as Purdue for the game.
- Nathan Scheelhaase became the 10th player in Big Ten history to amass 10,000 career yards of total offense. With 276 yards today (257 passing, 19 rushing), Scheelhaase now has 10,272 career yards, which ranks eighth in Big Ten history.
- Steve Hull caught 10 passes for 169 yards, this third-straight 100-yard receiving game. After totaling 19 receptions for 340 yards and one touchdown in the first eight games of the season, Hull has recorded 26 catches for 498 yards and five touchdowns in the last three games, the nation's most prolific receiver by yards during that span.
- Josh Ferguson caught four passes for 11 yards, breaking Kameno Bell's Illinois record of single-season receiving yards by a running back. Ferguson now has 509 receiving yards this season, surpassing Bell's total of 503 yards from the 1991 season.
- Ferguson passed 1,000 career rushing yards, becoming the third active Illini in the 1,000-yard club (Nathan Scheelhaase, Donovan Young). With 115 yards today, Ferguson now has 1,033 career rushing yards.
- Ferguson picked up his third career 100-yard rushing game. He carried the ball 20 times for 115 yards, both of which were career highs.

- With 362 total yards against Northwestern, senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase broke Juice Williams' (10,594 yards) career total offense record and closed his career as Illinois' all-time leader and seventh-best in the Big Ten with 10,634 yards (2,066 rushing, 8,568 passing).
- Scheelhaase became the eighth Illini quarterback to throw for 3,000 yards in a season and finished in fourth place on the single-season list with 3,272 yards after his fifth 300-yard passing game this season (307 yards).
- Scheelhaase threw for two touchdowns and tied Jack Trudeau for the third-most career passing touchdowns in school history with 55 TDs. His career-high 21 touchdown passes this year tied Jon Beutjer (2002) for the fifth-most in a single season by an Illini quarterback.
- Senior wide receiver Steve Hull continued his stellar play with his fourth consecutive 100-yard receiving game. He collected a career-high 13 receptions for 155 yards, moving him into eighth place in single-season receiving yards by an Illini with 993 yards.
