Orange Krush is a student-run cheering section of dedicated Illini students who love basketball, with more than 900 students standing courtside to cheer on the Illinois men’s basketball team. Members arrive hours before the game to get the best seats on the floor on game day, with the line of Orange Krush students waiting for the doors to open extending halfway around State Farm Center.

Not only is the Orange Krush considered one of the nation’s premier basketball student sections, it also is a charity foundation as well. Founded in 1998, the Orange Krush Foundation is a University of Illinois student-run foundation intent on improving the quality of life for the youth and young adults of the Champaign-Urbana and campus community by providing financial support and contributing community service to area not-for-profit organizations.

Since the inception of the Orange Krush Foundation, Krush members have raised and donated more than \$2.8 million to charity. The Orange Krush Foundation is almost entirely student-run and has donated funds to worthy causes including The V Foundation for Cancer Research, The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, Make-A-Wish Foundation, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Developmental Services Center. In addition, the Orange Krush Foundation also funds scholarship.

Krush began its scholarship endeavors by creating the Matthew Heldman Memorial Fund, which honors Matthew Heldman, a point guard for the Illini’s 1998 Big Ten Championship Team, who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1999. The fund, in his name, endows a scholarship for a future Illini basketball player. After five years, the Orange Krush fulfilled the \$250,000 commitment, and the fund is fully endowed.

During the 2003 season, the Orange Krush Foundation announced the formation of the Rod Cardinal Sports Medicine Fund. This fund pays tribute to Rod Cardinal, who was the University of Illinois men’s basketball athletic trainer for 30 years. The endowment benefits all student trainers at the University of Illinois, which in turn benefits all varsity athletic teams. Krush completed fundraising for this fund in 2006.

At the conclusion of the 2005 season, Orange Krush created the Louis and Dawn M. Weber Student Manager Enhancement Fund. Named



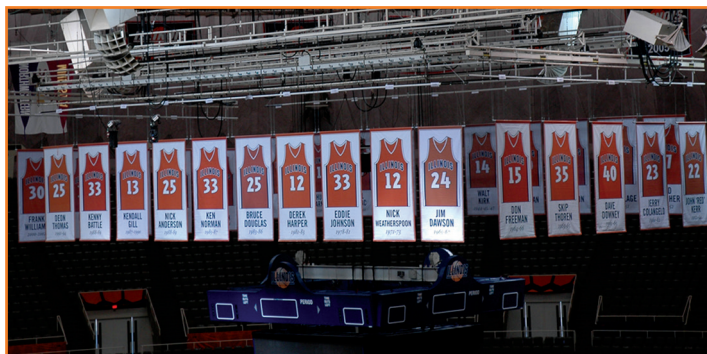
in memory of former coach Bruce Weber’s parents, the fund benefits Illinois’ men’s basketball managers.

Orange Krush began its newest endeavor in 2009, announcing the Lou Henson Coaching Development Endowment Fund. Named in honor of former Illinois head coach Lou Henson, this \$500,000 pledge will be used as a fund to promote the basketball coaching profession within the younger generation, supporting people entering the coaching profession in positions such as graduate assistant, director of basketball operations and video coordinator.

Players selected to have their jerseys hung must have achieved any of the following criteria: 1) National Player of the Year; 2) Enshrined in the National Basketball Hall of Fame; 3) U.S. Olympian; 4) Big Ten Player of the Year; 5) Consensus First- or Second-Team All-American; 6) Illinois All-Century Team Member; 7) Individual whose pioneering efforts made a significant impact on Illinois and international basketball.

#11 DEE BROWN (G, 2003-06)

2006 Bob Cousy Award winner as a senior as nation's top point guard ... NCAA Consensus Second-Team All-American ... Wooden Award All-America Team ... Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner as nation's top player 6-0 and under ... First-Team All-Big Ten selection, USBWA District V Player of the Year and NABC First-Team All-District selection ... Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient ... *Sporting News* National Player of the Year as a junior in 2005 ... NCAA Consensus First-Team All-American ... Wooden Award All-America Team ... Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year ... USBWA District V Player of the Year and NABC First-Team All-District ... Winningest player in school history, playing in 114 wins during his career ... Ranks third all-time at Illinois in scoring (1,812 points), second in career 3-pointers (299) and steals (231) and third in assists (674).

Second-Team All-America selection by *Sporting News* and NABC ... Third-Team All-American by the *Associated Press* ... First-Team All-Big Ten selection by both media and coaches ... USBWA All-District and NABC First-Team All-District selection ... NCAA Chicago Regional Most Outstanding Player ... NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team ... Averaged 12.5 points and 6.8 assists in 2005 ... First-Team All-Big Ten, USBWA All-District, NABC Second-Team All-District and Big Ten All-Tournament Team selection as a sophomore in 2004 ... Only player in Big Ten history to lead the conference in assists in each of his first three seasons ... Ranks 41st all-time at Illinois in scoring (1,111 points) and fourth in career assists (594).

NCAA Consensus Second-Team All-American as a senior in 2005 ... Second-Team All-America selection by the *Associated Press*, USBWA and NABC ... First-Team All-Big Ten selection by both media and coaches ... USBWA All-District and NABC First-Team All-District selection ... Earned three accolades during the postseason: Big Ten All-Tournament Team, NCAA Chicago Regional All-Tournament Team and NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team ... Led the Illini in scoring, averaging 15.9 points ... Led the Big Ten in 3-pointers, setting an Illini school record with 116 treys on the season ... Ranks 23rd all-time at Illinois in scoring (1,295 points), eighth in career 3-pointers (209) and 10th in career steals (158).

All-Century Team member ... 2003 Big Ten Player of the Year and *Chicago Tribune* Silver Basketball Winner ... First-Team All-Big Ten pick in 2003 after earning Second-Team honors in 2001 and 2002 ... 2000 Big Ten Co-Freshman

of the Year ... Third-Team All-American in 2003 ... Ranks fourth on the Illini all-time scoring list with 1,748 points and seventh on the career rebounding list with 815 ... Led the Big Ten in scoring in 2003 with an average of 20.0 points per game ... Set the Illini single-season free throw record in 2002 by making 96-110 for 87.3 percent ... Played in 98 wins over his Illini career, ninth-most in school history.

#30 FRANK WILLIAMS (G, 2000-02)

All-Century Team member ... Earned Wooden Award All-America Team honors in 2001 and was honorable mention in 2002 ... Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Silver Basketball Award winner in 2001 ... First-Team All-Big Ten in 2001 and 2002 ... Wooden Award nominee in 2001 and 2002 ... Ranks 16th on the Illini career scoring list with 1,440 points, a career 14.3 scoring average ... Ranks ninth in school history in career assists with 432 and fourth in career steals with 212 ... Holds the Illini record with most free-throw attempts in a game with 24 ... Illini team MVP in 2001 and 2002 after helping Illinois to shares of the Big Ten title each season.

#25 DEON THOMAS (F/C, 1991-94)

All-Century Team member ... Illinois' all-time leading scorer with 2,129 points, and fourth all-time leading rebounder with 846 ... Averaged 18.0 points per game over his career and was a Second-Team All-Big Ten selection in 1992, 1993 and 1994, after earning Third-Team honors in 1991 ... Holds Illini records for most field goals in a career (803) and most free throws in a game with 19 ... Ranks second in school history with 177 blocks ... Illini team MVP in 1992, 1993 and 1994 ... Set Illini freshman scoring record with 34 points against Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

#13 KENDALL GILL (G, 1987-90)

All-Century Team member ... Earned First-Team All-America honors in 1990 after leading the Big Ten in scoring at 20.0 points per game ... First-team All-Big Ten in 1990 and Honorable-mention in 1989 ... Helped the Flying Illini to the 1989 Final Four ... Still ranks 18th on the Illini career scoring list with 1,409 points ... Third on the Illini career steals list with 218 ... First-round NBA draft pick by the Charlotte Hornets ... Also spent time with Seattle, New Jersey, Miami, Minnesota, Chicago and Milwaukee ... Helped Illini to the NCAA Tournament each of his four seasons.

Was the first player ever drafted by the Orlando Magic in 1989 ... Played 13 years in the NBA ... Sixth on the Illini career shooting list at 55.3 percent ... Ranks 33rd on the Illini career scoring list with 1,172 points, averaging 17.0 points over his two seasons ... Averaged 18.0 points and 7.9 rebounds in 1989, helping the Flyin' Illini

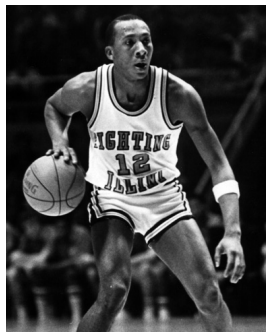

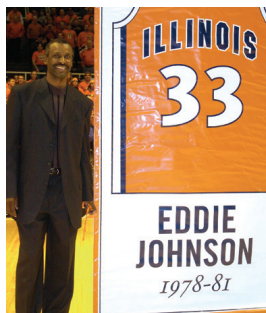

#33 KENNY BATTLE (F, 1988-89)

All-Century Team member ... The "King of the 360" was arguably the best dunker in Illini basketball history ... Transferred to Illinois from Northern Illinois after his sophomore season and still ranks 40th on the career scoring chart with 1,112 points and 16.1 average ... Stands fourth on the Illini career shooting list at 59.1 percent from the field ... His 596 total points in 1989 ranks 11th-best season in Illini history ... Honorable-Mention All-American in 1988 and 1989 ... Earned Third-Team All-Big Ten honors in 1988 and Second Team in 1989 ... Put the "Flyin'" into the Flyin' Illini on the way to the 1989 Final Four ... NBA first-round draft pick by the Detroit Pistons in 1989 and played four years in the league.

#33 KEN NORMAN (F, 1985-87)

All-Century Team member ... "Snake" earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in both 1986 and 1987 ... Consensus Second-Team All-American in 1987 ... Was an NBA first-round draft pick by the Los Angeles Clippers in 1987 and saw action in L.A., Milwaukee and Atlanta ... Ranks 19th on the Illini career scoring list with 1,393 points ... Best season was in 1987 when he averaged 19.7 points and 9.8 rebounds per game ... Shot 60.9 percent from the field during his three-year Illini career, second best in school history ... Set Illini single-season record by making 64.1 percent of his shots in 1986 (now ranks second).

#25 BRUCE DOUGLAS (G, 1983-86)

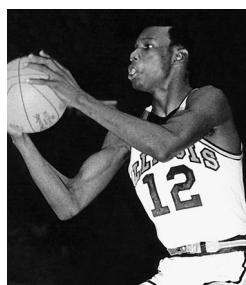
All-Century Team member ... Finished his career as the Big Ten's all-time leader in assists (765) and steals (324), still ranking second in assists ... Was the UPI Big Ten Co-Player of the Year in 1984 after helping the Illini to a share of the Big Ten title ... Was the Big Ten's Defensive Player of the Year in 1985 and 1986 ... Third in school history in minutes played at 4,373, including all 60 minutes in a four-overtime win over Michigan in 1984 ... Has four of the 10 best assist average seasons in Illinois history, and four of the top-five steals average seasons ... Still ranks 26th on the Illini career scoring list with 1,261 points ... Helped the Illini to four-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and an average of 12.3 Big Ten wins per season during his career ... Earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in 1984, Second-Team recognition in 1985 and 1986, and Honorable Mention in 1983 ... Third-Team All-American in 1984.

#12 DEREK HARPER (G, 1981-83)

All-Century Team member ... First-Team All-Big Ten in 1983 after earning Honorable-Mention honors in both 1981 and '82 ... Second-Team All-American in 1983 ... First draft pick in Dallas Mavericks franchise history in 1983 ... Enjoyed a 16-year NBA career ... Ranks 10th on the Illini career assists list with 419 and sixth on the career steals list with 178 ... Ranks 47th on the Illini career scoring list with 977 points ... Averaged 4.7 assists per game for his career ... Knocked down game-winning three-pointer against Minnesota in final regular-season game of 1983 to send Illini to the NCAA Tournament ... Led the Illini with 15.4 points per game as a junior in 1983 ... Team co-captain and MVP in 1983.

#33 EDDIE JOHNSON (F, 1978-81)

All-Century Team member ... Finished his Illini career as Illinois' all-time leading scorer, currently ranked seventh with 1,692 points ... Earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in 1981, Second-Team honors in 1980 and Honorable Mention in 1979 ... Team MVP in 1980 and 1981 ... Holds the Illini record for field goals in one season with 266 (1980) ... Enjoyed a long pro career following his days at Illinois, and still stands as the Illini's

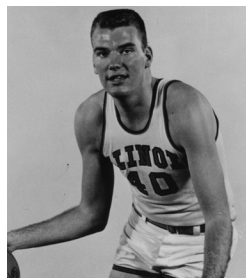

all-time leading scorer in the NBA with a total of 19,202 points ... Hit the game-winning shot for the fourth-ranked Illini against No. 1 Michigan State as Illinois posted a 57-55 win on Jan. 11, 1979 at the Assembly Hall ... Led Illini to the 1980 NIT, Illinois' first post-season appearance since 1963, and to the 1981 NCAA Tournament.

#12 NICK WEATHERSPOON (F, 1971-73)

All-Century Team member ... "Spoon" finished his career as Illinois' all-time leading scorer with 1,481 points, which still ranks 12th on the Illini career list ... His 20.9 career scoring average is best in Illini history ... Averaged 25.0 points per game in 1973 to earn First-Team All-America honors ... Honorable-Mention All-American and All-Big Ten in 1972 ... Also finished his career with the highest rebounding average in Illinois history at 11.3 boards per game ... Team MVP in 1972 and 1973 ... First-round draft pick by the Washington Bullets of the NBA.

#24 JIM DAWSON (G, 1965-67)

Earned the *Chicago Tribune* Silver Basketball Trophy in 1967 as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player ... Led the Illini in scoring as a senior with an average of 21.7 points ... Second-Team Academic All-American ... Named University of Illinois Athlete of the Year in 1967 ... Ranks 48th on the Illinois all-time scoring list with 976 career points.

#15 DON FREEMAN (F, 1964-66)

All-Century Team member ... Finished his Illini career as Illinois' all-time leading scorer with 1,449 points (now ranks 15th) and 20.1 career scoring average, third-best in school history ... Earned First-Team All-America honors in 1966 after setting school records for points in a season (668) and scoring average at 27.8 points per game ... Earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in 1966 after being named to the Third-Team in 1965.

#12 TAL BRODY (G, 1963-65)

First-team All-American by Helms and second-team All-American by Sporting News and Converse as a senior in 1965 ... Also a second-team Academic All-American and first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1965 ... Scored 1,121 points during his UI career, still ranking 38th on the school's all-time scoring list ... No. 12 pick in the NBA Draft, but chose to instead play professionally in Israel ... Enjoyed a standout career overseas, highlighted by Israel's title in the 1977 European Cup.

#35 DUANE "SKIP" THOREN (C, 1963-65)

All-Century Team member ... Named First-Team All-Big Ten in 1965 and Second-Team in 1964 ... Was First-Team All-American in 1965 and Honorable-Mention in 1964 ... Ranks 34th on the Illini career scoring chart with 1,164 points, averaging 15.7 points and 11.2 rebounds per game over his three-year career ... Averaged 20.3 points and 13.8 rebounds as a junior and 22.2 points and 14.5 rebounds as a senior ... Holds the top two spots on the Illini rebounding lists for season average (14.5 and 13.8) and total rebounds in a season (349 and 331) ... Set the Illini single-game rebound record with 24 against UCLA on Dec. 28, 1963 ... His scoring average of 22.2 points ranks as the fourth-best season in Illini history.

#40 DAVE DOWNEY (F, 1961-63)

All-Century Team member ... Set the Illinois single-game scoring record with 53 points at Indiana on Feb. 16, 1963 ... Helped lead the Illini to the 1963 Big Ten title ... His 18.9 career scoring average ranks fourth in school history ... His 11.0 career rebounding average ranks third in UI history, and his 790 career boards is ninth on the career list ... Was Second-Team All-Big Ten pick in 1961 and 1962 and First-Team in 1963 ... Earned First-Team All-America honors in 1963 after being Honorable Mention in 1962 ... Was a three-time Illini team MVP ... Earned the 1963 Big Ten Medal of Honor for excellence in both academics and athletics.

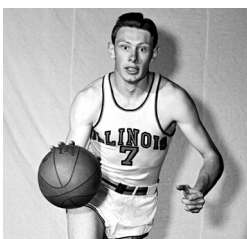

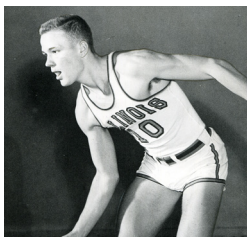

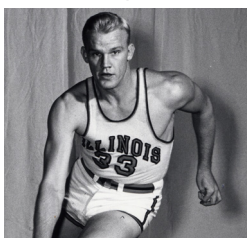

#23 JERRY COLANGELO (G, 1960-62)

Inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2004 ... Two-time Honorable-Mention All-Big Ten selection at Illinois in 1961 and 1962 ... Illini team captain as a senior ... Managing Director of the USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team that won gold medals at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games and 2010 FIBA World Championships.

#30 MANNIE JACKSON (G, 1958-60)

One of the first two African-American starters and letterwinners in school history ... Honorable mention All-American by Converse and Illini team captain as a senior in 1960 ... Finished his career ranked fifth on the UI's all-time scoring list with 922 points, averaging double figures all three years ... Played professionally with the Harlem Globetrotters after college ... Purchased the Globetrotters in 1993 and revived the legendary organization as one of America's favorite teams.

#35 GOVONER VAUGHN (F, 1958-60)

One of the first two African-American starters and letterwinners in school history ... Honorable mention All-American by Converse and Illini team MVP as a senior in 1960 ... Totaled 1,001 points during his UI career, which still ranks 46th on the school's all-time scoring chart ... Played professionally with the Harlem Globetrotters after college and still works for the organization.

#22 JOHN "RED" KERR (C, 1952-54)

All-Century Team member ... Earned the *Chicago Tribune* Silver Basketball Trophy in 1954 as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player ... Team MVP and captain in 1954 ... Played for Syracuse in the NBA from 1955-63, for Philadelphia in 1964 and 1965 and at Baltimore in 1966 ... Was Second-Team All-Big Ten in 1952 and 1953, and First-Team in 1954 ... Earned Honorable-Mention All-America honors in 1952 and 1953, and Second-Team All-America honors in 1954 ... Named to the 1952 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team ... Finished his Illini career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,299 points (now ranks 22nd) and 18.6 scoring average ... Averaged 25.3 points per game in 1954, second-best scoring season in school history.

#37 ROD FLETCHER (G, 1950-52)

NCAA Consensus First-Team All-American in 1952 ... Also a First-Team All-Big Ten selection as a senior ... 1952 Illinois team MVP and team captain ... Helped lead the Illini to back-to-back Big Ten championships and NCAA Final Four appearances in 1951 and 1952 ... Second-Team All-Big Ten as a junior.

#11 DON SUNDERLAGE (G, 1949-51)

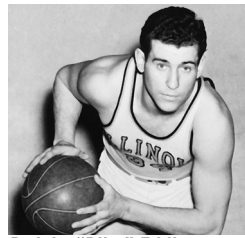
Won the *Chicago Tribune* Silver Basketball Trophy in 1951 as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player ... Team captain helped lead the Illini to the 1951 Big Ten championship and NCAA Final Four appearance ... Led the Big Ten in scoring as a senior, averaging 17.4 points ... Named University of Illinois Athlete of the Year in 1951 ... First-round NBA draft pick and 1954 All-Star.

#33 BILL ERICKSON (G, 1947-50)

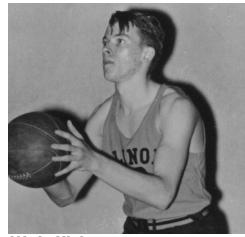
NCAA Consensus Second-Team All-American in 1949 ... First-Team All-Big Ten pick as well ... Helped lead Illinois to the 1949 Big Ten championship and school's first NCAA Final Four appearance ... Team captain as a senior in 1950 ... Honorable Mention All-American and Second-Team All-Big Ten in 1950.

#40 DWIGHT "DIKE" EDDLEMAN (F, 1947-49)

All-Century Team member ... The greatest athlete in University of Illinois history after earning 11 letters in basketball, football and track during his Illini career ... Helped lead the Illini to the 1949 Big Ten title and NCAA Final Four appearance ... Earned the *Chicago Tribune*



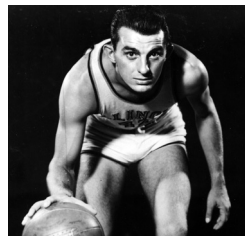

Silver Basketball Trophy as the league's MVP in 1949 ... Team MVP and captain in 1949 ... First-Team All-Big Ten in 1948 and Second-Team in 1949 ... Second-Team All-American in 1948 and First-Team All-American in 1949 ... Played in the NCAA Final Four in basketball, Rose Bowl in football and finished tied for second in the high jump at the 1948 Olympics.

#14 WALT KIRK (G, 1944-45, 1947)

NCAA Consensus First-Team All-American in 1945 ... First-Team All-Big Ten ... Illinois' team MVP and leading scorer, averaging 10.6 points ... Named University of Illinois Athlete of the Year ... At the conclusion of the school year, entered the service before returning to Illinois for his senior season of 1947 ... Went on to play in the NBA for three years.

#25 GENE VANCE (G, 1942-43, 1947)

All-Century Team member ... Whiz Kid member lettered in 1942, 1943 and 1947 ... After Illinois won the 1943 Big Ten championship with a perfect 12-0 record, Vance, along with his Whiz Kid teammates, chose to enter the armed forces for WWII instead of participating in that season's NCAA Tournament ... Three-time Honorable-Mention All-American ... First-Team All-Big Ten selection in 1942 and 1943 and Second-Team in 1947 ... Played for Chicago, Tri-Cities and Milwaukee in the NBA from 1948-1952 ... Served as Illinois' Director of Athletics from 1967-72.

#47 ANDY PHILLIP (F, 1942-43, 1947)

Only Fighting Illini to earn a spot in the National Basketball Hall of Fame as a player, was inducted in 1961 ... All-Century Team member ... Illinois' most acclaimed basketball player ... Leader of the famed Whiz Kids ... *The Sporting News* National Player of the Year in 1943 ... Shot an amazing 54 field-goal attempts against Chicago in his final game, scoring a career-high 40 points on March 1, 1943 ... Earned First-Team All-America honors in 1942, 1943 and 1947 ... First-Team All-Big Ten selection in 1942 and Second-Team in 1943 ... Named Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 1943 ... Team MVP in 1942 and 1943 ... Helped Illini win Big Ten titles in 1942 and 1943 ... Played for Chicago, Philadelphia, Fort Wayne and Boston in the NBA from 1948-58.

#19 BILL HAPAC (F, 1938-40)

Illinois' first Consensus All-American as recognized by the NCAA, earning First-Team honors as a senior in 1940 ... Also became the first-ever recipient of the University of Illinois Athlete of the Year award in 1940 ... Set the then-Big Ten single-game scoring record on Feb. 10, 1940 with 34 points vs. Minnesota, a point total unheard of at that time ... Also a three-year letterwinner on the Illini baseball team.

#1 CHUCK CARNEY (F, 1920-22)

All-Century Team member ... Earned First-Team All-America honors in 1920 and 1922 ... Helms Foundation National Player of the Year in 1922 ... First-Team All-Big Ten choice in 1920 and 1922 ... One of the greatest athletes in UI history, he also earned consensus All-America honors as an end for Bob Zuppke's football squad in 1920 ... Set the Western Conference basketball scoring record that stood for 22 years ... Lettered in basketball from 1920-22 ... Inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1966.

#1 RAY WOODS (G, 1915-17)

All-Century Team member ... First-Team All-America pick by Helms in 1915, 1916 and 1917 ... Helms Foundation National Player of the Year in 1917 ... Earned First-Team All-Big Ten honors in 1915 and 1916 ... Illini team captain in 1916 ... Brother, Ralf, also earned All-Big Ten honors from 1915-17 ... Helped the 1915 squad to National Championship honors by the Helms Foundation with a perfect 16-0 record.

HONORED COACHES

Following the creation of the Honored Jerseys program that recognizes the best players in school history, the University of Illinois established the Honored Coaches program to hang banners from the rafters of State Farm Center honoring the most successful Fighting Illini coaches. A total of four coaches have earned a spot on this distinguished list. To be considered for selection, a coach must have achieved all of the following criteria: 1) Minimum career winning percentage at Illinois of .650; 2) Big Ten championship or NCAA Final Four appearance; 3) minimum of eight years as head coach at Illinois, which covers two four-year cycles of student-athletes; 4) non-active coach.



LOU HENSON (1976-96 // 423-224)

Winningest coach in school history, amassing 423 victories during his 21 seasons in Champaign ... Won 65.4 percent of his games with the Illini ... Ranks fifth in Big Ten history in overall wins ... Also ranks fifth all-time in conference wins with 214 ... Led the Illini to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 1989 Final Four when the Flyin' Illini won a then-school record 31 games ... Won a Big Ten championship in 1984 and advanced to the Elite Eight.



DOUG MILLS (1937-47 // 151-66)

Guided the Illini to 151 wins during his 11 seasons in Champaign ... Won 69.6 percent of his games with the Illini ... Led the UI to three Big Ten Championships in 1937, 1942 and 1943 ... Coached the famed Whiz Kids, who were 12-0 during conference play in 1943 and went 17-1 overall before all five starters entered the armed forces.



HARRY COMBES (1948-67 // 316-150)

Directed the Fighting Illini to 316 victories during his 20 seasons in Champaign ... Won 67.8 percent of his games with the Illini ... Led the UI to three Final Fours and Big Ten championships in 1949, 1951 and 1952, and a fourth Big Ten title in 1963 ... His 174 wins in conference play rank eighth in league history.



RALPH JONES (1913-20 // 85-34)

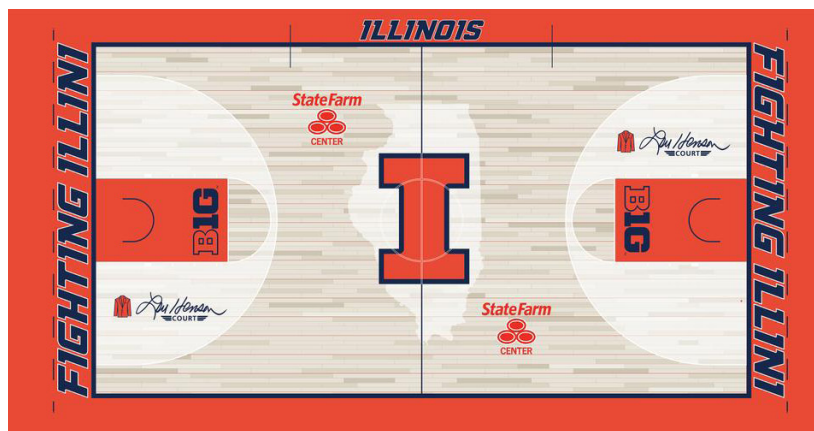
Led the Illini to 85 wins during his eight seasons in Champaign ... Best winning percentage of any Illini basketball coach at 71.4 percent ... Coached the Illini to an undefeated season in 1915, as Illinois went a perfect 16-0 and was named national champion by the Helms Foundation ... Won two Big Ten championships in 1915 and 1917.

LOU HENSON COURT

The University of Illinois Division of Intercollegiate Athletics announced on Aug. 24 that the basketball court at State Farm Center will now be called Lou Henson Court. The court will officially be dedicated at Illinois' first home game in the renovated State Farm Center, on Dec. 2 versus Notre Dame in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Lou Henson Court logo includes Henson's signature accented by his patented orange blazer and a pair of wings as a nod to the Flyin' Illini of 1989, his greatest UI team.

Henson was hired at Illinois on April 5, 1975. What followed was a legendary 21-year career in charge of the Orange and Blue. He amassed a 423-224 record, highlighted by 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, a total of 15 postseason bids, and eleven 20-win seasons. Illinois basketball was one of the nation's most dominant programs during Henson's tenure, earning a top-5 seed in the NCAA Tournament seven straight years from 1984 through 1990.

Henson's Illini won the 1984 Big Ten Championship and advanced to the Elite Eight. His most successful season came with the Flyin' Illini, who won a then-school record 31 games and advanced to the 1989 NCAA Final Four. Henson ranks fifth all-time among Big Ten coaches in both total wins (423) and conference wins (214). He will be inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on Nov. 20 in Kansas City.

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS ATHLETE OF THE YEAR
