WEIGHT CLASS PREVIEW

Following a bumpy 2009-10 season, the Fighting Illini look toward the 2010-11 campaign with renewed optimism in the second year under head coach Jim Heffernan. Although senior John Dergo and sophomore Jordan Blanton each earned their first career All-American honors, injuries and a myriad of other circumstances wreaked havoc on the Illini lineup and led to a disappointing eighth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships and 23rd place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Fifth-year senior Jimmy Kennedy returns to the lineup rejuvenated from a redshirt season last year and will compete for an NCAA title at 141 pounds, up from the 133-pound weight class where he wrestled his first three years. Blanton looks to be a major player on the national scene at 174, while sophomores B.J. Futrell and Conrad Polz will be strong points at 133 and 165, respectively. Futrell returns from a shoulder injury and bumps up to 133 after qualifying for the 2009 NCAA Championships at 125, while Polz will try to capitalize on a big freestyle season last summer that saw him make the United States Junior World Team.


The schedule in 2010-11 looks a bit different, with Midlands and the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational the only tournaments that the Illini will participate in besides the postseason events. But Heffernan has continued the extremely competitive dual series with Missouri, which will be held at the Jon Davis Wrestling Complex in Edwardsville, Ill., home of Illini sophomore Daryl Thomas. The Illini also will host West Virginia in a return dual for Illinois' trip to Morgantown in 2009, SIU Edwardsville for the second-straight year and will travel to Lock Haven for a dual the night after the Illini square off with Penn State.

Redshirt-freshman and three-time Ohio state high school champion Sam White is the front-runner for the starting job at 125, but he will be pushed by senior John Deneen, who started in Futrell's absence last year, sophomore Daryl Thomas and freshman Logan Arlis. White won the Dan Gable Open and took fifth in the open division at the Missouri Open during his redshirt season last year. Deneen took seventh at the Big Ten Championships and finished 11-13 with a 7-7 dual record a year ago. Thomas started at 133 last year for the Illini, compiling a 13-18 record. Arlis is a two-time Illinois state medalist and three-time state qualifier, and is the younger brother of former Illini 157-pounder Clint Arlis.

133

Futrell, a 2009 NCAA qualifier at 125, moves up to 133 pounds for the 2010-11 season after a shoulder injury ended his season prematurely a year ago. At the time of his injury, Futrell was 6-1 with four falls, which gives him 10 falls in only 46 career matches. Backing him up will be Deneen, Thomas and sophomore Tyler LePretre. LePretre was 0-4 last year as a redshirt-freshman.

Two-time All-American Jimmy Kennedy will take aim at an NCAA title in 2010-11 as he enters the year ranked No. 1 by *WIN Magazine*. The senior redshirted last year and fared well in limited action, going 6-3 at Midlands and the Sunkist Open freestyle tournament. Kennedy finished second at Midlands at 141, losing only to Maryland's Alex Krom. Kennedy will be backed up by LePretre and true-freshmen Jamie Clark.

149

Eric Terrazas will start at 149 for the third-straight year for Illinois, after finishing 12-9 a year ago. Terrazas started the season 11-0 despite missing the entire month of December with a broken foot he suffered while working out over Thanksgiving break. He won his first two matches after returning from the injury but went 1-9 the rest of the way, losing seven of those 10 bouts by two points or less. He also was in one of the toughest weight classes in the Big Ten, as he faced seven ranked opponents despite never squaring off with No. 1 Brent Metcalf. Terrazas will be backed up by junior Vince Vercelli, senior Matt Lee and freshmen Jed Lightfoot and Guy Kirby.

In what is likely Illinois' most wide-open weight class, two juniors, a sophomore and three true-freshmen will compete for the spot. Sophomore Kyle Dooley and true-freshman Jackson Morse are the leading contenders for the spot, while juniors Jake Beechy and Jake Kimberlin, and true-freshmen Jake Gingerich and Joey Uccardi also will vie for time. Dooley was 8-8 last year, serving as Illinois' starter at 157 against Davidson at the Sprawl & Brawl duals as well as at the Las

Vegas Invitational. He also wrestled at 165 against Findlay and went 1-2 at Midlands at 157, with both losses coming to ranked wrestlers. Morse is very highly touted coming out of high school, as he was the No. 1 national recruit at 152 pounds according to *Intermat* at one point and was a three-time Michigan state champion. He also won a pair of Super 32 Challenge titles, one of the top national high school tournaments.

165

Sophomore Conrad Polz will start at 165 pounds for the Illini after an impressive summer freestyle campaign in 2010. Polz won the FILA Junior World Team Trials in May, earning a spot on the United States Junior World Championships team. He lost his lone match in Hungary, but the experience should be invaluable as he continues his collegiate career. Polz also finished seventh at the 2010 Big Ten Championships and posted a 17-15 season record. He will be backed up by senior Joe Barczak and true-freshman Adam Acheson.

174

All-American Jordan Blanton returns as Illinois' starter at 174 after finishing 2010 with a bang. He out-performed his No. 5 seed at the Big Ten Championships, finishing third, and out-performed his No. 10 seed at the NCAA Championships with a fifth-place finish that earned his first career All-America honor. Blanton defeated five ranked opponents last year on his way to a 25-9 season mark. He'll be backed up by senior Ben Friedl, sophomore Dan Stelter and freshman Nico Jimenez.

184

Redshirt-freshman Tony Dallago likely will man the 184-pound weight class for the Illini, but he'll be pushed by senior Clinton Polz, sophomores Stelter and Matt McCarter, and true-freshman Brendan Mahaney. Dallago went 5-3 during his redshirt season, finishing third at the Eastern Michigan Open with a 5-1 mark. He also was a 2009 Pennsylvania state champion and four-time PIAA state medalist with a 171-28 career high school record.

197

Redshirt-freshman Mario Gonzalez will start at 197 for Illinois after going 5-3 during his redshirt season. He struggled early in the year and suffered a knee injury, but he bounced back later in the season with a third-place finish at the National Collegiate Open after winning four of his five matches at the event. McCarter also will back up Gonzalez at 197.

HWT

Sophomore Pat Walker and junior Martin Smith once again will battle for the starting job at heavyweight, a year after they shared the role throughout the season. Walker was 10-14, including a 2-6 dual record, while Smith went 11-15 with a 4-7 dual mark. Smith started in five Big Ten duals compared to Walker's three Big Ten starts.



JIM HEFFERNAN

HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON

Jim Heffernan begins his second season as head coach after serving as the top assistant under Mark Johnson for 19 years – 17 at Illinois and two at Oregon State. The 1986 NCAA 150-pound champion and a four-time Big Ten Conference champion, Heffernan garnered the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year honor in 2001 following the Illini's fifth-place national finish and second-place finish in the Big Ten.

During Heffernan's time in Champaign-Urbana, Illinois has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA championships on 10 occasions and in the top 15 in 13 of the last 16 seasons. Heffernan has been a major factor in the renaissance of the Illinois wrestling program, helping lead the team to its greatest prosperity since the post-World War II era.

Heffernan also has mentored seven individual national champions in the last 16 seasons. In 2003, 165-pounder Matt Lackey joined Adam Tirapelle (149, 2001), John Lockhart (heavyweight, 2001), Carl Perry (141, 2000), Eric Siebert (150, 1998), Ernest Benion, Jr. (158, 1995) and Steve Marianetti (150, 1995) in earning NCAA titles since 1995.

Heffernan guided a pair of Illini to All-America honors in 2009-10, with senior John Dergo (184) and sophomore Jordan Blanton (174) each taking fifth place at the NCAA Championships. Dergo had an incredible season, winning a Big Ten championship and finishing 36-4, including a 22-match winning streak from Dec. 12-March 18. Blanton rebounded from an early injury to finish third at the Big Ten Championships and out-perform his No. 10 seed at the NCAA Championships to earn his first career All-America honor.

For the third-straight season, Illinois had at least two true-freshmen starters in 2008-09, with B.J. Futrell (125), Eric Terrazas (149) and Jordan Blanton (184) becoming regulars in the Illini lineup. A year earlier, Ryan Prater (141) and Grant Paswall (149) turned in solid results throughout the season as rookies, and Jimmy Kennedy (133) and John Dergo (184) battled hard throughout their freshman season in 2006-07. Those seven youngsters have accounted for 11 berths in the NCAA Championships over the past four seasons.

Heffernan helped Illinois place nine wrestlers in the 2009 NCAA Championships, all by automatic berths in the first year of the individual RPI rankings, and garner three All-America finishes with Mike Poeta placing second at 157, Jimmy Kennedy taking fifth at 133 and heavyweight John Wise finishing seventh. Kennedy was one of the most impressive wrestlers as the tournament wore on, winning six straight matches after losing his pigtail bout to reach the consolation semifinals and eventually take fifth. Poeta won his second Big Ten title in 2009 and Kennedy had a career year, going 36-6. In addition, Illinois finished second at the Big Ten Championships, its best finish since 2005.

Poeta and Kennedy also starred for the Illini in 2008, finishing second and fourth, respectively, at the NCAA Championships. Poeta won his first Big Ten title after starting the season 22-0, while Kennedy put together an 11-match winning streak that included an undefeated Big Ten dual season.

In 2006-07, Kennedy finished the season ranked No. 9 at 133 pounds and Dergo ended the year No. 11 at 184, marking the first time since Carl Perry in 1997 that at least one true-freshman from Illinois ranked in the Top-20. The Illini qualified eight for the 2007 NCAA Championships and were led by Poeta, who notched a third-place finish at 157 pounds and garnered his first All-America honor.

In 2005-06, the tradition of excellence continued as the Illini took home their third-straight Midlands title, joining Iowa and Iowa State as the only three-peat champions. At Midlands, Alex Tirapelle (157) and Pete Freidl (184) took home individual titles, while Poeta (165) and Tyrone Byrd (197) grappled to runner-up finishes. Rounding out the top-eight finishes for Illinois were Donny Reynolds (174) in fifth and Troy Tirapelle (149) in seventh.

At Big Tens, the Fighting Illini finished second, just behind top-ranked Minnesota. In all, five Orange and Blue grapplers (Byrd, Freidl, Kyle Ort, Alex Tirapelle and Troy Tirapelle) made conference finals appearances, each finishing second in their respective weight classes.

With the performance at the league tournament, the Illini became the only team to qualify all 10 wrestlers for NAAs in Oklahoma City in 2006, marking the third time in school history all 10 grapplers made the trip to NAAs (1995, 2000, 2006). Freidl took home All-America honors with a third-place finish, finishing his career a three-time All-American. On the year, Illinois finished second during the regular season in the Big Ten with a 10-2-1 overall record and 5-2-1 ledger in conference action.

The 2005 squad brought home Illinois' first Big Ten Conference tournament championship, and the first for the program in 53 years as Alex Tirapelle (157) and Friedl (174) took home individual league crowns out of five total finalists for the Illini. For the second season in a row, the Illini won the Big Ten regular-season dual meet title with a near-perfect 7-0-1 record. The team finished sixth at the national tournament after qualifying nine wrestlers, while 125-pounder Ott made a repeat appearance in the finals.

The team matched 2004's achievement of five All-Americans in Ott (2nd, 125), Mark Jayne (7th, 133), Cassio Pero (7th, 141), Friedl (4th, 174) and Brian Glynn (3rd, 184).

In what served as a benchmark for the Illini program, the 2004 season served as a year of firsts as Heffernan helped guide the team to a Big Ten regular-season dual meet title and the first Midlands Tournament team title in program history. The squad concluded the season with a seventh-place finish at nationals, including a finals appearance by Ott at 125. The team brought home five All-America honors, a feat which tied 2004 national champion Oklahoma State, and was the most for Illinois since 1948.

During the 2003 season, Illinois took eight qualifiers to the NCAA Championships from a squad that had five freshmen competing most of the year. The 2003 team finished ninth overall with two national finalists. Matt Lackey finished his climb up the ladder with his win in the finals over Troy Letters for his first national title. Alex Tirapelle became the first Illinois freshman to make the finals as he ensured All-America honors with his second-place finish. For his efforts, Heffernan earned AFLAC Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2003.

In 2002, during a rebuilding year, Heffernan helped lead a reshaped starting lineup to a 12-4 record and 10th-place finish at nationals. With seven new starters, the Illini still managed to qualify nine wrestlers for NAAs after a fifth-place finish at Big Tens, equaling the 2001 squad's NCAA representation. That year, the Illini crowned three All-Americans, following two straight seasons of awarding four All-Americans, and Heffernan was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA).

The Illinois wrestling team has progressively made school history year after year. In 2000, the team's sixth-place national finish was the best since 1958, only to be topped by the 2001 finish of fifth place, which was the highest since 1948. The 2001 team also took second at the Big Ten Championships, sent nine athletes to the NCAA Championships and posted a 12-2 dual meet record.

In 1996-97, Heffernan guided the Illini to a 14-1 dual meet record, a third-place finish at the Big Ten Championships and a ninth-place effort at the NCAA Championships. At the time, the third-place outing was the best in school history in 39 years.

Illinois has sent 123 wrestlers to the NCAA championships during Heffernan's tenure, an average of nearly seven qualifiers each year. During the past 16 seasons, the Illini have crowned 45 All-Americans and produced seven national champions (out of 17 finalists).

Heffernan also earned NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 1995 after Illinois posted a pair of national champions in Steve Marianetti (150) and Ernest Benion (158), a 13-2 dual record and a ninth-place finish at NAAs.

On the recruiting front, Heffernan has been instrumental in landing nine classes ranked among the top 20 in the nation, including the second-ranked class in the nation in 1993 and the sixth-ranked group in 2004.

A 1987 graduate of the University of Iowa, Heffernan was a four-time All-American, while being a member of three Hawkeye NCAA and four Big Ten championship teams. Heffernan captained the Hawkeyes as a senior and grabbed Iowa's Male Athlete of the Year honor in 1987.

Heffernan began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Iowa before becoming an assistant coach at Lehigh University in 1988. He remained at Lehigh until moving to Oregon State in 1990. He joined Johnson in Champaign in 1992.

He also coached the Cadet Wrestling Team at the world championships in Istanbul, Turkey, in 1992, and the USA World Espoir Team in 1989.

Heffernan graduated from national wrestling powerhouse St. Edward High School (Cleveland, Ohio), where he finished as a two-time high school state champion.

Heffernan and his wife, Rebecca, live in Champaign with their son, Sean, and daughter, Alex.

HEFFERNAN FAST FACTS

It is impossible to ignore the success that Illinois has had during the 18 years that Jim Heffernan has been on staff. In 1993, the Fighting Illini had posted two winning seasons in 10 years. Since then, the Orange and Blue have posted 17 straight seasons with a .500 record or better, and 13 top-15 national finishes.

- ❖ In 2005, Illinois won the Big Ten Championship for the first time since 1952.
- ❖ Led Illinois to a No. 1 national ranking in 2004.
- ❖ Heffernan was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 1995 and 2001, and was the AFLAC Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003.
- ❖ The 2005-06 season marked the third consecutive year that the Fighting Illini brought home the Midlands Tournament team title. The Illini join Iowa and Iowa State as the only teams to accomplish the three-peat.
- ❖ Heffernan has led Illinois to 13 top-15 finishes and 10 top-10 finishes at the NCAA Wrestling Championships in the last 16 years.
- ❖ Matt Lackey became the seventh NCAA Champion during Heffernan's tenure at Illinois when he won the title in 2003. He joins Adam Tirapelle (2001), John Lockhart (2001), Carl Perry (2000), Eric Siebert (1998), Ernest Benion, Jr. (1995) and Steve Marianetti (1995).
- ❖ In the last 16 years, Illinois has had 45 All-Americans, 28 of which came over the last 10 seasons. The five All-Americans in 2005 and 2004 ties the school record set in 1948.
- ❖ During Heffernan's 18-year tenure, UI has had an impressive 123 NCAA qualifiers, including 10 in 1995, 2000 and 2006, and nine in 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2009.

CARL PERRY

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH // NINTH SEASON

Former Illini and NCAA champion Carl Perry is in his ninth year as a member of the Illinois wrestling staff and second as associate head coach. Perry, who was a four-year varsity starter for the Illini from 1996-2000, was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2009-10 campaign.

He has been instrumental in the success of Illinois' wrestlers in the lightweights and middleweights over the past seven seasons, particularly with All-Americans Mike Poeta and Jimmy Kennedy.

A 2000 NCAA champion at 141 pounds, Perry wrapped up his career as a two-time All-American and a two-time team captain. As a four-time NCAA qualifier, he consistently ranked among the top 10 at 141 pounds nationwide. Perry also compiled a 13-6 career record at the NCAA Championships.

He finished his Illinois career in the top 20 of career wins and career winning percentage with 98 victories and a .748 winning percentage. He also helped the 2000 Illini squad to the best dual winning percentage in school history (.933), as the team was 14-1 in duals that season.

Perry earned his bachelor's degree in applied life studies in May 2001 with an emphasis in sport management.

He and his wife, Jamie, have a daughter, Breanna, and a son, Bryce. The family resides in Champaign.


ASSISTANT COACH // SECOND SEASON

The 2000 NCAA Champion at 125 pounds, Jeremy Hunter begins his tenth season on the Illinois coaching staff and second as an assistant coach. Hunter wrestled post-collegiately for four years (2000-04), competing in two World Team Trials and the 2004 Olympic Trials, where he finished fourth at 55 kg.

Hunter has shown great versatility in his coaching, as he was a big factor in the success of All-Americans Jimmy Kennedy (133), Mike Poeta (157) and John Wise (HWT), often drilling with Kennedy and Poeta during workouts.

A three-time All-American at Penn State University, Hunter ended his career ranked third all-time with 62 dual meet wins and 29 career pins. His 123 career victories are tied for fifth and his 14-5 NCAA Tournament record ranks ninth in the Nittany Lion record books. He placed fifth in 1998 and was the NCAA runner-up in 1999.

Hunter won a Big Ten title in 1999 and placed among the top three on four occasions during his Penn State career. He earned Big Ten Wrestler of the Year honors in 2000 after his second-straight 33-1 season and was the conference's Rookie of the Year in 1997. A four-year starter, he led the Nittany Lions in scoring for three straight seasons and posted a string of 41-straight dual-meet wins.


2009-10 IN REVIEW

ILLINI NOTCH 2 ALL-AMERICANS

Senior 184-pounder John Dergo and sophomore 174-pounder Jordan Blanton earned All-America honors at the 2010 NCAA Championships, each taking fifth place in his respective weight class to give the Illini at least two All-Americans for the third-straight season. Blanton, the No. 10 seed at 174, knocked off seventh-seeded Ben Bennett (Central Michigan) twice and fended off three lower-seeded foes while dropping bouts to No. 1 Jay Borschel (Iowa) and No. 4 Stephen Dwyer (Nebraska) on his way to fifth place.


Dergo beat two unseeded opponents before dropping a 10-8 overtime decision to No. 7 Joe LeBlanc (Wyoming) despite a furious comeback from an early 4-0 deficit. Dergo then won two in a row before a controversial call giving American's No. 4 Mike Cannon a takedown and two near-fall points proved to be the difference in a 7-5 Cannon victory in the consolation semifinals. But Dergo dispatched No. 5 Clayton Foster (Oklahoma State) 10-4 to grab fifth place.

The All-American finishes by Dergo and Blanton mark the third-straight year that the Illini have had multiple All-Americans in a season. Mike Poeta, Jimmy Kennedy and John Wise all accomplished the feat in 2009, while Poeta and Kennedy were Illinois' All-Americans in 2008.



DERGO EXCELS IN FINAL GO-AROUND

John Dergo had a banner senior season after moving up to 184, finishing 36-4 record with all four losses coming to top-7 opponents. Dergo earned his first All-America honor after placing fifth at the NCAA Championships and won the Midlands title by beating three consecutive two-time All-Americans in Missouri's No. 1 Max Askren, American's No. 2 Mike Cannon and Harvard's Louis Caputo. The 36-4 mark is a career-best season record for the Morris, Ill., native, tying him for the ninth-most wins in school history. He also is



ranked 11th on the season winning percentage list, 15th on the all-time wins list and 19th on the career winning percentage list. Dergo's nine pins also are tied for seventh-most in a season in the Illinois record book.

BLANTON CAPITALIZES ON WEIGHT-CLASS SWITCH

After a strong freshman year, sophomore Jordan Blanton enjoyed his move down to 174 pounds this season, earning his first All-America honor with a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, a 25-9 record and six pins.

DERGO TAKES HOME BIG TEN CROWN

Second-ranked John Dergo simply took care of business at the 2010 Big Ten Championships, dispatching the Nos. 3, 4 and 8 seeds on his way to his first Big Ten title at 184 pounds. Dergo pinned Purdue's eighth-seeded Nick Corpe in the quarterfinals before dominating fourth-seeded former NCAA champion Mike Pucillo (Ohio State) 13-6. Dergo then took care of third-seeded Phil Keddy (Iowa) by a 5-3 margin to bring home Illinois' third Big Ten title in as many years.

2009-10 IN REVIEW

Fifth-seeded Jordan Blanton out-performed his seed in finishing third at 174, with a 10-1 drubbing of second-seeded Luke Manuel (Purdue) in the consolation semifinals before topping Michigan's eighth-seeded Justin Zeerip, 2-0, in the third-place match. It's Blanton's highest finish ever at a Big Ten Championships after taking fourth last year at 184 pounds.

Fourth-seeded Patrick Bond dropped a 2-1 decision to Minnesota's fifth-seeded Sonny Yohn in the first set of tiebreaks in their quarterfinal match but fought back with a pair of wins in the consolation bracket. But he fell, 6-3, to third-seeded Anthony Biondo (Michigan) in the consolation semifinals before accepting a medical forfeit from Iowa's Chad Beatty in the fifth-place match.

Illini 125-pounder John Deneen, 157-pounder Clint Arlis and 165-pounder Conrad Polz all took seventh place at the Big Ten Championships.

DERGO DIALS UP MIDLANDS TITLE

Entering the Midlands Championships, No. 6 John Dergo had never finished higher than sixth at the event and had beaten only one opponent ranked higher than No. 10. But that all changed as Dergo charged through the 184-pound bracket to bring home his first major-tournament title.

Dergo downed No. 1 Max Askren (Missouri), No. 2 Mike Cannon (American) and fourth-seeded Louis Caputo (Harvard), who was unranked because he hadn't wrestled yet this season. Caputo, Askren and Cannon all are two-time All-Americans and Dergo had never beaten any of them, losing to Caputo at the 2006 Midlands, to Cannon at the 2009 NCAA Tournament and to Askren earlier this year in a dual. The victories also gave Dergo wins over opponents ranked Nos. 1, 2 and 3 this season (Askren and Cannon at Midlands and Mike Pucillo at the Las Vegas Invitational).

ILLINI NOTCH PLENTY OF PINS

Illinois registered 35 pins by non-redshirting wrestlers, coming two falls short of the top 10 in school history for single-season pins. John Dergo (184) led the way with a career-high nine falls – which ranked seventh on the single-season pins list – and No. 9 Jordan Blanton (174), who had six.

POLZ DROPS DOWN TO 157, SETTLES AT 165

Redshirt-freshman Conrad Polz wrestled the first half of the season at 165 pounds, collecting a 10-6 record and being ranked as high as No. 17. But he dropped down to 157 for Midlands and wrestled there through the Indiana dual on Jan. 29 before bumping back up to 165. He was 3-5 at 157 in 2009-10 and 14-10 at 165.

DERGO, BLANTON SWITCH SPOTS IN LINEUP

After both John Dergo and Jordan Blanton had strong seasons in 2009, few would've predicted the move they executed for 2010 – switching weight classes. Dergo bumped up to 184 pounds – where he wrestled as a true freshman, going 24-12 and placing fifth at the Big Ten Championships – and Blanton dropped to 174 after going 27-11 with a fourth-place Big Ten finish at 184 a year ago.

The results bear out the switch, as Dergo went 36-4 with an All-America honor, titles at the Big Ten Championships and Midlands, a second-place finish at the Las Vegas Invitational and wins over No. 1 Max Askren (Missouri), No. 2 Mike Cannon (American) and No. 3 Mike Pucillo (Ohio State). Blanton also thrived from the switch despite battling injuries early in the season, going 25-9 with an All-America finish and a third-place finish at the Big Ten Championships. All of Blanton's losses came to ranked opponents.

THE HISTORY OF WRESTLING IN THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

A meeting of seven university presidents in 1895, at the Palmer House Hotel in Chicago, was the first development of what would become one of organized sports' most successful undertakings.

Those seven men established the principles for which the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives, more popularly known as the Big Ten Conference, was founded. Football and baseball were the most popular sports prior to 1900. Since then, many different athletic events have become popular on Big Ten campuses. Today, the Big Ten sponsors 12 championships for men and 12 for women.

The Big Ten began sponsoring wrestling in 1913, with Illinois and Minnesota tying for the first conference championship. Since then, the Big Ten has developed into the premier wrestling conference in the country. Big Ten teams have won 27 NCAA team championships and over 272 individual championships since the NCAA started sponsoring a national wrestling championship in 1928, including Iowa's three consecutive team titles from 2008-10. At the 2008 NCAA Championships, the top three teams all represented the Big Ten.

In 2010, The Big Ten Conference received more individual NCAA Championship qualifiers than any other conference in the nation with 66. The 2011 NCAA Championships will be held at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia, Pa.



BIG TEN MEDAL OF HONOR



John Lockhart, an NCAA champion and three-time Academic All-American, was Illinois' Big Ten Medal of Honor winner in 2002.

In 1914, the Big Ten Conference endowed a Medal of Honor, to be awarded annually at each institution to the student demonstrating proficiency in scholarship and academics. The award takes into consideration academic excellence, athletic awards and contribution to the community.

In the 86-year history of the award, nine Fighting Illini wrestlers have earned the award, including national champions Al Sapora, Steve Marianetti, Eric Siebert and John Lockhart. Since the arrival of Mark Johnson and Jim Heffernan, the squad has produced four winners.

Lockhart was the most recent recipient of the award for the wrestling squad. He was a three-time All-American for the Illini whose national title at heavyweight in 2001 helped lead the team to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Lockhart placed third in 2002 and seventh in 2000 and completed his career with a 123-26 record. He also was a two-time Academic All-American, posting a 3.43 GPA in kinesiology. Currently, he is a

resident at the Cleveland Clinic in Cleveland, Ohio.

Beginning in 1982, a woman athlete from each institution has also been awarded the Conference Medal of Honor. There has been one father-son UI Medal of Honor duo, Lee Sentman (track) in 1931 and his son, Lee Sentman III (fencing) in 1958. Gymnast Howard Beck (1974 and 1975) is the only two-time recipient of the award.

ILLINOIS DIKE EDDLEMAN ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The University of Illinois Athlete of the Year was first given in 1940 to Bill Hapac, who played basketball and baseball. The award was given annually until it was discontinued in 1973. There were no awards given until 1982, when the Big Ten began a Conference Athlete of the Year, in which each school nominated a male and female athlete.

Since 1982, the University of Illinois has recognized a Male and Female Athlete of the Year. In 1993, the awards were renamed the Dike Eddleman Athlete of the Year awards in honor of the 11-time UI letterman and former Olympian. The awards are announced each June and presented at the annual Varsity "I" banquet in the fall.







HUFF HALL



Huff Hall is named for long-time Illinois athletic director and coach George Huff, who served as athletic director from 1901-1935. During that time, the athletic programs enjoyed unparalleled success, including 12 Big Ten wrestling titles. Illinois athletics enjoys a proud tradition in Huff Hall.

The gymnasium served as home for Illinois basketball from 1925-63. During that period, Fighting Illini teams won eight Big Ten championships and earned two NCAA Final Four appearances.

Huff Hall also was the longtime home of the Illinois High School state basketball tournament, creating the circus-like atmosphere that fostered the term “March Madness.” The facility also hosted nine IHSA state wrestling tournaments – in 1948, ’49, ’51, ’53, ’55, ’57, ’61, ’63 and ’65 – before the championships moved to the Assembly Hall. Collegiately, Huff Hall was the site of numerous championships, including the 1930, ’33, ’46, ’48 and ’58 Big Ten Wrestling championships. In 1940 and ’47, the Fighting Illini hosted the NCAA national wrestling championships at Huff Hall.

WRESTLING ATTENDANCE RANKED IN TOP 20 FOR FIFTH-STRAIGHT YEAR

Illinois wrestling finished in the top 20 for home dual attendance for the fifth-straight year in 2009-10, posting an average of 1,053.6 fans over five home meets at Huff Hall to place 12th nationally.

The Illini’s largest crowd last season was when 2,469 fans watched Illinois’ dual against Purdue on Feb. 18, 2010, which was the second-largest crowd in school history.

The largest attendance in school history came on Jan. 28, 2005, when 3,573 fans packed Huff Hall to watch Illinois defeat Iowa, 25-7.

FORMER ILLINI POETA REPRESENTS UNITED STATES AT 2010 WORLD CUP



Former Fighting Illini All-American Mike Poeta was a member of the United States team at the 2010 World Cup in Mahachkala, Russia. Poeta went 1-2 in the tournament, with his victory coming over Uzbekistan's Murodillo Ablokulov.

Poeta was a two-time NCAA finalist and three-time All-American at Illinois, placing second in both 2008 and 2009, and finishing third in 2007, all at 157 pounds. He also was a two-time Big Ten champion in 2008 and 2009. Poeta finished his career ranked second on the school winning percentage record at .882 and 15th in career wins with 105.

FORMER ILLINI VAUGHN AWARDED PURPLE HEART



In November 2004, former Illini wrestling letterwinner Jon Vaughn received a Purple Heart from the U.S. Marines.

Vaughn, a member of the U of I squad from 1994-97, suffered injuries to his hand and leg during battle in Fallujah, Iraq. He was then sent to a

German hospital for recovery and returned to the States shortly after.

Vaughn was a four-time NCAA qualifier for the Illini at both 134 and 142 pounds. He currently is a major and attorney in the USMC.
