2012 FIGHTING ILLINI SEASON OUTLOOK

First-year cross country coach Jake Stewart views this season as one unique from previous seasons as the 2012 Illini return two upperclassmen and welcome a handful of freshmen and two transfers.

“We have a very talented group of athletes, most being pretty young,” Stewart said. “We have a couple upperclassmen who have gone through this before and are doing a good job right now of leading by example. We have the talent to be successful, now it’s just a matter of growing and developing over the season. We want to make sure we’re doing everything we can to be where we want to be at the end of the year.”

The Illini lost eight letterwinners, including NCAA Championship participant Jim Riddle, but they will return senior Jordan Hebert, who along with Riddle were the second pair of Illinois athletes in school history to qualify for the NCAA Championships. Hebert finished first for the Illini and 22nd overall at the Big Ten Championships, and second for the Illini at the NCAA Midwest Regional. The squad also returns senior Hunter Mickow who scored points for the Illini last season at the Big Ten outdoor championships in the 10,000m.

“Both Jordan and Hunter have had great successes,” Stewart said. “I’ve talked to them a lot about showing up and setting an example with their approach and attitude for the younger guys. For our team to be successful and to grow, they need to be able to look to those two.”

Along the way, new faces are expected to appear in the lineup as individuals step into new roles this year. Stewart is excited to see who is going to come out of the woodwork and make their presence known. These expectations may fall upon the seven freshman on the roster who redshirted last season.

“I’m definitely excited about coaching a young team,” Stewart said. “The group has nothing to compare it to, that’s a good thing. They just want to get out and compete with people, they aren’t worried about anything else. They’re a close knit group, we’re a team in every sense of the word.”

The Illini kick off their season at home with the Illini Challenge on Aug. 31, then head to Normal, Ill. for the Illinois Intercollegiate Championships.

“We’re going to use the Illini Challenge as an opportunity to race the big redshirt group from last year,” Stewart said. “We want to get them onto an Illinois vest and race. They’re definitely excited. The Intercollegiate meet will definitely be competitive and our younger guys will thrive there. The course is very comparable to the Big Ten course at Michigan State.”

After a week off, Illinois is back in action at the Notre Dame Invitational, scheduled for Friday, Sept. 28 in South Bend, Ind. The men’s 8K race will take place at 1 p.m. CT at the Notre Dame Golf Course.

“The Notre Dame meet is one of the better races in the country at that time of the season,” Stewart said. “We’ll have a full group going to the meet with some guys opening up their season in South Bend.”

The Illini will continue to train until splitting up and heading to the Wisconsin adidas Invitational in Madison, Wis., and the Bradley Classic in Peoria, Ill. on Friday, Oct. 12. The squad’s final regular season meet will be held at home, as the Illini Open is scheduled for Friday, Oct. 19. The men will run the 8K course at 4:45 p.m. as the final race before beginning postseason competition.

“We will take a group of seven to eight guys to the Wisconsin meet and the Bradley Classic will be another opportunity to be competitive as we move through the course of the season,” Stewart said.

“The Illini Open will be used for some of our younger guys who are not going to the Big Ten Championships,” Stewart said. “We have some solid programs coming in for that meet. It will be an opportunity to be competitive later in the year.”

Postseason competition begins on Sunday, Oct. 28 with the Big Ten Championships at Michigan State’s Forest Akers East Golf Course. A few days after the conference meet, a few Illini runners will make the short trip to Bloomington, Ind., to compete in the Hoosier Open.

“The Big Ten Championships are the focal point of the year,” Stewart said. “We look to run well.”

A week later on Friday, Nov. 9, the Illini travel to Springfield, Mo., for the NCAA Midwest Regional Championships, where the top two teams will automatically advance to the NCAA Championships at the University of Louisville’s Tom Sawyer State Park on Saturday, Nov. 17. Last season, the Illini sent two individual runners to the NCAA Championships for the second time in school history.



JAKE STEWART

HEAD CROSS COUNTRY COACH

FIRST SEASON

Jake Stewart begins his first year as the cross country and assistant track coach. Stewart comes to Illinois after coaching a year on Purdue's men's and women's cross country/track and field staff. At Illinois, Stewart will take on the role of cross country coach for the fall season and lead the distance crew on the track in the winter and

spring.

During his time at Purdue, he had success on the cross country course and on the track. In the fall, he led the men's cross country team to its best finish since the 2008 season. Stewart also had two athletes qualify for the NCAA Division I East Preliminary Round of Championship (800, 5,000m) while also coaching an athlete who's performance placed them into the top five all-time in the school record books. In addition, Stewart had a USATF Junior All-American and recruited the first Foot Locker All-American recruit in school history.

Before coaching at Purdue, Stewart spent three years at Lamar University where he was the assistant track coach and cross country coach. At Lamar, he was named the Southland Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 and in 2010 after the men won four of their five invitationals including a top finish at the 12-team conference championships. The men were also back-to-back cross country conference champions in 2009 and 2010. Individually, he coached 17 Southland Conference champions, helped the Cardinals set 10 new school records and coached 53 conference point scorers in both indoor and outdoor track.

Prior to his tenure at Lamar, Stewart was the assistant coach for the Iona College men's and women's cross country and track and field teams for three seasons. In his time with the Gaels, the men's cross country team finished third in 2006 and runner-up in 2007 and 2008, the highest finish of any program in school history. The men's team was also honored for its scholastic achievements as it was named the NCAA Division I All-Academic Team of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In addition, he coached the first women's cross country team to qualify for the 2006 national championships.

During his time as an undergrad at Iona, Stewart helped the Gaels win four MAAC championships and finish in the top 10 each year. In addition, he was the captain of the squad in 2005, becoming the first walk-on in program history to achieve the feat.

Stewart earned his Bachelor of Science in English from Iona College in 2005. He resides in Champaign and is married to his wife, Brandi.



MICHAEL ALLIO

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

SECOND SEASON

Michael Allio returns for his second season as the volunteer assistant coach at Illinois after helping the Illini finish seventh at the Big Ten Championships last season and qualifying two individuals for the NCAA Cross Country Championships for the second time in school history.

As an athlete Allio ran cross country and track at the Division II level at Anderson (S.C.) University, where he held the school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase. After graduation, Allio returned to his alma mater as an assistant Cross Country and Track and Field coach. During his three year tenure at Anderson, the cross country teams won two Conference Carolinas Cross Country championships. These teams included one NCAA Cross Country National Championship Qualifier (2006) and one individual conference champion. Allio worked with athletes setting 16 track and field and cross country records at Anderson.

After completing his Master's degree, Michael followed his wife, Jennifer, to central Illinois where she is currently completing graduate coursework at the University of Illinois, School of Veterinary Medicine. Upon moving to Illinois he became the inaugural head track and field coach at Judah Christian School. During the 2009 and 2010 seasons, his athletes qualified for the state meets in seven events. This group included on All-State jumper.

While Allio assisted at Illinois Wesleyan the women's team finished sixth overall at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field National Championships. Allio holds USATF Level 1 and 2 certifications with his level 2 concentration in endurance events.



MIKE TURK

TRACK & FIELD HEAD COACH

SECOND SEASON, SEVENTH OVERALL

In his first year as head coach in 2011, Mike Turk saw the track and field programs finish with top-13 performances on the national level, including finishing T-11th outdoors and 13th indoors. He also coached senior Andrew Riley to two national titles. Riley's won the 100m dash and the 110m hurdles, becoming for the first male athlete in NCAA history to win both events in one year. Turk's squad qualified 18 athletes to the West Preliminary Round of Championship and advanced in five events to the NCAA Championships. Turk also coached freshman Davis Fraker into the record books again, as the Peachtree City, Ga., native recorded a school record outdoors in the hammer throw with a mark of 207-8 (63.60m).

Turk was named the interim head coach of the Illinois men's track and field in November 2009 after former coach Wayne Angel stepped down. Turk is in his second year as interim head coach and sixth season at the University of Illinois coaching the jumps, throws and multi-events. He is well known as one of the top field event coaches in the country and is especially heralded for his development of athletes in the throwing events. Turk has accumulated over 20 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level, including 18 years at the NCAA Division I level. In his career, Turk has coached All-Americans in nine different events, including the long jump, triple jump, high jump, shot put, weight throw, hammer throw, discus, decathlon and 800m.

In his first year as interim head coach in 2010, Turk worked to change the culture of the program and made great strides from the indoor to the outdoor season, which was capped off by a national title in the 110m hurdles by Andrew Riley. Turk's squad qualified 16 athletes to the West Preliminary Round of Championship and advanced in three events to the NCAA Championships, with Riley in the 110m hurdles, junior Cody Wisslead in the 400m hurdles and the 4x100m relay. At the Big Ten Outdoor Championships, the Illini turned in their best conference finish since 2006, as they placed sixth overall. Turk also coached junior Matt McHugh into the record books again, as the Exter, N.H., native recorded school records during the indoor and outdoor seasons. McHugh smashed the school record in the weight throw with a mark of 63-2 3/4 (19.27m) and broke his own school record in the hammer throw twice, tallying a personal-best mark of 202-10 (61.83m).

During the 2009 season, Turk coached a pair of athletes who altered Illinois records that had stood for 30 years. Junior Greg Shroka placed sixth in the high jump with a personal-best height of 7 feet, 1 1/2 inches (2.17m) at the NCAA Outdoor Championships to become the first Fighting Illini outdoor All-American in the event since Gail Olson took fifth in 1979. McHugh broke Bob Carper's school record of 187-4 set three decades ago when he marked 190-4 (58.02m) in the hammer throw at the Illinois Invitational. Along with those record-setting marks, Turk also guided junior Casey Fonesbeck to a sixth-place finish in the shot put at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships, where he also qualified for the NCAA Mideast Regionals with a personal-best distance of 57-3 3/4.

Fighting Illini field event athletes also achieved a number of milestones in 2008 under Turk, as Shroka became just the third athlete in Illinois history to leap over seven feet in the high jump, marking 7-0 1/4 at the Illinois Twilight. Shroka went on to earn All-Mideast Region honors, narrowly missing a trip to the NCAA Outdoor Championships and scoring at both the Big Ten indoor and outdoor meets. In the throwing events, Fonesbeck earned a trip to regionals and scored at the Big Ten outdoor meet in the shot put with a mark of 57-1 that ranks 10th in Illinois history. McHugh had a standout debut season, marking 59-7 in the weight throw and 183-7 in the

hammer throw to rank third and fourth in Illinois history, respectively. In addition, multi-event athlete Andrew Zollner moved up to second on the Illini all-time list in the decathlon, with a personal-best point total of 6,776 points at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2007 under Turk, Nick Brown continued his success at the conference championships by finishing second in the long jump and fourth in the triple jump at the Big Ten Indoor Championships and third in both events at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships. Brown also competed in the long and triple jumps at the NCAA Mideast Regional Championships. Turk helped guide Shroka to a successful rookie campaign, as he scored as a redshirt freshman at the Big Ten Championships and qualified for the regional championships. Zollner also came on strong, taking sixth in the decathlon and ninth in the heptathlon at the conference meets. In addition, Chad Gridley improved his personal-best in the discus by over 20 feet.

Turk made an immediate impact with the Fighting Illini in his first year with the program in 2006. His athletes crashed the record books, with nine all-time top-10 performances in Illini history, with the season highlighted by the outstanding achievements of Brown. Under Turk's leadership, Brown was an NCAA Championships qualifier in both the long and triple jumps during the indoor season and in the triple jump during the outdoor season, earning All-America honors in the long jump indoor and the triple jump outdoor.

Prior to coming to Illinois, Turk spent six years coaching the men's track and field and cross country program at Western Michigan University. As head coach, he led the 2003 Broncos to a top-20 ranking in the NCAA Division I Team Power Ranking (USTCA). Turk was named the 2003 Central Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year in cross country and the 2004 Central Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year in outdoor track. In six years at Western Michigan, Turk coached two All-Americans, three school record holders, seven NCAA Qualifiers, a conference record holder and All-Mid American Conference performers in the long jump, triple jump, high jump, shot put, discus, hammer and decathlon.

Prior to joining Western Michigan's program, Turk was the assistant coach for both Marquette University and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's men's and women's track and field programs. While at Marquette, Turk coached several All-Americans and NCAA Championships qualifiers, including the school's first-ever women's indoor NCAA qualifier and first-ever men's indoor NCAA All-American. Upon his departure from Marquette, Turk's athletes had set 27 school records. While at UW-Milwaukee, Turk coached numerous NAIA All-Americans including the 1989 NAIA outdoor 800m national champion.

Turk is a USATF Level II certified coach in the jumps and throws and as an instructor. He is a part of the USATF Coaches Education Level II staff and helped co-author the USATF Level II Throws curriculum. Turk is a popular clinician and has spoken at numerous clinics throughout the country. He is also a lead instructor at the prestigious Ironwood Throws Development Camp, organized the King of the Ring Throws Clinic and has authored several articles.

As a student-athlete at Augustana College in Rock Island, Ill., Turk received his bachelor's degree in Physical Education in 1985 and competed on the varsity track and field team. He was the 1984 CCIW Conference Champion in the shot put.

Turk and his wife, Lori, reside in Mahomet and have three children, daughters Hannah and Payton and a son, Sam.

2011 SEASON IN REVIEW

After making great strides in the 2010-2011 cross country and track seasons, the 2011 Fighting Illini men's cross country team set its sights high for the 2011 season. In Gavin Kennedy's first season as head coach, he led an experienced senior class with hopes of finishing in the middle of the pack in the Big Ten Conference and move on to qualify for nationals.

"I thought the first season here at Illinois went well," Kennedy said. "I had high hopes for the team to go to the NCAA Championships, but I think after the performance at Big Ten's, getting two guys to the national meet was a step in the right direction. Hopefully it'll be the catalyst for the team to push through next year and go to the national championships on a regular basis."

The Orange and Blue saw the first two meets of the season as steps in the right direction after finishing first in the Illini Challenge and second in the Orange and Blue Preview. Illinois captured its seventh consecutive title by finishing first at the Illini Challenge, where seven of the top eight runners were clad in orange and blue. Senior Chris DeSilva took the individual title with a personal-best 6K time of 18:50. The Illini had three of their six runners finish in the top six at the Orange and Blue Preview with Dan Kremske leading the way with an 8K time of 24:25.

Illinois had the chance to preview their Big Ten rival, Wisconsin, at the Wisconsin adidas Invitational. This was their toughest competition yet as the Illini finished with a solid mid-pack performance of placing 26th. Junior Jordan Hebert led all squad with an 8K time of 24:31. Colin Mickow finished second for the Illini and helped round out the scoring. Mickow would end up finishing in the top three of every race he ran throughout the season.

At the Illini Open, the Orange and Blue was led by freshman Mark Donohue who made his collegiate 8K debut with a time of 25:49. In his first race of the season, Graham Farnsworth clocked a personal best 8K time of 26:12. Running unattached was a group of freshman with Tommy King (25:43) coming in second, David Eckhart (25:50) in fifth, Sam Telfer (25:54) in sixth, Paul Zeman (25:55) in seventh, Ian Barnett (26:17) in 11th and Joe McAsey (26:33) in 13th. Since the Illini ran only two attached runners, they were unable to record a team score.

Running three meets at home gave the Orange and Blue the chance to prepare for the Big Ten Championships, which were held on their home course at the UI Arboretum. The Illini were led at the conference championships by junior Jordan Hebert, who clocked a personal-best 8K time of 24:26. The Fighting Illini's seventh place finish gave them the motivation to perform well at the NCAA Midwest Regional.

Senior Jim Riddle and junior Jordan Hebert became only the second pair of Illini to qualify for the NCAA Championship meet from the Midwest Regional. The first pair, Barry Pearman and Jason Zieren did so in 1996. Riddle automatically qualified for the national meet by leading Illinois at the Midwest Regional and finishing 12th overall. Hebert joined Riddle by finishing second for the Illini and 17th overall. Illinois last qualified an individual in 2007 when Trent Hoerr won the regional title.

Jim Riddle and Jordan Hebert closed out their season by finishing the 10K NCAA Championships race 126th and 140th, respectively. Riddle crossed the finish line with a time of 31:00.3 while Hebert finished seven seconds behind, with a season-best 10K time of 31:07.7. Hebert's performance was just seven seconds away from his personal best set at last year's regional race.

"Hebert was a nice surprise this season," Kennedy said. "After fighting through some sickness last year, he seemed to get stronger and stronger after each race and built up a lot of confidence this season. Riddle always stepped up to the plate and got the job done. After running limited amount of races this season, there wasn't a lot of time for him to settle in. He had to race hard from the start and he did just that."

The Orange and Blue had multiple runners step up throughout the season, with Chris DeSilva, Dan Kremske, Mark Donohue, Colin Mickow, Jordan Hebert and Tom Achtien all posting top-five finishes in multiple meets for the squad. The season culminated with Riddle and Hebert qualifying for the NCAA Championships for just the second time in history for the Illini as a pair.

"Transition is always tough. You're dealing with a whole new training system with a new coach. I think the guys did a good job of dealing with the new process. The future is bright and they are only going to get better with the upcoming months we have together."

With the group of seniors graduating, the Illini are left with a young squad that hopes to improve upon what was accomplished this year. They will be led by Jordan Hebert and hope to take what they learned throughout this season and make the 2012 Fighting Illini cross country team even stronger.

"I'm a strong believer in one good season leading to another season," Kennedy said. "I'm looking for the guys to step up to the plate during the track season and score points at the Big Ten Championships and put Illinois distance running on the map."

ILLINOIS CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

The University of Illinois has had a strong and successful program since the early 1900s. Several great runners have made significant contributions throughout the years. Most recently, Trent Hoerr owned the spotlight. Hoerr finished third at the 2007 Big Ten Championships and went on to earn All-America honors with a 16th-place finish at the NCAA meet. In addition, the Morton, Ill., native was named the 2007 Midwest Regional Athlete of the Year by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. He also set a new Illinois 8K record with a time of 23:39 at Pre-Nationals.

In the 1980s, UI won one Big Ten crown and finished second on four other occasions. The premier runners of the decade were All-Americans Kerry Dickson, Jeff Jacobs, Greg Domantay, Ty Wolf and Joe Leuchtman.

The '70s were dominated by great individual performances. In 1971, Rick Gross finished second in the Big Ten and ninth in the nation. Jim Eicken earned All-America honors in 1978, and Mike Durkin finished third in the conference and 18th in the nation in 1973.

Craig Virgin was synonymous with success in the 1970s. He was the first runner in Big Ten history to become a four-time cross country champion, winning the crown from 1973-76. Virgin also won the 1975 NCAA individual title and went on to win the cross country world championship in 1980 and '81.

Preceding Virgin in the 1960's were All-Americans Ken Brown, Allen Carius and Ken Howse. In 1960, Brown finished fourth in both the Big Ten and the nation. Howse garnered All-American status in 1969 after a fourth-place finish in the Big Ten and 37th nationally. The dominant Fighting Illini runner in the '60s was Allen Carius. In 1962 and 63, Carius repeated as the Big Ten champion. In 1962, he placed 12th at the NCAA National Championships and earned All-American status.

Each year, most of these former athletes, along with dozens of other Illinois cross country alumni and their families from all decades return to Champaign-Urbana one weekend during the fall to keep the Fighting Illini tradition alive.
