

2015 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS



A SEASON TO REMEMBER

It was a record-setting season for Illini baseball. The team won 50 games, breaking the previous school record of 49 wins set in 1982. Along the way the Illini reeled off a Big Ten-record 27-game winning streak from March 30-May 20, the longest in the nation in 2015. Illinois won its first outright conference title in 10 years, claiming the crown with a 21-1 Big Ten regular season record. The Illini's .955 winning percentage was the best by a league champion since 1966.

The Illini earned the No. 6 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament; becoming just the second Big Ten team to earn a national seed. Illinois went on to win its first-ever NCAA Regional, advancing to the Super Regional for the first time in school history, before falling to eventual national runner-up Vanderbilt.

The Orange and Blue hosted both the Regional and Super Regional during a season in which the Illini won a school-record 25 games at Illinois Field.

Illinois swept the Big Ten individual awards for the first time in school history with first baseman David Kerian being named Player of the Year, left-hander Tyler Jay selected as Pitcher of the Year and Dan Hartleb earning Coach of the Year.

Jay went on to earn first-team All-America honors while Kerian and pitcher Kevin Duchene were chosen as second-team All-Americans. Immediately following the season a school-record nine players were selected in the MLB Draft, highlighted by Jay's selection at No. 6 overall by the Minnesota Twins to become the highest draft pick in program history.

2015 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

FIRST NCAA REGIONAL TITLE

Illinois' won the program's first NCAA Regional title with an 8-4 victory over Wright State at Illinois Field. The Fighting Illini reached 50 wins for the first time in school history when closer Tyler Jay shut the door with four scoreless frames, sending Illinois to its first Super Regional. Kevin Duchene posted a complete game in the 10-3 opening win over Ohio followed by a shutout from Drasen Johnson in a 3-0 victory over Notre Dame.

NINE DRAFT PICKS

A school record nine Illini were selected in the 2015 MLB Draft, which led the Big Ten and was tied for third in the nation. The previous Illinois school record was six selections in 1985. Tyler Jay (No. 6 overall - Toronto) was the highest pick in school history.

SCHOOL RECORD 50 WINS

Illinois set the school record with 50 wins when it clinched the NCAA Champaign Regional title. The Illini have exceeded 40 wins seven times. Illinois, which boasts 11 all-time NCAA Tournament appearances, reached a regional in five of those years, including a Super Regional for the first time in 2015.

THREE OF FOUR COACHES RETURN

Illinois returns three of its four coaches for 2016, including head coach Dan Hartleb, pitching coach Drew Dickinson and volunteer Kyle Hudson. Adam Christ was hired from Minnesota State to replace Spencer Allen, who took the head coach position at Northwestern.

30TH BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP

With their 25th straight win on May 14, the Fighting Illini clinched the 2015 Big Ten regular season championship, marking the 30th conference title in program history.

Illinois defeated Nebraska 6-3 at Illinois Field and surpassed Texas A&M for the longest winning streak in the nation.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT RECAP

Illinois went 2-2 at the 2015 Big Ten Tournament at Target Field despite posting a 0.51 ERA. The Illini opened with a 3-2 comeback win over Nebraska for a Big Ten record 27-game winning streak. The streak was snapped in a 2-0 loss to Maryland, with both runs being unearned. Senior John Kravetz's first career complete game shutout in a 2-0 win over Michigan State kept the Illini alive. UI allowed five unearned runs and fell 5-3 to Michigan, ending its tournament run. All seven runs were unearned in the two losses.

Illinois reached postseason play for the third year in a row and eighth time in 10 years under Dan Hartleb. Illinois is 29-35 in 20 all-time appearances in the Big Ten Tournament and 10-14 in eight trips under Hartleb.

TOP HOME RECORD

The Orange and Blue went 25-4 at home this season, setting the best record in Illinois Field history and breaking the mark from 1998 (20-5). The Illini also notched a school-record 19-game home winning streak from March 25-June 1.

SCHOOL-RECORD WINNING STREAK

By winning 27 games in a row from March 30 to May 20, the 2015 Fighting Illini set the single-season and overall winning streak program records, which also broke the Big Ten winning streak record of 26 straight by Nebraska (1983). The previous best single-season streak was 16 in 1959 and 1989, while the previous longest winning streak across seasons was 19 games spanning 1909-11.

STATS BEHIND THE STREAK

Illinois did not lose over a span of 52 days, including 15 wins at home, 10 on the road and two at neutral sites. Senior David Kerian hit a team-high .400 with seven home runs and 29 RBI during the 27-game winning streak. Jason Goldstein (.367) had six homers and a team-high 31 RBI during the streak, while the Illini totaled 30 home runs over the 27 games. Ryan Nagle (.367), Casey Fletcher (.351) and Adam Walton (.314) each hit over .300 during the run.

ILLINI RECORD THREE ALL-AMERICANS

Three Illini — Tyler Jay (first team), Kevin Duchene (second team) and David Kerian (second team) — were named All-Americans by multiple publications (NCBWA, ABCA, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, Baseball America, Perfect Game). It was the first time Illinois garnered three All-America honors in program history. All three were named second-team All-Americans by D1Baseball.com.

FIVE ALL-MIDEAST REGION PICKS

Five Illini — first baseman David Kerian (first team), pitchers Kevin Duchene (first team), Drasen Johnson (first team), and Tyler Jay (first team), and catcher Jason Goldstein (second team) — were named All-Mideast Region.

JAY PITCHER OF THE YEAR FINALIST

Fighting Illini junior LHP Tyler Jay was named one of three finalists for the National Pitcher of the Year Award. Jay was up for the award along with Vanderbilt's Carson Fulmer (won the award) and College of Charleston's Taylor Clarke.

Jay had a school-record 14 saves and a 5-2 record with a 1.08 ERA in 66 2/3 innings over 30 appearances (2 starts) in 2015. The Lemont, Illinois, native allowed only 40 hits and seven walks while striking out 76, holding opponents to a .177 batting average.

The Big Ten Pitcher of the Year helped Illinois earn a Big Ten regular-season championship and No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. The two-time All-Big Ten selection was a semifinalist for the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award and NCBWA Dick Howser Trophy.

Jay ended his Illini career as the school record holder for ERA (1.68) and career saves (24). He went 10-6 in 128.2 innings pitched in 71 career appearances, which is tied for the sixth-most in school history.

BEST BIG TEN RECORD

The 2015 Fighting Illini tallied a 21-1 (.955) Big Ten record, marking the best non-undefeated winning percentage in Big Ten history. Eight teams have finished the Big Ten regular season undefeated, with Ohio State (6-0) being the last in 1966. Illinois also equaled the 2014 Indiana Hoosiers for the most wins in a 24-game schedule, which began in 2009.

HARTLEB NO. 3 IN ILLINOIS HISTORY

Dan Hartleb has coached in 557 games as an Illini and currently ranks third in school history with 326 wins. He earned his 300th career win in a 17-2 rout of Northwestern on April 5 and moved past George Huff with career win No. 315 in a 6-5 comeback victory at Ohio State on May 2. The top-four winningest coaches among the 10 all-time coaches at Illinois are listed below:

DICK HOWSER TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

Junior closer Tyler Jay and starter Kevin Duchene were named semifinalists for the NCBWA Dick Howser Trophy and the National College Baseball Hall of Fame Pitcher of the Year award.

ILLINI PITCHERS IN BIG TEN STATS

Four Illinois pitchers ranked among the Big Ten's top five in ERA. Tyler Jay led the conference with a 1.08 ERA followed by Kevin Duchene (1.75) in third, Drasen Johnson (2.01) in fourth and Rob McDonnell (2.28) in fifth.

Five Illinois pitchers ranked among the Big Ten's top 15 opposing batting average leaders. Jay (.177) led the league followed by McDonnell (.211) in fourth, Duchene (.235) in ninth, Johnson (.238) in 11th and Kravetz (.258) in 15th.

DUCHENE'S DOMINANT ON FRIDAY

Junior Kevin Duchene ranked eighth in the nation with an 11-2 record, 21st with a 1.75 ERA, 41st with a 4.89 strikeout-to-walk-ratio and 55th with 1.58 walks allowed per nine innings. He fanned eight or more five times, including a season-high 10 punch outs against Northwestern. His 86 strikeouts were tops on the team and third in the Big Ten. Duchene's 2.11 career ERA ranks second in school history, while his 24-4 (.857) career record is the fifth-best winning percentage all-time by an Illinois pitcher.

JOHNSON EATS UP INNINGS

Redshirt-senior Drasen Johnson was a workhorse for the Illini starting staff after moving into the rotation last season. Johnson finished 10-3 with a 2.01 ERA and led the Big Ten with 116.2 innings pitched, including a team-high three complete games. The Chillicothe, Illinois, native made every start last season and led the Illini with 96 innings pitched. He spent his first two seasons in the bullpen, throwing 39 innings in 2012 and 29.1 innings in 2013. He finished eighth in school history with 281 innings pitched.

NCAA SUPER REGIONAL

KRAVETZ ALL-TIME IP LEADER

Senior John Kravetz finished his career as Illinois' all-time leader with 337 innings pitched.

24 CAREER VICTORIES

Kevin Duchene (24-4) and John Kravetz (24-7) finished tied for seventh on the Illinois all-time wins list. Mark Dressen (1989-92) and current pitching coach Drew Dickinson (1999-02) hold the school record with 30 career wins.

KERIAN, ILLINI DIG THE LONG BALL

Illinois finished first in the Big Ten with 54 home runs (23rd in NCAA). Senior David Kerian led the Big Ten with a career-high 16 bombs (10th in NCAA), which was the most by an Illini since Dusty Bensko hit 16 in 2005. Reid Roper was in second with 10 HR (5th in Big Ten) and Jason Goldstein was third with eight HR (7th in Big Ten).

REID ROPER NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

Redshirt-senior Reid Roper was named a Capital One second-team Academic All-American. Roper, who boasts a 3.55 GPA as an elementary education major, hit .293 with 10 home runs and 49 RBI. He also was a first-team Academic All-District selection, Big Ten Distinguished Scholar and Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

SCHOOL-RECORD ATTENDANCE AT ILLINOIS FIELD

Illinois averaged 1,721 fans at Illinois Field this season, which broke the school record (1,270 average in 1990). Nine of the Top 14 biggest crowds in Illinois Field history (opened in 1988) came in 2015.

ALL-BIG TEN AWARD HIGHLIGHTS

- Illinois swept the top three Big Ten individual awards for the first time in school history: David Kerian (Player of the Year), Tyler Jay (Pitcher of the Year) and Dan Hartleb (Coach of the Year).
- First baseman David Kerian was the second Illini in the past three years and ninth overall to win Big Ten Player of the Year, with Justin Parr being the last to do so in 2013.
- Closer Tyler Jay is the first Illini to earn Big Ten Pitcher of the Year honors since current pitching coach Drew Dickinson in 2001. Jay is the fourth Illini to win the award all-time, with Jason Anderson (2000) and Brett Weber (1998) being the other two.
- Head coach Dan Hartleb collected his first Big Ten Coach of the Year accolade, which marks the third in Illinois history (Itch Jones - 1998, 2005).
- Eleven Illini were named to All-Big Ten teams, equaling the school record from 1998. Six first-team selections also tied the record mark from that year.
- Illinois led the conference in first-team All-Big Ten selections (6) and overall selections (11).
- Outfielder Will Krug was Illinois' Sportsmanship Award honoree.

DOUBLE-DIGIT HITTING STREAKS

Illinois players posted five double-digit hitting streaks in 2015: David Kerian (18 and 17), Ryan Nagle (15), Jason Goldstein (15) and Casey Fletcher (12). An Illini has notched an 18-game hitting streak in each of the past three years with shortstops Thomas Lindauer (2013) and Adam Walton (2014) both doing so previously.

FLETCHER'S THIRD WALK-OFF

Senior Casey Fletcher earned his third career walk-off RBI in the 7-6 victory over Fordham (2/21) and did not have to swing the bat. With the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth, a pitch ricocheted off his foot, allowing Jason Goldstein to score. Last season, the Illini right fielder had walk-off hits in consecutive games against Michigan State (May 3-4, 2014).

SCHOOL-RECORD NINE WEEKLY HONORS

Illinois, which racked up five Big Ten Player of the Week awards and four Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors this year, totaled a program-record nine Big Ten weekly awards which led the conference in 2015. The previous Illinois season-high was seven in 2009.

FIVE BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Illinois equaled the school record from 2009 with five Big Ten Player of the Week awards in a season. Senior David Kerian (May 4, May 18) and junior Jason Goldstein (May 12, April 7) were both two-time winners, while senior Casey Fletcher (April 27) also collected the honor this season.

FOUR BIG TEN PITCHERS OF THE WEEK

The Illini earned four Big Ten Pitcher of the Week accolades in 2015, a new school record. Each one was a left-handed pitcher: Kevin Duchene (April 7 & March 23), Tyler Jay (March 9) and Rob McDonnell (Feb. 16). The Orange and Blue broke the school record from 2002 of three Big Ten Pitcher of the Week awards in a season.

HOT START IN 2015

The Illini went undefeated through eight games for the first time since 1986 when it also started 7-0-1. It was the fifth time in school history an Illini team did not lose during its first eight games of the season. The best undefeated start ever by Illinois was in 1910 when Illinois finished the year undefeated with a 14-0 record.

STAFF ERA UNDER DICKINSON

Fourth-year pitching coach Drew Dickinson improved Illinois' staff ERA each year of his career. The Illini finished with a 4.77 ERA in 2012 followed by a 3.76 ERA in 2013 and a school-record 3.25 ERA in 2014. In 2015, Illinois had a 2.55 ERA.

NIKE REBRANDED UNIFORMS

Illinois wore new orange and blue jerseys during the 2015 season, which featured the Illinois wordmark across the chest with the Victory Shield logo on the left sleeve.

NEW VIDEO BOARD IN RIGHT FIELD

The Division of Intercollegiate Athletics unveiled its new video display for Fighting Illini baseball on April 3 at Illinois Field. The OES baseball scoreboard features a YESCO video display, measuring nearly 36x19 feet. The new board, which was constructed by Correct Digital Displays, Inc., out of Sheridan, Illinois, sits just beyond the right field wall. It is the first video display at Illinois Field, which opened in 1988.
