ILLINOIS SOCCER AND TRACK STADIUM

The Fighting Illini are entering their 18th season at the beautiful Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium. The Orange and Blue competed at the First and Stadium Multiplex during the 1997 and 1998 seasons before moving to the renovated stadium - which includes the outdoor track and field facilities - in 1999.

Future upgrades are planned for the Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium, including seating capacity for more fans, locker rooms and a press box. The project is being handled by JJR Architects of Chicago. The first phase, which included lights and a throwing area for field events during the track and field season, cost \$1.2 million. Phase II includes 6,000 seats on the home side, an additional 2,000 seats on the visitors side, restrooms and a concession stand.

The Illini have been dominant at home since moving into the Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium, compiling an overall record of 134-44-8. Since its opening, the stadium has featured one undefeated record (2004), six one-loss seasons (2005-08, 2010-11) and three of two-loss years (2012-13-15). In 2007, the Orange and Blue shut out a school-record seven consecutive opponents at the Illinois Soccer Stadium from Sept. 2 through Oct. 19, compiling 650 consecutive shutout minutes.

In 2011, the Illini emerged victorious over nine teams at home, the second most in the program's history. The Orange and Blue outscored their opponents 25-10. Their home wins over Indiana and Purdue at the beginning of October jumpstarted the Illini to a program best 12-game undefeated stretch, which culminated with a 1-0 win over Notre Dame in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament at the Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium. Head coach Janet Rayfield has now established an .805 winning percentage at home in her career as a Fighting Illini.

The 2006 season saw the Illini put together a 7-1-0 home record with five shutouts and a new attendance record of 7,261 fans. On Oct. 1, No. 15 Illinois took down No. 9 Penn State, 3-2, in front of a school-record 2,667 fans, boosted by the joining of the match with the Illinois Homecoming Kickoff celebration.



In 2004, the Illini completed their first undefeated season at home with a record of 8-0-1. In the final match at Illinois Soccer Stadium, the Illini posted a thrilling 2-1 victory over Nebraska in the third round of the NCAA Tournament, sending the Orange and Blue on to the Elite Eight. In addition, the victory also occurred in front of a then-record 1,046 fans.

In 2000, the Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium was the site of the Big Ten Women's Soccer Tournament in addition to the Illini hosting the Xavier Muskateers in the NCAA Tournament First Round. In 2001, the Illini welcomed Evansville, Syracuse and eventual National Champion Santa Clara in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament and in 2003, the Illini hosted Western Michigan, Purdue and DePaul in first and second round NCAA Tournament action.

When Illinois decided to add soccer, the athletic department, led by former Athletic Director Ron Guenther, Associate Athletic Director Dana Brenner, coaches and student-athletes, conducted a feasibility study. The first two years included the use and improvement of the campus recreational fields along Stadium Drive, followed by the construction and renovation of the new Illini Stadium. The field includes Kentucky Bluegrass with a sand base for quick drainage and is noted for its playing surface and built-in irrigation.

JANET RAYFIELD

HEAD COACH // 15TH YEAR



In her 14 seasons as head coach of the Fighting Illini, Janet Rayfield has established the University of Illinois women's soccer team as one of the premier programs in the nation. Year after year, her Illinois teams break school records and set new benchmarks for conference and national levels of success.

Rayfield has led Illinois to the NCAA Tournament in 10 of her 14 seasons at the helm, highlighted by the Illini's fourth Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2013. She has coached seven players to nine conference Player of the Year honors during her tenure, and has seen five players taken in the NWSL draft following their college careers. The Orange and Blue scored the most goals under Rayfield with 54 in 2013,

just three goals shy of the school record, and finished the year ranked No. 25 by the NSCAA. She coached Big Ten Forward of the Year Janelle Flaws to a school-record 23 goals, which was tied for the most in the NCAA. Vanessa DiBernardo, who became Illinois' highest drafted player in school history following the season, completed her decorated career No. 3 on the all-time list with 43 goals along with being named a Capital One second-team Academic All-American and an NSCAA third team Scholar All-American.

In her 13th season with the Illini, Rayfield guided veteran Illini all-star Janelle Flaws to her second consecutive Big Ten Forward of the Year honor, and also saw her receive NSCAA Third Team All-American recognition. Rayfield guided the Illini to their 11th Big Ten tournament appearance and the team finished with 10 wins on the season.

Flaws continued to impress in Rayfield's 14th season as she reset Illinois' all-time goals record. The record-breaking goal was scored in style as she tallied the second-fastest hat trick in school history. With Rayfield's coaching, Flaws graduated as one of Illinois' most prolific players, holding the school records for career goals, points, shots and shots on goal. Rayfield guided the Illini to several significant wins in the 2015 season, upsetting No. 11-ranked and previously undefeated Rutgers in the Big Ten home opener. Junior Allison Stucky was credited with the first goal against the Scarlet Knights all season in the victory. Rayfield's squad qualified for its fifth-consecutive Big Ten Tournament with a 3-1 victory over Minnesota in the regular season finale.

Rayfield's 11th season saw the Illini finish 10-9-4 and reach the Big Ten Tournament Championship game along with the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The year was highlighted by the program's first ever win in Ann Arbor vs. No. 24 Michigan, advancing past Minnesota when trailing two goals and down a player 15 minutes into the match and knocking off No. 3 Penn State 1-0, the program's first ever win against a Top-3 opponent. 2012 also marked the year Rayfield's stint as Assistant Coach for the U-20 U.S. Women's National Team was rewarded with a gold medal at the U-20 World Cup in Japan. In addition, Rayfield became the first woman to win the NSCAA Honor Award.

Rayfield's first decade of leadership at Illinois culminated in one of the most successful seasons in program history - with the Illini earning a 17-5-2 record, the 2011 Big Ten Tournament Title and another NCAA Tournament appearance. During the 24-game schedule, the Orange and Blue earned a program-best eight-game winning streak and 12-game undefeated mark, while the 17 victories rank as a school record.

Though the Orange and Blue fell in the NCAA Tournament Second Round at Elite Eight-bound and No. 4-nationally ranked Oklahoma State, 1-0, to end the remarkable year despite outshooting the Cowgirls, Rayfield left an indelible mark on the 2011 college soccer season, one during which Illinois experienced tremendous success in tandem with adapting a new formation strategy and employing five first-time starters on the field.

What is the "ideal" Illinois soccer player? She is disciplined, hard working, and self-motivated. She has a great desire to improve and a willingness to learn. She has a passion for the game that makes the hard work not a sacrifice but a choice. She smiles and sweats at the same time because she loves what she does. She always competes with everything she has because she expects everyone to do the same. She is a champion – not because she has won titles but because she strives to do her best in every facet of her life.

The NSCAA recognized sophomore Vanessa DiBernardo with All-America honors while the Big Ten named DiBernardo the Midfielder of the Year and Soccer America named the Naperville, Ill., native a second team All-American as well. DiBernardo continued to grow throughout the season under Rayfield's tutelage - finishing with the second-most single-season goals (17) and points (39) in program history while accumulating the third-most game-winning tallies (eight) in the NCAA over the course of the season. On defense, converted midfielder Jenna Carosio also benefited from Rayfield's guidance throughout her senior season and first as a starter. Carosio filled the void in the center of Illinois' defense left by the graduation of Danielle Kot and Krystin Miller, earning Big Ten Defender of the Year and First Team All-Big Ten honors with DiBernardo. Illinois was equally impressive in the classroom, with Carosio tallying NSCAA Academic All-America honors in addition to totaling CoSIDA Academic All-District with DiBernardo and Megan Pawloski, while 12 players were named Academic All-Big Ten award recipients. In total, more than 70 individual and team awards were handed out to the Orange and Blue during the 2011 season.

The Orange and Blue opened the fall with the dynamic offensive firepower expected, outscoring Gonzaga, eventual MAC Champion Toledo and Ball State, 15-2, to race out to a 3-0 mark to start the season. The schedule-opening firepower became the 26th highest scoring offense in the country of 330 ranked teams by seasons-end, with the Orange and Blue going on to net 142 points on 53 goals and 36 assists - the most in Rayfield's tenure. However, as the season progressed into the all-important conference slate, the true dynamic nature of Rayfield's program blossomed as the defense evolved into the lock-down unit needed to propel Illinois to the No. 2 seeding in the Big Ten Tournament.

After blowing out Indiana, 4-1, the Illini produced five consecutive shutouts, including four straight by one-goal margins as Illinois downed Purdue, Michigan State, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Northwestern in succession. Though the Illini finally allowed a goal at Nebraska to end the 554-minute shutout streak - only 77 minutes shy of the program record - Illinois continued to reel off victories with triumphs over the Cornhuskers and Michigan capping the regular season and establishing the program record for consecutive victories.

Entering the 2011 Big Ten Tournament as a predicted favorite to win it all, the Orange and Blue did not disappoint. After using penalty kicks to fight past Ohio State in the quarterfinals after tying through double overtime, Illinois downed Michigan State, 1-0, in overtime during the semifinals and again used extra minutes to beat No. 11-nationally ranked Penn State in dramatic fashion in the final round, 2-1, as Rayfield secured the second conference championship of her tenure.

With the automatic bid for the conference secure, Illinois put its 11-game unbeaten streak on the line against the defending National Champions, Notre Dame, in the

NCAA Tournament First Round. In a season of firsts, the Orange and Blue continued their record-setting ways with a 1-0 win over the Fighting Irish - becoming the first team to beat the defending champs in the first round in the tournament's 30-year history. The 17th and final victory of the year for Illinois simultaneously marked the program-high for single-season victories as the Illini had previously finished with 16 wins on three occasions - all under Rayfield.

The 2010 season saw Rayfield guide the Illini to their seventh NCAA tournament appearance since assuming head coaching duties before the 2002 season. Throughout the regular season, Illinois exhibited the dominance against non-conference opponents and visiting foes that has made the Orange and Blue successful throughout the program's history. Illinois rolled through its out-of-conference slate, accumulating a 7-1-0 record with six shutout victories while holding opponents to only six goals in nine home games, earning an 8-1-0 mark in the process.

In 2010, Rayfield created a dynamic offense while maintaining the shutdown defense that has highlighted her tenure with Illinois, earning a 13-5-1 overall record, 6-3-1 Big Ten mark and national rankings throughout much of the non-conference slate and the entire Big Ten schedule. The 32 goals produced by the Illinois offense marked the second-highest seasonal total in program history as the defense stifled opponents, holding the Illini's foes to only 16 goals in 19 games, the third-fewest ever for an Illinois team.

Throughout the 2009 season, different Illini stepped forward to secure victories against one of the most difficult schedules in the country. The Illini faced 12 eventual 2009 NCAA Tournament participants, including five Big Ten teams. With her experience facing high-caliber opponents, Rayfield was able to guide Illinois to victories over 2009 NCAA Tournament-bound Illinois State, UC Santa Barbara, Milwaukee and Michigan State by a combined score of 15-1.

Illinois also saw the emergence of young talent on the field throughout 2009 under Rayfield's guidance as Niki Read earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and Shayla Mutz was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. Rayfield also successfully guided her fourth player into the Women's Professional Soccer league (WPS) as midfielder Jackie Santacaterina was drafted with the 60th pick by the Chicago Red Stars.

The 2008 season was an absolute success, as Illinois made a trip to the NCAA Round of 16 for the third time in the past five seasons. Three Illini earned All-Big Ten honors, including first-team defender Emily Zurrer and second team honorees midfielder Jackie Santacaterina and defender Danielle Kot. Zurrer also became the first Illini to earn All-America honors three years in a row. Additionally, goalkeeper Alexandra Kapicka was named a National Player of the Year finalist by Soccer News Net.

The past year also was special because of the development of the WPS league. Three Illini that played under Rayfield's tutelage were drafted, including Ella Masar, Mary Therese McDonnell and Christen Karniski. Rayfield also gained valuable coaching experience in the summer of 2008 as an assistant with the U.S. Women's National Team for two of its matches against Canada.

In 2007, Rayfield led the Illini to their fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, advancing to the second round for the fourth year in a row. The squad featured seven All-Big Ten selections, including three named to the all-freshman team, both of which were the most in school history. The Illini also had two representatives named National Soccer Coaches Association of America Scholar All-Americans in McDonnell and Kara Gostisha. In addition, McDonnell also earned the school's prestigious Big Ten Medal of Honor while her sister, Shannon, was honored with the school's Fighting Illini Spirit Award.

Rayfield guided the 2006 squad to a school record-tying 16 wins, a top-10 ranking, a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and a berth in the Round of 16. That Illini team also became the first in the history of the Big Ten to boast the conference Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year and the Freshman of the Year in Ella Masar (offensive), Zurrer (co-defensive) and Chichi Nweke (freshman). In addition, Masar was named a second-team All-America selection by the NSCAA, while Zurrer was a third-team selection by the NSCAA.

The 2005 season was no different, despite entering the season with more question marks than in previous years. The Illini wasted no time answering those doubts, defeating No. 17 Nebraska 1-0 early in the season. The Orange and Blue proceeded

to extend its streak of first-round Big Ten Tournament wins to seven and qualify for its third-straight NCAA Tournament and fifth in the last six years. Illinois defeated No. 20 Florida in the first round on the Gators' home field, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year.

After the season, senior defender Christen Karniski became the most decorated Illini in school history, earning recognition as the Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Year, second team All-American by the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz, and first team Scholar All-America by NSCAA among her 10 postseason awards.

The Illini were just as successful in 2004 as Rayfield led her team to their best postseason record in school history, advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. The Illini finished the season with a record of 4-0 against the always-powerful Big 12 conference, which included a 2-1 come-from-behind upset over ninth-seeded Texas A&M in the second round of the NCAA tournament. The squad also set a school record for consecutive wins (7), with Tara Hurless earning All-America status for the second-straight year.

In 2003, Rayfield led the Illini to the best season in the program's history with a 16-4-2 record, a top-10 national ranking, the program's first Big Ten Tournament title and a top-16 seed in the NCAA Tournament. In addition, the 2003 Illini featured two All-Americans in goalkeeper Leisha Alcía and forward Tara Hurless, a first for Illinois. For her efforts, Rayfield was named Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year by Soccer Buzz.

Rayfield not only has a wealth of soccer experience but also a fierce determination to succeed and an immense amount of respect from her peers. Rayfield served as President of the NSCAA, an organization that includes over 16,000 members, in 2003-04. In addition, she continues to assist at the youth national team level whenever possible.

A United States Soccer Federation 'A' Licensed Coach, Rayfield was an assistant for Illinois in 1999 under former head coach Tricia Taliaferro and helped the Illini to a 12-8-1 record and the school's first-ever trip to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals. That season, the Illini entered the NSCAA poll for the first time and climbed as high as No. 15.

Rayfield returned to Illinois in 2002 after serving two years as a United States National Staff Coach for Region II. Her duties consisted of player identification, player development and coaching education within the region. During that time, she also served as a U-19 and U-16 National Team Assistant Coach.

"Janet will be able to provide the kind of leadership and stability this team needs," Director of Athletics Ron Guenther said when Rayfield was hired in 2002. "She has exceptional contacts as both a player and a coach at the national and international level that will allow us to continue to develop this young program."

In her playing days, Rayfield was one of the best. She played collegiately at the University of North Carolina from 1979-82 and helped build the program from the ground up. She led the Tar Heels to the 1981 AIAW National Championship and a 23-0 record in only their third year. That season, Rayfield took home the Nike Player of the Year award, All-America honors and was named one of the top 10 soccer players in America (male or female).

In 1982, she led the Tar Heels to the first-ever NCAA women's soccer championship. That championship would be the first of 18 NCAA national titles in the storied history of the North Carolina program.

During her career at North Carolina, Rayfield was a captain all four years and led the Tar Heels to an overall record of 73-9 in that span. She also left her mark all over the Carolina record books. Today she still ranks in the top three in seven different offensive categories, including holding the school records for most goals in a game (6) and most points in a game (12), both set against the Chapel Hill Club in 1979. She also currently ranks second to Mia Hamm in career goals with 93, third in career points with 223, third in single-season points with 74 in 1981 and tied for third in single-season goals with 30 in both 1979 and 1981.

After earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematical Sciences from North Carolina in 1983, Rayfield worked as a Senior Software Engineer for E-Systems in Garland, Texas, where she wrote numerous computer programs and worked her way up to management level.

When she wasn't working, Rayfield was still heavily involved with the game she loves. She played seven seasons with the Ladies' Football Club in Dallas and was the captain on six of those squads, leading them to three National Titles in 1985, '87 and '89. During that same time, she was head coach of the Texas Spirit Soccer Club that won several Washington (D.C.) area and Dallas Cup titles.

In 1990, Rayfield returned to the collegiate ranks to coach at the University of Arkansas. After three years as an assistant, she was named head coach at Arkansas in January of 1993. In six seasons at the helm of the Razorback program, she coached the 1996 SEC West Champions, two SEC tournament finalists, four All-Region players, six All-SEC players, and 27 Academic All-SEC performers while compiling an overall record of 45-64-7.

At Arkansas, Rayfield earned a Master of Science in Exercise Science/Biomechanics and also served as a USYSA Olympic Development staff coach and as a scout for both the U.S. Women's World Cup and Olympic teams. While doing all of this, she was still able to continue her playing career, as she led the Dallas Sting Soccer Club to the Over-30 National Championship in 1993.

JEFF FREEMAN

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH - SIXTH SEASON



Jeff Freeman enters his sixth season overall with the Fighting Illini and second as the soccer program's associate head coach in 2016. Illinois has reached at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament in three of the five years he has been on staff, highlighted by a Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2013. Freeman helped to coach standout Vanessa DiBernardo earn a pair of All-America honors and saw Janelle Flaws lead the country and break the school record for goals scored. Freeman also was a clinician at the 2014 NSCAA Convention in Philadelphia.

The Illini have turned in two of the top four single-season goal totals in school history during Freeman's tenure in Champaign. The Orange and Blue netted 54 goals in 2013 and 53 goals in 2011, which rank third and fourth, respectively, on the all-time list. UI boasts an overall record of 71-23-9 over the past five seasons with four NCAA Tournament appearances, a Big Ten Tournament title in 2011 and a Big Ten Tournament runner-up finish in 2012.

In 2014, Illinois finished with a 10-8-2 record on the season. With Freeman's assistance, Illini redshirt senior Janelle Flaws was named Disney Soccer/NSCAA National Player of the Week, the first Illini to ever earn the recognition. Flaws continued on to be named the unanimous Big Ten Forward of the year for the second-straight season. She led the Big Ten and tied for 12th in the NCAA with 17 goals, also being tabbed a third-team NSCAA All-American.

In 2013, Freeman helped guide the Illini to their fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in school history, as they finished 11-9-3 overall. He coached Big Ten Forward of the Year Janelle Flaws to a school-record 23 goals, which was tied for the most in the NCAA. Vanessa DiBernardo, who became Illinois' highest drafted player in school history following the season, completed her decorated career No. 3 on the all-time list with 43 goals, with Freeman coaching her during three of four seasons.

In 2012, Freeman served as the interim head coach for the non-conference portion of the schedule while Rayfield was coaching with U.S. Soccer's U-20 National Team at the World Cup. Freeman helped coach the Illini to the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round after knocking off neighbor-state rival Missouri. Freeman also helped guide the Illini to their fifth Big Ten Tournament title game. In addition, Freeman took the reigns of the Illini program for the first seven games of the season against one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country. Illinois finished 10-9-4 on the year.

In 2011, Freeman was integral in the process of implementing the formation changes that led the Orange and Blue to a 17-5-2 overall record, the most wins in a single season in school history and a Big Ten Tournament title victory over No. 11 Penn State. Freeman worked with both the offensive and defensive units throughout the season, also serving as a key contributor to the Illini's recruiting efforts while performing additional administrative and travel-related duties.

Freeman brought a wealth of experience and tactical expertise to Champaign, Illinois, after serving as a member of the University of Miami (Fla.) women's soccer staff from 2004-10, including the final three years as the associate head coach. He played a prominent role in Miami earning conference and national recognition with top-25 rankings and back-to-back appearances in the 2007-08 NCAA Tournaments as he assisted in all aspects of recruiting and team administration. As the recruiting coordinator, Freeman was responsible for the Hurricanes' 2007 top-25 recruiting class, which included ACC Freshman of the Year Brittney Steinbruch, and fellow U-20 National Team member Brittney Macdonald.

Freeman joined the Hurricanes' staff after serving as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Missouri State, for four years. The Bears' goalkeeping units earned Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Defensive Player of the Year and conference tournament MVP honors in addition to weekly MVC defensive accolades under Freeman's tutelage, while Missouri State won the MVC crown and earned its first NCAA Tournament appearance with Freeman's guidance.

As a student-athlete at Missouri State, Freeman earned academic all-conference recognition as a goalkeeper with the Bears and was a member of the 1997 squad that made the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance after earning a top-10 national ranking and the MVC regular season title.

Freeman, who earned a bachelor's and master's in education from Missouri State, is accredited as a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) 'A' Licensed Coach and holds a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

NICK STIRRETT

ASSISTANT COACH - FIRST SEASON



Nick Stirrett begins his first season with the Fighting Illini soccer program. A Champaign native, Stirrett will work with the team's goalkeepers and take on the role of recruiting coordinator for the Illini. Stirrett comes to Illinois after spending the past season with the Penn State women's soccer program.

While at Penn State, Stirrett helped the Nittany Lions to their 17th Big Ten regular season title, sixth Big Ten Tournament title and their first-ever National Championship title. Prior to his time in Happy Valley, Stirrett served as the head men's soccer coach at the University of Mount Union where

he led the Purple Raiders to one of the most successful seasons in program history. His 2013 squad earned 12 wins on its way to a third place finish in the Ohio Athletic Conference and an appearance in the OAC tournament semifinals.

Stirrett brings with him seven years of experience as an assistant coach with both men's and women's programs as well as he previously held the position at Northern Illinois and Depauw University. While at Northern Illinois, Stirrett saw Jordan Godsey set the school record for career shutouts, a number that ranked 11th all-time in NCAA Division I history.

At Depauw, Stirrett worked with both the men's and women's soccer programs, also serving as the goalkeepers coach. Stirrett saw two of his players continue on into the professional ranks after their time at Depauw, and he helped guide the men's program to a No. 11 ranking after the 2010 season. He was also active with youth development programs, acting as the director of boys' goalkeeping and the assistant girls' goalkeeping coach for the Indiana Olympic Development Program and serving as the U-14 girls head coach and head goalkeeping coach for Dynamo FC.

From 2006-07, Stirrett also held multiple roles as he worked as the women's soccer assistant coach and an assistant for the men's and women's track and field teams at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology.

Stirrett graduated from Augustana College in 2006 with Bachelor's degrees in both English and history. He played soccer and ran track for the Vikings as well. Stirrett earned his Master's degree in English in 2008 from Queen's University in Belfast, Northern Ireland, and holds an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma, USSF National 'D' License and a US Soccer National 'Y' License.

ALLIE OSMUNDSON

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH - SECOND SEASON



Allie Osmundson enters her second year with the Fighting Illini Soccer program, assisting the team during practices and with game day management duties. A native of Iowa, Osmundson comes to Illinois from Marshalltown High School where she previously served as the Head Girls' Soccer Coach. Under her tenure, she led Marshalltown to back-to-back winning seasons, tripling the program's wins from 2012 to 2013. She has coached 25 All-Conference players, four All-District players, one All-Division player and one All-State team player.

In addition to her responsibilities at Marshalltown, Osmundson also served as the Assistant Men's Soccer Coach at Marshalltown Community College. Her main responsibilities with men's program included preparing drills and scouting reports as well as managing equipment and travel arrangements. She helped guide the team to the 2012 NUCAA Tournament and has coached three NJCAA All-Americans.

Osmundson also has coaching experience with the Marshalltown Strikers, an Iowa club soccer program, and the Lake Country Soccer Club in Springfield, Mo.

A Division I soccer player, Osmundson was a member of the Missouri State Women's Soccer team from 2005-08. She made the Missouri Valley All-Conference team three times in her career, and was named team captain in 2008. She was twice named the Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week and was recognized on the Missouri Valley Conference All-Tournament Team in 2007.

2016 SEASON PREVIEW

Fighting Illini Soccer and head coach Janet Rayfield announced the slate for the 2016 season, which will be the 20th season of the Illinois soccer program. The Illini will matchup against several top-25 opponents in addition to facing a challenging non-conference road schedule.

"We are excited for the 20th season of Illinois Soccer and this slate of regional opponents," Rayfield said. "We are excited to travel to new environments and face-off against top-25 opponents in order to prepare this team to reach the goals that they have set for themselves and to help us prepare for competition at the highest level."

Illinois will open the season against first-time opponent Morehead State on Friday, August 19. The Eagles are coming off of a 9-11-2 season in 2015 that saw the squad advance to the semifinal round of the OVC Tournament. The Orange and Blue will continue the weekend hosting the Illinois State Redbirds in a 7 p.m. contest on Aug. 21. Illinois own an 8-2-2 record all time against the foes from Normal, Illinois.

The Orange and Blue will hit the road for the next two weekends, making the rounds in both Missouri and Texas. UI will travel to Mizzou for an Aug. 26 match against the Tigers in Columbia, Mo. The two teams have not met in regular season play since the 2008 season. Illinois will follow up with a contest at St. Louis on Aug. 28. Illinois is 3-2-0 against the Billikens, earning a 3-1 victory in Champaign last season.

Next up will be a road trip to Texas for the Illini squad. UI will travel to TCU (Sept. 2) for the first time in program history before heading to College Station, Texas to face Texas A&M. The Aggies finished the 2015 season ranked at No. 21 in the country after advancing to the quarterfinal round of the 2015 NCAA Championship.

Illinois will close out the non-conference slate with a homestand against Miami (Ohio) and Evansville in early September before opening conference play on Sept. 15.

"After the variety of opponents in non-conference play, we expect to be ready to handle the grueling competition that will be present this year in the Big Ten," Rayfield said. "The challenge in the non-conference schedule is to test yourselves, continually improve in all areas and hit the first peak of preparation heading into the Big Ten season."

The Big Ten campaign begins with a Thursday evening contest against Purdue, before welcoming Indiana on Sept. 18. The Illini are

11-7-3 against the Boilermakers and will face a Hoosier team coming off of a 3-10-6 record in the 2015 season.

The Illini then have a crucial road stretch to close out the month of September as the Orange and Blue travel to Maryland (Sept. 22) and Rutgers (Sept. 25) before facing reigning National Champion Penn State in Happy Valley on Oct. 1. Last season, the Illini hosted both Rutgers and Maryland in one of the most exciting weekends of the year. UI upset the then No. 11-ranked Scarlet Knights, recording the first goal surrendered by Rutgers on the year. Illinois continued the weekend to earn a double-overtime victory against Maryland a few days later.

Back in Champaign, Illinois will welcome Michigan (Oct. 6) and Michigan State (Oct. 9) the following weekend. Illinois boasts a 17-3-2 record over the Spartans in program history, and the Illini have won the last five meetings against Michigan State in Champaign.

UI will travel to Nebraska on Oct. 13 to face the Huskers for the seventh time in program history. Illinois is 2-0 against the Cornhuskers in Lincoln, Nebraska. The Illini will then face Iowa in Iowa City on Oct. 16.

The 2016 home slate will come to a close on Oct. 22 as the Illini welcome Wisconsin for an evening match. The two teams have not met since the 2014 season. Illinois regular season finale will take place in Evanston as Illinois takes on in-state foe Northwestern on Oct. 26.

"We face a tremendous road challenge this fall during our Big Ten campaign as we have six away games and lots of travel," Rayfield discussed. "But we know that going in, and our team understands the challenge that awaits them. We also host a great slate of Big Ten opponents, so our fans will get to see some of the best soccer the NCAA has to offer. We have high expectations for this senior-laden team, but they will have to grind out a grueling and challenging Big Ten schedule to reach those goals."

Instituted prior to the 2015 season, the Big Ten Tournament will once again take place over a two-weekend span with quarterfinals being held Oct. 28-30 at campus locations. The final four seeds will then meet Nov. 4-6 at the home field of the highest remaining seed. NCAA Championship play will begin Nov. 11 and continue until Dec. 4. Game times and dates may be subject to change.

2015 SEASON REVIEW

The 2015 season was riddled with record-breaking accomplishments for the Fighting Illini soccer program. Illinois saw its fifth consecutive Big Ten Tournament appearance this past season, while sixth-year senior Janelle Flaws broke a few records of her own.

Flaws was recognized for her talents on the field as Flaws was twice named Big Ten Offensive Player of the week during the season and made the All-Big Ten Second Team at the conclusion of the year. Several Illini were also recognized for their abilities off the field this season as senior Anastasia Medellin was also honored as a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree. Junior Hope D'Addario earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District Second Team, an honor that recognizes academic achievements.

The academic accolades did not stop there, as 12 Illini garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors following the season. Alia Abu-Douleh, Nicole Breece, D'Addario, Kara Marbury, Jenna Miller, Emily Osoba, Taylore Peterson, Katherine Ratz, Summer Schafer, Sarah Warren, Aliina Weykamp and Claire Wheatley all made the list for the 2015 fall semester.

The team is also sending off four seniors this season including Flaws, Weykamp, Medellin and Breece. Each will leave the Illini with a lasting legacy all their own.

The Illini put up a 10-6-3 record for the year, dominating opponents within Illinois Soccer Stadium. Illinois won seven of 10 home games, outscoring opponents 21-11. The Orange and Blue were a tough matchup defensively, holding four opponents to single-digit shots on their home turf and allowing opponents just 29 corner kicks.

The 2015 season started off with a bang as the Orange and Blue won four games in a row to kick off the year. The Illini notched one of the best starts to a season that the program has seen since 2011. In that four-game stretch, UI earned wins over Oakland, Illinois State, TCU, and Saint Louis University.

Flaws made a bang of her own to start the year as she tied and then shattered the program's all-time career goals record. Previously held by Tara Hurlless, Flaws scored her 47th career goal in a 5-2 win over TCU. She then broke the record in style on Aug. 30 against Saint Louis University. Flaws notched a hat trick in a span of just nine minutes against Saint Louis to break the record. She finished the game with 50 career goals, and recorded the second-fastest hat trick in program history at the same time.

Flaws finished the season with 11 total goals, and her 54 career goals are the most in Illinois history. She graduates as the program's leader in total points, total goals, goals in a season, shots and shots on goal, among other categories.

After the two-game home stretch, the Illini traveled to Seattle, Wash., for the Husky Invitational. The team fell to the Washington Huskies on Sept. 4, but came back to defeat the Portland Pilots, 1-0 just two days later. The game was tough as neither team found the back of the net until Flaws put in the game-winner with just eight minutes left in the match.

It was D'Addario's turn to notch a game-winner, as the Illini returned home to Illinois Soccer Stadium to host Northern Kentucky for the first time in program history. The Orange and Blue shut out Northern Kentucky in the first half, not allowing a single shot from the Norse. The Illini allowed just four NKU shots in the match, the lowest total for an opponent this season.

Illinois opened conference play with a tough road trip at Indiana and Purdue, but returned home to hand undefeated Rutgers its first loss of the season. The Scarlet Knights were 8-0-0 heading into their matchup in Champaign, and had not allowed a goal in the season. Illini junior Allison Stucky scored the first goal against Rutgers this season, while sophomore Kara Marbury put in the game-winner to secure the Illini victory.

After the exciting defeat of Rutgers on Sept. 24, the Orange and Blue were set to play the Maryland Terrapins on Sept. 27 at Illinois Soccer Stadium. Freshman Katie Murray knocked in the first goal of the game, with the assists from Breece, but Maryland tied things up by making a penalty kick. The game continued into double-overtime, before Breece was able to get a shot on frame and win the game for Illinois. The performance earned Breece Big Ten Player of the Week honors.

Illinois would see two more double-overtime contests early in October, against Ohio State and Michigan State, both ending in a draw.

After a tough, 1-0 loss to Iowa, Illinois was able to turn things around with a 3-1 win over Nebraska on Oct. 18. Kara Marbury headed in two goals in the match, lifting Illinois over the Huskers. The two-goal game marks the first for Marbury in her career. She finished the year with seven total goals, second on the team only to Flaws.

The Illini would once again bounce back to close the regular season. Illinois suffered a 2-0 senior day loss to Northwestern on Oct. 24, but ended regular season play on a high note with a 3-1 win at Minnesota. UI braved the snowy conditions and battled to victory over the Gophers, earning a No. 8 seed in the Big Ten Tournament with the win.

The season ended for the Illini in College Park, Pa. as the Illini fell to NCAA Champion and No. 1 seed Penn State, 3-1.

Illinois welcomed five freshmen to the roster for 2015, all of which head coach Janet Rayfield promised would make a major impact. They did just that, as freshman Morgan Maroney became a consistent member of the Orange and Blue's starting defense. Murray put in two goals this year, and Patricia George played in 18 games at forward. Caroline Ratz started in nine matches this year, while Lauren Ciesla racked up four appearances for Illinois.

The Illini scored 30 goals this season, and eight Illini found the back of the net this year. Seven of those players recorded two or more goals, and nine Fighting Illini recorded at least one assist on the year.

Although the season is concluded, the accolades kept coming in for Illinois as head coach Janet Rayfield was awarded the 2015 NSCAA Women's Soccer Award of Excellence. In her 14 seasons as head coach of the Fighting Illini, Rayfield established the University of Illinois women's soccer team as one of the premier programs in the nation. She has led Illinois to the NCAA Tournament in 10 of her 14 seasons at the helm, highlighted by the Illini's fourth Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2013. Rayfield and the Illini look forward to continuing their success next season.

ACADEMIC HONORS

The Orange and Blue saw 12 Illini recognized for their academic achievements this fall as they were named Fall Academic All-Big Ten honorees. To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection, student-athletes must be letter-winners who are in at least their second academic year at their institution and carry a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or higher. Alia Abu-Douleh, Nicole Breece, Hope D'Addario, Kara Marbury, Jenna Miller, Emily Osoba, Taylor Peterson, Katherine Ratz, Summer Schafer, Sarah Warren, Aliina Weykamp, and Claire Wheatley

ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Fighting Illini redshirt senior Janelle Flaws was named to the All-Big Ten second team, as announced by the Big Ten Conference Office on Friday, Oct. 30. The two-time Big Ten Forward of the Year scored 11 goals this season and her 54 career goals are the most in Illinois history. Flaws was twice named Big Ten Offensive Player of the week this season, with the most recent honor coming on Oct. 29 after leading the Illini to a 3-1 victory over Minnesota and the No. 8 seed in the Big Ten Tournament.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Fighting Illini soccer Junior Hope D'Addario was named to the Academic All-District Second Team by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Wednesday, Oct. 29. D'Addario is majoring in health behavior change at Illinois and has started in all 18 games for the Orange and Blue this year. D'Addario has scored two goals this season, and her five assists rank second on the team.

NSCAA AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

Fighting Illini Soccer head coach Janet Rayfield has been recognized as the 2015 NSCAA Women's Soccer Award of Excellence recipient, as announced by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) on Thursday, Dec. 3. This award is presented by the NSCAA Women's Membership Advocacy Group and sponsored by the Washington Area Girls Soccer League (WAGS).

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

The Illini were dominant on their home turf, outscoring opponents 21-11 this season. Illinois held four opponents to single-digit shots at home, and took 45 corner kicks to its opponents' 29.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Illini had a 3-4-2 record on the road this season, averaging about 12 shots per game in enemy territory. The Orange and Blue converted all three of their penalty kicks awarded on the road, and have fired 109 shots, putting 46 on goal.

FLAWS IS THE ALL-TIME LEADER

Redshirt senior **Janelle Flaws** sits in the top 10 in several career categories in the Illinois soccer record book. She ranks first in goals (54), first in shots on goal (169), first in points (122) and in shots (346). In Big Ten games only, she owns the most goals (29) and points (64) in school history.

FLAWS DRAFTED TO CHICAGO RED STARS

Fighting Illini forward Janelle Flaws was drafted by the Chicago Red Stars with the No. 33 overall pick in the 2016 NWSL (National Women's Soccer League) College Draft on Friday, Jan. 15. Flaws is the fourth Illini to be drafted to the Chicago Red Stars program. She is the first Illini to be drafted to the NWSL since 2014 and just the sixth Illini drafted in program history. The last Illini to be taken in the NWSL Draft was Vanessa DiBernardo, taken fourth overall by the Chicago Red Stars. Other former Illini to be taken in the NWSL Draft include Jackie Santacaterina, chosen 60th by the Red Stars in 2010, Ella Massar, taken ninth by the Red Stars in 2008, Mary Therese McDonnell, chosen 53rd by Sky Blue FC in 2008 and Christen Karniski, chosen 64th overall by the Washington Freedom.

MULTI-GOAL MARBURY

Illini sophomore **Kara Marbury** headed in two goals on Oct. 18, lifting Illinois over Nebraska, 3-1. The two-goal game marks the first for Marbury in her career. She has accumulated five goals this season, good for second on the team.

FRESHMAN PHENOMS

The Illini welcomed five freshman to the roster this season, all of which head coach **Janet Rayfield** said would make a major impact. They have done just that as freshman **Morgan Maroney** has become a consistent member of the Orange and Blue's starting defense. **Katie Murray** put in two goals this year, and **Patricia George** played in 18 games at forward. **Caroline Ratz** has started in nine matches this year, while **Lauren Ciesla** racked up four appearances for Illinois.

STOPPING THE STREAK

Illinois put a stop to two streaks on Sept. 24, as the Orange and Blue handed the Rutgers Scarlet Knights their first loss of the season. Rutgers was 8-0-0 heading into their matchup in Champaign, and had not allowed a goal in the season. Illini junior **Allison Stucky** scored the first goal against Rutgers this season, while sophomore **Kara Marbury** put in the game-winner to hand the Scarlet Knights their first loss.

2015 FINAL NOTES

LIMITING THE OPPONENT

The Illini did a great job of limiting their opponents shots this season. UI outshot its opponent in 12 games this season, firing a team total 280 shots while only allowing 241 shots from opponents. The Illini held Northern Kentucky to just four shots in the game, the fewest for an opposing team since Illinois allowed just four shots from Indiana last season (9/18/2014). Illinois' 29 shots in the game mark the most for an Illinois team since firing 29 shots against Oakland in 2014 (Aug. 31). The Illini held five opponents to single-digit shots this season. Prior to facing Purdue on Sept. 20, Illinois had held three consecutive opponents scoreless for the second year in a row. The Illini shutout Nebraska (3-0), Indiana (2-0) and Purdue (3-0) in consecutive games during the 2014 season.

TOP OF THE NATION

Illini standout **Jannelle Flaws** not only led the team in several categories this season, but she was also among the nation's leaders. Flaws ranks 31st in the country with her five game-winning goals this season. She sits 60th in the country for her 28 points, while her 11 goals ranks 61st in the country and her 4.63 shots per game ranks 18th. Flaws' 2/11 shots per game ranks 26th in the nation as well.

As a team, the Illini are 70th in the country with 7.00 shots on goal per game and 81st for their 14.79 shots per game.

LEAGUE LEADERS

Jannelle Flaws sits among the top-five on several conference lists so far this season. She led the league with her 2.11 shots on goal per game, her 0.58 goals per game and her 1.47 points per game. Her 4.63 shots per game and her 11 goals sit second while her 28 points and five game-winning goals rank third.

Junior **Claire Wheatley** grabbed a season-best nine saves against Michigan State, and boasts a season tally of 86, which ranked third in the league this season. She averages 4.53 saves per game, good for second in the conference.

As a team, the Illini rank third in the league for their seven shots on goal per game and fifth for their 4.58 points per game. Illinois finished the season at sixth in the league with 31 goals and 87 points this season.

SCORING MENTALITY

The Illini scored 31 goals this season, just one more than the goal tally from 2014. However, last season, the Illini played 20 games, while the Illini competed in 19 contests during 2015. Eight Illini found the back of the net this year, and seven of those players have recorded two or more goals, led by Jannelle Flaws who scored eight goals on the season.

FLAWS BREAKS CAREER GOALS RECORD IN STYLE

Redshirt senior **Jannelle Flaws** shattered Tara Hurlser's career goals record in style on Sunday, Aug. 30. After tying the record (47) against TCU on Aug. 28, Flaws notched a hat trick in a span of nine minutes against Saint Louis to

break the record. She finished the game with 50 career goals. Next up for Flaws is the Big Ten career record, which is set at 91 by Penn State's Tiffany Weimer.

SECOND-QUICKEST ILLINI HAT TRICK

The three goals in 9:27 by **Jannelle Flaws** against Purdue last season (9/21/14) was previously the second-fastest hat trick in school history behind Vanessa DiBernardo, who scored three goals in 8:49 as part of a school-record four goals against Purdue (10/1/10). Flaws surpassed that record against Saint Louis on Aug. 30 as she recorded three goals in exactly nine minutes, leading the Illini over Saint Louis (3-1) and breaking the Illinois career goals record.

STARTING STRONG

With four consecutive wins to start the season, the Illini notched one of the best starts to the year since 2011 when Illinois won its first four games and finished with an NCAA second round appearance. The Illini topped Gonzaga, Toledo, Ball State and Louisville before falling to USC in the fifth game of the year.

PRESEASON BIG TEN POLLS

Illinois was slated to finish fifth in the league in this year's Big Ten Preseason Poll. After finishing seventh in the league last season, the Illini returned nine of 11 starters from 2014, bringing back a wealth of experience. Redshirt senior, **Jannelle Flaws**, junior defender, **Hope D'Addario**, and senior midfielder, **Nicole Breece** are on the Big Ten's Preseason Players to Watch List.

BREAKING DOWN THE SCHEDULE

Illinois saw a challenging 2015 schedule, featuring matchups with several top-25 opponents. Illinois has faced two opponents for the first time in Northern Kentucky and TCU. The Illini also saw a familiar face in former Illini assistant coach, Eric Bell, who led the Horned Frogs to Champaign for the first-ever match up with his former team. The Illini faced three 2014 NCAA Tournament teams during the 2015 slate.

ILLINI IN EXHIBITION PLAY

Before jumping into the 2015 season, the Illini put themselves to the test with some challenging exhibition matchups. Illinois went head-to-head with NCAA runner up, Virginia before facing last year's No. 11-ranked Notre Dame. Rayfield was excited for the two challenges, hoping they would help point out areas in which the team could fine tune prior to the season opener against Oakland.

SUMMER SOCCER

The Illini were busy during the 2015 summer as several of the Orange and Blue spent their time playing all over the country. Redshirt senior **Jannelle Flaws** and junior **Kara Marbury** spent their summer making an impact in the W-League for the Seattle Sounders Women, while junior **Hope D'Addario** was called up to help the United States on the U23 National Team at the Four Nations Tournament.

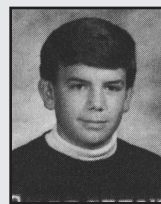

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY (11-12-3 IN 12 APPEARANCES)

2000 - SECOND ROUND

ILLINOIS 2, XAVIER 0

FIRST ROUND // CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

Illinois made the most of its first NCAA Tournament berth, shutting out Xavier to end the Musketeers' 14-match unbeaten streak and advance to a second-round showdown with Big Ten champion Penn State. Sophomore Laura Freeman netted a pair of goals, one in the 17th minute and another in the 46th minute and the Illini defense stonewalled Xavier for the program's first NCAA Tournament victory.

PENN STATE 1, ILLINOIS 0 (OT)

SECOND ROUND // UNIVERSITY PARK, PA.

The Illini took Big Ten champion Penn State into extra time, but Nittany Lion midfielder Erin Miller put in a soaring shot from the top of the 18-yard box in the 100th minute that was the difference. Illinois goalkeeper Sarah Anderson came up with seven saves on the afternoon.

2001 - FIRST ROUND

SYRACUSE 1, ILLINOIS 0

FIRST ROUND // CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

Illinois hosted an NCAA first-round match for the second straight year, but this time found itself on the losing end of a shutout, falling 1-0 to Syracuse. The teams played a scoreless first half, but the Orangewomen's Erica Mastrogiacomone sliced through the Illini defense in the 50th minute for the deciding goal.

2003 - FIRST ROUND

WESTERN MICHIGAN 2, (16) ILLINOIS 0

FIRST ROUND // CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

The Illini continued their streak of hosting NCAA first-round matches, but lost their second straight home opener, 2-0 to Western Michigan. The victory was the Broncos' first in the NCAA Tournament and 10th in a row. On a blustery night, WMU freshman Chantal Robinson blasted a 25-foot rocket off a free kick that broke Illinois' school-record scoreless minutes streak of 631:07. The Broncos then scored from close range in the 85th minute to ice the game.

2004 - ELITE EIGHT

ILLINOIS 2, RICE 0

FIRST ROUND // COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS

Illinois broke its first-round drought, taking out Rice 2-0 as senior Tara Hurlless became the Illinois career goal-scoring record holder by scoring both goals. Hurlless knocked in a 20-yarder from the right side in the 23rd minute and the Illini defense held the Owls to one first-half shot as Illinois led 1-0 at halftime. Hurlless then knocked in an 8-yarder in the 85th minute to grab the goal-scoring record and finish off the Illini win.

ILLINOIS 2, #7 TEXAS A&M 1

SECOND ROUND // COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS

The Illini fell behind early but rallied with two goals in the final 23 minutes to advance to the Sweet Sixteen for the first time in school history after a 2-1 win at ninth-seeded and seventh-ranked Texas A&M. The Aggies scored in the 19th minute and kept Illinois off the board until Natasha Karniski tied the match at 1 in the 67th minute. Just one minute, 15 seconds later, Andrea Ridgeway knocked in the go-ahead

goal, but A&M drew a penalty kick in the 77th minute. All-American Illini keeper Leisha Alcia saved it and Illinois finished out the upset to advance to the Round of 16.

ILLINOIS 2, NEBRASKA 1

SWEET SIXTEEN // CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

Illinois managed its first home NCAA Tournament win since 2000 due to a penalty-kick goal by defender Sarah Brown in the 86th minute, taking down Nebraska 2-1. Midfielder Paula Faherty got the Illini on the board early with a goal in the 21st minute off a rebound of a corner kick, but the Huskers responded with a goal in the 29th minute. With extra time looming, forward Jessica Bayne drew a foul in the 18-yard box and Brown pounded home the penalty kick for the game-winner.

#4 SANTA CLARA 2, ILLINOIS 0

ELITE EIGHT // SANTA CLARA, CALIF.

As the only unseeded team to reach the quarterfinal round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament, Illinois met expectations against Santa Clara as the Broncos advanced to the College Cup with a 2-0 win. Santa Clara notched the first goal off a free kick in the 39th minute, sending the game to halftime with a 1-0 Bronco lead. Santa Clara then staged an early charge in the second half, scoring just 45 seconds in for the final 2-0 margin.

2005 - SECOND ROUND

ILLINOIS 1, #20 FLORIDA 0 (2 OT)

FIRST ROUND // GAINESVILLE, FLA.

Rachel Frank notched her second shutout of the season in only her fourth game and Laura Redmond knocked in the game-winner in the 102nd minute as the Illini moved into the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. Frank and the Illini defense kept the Illinois season alive, as the back-up keeper made a season high-tying six saves, including a pair of tough saves in the first half and another just after halftime to keep the game scoreless. After a much more aggressive Illini team pressured the Gators during the overtimes, Christen Karniski sent a corner kick toward the box, where Ella Masar flicked it to Redmond, who beat the Florida keeper and tapped in the golden goal.

#11 (3) FLORIDA STATE 2, ILLINOIS 1

SECOND ROUND // GAINESVILLE, FLA.

Illinois' postseason run ended with a 2-1 loss to eventual College Cup participant and 11th-ranked Florida State in the NCAA second round. FSU scored first as forward Sel Kuralay blasted a 25-yarder from the top of the box over keeper Rachel Frank's head in the 30th minute. In the 64th minute, Illini defender Kelly Campbell stole the ball from Seminole forward India Trotter inside the 18-yard box, but Trotter regained possession and put in a eight-yarder for a 2-0 lead. Ella Masar pulled the Illini within a goal in the 76th minute went far post from 14 yards, but FSU held on for the 2-1 win.

2006 - SWEET SIXTEEN

#15 (3) ILLINOIS 2, SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE 0

FIRST ROUND // ST. LOUIS, MO.

Third-seeded and 15th-ranked Illinois overcame a choppy start and withstood a one hour, 38-minute lightning delay in the first half to eliminate Southeast Missouri State, 2-0, in the NCAA first round. Paula Faherty got the Illini on the board when she received a serve in the right slot, took a touch and fired in a shot at 36:41 for her first goal of the season. Jackie Santacaterina added an insurance goal in the 50th minute when she one-timed a serve from Ella Masar off the end line.

#15 (3) ILLINOIS 4, SAINT LOUIS 1

SECOND ROUND // ST. LOUIS

Chichi Nweke scored a goal and an assist in 29 minutes of action as Illinois took a 2-0 halftime lead on its way to a 4-1 win that sent the third-seeded Illini to their second Round of 16 match in program history. Nweke scored in the 19th minute on a shot that ricocheted off a SLU defender and past the keeper, putting the Illini up 1-0. Less than three minutes later, Nweke dribbled up the left flank before passing to Ella Masar, who split two defenders, turned and fired a rocket off the inside of the right post for a 2-0 halftime lead. The Billikens cut the lead to 2-1 in the 54th minute, but Eva Strickland scored in the 61st minute and Brittany Garrett notched her first career goal in the 79th minute as the Illini pulled away for the 4-1 victory.

#5 (2) FLORIDA STATE 1, #15 (3) ILLINOIS 0

SWEET SIXTEEN // TALLAHASSEE, FLA.

Florida State scored in the 20th minute and held on for dear life, turning away a number of near-misses by the Illini in the second half as the second-seeded Seminoles bounced the third-seeded Illini from the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year. Illinois limited FSU to only nine shots, but the Illini managed to put just one of their six shots on frame as the Orange and Blue saw one of the best seasons in program history come to an end.

2007 - SECOND ROUND

ILLINOIS 1, LOUISVILLE 0 (OT)

FIRST ROUND // SOUTH BEND, IND.

After a defensive battle through 90 minutes against the Louisville Cardinals left the two teams knotted at zero, the Illini wasted little time in the overtime period as senior forward Ella Masar headed in the golden goal in the 92nd minute to propel Illinois into the second round. Sophomore forward Chichi Nweke drove the ball down the right flank before crossing to Masar inside the six for her record-tying seventh game-winning goal of the season.

#11 (4) NOTRE DAME 2, ILLINOIS 0

SECOND ROUND // SOUTH BEND, IND.

Illinois advanced to the second round for the fourth consecutive year but came up short against host Notre Dame in a 2-0 loss. The Irish notched their first goal in the 27th minute and added the second just before the half on a heart-breaking own goal for the Orange and Blue. Despite holding Notre Dame to just one shot on frame in the second half, the Illini were unable to find the back of the net as their season came to an end.

2008 - SWEET SIXTEEN

ILLINOIS 1, MEMPHIS 0 (20T)

FIRST ROUND // COLUMBIA, MO.

Illinois and Memphis battled into the second overtime before Illini forward Jordan Hilbrands netted the golden goal in the 103rd minute to propel the Orange and Blue into the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The first half was a stalemate, as the teams went back and forth with possession in the midfield. The Orange and Blue defense withstood a late second-half attack from the Tigers, sending the game into overtime still scoreless. In the overtime period, Memphis collected three corner kicks but was unable to capitalize as the Illinois defense staved off the Tigers to send it to the second overtime and set up Hilbrands' game-winner.

ILLINOIS 1, #13 (4) MISSOURI 1 (20T)

ILLINOIS WINS 4-3 IN PENALTY KICKS

SECOND ROUND // COLUMBIA, MO.

Illinois again battled into double overtime and again found a way to win, capturing a 4-3 victory in penalty kicks over Missouri. The Illini and Tigers tied through 110 minutes of play, with Chichi Nweke tallying the goal for the Orange and Blue in the 56th minute and Missouri netting the equalizer in the 74th. In the PK round, Courtney Bell punched in the final attempt for the Illini, with goalkeeper Alexandra Kapicka saving Missouri's final attempt to propel Illinois to the next round. Kapicka collected a career-high 11 saves in the match.

#4 (1) NORTH CAROLINA 3, ILLINOIS 0

SWEET SIXTEEN // CHAPEL HILL, N.C.

Illinois battled hard against North Carolina, holding the top-seeded team to one goal in the first half before falling, 3-0, in the NCAA Round of 16 at Fetzer Field. Illinois goalkeeper Alexandra Kapicka delivered another solid performance, turning away five shots on goal. UNC took the lead in the 32nd minute after an unlucky Illinois own goal, then added to the lead with two goals in the second half within a two-minute span. The Illini had a few chances late in the game, but were unable to crack the Tar Heel defense.

2010 - FIRST ROUND

#22 USC 3, #13 ILLINOIS 1

FIRST ROUND // SOUTH BEND, IND.

After falling behind by three goals late, Shayla Mutz produced her first post-season points by converting an attempt within the Southern California box off a feed from Marissa Mykines in the 80th minute. The Illini continued to pressure over the final 10 minutes by producing seven more shots; however, the Orange and Blue were unable to cut the deficit further.

2011 - SECOND ROUND

NOTRE DAME 0, #16 ILLINOIS 1

FIRST ROUND // CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

Five minutes into the second half, midfielder Niki Read earned the game winning goal, her first postseason tally. The defense then clamped down, as they allowed just two off target shots for the remainder of the game, netting their ninth shutout of the season.

#16 ILLINOIS 0, #4 (2) OKLAHOMA STATE 1

SECOND ROUND // STILLWATER OKLA.

The Illini fell to #4 Oklahoma State in a hard fought, 1-0 contest. The Orange and Blue outshot the Cowgirls 18-12 and earned an 8-1 advantage on corner kicks. Yet, in the 25th minute, it was Oklahoma State who found the back of the net and eventually reached the Elite Eight of the tournament. This was the first meeting between the two programs.

ILLINOIS WINS 3-0 IN PENALTY KICKS

FIRST ROUND // COLUMBIA, MO.

In a similar rematch from 2008, the Fighting Illini once again invaded Columbia and advanced into the next round after 110 minutes of play and a penalty kick shootout. Allie Osoba scored the lone goal in the 19th minute. Then, Taylore Peterson, Kassidy Brown and Aliina Weykamp converted successful PK's while goalkeeper Steph Panozzo produced two big saves for the Illini to take the shootout 3-0. Panozzo finished with seven saves on the day.

#14 NORTH CAROLINA 9, ILLINOIS 2

SECOND ROUND // CHAPEL HILL, N.C.

In a head coach matchup that pitted former player vs coach, it was the Tarheels that advanced to the Sweet 16. Illinois struck first, scoring in the first 90 seconds of the match as DiBernardo connected on a through ball to forward Nicole Breece. Illini then entered halftime down 2-1 and without star player DiBernardo who left due to an injury. North Carolina went on to outscore the Illini 7-1 in the second half. Niki Read scored her 14th career goal.

ILLINOIS 0, #21 WASHINGTON STATE 0 (20T)

ILLINOIS WINS 3-1 IN PENALTY KICKS

FIRST ROUND // PULLMAN, WASH.

Illinois made the longest first round trip of any tournament team at nearly 2,000 miles and ended up playing the longest possible game at the muddy Lower Soccer Field. After two overtime periods, the contest ended in a 0-0 draw, sending it to penalty kicks with a trip to the second round on the line. UI won the PK shootout, 3-1, thanks to two saves by freshman goalkeeper Claire Wheatley and the game-winner by senior Vanessa DiBernardo.

ILLINOIS 4, #7 PORTLAND 3 (OT)

SECOND ROUND // LINCOLN, NEB.

Illinois continued its run with a thrilling 4-3 overtime victory over No. 7 Portland in Lincoln, Neb. The Illini battled back from a 2-0 halftime deficit on a snowy Nebraska Soccer Field and netted three second-half goals to send the NCAA second round match to an extra period. Big Ten Forward of the Year Janelle Flaws connected on the golden goal with a minute remaining, sending Illinois to the NCAA third round for the first time since 2008.

MEDIA INFORMATION

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All requests for media/photo credentials should be made at least three days in advance of the event to Jenny Dewar at the University of Illinois Athletic Communications Office at 217-300-1148. Requests may also be made through email to jdewar2@illinois.edu. Space in the soccer press area is limited and intended for working media and event staff personnel only. Media credential requests for away games should be made through the host SID office.

INTERVIEW POLICY

All media requests of coaches, student-athletes and administrators must be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Media personnel are asked not to call the student-athlete at her residence or on her cell phone. Student-athletes have been instructed not to talk to media who have not coordinated their requests with the Illinois Athletic Communications Office. Generally, the most convenient opportunity for media interviews is after the team practice sessions. If this is not convenient for media, return telephone calls from the student-athletes will be arranged. In most situations, student-athletes are not available the day before a game or on the day of matches until after the end of the match.

WEEKLY RELEASE AND RESULTS

A weekly release – usually available two days in advance of the first game of the week – and match results will be made available to the media and opponent SIDs by email and online at FightingIllini.com. If you wish to have your media agency added to the email list, please contact Jenny Dewar in the Athletic Communications Office.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Coach Rayfield and select student-athletes will be available for comments after games following a short cool-down period. Please make all requests for post-game interviews to Jenny Dewar in the press area.

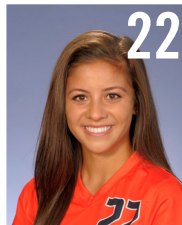
