NADALIE WALSH

HEAD COACH | FOURTH SEASON



Nadalie Walsh enters her fourth season as head coach of the Illinois Women's Gymnastics program. Walsh took her teams to NCAA Regionals in each of her first two years and a 10-6 record before the 2020 season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In her first season at Illinois, Walsh took the Illini to a third-place finish at the 2018 NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional, their highest finish since 2015. Walsh coached 2018 NCAA individual qualifier Rae Balthazor to a Second-Team All-American performance on floor exercise. The Illini finished third at Walsh's first Big Ten

Championships, as Balthazor, Bridget Hodan, and Nicole Biondi earn all-conference honors. Under Walsh's watch, the Illini had ten All-Big Ten Academic performers as Balthazor, Hodan, Rachael Donovan, Lindsay Dwyer, Jordyn Givens, Mary Jane Horth, Karen Howell, Brittany Jones, Sarah Lyons, and Haylee Roe were all honored.

The Illini followed Walsh's inaugural campaign with a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Ann Arbor Regional and a second-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, which equaled their highest conference finish since 1990. Mary Jane Otto won the conference title on bars and was named First Team All-Big Ten. Karen Howell, Kasey Meeks, and Kylie Noonan earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors. Illinois boasted 11 Academic All-Big Ten honorees, the program's most since 2009.

University of Illinois Director of Athletics Josh Whitman announced the hiring of Nadalie Walsh as the seventh head coach of the Illinois women's gymnastics program on June 12, 2017.

"I am truly honored to be selected as the new head coach for the Fighting Illini women's gymnastics program," Walsh said. "I cannot thank Director of Athletics Josh Whitman and Senior Associate AD/SWA Maria Ochoa Woods enough for entrusting me with the incredible opportunity and responsibility of leading this prestigious program. From the first moment I met Josh, I was immediately impressed with his character, demeanor and especially the positive atmosphere he has created within his department.

"I am beyond excited to begin the journey of returning home to the Midwest, so I can start the process of pouring into the student athletes. It is my vision that together we can build a passionate culture which will create momentum and inspire the alumni, recruits and community around us. I am grateful to each of my previous institutions who have equipped me with the experience needed to confidently lead the Fighting Illini gymnastics program."

Prior to arriving at Illinois, Walsh spent four years at the helm of Utah State, where she guided the Aggies to four-consecutive NCAA Regional appearances.

Walsh also spent six seasons as the head coach at Ball State, where she coached six different gymnasts to the NCAA Regional Championships for a total of 10 appearances, as well as four Mid-American Conference individual event champions. She also coached one MAC Senior Athlete of the Year as part of eight All-Mid-American Conference gymnasts during her tenure at Ball State.

Before taking the position at Ball State, Walsh spent four years (2004-07) as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh, her alma mater. In her final season at UW-Oshkosh, Walsh guided the Titans to the 2007 National Collegiate Gymnastics Association (NCGA) National Championship. The NCGA is the governing body for college gymnastics for NCAA Division III Schools. It was UW-Oshkosh's second national title in the program's history and the first since 1989. The title win by the Walsh-led Titans in 2007 halted a six-year reign by UW-La Crosse.

Walsh was named the NCGA Coach of the Year in 2006 and also earned Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletics Conference Coach of the Year accolades in 2005 and 2006, as well as Division III West Regional Coach of the Year honors in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Before becoming UW-Oshkosh's head coach, Walsh was an assistant coach for the Titans from 2001-03, helping the Titans to a second-place finish at nationals in 2001.

A native of Kewaskum, Wis., Walsh earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science and fitness from UW-Oshkosh in 2000. She and her husband, Victor, have three children Aiden, Ireland, and Valient.

KAITLYN BETTS

ASSISTANT COACH | SECOND SEASON



Kaitlyn Betts enters her second season as an assistant coach for Illinois.

Betts was hired as an assistant coach for the team on July 14, 2019 after spending the 2018-19 season as a volunteer assistant coach.

In her first season in Champaign, Betts coached the Illini to a runner-up finish at the 2019 Big Ten Championships, led by a conference title on the uneven bars by sixth-year gymnast Mary Jane Otto. Illinois advanced to the second round of the NCAA Ann Arbor Regional and finished third

among the four squads on day two.

Prior to Illinois, Betts served a season as a volunteer assistant coach with the women's gymnastics team at University of Michigan. While at Michigan, Betts helped lead the Wolverines to the Big Ten regular season and championship titles. Individually, she helped the Wolverines earn seven All-Big Ten selections, along with having two individual Big Ten champions and a Big Ten Co-Gymnast of the Year. For her efforts last season, Betts was named Co-NCAA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year.

While in graduate school, Betts transitioned into a team manager role for the Utah State women's gymnastics team from 2015-17. As a team manager contributed in the gym as a spotter and equipment and apparel manager, while also assisting with business operations such as practice logs, travel and meal arrangements, fundraising, alumni events, and social media.

Under Walsh's tenure, Betts was a gymnast at Utah State from 2011-15. She helped the Aggies qualify to NCAA regionals during her junior and senior years (2013-15), while earning second team All-WAC on vault in 2012. In the classroom, she was a two-time Academic All-WAC selection and four-time Joe E. and Elma Whitesides Scholar-Athlete Award recipient from 2012-2015. As a senior, Betts also served as a student-athlete mentor and was the vice president of the Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

As a Junior Olympic gymnast, Betts earned the 2011 Junior Olympic National title on vault, along with placing eighth on bars. In 2010, Betts placed third in the all-around at the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Betts periodically coached gymnastics since high school, including working the Utah State summer camps for three years.

A native of Canton, Mich., Betts is the daughter of Steve and MaryBeth Betts. She has three siblings, a brother and two sisters. The former Aggie earned a pair of degrees from Utah State University with a bachelor degree in Business Administration in 2015 and a master's degree in Sport and Physical Education in August 2017.

Fighting Illini women's gymnastics head coach Nadalie Walsh announced the addition of Stephen Buckner to her staff as an assistant coach for the 2019-20 season.

Buckner comes to Illinois after three seasons at Arizona State as an assistant coach under head coach and associate head coach, Jay and Jessica Santos. Both Jay and Jessica served on the staff when the Illini made three NCAA Championship appearances (2011, 2013, 2014).

In his three years in Temple, Buckner helped the Sun Devils to the most substantial turnarounds in recent collegiate gymnastics history as ASU improved 18 spots from its 2017 national finish of 41st, capping the 2018 season ranked at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). In 2018, Arizona State also made its first team NCAA regional appearance since 2014, while qualifying Sun Devil standout Cairo Leonard-Baker to the NCAA Championships as an all-around competitor. A bars standout, Leonard-Baker earned the program's first Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Year honor along with three All-American honors and being named to four All-Pac-12 teams.

This past season, Buckner propelled the Sun Devils to a fifth-place finish at the Pac-12 Gymnastics Championships, the best team finish since 2006. At Pac-12s, the Maroon and Gold also finished first in the first session with a 196.400, beating No. 19 Washington and No. 22 Stanford. For the first time since 2014, the Sun Devils had a winning record (11-10) in the regular season and the team was ranked in the top-25 nationally all season long, earning four wins over top-25 teams.

Prior to Arizona State, Buckner was an assistant coach at the University of Washington for the 2015-16 season. While there, he coached vault and floor, helping the Huskies to a third-place finish at the 2016 NCAA Salt Lake City Regional. He also had a hand in coaching Washington's first individual NCAA Qualifier since 2013, all-arounder Allison Northey. Buckner began his career with the University of Alabama, where he spent five seasons on the coaching staff serving as both the team's strength and conditioning coach (2013-15) and a graduate assistant (2010-13). He helped the Crimson Tide to back-to-back NCAA titles in 2011 and 2012 and two more top-four finishes in 2014 and 2015.

A Nashville native, Buckner lives in Champaign with his wife Alicia and son Brooks. He is a former instructor in the University of Alabama's Department of Kinesiology and earned a pair of degrees from Alabama with bachelor's and master's degrees in Exercise Physiology. Buckner has been a certified strength and conditioning specialist by the National Strength and Conditioning Association since 2014.

KELSEA KOCAN

Nadalie Walsh announced the addition of Kelsea Kocan as a volunteer assistant coach on Nov. 5, 2020.

Kocan is a coach and the women's team coordinator at Champaign Gymnastics Academy. She has been coaching gymnastics in some capacity since she was 15 years old. While in college, she coached at Flip Fest Summer Gymnastics Camp in Crossville, TN. While there, she had the opportunity to learn from collegiate coaches from all over the nation, many former Olympians, and current/former Olympic coaches.

After graduating from Central Michigan, Kocan moved to Philadelphia and worked as an athletic trainer for the women's soccer and women's lacrosse Team at Saint Joseph's University for two years. She then pursued a masters degree from the University of Kentucky. During graduate school, she coached gymnastics part time at Legacy All Sports in Lexington.

A native of Midland Michigan, Kocan lives in Champaign with her husband Ian and dog Ziggy. She was a competitive gymnast for 10 years and has a pair of degrees in athletic training. She received her Bachelors of Science in Athletic Training from Central Michigan University and her Masters in Athletic Training from University of Kentucky.

2020 SEASON REVIEW

ILLINOIS CONCLUDES 2020 SEASON

Illinois' 2020 season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Illini finished the shortened season 10-6 overall and 4-5 in Big Ten competition. In their last meet of the season they scored 196.450 in a loss at Kentucky 3/6/20.

ILLINOIS FINISHES SECOND AT BIG FIVE MEET

Illinois recorded a season-high team score of 196.550 at the Elevate the Stage Big Five meet at the Huntington Center in Toledo. Illinois finished second out of five teams, 0.200 behind No. 16 Nebraska. The Illini recorded season highs as a team on vault (49.200) and bars (49.250). Illinois entered the meet with three individual vault scores better than 9.800 on the year. Four Illini recorded scores of 9.825 or better Friday.

FOUR ILLINI GARNER ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Four members of the Illinois women's gymnastics team were named to the Big Ten All-Conference teams in 2021. Freshman Mia Takekawa was named First Team. Senior Karen Howell, sophomore Shaylah Scott and freshman Arayah Simons were named to the second team.

ILLINI EARN SCHOLASTIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS

11 Illini earned Scholastic All-America Awards for the 2019-20 academic year announced by the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA). Karen Howell and Brittany Jones, Nicole Biondi, Grace Gough, Maggie Lamps, Kylie Noonan, Olivia O'Donnell, Shaylah Scott, Arayah Simons, Mia Takekawa and Julia Waight were award winners.

ORANGE AND BLUE NOTABLES

- The Illini posted a season-best 196.550 and finished second, .200 behind Nebraska at the Big Five meet on February 23.
- Illinois recorded its second-highest score on beam in program history February 26 at Michigan State (49.400). Karen Howell, Kylie Noonan and Shaylah Scott scored a 9.900 on the event.
- In their last meet of the season the Illini tied the seventh-highest beam score in program history with a 49.350. Mia Takekawa scored a 9.750, the second best in Illinois history.
- Illinois ranked 24th overall in the Week 11 Road to Nationals rankings. By event, the Illini ranked 17th in the nation on beam, 20th on bars and 25th on floor.
- The Orange and Blue tied the seventh highest vault score in program history at the Big Five meet, putting up 49.200 on the event. Shaylah Scott lead the way for the Illini scoring a career high 9.900.
- Freshman Mia Takekawa made her mark on Illini record books. Takekawa, a walk-on, scored the first 10.0 on beam in program history. She was named BIG Freshman and Gymnast of the Week in back-to-back weeks. She finished the season scoring a 9.975 on beam, the second best score in program history.

HUFF HALL

Huff Hall is a versatile, multi-use facility that serves as the home for the Illini men's and women's gymnastics, wrestling and volleyball squads. It has a seating capacity of 3,800 for gymnastics meets. Huff Hall, once the longtime home of the Illinois State High School Association state basketball tournament, is known for creating the circus-like atmosphere that fostered the term "March Madness." This historical building on the U of I campus continues to make lasting memories in the hearts of all Fighting Illini fans.

Illinois athletics enjoy a proud tradition in Huff Hall. Huff served as the host venue for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championships and previously served as host for the 1991, 1995 and 2003 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championships. The historic building also hosted the 1992, 1995, 2004 and 2011 Big Ten Men's Gymnastics Championships, and was the site of the 1993 and 1999 NCAA Men's Gymnastics East Regional. It has also been the site of the 2018 NCAA Volleyball Champaign Regional, 2018 and 1994 NCAA first-round volleyball match, 2018 and 1995 NCAA second-round volleyball match, the first and second rounds of the 1997 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament and the first and second rounds of the 1998, 2001, 2008-11, 2013 and 2014 NCAA Volleyball Tournaments.

Huff Hall is named for longtime Illinois athletic director and coach George Huff. Huff was Illinois' athletic director from 1901 to 1935, during a time in which Fighting Illini athletic programs enjoyed unparalleled success. Huff was the driving force behind the construction of Memorial Stadium. He also served as football coach from 1895 to 1899, and baseball skipper from 1896 to 1919. Known by many of his close friends and business associates as "G," Huff served as manager of the Boston Red Sox in 1907.

Huff Hall contains two volleyball practice courts and the volleyball game facility, as well as four basketball courts and a main court. In addition, the building contains spacious locker and squad rooms which were completely renovated in 2004.

Huff Hall also houses a weight room, equipment rooms, locker rooms, a training room, a wrestling room and one squash court, as well as many offices and classrooms. In 2004, Huff received several enhancements with the renovation of its training room and weight room. Within the last decade, Illinois has made multiple improvements to Huff Hall with the addition of a new scoreboard, a new sound system, new bleachers and new lighting.



KENNEY GYM

Historical Kenney Gym, one of the university's oldest and most revered buildings, houses a unique training atmosphere and represents over a century of exercise tradition at the University of Illinois.

H.E. Kenney Gym was built in 1902, in the Renaissance Revival style. Originally the building was named the "Men's New Gymnasium" until Huff Hall opened in 1925, at which time it's name was changed to the "Men's Old Gym" then, in 1974, the Board of Trustees named it after Harold Eugene "Hek" Kenney (1903-72), who wrestled for the Illini from 1923 to 1926.

The upper level of Kenney Gym, which has 49,072 gross square feet, houses the Illinois gymnastics workout facilities. In this extensive facility, both the men's and women's gymnastics teams practice in a harmonious environment.

Kenney Gym accommodates Illinois gymnasts with its large variety of FIG specification equipment. Men's equipment includes two pommel horses, two sets of still rings, three sets of parallel bars and two high bars. While the women's equipment includes four balance beams and two sets of ELITE uneven bars. The teams share two vaulting horses, a Palmer spring floor and a 40 foot long tumble track. The historic building also features a weight room, running track, swimming pool, locker and shower facilities as well as basketball and volleyball courts.

Named after former wrestling coach H.E. Kenney, Kenney Gym has long been a focus of innovative techniques and equipment in gymnastics training. The world's first foam-lined, in-ground "pit," developed for added safety in the instruction of tumbling and vaulting, was built here in 1963. Since then, another pit has been installed for vaulting, tumbling, high bar and beam work. The Kenney Gym pit structure provides dismounting capabilities for most men's and women's apparatus events, as well as tumbling and vaulting.



IRWIN ACADEMIC CENTER

The Irwin Academic Center first opened up in 1997 and gave a home for Student Support Services for student-athletes. The Irwin Academic Services Center is home to one of the best athletic academic student support programs in the country. The staff is dedicated to working with Illinois athletic teams to ensure that all of our student-athletes are balancing the athletic, academic, and social responsibilities that arise during their time in college. Staff includes: eight full-time counselors, two learning specialists, a nutritionist and two graduate assistants.

The Irwin Academic Center is home to many support services for the Fighting Illini. These programs include:

- Study table provides a quiet place to study and computer lab use, and includes various learning environments, such as group, individual, and private.
- Tutor program provides one-on-one, small group, and drop-in sessions in all academic areas.
- Champs Life Skills provides student-athletes with an opportunity to make a successful transition to college, and enhance their growth personally & professionally.
- Illini Leadership Academy
- Career Services
- Community Service
- Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC)

In 2007, a five million dollar expansion was completed. A few of the highlights of this project are:

- Increasing facility size to 20,000 sq ft
- Increasing computer work stations from 30 to 75
- Added a laptop station work area
- Wireless internet availability throughout the building
- Large multipurpose room
- Increased private tutoring rooms from 8 to 18
- 50+ seat auditorium for meetings and presentations



FIGHTING ILLINI CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE

The Fighting Illini Center for Excellence (FICE) is a 77,000 sq. ft one-stop support center for all 500 Fighting Illini student-athletes. FICE provides three floors of student support units covering academics, sports medicine, sports nutrition and strength & conditioning.

What Inside?

Two weight rooms totally over 20,000 sq. ft of workout space

14,000 sq. ft of academic services support area

125 seat auditorium

3,500 sq. ft sports medicine treatment area

1,000 sq. ft sports nutrition refueling lounge

5,000 sq. ft multi-purpose space with glass windows looking onto Zupke Field

The DIA broke ground on the facility in 1985 as part of a \$7-million renovation project in the northeast tower area of Memorial Stadium to create an all-encompassing home for Fighting Illini Football. In 2019, the building was renovated and rebranded in order to support all Fighting Illini student-athletes.

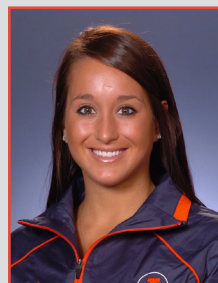

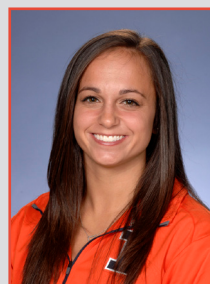

NANCY THIES-MARSHALL, CLASS OF 2017

Nancy Thies Marshall is the only Illinois women's gymnast to compete in the Olympics, when she made the 1972 team as a 15-year-old out of Urbana High School. Marshall placed third in the all-around at the 1972 AAU Meet and was fifth at the Olympic Trials to make the Olympic Team. She is credited with being the first person to perform back aerial tumbling on the balance beam in Olympic competitions. During her career, she has served as vice-chair for women at USA Olympics. Marshall has co-authored athletic-themed books, volunteered and led nonprofit organizations, worked for NBC as a commentator for television broadcasts of gymnastics, and traveled as a tireless proponent of athlete wellness. She was a four-year member of the U.S. National Team and was two-time Big Ten Gymnast of the Year. Marshall won the Big Ten All-Around title and earned All-American honors. She was inducted into the World Acrobatic Society Hall of Fame in 2010. Marshall is currently the director of Human Resources at Corban University in Salem, Oregon.
