ILLINOIS NOTES

FIRST SERVE I WEEK SEVEN

The Illinois volleyball team have a quick turnaround this week as the Illini will once again face No. 6 Purdue and No. 4 Wisconsin, wrapping up their home-and-home series with each team.

The week kicks off with the Illini hosting the Boilermakers on Wednesday (Oct. 6) at 8 p.m. CT in Huff Hall, before traveling to Madison, Wis., to take on the Badgers in UW Field House at 7 p.m. CT on Saturday (Oct. 9).

Both matches will be televised on Big Ten Network as well as broadcasted on the radio on WDWS 1400 in Champaign and streamed on Fighting!!lini.com.

The 2021 season marks the 48th season of Illinois volleyball, with the Illini holding an overall record of 1,023-587-7 (.635) and a mark of 459-290 (.613) in the Big Ten.

ILLINOIS VS. THE FIELD

Illinois leads the all-time series with the Boilermakers, 50-42 and are 28-15 in Huff Hall. The Illini have won five of the last six meetings with Purdue, including last Friday's five-set thriller in Holloway Gymnasium.

The Illini also hold a 49-43-1 advantage in the all-time series against Wisconsin, but trail 17-22-1 all-time in Madison, Wis., with the Badgers taking last Sunday's meeting as the Illini took the opening set before UW won the next three.

ILLINI BATTLE IN FOUR-SET LOSS TO NO. 5 BADGERS

Despite taking the opening set, Illinois came up just short against No. 5 Wisconsin, falling in four (25-22, 25-20, 25-20, 17-25) on Sunday (Oct. 3) afternoon in Huff Hall.

Graduate student Megan Cooney paced the Illini with her 10th career double-double with teamhighs of 13 kills on a .345 hitting percentage and

13 digs, with junior Jessica Nunge and sophomore Raina Terry adding 11 and 10 kills, respectively, to go along with eight digs.

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown passed out 41 assists on the day, with senior Taylor Kuper registering 11 digs.

As a team, the Illini outblocked the Badgers, 11 to seven, with junior Kennedy Collins leading the way with six stuffs and Brown, Terry and junior Kyla Swanson adding three each.

ILLINI KNOCK OFF NO. 4 BOILERMAKERS IN FIVE-SET THRILLER

For the fifth time in the last six matches in West Lafayette, Illinois left Holloway Gymnasium with a victory as the Illini earned their then-sixth-straight win with a 3-2 victory over No. 4 Purdue on Oct. 1.

It was the highest-ranked win for the Illini since defeating No. 1 USC in the 2011 NCAA National Semifinal match on December 15, 2011.

It also marked the first time since 2018 that the Illini had opened league play with three-straight wins.

The Illini had four players reach double figures kills, led by graduate student Megan Cooney with a career-high-tying with 21 kills on a .260 hitting percentage. Junior Jessica Nunge turned in 15 kills, while sophomore Raina Terry registered her ninth-career double-double with 14 kills, a career-high 17 digs and two service aces.

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown posted her 30th career double-double with 50 assists, 15 digs and four blocks, while defensively junior Kyla Swanson also turned in four stuffs and senior Taylor Kuper tallied her fifth 20-dig match of the season and 12th of her career with a match-high 25 digs to lead the Illini

WEEK SIX STANDOUTS

Graduate student Megan Cooney Cooney totaled a team-high 34 kills (3.78 kills per set) on a .291 hitting percentage to go along with 22 digs (2.44 digs per set) and three blocks in the two matches.

Junior Kennedy Collins paced the Illini with 11 blocks, while adding 17 kills in the two matches, while senior Taylor Kuper had 36 digs for a 4.00 digs per set mark on the weekend.

- Along with Kuper and Terry, the Illini boast four players in the top six in the conference for service aces, with junior Jessica Nunge ranking fourth (23) and graduate student Megan Cooney sitting in seventh (20). Nunge also sits 62nd nationally in total aces.
- Redshirt-junior Diana Brown ranks 20th in the NCAA and leads the conference with 599 total assists, while also sitting 57th nationally and eighth in the Big Ten with 10.15 assists per set.
- Junior Kyla Swanson ranks fourth in Big Ten play with 1.32 blocks per set.

• Cooney sits ninth in conference action with a .345 hitting percentage.

KUPER HITS 1,000 CAREER DIGS, CLOSING IN ON ACES RECORD

A constant in the Illini lineup through her four years at Illinois, senior Taylor Kuper reached a career milestone in the Missouri match on Sept. 17 as she collected a match-high 18 digs, with her 14th dig of the match marking her 1,000 career dig. Kuper becomes the 16th Illini to reach that mark and currently sits 12th in the program with 1,107 career digs, just 20 digs away from moving into the top-10.

The Lenexa, Kansas native also owns 149 career service aces and moved into fourth place in program history with two aces in the win over lowa on September 22. Illini Hall of Famer Mary Eggers owns the all-time record with 180 aces from 1985-88, with Laura Bush (1987-90) sitting in second with 176 and Disa Johnson (1984-87) in third with 154.

COONEY'S CAREER MARKS

Graduate student Megan Cooney has been a stalwart in the Illini lineup since she has been a freshman - playing in 129 of 133 in her five years. She has seen action in 489 sets, ranking her eighth all-time in program history, just 27 sets behind the program record established by Mary Eggers with 516 sets played from 1985-88.

After reaching the 1,000 kills mark a season ago on the road at Penn State, she also recently moved over 1,300 kills, 400 digs and 300 blocks in her Illini career and is closing in on 1,400 kills and 500 digs. Heading into this week's matches, Cooney currently sits at 1,313 kills, 404 digs and 305 blocks in her career.

ILLINI OUTLAST WILDCATS IN FIVE IN B1G HOME OPENER

For the seventh time in the last eight seasons, the Illinois volleyball opened Big Ten Conference action with a pair of wins as the Illini outlasted Northwestern in five (23-25, 25-17, 25-17, 21-25, 15-9) in the league home opener on Saturday (Sept. 25) night in Huff Hall.

Sophomore Raina Terry turned in a season-high 19 kills on a .227 hitting percentage to lead the Illini, while also adding five blocks and five service aces. For the second-straight match, graduate student Megan Cooney registered a double-

double – the ninth of her career – with 16 kills on a seasonhigh .536 attack clip, 12 digs and five blocks, while junior Kennedy Collins joined the duo with 16 kills of her own with only two errors on 22 swings for a .636 hitting percentage and four blocks.

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown paced the Illini attack with a season-high 52 assists as she directed UI to a .336 team hitting percentage, while adding nine digs.

Defensively, the Illini outblocked the Wildcats, 13.0 to 8.0, with junior Kyla Swanson notching her second-straight nine-block outing. Senior Taylor Kuper led the Illini with 13 digs as the home team held Northwestern to a .184 team attack clip.

ILLINI OPEN B1G PLAY WITH FIVE-SET WIN AT IOWA

Illinois opened Big Ten Conference play with a gritty five-set (24-26, 25-20, 25-20, 17-25, 15-5) victory over lowa, marking the eighth-straight season the Illini have won its league opener, on Sept. 22 night in Xtream Arena.

Graduate student Megan Cooney paced the Illini with her eighth-career double-double with a season-high-tying 17 kills on a .317 hitting percentage to go along with 11 digs, five blocks and three aces. Junior Jessica Nunge turned in a career-high 14 kills, a season-high eight digs, three aces and two blocks, while sophomore Raina Terry joined the duo in double figures with 10 kills, while adding eight digs and four blocks

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown continued her strong play with her 29th career double-double and fifth of the season with 38 assists and a career-high 20 digs, while directing the Illini to a .221 team attack clip.

Senior Taylor Kuper came within one assist of her secondcareer double-double with 28 digs, nine assists and two aces, with freshman Caroline Barnes reaching double figures for the first time with a career-high 10 digs on the night.

As a team, the Illini outblocked the Hawkeyes, 11.0 to 4.0, with junior Kyla Swanson posting a match-high nine blocks.

BROWN NAMED BIG TEN SETTER OF THE WEEK

After leading the Illinois volleyball team to a 3-0 weekend – including a perfect 9-0 mark in sets – at the Redbird Classic, redshirt-junior Diana Brown was named the Big Ten

Conference Setter of the Week, the conference announced on Sent 20

It marks the first weekly conference honor the Illini have received this season and the second weekly accolade Brown has earned after being named Big Ten Freshman of the Week during her rookie campaign.

Brown collected MVP and All-Tournament honors at the Redbird Classic after registering 103 assists for a 11.44 assists per set mark to lead the Illini to a .319 team hitting percentage on the weekend. She added 17 digs, six blocks, three kills on a .200 hitting percentage and an ace in the three wins.

The Columbus, Ohio native started off the tournament by passing out 35 assists and directing the Illini to a .368 attack clip, while also turning in four digs and three blocks against Missouri. She then guided UI to a season-best .375 hitting percentage at Illinois State after handing out 35 assists to go along with five digs and two blocks. Brown wrapped the weekend by recording 33 assists, eight digs, two kills and a block in the Illini's third-straight sweep against North Texas, with the team hitting at a .225 attack clip.

REDBIRD CLASSIC RECAP ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM & WEEKEND STANDOUTS

The Illinois volleyball team swept its competition with a perfect 9-0 mark in sets at the Redbird Classic, securing sweeps against Missouri (25-15, 25-14, 25-21) and Illinois State (25-16, 25-16, 25-16) on Friday, before capping the weekend with a 3-0 win against North Texas (25-19, 25-21, 25-12)

Junior Kennedy Collins totaled a team-high 32 kills for a 3.56 kills per set mark on a .473 hitting percentage after registering just six errors in 55 swings, while also pacing the team with 15 blocks for a 1.67 blocks per set clip on the weekend to help hold Ul's opponents to a .136 hitting percentage.

Collins kicked off her weekend with a dominant performance against Missouri with match-high of 13 kills — with just one error on 22 swings — on a season-best .545 hitting percentage and four blocks, before another standout outing against the host Redbirds with 10 kills on a .643 attack clip and a season-high eight blocks.

Junior Jessica Nunge registered 25 kills on a .375 hitting percentage to go along with 13 digs, three blocks and four service aces at the Redbird Classic.

Her weekend was highlighted against UNT as she turned in nine kills on a season-best .471 hitting percentage after committing just one error on 17 swings.

For their efforts, redshirt-junior Diana Brown, Collins and Nunge were named to the Redbird Classic All-Tournament Team, with Brown earning MVP honors.

Senior Taylor Kuper paced the Illini defensive effort with 44 digs for a 4.89 digs per set mark, while serving up seven aces. As a team, the Illini collected 24 aces to average 2.67 per set.

Redshirt-freshman Maddie Whittington also had a solid weekend as she totaled 11 kills on a .409 hitting percentage, while adding three blocks and an ace. Whittington's tournament was highlighted with six kills on a .500 hitting percentage after just one error in 10 swings to go along with two blocks against Missouri.

BLUEJAY INVITATIONAL RECAP, ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM & WEEKEND STANDOUTS

Illinois finished second at the Bluejay Invitational, recording a 2-1 mark in Omaha, Neb., on Sept. 10-11. The Illini opened the invitational with a 3-1 (25-15, 25-17, 18-25, 25-11) victory over Omaha on Friday morning, before needing just over 80 minutes to dispatch SMU in a 3-0 (25-14, 25-13, 25-18) sweep in its second match of th day.

The Illini then came up just short in forcing a decisive fifth set in a 3-1 (18-25, 16-25, 27-25, 31-33) setback to No. 19 Creighton in its final match at the Bluejay Invitational.

Sophomore Raina Terry paced the Illini offense wih 44 kills on a .255 hitting percentage, while also adding 24 digs, three blocks and one service ace.

Terry kicked off her weekend with a season-high 17 kills on a .300 hitting percentage against Omaha, before turning in a match-high 14 kills on a career-high .591 hitting percentage after just one error in 22 swings vs. SMU. She then posted her eighth-career double-double with 13 kills and 12 digs at No. 19 Creighton.

Graduate student Megan Cooney also had a standout weekend with 32 kills on a .239 attack clip to go along with 34 digs second-most on the team - five blocks and five aces. Cooney's weekend was highlighted with her seventh-career double-double and third of the season to pace the Illini with 17 kills on a .267 hitting percentage to go along with a career-high 17 digs at No. 19 Creighton.

For their efforts, Terry and Cooney were named to the Bluejay Invitational All-Tournament Team.

Senior Taylor Kuper also had a strong weekend defensively, totalling 67 digs in the Illini's three matches to average 6.09 digs per set, while adding 10 assists and six services aces on the weekend. Her weekend highlight came against No. 19 Creighton as she equaled her career-high with 29 digs — her 10th-career 20-dig match — to go along with six assists and two aces.

Junior Kennedy Collins recorded 10 stuffs on the weekend to lead the Illini's blocking efforts, while redshirt-junior Diana Brown handed out 111 assists en route to leading the Illini to a .229 team hitting percentage at the Invitational, including back-to-back .306 attack percentages against Omaha and SMII

B1G/PAC-12 CHALLENGE RECAP & WEEKEND STANDOUTS

Fans were once again back in Huff Hall on Sept. 3-4 after 645 days since the final home match of the 2019 season. The Illini opened its 2021 home schedule with the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge, while also hosting the 10-year reunion for the Fighting Illini's 2011 National Runner-Up team as well as welcoming back alums and United States Olympic Gold Medalists Michelle Bartsch-Hackley, Jordyn Poulter and Erin Virtue on Friday.

The Illini battled against No. 11 Washington before dropping a 3-1 (15-25, 21-25, 32-30, 25-21) decision in their first home match in Huff Hall on Friday (Sept. 3) night.

Graduate student Megan Cooney led all players and was one of four Illini in double figures with 14 kills, while adding 10 digs for her sixth-career double-double. Joining her was junior Kennedy Collins with 13 kills, junior Jessica Nunge with 12 kills and sophomore Raina Terry with 11 kills to go along with a match-high four aces.

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown registered her 27th-career double-double — and her third in four matches this season — with 47 assists and a match-high 17 digs. Defensively, junior Kyla Swanson led with five blocks.

On Saturday (Sept. 4) afternoon, the Illini battled back from a two-set deficit, before dropping a five-set (21-25, 18-25, 25-16, 25-22, 18-16) heartbreaker to Colorado in its final match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge.

Cooney again led the Illini with team-highs of 15 kills on a .256 hitting percentage, six blocks and four aces, while adding nine digs. Collins and Terry each posted 12 kills, with Collins and sophomore Maddie Whittington — in her first-career action at Illinois — also adding five blocks in the contest.

Brown handed out 42 assists and seven digs, four blocks three kills on a .750 attack clip and two aces.

Defensively, senior Taylor Kuper led the way with her eighthcareer 20-dig match with a team-high 21 digs to go along with three aces. As a team, the Illini totaled 15 aces against the Buffs (4-0), which ties for the fifth-most service aces in a match in program history.

On the weekend, Cooney registered a team-high 29 kills on a

BIG TEN/PAC-12 ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

For her efforts, junior Kennedy Collins was named to the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge All-Tournament team after totalling 25 kills, a team-high eight blocks and five digs in the two matches. It was her second All-Tournament Team honor in as many weeks.

PANTHER INVITE RECAP & WEEKEND STANDOUTS

For the first time since the 2018 season, the Illinois volleyball team opened the season with a 3-0 start after earning three-straight wins at the Panther Invite on August 27-28.

The Illini opened the 2021 season with a come-from-behind five-set thriller (23-25, 32-30, 22-25, 25-22, 15-8) over UC Santa Barbara on Friday afternoon, before a dominating 3-0 sweep (25-18, 25-21, 25-23) over Milwaukee in the second match of the day. Illinois then finished the weekend off with another 3-0 sweep (25-20, 25-16, 25-20) on Saturday against Valparaiso.

Junior Kennedy Collins was named the Tournament MVP, while redshirt-junior Diana Brown and junior Jessica Nunge were also selected to the All-Tournament Team.

Along with the All-Tournament honorees, sophomore Raina Terry led all players with 37 kills for a 3.36 kills per set mark, while adding the second-most digs with 29, while adding seven aces and five blocks.

Junior Kyla Swanson also had a strong weekend with a teamhigh 14 total blocks for a 1.27 blocks per set mark, while adding 21 kills and two digs. Swanson opened the season with her first-career double-double with 10 kills and 10 blocks against UCSB.

Defensively, senior Taylor Kuper led with 44 digs for a 4.00 digs per set mark and was the co-leader on the team with seven service aces.

PANTHER INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM HONOREES

Junior Kennedy Collins was named the Tournament MVP after leading the Illinois volleyball team to a 3-0 weekend at the Panther Invite in Milwaukee August 27-28. Collins registered 32 kills for a 2.91 kills per set on a .500 hitting percentage, while adding nine total blocks, two assists and a dig in her middle blocker position. The junior started off her season with a game-high 17 kills on a .520 hitting percentage, before adding eight kills on a .462 attack clip to go along with five blocks against host Milwaukee. She then wrapped up her weekend with seven kills on a .500 percentage with three blocks against Valpo.

Redshirt-junior Diana Brown and junior Jessica Nunge were also nanmed to the Panther Invite All-Tournament Team. Brown totaled 115 assists for a 10.45 assists per set, while adding 26 digs for a 2.36 digs per set, five kills on a .308 hitting percentage, four blocks and four service aces. Brown opened the season with her 25th career double-double with 48 assists, 10 digs, two kills and an ace in a season-opening win against UCSB. She then handed out 32 assists to go along with six digs, three blocks and two kills against host Milwaukee, before finishing the weekend with her second double-double of the weekend with 35 assists, 10 digs, two aces, one solo block and a kill in a win over Valpo.

Nunge registered 29 kills, eight digs, six blocks and five aces at the Panther Invite. In her Illini debut, she posted 13 kills, three aces, two blocks and two digs in a five-set win over UCSB.

ILLINI PICKED SEVENTH IN B1G PRESEASON POLL

The Illinois volleyball team was picked to finish seventh in the league standings in 2021, the conference announced on August 23. Wisconsin was an unanimous choice as the conference favorite for the 2021 volleyball season as voted on by the Big Ten coaches, while Nebraska was picked to finish second and Penn State was tabbed third. Minnesota was voted to finish fourth, while Purdue rounded out the top five of the preseason poll.

ROSTER RUNDOWN

The Illini return 12 members from the 2020-21 squad, including a pair of "super seniors" in graduate students Megan Cooney - a 2020-21 All-Big Ten Second-Team honoree - and Kylie Bruder, who both received an extra year of eligibility due to COVID-19. Also returning is senior Taylor Kuper, a All-Big Ten First-Team selection a year ago.

Redshirt-juniors Diana Brown and Bruna Vrankovic, juniors Kennedy Collins, Rylee Hinton and Kyla Swanson, redshirtsophomore Ellie Holzman, sophomores Raina Terry, Maddie Whittington and Sophie Gregus round out the returnees.

New to the squad this season is junior Jessica Nunge, a transfer from Florida State and freshmen Sarah Bingham, Caroline Barnes, Becca Sakoda and Brooke Mosher.

HEAD COACH CHRIS TAMAS STARTS FIFTH SEASON AT THE HELM

Chris Tamas is in his fifth season as head coach of the Fighting Illini volleyball program in 2021 after being named to the position in February 2017. Tamas (pronounced Thomas) is the eighth head coach in Illinois history.

In his five seasons at the helm of the program, Tamas has made an immediate impact on Illinois volleyball and owns an overall record of 89-44 (.669), including a 50-32 (.610) mark in the nation's toughest volleyball league, the Big Ten Conference, as well as three NCAA Tournament appearances.

Illinois experienced one of its most successful seasons ever in 2018 under Tamas, who was named American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year. The Illini made the program's fourth-ever appearance in the NCAA National Semifinals as the No. 3 overall seed in the tournament – riding a 17-match win streak into the Final Four – and ended the season ranked No. 3 in the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Coaches Poll. The team registered a 32-4 overall record and finished in second place in the Big Ten Conference with a 17-3 mark, with the 32 victories ranking tied for fourth-most wins in school history.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

The Illinois volleyball team released its complete 2021 schedule with the announcement of its non-conference slate on August 9, highlighted by the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge in Huff Hall on Sept. 3-4.

The 2021 Big Ten volleyball schedule was previously announced by the conference office in June, with the league once again competing in a 20-match conference schedule, with the Illini playing seven teams both home and away and six teams once (three home and three away).

The Illini open Big Ten play on the road against lowa on Sept. 22, before returning to Champaign for their conference home opener against Northwestern on Sept. 25 in Huff Hall. UI then wraps up conference action and the 2021 regular season with a trip to the state of Michigan as Illinois takes on Michigan on Nov. 24 and Michigan State on Nov. 26.

ILLINI SET FOR SEVEN BIG TEN NETWORK APPEARANCES IN 2021

The Big Ten Conference announced its fall volleyball broadcast schedule with Illinois set for seven appearances on the Big Ten Network during the 2021 campaign.

Illinois fans unable to cheer on the team in person will get their first opportunity to watch the Illini on television on Sept. 3 in their home opener against 2020-21 NCAA National Semifinalist Washington in the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge at 8 p.m. CT.

The lineup also includes six Big Ten matches, including the league opener at lowa (Sept. 22), Purdue (Oct. 6) in Huff Hall, on the road against Wisconsin (Oct. 9) and Rutgers (Oct. 29) and back-to-back home contests against Nebraska (Nov. 4) and Minnesota (Nov. 6).

BTN's coverage of Big Ten Volleyball is the most expansive in the network's history, with the 2021 schedule including at least 47 matches on television, a new high-water mark for the network, with all non-televised matches scheduled to appear on Big Ten Network+. Another six contests will air on ESPN2 or ESPNU, giving the Big Ten at least 53 matches on linear television during the 2021 season.

All Big Ten Network matches can also be seen through its digital extension, the FOX Sports app, delivering live events and on-demand programming to Big Ten Network customers via the web, smartphones and tablets.

BARTSCH-HACKLEY, POULTER & VIRTUE HELP LEAD TEAM USA TO FIRST-EVER OLYMPIC GOLD MEDAL

A trio of former Illinois volleyball greats are now Olympic gold medalists as Michelle Bartsch-Hackley and Jordyn Poulter, along with USA Volleyball assistant coach Erin Virtue, helped lead Team USA to its first-ever gold medal in women's volleyball with a dominating 3-0 (25-21, 25-20, 24-14) victory over Brazil at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

It marks the sixth medal earned by the United States in women's volleyball adding to its three silver medals (1984, 2008, 2012) and two bronze medals (1992, 2016).

Bartsch-Hackley and Poulter also become the first Illinois female athletes to earn gold medals and just the third and fourth Illini female athletes to medal at an Olympic Games following bronze medals from Tonya Buford-Bailey in the 400m hurdles at the 1996 Olympic Games and Aja Evans in bobsled at the 2014 Olympic Games.

The United States finished is tournament with a 7-1 record and dominated the playoff matches with sweeps in the quarterfinal, semifinal and championship rounds. For their efforts, five members of Team USA were named to the Olympic Dream Team, highlighted by Bartsch-Hackley being named the Best Outside Hitter and Poulter earning Best Setter of the tournament.

USA controlled the gold medal match from start to finish, with Bartsch-Hackley posting 14 points on 11 kills, two blocks and one ace, while adding three digs and 11 successful receptions. Poulter, who came back from an ankle injury suffered during pool play to set in the semifinals and finals, helped her team to a .418 hitting efficiency. She totaled 36 assists, six digs and one point with a kill.

Bartsch-Hackley was a three-time All-American for Illinois from 2008-11 and led the Illini to the national championship match in 2011. Poulter was also a three-time All-American, including earning first-team accolades as a senior in 2018 as well as being named Big Ten Co-Setter of the Year, AVCA Northeast Region Player of the Year and a finalist for the Honda Award and led the Illini to the program's fourth-ever NCAA National Semifinal appearance. Virtue, who joined the U.S. Women's National Volleyball Team as a consultant coach in 2017 and moved into a full-time role with USA Volleyball in fall of 2018, was an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American setter during her time in the Orange and Blue from 2001-05.

KUPER NAMED 2020-21 AVCA NORTHEAST ALL-REGION HONORABLE MENTION

Senior Taylor Kuper added another accolade to her name as she was selected American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Northeast All-Region Honorable Mention, the organization announced on April 13.

The Lenexa, Kansas native saw action in all 71 sets for the Illini, ranking third in the NCAA with 40 aces and fourth in the nation with a 0.56 aces per set, while leading the conference in both categories. She ranked third in the league with 4.41 digs per set, with her 313 total digs sitting fourth in the Big Ten, while also registering a .966 reception percentage after committing just 17 errors in 502 attempts. The final Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honoree of the season also notched six 20-dig matches and one double-double on the season, while adding 84 assists for the Illini.

ILLINI TRIO GARNER 2020-21 ALL-B1G ACCOLADES

Three Illini garnered 2020-21 Big Ten Conference postseason volleyball honors, the league announced on April 8 as senior Taylor Kuper was selected to the All-Big Ten First-Team and graduate student Megan Cooney earned All-Big Ten Second-Team accolades. Sophomore Sophie Gregus was tabbed as Illinois' Big Ten Sportsmanship Award recipient.

Kuper becomes the first defensive specialist or libero to earn all-conference first-team accolades in program history after a breakout season in her first year in the libero jersey.

One of the mainstays in the Illinois lineup throughout her entire collegiate career, Cooney played in 16 of the Illini's 18 matches, only missing two contests due to a non-COVID-19-related injury, ranking second on the team and seventh in the Big Ten with 205 kills for a 3.31 kills per set average that sat ninth in the league. She was third on the team with 37 total blocks, while also contributing 109 digs, 14 aces and eight assists. The Topeka, Kansas native, who reached a career milestone of 1,000 kills earlier this season, reached double-digits kills in 12 matches and recorded four double-doubles on the season.

BROWN TABBED 2020-21 COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT FIRST TEAM

Illinois volleyball redshirt-junior Diana Brown earned 2020-21 Academic All-District First-Team honors for district five, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), the organization announced on June 10. honor, which is selected by CoSIDA members, recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.

Brown, who owns a 4.00 GPA majoring in molecular & cellular biology, now advances to the Academic All-America team ballot as a first-team selection. Due to the variety in matches played across conferences and across divisions in college athletics this year, the CoSIDA Academic All-America nominations volleyball was based on career statistics for the 2020-21 academic year.

The Columbus, Ohio native started all 18 matches for the Illini in the conference-only 2020-21 season, handing out 542 assists for a 7.63 assists per set mark, while also ranking second on the team with 190 digs. She led all Illini players with 10 double-doubles, while adding 29 blocks, 17 kills and 11 service aces. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten, Brown also collected Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honors and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2019.

VOLLEYBALL TRIO NAMED 2020-21 BIG TEN DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARS

The Big Ten Conference announced its Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award winners, including a trio of Illini volleyball student-athletes - redshirt-junior Diana Brown, graduate student Megan Cooney and senior Taylor Kuper.

The list recognizes student-athletes with a minimum gradepoint average (GPA) of 3.7 or higher for the 2020-21 academic year that were also named Academic All-Big Ten.

Big Ten Faculty Representatives established the Distinguished

Scholar Award in 2008 to supplement the Academic All-Big Ten program. Distinguished Scholar Award recipients must have earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in the previous academic year, must have been enrolled full time at the institution for the entire previous academic year (two semesters or three quarters) and earned a minimum GPA of 3.70 or better during the previous academic year, excluding any summer grades. The Academic All-Big Ten threshold is a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher for a student-athlete's academic career.

ILLINI VOLLEYBALL HONORED WITH 2020-21 USMC/AVCA TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD

The Illinois volleyball team was named one of the United State Marine Corps (USMC)/American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Team Academic Award recipients for the ninth-straight season, the organization announced.

With 1,275 teams recognized, including a record 243 in Division I, the Illini are one of 13 Big Ten schools to be honored with the accolade.

The award, which was initiated in the 1992-93 academic year, honors collegiate and high school volleyball teams that displayed excellence in the classroom during the school year by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team grade-point average on a 4.0 scale or a 4.10 cumulative team GPA on a 5.0 scale.

MICHELLE BARTSCH-HACKLEY NAMED TO ILLINOIS ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2020

Michelle Bartsch-Hackley was one of 15 former Illini greats that were named to the Illinois Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2020. The class includes athletes and coaches from nine different sports and covers athletes from 1901 through 2013.

Bartsch-Hackley was one of the most well-rounded stars in Fighting Illini volleyball history. Bartsch-Hackley earned AVCA Third-Team All-America honors in 2010 and 2011 and Honorable Mention recognition in 2009 and was also selected to the Volleyball Magazine All-America First-Team in 2011. She was named First-Team All-Region and All-Big Ten in 2010 and 2011, was named the AVCA Mideast Region Freshman of the Year and Big Ten Freshman of the Year and placed on the Big Ten All-Freshman team in 2008, and was honorable-mention all-conference in 2009.

Bartsch-Hackley has been a U.S. National Team member since 2016 and is currently playing professionally in Istanbul. She helped lead Illinois to the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen from 2008-10 and to the national championship match in 2011.
