Opening Tips

- No. 14 Illinois returns home to host Nebraska at sold-out State Farm Center on Sunday (5:30 p.m. CT/BTN).
- Both programs are coming into the game following key Big Ten victories; the Illini picked up their third Quad 1 win of the season at Ohio State on Tuesday, while the Huskers upset No. 6 Wisconsin at home Thursday night.
- Sunday evening's matchup with Nebraska, the lone regular-season meeting vs. the Huskers on this year's schedule, is the 30th in the series that began during the 1920-21 season. Illinois leads 21-8 overall.
- Illinois also holds a 14-6 lead in the series since Nebraska joined the Big Ten in 2011-12. The Fighting Illini have captured seven straight victories over the Huskers, an active streak that began on Feb. 2, 2019.
- The Illini are 11-2 at State Farm Center this season, while the Huskers are 1-5 on the road.
- Illinois is No. 14 in the latest AP poll, marking the team's 10th consecutive week inside the Top 25.
- Illinois is the Big Ten's winningest team in conference play since the start of 2019-20. Entering Sunday's game vs. Nebraska, the Illini are 62-28 (.689) in league games over the last four-and-a-half seasons.
- Following Illinois' road win at Ohio State on Tuesday, the Illini also have a Big Ten-leading 26 road wins (26-19, .578) on the road in conference play since the start of 2019-20, including a 3-2 mark this season.
- Following a stretch of seven games in 19 days between Jan. 11 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 30 at Ohio State, Sunday's game is the Illini's only contest in an 11-day stretch between the win at OSU win and the team's Feb. 10 rematch at Michigan State.

Illini Team Notables

- Illinois is scoring an average of 82.3 points per game, the team's highest since 1993-94 (84.0 ppg).
- Illinois is fifth in the country in offensive efficiency (121.6), its second-highest ranking of the Kenpom era and best since 2005, when the Illini's NCAA Runner-Up team had the nation's No. 3 offense (122.3).
- Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten and 21st nationally with a scoring margin of +13.4 ppg.
- During the Illini's seven-game home win streak from Nov. 17 through Jan. 11, the Orange and Blue outscored opponents by an average of 23.7 points per contest.
- Illinois has 21 wins over Top 25 teams since 2019-20, sixth-most nationally. Three of the team's four losses this season have been by single-digit margins against top-25 foes.
- Illinois is among the top 25 nationally in two defensive categories via KenPom, ranking 15th in the nation in effective field goal percentage defense (.453) and 22nd in 2-point field goal percentage defense (.445).
- KenPom rates the Illini among the top 35 programs nationally in adjusted efficiency on both offense (5th, 121.6) and defense (31st, 97.6). Illinois is one of 14 programs to rank inside the top 35 in both metrics.
- The Illini lead the Big Ten and rank in the top 25 in the NCAA in total rebounds per game (42.9; fifth in NCAA), defensive rebounds per game (29.5, seventh in NCAA), and offensive rebounds per game (13.3; 23rd in the NCAA). The Illini also rank second in the Big Ten in rebounding margin (+9.4), which ranks 12th nationally.
- The Illini average 42.9 rebounds per game is the team's best single-season mark since 1972-73 (44.4 rpg).
- The Illini have outrebounded their opponents in 16 of 21 games this season, and own a 14-2 record when winning the battle on the glass.
- Illinois enters play this week leading the Big Ten in second-chance scoring, converting their offensive rebounds into 15.6 ppg, more than two points higher than the next closest Big Ten program (Purdue, 13.0).
- The Illini are 54th in the NCAA in field goal percentage defense (.409), 78th in three-point percentage defense (.315), and 79th in blocks per game (4.2), marks that rank fifth, fourth, and fifth, respectively, in the Big Ten.
- Illinois has pulled down 50+ rebounds in seven games this season, its most since 1979-80. Included in that was a stretch four straight – vs. Valpo, Southern, Western Illinois, and at Rutgers – that was Illinois' longest streak of consecutive games with 50+ rebounds since the 1963-64 season.
- Illinois averaged 99.0 ppg (297) over a three-game stretch from Dec. 22-Jan. 2 in wins vs. Missouri (97-73), vs. FDU (104-71), and vs. Northwestern (96-66). It marked the first time Illinois had topped 90 points in three consecutive games in 30 seasons, since December 10-18, 1993.

Illini Player Notables

Marcus Domask

- **Domask** has scored in double figures in 14 of the last 15 games, with two 30+ point performances – a career-high 33 vs. Florida Atlantic at Madison Square Garden and 32 vs. Northwestern – plus game highs of 26 points at No. 1 Purdue and vs. Maryland and team-leading 23 in a road win at Ohio State.
- **Domask** is averaging 18.5 ppg over the last 15 games (277). He has climbed to 12th in the Big Ten at 15.5 points per game overall this season after averaging just 8.2 points over his first six games.
- In conference games only, **Domask** ranks fourth in the Big Ten at 20.2 points per game.
- **Domask** is one of the Big Ten's most efficient scorers, ranking 15th in the conference with a .449 (114-254) field goal percentage.
- **Domask** ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten in free throw shooting at 88.6% (78-88), closing in on the Illinois program's single-season record of .874 (76-87) set by Alfonso Plummer in 2022.
- **Domask** is averaging 5.0 assists over the last 11 games (55), compared to 1.6 apg the first 10 games (16), and ranks 12th in the Big Ten 3.4 assists per game, and 14th with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.48.
- **Domask** was named Big Ten Player of the Week by the Big Ten (Jan. 8) and Associated Press (Jan. 9), and was also honored as one of five USBWA Oscar Robertson National Players of the Week (Jan. 9), after averaging 29.0 points, 5.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 59.4% from the field, 66.7% from 3-point range, and 90% from the free-throw line in matchups vs. Northwestern and at No. 1 Purdue.

Coleman Hawkins

- **Hawkins** has scored in double figures in 11 of the last 13 games and is averaging 13.8 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 1.4 blocks and 2.2 steals with 28 threes (2.2 per game) during that run.
- In Illinois' 88-73 road win at Michigan (1/18), **Hawkins** became first Big Ten player since 2007 (Purdue's Carl Landry) to record a stat line of at least 21 points, 10 rebounds, four assists, six steals and one block.

- **Hawkins** followed up his six-steal performance at Michigan (1/18) with five more swipes vs. Rutgers (1/21), becoming the first Illini player since **Trent Frazier** in 2018-19 to record two games with 5+ steals in a single season. His combined 11 steals are the most by an Illini over a two-game stretch in 38 years, since **Bruce Douglas** combined for 12 steals with seven at Michigan (1/18/86) and five at Michigan State (1/12/86).
- In back-to-back two road games at Michigan (1/18) and at Northwestern (1/24), **Hawkins** recorded two double-doubles of 21 points and 10 rebounds vs. the Wolverines and 22 points and 13 boards vs. the Wild-cats, while shooting 54% (14-26) overall, 50% (5-10) from 3-point range, and a perfect 10-for-10 from the free-throw line, while adding eight steals, five assists, three blocks.
- **Hawkins** recorded at least one steal 14 straight games from Dec. 2 at Rutgers to Jan. 27 vs. Indiana, a career-long streak, before finishing without a swipe at Ohio State (1/30) for the first time since the season's first three games. He ranks seventh in the Big Ten at 1.78 steals per game.
- **Hawkins** also posted a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a block between Dec. 17 vs. Colgate and Jan. 18 at Michigan, and ranks 12th in the Big Ten at 1.28 blocks per game.
- **Hawkins** is the one of two players in the Big Ten - along with Maryland's Julian Reese - to rank in the top 15 in the conference in both blocks per game (1.28 bpg, 12th) and steals per game (1.78 spg, seventh).
- **Hawkins** ranks first in the Big Ten in 3-point shooting among players listed 6-foot-10 or taller with 31 triples on the season, more than the next two players - Wisconsin C Steven Crawl (14) and Minnesota F Dawson Garcia (12), combined.
- **Hawkins** has made 28-of-67 (.418) 3-pointers over the last 13 games, after going 2-of-14 (.143) from distance in his first five contests.
- **Hawkins** is averaging 7.9 rebounds per game over his last seven contests, and has climbed to No. 15 in the Big Ten with an overall rebounding average of 6.3 rebounds per game.

Terrence Shannon Jr.

- **Shannon** has reached double-figures scoring in each of his last 25 games as an Illini, doing so in all 15 of his appearances this season, plus the final 10 contests of the 2022-23 campaign.
- **Shannon** recorded 16 points and four assist in the Illini's victory over Rutgers (1/21).
- **Shannon** started at Northwestern (1/24) and posted 12 points, including 5-for-6 from the free-throw line.
- In the Illini's victory over Indiana (1/27), **Shannon** scored 12 points, going 8-for-10 from the free-throw line and closing out the victory by knocking down six straight from the stripe in the final 63 seconds of the game.
- **Shannon** returned to form in the win at Ohio State (1/30), tying **Marcus Domask** for the team lead with 23 points (including 6-for-6 from the free-throw line), along with three rebounds and team highs in assists (3) and blocks (2).

Quincy Guerrier

- **Guerrier** leads one of the nation's most tenacious rebounding teams, ranking eighth in the Big Ten in overall rebounding (7.57 rpg) and sixth in the league in defensive rebounding (5.62 rpg).
- **Guerrier** leads the Illini and ranks third in the Big Ten with eight double-doubles through 21 games this season with the Illini. He totaled two double-doubles in 71 career games at Oregon, both coming during the 2021-22 season.
- **Guerrier** has scored at least 10 points in 10 of his last 13 games, averaging 13.9 points per game over that stretch after opening the season with a 6.3 points per game average through his first eight contests at Illinois.

- **Guerrier** is 21-of-50 (.420) on threes over the last 13 games, compared to 2-of-20 (.100) over his first eight.
- **Guerrier** enters play Sunday vs. Nebraska with 915 career rebounds, ranking 15th on the NCAA's list of active career leaders.

Luke Goode

- **Goode** started seven games, from Dec. 29 vs. FDU to Jan. 21 vs. Rutgers, averaging 30.4 minutes per game. Goode set his career high in minutes with 36 each in each game against Michigan State (1/11) at Maryland (1/14).
- **Goode** scored career-best 16 points at #1 Purdue and tied his career high with four 3-pointers against the Boilers, then two games later vs. Maryland he tallied 13 points including a trio of 3-pointers.
- **Goode** ranks 12th in the Big Ten at 1.95 triples per game and is shooting team-leading 40.6% from distance while knocking down a team-high 41 total 3-pointers on the season.

Ty Rodgers

- **Rodgers** has provided the Illini with another excellent rebounder from his point guard position, ranking third on the team, behind **Quincy Guerrier** and **Coleman Hawkins**, at 5.3 rebounds per game.
- **Rodgers** has been particularly effective on the offensive glass where he has pulled down a team-leading 43 offensive rebounds, or a team-high 38.7% of his 111 total rebounds.
- **Rodgers'** 2.1 offensive rebounds per game ranks 14th in the Big Ten this season.

Justin Harmon

- **Harmon** ranks sixth on the Illini roster in scoring at 6.9 points per game, and has tallied 100 of his 145 total points over the team's last 10 games (10.0 ppg) after averaging just 4.1 points per game over the team's first 11 contests of the season.
- **Harmon** shot 5-for-16 (.313) from 3-point range through his first 10 games, but has hit at a clip of nearly 43 percent (15-for-35) over his last 10 contests.
- **Harmon** posted a season-high 20 points, hitting 7-of-11 from the field, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range, along with 2-of-2 at the foul line in 30 minutes of action in the Illini's win against Northwestern on Jan. 2.
- **Harmon** led the Illini in scoring for the first time this season, with 18 points in the 86-63 home win vs. Rutgers (1/21).

Illini Climbing the Rankings

- It marks the fifth straight season that head coach Brad Underwood has led the Fighting Illini to a top 20 ranking, and the third time in the last four years that the team reached the top 10:

- Illinois is 324-105 (.755) all-time when ranked in the AP top 10.
- When top-10 ranked, the Illini are 170-11 at home (110-7 at State Farm Center), 82-71 on the road, and 72-23 in neutral-site contests.
- Saturday's win vs. Indiana marked Illinois' third win of the season as a top-10 ranked team, the program's most wins as a top-10-ranked team since posting 15 such wins during the 2020-21 season.

G21 Notes from 87-75 Win at Ohio State

- **Marcus Domask** and **Terrence Shannon Jr.** each scored at least 20 points in the same game for the second time this season (also 33 each vs. FAU at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 5).
- **Shannon** scored 23 points, for his eighth 20-point game of the season and had three rebounds and three assists.
- Shannon has scored in double figures in all 15 games this season and has reached double-figures scoring in 25-straight contests dating back to Jan. 31, 2023.
- Shannon went 3-for-7 from beyond the arc, his sixth game of the season with at least three makes from deep.
- Shannon was a perfect 6-for-6 from the free throw line.

- **Hawkins** also recorded two blocks and two steals. He has at least block in nine of his last 10 games, and runs his career-long streak of consecutive games with a steal to 13, including nine games with multiple swipes during that stretch.
- **Marcus Domask** scored 22 points, his 10th straight game in double-figures and 12th of 13 overall.
- **Domask** has four 20-point games, including two 30+-point efforts during that 13-game stretch.
- **Domask** also dished out a team-leading six assists, and has 5+ assists in four of his last six games.
- **Quincy Guerrier** recorded his team-leading eighth double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds.
- **Guerrier** has recorded a double-double in three straight games for the second time this season. Prior to Guerrier, the last Illini with three consecutive double-doubles was Kofi Cockburn in the final three games of his Illinois career to close out the 2021-22 season.
- **Guerrier** has scored in double figures in 10 of his last 11 games.
- **Guerrier** knocked down multiple 3-pointers for the fifth time this season.
- **Guerrier** as recorded double-digit rebounds in six of his last eight games.
- **Terrence Shannon Jr.** scored 12 points and added three rebounds, three assists, one block and two steals.
- **Shannon** has scored in double figures in all 13 games this season, and has reached double-figures scoring in his last 23 games dating back to Jan. 31, 2023.
- Illinois out-rebounded Northwestern 46-32, including a 21-7 edge in offensive rebounds.
- The Orange and Blue converted those 21 offensive boards into 19 second-chance points.
- The Illini won the rebounding battle for the third straight games and the 15th time in 19 games, overall.
- The Illini have had four players score in double-digits in nine of the last 10 contests.
- Illinois made 11 3-pointers in the game, their 14th-straight game with at least six makes from deep.
- The Illini made 18 free throws in the contest, their 12th straight game with at least 16 makes from the line.

G18 Notes from 86-63 Win vs. Rutgers

- **Justin Harmon** scored a team-high 18 points (2-5 3FGs), his fourth time in the last seven games with multiple 3-pointers, and his second straight game with 10+ points (sixth overall).
- It marked **Harmon's** first game of the season as the Illini's leading scorer.
- **Harmon's** eight boards were his most since recording nine on Nov. 17 vs. Valparaiso.
- **Quincy Guerrier** scored 15 points and secured 11 rebounds, his second straight double-double and his team-leading seventh double-double of the season.
- **Guerrier** Has scored in double figures in back-to-back games and in nine of his last 10 overall.
- **Guerrier** went 2-for-3 from 3-point, his fourth game of the season with multiple triples.
- **Guerrier** has recorded double-digit rebounds in five of his last seven games.
- **Coleman Hawkins** scored 12 points, his ninth time in the last 10 games with 10+ points.
- **Hawkins** followed his six-steal game at Michigan with five steals against Rutgers.
- **Hawkins** is the first Illini player since at least 2010-11 to record 5+ steals in back-to-back games, and the first Illini with two 5-steal games in a single season, overall, since Trent Frazier in 2018-19.
- **Hawkins** has recorded at least one steal in 12 straight games, a career-long streak, and has multiple swipes in eight games during that stretch.
- **Hawkins** grabbed nine rebounds and has recorded at least seven boards in four straight games.
- **Terrence Shannon Jr.** scored 16 points - his 22nd straight game in double-figures scoring dating back to Jan. 31, 2023 - and dished out four assists.
- **Shannon Jr.** went 8-for-10 from the free throw line and has at least eight free-throw makes in four of his last five games.
- **Shannon Jr.** also recorded four assists, his second straight contest with four helpers.
- **Marcus Domask** scored 12 points, scoring in double figures for the ninth consecutive game, and added seven rebounds and five assists.
- **Domask** has at least five assists six of his last eight games.

- Sunday's attendance of 15,544 marked the fifth sellout crowd of the season at State Farm Center.
- Illinois improves to 8-0 all-time against Rutgers at State Farm Center and has won three straight over the Scarlet Knights overall.
- The Illini have outscored the Scarlet Knights by an average of 16.6 points per game in their eight wins at State Farm Center.
- The Illini are now 60-27 (.690) in Big Ten play over the last four-plus seasons, the best mark in the conference during that span.
- Five Illini players scored in double figures for the second-straight contest and the third time in the last four games.
- The Illini have had at least four players in double-figures scoring in eight of the team's last nine.
- The Illini out-rebounded the Scarlet Knights 46-32, including a 13-10 advantage on the offensive glass.
- Illinois posted a 16-5 edge in second-chance points.
- The Illini have won the rebounding battle in back-to-back games and in 14 of 18 games overall.
- Illinois posted an overall rebounding margin of +42 in two games against the Scarlet Knights this season.
- Illinois forced a season-high 14 turnovers, scoring 20 points off of those turnovers.
- The Illini held a 50-32 advantage in the paint, the second time this season that the Illinois bench has scored at least 50 (62 vs. Southern).
- Illinois scored a season-high 20 fast break points and allowed just eight, a season-best margin in that category.
- The Illini assisted 17 times on 32 field goals, matching the team's highest assist total in Big Ten play this season.
- Illinois made at least six 3-pointers for the 13th straight game.
- The Illini made 16 free throws in the contest, their 11th straight game with at least 16 makes from the line.

Noting Shannon Jr.'s Play

- Fighting Illini fifth-year guard **Terrence Shannon Jr.**, ranked among the top players in college basketball through the team's first 11 games. He was suspended from all team activities on Dec. 27, missing the ensuing six games, and was reinstated to full status with the team on Jan. 19.
- A unanimous preseason All-Big Ten selection, **Shannon** was named to preseason watch lists for the Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy, NABC Division I Player of the Year, and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year. He was also named a Preseason All-American by FOX Sports, CBS Sports and Blue Ribbon, and was tabbed as a Midseason All-American by Rob Dauster, Doug Gottlieb, & Matt McCall of Field of 68 and by 247Sports.
- **Shannon** has continued his streak of consecutive games in double-figures scoring which now sits at 25 straight dating back to Jan. 31, 2023-
- In his last four games back in the Illini lineup, **Shannon** is averaging 15.8 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game, while going 27-for-32 (.844) from the free-throw line.
- Prior to his six-game absence, **Shannon** ranked No. 3 in the race for KenPom National Player of the Year.
- **Shannon** is averaging 20.1 points per game, on pace for Illinois' 20th single-season scoring average of 20-plus points since 1907.
- **Shannon** would record the fifth 20-point season by an Illini guard in program history. Other Illini guards to average more than 20.0 points per game are **Jim Dawson** (21.7 ppg in 1966-67), **Rick Howat** (20.6 ppg in 1970-71), **Kendall Gill** (20.0 ppg in 1989-90), and **Ayo Dosunmu** (20.1 ppg in 2020-21).
- **Shannon's** scoring average of 20.1 points would rank third in the Big Ten and No. 28 nationally. He currently does not meet the minimum number of games played to appear in the rankings (75% of team's games).
- If **Shannon** reaches the threshold of playing in 75% of the team's games, he would be one of six "Power Conference" players nationally averaging 20+ points while shooting .475 or better from the field joining Purdue's Zach Edey, Alabama's Mark Sears, Cal's Jaylon Tyson, Washington's Keion Brooks Jr., and Tennessee's Dalton Knecht, and one of only 11 NCAA Division I players overall to hit those offensive marks.

G17 Notes from 88-73 Road Win at Michigan

- Illinois has now won seven-straight over Michigan, including four-straight victories in Ann

Arbor. It equals the program's longest win streak at Crisler Center since a four-game streak from Jan. 25, 2001, to Feb. 8, 2005.

- **Brad Underwood** becomes just the second coach in Fighting Illini history to win four straight in Ann Arbor, joining Harry Combes (1952-55).
- The Illini's seen-game win streak vs. the Wolverines is the team's longest over Michigan since a series-record 11-game streak from Feb. 9, 2000, to Jan. 14, 2006.
- **Coleman Hawkins** scored a season-high 21 points and added 10 rebounds, four assists, one block and a career-high six steals, becoming the first Big Ten player since 2007 to reach those thresholds in a game.
- **Hawkins** has at least one block and one steal in eight-straight games.
- **Quincy Guerrier** posted his team-leading sixth double-double of the season with 16 points 14 rebounds. Four of his double-doubles have come in the last six games.
- **Guerrier** grabbed double-digit rebounds for his team-leading seventh time this season, and his game-high total of 14 included six offensive rebounds, tied for the Illinois single-game high on the season.
- **Guerrier** is the first Illini to have at least 16 points and 14 rebounds in a game since Dainja (20 points, 15 rebounds) on Nov. 11, 2022, vs. Kansas City.
- **Ty Rodgers** scored 15 points and added five rebounds and three assists, his second game with 10+ points in his last three contests.
- **Rodgers**, a Saginaw, Mich., native, has scored in 10+ points against every opponent from his home state this season with 10 vs. Oakland (11/10/23), 15 vs. Michigan State (1/11/24) at 15 at Michigan (1/18/24).
- **Marcus Domask** scored 15 points and had three rebounds and three assists, his eighth straight game in doubled-figures scoring.
- **Domask**, who is on pace for Illinois' single-season free-throw percentage record, went 5-for-7 from stripe to move to .884 (61-69) on the year, and has made at least five free-throws in six-straight games.
- **Justin Harmon** added 11 points, shooting a season-best 5-for-5 from the line.
- **Luke Goode** chipped in with eight points, going 2-for-4 from beyond the arc, his team-leading 10th game of the season with multiple triples.
- **Niccolo Moretti** returned to the hardwood, scoring two points in six minutes in his first game action since Nov. 19.
- With double-doubles from **Coleman Hawkins** (21 points, 10 rebounds) and **Quincy Guerrier** (16 points, 14 rebounds), it marked the second time this season that the Illini have had multiple double-doubles in a game.
- **Hawkins and Guerrier** are the first game Illini with double-doubles against a Big Ten opponent since Feb. 6, 2021, vs. Wisconsin (Kofi Cockburn and Ayo Dosunmu) and the first teammate duo to do so on the road in Big Ten play since Dec. 12, 2020, at Rutgers (Cockburn and Dosunmu).
- Illinois outrebounded Michigan 39-29, including a 13-8 advantage on the offensive glass that resulted in 16 second-chance points.
- The Illini have outrebounded 12 of 17 opponents this season, going 11-1 in those contests.
- The Illini's six turnovers set a new season-low mark, while defensively the team recorded a season-high nine steals vs. the Wolverines.

Underwood Surpasses 200 Games at Helm of Illini Program

- The Dec. 2 victory at Rutgers marked head coach Brad Underwood's 200th game at the helm of the Fighting Illini basketball program.
- Underwood, the 18th full-time head coach in program history, is just the sixth head coach to lead the Illini in 200+ games.

Taking on the Top

- Illinois has won 12 of its last 20 games vs. top-10 opponents, another highlight of the job **Brad Underwood** has done rebuilding the Fighting Illini program.
- Illinois set a single-season school record in 2020-21 with six wins over top-10 foes, going 5-1 in those matchups.
- Illinois went 2-1 last year against top-10 teams, fighting back from double-digit deficits in all three contests.
- Illinois came back from down 15 in the second half to beat No. 8 UCLA in the Las Vegas Main Event (Nov. 18, 2022) and defeated No. 2 Texas in the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden (Dec. 6, 2022), overcoming a 10-point second-half hole to earn the victory in overtime.
- Illinois also erased a 24-point second-half deficit at No. 5 Purdue (March 5, 2023) to tie the game before falling in the final minute.
- Illinois is 0-2 vs. top-10 opponents this season, but both losses have come by single-digit margins vs. No. 4 Marquette (71-64) on Nov. 14 at State Farm Center, and at No. 1 Purdue (83-78) on Jan. 5 at Mackey Arena.
- The Illini rank third nationally in top-10 wins since the start of the 2019-20 season:

- Four of those wins are over top-5 opponents, one off the NCAA lead of five shared by Alabama, Arizona, Gonzaga, Michigan State, and Tennessee, and tied with Baylor, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Purdue, Texas and UCLA.

Three Illini in 1,000-Point Club

- The Fighting Illini roster features three players - **Marcus Domask**, **Quincy Guerrier**, and **Terrence Shannon Jr.** - who have scored more than 1,000 points in their collegiate careers.
- Illinois' three 1,000-point scorers are tied for third-most in the NCAA, behind St. John's and TCU (4 each).
- Other programs to feature three active 1,000-point scorers entering the 2023-24 season: Alabama, Creighton, Grand Canyon, Kansas, Memphis, Mississippi State, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, St. Bonaventure, Vanderbilt, and Washington.

Illini Season Outlook

- Illinois is the winningest program in the Big Ten over the last four seasons and one of the nation's most successful programs as well. The accolades are plentiful: 2021 Big Ten wins leader, Big Ten Tournament Champion and NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed, 2022 Big Ten Champion, four straight top-25 finishes and 20-plus win seasons, and three straight NCAA tournament appearances (fourth precluded by COVID-19 cancellation in 2020).
- After orchestrating one of most impressive program rebuilds in the country,

what's next for Coach Brad Underwood? He enters his seventh season in charge of the Fighting Illini with an experienced group of veterans players that boasts more than 650 career games and over 350 starts at the NCAA Division I level.

- In fact, the Illini return 59 percent of the team's total minutes from last season, 58.9 percent of their scoring, and greater than 60 percent of the team's rebounding (64.5%), assists (65.8%), blocks (61.8%) and steals (67.2%).
- Added to the team's returning production is a group of six Division I transfers with more than 300 games played and 198 career starts, and a top-20 recruiting class. The solid blend of youth and experience will give Illinois the opportunity to contend once again in the rugged Big Ten conference.

Returning for the Illini

- The return of both **Coleman Hawkins** and **Terrence Shannon Jr.** provided an offseason spark for the Orange and Blue. The duo, who ranked first and third, respectively, on the team in scoring last season, both explored their professional prospects before announcing within hours of one another that they were withdrawing from the NBA Draft on May 31.
- Hawkins** enters his senior season and provides great continuity in the Illini lineup after starting all 33 games last season and leading the team in minutes played (32.5 mpg). The 6-10 power forward's versatility and all-around game was on display in all facets last season, where he ranked third on the Illini in scoring (9.9 ppg), led the team in rebounds (6.3 rpg) as well as assists (3.0 apg), and was second on the roster in both blocked shots (1.2 bpg) and steals (1.1 spg).
- Shannon**, a fifth-year senior, is back for his second year at Illinois. The Chicago native averaged 17.2 points, 4.6 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.3 steals in his inaugural season in Champaign, earning first-team All-Big Ten accolades. He ranked seventh in the Big Ten in scoring and had 11 games of 20+ points, including nine times against high-major opponents. His aggressiveness on the offensive end also resulted in 166 free throws on 210 attempts, ranking second in the BIG in both categories while cracking the Illinois single-season top-10 lists.
- Big man **Dain Dainja** leads a group of four other returners that played significant roles for the Illini in 2022-23, along with **Luke Goode**, **Ty Rodgers**, and **Sencire Harris**.
- Dainja**, redshirt junior, provides a strong presence in the Illini front court in his second season. He returns after leading the team in field goal percentage (.636) and offensive rebounds (67), and is tied with Coleman Hawkins as the team's returning leader in blocks (39).
- Goode**, a junior, is one of the team's most potent three-point threats, but was limited to just 10 games last season after suffering a bone fracture in his left foot Oct. 22 and undergoing surgery. After returning to the Illini lineup in mid-February, Goode averaged 4.0 points and 1.6 rebounds per game while shooting a team-best 42.1% from deep.

- Rodgers** and **Harris** are both back for their sophomore campaigns after stellar starts to their careers as freshmen in 2022-23. Each played in all 33 games with Harris making seven starts. Rodgers, who is expected to serve as a primary ball-handler, averaged 3.3 points and 4.0 rebounds recording 32 assists and 22 steals last year. Harris averaged 3.7 points and 2.1 rebounds, with 29 assists and 27 steals as a freshman, and will use the 2023-24 season as a redshirt year as he continues to develop his body and his game.
- Sophomore **AJ Redd** and redshirt Freshman **Niccolo Moretti** are also back after developing on the Illini roster during the second half of the 2022-23 season. Redd, from Chicago, originally joined the Illini as student manager but was added to the roster as a walkon on Dec. 21, and saw action in two games. Moretti, originally from Bologna, Italy, began practicing with the Illini on Jan. 26, enrolling in classes during the spring semester and practicing with the team while using the year as a redshirt season.

Illini Add Experience in Portal

- Illinois has added three graduate transfers to this year's team who all played four seasons but are utilizing the additional year of competition opportunity due to COVID.

- **Marcus Domask** played four years at Southern Illinois where he was a three-time All-Missouri Valley selection and posted career averages of 15.2 points, 5.3 rebounds and 3.4 assists in 35.1 minutes over 106 career games. He ranks in the SIU top 10 in five career categories: ninth in scoring with 1,615 points, sixth in free throw shooting at 84.3%, eighth with 332 free throws, eighth with 165 three-pointers, and eighth with 356 assists.
- **Quincy Guerrier** played his first two years at Syracuse, where he was All-ACC as a sophomore, followed by two years at Oregon. Guerrier owns career averages of 9.8 points, 5.8 rebounds over 131 games, totaling 1,280 points and 756 boards.
- **Justin Harmon** played two years at Utah Valley, averaged 12.9 points, 3.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists, and 1.1 steals over his two-year career. He was Utah Valley's leading scorer last year, averaging 14.0 points, as the Wolverines won the WAC regular season title and advanced to the NIT Semifinals.
- **Keaton Kutcher** and **Max Williams** joined the Illini in the offseason as walkons. Kutcher, a junior, played in 25 games and averaged 2.5 points in two seasons at South Dakota. Williams, played in three contests in his three seasons at DePaul, totalling 14 minutes for the Blue Demons.

Top-20 Freshman Class

- Illinois has once again signed a talented recruiting class, in what has seemingly become the norm for Underwood and his assistant coaches. The Illini welcome two freshmen four-star recruits **Amani Hansberry** and **Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn**, a class ranked No. 19 nationally by 247Sports.
- **Amani Hansberry** was rated as the No. 1 player in state of Maryland. Coming out of Mount Saint Joseph High School, the Silver Spring, Maryland native was tabbed as a four-star power forward ranked No. 42 by Top247, No. 63 by ESPN100, No. 85 by On3, and No. 118 by Rivals150. He was named the 2023 Gatorade Maryland Player of the Year after averaging 15.3 points, 12.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game as a senior. During his junior season, Hansberry averaged 20.3 points, 13.6 rebounds and 4.3 assists. He was a two-time Baltimore Sun All-Metro Player of the Year and led Mount Saint Joseph to two consecutive Maryland Interscholastic Athletic Association (MIAA) A Conference Tournament championships and Baltimore Catholic League (BCL) titles.
- **Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn** joined the Illini as a four-star guard ranked No. 108 by Rivals150, No. 119 by On3 Industry, No. 134 by 247Sports Composite, No. 143 by Top247, and No. 151 by On3. The Lafayette, Indiana native finished high school at Word of God Christian Academy in North Carolina, after previously attending Montverde Academy, Real Salt Lake Academy and McCutcheon High School. He was a reserve on Montverde's team that won the 2022 GEICO Nationals championship. In the EYBL, Gibbs-Lawhorn averaged 18.2 points, 2.1 rebounds, 3.2 assists, and 1.8 steals while shooting 48% from the field and 37% from three. He was named MVP of the EYBL Indy session by The Circuit after averaging 21 points, 2.8 assists and 2.4 rebounds

Illini and Jayhawks Team Up to Raise Money for Maui

- No. 25 Illinois hosted No. 1 Kansas in a Maui Strong Relief Matchup on Oct. 29 at State Farm Center. The Illini defeated the Jayhawks, 82-75 in front of 12,592 fans, with all proceeds raised from the exhibition game donated to the Hawai'i Community Foundation Maui Strong Fund, providing financial resources to the relief efforts from the devastating Maui wildfires.
- Illinois and Kansas met in St. Louis in a closed scrimmage prior to the 2022-23 season, and were set to do so again this year when longtime friends Brad Underwood and Bill Self developed the idea to instead hold a charity fundraiser to aid the Lahaina community, longtime site of college basketball's Maui Invitational. Kansas is part of this year's Maui Invite, which has been relocated to Honolulu due to the wildfires.
- The Maui Strong Relief Matchup marked Kansas Coach Bill Self's return to Champaign, where he led the Fighting Illini for three years. While at Illinois, Self won Big Ten regular-season titles in 2001 and 2002, a Big Ten Tournament crown in 2003, and made three straight NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the 2001 Elite Eight.

Preseason Accolades for Shannon

- Illini fifth-year senior Terrence Shannon Jr. has been selected as one of 20 watch list candidates named for the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Award, and

one of 50 honorees on the preseason watch list for the Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year. He is one of just four Big Ten players honored by the NABC and one of seven league members on the Naismith list.

- The two honors are the latest for Shannon, who was a unanimous selection to the Preseason All-Big Ten Team, is on the watch list for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, was named a Preseason All-American by FOX Sports, CBS Sports and Blue Ribbon.
- Shannon averaged 17.2 points, 4.6 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.3 steals last season, earning first-team All-Big Ten accolades. He ranked seventh in the B1G in scoring and had 11 games of 20+ points, including nine times against high-major opponents. His aggressiveness on the offensive end also resulted in 166 free throws on 210 attempts, ranking second in the B1G in both categories while cracking the Illinois single-season top-10 lists.

Hawkins on Karl Malone Award Watch List

- Illini senior **Coleman Hawkins** is one of 20 watch list candidates for the Karl Malone Award, given to the nation's top power forward. He is one of just two Big Ten players on the list.
- **Hawkins** started all 33 games last season, leading the team in minutes played (32.5 mpg). His versatility and all-around game was on display in all facets, where he ranked third on the Illini in scoring (9.9 ppg), led the team in rebounds (6.3 rpg) as well as assists (3.0 apg), and was second on the roster in both blocked shots (1.2 bpg) and steals (1.1 spg).

Program-Record Fourth Straight Preseason Ranking

- Illinois opened the 2023-24 season at No. 25 in the Associated Press Top 25.
- Head Coach Brad Underwood's Illini appeared in the AP preseason rankings for the fourth year in a row, which marks the longest streak in school history. Illinois started at No. 8 in 2020-21, No. 11 in 2021-22, and No. 23 in 2022-23.
- It is the 20th time in program history, that the Illini are ranked in the preseason poll.
- Illinois was one of just three Big Ten teams ranked in the preseason, along with No. 3 Purdue and No. 4 Michigan State.

Tough Sledding

- Illinois Coach **Brad Underwood** believes in putting together a rigorous schedule to prepare for Big Ten play. That is the case once again this season, as the Illini faced preseason No. 1 Kansas in an exhibition game, before taking on six 2023 NCAA Tournament teams during non-conference play, including three teams ranked in the preseason top-10.
- Illinois hosted No. 4 Marquette, the reigning Big East champion and Sweet 16 participant, on Nov. 14 in the Gavitt Tipoff Games.
- The Illini returned to the Jimmy V Classic for the second straight season and third time in four years on Dec. 5, defeating 2023 Final Four participant and No. 11-ranked Florida Atlantic, 98-89.
- After the trip to New York City, Illinois headed to Knoxville on Dec. 9 to play at No. 17 Tennessee, where the Volunteers were fresh off a Sweet 16 appearance.
- Following semester exams, the Illini beat defending Patriot League Champion Colgate on Dec. 17, then earned a 97-73 win over Missouri in the annual Braggin' Rights game on Dec. 22 in St. Louis. Mizzou was coming off a trip to the NCAA second round.
- FDU also advanced to the second round of the 2023 NCAA tournament after upsetting No. 1 seed Purdue. The Illini closed non-conference with an emphatic 104-71 home win over the Knights on Dec. 29 to finish 9-2 outside of Big Ten play.

Ubben Complex Re-Dedication

- The Division of Intercollegiate Athletics re-dedicated the Ubben Basketball Complex on Feb. 10, 2023 in a ceremony highlighting the generous support of dozens of the program's most influential donors. The daily home for the Fighting Illini men's and women's basketball programs concluded a two-year renovation in 2022 that doubled the facility's size while incorporating the nation's best technologies and advancements in sports performance, sports medicine, sports science, sports nutrition and basketball training.
- The \$40 million project is being financed completely by DIA's self-supporting funds, including more than \$34 million in private donations pledged to date. There

are 91 unique gifts from 77 donors that range from \$100 to \$5 million. Notably, 15 men's and women's basketball alumni have committed to gifts totaling more than \$9.6 million to the project.

- Highlighting the renovation is the naming of the men's practice court in honor of Fighting Illini icons and distinguished professional basketball executives **Mannie Jackson** and **Jerry Colangelo**.

Winning B1G

- Illinois' performance in conference play during the Underwood era has reached historic levels of success. The Illini enter the 2023-24 season with 55 Big Ten wins since 2020, a mark that not only leads the league, but is the most in school history over a four-year stretch:

- Illinois is the winningest team in the Big Ten over the last four seasons, registering a 55-25 mark in league play from 2019-20 through 2022-23. The Illini finished fifth in 2023, won the regular season championship in 2022, led the conference in wins while adding a B1G Tournament crown in 2021, and finished one game back of the title in 2020.

Trip to Spain Provides Head Start on Season

- Illinois had 10 days of practices over the summer prior a three-game, nine-day trip to Spain in August. Illinois played one game in each of the three cities it visited, defeating teams in Madrid, Valencia, and Barcelona.

Accomplished Ayo

- Former Fighting Illini star **Ayo Dosunmu** is enjoying a terrific start to his pro career in his hometown of Chicago. After playing a prominent role in his first two seasons - 157 games played with 91 starts - **Dosunmu**, signed a three-year, \$21 million contract to remain with the organization. He earned NBA second-team All-Rookie honors in 2022.
- **Dosunmu** averaged 20.1 points, 6.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists during his final season at Illinois, becoming the first NCAA player since 2010 and just the second Big Ten player since 1993 to average at least 20 points, six rebounds and five assists. He accumulated the most impressive single-season list of accolades ever by an Illini player, highlighted by USA Today National Player of the Year, Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, and consensus first-team All-American.

- **Dosunmu** was selected by the Bulls with the No. 38 overall pick in the second round of the 2021 NBA Draft. He returned to campus in January 2022 to raise his banner to the State Farm Center rafters, joining the Fighting Illini Honored Jerseys program.

Game 16 Recap – Illinois 76, Nebraska 50

Illinois secured its first Big Ten road win of the season against Nebraska, taking down the Cornhuskers in an emphatic 76-50 victory at Pinnacle Bank Arena.

Five different Illini finished in double figures, and Illinois took advantage of a big second half, outscoring the Cornhuskers, 42-27, in the final 20 minutes.

The Illini shot 58.1 percent from the field in the second half, scoring 10 second-chance points and 10 points off turnovers in the final frame.

Illinois set the tone defensively early and maintained its energy throughout the contest, grabbing 12 steals and making seven blocks in the win. **Dain Dainja** led the way with three blocks, while **Terrence Shannon Jr.** tied his career high with four steals. **Sencire Harris** registered a career-high three steals.

Shannon also dominated offensively, making a career-high 10 field goals en route to a 25-point, 11-rebound double-double, his second of the season and the fourth mark of his career. He scored 17 of his 25 in the first half to push the Illini to a 34-23 lead at the break.

Illinois found a second gear on offense early in the second half. The Illini went on a 17-4 run, converting five straight shots, over a five-minute stretch to open up an 18-point lead.

After Nebraska cut its deficit to 10 points with six minutes to play, Illinois halted the host's comeback attempt. The Illini closed the game on a 17-1 run and held the Cornhuskers without a field goal for the final six minutes of play to seal the 26-point victory.

Coleman Hawkins notched 12 points, nine of which came in the second half. Jayden Epps registered seven of his 11 points in the final five minutes of play, going 5-of-6 from the field for his fifth-straight double-figure outing.

RJ Melendez and **Matthew Mayer** both recorded 10 points in the win.

Game 22 Recap – Illinois 72, Nebraska 56

Illinois used a big final 12 minutes to defeat Nebraska, 72-56, at State Farm Center. The Illini outscored the Cornhuskers, 24-6, during that closing stretch to secure their seventh win in eight games.

A strong Illinois defensive stand late in the game kept Nebraska without a field goal for the last six minutes, and four Illini finished in double figures in the victory.

Matthew Mayer scored a team-high 16 points, including three 3-pointers, while tallying six rebounds and two blocks. **Jayden Epps** recorded 12 points, including a team-high eight second-half points. **Epps** also registered three rebounds and three assists.

Ty Rodgers put together another strong performance with seven points and seven rebounds, six of which came on the offensive glass. **Rodgers** also made two steals. **Sencire Harris** was efficient in his 13 minutes of action, scoring eight points, which helped spark the Illini's second-half comeback.

A 14-5 Illini run over a four-minute period helped the hosts take a 30-22 lead, their largest lead opening period, with five minutes to play.

Illinois opened the second half with energy, going on an 8-2 run to open the frame. The Illini forced five turnovers within the first three minutes of the period to take a seven-point lead.

After Nebraska reeled off nine unanswered to move ahead 50-48, an 8-0 Illinois run – fueled by strong defense, two steals, and four points from **Harris** – put the hosts back in front, 56-50, with eight minutes to play. A 7-2 run featuring points from three Illini freshmen extended Illinois' advantage to nine with just over five minutes left on the clock.

The Illini closed the game on a 9-0 run and held the Cornhuskers scoreless in the final four minutes of play to secure the home victory.

Brad Underwood has reinvigorated Illinois Basketball, bringing the Fighting Illini back to the national stage and building a championship program during his six seasons in Champaign.

Underwood is the 18th head coach in Illinois history, hired in March 2017 as the Richmond Family Endowed Men's Head Basketball Coach.

He has won nearly 68 percent of his games during his 10 years as a Division I head coach, recording eight 20-win seasons. Underwood has made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament, with the eighth precluded by the cancellation of the 2020 postseason due to COVID-19.

Illinois had another successful season in Underwood's sixth year in Champaign. Despite replacing all five regular starters, its top five leading scorers, and a total of 10 players from the previous year's Big Ten championship squad, Illinois went 20-13 overall and finished fifth in the Big Ten (11-9) in 2023, securing a third straight NCAA Tournament bid and fourth straight 20-win season.

Illinois ranked in the bottom 25 nationally in minutes continuity from last year. Of those last 25 teams, Illinois was the only one to earn a bid in the 2023 NCAA tournament. The Illini were one of just two teams with multiple kenpom top-10 non-conference wins away from home, posting dramatic comeback wins over UCLA in Las Vegas and Texas at Madison Square Garden. Illinois also protected its homecourt, going 15-2 at State Farm Center to mark its best home winning percentage in 17 years.

Illinois has now recorded at least 20 wins and a winning record in B1G play in four straight seasons for the first time since doing so eight years in a row from 1999-2000 through 2006-07.

The Big Ten has been the nation's preeminent conference in recent years. It was ranked No. 1 by kenpom in 2020 and 2021, received a league-record nine NCAA Tournament bids in 2021 and 2022, and led all conferences once again with eight tournament bids in 2023. Yet no team has fared better during this stretch than the Fighting Illini, who are 55-25 (.688) in Big Ten play the last four years of the Underwood era. Illinois owns the most wins and best winning percentage in the league over the last four Big Ten seasons.

The 55 Big Ten victories mark the winningest four-year run in school history, with Underwood claiming Illinois' two all-time winningest Big Ten seasons (16 in 2021, 15 in 2022), and three of the top seven (13 in 2020) during this stretch.

Underwood led Illinois to the 2022 Big Ten championship in year five, navigating a challenging schedule with a frequently depleted roster to post a 15-5 league record and earn the school's first regular season conference title in 17 years. Illinois went 23-10 overall and ended the year at No. 19 in the AP poll to register a third-straight Top 25 finish, the program's longest streak since 2000-06.

Illinois was a No. 4 seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament, becoming one of just six programs to receive top-4 seeds in back-to-back tournaments

after earning a No. 1 seed in 2021. Illinois again made a Round of 32 appearance, advancing in consecutive NCAA Tournaments for the first time in 16 years.

Underwood coached junior Kofi Cockburn, the most dominant player in college basketball, to consensus first-team All-America honors in 2022. Cockburn was the only player in the country to average 20+ points and 10+ rebounds, becoming the first Illini to do so in the last 50 years. Cockburn joined Ayo Dosunmu as the only AP first-team All-Americans in school history, players mentored by Underwood in back-to-back seasons.

Underwood's fourth Illini team in 2021 put together one of the best seasons in school history, ending the year ranked No. 2 in the final AP poll, winning the Big Ten Tournament championship, and earning a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Illinois went 16-4 in conference play to mark its winningest Big Ten season ever. Illinois led the Big Ten in victories while playing the full conference schedule, but missed out on the regular season title due to an unequal number of games played creating a win percentage differential of .024. The Illini went on to win the Big Ten Tournament, earning the program's first conference tournament title since 2005.

In all, Illinois totaled 19 wins against conference foes in 2021, setting a school record and tying the second-most wins ever by a Big Ten school against league competition in a single season.

Illinois earned the fourth NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed in school history after winning 14 of 15 games over a two-month stretch leading into NCAA March Madness. The remarkable run included seven wins over ranked teams, with five coming against top-10 foes.

Illinois finished the season with a total of six victories over top-10 teams, breaking the previous school record of five set by the 1989 Flyin' Illini.

Illinois had a pair of consensus All-Americans leading the way in 2021. Junior Ayo Dosunmu was a first-team All-America selection by every organization and finalist for every player of the year award. The USA Today National Player of the Year and Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, Dosunmu became the first NCAA player since 2010 to average at least 20 points, six rebounds and five assists.

Sophomore Kofi Cockburn was a second-team All-America pick by every outlet, totaling 16 double-doubles and standing as the only player in the country to average at least 15 points and nine rebounds on 60+ percent shooting.

Brad and his wife, Susan, have a son, Tyler, and two daughters, Katie and Ashley. Tyler, who played four seasons for the Illini while earning three degrees, is an assistant coach on the Illinois staff. Katie also is a U of I graduate, and Ashley attends Miami-Ohio.

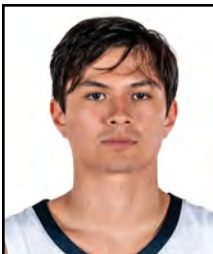

The Owls retook the lead, momentarily, 57-56, with an 8-0 run of their own. But after Domask converted an and-1 layup, Harmon hit his second 3-pointer of the night and Shannon's driving layup capped off an 8-0 run for the Orange and Blue to restore the Illini's seven-point lead, 64-57.

The Illini lead reached as many as 11, but the Owls fought back to within two points with three minutes to play. Hawkins answered with a 3-pointer to push the lead back to five, 89-84. Shannon then sealed the win at the free-throw line where he scored seven of the game's final nine points.

The Fighting Illini (9-2) had four players score in double figures, led by Shannon Jr., who secured a double-double with 30 points and 11 rebounds. Guerrier tacked on 28 points and eight rebounds and Coleman Hawkins chipped in with 15 points, seven rebounds and two steals.

Illinois collected 51 rebounds in Friday's game compared to Missouri's 35, led by Shannon Jr.'s 11 boards. The Fighting Illini also put in work on the offensive glass, turning 16 rebounds into 21 second chance points.

Illinois' defense held Missouri to only 39.2 percent shooting from the field, including 22.2 percent from beyond the arc.

After jumping out to a 35-20 advantage, Illinois went on a 9-0 run with 6:04 left in the first half to increase its lead to 44-20. The Fighting Illini entered halftime with a 49-24 advantage. Illinois relied on its three-point shooting in the period, knocking down seven shots from behind the arc.

Illinois kept its lead intact before going on an 8-0 run, finished off by Marcus Domask's jumper, to grow the lead to 85-56 with 5:40 to go in the contest. The Tigers narrowed the margin midway through the second half, but the Fighting Illini cruised the rest of the way for the 97-73 win.

The Fighting Illini opened the contest with points on their first four trips down the court and ledd 16-10 at the first media timeout. All five starters registered a basket within the first five minutes of the game. Illinois pushed its lead to 18 with an 11-0 run that ended with a four straight from Domask, and the Illini went into the break with a 46-29 advantage

Illinois picked up right where it left off to begin the second half. Another 11-0 run, that began with five straight from Hawkins and was capped by a Harmon bucket, pushed the Illini lead to 33 points, 75-42, with 9 minutes remaining, and the Orange and Blue cruised to a their fourth straight win and 2-0 start to Big Ten play.

Game 15 Recap – #10 Illinois 71, Michigan State 68

No. 10 Illinois fought off a late rally to secure a 71-68 home win over Michigan State at State Farm Center on Thursday night. Five Illini scored in double digits in the three-point win, including a career-high 15-point effort from **Ty Rodgers**.

Coleman Hawkins scored 15 points, his seventh consecutive game with 10-plus points, knocking down 3-of-5 3-pointers while also tacking on seven rebounds, two assists, and two steals, and matching his career high with four blocks.

Justin Harmon hit multiple 3-pointers (2-for-4) en route to 10 points, his fourth double-digit game of the season. **Harmon** also grabbed four rebounds and dished out two assists. **Marcus Domask** tallied 15 points to go along with six rebounds and five assists, while **Quincy Guerrier** added 10 points, six rebounds and a block for the Illini.

The Illini opened an 8-3 lead with six early points from **Rodgers**, who connected on his first five shots. A 7-0 Illini run over the course of 74 seconds then helped the Illini to push their lead to nine points midway through the first half before the Spartans battled back to cut the deficit to two. Illinois went into halftime holding on to a 37-34 lead.

Michigan State led by as many as six points, just more than 5 minutes into the second half before a **Domask** triple and back-to-back **Guerrier** buckets put the Illini back in front, 49-48 with 12 minutes left to play.

After Michigan State knotted the game at 52-52, a **Rodgers** dunk followed by **Hawkins'** second trey capped rounded out a 17-4 scoring stretch for the Illini over the span of five-and-a-half minutes. **Hawkins** splashed his third 3-pointer of the night one minute later to extend the Illini advantage to 62-54 at the 6:35 mark.

The Spartans cut their deficit to a single point, 65-64, with under two minutes to play, before the Illini closed out the game from at the charity stripe with **Domask** (4-for-4) and **Hawkins** (2-for-2) combining to drain all six of the attempts over the final 94 seconds of action.

Game 16 Recap – Maryland 76, #10 Illinois 67

No. 10 Illinois fell to Maryland, 76-67, at State Farm Center on Sunday afternoon.

The loss snaps Illinois' seven-game home win streak, and marks the team's first home loss to a Big Ten opponent since Jan. 19, 2023.

Luke Goode hit double figures for the fourth time this season, tallying 13 points. **Goode** knocked down his first three 3-point attempts of the afternoon, recording nine points within the first five minutes of action. He also grabbed six rebounds and one steal.

Marcus Domask finished with a team-high 26 points, his seventh consecutive outing in double digits. After leading the Illini with 13 points in the first half, **Domask** registered 13 points after the break. He also tacked on four rebounds.

Ty Rodgers matched his career-high assist mark with five. He notched an assist on four of the Illini's first five baskets of the contest, and he also ended his outing with five points, six rebounds, and one steal.

Coleman Hawkins amassed eight points, seven rebounds, two blocks, and one steal.

Maryland was led by Jahmir Young who posted 28 points, two shy of the season high allowed by the Illini defense, and 8 assists, the most by an opposing player this season

As a team, the Illini posted season lows in field goals made (21), field goal percentage (.328), assists (8), and second-half points (28), while the Terps poured in 30 field goals, a season-most for an Illinois opponent.

No. 14 Illinois used five scorers in double figures and a strong defensive performance to take down Michigan, 88-73, at Crisler Center on Thursday night.

Quincy Guerrier and **Coleman Hawkins** both registered a double-double in the win, the first Illini duo with double-doubles in a Big Ten road game since 2020. The victory marked Illinois' seventh consecutive over U-M.

Hawkins made plays on both ends of the court, recording his first double-double of the season with a game-high 21 points and 10 rebounds, plus six steals, four assists, one block, and zero turnovers. **Guerrier's** double-double of 16 points and 14 boards marked his sixth of the season. His also tied the team season high with six offensive rebounds.

Ty Rodgers tied his career-best with 15 points to go along with five rebounds, three assists and a career-high two blocks. **Marcus Domask** added 15 points, three rebounds, three assists, one block, and one steal, and **Justin Harmon** scored 11 points off the bench, while two rebounds and matching his season high with two steals.

The Illini totaled a season-high nine steals, and Illinois' 39-29 rebounding edge led to 16 second-chance points off 13 offensive boards. With a season-low six turnovers, the Illini trailed for only 23 seconds en route to their second Big Ten road win of the season.

Michigan scored the game's first points, but an 11-0 Illini run quickly put the Orange and Blue in control. The tightly contested first half ended with the Illini holding a 37-36 lead. But Illinois outscored Michigan 51-37 after the break to run away with the win.

Michigan briefly evened game at 38 early in the second before a 7-0 Illinois run put the Illini back in front for good. U-M later pulled within one point but the Illini responded with a 10-0 run to push the lead to 58-47 with 11:30 left. Following a pair of Michigan free-throws, the Orange and Blue rattled off another 7-0 run to extend their lead to 65-49 at the 8:19 mark of the second half.

Michigan would draw no closer than nine points for the remainder of the game before **Domask**, **Harmon**, and **Hawkins** combined to close out the win by knocking down all six of their free-throw attempts in the final 84 seconds.

No. 10 Illinois fell to Northwestern, 96-91, in overtime at Welsh-Ryan Arena on Wednesday night.

The Illini and Wildcats went blow-for-blow over the course of the game's first 40 minutes to the tune of 15 ties and 18 lead changes. But a 7-0 run by the host Wildcats to begin the overtime period proved too much for the Illini to overcome on the road.

Coleman Hawkins recorded his second double-double of the season, amassing a season-high 22 points and 13 rebounds. Hitting double figures for the 10th time in his last 11 games, Hawkins also notched a career-high seven offensive boards, two steals, and two blocks, his fifth game with multiple swats this season.

Game 20 Recap – #10 Illinois 70, Indiana 62

Scoring the final eight points of the contest, No. 10 Illinois fended off Indiana, 70-62, in front of an Orange and Blue-striped, sold-out State Farm Center crowd on Saturday. Four Fighting Illini scored in double figures, while nine Orange and Blue players contributing offensively in the eight-point home victory as Illinois returned to the win column.

Marcus Domask registered his second double-double of the season, pouring in a team-high 16 points and a season-high 10 rebounds. Domask secured his 11th consecutive outing in double-figures scoring and added a team-high four assists and one steal.

Luke Goode hit three 3-pointers and finished with 11 points, matching Coleman Hawkins, who also added seven rebounds, two blocks and two steals. Ty Rodgers did a little bit of everything in the victory, tallying eight points, five rebounds, two assists, two blocks, and one steal, and Terrence Shannon Jr. hit double figures for the 24th game in a row, recording 10 of his 12 points in the second half, including six points from the free-throw line in the final 63 seconds of action.

Illinois held Indiana without a 3-pointer, while the Illini also won the rebounding battle, 42-35. Taking advantage of 14 offensive rebounds, the Orange and Blue accumulated 13 second-chance points. The Illinois bench outscored the Indiana reserves, 21-2.

After Indiana jumped out to early 20-12 lead, Illinois began chipping away at its deficit throughout the first half, and eventually took a 38-34 halftime lead. The Illini defense stepped up its intensity over the course of the frame, racking up four steals and four blocks before the break.

Indiana came back to take a 49-42 lead at the 12:43 mark of the second half, but a Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn 3-pointer sparked a 9-0 Illinois run that put the Illini back in front, 51-49. Holding the Hoosiers without a field goal for nearly four minutes, the Illini saw their lead grow to five points, 57-52, via Goode's third 3-pointer of the day.

Two Shannon free throws put the Illini in front, 64-62, with 1:03 remaining. Shannon then hit four more key free-throws in the final 19 seconds to clinch the victory.
