# JUSTIN SPRING

## HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON



Justin Spring enters his second season at the helm and fifth season overall with the Illinois men's gymnastics program.

Following the 2009-10 season, Spring was named head coach for the Illinois men's gymnastics program after spending one year as an associate head coach. Spring handles all of the gym coaching duties along with assistant coaches Ivan Ivankov and 2010 graduate Luke Stannard.

In one season as associate head coach, Spring led Illinois to its second straight Big Ten team title and a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Individually, five Illini earned All-America accolades, three took home Big Ten titles and Stannard became

just the third Illini to win the prestigious Nissen-Emery Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top senior male gymnast.

Additionally, Spring helped guide Illinois to a 22-5 overall record and the top spot in the rankings on four separate occasions and never dropped out of the top five. For his efforts, Spring was honored as both Central Region Coach of the Year and Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Spring was promoted to associate head coach following the 2009 season after three years as an assistant under the legendary Yoshi Hayasaki. The promotion meant that Spring had to retire from competitive gymnastics to concentrate on coaching full time.

In 2009, Spring was named Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year along with Ivankov after helping Illinois to the Big Ten Championship, a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and three individual NCAA titles.

Spring, a former Illini standout, had an amazing year in 2008 that culminated with winning a bronze medal with Team USA at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Along with his teammates, Spring defied all odds as the U.S. men brought home the bronze medal and surprised everyone, except themselves.

Spring was spectacular in the team finals in leading the Americans to the improbable bronze. He scored 15.900 on vault in the second rotation, a team-leading 15.850 on parallel bars, a spectacular 15.675 on horizontal bar, along with 15.200 on floor exercise in the three-up, three-count format.

Spring's road to the Olympics was not an easy one to say the least. Plagued by injuries throughout his career, Spring battled through constant pain in hopes of accomplishing his lifelong dream of bringing home an Olympic medal. Less than a year before his Olympic appearance, Spring tore his ACL at the 2007 Visa Championships. However, he did not let the incident hamper his dreams. After making a speedy recovery, the Burke, Va., native headed to the 2008 Olympic Trials, where he was scheduled to compete on only four events due to a nagging ankle injury.

However, he knew he needed to do more in order to make the team. He needed to show the Olympic selection committee that he had the complete package they were looking for. With his dream on the line, Spring rolled the dice and made a last minute decision to add floor exercise to his competition events. Despite not practicing on the event in nearly two months, the gutsy move paid off as he posted a score of 15.200, the second highest score of the night.

After a second strong day of competition at the Olympic Trials, all Spring could do was wait. The Olympic team would be announced the next day. In the end, the decision to add floor proved to have a huge pay off, as Spring's name was one of the six announced to the team.

Spring, one of the most talented gymnasts in Illinois history, finished his collegiate career in 2006. He now looks to help lead the Orange and Blue to Big Ten and NCAA

Championship titles in his new role on the coaching staff.

In his first season as an assistant in 2007, Spring was instrumental in helping the Illini return to the NCAA Championships Super Six, as the Illini extended their streak of top-five finishes to five straight years with fifth-place finishes at NCAAs and Big Tens.

In 2008, Spring helped lead the Illini to a runner-up finish behind No. 1 Penn State at the Big Ten Championships. At the 2008 NCAA Championships, the Illini continued their success finishing third, their sixth consecutive top-five finish. The Illini brought home nine All-American honors with freshman Paul Ruggeri winning the national title on high bar, Illinois' first high bar champion since Spring in 2006.

Finishing his collegiate career in 2006, Spring strung together one of the best seasons in Illinois gymnastics' history. The season culminated with him earning the 2006 Nissen-Emery Award, an honor that goes to the top senior male gymnast in the nation. A double titlist at the 2006 NCAAs, Spring took home the crown on the high bar and defended his title on parallel bars. In addition, he carded five total All-America honors with a second-place finish in the all-around, third on floor exercise and fourth on vault.

Along with his individual honors, Spring helped the Illini to runner-up finishes at the 2006 NCAA and Big Ten Championships. The finish at NCAAs came less than a half-a-point shy of team-champion Oklahoma, and just short of the Orange and Blue's 10th national title.





Overall, the Burke, Va., native is a four-time NCAA Champion, winning a pair of titles on high bar in both 2004 and 2006 and back-to-back crowns on parallel bars in 2005 and 2006.

Along with his national recognition, Spring earned 2006 Big Ten Gymnast of the Year accolades after winning the all-around crown at Big Ten Championships. In all, Spring finished his illustrious career with three All-Big Ten first team honors, six Big Ten Gymnast of the Week laurels and three Inside Gymnastics' NCAA Gymnast of the Week honors.

During his four-year career, Spring garnered three Big Ten Championships with titles on parallel bars and all-around in 2006 and on the floor exercise in 2004. Spring is a two-time recipient of the Dike Eddleman Athlete of the Year award (2004, 2006), which goes to Illinois' top male and female athlete. A face and name that will forever be remembered in Illini record books, Spring left the Fighting Illini a 12-time All-American, the most since Abie Grossfeld earned 13 from 1957-59, and holds Illinois records on floor exercise, vault, parallel bars and high bar. Spring's success has extended far beyond his honors in collegiate competition, as he won the national title on parallel bars at the 2008 Visa Championships, his third overall honor. In 2005, Spring became the first Illini gymnast to win a National Title at the Visa Championships, winning the gold on high bar. With his two-day combined high bar score of 18.750, Spring took home the title on the event.

He competed at the 2007 World Cup meet in Moscow, taking home second on high bar at the event. The Illini great was chosen to the 2007 U.S. Pan American Games team, bringing home the United States' first gold medal at the games in 16 years when he claimed the crown on parallel bars. He also helped lead the U.S. team to a bronze medal finish at the Games hosted in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Spring then followed the performance with a stellar outing at the 2007 Visa U.S. Championships, where he collected his second U.S. title on high bar - first since 2005 - and was a silver medalist on floor exercise.

Spring is a five-time U.S. Senior National Team member after his fifth straight selection in 2008. Spring also represented the U.S. at the 2005 World Artistic Gymnastics Championships in Melbourne, Australia, on floor exercise, parallel bars and high bar. At the 2005 World Championships, Spring finished 10th to qualify as a reserve on high bar and finished 12th on parallel bars.

At the 2005 American Cup, Spring scored a 9.500 on high bar and brought home the silver medal behind only Olympic champion Paul Hamm.

The Illini gymnast finished fourth on the high bar at the 2004 Visa U.S. Championships and competed for Team USA at the 2003 World University Games in Daegu, South Korea, advancing to the finals on floor.

Spring graduated from the University of Illinois in 2006 with a bachelor's degree in speech communication and is currently pursuing his master's in recreation, sport and tourism. Spring and his wife, Tori, reside in Champaign, Ill.

# IVAN IVANKOV

## ASSISTANT COACH // THIRD SEASON



Ivan Ivankov is in his third season as an assistant coach for the Illinois men's gymnastics team.

In 2010, he was honored with his second straight Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year accolade for his role in helping guide the Orange and Blue to an 11-1 overall mark in the regular season and a second consecutive Big Ten title.

Following the 2009 season when he was a visiting assistant, he was promoted to assistant coach after helping Illinois to the Big Ten Championship, a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and three individual NCAA titles this season en route

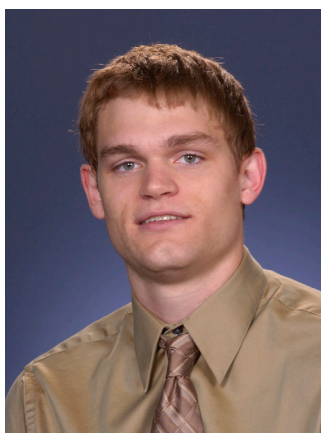
to earning Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors along with Justin Spring.

The 1994 and 1997 World All-Around Champion and two-time Olympian, Ivankov has spent the last five years as a men's team coach at the Bart Connor Gymnastics Academy in Norman, Okla. During his time there he was coach to Rohan Sebastian, a Level 10 gymnast representing Ireland at the 2007 Junior European championships in Lausanne, Switzerland.

One of the most accomplished gymnasts in the world over the last decade and a half, Ivankov won 10 World Championship medals, including three Gold. The Misk, Belarus, native competed at the 2000 Sydney and 2004 Athens Olympics. He retired from international competition in 2006 after competing at the World Championships. Ivankov achieved the highest athletic level "Master of Sport" in his native land.

# LUKE STANNARD

## ASSISTANT COACH // FIRST SEASON



Luke Stannard is in his first season as an assistant coach for the Illinois men's gymnastics team after completing a stellar collegiate career.

As a member of the Illinois men's gymnastics team from 2007-10, Stannard became the third Illini to win the prestigious Nissen-Emery Award, presented annually to the nation's top senior male gymnast. Also as a senior, he earned his first career All-America honor on pommel horse and set new career highs on all five events (FX, PH, VT, PB, HB) he competed on during the season.

In 2009, Stannard garnered All-Big Ten accolades after winning his first Big Ten title on pommel horse and followed it up with a gold-medal finish on pommel horse at the USA Gymnastics Visa Championships. Outside the gym, Stannard has excelled as well, as he is a three-time CGA All-America Scholar-Athlete and Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

In his senior season, the Waukegan, Ill., native also earned the Big Ten Distinguished Scholar award and the Fighting Illini Male Spirit award.

Brian Liscovitz is in his first season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Illinois men's gymnastics team.

As a member of the Illinois men's gymnastics team from 2007-10, Liscovitz was a significant contributor in the lineup all four years, mainly competing on parallel bars and high bar.

In 2008, Liscovitz earned his first career All-America honor on parallel bars, while in 2010, the Hillsborough, N.J., native earned All-Big Ten honors and was the team's recipient of the Big Ten Sportsmanship award.

Prior to his time at Illinois, Liscovitz was a three-time New Jersey state champion on parallel bars and two-time all-around champion. He also was a Junior Olympics All-American on parallel bars in 2006 and was the Junior Olympics National Champion on parallel bars in 2004.

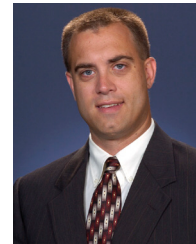

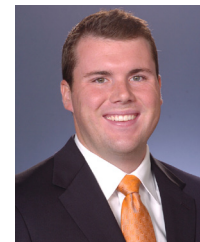

## 2011 SEASON PREVIEW



Seniors Chad Wiest, Kyle Moe, Paul Ruggeri, Daniel Ribeiro.

Head coach Justin Spring returns for his second season at the helm of Fighting Illini men's gymnastics and will look to guide his 2011 program to its third-straight Big Ten title and first NCAA title since 1989.

"I am really excited about the upcoming season," Spring said. "Our team is in a great position to do very well again. Our seniors have shown amazing leadership and competitive ability and they will lead this young team to another great season."

The talented cast of seniors, which includes Daniel Ribeiro, Paul Ruggeri and Chad Wiest, boasts several of the sports' top accolades including 10 NCAA and Big Ten individual titles and 11 All-America honors.

"Our senior class is small, but filled with huge scoring routines," Spring said.

"Daniel, Paul and Chad will contribute many of our top scores on nearly every event except rings. Between the three of them, they have the potential to take home NCAA individual titles on five events."

Ribeiro competed in every meet for the Illini and was dominant on pommel horse all season long. The Chestnut Ridge, N.Y., native collected his second Big Ten title on the event and followed it up with his first gold medal at the 2010 USA Gymnastics Visa Championships this past August. While seven of his career-high 10 individual titles came on pommel horse, Ribeiro also captured three on vault, including a first-place finish in his collegiate debut on the event.

Ruggeri continued to raise the bar for himself during the 2010 season, as the Manlius, N.Y., native won a team- and career-best 20 event titles on the year, in addition to attaining 29 top-three finishes, four school records (vault, parallel bars, high bar, all-around) under the FIG open ended code and four career-high scores on rings, vault, parallel bars and high bar.

In the offseason, Ruggeri has kept busy as a member of the U.S. Senior National team, earning five bronze medals competing at international events. Over the summer, Ruggeri helped lead the team to a third-place finish at the Japan Cup, before garnering an individual medal on high bar at the Moscow World Stars. Most recently, Ruggeri was one of three Americans to represent the U.S. at the Toyota Cup in Japan and the only one to medal, as he took third on floor and high bar.

After missing the entire 2009 season due to injury, Wiest made a strong return to the lineup in 2010. The Butler, Pa., native competed in all but one meet for the Illini and opened the season with a first-place finish on floor exercise at the Windy

City Invitational in his first meet back since breaking his arm at the 2008 Big Ten Championships. Wiest won three individual titles on floor and tied the NCAA season-best score with a career-high 16.100 on the event to close out the regular season, before he capped off the year with his second All-America accolade on floor. The junior class, led by 2010 All-Americans Tyler Mizoguchi and Anthony Sacramento and reigning Big Ten Parallel Bars Champion C.J. Padera, will look to continue its momentum from last season and make significant contributions on nearly every event in 2011.

"The junior class is big and loaded with talent," Spring said. "I expect big numbers from C.J. and Tyler on all events."

Mizoguchi put together a solid sophomore campaign for the Illini last season, as he earned his first-career All-America honor with a sixth-place finish in the all-around at the NCAA Championships and earned a spot on the U.S. Senior National team for the first time in his career after finishing ninth overall at the Winter Cup Challenge. The Houston, Texas, native set career highs on every event and recorded a career-best seven individual titles on the year, in addition to 21 top-three finishes.

Padera enjoyed a breakout season as well, highlighted by his first-ever Big Ten title on parallel bars and first-team All-Big Ten honors. The Winfield, Ill., native also set career highs on floor exercise, parallel bars and high bar, won a career-best five individual titles and posted 13 top-three finishes on the year.

Sacramento emerged last season as one of the top competitors on rings for the Illini, solidified by his first-career All-America accolade on the event and a second-place finish at the Big Ten Team Finals with a career-high score of 15.150. The Libertyville, Ill., native also won his first-ever individual event title and collected a trio of top-three finishes for the year.

Also representing the junior class on select events will be Kyle Moe (Champaign, Ill./Rings), Maxwell Portocarrero (Hampton Bays, N.Y./Floor, Rings) and Devin Regan (Libertyville, Ill./Rings, High Bar).

Redshirt sophomore Austin Phillips (Mahwah, N.J.) will make his return to the lineup after missing all of last season due to an ACL injury, while Malcolm Brown (Chicago, Ill.) and Yoshi Mori are back after finishing up their first season of collegiate competition.

“The sophomore class is small, but I expect great things from them,” Spring said. “Austin is looking better than ever. Malcolm’s pommel horse should be a factor and Yoshi’s ability to compete very well in the all-around will be huge for our team. However, Yoshi is coming back from surgery and will not be at full strength until late in the season.”

Mori quickly became a mainstay in the Illinois lineup and was rewarded with Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Year honors after claiming five individual event titles on the year and posting 12 top-three finishes. The Anaheim, Calif., native was selected Big Ten Freshman of the Week on four separate occasions and was a finalist for the Fighting Illini Male Newcomer of the Year award.

In one season of competition, Phillips competed in the all-around in four meets and captured four top-three finishes, while Brown saw action in two meets for the Illini in his debut season last year.

Six newcomers, including Andrew Margolis (Solon, Ohio), Chad Mason (Lake Balboa, Calif.), Cameron Rogers (Charlotte, N.C.), Cole Smith (Santa Rosa, Calif.), Jordan Valdez (Louisville, Colo.) and Alex Varga (Glen Ellyn, Ill.), will look to make an immediate impact in the lineup this season, as Spring expects each to contribute significantly on various events.

“For freshmen, adapting to the intense training and college lifestyle is tough,” Spring said. “We have a big, talented class and we will look for them to put up scores on all events. Many of them will not only break into the lineup, but will possibly contribute a huge score on a few of our events where we have less depth.”

Mason, Rogers and Valdez will work to compete in the all-around, while Margolis specializes on rings, Smith on floor, pommel horse and vault and Varga on floor, pommel horse, rings and vault.

Spring also made some additions to the coaching staff in the offseason, as recent graduates Luke Stannard and Brian Liscovitz will remain involved with the program on the coaching side this time around and will assist Spring and third-year assistant coach Ivan Ivankov in the gym.

“Luke has been an amazing addition to our coaching staff in the office,” Spring said. “His organization and experience with ‘mental training’ has been fantastic. With the big freshman class, Brian’s presence in the gym has been great and we are fortunate to have his help and extra energy.”

Projections thus far have the Illini ranked fourth nationally in the GymInfo Pre-season Coaches poll and second in the Big Ten preseason poll. Defending national champion Michigan and runner-up Stanford each received seven first-place votes, though Stanford edged the Wolverines for the top spot in the poll. Rounding out the top five was Oklahoma with two-first place votes and California in fifth. Michigan was picked first in the Big Ten.

This year’s regular-season schedule will pit the Illini against opponents previously only seen in the postseason, including meets against Oklahoma, Stanford, Nebraska and Air Force.

“I changed the schedule a lot this year in order to see some of the best teams in the country,” Spring said. “It will be nice to go head to head at least once before we see them at NCAAs, so we can see how we match up.”

Illinois’ first two regular-season competitions will take place on the road at the annual Windy City Invitational hosted by UIC in Chicago on Saturday, Jan. 15, followed by a tri-meet against Nebraska and Minnesota the following week in Minneapolis.

The Illini will face Iowa on Jan. 29 for their home debut and will also welcome Penn State on Feb. 19 and UIC on March 26 for Senior Day, before hosting the Big Ten Championships for the first time since 2004. The competition will take place April 1-2 at Huff Hall.

“Hosting the Big Ten Championships should give us a little bit of an advantage with not having to travel,” Spring said. “However, we were able to tie Michigan for the win at their place in 2009 and they will be a strong team again this year, so anything can happen.”

“As a team we need to improve on consistency. We could have won an NCAA Championship last year, but we missed several crucial routines in the team finals. We upgraded a lot of our difficulty last year and that was maybe why we had misses. We are more prepared this year and should be in a much better place to hit our harder routines.”

## 2010 SEASON REVIEW

It was quite an inaugural season for first-year associate head coach Justin Spring, as the former Illini standout helped guide the program to its second straight Big Ten title and final overall record of 22-5. Spring's gymnasts also earned numerous individual achievements, including the 2010 Nissen-Emerly Award, five All-America honors, four Big Ten titles and two U.S. National team selections.

Illinois checked in at No. 5 in the first national rankings of the year and early expectations projected the Illini to finish second in the Big Ten behind Michigan. They immediately silenced critics with a first-place finish at the 40th annual Windy City Invitational to open the 2010 season, and captured their first victory at the meet since 2005 with a score of 353.750 to top four other top-10 teams including Michigan, Ohio State, Iowa and Minnesota.

Illinois' winning performance was ultimately rewarded in the weekly GymInfo national rankings as its score held the top spot for the next two weeks. Following a rare bye week, the Illini's next stop was at fifth-ranked Ohio State, where they again took care of the Buckeyes, 349.700-341.350.

The Illini took the next weekend off from team competition while nine members of the squad, including seniors Brian Liscovitz, Luke Stannard and Tyler Williamson, juniors Daniel Ribeiro, Paul Ruggeri and Chad Wiest, sophomores Tyler Mizoguchi and C.J. Padera and freshman Yoshi Mori, traveled to Las Vegas to compete in the 2010 Winter Cup Challenge for a chance to earn a spot on the 15-member U.S. Men's Senior National team.

Six Illini advanced to the finals of the two-day event led by Mizoguchi who was the top finisher for Illinois in the performance-based points ranking system with 36 points. Stannard finished close behind with 32 points, followed by Wiest (28), Ribeiro (20) Ruggeri (19) and Padera (14). Ultimately just two Illini would make the final cut however, as Mizoguchi and Ruggeri were named to the U.S. Senior National team for the first time in their careers after finishing in the top 10 in the national team selection points program.

The Illini were victorious in their home opener the following weekend against Minnesota and kept the hot streak going over the next month with road wins at Penn State, UIC and Iowa to set up a showdown with Michigan, which also was undefeated in the Big Ten. Despite tallying their highest score of the season up to that point, the Illini suffered their first loss of the year to the Wolverines by a single point, 359.650-358.650 at Huff Hall.

In the regular-season finale against UIC, the Illini closed out the year at home on a high note and rebounded with dominating performances and a new season-best score (362.250) to build up momentum heading into the postseason.

Illinois entered the Big Ten Championships ranked first in the team standings and in the top two on five events and that was exactly how the team finals played out, as the Illini captured their second straight conference title and 25th in school history, the most among any Big Ten school. Additionally, Spring, who was later named Big Ten Coach of the Year, became the first Illinois men's gymnastics coach to win the Big Ten title in his first season at the helm.

The battle between Illinois and rival Michigan, which were crowned co-Big Ten Champions last season after tying with a final score of 357.100, remained close throughout the night at St. John Arena in Columbus, Ohio, as the Wolverines held the slightest of margins heading into the final two rotations. Sophomore Anthony Sacramento posted a season-high score on rings to pull the Orange and Blue within 1.85 of first place, and in the final rotation on vault, the team tallied its third-best score of the season, led by Ruggeri's first-place finish on vault to overcome the deficit and claim the title with a final team score of 359.700.

Of the 10 Illini that qualified for the Individual Event Finals the following night, three took home Big Ten titles as Ruggeri won on vault and high bar for the first time in his career, Ribeiro captured his second-career pommel horse title and Padera secured the first Big Ten title of his career on parallel bars. It was the second straight year the Illini have tallied at least three individual event titles.

All three event winners earned first-team All-Big Ten accolades, while Liscovitz garnered second-team honors for the first time in his career after finishing in second place on parallel bars and newcomer Mori secured co-Freshman of the Year honors.

With a No. 1 national ranking and momentum heading into the NCAA Championships held in West Point, N.Y., the Illini were intent on bringing home the elusive national title. The week of NCAAs got off to a solid start, as Stannard became just the third Illini to win the prestigious Nissen-Emerly Award at the NCAA banquet on the night prior to the start of competition. The award is presented annually to the nation's top senior male gymnast and honors excellence in gymnastics, good sportsmanship and fair play and a high standard of scholarship throughout his collegiate career.

Stannard joined David Zeddies (1989) and Spring (2006) as the only Illini to win the award since its inception in 1966. Additionally, Illinois swept Central Region Coach of the Year honors for the second straight year, as Spring took home Coach of the Year and Ivan Ivankov earned his second consecutive Assistant Coach of the Year accolade.

It was back to business the following afternoon, as the Illini advanced to the "Super Six" team final for the eighth straight year with a second-place finish (354.050) in the afternoon qualifying session behind defending national champion Stanford (359.000).

Illinois struggled in the team finals the following night, due in large part to a shaky start that involved one of the stranger occurrences in men's gymnastics. During just the second rotation for the Illini, the left ring broke shortly after the start of Williamson's routine that resulted in a lengthy delay to replace the broken ring.

Despite the team's best efforts, Illinois ultimately finished in fourth place (354.900) behind Michigan (360.500), Stanford (359.800) and Oklahoma (357.050), while individually, seven Illini qualified for event finals and Mizoguchi placed sixth in the all-around to earn his first All-America honor.

Three more Illini garnered first-career All-America accolades at the Individual Event Finals the next night, including Williamson and Sacramento on rings and Stannard on pommel horse, while Wiest captured his second All-America honor on floor. Illinois has had at least one All-American the last 11 years, in addition to eight straight years with at least five.

The season was capped off the following weekend at the team's annual awards banquet, where Stannard took home Most Valuable honors. Wiest was tabbed Most Outstanding and Most Improved along with junior Kyle Moe and earned the team's Scholar-Athlete Award, while Ribeiro was the recipient of the Fighting Illini Attitude Award and Padera earned the Yoshi Hayasaki Award for consistency.

Newcomer Yoshi Mori collected Co-Freshman of the Year honors with Penn State's Felix Aronovich and first-year associate head coach Justin Spring was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in his first season at the helm for Illinois men's gymnastics.
