SCENE SETTER

» Florida Gulf Coast men's basketball is set to face its first power conference opponent of the season when it travels to No. 17 Illinois on Friday night.






» FGCU enters off a 96-60 win over New College (FL) in its season opener. Five players scored in double-digits, led by Rahmir Barno's 14 points.

» The Eagles will play a Big 10 team for the first time since Dec. 9, 2023, when they lost 77-55 to Minnesota in Minneapolis. It's FGCU's first trip to the state of Illinois since Nov. 13, 2021, when the Eagles fell 77-89 to Loyola Chicago in a true road game.

NOTE OF THE NIGHT

» The Eagles are 1-14 all-time against Big 10 opponents, with the lone win a 74-61 triumph at USC on Nov. 7, 2022. While the Trojans had not formally moved to the Big 10 at that point, they had announced their intention to do so a few months prior. FGCU is 6-51 against power conference (SEC, Big 10, Big 12, ACC, Big East) opponents all-time. Illinois marks the 9th unique Big 10 opponent and 38th unique power conference opponent in program history.

DOMINANT ON THE GLASS

» The Eagles controlled the glass against New College to the tune of 59 rebounds, setting the single-game program record for rebounds in a regulation game. The only time in the Division I era of FGCU men's basketball that the team had more was 61 rebounds in a triple overtime victory over Youngstown State on Nov. 21, 2015. No Eagle had double-digit rebounds, but JR Konieczny, Tristen Guillouette and Michael Duax all tied for the team lead with eight boards, and six Eagles had more than five rebounds. The +24 rebound margin is FGCU's best since matching that total on Nov. 21, 2021 against Eckerd. The 25 team offensive rebounds, led by Konieczny's seven, enters a four-way tie for the program record for offensive rebounds in a single game, matching the total against both Eckerd and the Penguins, along with 25 against Ave Maria on Nov. 29, 2015. Konieczny's seven offensive rebounds are a career high and Guillouette's five offensive rebounds tied his best outing.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

» FGCU is the only school in the country with three sets of brothers between the student-athletes and coaching staff. JR and Chase Konieczny & George III and BB Washington are 2 of 16 sibling duos on the same team in Division I basketball. Only Oakland (Nassim and Hamoudy Mashhour & twins Donny and MJ Yeager) also has a pair of siblings on their roster. Assistant coaches Ryan and Will Chlebek move FGCU to the nation-leading three sets of brothers in the program.

» Illinois is the only school on the Eagles' schedule that also has a set of brothers on the roster in twins Tomislav and Zvonimir Ivisic, and Florida is the only other school in Florida with a sibling duo on the roster (Isaiah and AJ Brown); though FAU (also on the Eagles' schedule) has a sibling pair split between its coaching staff and roster in Demond (coach) and Josiah Parker (student-athlete).

CHAMBERS EXTENDED

» Florida Gulf Coast University Director of Athletics Colin Hargis announced a contract extension for FGCU men's basketball head coach Pat Chambers on Thursday, Oct. 30.

» Chambers inked a three-year extension which will see him under contract with the Eagles through the 2029 season. Chambers' 2025 recruiting class was among the best in FGCU history. His energy and experience have helped guide the Eagles to postseason success, while building a culture of toughness and accountability.

ALICO ADD-ONS

» "We're committed to constantly improving the fan experience at Alico Arena," said FGCU Director of Athletics Colin Hargis. "These upgrades reflect our dedication to making every game special, from the moment fans step through the doors to the final buzzer."

» Among the most noticeable upgrades are new integrated light-show effects, spotlights, and fog machines that will bring a new level of energy and spectacle to introductions and in-game presentations.

» Fans will also notice signage and aesthetic updates throughout Alico Arena. Those upgrades include improvements in the lobby, suite areas, and the Hillmeyer-Tremont Suite, all reinforcing the modern, vibrant look of the arena. In addition, concession areas have been enhanced with improved service options and the introduction of local Riptide Brewery selections.

SCOUTING THE ILLINI

» Illinois enters off a 113-55 home rout of Jackson State. Tomislav Ivisic and Ben Humrichous scored 21 points each, and David Mirkovic posted a 19 point, 14 rebound double-double.

» The Illini shot a scalding 17-37 from beyond the arc and 54.8% from the field, as all five starters scored in double-digits in the wire-to-wire win. Illinois is looking to start 2-0 or better for the seventh straight season under head coach Brad Underwood.

RAHMIR BARNO

» Barno missed nearly six weeks and nine games in the spring with a wrist injury. Now fully healthy, the Eagles have their junior point guard ready to lead the squad in 2025-26.

» The longest tenured player on the roster (three seasons), Barno has gone against the "modern" grain and hasn't entered the transfer portal in search of greener grass elsewhere, instead choosing to plant roots in Fort Myers and with head coach Pat Chambers, who affectionately refers to him as a "dinosaur" for sticking with FGCU through thick and thin.

JR KONIECZNY

» Konieczny was perhaps Chambers' most notable transfer addition ahead of the 2025-26 season, as JR headed south from Notre Dame to join the Eagles with his younger brother, Chase.

» In his final season at Notre Dame, he averaged 16.2 minutes, 4.3 points and 2.8 rebounds per game, primarily off the bench. The South Bend native shot 39.7% from the field and 77.3% from the free throw line for the Irish. Konieczny was on the Notre Dame roster in 2021-22 when the Irish faced Illinois, but didn't play in the game.

ISAIAH MALONE

» Malone transferred to Florida Gulf Coast ahead of the 2025-26 season from NAIA Saint Francis, Indiana – not to be confused with St. Francis (PA) which is in the process of reclassifying from Division I to Division III. The forward will strive to emulate his older brother Elijah's path, as the elder Malone transferred from Grace College to Colorado, where he is currently playing his second graduate season for the Buffs after leading them in field goal percentage during the 2024-25 season.

» The junior was dominant in the paint in his 13 minutes against New College, scoring 10 to go with seven rebounds and four blocks. He's set for a significantly tougher test against Illinois' Ivisic brothers on Friday.

MICHAEL DUAX

» Duax returns for his second year on the beach as the Eagles' leading producer in nearly every stat category following the departure of the four other regular FGCU starters. The Dubuque, Iowa native will serve as one of the on-court and vocal leaders for the Eagles all season long.

» Duax is the Eagles' leading returner in: Starts, Minutes, Scoring, FGM, FGA, FTM, FTA, O-Rebounds, D-Rebounds, Total Rebounds & Steals (totals listed below).

GEORGE WASHINGTON III

» One of the best names in college basketball is poised for a breakout season on the beach. Washington III arrives at FGCU after stops at Michigan and Richmond, and joins his brother, BB Washington, on the FGCU roster.

» Both Washington III and the coaching staff hope he's found the right fit in Fort Myers, and it showed in the season opener, as the junior took a team-high 11 shots from the field and led the defense with three steals. He was one of five Eagles to score in double digits in the win. He is also the only current Eagle to appear in a game against the Illini (at Michigan, twice, '23-24).

RORY STEWART

» Stewart returns for his second year in Fort Myers as one of the four seniors on the squad. The London native excelled from behind the arc in his first year at FGCU, knocking down triples at a 40.4% clip.

» Stewart will aim to provide veteran leadership alongside JR Konieczny and Duax, and to reprise his role as a 3-point knockdown shooter in 2025-26.

TRISTEN GUILLOUETTE

» Guillouette, alongside his frontcourt mate in Isaiah Malone, will attempt to help FGCU collectively fill the hole left by First Team All-ASUN selection Keshawn Kellman.

» The Willingboro, New Jersey, native stands at 6'10 and had 16 blocks in 2024-25 playing behind Kellman at the five. Look for his role to expand as the tallest player on the roster and the likely rim protector.

DARREN WILLIAMS

» Williams appeared in 28 games as a true freshman, averaging 7.4 minutes per game, 1.0 rebounds, and 2.1 points per game. One of the five players from Pennsylvania, and one of the three from Philadelphia, expect Williams to take a step forward in 2025-26.

JACK REDDICK

» Reddick played in 24 games as a true freshman, averaging 0.8 points and 1.3 rebounds in 7.9 minutes per game.

» Reddick had 23 assists and seven steals and recorded multiple assists in three games. Anticipate the sophomore to tally minutes as a backup point guard and look to emphasize the facilitation of FGCU's offense, along with his own production from behind the arc.

JORDAN ELLERBEE

» Ellerbee joins FGCU as part of the highly touted freshman class that also includes Matt McCarthy, Chase Konieczny and Gabe Tanner. The 6'2 Philadelphia native will look to contribute immediately as a part of the guard rotation.

» In his first career outing, Ellerbee scored seven, grabbed four rebounds and had two steals in 19 minutes played.

DEPARTING VS. RETURNING PRODUCTION

» FGCU will be forced to replace four starters from its 2024-25 squad with the graduation of Keeshawn Kellman, Dallion Johnson, and Zavian McLean. The Eagles also saw guard Javian Muniz transfer to Colorado State after the season, and Xavier Pina, Cameron Codio and Blake Vespe departed after not recording any minutes throughout the season.

» Kellman was selected to the All-ASUN 1st Team, while Johnson earned 2nd Team All-ASUN honors. Additionally, both Kellman and Muniz eclipsed the 1,000 point mark during the season.

DEPARTING VS. RETURNING PRODUCTION, PART 2

» The upperclassmen quartet accounted for a majority of the Eagles' production in every stat category except for steals. As a group, the departees represented:

DEPARTING VS. RETURNING PRODUCTION, PART 4

» Individually, the only stat category where one of the quartet also didn't have the team-best mark was also steals. Barno had 35 despite missing nine games due to injury, and Duax led the squad with 37.

» The departing quartet represented the top four FGCU players in games started, minutes played, field goals made & attempted, points scored and points per game.

» The departing quartet comprised three of the top four FGCU players in 3-pointers made & attempted (Stewart, not Kellman), free throws made & attempted (Duax, not Johnson), offensive rebounds (Duax, not Johnson), and total rebounds (Duax, not Johnson).

DEPARTING VS. RETURNING PRODUCTION 5

» Guilouette shot 60.8% from the field in 2024-25, but Kellman posted a 59.8% shooting season on significantly higher volume, and Zavian McLean knocked down 54.4% of his shots. Johnson buried 104 3-pointers at a 36.7% clip, totaling approximately 40% of the Eagles' made triples by himself.

» At the free throw line, Johnson and Muniz were the FGCU staples, hitting shots from the charity stripe at 83.3 and 77.8%, respectively. Kellman hit just 58.3% of his free throws, and McLean only knocked down 63.8% of his. Only Duax (69.1%) and Barno (74.4%) return with more than 40 free throw attempts from 2024-25.

THE ROAD TO ONE IS DONE

» Dwyer has gained local and national notoriety on social media for his "Road to One (Point)" series, and he finally accomplished his goal in FGCU's home opener against New College. Dwyer ended his "Road to One" by drilling a wing 3-pointer with 2:49 to play. He would hit another triple two possessions later. The crowd had chanted the FGCU social media star's name for several minutes before he entered the game and missed the first shot he took.

» "It's been a long journey, it's my fifth year in college and my teammates call me 'Unc'," Dwyer said after the game. "It's definitely nice to have that weight lifted off my shoulders."

» "It's pretty surreal, especially when coach calls me in and I go to the table and all the fans are going crazy. It gets my adrenaline going, it gets my blood pumping, it gets me feeling good. I know all my teammates, they want to see me succeed. They're always telling me 'I'm looking for you.' The first shot, I missed a little bit left, but they all told me back at the free throw line 'shoot

the next one, you've got it"

"When the first one went through, it definitely felt pretty cool. I don't really know how to describe that feeling, I don't even know what celebration I did, but it was really cool. Then when the second one went in, (freshman guard) Matt McCarthy gave me a great extra pass, unselfish guy. He was open but he wanted to see if I could make another one and I did. That shows a lot about him and that shows a lot about our team, that we all want to see each other succeed."

» His 2.2 million followers – 1.3M on TikTok, 530K on Instagram, and 341K on YouTube – figuratively broke the internet, and the 2,410 in Alico did break the arena's internet immediately after he hit the shot. Since, Dwyer has been featured in The Athletic/New York Times, on Front Office Sports, on the social media of ESPN, Bleacher Report, NCAA March Madness and more. Kendrick Perkins, among others, reached out to congratulate him on accomplishing his goal.

BIRDS OF PREY ABOUND

» FGCU has the unique distinction of playing three of the four schools with the "Owl" nickname in the 2025-26 season in Kennesaw State, Rice and FAU. The only "Owls" that FGCU will not play in the 2025-26 regular season is Temple. Interestingly, three Eagles are Philadelphia natives (Barno, Williams and Ellerbee), McCarthy and head coach Pat Chambers are both from Philadelphia suburbs, and FGCU has more players from Pennsylvania (5) than any other state. Zero Eagles are native to Oklahoma or Georgia, though BB Washington claims Houston as his hometown.

» Not only do the Eagles play three of the four Owl schools, they do it in a 13-day span from Nov. 25 to Dec. 7.

» The Eagles also face off with a pair of other Eagles – the Eagles of Georgia Southern and the Golden Eagles of Oral Roberts; and will have the annual ASUN Birds of Prey meeting with a home-and-home with the North Florida Ospreys.

» Elite men's and women's college basketball action takes center stage in the City of Palms during Thanksgiving Week when the inaugural Coconut Hoops tips off beginning Monday, Nov. 24 at FGCU's Alico Arena. Veteran promoter bdG Sports announced event details, including both fields Tuesday. The event formerly known as the Gulf Coast Showcase was played at Hertz Arena the past 12 seasons. "We have had terrific success in Fort Myers since 2013, highlighted by the very best women's teams, including UConn, South Carolina and Iowa, men's champions like FGCU and Houston, and superstars like A'ja Wilson and Caitlin Clark, but now we have an opportunity to elevate the event even further with our move to Alico Arena," said Brooks Downing, founder and president of bdG Sports, the event organizer. "FGCU owns a terrific venue for basketball, and I want to thank Director of Athletics Colin Hargis for sharing the vision of playing host to what will become one of the best events in the sport."

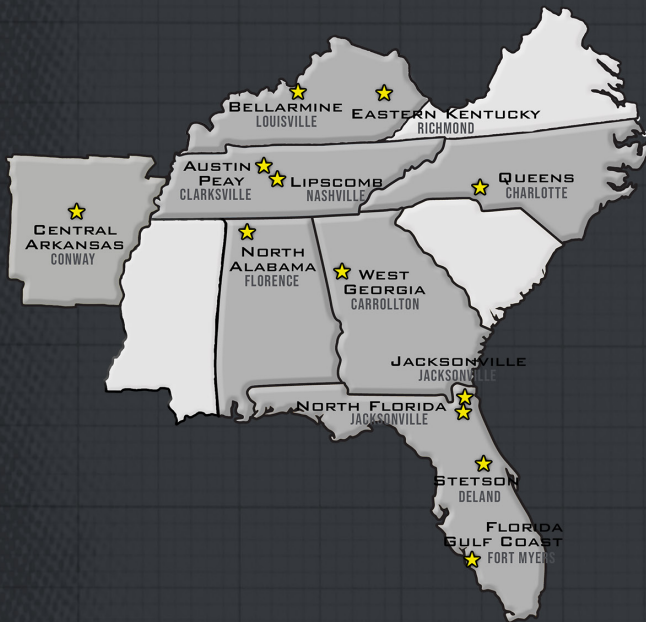

THE CHAMBERS FILE



Pat Chambers enters his fourth season as the head men's basketball coach at Florida Gulf Coast University. He enters his 15th season as a head coach with an overall record of 231-226* (.505). Chambers became the fifth head coach in the history of the FGCU men's basketball program when he took the reins of the program.

In 2024-25, FGCU went 19-15 (13-5 Atlantic Sun), good for a third place regular season finish in the conference. Wins over in-state foes FIU (at home) and FAU (in Boca Raton) highlighted the nonconference slate before the Eagles turned up the intensity in January, going 7-2 in the month. Chambers added a pair of players to his growing list of all-conference student-athletes in First Team All-ASUN selection Keeshawn Kellman and Second Team All-ASUN honoree Dallion Johnson. FGCU took a win in the program's first ever College Basketball Invitational (CBI) tournament appearance with a 68-65 victory over Army in Daytona Beach.

In his second season at the helm, Chambers led the Eagles to a tie for sixth in the Atlantic Sun Conference regular season standings with an 8-8 league record. The Eagles would also pick up a 24-point win over ASUN champion Stetson on Jan.

20, 2024. FGCU closed the regular season with three-straight league wins, topping Queens at home, then beating North Florida and Jacksonville on the road. Zach Anderson was named Third Team All-ASUN, with Rahmir Barno named to the ASUN All-Freshman Team. Anderson also picked up ASUN Player of the Week honors during the season, with Dallion Johnson and Keeshawn Kellman earning ASUN Newcomer of the Week recognition.

Strong results in the classroom were seen right off the jump in 2022-23 for Chambers as Isaiah Thompson was named to the ASUN All-Academic Team in addition to earning ASUN Third Team All-Conference honors. Thompson led the Eagles in scoring, averaging 14.9 points per contest, while handing out a team-best 103 assists. He did that while majoring in organizational leadership at FGCU while carrying a 3.8 GPA.

The Eagles would go 17-15 in Chambers' first year leading the program. One of the highlights of the season included winning the 2022 Gulf Coast Showcase at Hertz Arena, defeating Northern Kentucky, Drexel, and Kansas City en route to the title.

Chambers spent nine years leading the Penn State (2011-20) program and two years as head coach at Boston University (2009-11). He has 190 career victories as a head coach in that span including four 20-plus win seasons. Part of his career as a head coach was highlighted by leading the Nittany Lions to a No. 9 national ranking in 2019-20 which tied the program's best-ever ranking set in 1996.

"The passion and drive from everyone involved with the process kept getting me more and

more excited to be here. I have to thank everyone at La Salle – Director of Athletics Brian Baptiste, Head Coach Ashley Howard, the staff, and the players – I am so grateful for all of you. I would not be here if it weren't for all the hard work of my former players and staff at each stop of my journey as well. Most importantly of all, I can't thank my wife Courtney and our children enough for allowing me to continue to live the dream of doing what I love. Their love, support, sacrifice, and resilience means the world to me during the crazy adventure."

In addition to his head coaching experience, Chambers has served in various capacities with three different programs. At Villanova, he started with the Wildcats in 2004 as the Director of Operations before being elevated to Assistant Coach (2006-08) and then Associate Head Coach (2008-09). He started his coaching career at Delaware Valley College in 1995-96 and most recently served as an assistant coach at La Salle.

At Penn State, he led the Nittany Lions to 148 wins during his nine year tenure which included 18 ranked wins and 56 Big Ten wins which are the most for a head coach in program history. His 148 wins rank as the fifth-most for a head coach at PSU. During the 2019-20 campaign, he was a Naismith Coach of the Year candidate after the Nittany Lions spent 10 weeks ranked in the top 25 and had its highest-ever NET ranking at No. 15. He had a pair of 20-win seasons in Happy Valley after going 26-13 in 2017-18 en route to winning the NIT Championship and 21-10 in 2019-20 before the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Before joining PSU, he spent two years with Boston University leading the Terriers to a 42-28 record. In 2010-11, he led BU to an America East Conference Championship and the Terriers' first berth to an NCAA Tournament since 2002. In 2009-10, BU was also 21-14 and reached the CBI Semifinal in the postseason. He was the fastest coach in program history to earn a conference championship and the only BU coach to earn 20 wins in each of his first two seasons.

During his tenure at Villanova, Chambers was part of a staff that helped the Wildcats to a tremendous five-year stretch that included a Final Four (2009), two Sweet Sixteens (2005, 2008), an Elite Eight appearance (2006), and reaching the second round (2007). In 2008-09 as the Associate Head Coach, Chambers helped Villanova to a 30-8 overall record and the No. 3 recruiting class in the country. All told, during his time with Nova, the Wildcats were 126-45 including the program's single-season win record of 30-8 in 2008-09.

Along with his service under the mentorship of Villanova head coach Jay Wright, the Newtown Square, Pa., native played for Naismith Hall of Fame coach Herb Magee while a student-athlete at Philadelphia University. Magee continues to rank as the second all-time winningest men's basketball head coach behind Duke's Mike Krzyzewski.

Chambers began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Delaware Valley College in 1995-96. After taking a break to work in the family business, he return to coaching in 1999 as the top varsity assistant coach at Episcopal Academy through 2004.

A standout guard under Magee at Philadelphia University, Chambers graduated from the university in 1994 with a degree in marketing and a minor in finance. He joined the NCAA Division II university's basketball team as a walk-on in 1990 and went on to have an outstanding career, becoming the team's starting point guard, earning first-team All-ECAC honors and leaving as the school record holder in assists with 709. Chambers helped lead the Rams to four NCAA Division II Sweet 16 appearances and two Elite Eight appearances.

Chambers and his wife, Courtney, have four children, Grace, Ryan, Caitlin, and Patrick.

ASSISTANT COACHES

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH KYLE GRIFFIN



Kyle Griffin will enter his fourth season overall with FGCU, and third season as associate head coach for the FGCU men's basketball team in 2025-26. Griffin became associate head coach for the Eagles in 2023-24. Prior to FGCU, he served four years at La Salle – including two years as associate head coach on the Explorers sideline. "Kyle is loyal, hard-working and passionate about our program and players," Chambers said. "He carries a tremendous basketball IQ and is a relentless recruiter. We are fortunate to have a coach of his caliber on the FGCU staff, and his future is very bright in the game." In the summer of 2024, Griffin was selected to participate in the 2024 TopConnect Basketball Symposium in Las Vegas, Nevada. The program identifies the top assistant basketball coaches in the country and connects them with mid-major Athletic Directors, providing tremendous networking and leadership development opportunities for both parties.

ASSISTANT COACH DJ IRVING

DJ Irving joined FGCU men's basketball in June 2025 and serves as an assistant coach. A two-year captain at Boston University for Pat Chambers, Irving spent four years in Coral Gables, Fla., with the University of Miami prior to FGCU. In May 2023, following his second season with the Hurricanes, Silver Waves Media tabbed Irving to its list of the 50 Most Impactful High-Major Assistants in the nation. Miami won 77 games in his four years on the bench with the Hurricanes. In 2022-23, Irving assisted the team to its best campaign ever. The Hurricanes reached the Final Four for the first time, won a share of the ACC regular season championship and finished the year 29-8 (15-5 ACC). They finished a program-best third in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll and set or tied school records in overall, ACC, regular season (24), home (16), top-25 (seven), top-10 (three) and top-five (two) victories, claiming the Midwest Regional title. During his first year at The U, Irving helped Miami to another one of its best seasons ever.

ASSISTANT COACH DOMINIC MORRIS



Dominic Morris joined FGCU men's basketball in June 2025 and serves as an assistant coach. Prior to FGCU, Morris went from professional basketball to corporate America. He joined Webster Bank as a Portfolio Manager, where he managed a \$2B+ client portfolio on a property management team. He became known for leading strategic planning sessions, building strong client relationships, and representing the bank at major industry events across the Northeast. These experiences sharpened his skills in leadership, communication, and relationship-building — the same tools he now applies to recruiting, mentoring, and player development at FGCU. Morris played professionally overseas for ten seasons, competing at the highest levels across Romania, Argentina, Switzerland, Ukraine, Belgium, France, Finland, and Israel. His journey culminated in a Swiss League Championship in 2021, cementing his status as a winner and veteran leader. A Penns Grove, N.J., native, Morris was raised in Newark, Delaware.

CHIEF OF STAFF DAVID CAPORALETTI



David Caporaletti continued his longtime relationship alongside head coach Pat Chambers when he was named Assistant to the Head Coach at FGCU in July 2022. The duo have known and worked with each other since attending Philadelphia University in the early 1990's. Prior to FGCU, Caporaletti spent 10 seasons as a member of the Penn State basketball staff where he served as the program's director of player development. The Philadelphia native was responsible for the implementation of schedules and programs to promote student-athlete success. He also oversaw the scheduling of team events, equipment ordering and distribution, and overall program advancement initiatives. During the summer 2020, Caporaletti met the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic with innovative solutions and collaboration with the basketball staff and colleagues across Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics. From 2015-17, Caporaletti served as the program's director of operations.

ASSISTANT COACH RYAN CHLEBEK



Ryan Chlebek joined FGCU men's basketball in May 2025 and serves as an assistant coach. At FGCU, he assists & runs skill development workouts, helps with recruiting and scouting reports, as well as other duties assigned by head coach Pat Chambers. Prior to FGCU, Chlebek had a short stint at Palm Beach Atlantic University serving as the lead assistant coach in 2025. Before PBA, Chlebek served as an assistant coach at Florida College while achieving a 28-5 record in 2024. The Falcons were crowned CAC conference champions and made the second round of the national tournament. Chlebek recruited several incoming players at Florida College, most noticeably, NAIA All American - Tyshon Judge and All Conference Nominee Deonte' Martinez. Prior to Florida College, Chlebek was an assistant at Ave Maria University. In his four seasons, the Gyrenes stacked 3 straight twenty win seasons. He and his brother, Will, are both on the FGCU staff.

ASSISTANT COACH WILL CHLEBEK



Will Chlebek joined FGCU Men's Basketball in July 2024 as an assistant coach. In this role, he assists with film operations for practices and games, manages travel logistics, and supports the day-to-day operations of the program. He is also involved in on-court workouts with the team's players. Chlebek earned his undergraduate degree from FGCU in 2023. During his time as a student, he served as a student manager for head coach Pat Chambers in his first year with the program. After graduating, Chlebek transitioned to a graduate assistant position at Southwestern Community College (SWCC) in Creston, Iowa, starting in August 2023. At SWCC, his responsibilities included assisting with program logistics, developing scouting reports, and facilitating on-court workouts. During his one year with the program, SWCC achieved its highest win total since 2017.
