- One of four schools nationally with seven straight 20-win regular seasons
- Six straight NCAA Tournament appearances (*seventh precluded by COVID-19 cancelation in 2020*)
- One of 10 schools to appear in each of the last six NCAA Tournaments
- NCAA Tourney wins in four of the previous five years
- 2024 NCAA Elite Eight; Illinois' first appearance since advancing to 2005 national title game
- 2021 NCAA Tourney No. 1 seed (*fourth in school history*)
- 96 wins in Big Ten play since 2019-20, the most in school history over a seven-year period
- Only team with winning Big Ten record in each of the last seven seasons
- Five Top-25 finishes in last seven years, including two in the Top 10
- Five All-Americans (*three consensus*)
- 22 All-Big Ten selections (*eight first team*)
- 2024 Big Ten Tournament Champions

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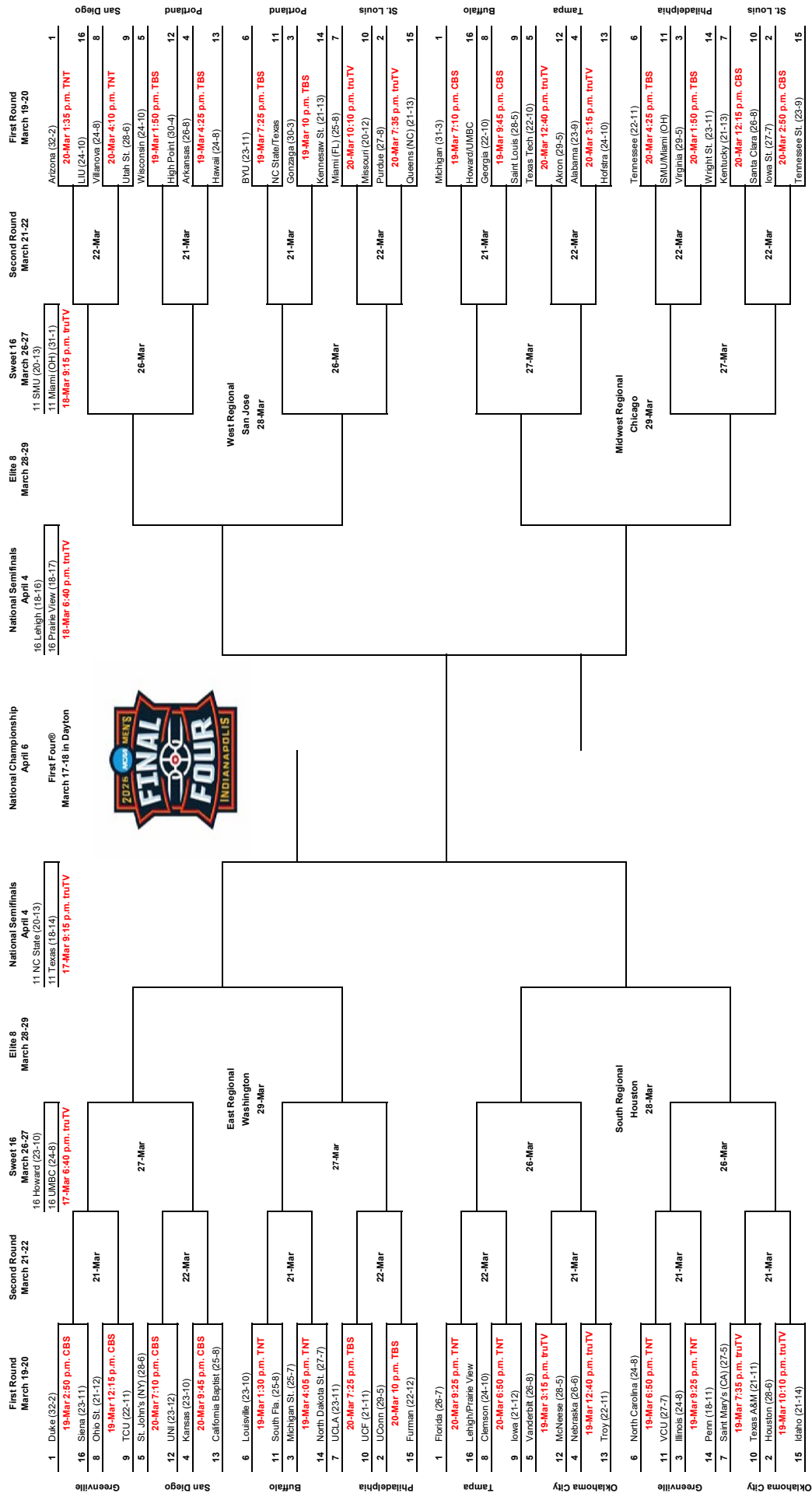
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2026 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship

WAGLER'S WORLD

- Illini star **Keaton Wagler's** rapid ascent during his freshman season has been remarkable for an unheralded recruit. Now contending for All-America honors, the Shawnee, Kansas native was ranked 150th by 247Sports and 179th by Rivals in the Class of 2025, and he had just two high-major offers before committing to the Fighting Illini.
- **Wagler** has earned the following All-America accolades: Bleacher Report-First Team, The Sporting News-Second Team, and Field of 68-Second Team. He also one of five finalists for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.
- **Wagler** is First-Team All-Big Ten and Big Ten Freshman of the Year from three separate votes: the conference coaches, media covering the league, and the Associated Press. In addition, he was a unanimous pick by the league coaches to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- **Wagler** is on the Wooden Award National Ballot (Top 15) and part of the Naismith Trophy Late-Season Team.
- **Wagler** is No. 7 in the kenpom national player of the year standings, and ranks second nationally among players with at least 24% possessions used with an offensive rating at 131.3.
- In what is being recognized as one of the most talented freshman classes in college basketball history, **Wagler** is one of only two high major first-year players in the nation averaging at least 17.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 4.0 assists on the season, along with Duke's Cameron Boozier.
- Since moving to the point at the start of December, **Wagler** is averaging 19.4 points, 4.7 rebounds and 5.2 assists over the last 24 games on 45.0% shooting, 41.6% from three, and 80.4% at the foul line.
- **Wagler** has scored in double figures in each of the last 24 games, and team-leading 29 times on the season.
- **Wagler** ranked fifth in the Big Ten in scoring during conference play, averaging 19.9 points.
- **Wagler** ranks sixth in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal shooting at 40.2% (74-184).
- **Wagler** has nine 20+-point games this season, one away from matching the Illini freshman record of 10 set last year by Kasparas Jakucionis, who is now a rookie with the Miami Heat.
- **Wagler** has netted 573 points on the season, shattering the Illinois freshman season scoring record. He broke the previous mark of 494 points, set by Cory Bradford in 1998-99 and equaled by Kasparas Jakucionis last year.
- **Wagler's** overall scoring average of 17.9 points per game is also on pace to break the Illini freshman scoring average record of 15.9 ppg, set by Kiwane Garris in 1993-94.
- After scoring 34 on Feb. 10 vs. Wisconsin to go with his 46 points at Purdue on Jan. 24, **Wagler** joined Kiwane Garris as the only two freshmen in Illini history with multiple 30+-point games.
- **Wagler** received six Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors this season. His six awards were the second-most in school history behind Kofi Cockburn (7) in 2019-20.
- **Wagler** earned National Player of the Week accolades Jan. 26 following one of the greatest performances in college basketball history with a record 46 points in the win at No. 4 Purdue (*see p. 8 for full list of records set*). He was later named the Oscar Robertson High-Major Player of the Month for January.

FIGHTING ILLINI NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Illinois is making its 36th all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and sixth* straight (*seventh precluded by cancellation of 2020 Tournament due to COVID-19).
- Illinois is tied for 18th among all schools, and fifth of B1G schools, for most NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Illinois is one of only three Big Ten teams – and one of just 10 teams nationally – to earn a bid in each of the last six NCAA Tournaments. Illinois' six-year streak is tied for the nation's seventh-longest active streak.
- **Brad Underwood** is just the second head coach in school history to lead Illinois to at least six straight NCAA Tournaments, joining **Lou Henson** (eight straight from 1983-90).
- Illinois' active streak of six straight NCAA Tournament appearances is its longest since participating eight years in a row from 2000 through 2007.
- Illinois has compiled a 46-36 (.561) record all-time in NCAA Tournament games.
- Illinois' 46 NCAA Tournament wins rank tied for 20th among all schools.
- Illinois' 46 NCAA Tournament wins are third-most among teams yet to win a national championship, trailing Purdue (51), and Gonzaga (47).
- Since 1975, when the field was increased to 32 teams, Illinois has advanced to the Sweet 16 nine times, the Elite Eight five times, and the Final Four twice.
- Illinois has made five all-time appearances in the NCAA Final Four, finishing as the national runner-up in 2005, placing third in 1949, 1951 and 1952, and tying for third in 1989.
- Illinois' five Final Four appearances are second-most among teams yet to win a national title, trailing only Houston (7), and tied with Oklahoma.
- Illinois has 10 all-time Elite Eight appearances, and 12 total Sweet 16 appearances. The Illini most recently played in both of those rounds in 2024.
- Head Coach **Brad Underwood** has brought Illinois back among the nation's elite college basketball programs.
 - » His rebuild in Champaign brought success during Year 3 of his tenure, leading the Illini to a top-25 finish and what would have been an NCAA Tournament bid before the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19.
 - » Underwood directed Illinois to a Big Ten Tournament title and #1 seed in 2021, as Illinois played in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2013.
 - » Underwood guided the Illini to a Big Ten Regular Season Championship and #4 seed in 2022, advancing to the Round of 32 for the second straight season.
 - » In 2023, Underwood guided the Illini to the NCAA tournament for a third straight season as a #9 seed.
 - » Illinois earned its fourth straight NCAA Tournament bid in 2024 after capturing the Big Ten Tournament title. As a #3 seed, Illinois advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight for the first time since 2005 behind star **Terrence Shannon Jr.**, who averaged 23.3 points, the highest NCAA Tournament scoring average in school history.
 - » Underwood's NCAA streak extended to five in a row in 2025. As a #6 seed, the Illini earned an 86-73 win in Round 1 vs. #11 seed Xavier. It marked the fourth season in the previous five years with an NCAA Tournament win for the Fighting Illini.
- **Brad Underwood** is making his 10th trip to the NCAA Tournament with his third program in 13 seasons as a Div. I head coach. He previously led Stephen F. Austin to three consecutive appearances from 2014-2016, advancing to the Round of 32 in 2014 and 2016. He then took Oklahoma State to the Tournament in his lone season in Stillwater in 2017. Underwood owns an 8-9 career record in the NCAA Tournament, with a 6-5 mark at the helm of the Fighting Illini.
- The Illinois enter the 2026 NCAA Tournament with a roster that features much more experience than last year's squad. According to kenpom, last year's Illini ranked third-lowest in D-1 experience (1.08 yrs) and fourth-lowest in minutes continuity (3.8%) among the 68-team field. This year, the Illini are 38th in the tourney field in D-1 experience (1.63), and 19th in minutes continuity (38.8%).
 - » **Kylan Boswell** will play in his fourth straight NCAA Tournament, and his second consecutive at Illinois after competing in the tourney during his time at Arizona in 2023 and 2024. During last year's tournament he, averaged 19 points, four rebounds and four assists to lead the Illini. For his career, Boswell owns NCAA Tournament averages of 11.3 points, 2.3 rebounds and 3.2 assists.
 - » **Tomislav Ivisic**, **Ben Humrichous**, and **Jake Davis** are all back after being a part of the Illini's NCAA Tournament team in 2025. Ivisic averaged 19.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 3.0 blocks vs. Xavier and Kentucky last year. Humrichous also played in both games, pulling down 4.5 rebounds per contest, while Davis logged two minutes in the team's Round 2 matchup vs. Kentucky.
 - » Transfers **Zvonimir Ivisic** and **Andrej Stojakovic** are slated to see their first NCAA Tournament action as Illini. Ivisic will play in his third straight NCAA Tournament after competing in 2024 while at Kentucky, and returning last year to help Arkansas to a Sweet 16 appearance. Stojakovic will make his NCAA tournament debut, having missed out on the Field of 68 during his freshman season at Stanford in 2024, and his sophomore campaign at Cal in 2025.
 - » **AJ Redd** is making his fourth-straight NCAA tournament appearance with the Illini. As a sophomore during the Elite Eight run he played in two tournament games, closing out first- and second-round wins over Morehead State and Duquesne.

Looking Back at the 2000 Illinois-Penn NCAA Tournament Game:

Penn took a calculated gamble, and Illini freshman Frank Williams made the Quakers pay.

The Quakers focused their perimeter defense on Cory Bradford, Illinois' top scoring threat, even if it meant giving Williams some open looks.

Williams responded with the best game of his rookie season, a 21-point out-ing that sent the Fighting Illini to a 68-58 victory in the first round of the NCAA East Regional.

Williams was 6-for-9 from the field on a day when Bradford, averaging 15.3 points, missed his first six shots and did not score until 25 minutes into the contest. He wound up with five points on 2-for-9 field-goal shooting.

Marcus Griffin added 17 points and 10 rebounds and Lucas Johnson had 10 points as fourth-seeded Illinois (22-9) ended Penn's 16-game winning streak.

The Illini forced 13 turnovers, converted them into 18 points and harassed the Ivy League champions into 37-percent shooting.

Pennsylvania (21-8) trailed for the final 36 minutes but cut its deficit to one point early in the second half.

Ugona Onyekwe had 17 points and Matt Langel 11 for the Quakers.

Illinois capitalized on first-half foul trouble by the Quakers' Michael Jordan, the Ivy League MVP. Jordan was held to eight points, and his absence in the opening half helped the Illini build a lead they never relinquished.

The Quakers went up 6-2 before Illinois turned up the defensive pressure, forcing four turnovers and converting them into seven points in a 16-0 run.

The surge put the Illini up by 12, but Pennsylvania's problems were just beginning. Jordan was assessed his second and third personals in a two-second span, sending him to the bench with 11:13 left in the half.

His departure set the stage for Illinois to push its lead as high as 15 before Dunphy put Jordan back on the floor for selected possessions the rest of the half.

The strategy worked, with Jordan scoring six points as the Quakers closed the half with a 17-7 run, trimming their deficit to 34-29.

A foul-line jumper by Frank Brown cut the Illini's lead to 38-37 with 17 minutes remaining, but Illinois scored the next six points. Bradford's first points of the game, on a fast-break layup at the 15-minute mark, made it 44-37.

Illinois pushed its lead as high as 13 in the closing minutes.

ILLINI ITEMS

- Head coach **Brad Underwood** has led the Illini to a seventh-straight 20+-win season. Illinois is one of four teams to win 20+ regular season games every year since 2019-20, joined by Gonzaga, Houston, and San Diego State.
- Illinois entered the postseason with 24 victories, its most during the regular season in the last 20 years since the 2005-06 Illini squad, led by seniors Dee Brown and James Augustine, won 25 regular-season games.
- Illinois finished 15-5 in Big Ten play to tie for runner-up in the league race. The Illini's 15 conference wins tied **Underwood's** 2022 Big Ten title squad for the second-most league wins in school history. Underwood led the 2021 Illini to a school-record 16 B1G wins.
- **Underwood** now owns the top three, and five of the top nine, winningest B1G seasons in program history, all coming within the last seven seasons:
 - » 1. 16 in 2021 » T2. 15 in 2026 and 2022 » T6. 14 in 2024 » T9. 13 in 2020
- Illinois is the winningest team in Big Ten play over the last seven seasons with 96 regular-season conference victories since 2019-20.
- Illinois tied the school record for Big Ten road wins this season with an 8-2 record. Underwood's 2021 squad also won eight Big Ten road games.
- Over the last seven seasons, Brad Underwood has led the Illini to a league-most 42 Big Ten road wins.
- Illinois ranks second in the nation in adjusted offensive efficiency (131.2). Offensive coordinator **Tyler Underwood** has helped **Brad Underwood** implement a top-15 offense for the third straight season after ranking third in 2024 (125.5) and 14th last year (121.9).
- Illinois is first in the nation in defensive free throw rate (20.6), and third in fewest fouls per game (13.4).
- The Illini are one of the nation's top rebounding teams, ranking third in offensive rebound percentage (38.7).
- Four Fighting Illini average at least 12 points per game, tied for the most nationally: **Keaton Wagler** (17.9 ppg), **David Mirkovic** (13.4), **Andrej Stojakovic** (13.4), and **Kylan Boswell** (13.2).
- Illinois is the only team in the nation with seven players averaging at least 4.0 rebounds: **David Mirkovic** (7.8 rpg), **Tomislav Ivisic** (5.5), **Keaton Wagler** (4.8), **Zvonimir Ivisic** (4.8), **Andrej Stojakovic** (4.6), **Ben Humrichous** (4.1), and **Kylan Boswell** (4.0).
- Illinois is currently ranked No. 7 in kenpom. It is the second-highest rating of the **Brad Underwood** era, behind the 2020-21 Illini squad that finished the season at No. 4.
- Illinois is No. 13 in the AP poll and No. 12 in the coaches poll. Illinois has been ranked in the AP Top 25 in each of the last seven seasons under **Brad Underwood**, and in every ranking released so far this season.
- Illinois finished 14-3 at home, averaging 86.1 points with an average scoring margin of +20.3 ppg.

- Illinois has defeated two Top-5 teams, with wins at No. 4 Purdue and at No. 5 Nebraska. The school record for Top-5 wins in a season is three, set by the 1951-52 Illini squad.
- Illinois is the tallest team in the nation, with an average height of 80.0 inches (kenpom).
- Illinois ranks sixth in the NCAA and first in the Big Ten with a free-throw percentage of 78.9%. Last year the Illini shot 76.2% at the free-throw line, the second-best season mark in school history behind the 2014-15 team that holds the single-season record at 79.4%.
- Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten with a scoring average of 84.4 points per game. The Illini led the B1G in scoring last season (83.6 ppg).
- Along with the No. 2-rated offense (131.2) by kenpom, the Illini are No. 28 in defense (99.1) this year.
- Illinois leads the Big Ten in second chance points, averaging 16.0 per game.
- Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten (11th nationally) averaging 10.9 three-pointers and has made 10+ 3-pointers in a 22 games this season with a 17-5 record.
- The Illini have knocked down at least 10 triples in 18 of the last 24 games, highlighted by a school-record tying 18 treys in the win at No. 4 Purdue (Jan. 24), and 17 threes in the team's home win vs. Northwestern (Feb. 4).
- Illinois has outrebounded its opponent in 27 of 32 games this season and ranks second in the Big Ten (seventh nationally) in rebound margin at +9.6 rpg. Illinois is 23-4 when it wins the battle on the glass.
- Eight different players have been the Illini's leading scorer in a game this season. That ranks second in the Big Ten and is tied for 10th nationally, overall, and tied for third among power conference programs.
- Illinois is No. 7 in the kenpom rankings with an adjusted efficiency margin +32.10. The Illini have had a kenpom rating of 35th or better each of the last six years under **Brad Underwood**, and are just short of the team's high ranking of No. 4 to close out the 2020-21 season. Illinois posted consecutive top-20 rankings the last two seasons: 10th in 2023-24 and 17th in 2024-25.
- At its current scoring pace (84.4 ppg), this year's Illini are challenging to become just the sixth team in program history to average at least 85.0 points for a full season. The Illini opened the 2025-26 campaign with seven straight games of 80+ points. It marked the most such games to open a campaign since the 1988-89 Flyin' Illini scored 80+ in each of their first 12 contests.
- **Brad Underwood** has led Illinois to 32 wins over top-25 opponents since 2019-20, with 23 of those wins coming in ranked-vs.-ranked matchups. Illinois' 32 top-25 victories are tied for 11th-most in the NCAA during that span. This season the Illini have ranked wins over No. 11 Texas Tech at home, vs. No. 13 Tennessee in Nashville, at No. 19 Iowa, at No. 4 Purdue, and at No. 5 Nebraska.

WAGLER POSTS HISTORIC PERFORMANCES IN FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

- Fighting Illini point guard **Keaton Wagler** has had a number of record-setting performances this season, two of which included consecutive road wins over top-5 opponents for the first time in program history.
- In Illinois' 88-82 win over No. 4 Purdue at Mackey Arena on Jan. 24, the freshman from Shawnee, Kansas, earned national recognition by pouring in 46 points on 13-of-17 shooting from the field, including 9-for-11 from 3-point range, while going 11-for-13 from the free-throw line and adding four assists.
- Wagler's 46 points ranks as one of the greatest scoring performances in college basketball history:
 - » The most points by any player in a road win over a top-10 team in AP poll era (since 1949).
 - » The most points ever by a freshman in a road game against an AP top-25 team.
 - » The most points ever by a Big Ten player against an AP top-5 team.
 - » Tied the most points by any player in a win over a top-5 team in AP poll history.
 - » The most points ever by a Big Ten freshman.
 - » The most points by any freshman this season.
 - » Set the Mackey Arena scoring record for a visiting player.
 - » Set the Illinois freshman single-game scoring record.
 - » The second-highest scoring performance in the 121-year history of Illini Basketball.
 - » The most points in a Big Ten road game in 47 years.
 - » The most points in any Big Ten game in 32 years.
 - » The best shooting percentage (.764) in a 45+ point game against an AP top-25 team in the last 30 years.
 - » The most points on 17 FGA in college basketball in the last 13 seasons.
 - » Set the Illinois school record with nine 3-pointers.
- Wagler earned National Player of the Week honors from the Associated Press, Naismith Trophy, Oscar Robertson Trophy, Lute Olson Award, Field of 68, and NCAA March Madness, and was tabbed Big Ten Player of the Week alongside the fourth of his league-leading six B1G Freshman of the Week honors.
- In the Illini's next road game, Feb. 1 at No. 5 Nebraska, Wagler again led all scorers with 28 points - including 23 in the second half on just six shots - to lead the Illini to a 78-69 win at Pinnacle Bank Arena.
- Wagler became the first NCAA DI player over the last 20 seasons to record multiple 25+-point games in road wins over top-5 teams. He combined for 74 points in the wins at No. 4 Purdue and at No. 5 Nebraska over the eight-day span from Jan. 24 to Feb. 1.
- Wagler netted 34 points in an overtime loss to Wisconsin on Feb. 10. That tied the third-most points by a freshman in Illini history, and ranks second by a Big Ten freshman this season behind his 46 at Purdue.
- Wagler joins Kiwane Garris as the only two freshmen in Illini history with multiple 30+-point games.

• Illinois is 5-6 this season vs. AP Top 25 teams. Illinois has won 5+ games vs. ranked opponents in four of the last six seasons under head coach **Brad Underwood**.

• Entering the NCAA Tournament, Illinois ranks in the top three in the Big Ten, and among the top 50 programs nationally in 14 categories: The Illini lead the Big Ten with 13.4 fouls per game (third in the NCAA), a .789 free-throw percentage (sixth), 40.7 total rebounds per game (11th), and 13.2 offensive rebounds per game (20th), and rank second in the league with a +9.6 rebound margin (seventh in the NCAA), 31.4 3-point attempts per game (10th), 10.9 3-pointers per game (11th), a +14.6 scoring margin (11th), 27.5 defensive rebounds per game (18th), and a scoring offense of 84.4 points per game (21st). The Illini are third in the BIG with 8.9 turnovers per game (fifth in the NCAA), 4.6 blocks per game (28th), a field goal percentage defense of .410 (33rd), and a 3-point percentage defense of .314 (49th).

• **Andrej Stojakovic** is the second active Illini to reach 1,000 career points, reaching the milestone Jan. 17 vs. Minnesota. Stojakovic now has 1,161 points to rank behind **Kylan Boswell** (1,267) in the 1,000-point club.

• Illinois claimed eight of 17 Big Ten Freshman of the Week selections this season. **Keaton Wagler** leads the Big Ten with six honors, while **David Mirkovic** has garnered two nods.

• Freshman G **Keaton Wagler** has scored in double-figures in 24 consecutive games dating back to the Illini's win over No. 13 Tennessee on Dec. 6, including an historic 46-point outburst in a win at No. 4 Purdue on Jan. 24 (more on p. 3). During that stretch, **Wagler** is averaging a team-leading 19.4 points per game, and ranks fourth in rebounding at 4.7 boards per contest, while shooting 45.0% (141-313) overall, 41.6% (64-154) from 3-point range, and 80.4% (119-148) from the free-throw line. Wagler also leads the team with 124 assists and 23 steals during that stretch.

• **Keaton Wagler** leads the Illini and ranks among the Big Ten leaders with: 157 free-throws made (4th), 195 free-throw attempts (5th), 573 total points (8th), 74 3-pointers made (9th), 17.9 points per game (10th), 2.31 3-pointers per game (10th), 4.4 assists per game (10th), 140 total assists (11th), 383 field goal attempts (12th), 184 3-point attempts (12th), 171 field goals made (16th), and a .446 field goal percentage (16th). Wagler also ranks 11th in the Big Ten minutes per game at 33:44.

• Freshman F **David Mirkovic** is one of only three freshmen in the nation, along with Duke's Cameron Boozer and North Carolina's Caleb Wilson, averaging at least 13.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists.

• **David Mirkovic** leads the Illini and ranks among the Big Ten leaders with: 248 total rebounds (6th), 7.8 total rebounds per game (6th), 5.4 defensive rebounds per game (6th), seven double-doubles (9th), 2.4 offensive rebounds per game (10th). Mirkovic is also tied for second on the team with a scoring average of 13.4 ppg (36th).

• Senior G **Kylan Boswell** is the Illini's active career leader with 1,267 career points (759 at Illinois), with eight 20+ point games and 40 career double-digit scoring games in Orange and Blue. **Boswell** has eclipsed the 20-point mark eight times over the last two years, including five times this season.

- Junior G **Andrej Stojakovic** transferred to Illinois with a reputation as a prolific scorer and is averaging 13.4 points on 49.1% shooting. **Stojakovic** has seven games this season with 20+ points, highlighted by 30 points vs. Maryland and 26 points vs. No. 11 Alabama. Stojakovic also posted 23 points the win over No. 11 Texas Tech, and scored 20 and 24, respectively, in Illinois' wins over LIU and UTRGV. In Big Ten play, Stojakovic scored 22 in the Illini's 101-65 victory at USC, and tallied 21 points and a career-high 12 rebounds in a double-double effort vs. Oregon. **Stojakovic** has led the Illini in scoring in eight games this season.
- Twin 7-footers **Tomislav Ivisic** and **Zvonimir Ivisic** rank among the top shooting big men in college basketball. Tomislav is first in the NCAA among 7-footers with 13 games this season with multiple 3-pointers, while Zvonimir is fifth with nine such games. Tomislav also leads the NCAA among 7-footers at 1.5 3-pointers per game, while Zvonimir ranks sixth at 0.9 triples per contest.
- **Zvonimir Ivisic** ranks fourth nationally in block rate at 12.9%. He is second in the Big Ten in total blocks (67) and blocks per game (2.1), 21st and 22nd in the nation, respectively. His average would rank tied for second all-time in Illinois' record book behind **Derek Holcomb** (3.0 bpg in 1978-79). The last Illini to average more than two blocks was **Nnanna Ekwu** (2.1 bpg) in 2013-14.
- **Ben Humrichous** and **Jake Davis** have been steady role players in helping the Illini to the nation's most efficient offense. Humrichous is ranked No. 1 by kenpom with a turnover rate of 4.2%, and has committed just six turnovers on the year, tied with Davis for the fewest nationally among players with at least 600 minutes played. Davis ranks fourth in turnover rate (5.0%). Among all players, regardless of usage rate, Davis (145.8) and Humrichous (135.3), rank first and 17th in the country, respectively, in offensive efficiency rating by kenpom.

ILLINOIS-PENN CONNECTIONS

- Though Illinois and Penn have only met on the hardwood six times, the two programs share a number of connections heading into the 2026 NCAA Tournament.
- The Fighting Illini are very familiar with Quakers' head coach Fran McCaffery from his highly successful tenure at Iowa from 2010-25. During that period, the Illini were 16-11 (.593) vs. the Hawkeyes
- Head coach **Brad Underwood** led the Fighting Illini to a 9-6 (.600) mark in 15 matchups vs. his friend and colleague, McCaffery, and the Hawkeyes.
- The **Underwood-McCaffery** friendship goes well beyond basketball. Underwood, a long-serving member of the Coaches Council for the American Cancer Society's partnership with Coaches vs. Cancer (CVC), and the Chair of the CVC Coaches Council since May 2024, annually hosts Kickin' Cancer, an event that has grown into the largest fundraising banquet in the CVC program. Over the years, Underwood's has welcomed a number of coaching colleagues as guests including Bill Self, Lon Kruger, Greg Kampe, Chris Collins, and Dana Altman. During the 2023 fundraiser, Underwood was joined by Tom Izzo, Matt Painter, Fred Hoiberg, and McCaffery, all of whom will be coaching in the 2026 NCAA Tournament.
- Illinois assistant coach/defensive coordinator **Camryn Crocker** is a University of Pennsylvania alumnus who played four years for the Quakers from 2011-12 to 2014-15. Crocker, in his first season at Illinois, served as team captain during his senior campaign and earned two degrees from Penn, a Bachelor of Arts in 2015 and a Master of Science in Education in 2018.
- Illinois and Penn previously met in the NCAA Tournament in a first-round matchup on March 17, 2000. The Illini, led by head coach Lon Kruger, defeated the Quakers, 68-58 in Winston-Salem, N.C. Lon Kruger's son, Kevin, is now in his first season on the Fighting Illini staff. The former UNLV head coach, Kevin returned to Champaign in the offseason as the Illini's Assistant to the Head Coach.

THREE ILLINI EARN ALL-BIG TEN RECOGNITION

- All-Big Ten awards were announced by the conference office and AP, with three Illini earning recognition.
- All-America candidate **Keaton Wagler** (Shawnee, Kan.) earned several awards. He is **First-Team All-Big Ten** and **Big Ten Freshman of the Year** from three votes: the conference coaches, media covering the league, and the AP, with the latter coming via unanimous selection. In addition, he was a unanimous pick by the coaches to the **Big Ten All-Freshman Team**.
 - » Wagler is having a historic freshman season with the Illini. He shattered the

school's freshman scoring record – currently with 573 points – and at 17.9 ppg, he is on pace to set the program's rookie scoring average record as well.

- » He has scored in double figures in each of the last 24 games, and 29 times on the season, with a total of nine 20-point games.
- » Wagler was a six-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week and earned National Player of the Week accolades after his 46-point performance in the win at No. 4 Purdue on Jan. 24 that marked the most points by any player in a top-10 road win and the most ever by a Big Ten freshman.
- » Wagler becomes the eighth first-team All-Big Ten honoree of head coach Brad Underwood's tenure. The Illini have now had at least one first-team pick in six of the last seasons, while Illinois' total of eight first-team selections over the last seven years is most in the Big Ten, tied with Purdue.
- » Wagler is the fifth Big Ten Freshman of the Year in school history and first since Kofi Cockburn in 2020.
- Forward **David Mirkovic** (Niksic, Montenegro) joins Wagler on the coaches' **Big Ten All-Freshman Team**, and he is an **All-Big Ten honorable mention** selection by both the coaches and media.
 - » Mirkovic averages 13.4 points and is the Illini's leading rebounder at 7.8 rpg.
 - » He has recorded seven double-doubles on the season, highlighted by his 27-point, 21-rebound effort vs. Colgate on Nov. 14 that set the UI freshman single-game rebounds record and marked the first 20-20 game by an Illini in 53 years.
- Illinois has had seven players voted to the B1G All-Freshman Team in the Underwood era.
 - » This is just the second time that the Illini have two Big Ten All-Freshman Team picks in the same season, joining Dee Brown and James Augustine in 2003.
- Senior G **Kylan Boswell** (Champaign, Ill.) received **All-Big Ten honorable mention** recognition by the media, and he earned one of five spots on the coaches' **Big Ten All-Defensive Team**.
 - » He is the Illini's second-leading scorer at 13.2 ppg while also averaging 4.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists.
 - » Boswell has scored in double figures 16 times, with five 20-point games, and he has earned a reputation as one of the most versatile defenders in the country, guarding every opposing position on the court.
 - » He is the first Illini on the B1G All-Defensive Team since Trent Frazier in 2021 and 2022.
- Underwood now has 22 All-Big Ten selections during his nine-year Illinois tenure: eight on first team, two on second team, four on third team, and eight honorable mention.

ILLINI MAKE HISTORY WITH BACK-TO-BACK TOP-5 WINS

- Following Illinois' 88-82 win at No. 4 Purdue on Jan 24 and the team's 78-69 win at No. 5 Nebraska on Feb. 1, the Fighting Illini captured consecutive road wins against top-5 teams for the first time in program history.
- Illinois also won consecutive games against top-five opponents away from home for the second time under **Brad Underwood**. In 2021 Underwood led his squad to a dominating road win at No. 2 Michigan (76-53) on March 2, followed 11 days later by a neutral-site victory over No. 5 Iowa (82-71) in the semifinal round of the Illini's run to the 2021 Big Ten Tournament title at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis.
- Illinois two top-5 wins are tied for the second-most in a single season, and one off the school record of three set during the 1951-52 season.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN

- The Fighting Illini lineup has featured two B1G All-Freshman Team honorees - G **Keaton Wagler** and F **David Mirkovic** - in starting roles. The duo has excelled in nearly all phases of the game to begin their college careers.
- They rank as two of only nine freshmen in the nation to average better than 12.5

points, 4.5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game:

TWIN TIME

- Illinois' activity in the transfer portal has led to the reuniting of **Tomislav Ivistic** and with his twin brother **Zvonimir Ivistic**, older by four minutes.
- They met last season when Illinois defeated Arkansas on Thanksgiving in Kansas City in what is believed to be the first time in college basketball history that twins played against each other. Tomi had 21 points, 10 rebounds, and three blocked shots for the Illini while Big Z had 13 points, six boards and two blocks for the Razorbacks.
- Now on the court together at Illinois, they are the first set of twins to play for the Fighting Illini since Paul and Phil Judson in 1956.
- Prior to this season, they last played together with SC Derby in Montenegro during the 2022-23 Adriatic League season.

- The two have been on the court together in 17 games (13-4) this season, logging a combined 96 minutes, 24 seconds with a +/- rating of +40:

- Senior G **Kylan Boswell** eclipsed 1,000 points for his collegiate career in the Fighting Illini's 81-77 victory over #11 Texas Tech on Nov. 11
 - » **Boswell**, who scored 508 points in his first two college seasons at Arizona, now has 759 points in an Illini uniform and 1,267 points for his career.
- Junior G **Andrej Stojakovic** became the second active Illini to reach 1,000 points for his collegiate career with his final bucket in the Illini's 77-67 victory over Minnesota on Jan. 17.
 - » **Stojakovic** scored 251 points as a freshman at Stanford, and added 520 during his sophomore campaign at Cal. In his first season at Illinois, he has tallied 390 points and has 1,161 for his career.

B1G DEBUTS FOR WAGLER, MIRKOVIC

- The Fighting Illini's starting freshmen duo of G **Keaton Wagler** and F **David Mirkovic** made history in their Big Ten debut at Ohio State, pouring in 23 and 22 points, respectively, to lead the Illini to the 88-80 road win.
- The performances marked just the 12th time in the last 16 seasons that a pair of freshmen teammates scored 20+ points in a Big Ten game. **Wagler** and **Mirkovic**, however, are the only duo on that exclusive list to do so in their Big Ten debuts.
- The Illinois program has produced three games with freshmen teammates scoring 20+ points against a Big Ten opponent (since 2010-11), all coming under **Brad Underwood**. This is tied for the most in the B1G with Ohio State.

MIRKOVIC'S HISTORIC 20-20 GAME PERFORMANCE

- Fighting Illini freshman F **David Mirkovic** earned his second straight Big Ten Player of the Week with an historic 27-point, 21-rebound double-double in the Illini's win vs. Colgate on Nov. 14.
 - » 21 rebounds are the most by a freshman in school history, breaking **Kofi Cockburn's** record of 17 from 2019-20, and tied for seventh most all-time in Illinois history.
 - » He posted the first 20 pts-20 reb game by an Illini in 53 seasons, since **Nick Weatherspoon** (37 pts, 22 reb) vs. DePauw on Dec. 2, 1972.
 - » Recorded his third double-double of the season and has a team-leading four entering the Dec. 6 matchup vs. #13 Tennessee.
 - » Became just the fourth freshman nationally in the last 21 years to record at least 27 points and 21 rebounds in a game: Marvin Bagley III for Duke (12/30/17 vs. Florida State), Michael Beasley twice for Kansas State (11/9/07 vs. Sacramento State and 11/17/07 vs. Western Illinois), and Kevin Durant for Texas (1/31/07 at Texas Tech).
 - » Scored his first 20-point game of the season/of his career, and the fourth of seven consecutive game of 10+ points to start his career.
 - » Eclipsed the 10-rebound mark in the first half, the third time in four games to open his career that he has posted double-digit boards.

HIGH-SCORING ILLINI

- Under head coach **Brad Underwood**, the Fighting Illini have regularly produced some of the most potent offensive team's in program history.
- The Illini have scored 80 more points in at least 20 games in each of the last three seasons, the longest such streak in program history: 2024 (24), 2025 (22), 2026 (21).
- The Illini closed the 2024-25 season as the highest-scoring team in the Big Ten Conference, averaging 84.6 points per game. It was Illinois' highest scoring average in 31 years, since the 1993-94 team put up 84.0 points per game.
- Entering the NCAA Tournament, this year's Illini are averaging 84.4 points per game, on pace to challenge for a top-5 mark in program history.

- Illinois scored 80+ points in each of the first seven games of the season. It marked the program's longest streak of 80+ points since the Flyin' Illini did so in 12 consecutive contests to open the season in 1988-89.
- Overall, the Illini scored are 15-6 in 21 games this season when scoring 80+ points.

ILLINOIS WHEN RANKED

- The No. 13 Illini have played all 32 games this season ranked in the Top 25.
- Illinois is 676-275 (.711) all-time in 951 games when ranked in the AP Top 25. The program is 369-56 at home, including a 291-43 mark at State Farm Center, 167-152 on the road, and 140-65 at neutral sites.
- Under head coach **Brad Underwood**, Illinois is 114-51 (.691) when ranked.

ILLINI IN TOP-25 MATCHUPS

- The No. 13 Illini have played 11 ranked-vs.-ranked games this season, posting a 5-6 mark with wins over No. 11 Texas Tech, vs. No. 13 Tennessee in Nashville, at No. 19 Iowa, at No. 4 Purdue, and at No. 5 Nebraska.
- Illinois is 116-114 (.504) all-time in 230 games when both teams are ranked, 52-23 (.693) at home including a 41-18 (.695) mark at State Farm Center, 21-52 (.288) on the road, and 43-39 (.524) at neutral sites.
- Illinois is 23-27 (.460) in ranked-vs.-ranked contests in the **Brad Underwood** era.

HIGHLIGHTING ILLINOIS' STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Illinois head coach **Brad Underwood** believes in putting together a rigorous schedule to prepare for Big Ten play. That has resulted in the Illini competing against some of the nation's strongest schedules over the last eight seasons.
- Since leading the Fighting Illini against kenpom's No. 58 schedule in his first season in 2018, Underwood and the Illini have faced top-25 slates in six of the last seven season:
 - » No. 58 in 2017-18 » No. 5 in 2020-21 » No. 17 in 2023-24
 - » No. 13 in 2018-19 » No. 17 in 2021-22 » No. 4 in 2024-25
 - » No. 25 in 2019-20 » No. 36 in 2022-23
- The Illini closed out one of the nation's most challenging nonconference slates, which featured several matchups against power conference foes in November and December.
 - » Nov. 11 vs. #11 Texas Tech - W, 81-77
 - » Nov. 19 vs. #11 Alabama - L, 86-90 (Chicago, Ill.)
 - » Nov. 28 vs. #5 UConn - L, 61-74 (New York, N.Y.)
 - » Dec. 6 vs. #13 Tennessee - W, 75-62 (Nashville, Tenn.)
 - » Dec. 22 vs. Missouri - W, 91-48 (St. Louis, Mo.)
- All five marquee non-conference opponents entered the 2025-26 season on the heels of NCAA Tournament runs, with Alabama (East / 2 Seed), Tennessee (Midwest / 2 Seed), and Texas Tech (West / 3 Seed) all making the Elite 8. UConn (West / 8 Seed) and Missouri (West / 6 Seed) closed in the Round of 32 and Round of 64, respectively.

ILLINI ROSTER AT A GLANCE

- Illinois' 2025-26 roster returns key contributors in guard **Kylan Boswell**, center **Tomislav Ivisic**, and forwards **Ben Humrichous** and **Jake Davis**. Those four collected 45% of the Illini's minutes in 2024-25, posting 41% of the team's points and 43% of its rebounds.
- The Fighting Illini added six newcomers that were rated as four-star additions by 247.
- Joining the mix are a pair of impact college transfers in forward **Zvonimir Ivisic** from Arkansas — Tomislav's twin brother — and guard **Andrej Stojakovic** from Cal.
- Illinois has continued its successful recruiting run in Europe with two more standout acquisitions in point guard **Mihailo Petrovic** of Serbia and forward **David Mirkovic** of Montenegro.
- A pair of promising freshmen from the U.S. high school ranks also look to make an immediate impact: guard **Keaton Wagler**, the 2025 Kansas Gatorade Player of the Year, and guard **Brandon Lee**, the No. 7 scorer in the state of New Jersey.
- The Illini also return junior wing **Ty Rodgers** and freshman **Jason Jakstys**, both coming off redshirt seasons, and **AJ Redd**. Rodgers is currently sidelined with a knee injury, while Jakstys is in his first action for the Illini. Redd, a senior, is a former manager who joined the Illini roster midway through his freshman campaign.
- In addition, the Illini added freshman guard **Blake Fagbemi**, a local product from Naperville who helped lead Benet Academy to the 2025 IHSA Class 4A state title at State Farm Center.
- The exciting mix of talent, experience, skill, and youth has the Illini ranked sixth in kenpom entering the season.

ILLINI IN THE NBA

- History was made in June for Fighting Illini basketball when freshmen **Kasparas Jakucionis** and **Will Riley** became the first-ever one-and-done players for the Illinois program.
- The Illini stars were selected back-to-back in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft, with **Jakucionis** taken at No. 20 overall by the Miami Heat and **Riley** going to the Washington Wizards the very next pick at No. 21 as part of a trade with Utah.
- Illinois has now had four players selected in the NBA Draft during head coach **Brad Underwood's** tenure, with **Jakucionis** and **Riley** following **Ayo Dosunmu** in the second round in 2021 (Chicago Bulls) and **Terrence Shannon Jr.** in the first round (Minnesota Timberwolves) in 2024.
- Illinois stands as one of just three programs with multiple first-round picks in the 2025 draft, along with Duke (3) and Rutgers (2). The Illinoi's total of three first-round picks over the last two drafts (2024 and 2025) leads the Big Ten and ranks second nationally behind Duke (4) and tied with Baylor and UConn.
- **Jakucionis** led the Illini in scoring and assists, averaging 15.2 ppg and 4.7 apg, and was third on the team in rebounding at 5.7 rpg. He equaled the most points ever scored by an Illini freshman, totaling 494 during his 33 starts, and set UI rookie season records shooting 84.5% from the free throw line and tallying eight 20-point games. **Jakucionis** was a Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection, first-team NABC All-Great Lakes District, second-team All-Big Ten by AP, third-team All-Big Ten by the league coaches and media, and was named Illinois Freshman of the Year.
- **Riley**, averaged 12.6 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.2 assists while playing in all 35 games. He registered double figures in 13 of the final 15 games, averaging 15.9 ppg over that stretch with five 20-point performances. **Riley** burst onto the scene by scoring 31 points vs. Eastern Illinois to set the Illini freshman debut scoring record. His instant offense for much of the season came from off the bench, culminating in his selection as Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year by the league coaches.
- **Shannon**, in Year 2 with the Timberwolves, was named an All-American by four media outlets after helping leading Illinois to 29 wins, the third-winningest season in school history, and No. 6 ranking in final AP poll in 2024. He earned NCAA All-Region Team honors, leading Illinois to its first Elite Eight appearance since 2005, and was named the Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player. A first-team All-Big Ten selection by the coaches, media, and AP, Shannon shattered the Illinois all-time single season scoring record, totaling 736 points, ranked third in the NCAA

in scoring at 23.0 ppg, and set the Big Ten Tournament's three-game scoring record with an astounding 34.0 points-per-game average (102 total).

- **Dosunmu** played four full seasons with the Bulls before being traded to the Timberwolves at the trade deadline in February 2026. He averaged 20.1 points, 6.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists during his final season at Illinois in 2021, becoming the first NCAA player since 2010 and just the second Big Ten player since 1993 to average at least 20 points, six rebounds and five assists. He accumulated the most impressive single-season list of accolades ever by an Illini player, highlighted by USA Today National Player of the Year, Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, and consensus first-team All-American.

NEW ADDITIONS TO COACHING STAFF

- Head coach **Brad Underwood** made additions to his staff this offseason with the hires of assistant coach **Camryn Crocker** and assistant to the head coach **Kevin Kruger**.
- **Crocker** brings a decade of coaching experience to the Fighting Illini staff that already included associate head coach **Orlando Antigua**, a 22-year veteran in Year 2 of his second stint with the Illini (sixth overall at Illinois), and three other assistant coaches: **Geoff Alexander** (ninth year), **Tyler Underwood** (fifth year), and **Zach Hamer** (seventh year).
- **Crocker**, who most recently was an assistant coach at Colgate (2022-25), will serve as the Illini's defensive coordinator alongside roles held by **Alexander** (recruiting coordinator), **Tyler Underwood** (offensive coordinator), and **Hamer** (director of player development)
- **Kruger** returns to Champaign where he lived for four years while his father, College Basketball Hall of Famer Lon Kruger, served as head coach from 1996-2000. Kruger was most recently the head coach at UNLV, where he led the Runnin' Rebels to four straight winning seasons and a record of 76-55.

9TH YEAR AT ILLINOIS // 13TH YEAR AS DIV. I HEAD COACH // 39TH YEAR IN COACHING

Brad Underwood has reinvigorated Illinois Basketball, bringing the Fighting Illini back to the national stage and building a championship program during his tenure in Champaign.

Underwood is the 18th head coach in Illinois history, hired in March 2017 as the Richmond Family Endowed Men's Head Basketball Coach. He has won more than 68 percent of his games during his 12 years as a Division I head coach, recording 10 seasons with at least 20 wins. Underwood has made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament, with a 10th precluded by the cancellation of the 2020 postseason due to COVID-19.

The Big Ten has been the nation's preeminent conference in recent years. Yet no team has fared better during this stretch than the Fighting Illini, who are 81-39 in Big Ten play the last six years of the Underwood era. Over that time, Illinois is tied for the most wins in league play (81) while owning the most league road wins (34) and tied for the most regular season and conference tournament wins combined (88). The Illini are the only program, meanwhile, with a winning Big Ten record in each of the last six years.

The 81 victories in Big Ten play mark the winningest six-year run in school history, with Underwood claiming Illinois' two all-time winningest Big Ten seasons (16 in 2021, 15 in 2022), three of the top five (14 in 2024), four of the top eight (13 in 2020), and five of the top 15 (12 in 2025) during this stretch.

Underwood has led Illinois to three Big Ten championships in the last five years, tied for most in the conference. He is the lone Illini coach, one of three active league coaches, and one of seven coaches in conference history to win multiple Big Ten Tournament titles, hoisting trophies in 2021 and 2024. He also directed the Illini to the 2022 Big Ten regular season crown, and in addition led Illinois to the most wins in the league in 2021.

Underwood's three Big Ten titles is tied for second-most in program history and trails only Harry Combes, who totaled four over his 20-year career. Underwood has joined Lou Henson as the only coaches in school history to lead the Orange and Blue to at least five consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. His sixth, meanwhile, was precluded by the cancellation of the 2020 postseason due to COVID-19.

Illinois is one of only three Big Ten teams, and 13 teams nationally, to participate in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments. Illinois has earned a top 4 seed three times during this stretch, highlighted by the fourth No. 1 seed in school history in 2021. Illinois is one of 12 programs to advance in NCAA Tournament play at least four of the last five years highlighted by its 2024 run to the Elite Eight, the first Regional Final appearance for the UI program since 2005.

Underwood is coming off another successful season in 2025, his eighth in Champaign. Despite losing all five starters and its top eight leading scorers from an NCAA Elite Eight team in 2024, Illinois spent the majority of the 2024-25 season ranked in the Top 25, totaled 22 victories on the year, made its fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance — advancing to the Round of 32 — and finished the year ranked 17th in kenpom. Perhaps its most impres-

sive feat is that despite playing a top-10 rated schedule, Illinois recorded its sixth straight 20-win regular season, standing as one of just four teams nationally to carry that streak.

Underwood's 2025 squad was once again known for its prolific offense. Illinois averaged 83.6 points per game, its highest scoring average in the last 31 years. The Illini topped 80 points 22 times, going 21-1 in those games. Standout offensive performances included the 109-77 win at No. 9 Oregon, the largest margin of victory in NCAA history by a road team against a top-10 opponent, the 106-94 win over Iowa to set the program's Big Ten Tournament single-game scoring record, and the 94-69 win at Indiana that marked the most points ever scored by a visiting team in a regulation game at Assembly Hall.

The Illini were led by newcomers, with the roster ranking 300th nationally and second-to-last among power five teams in Division I experience. Two of those newcomers would go on to make history, as freshmen Kasparas Jakucionis and Will Riley became Illinois' first ever one-and-done players when they were selected back-to-back in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft. It marked the first time in 20 years, and just the third time in program history, that Illinois had two first-round picks in the same draft.

Illinois hoisted a conference trophy for the third time in Underwood's seventh year at the helm in 2024, winning the Big Ten Tournament Championship in Minneapolis. Underwood became the first Illinois coach to win multiple Big Ten Tournaments, claiming two in a span of just four years. That followed a runner-up finish during the regular season where the Illini went 14-6 in conference play.

The Illini went 29-9 overall, with the 29 victories ranking as the third-winningest season in program history. Illinois earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and won three games to advance to the East Regional Final, marking the program's first Elite Eight appearance since 2005. Upon making his first trip to the NCAA second weekend, Underwood led the Orange and Blue to a victory over No. 2 seed Iowa State in the Sweet 16 as Illinois recorded just its second NCAA Tournament win ever over a top-two seed.

Illinois ended the year at No. 6 in the Associated Press poll, marking its second top-10 final ranking in four years and fourth top-25 finish in five years. The 2023-24 offense was Illinois' most efficient in the kenpom era, placing third nationally at 1.255 points per possession. The Illini averaged 83.4 points per game, its highest scoring average in 30 years. Illinois had two first-team All-Big Ten selections for the second time in the Underwood era in seniors Terrence Shannon Jr. and Marcus Domask. Shannon was the nation's third-leading scorer at 23.0 ppg, the highest average by an Illini player in 51 years.

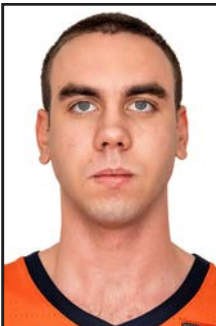

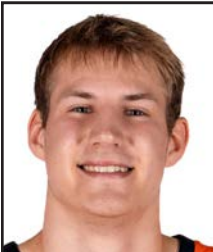

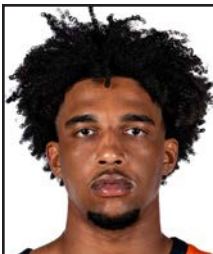

The 58-point Illini win stemmed from lockdown defense, dominating the glass, and shooting well from deep. Illinois outrebounded the Tigers, 61-19, and knocked down 17 threes.

Tomislav Ivisic and Ben Humrichous led Illinois in scoring, pouring in 21 points each. Humrichous tied his highest-scoring game at Illinois, knocking down five threes, shooting 6-11 from the field, and grabbing five rebounds. Ivisic shot 9-12 with four boards.

David Mirkovic recorded a double-double (19 points, 14 rebounds), becoming the first Illini freshman to achieve the feat in a season opener since Kofi Cockburn in 2019. Mirkovic also added four assists.

Keaton Wagler had a strong showing in his collegiate debut, starting and recording 18 points, six rebounds, four assists, and two steals. Wagler shot 4-8 from the field and 8-10 at the free throw line.

In his first game of his senior season, Kylan Boswell put up 10 points, five rebounds, and five assists to start the 2025-26 campaign. He shot 4-9 and hit two 3-pointers in 28 minutes of action.

Jake Davis finished with 13 points and three 3-pointers, while adding four rebounds, and four assists.

Jason Jakstys and Blake Fagbemi recorded the first buckets of their collegiate careers. Jakstys also grabbed nine rebounds to match Zvonimir Ivisic for game-high honors, while Fagbemi three rebounds and an assist.

Illinois has now won 10 consecutive season openers.

Game 2 Recap — #17 Illinois 113, Florida Gulf Coast 70

Kylan Boswell and David Mirkovic each recorded double-doubles to lead #17 Illinois to a 113-70 home victory at a sold-out State Farm Center on Friday night.

The Fighting Illini (2-0) had four players score in double figures, led by Boswell, who poured in a career-high 31 points and matched his personal-best with 10 rebounds. Mirkovic, who posted 19 points and 14 rebounds in his debut Monday vs. Jackson State, notched his second straight double-double performance with 17 points and 11 boards.

Keaton Wagler tallied career-highs with 22 points and seven rebounds after going for 18 points and six rebounds in his debut. Zvonimir Ivisic narrowly missed a double-double of his own, going for 16 points and nine rebounds while adding seven blocks.

The Illini shot 55% from the field as a team and hit 11 3-pointers, led by Boswell's four triples, his most as an Illini. Ivisic knocked down three shots from beyond the arc, including a four-point play in the first half. His seven blocks, tied for the second-most in a single game in Illinois program history and helped hold FGCU to 33% shooting from the field.

The Illini also posted a big rebounding edge, 51-30, over the Eagles.

After jumping out to a 38-15 advantage, Illinois went on a 9-0 run with 8:12 left in the first half to push the lead to 47-15 and went into halftime with a 59-27 advantage. Illinois took advantage of five offensive rebounds to score nine second-chance points in the first half.

After the break, the Illini widened the lead, 65-31, before going on a 14-0 run, finished off by Andrej Stojakovic's layup, to take a 79-31 lead with 13 minutes to play. The Eagles narrowed the margin late in the game, but the Fighting Illini rolled the rest of the way for the 113-70 win. Illinois got a boost from its bench in the second half, with non-starters accounting for 20 points in the frame.

Game 3 Recap — #14 Illinois 81, #11 Texas Tech 77

Andrej Stojakovic scored 23 points and blocked a potential tying 3-pointer in the final seconds as No. 14 Illinois defeated No. 11 Texas Tech, 81-77, in front of a sellout crowd at State Farm Center on Tuesday night.

Kylan Boswell, who eclipsed 1,000 career points in the contest, scored 22 and three players — David Mirkovich, Keaton Wagler, and Zvonimir Ivisic — each scored 11 for the Fighting Illini (3-0). After falling behind 7-0 to open the game, Illinois built a 13-point halftime lead, then battled back for the win by overcoming a second half onslaught from Texas Tech led by All-American J.T. Toppin.

Toppin, the reigning Big 12 Player of the Year, had 35 points and 11 rebounds for Texas Tech (2-1). It was his 33rd career double-double. LeJuan Watts scored 21 for the Red Raiders.

Texas Tech had an opportunity to tie the game after Watts sank two free throws with 12.5 seconds left to make it 80-77 following a flagrant foul on Boswell. But then Stojakovic blocked Christian Anderson's 3-point try and Wagler hit a free throw to seal it with just six seconds to play.

The Red Raiders overcame Illinois' 45-32 halftime lead by making 12 straight shots to start the second half. A Watt's tipin with 8:44 remaining gave TTU their final lead of the game, 65-64.

Illinois regained the lead for good 66-65 on a layup by Ivisic with 8:19 remaining. The bucket started an 8-0 Illini run that also included back-to-back buckets from Stojakovic and was capped by Boswell's layup with just over 5 minutes to play.

The win was the first home win over a top 25-ranked nonconference opponent for the Illini under head coach Brad Underwood, and marked the program's 28th top 25 victory since 2019-20, tied with UConn for the eighth-most in the country during that span.

Game 4 Recap — #14 Illinois 84, Colgate 65

Fighting Illini forward David Mirkovic recorded an historic 27-point, 21-rebound double-double to lead No. 14 Illinois (4-0) to an 84-65 win over Colgate (1-3) in front of a sold-out State Farm crowd.

Mirkovic etched his name among some Illini greats in the win, recording the first 20+ point, 20+ rebound game by an Illini in almost 53 years — since Nick Weatherspoon went for 37 points and 22 rebounds vs. DePauw on Dec. 2, 1972, and breaking Kofi Cockburn's single-game freshman rebounding record of 17, set twice in 2019-20.

Mirkovic became the just the fourth freshman nationally in the last 21 years to record at least 27 points and 21 rebounds in a game, joining Duke's Marvin Bagley III (32 points and 21 rebounds on Dec. 30, 2017 vs. Florida State), Michael Beasley twice for Kansas State (32 points and 24 rebounds vs. Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007, 28 points and 22 rebounds vs. Western Illinois on Nov. 17, 2007), and Texas' Kevin Durant (37 points and 23 rebounds at Texas Tech on Jan. 31, 2007).

Behind Mirkovic, freshman G Keaton Wagler, continued his sensational start to the season with 19 points and six rebounds. Nine of Wagler's 19 came on 11 attempts from the free-throw line.

Kylan Boswell (11 points) and Ben Humrichous (10 points) also posted double-digit scoring games for the Illini who were outshot by Colgate, 37.7% to 41.9%, but posted a +20 rebounding margin (49-29).

The Illini jumped out to a 19-11 lead early in the contest before a Colgate run knotted the game, 28-28, at the 4-minute mark of the first half. Illinois responded, however, with a 13-2 run to close out the half with a 41-30 lead.

Out of the break, the Illini continued to steadily pull away from the Raiders and built a 19-point edge, 57-38, with just under 15 minutes left to play. A Mirkovic triple at the 4:35 mark gave Illinois its biggest lead of the night at 24 points, 78-54, before the Orange and Blue closed out the 19-point victory.

Game 5 Recap — #11 Alabama 90, #8 Illinois 86

No. 8 Illinois fell to No. 11 Alabama, 90-86, on Wednesday night inside the United Center.

Andrej Stojakovic paced the Fighting Illini with 26 points on 11-16 shooting, including a pair of threes, while David Mirkovic added ten points and ten rebounds for his fourth double-double this season.

The Fighting Illini jumped out to a quick lead, 19-10, with treys from Mirkovic, Zvonimir Ivisic and Stojakovic. Alabama closed the gap and Illinois saw a three-minute drought from the field near the end of the first half, until Mihailo Petrovic, Keaton Wagler and Ben Humrichous drained another trio of threes to put the Illini ahead going into the break, 42-41.

Alabama came out strong to begin the second half, outscoring Illinois 11-4 in the initial five minutes of play. The Crimson Tide were fueled by 19 second-half points from Labaron Philon Jr.

Behind by six with eight minutes remaining, the Illini battled within a possession, led by seven points down the stretch from Kylan Boswell, who finished with 22. The rally was not enough for Illinois, as Alabama secured six of its last seven free throws to take the victory.

Tomislav Ivisic returned from injury to 14 minutes after missing the Illini's three previous games. Petrovic made his Illini debut after missing the first four games of the season.

The game drew 17,775 fans, Illinois largest crowd in a regular-season game hosted at the United Center since defeating Auburn, 81-79, in front of 18,136 fans, on Dec. 29, 2012.

The #8 Fighting Illini rolled past Long Island University, 98-58, on Saturday afternoon at State Farm Center, behind a 20-point effort from Andrej Stojakovic.

Stojakovic posted his second straight - and third overall - game with 20+ points to lead the Illini. The Orange and Blue also received double-digit points from Keaton Wagler (19), David Mirkovic (12), and Kylan Boswell (11).

As a team, the Illini shot a season-best 63.1% (41-65) from the field, while posting a 68-24 scoring edge in the paint against the Sharks. Illinois also forced a season-high 17 LIU turnovers, turning those miscues into a 28-14 scoring advantage.

LIU jumped out to a 4-0 lead, and the Sharks clinged to an 8-7 edge just four minutes into the contest when the Illini clamped down defensively to take control.

The Orange and Blue held LIU without a field goal for the next 5 minutes, and used a 19-2 run to build a 26-10 lead, and never looked back en route to the team's third 40+-point victory of the year.

The Illini scored the final 16 points of the first half to build 54-19 halftime lead, then opened the second period on a 16-4 scoring run to push the advantage as high as 46 points, 70-24, with 14 minutes left in the contest.

The sharks cut into the deficit by 13 to pull within 33 points, 91-58, but the Illini scored the final six of the game before dribbling out the clock just shy of the team's third 100-point scoring effort of the season.

The Illini outrebounded the Sharks, 40-22, the team's sixth straight to open the season with a rebounding advantage, and turned their 13 offensive rebounds into 17 second-chance points.

Game 7 Recap — #13 Illinois 87, UTRGV 73

No. 13 Illinois remained perfect at State Farm Center this season with an 87-73 victory over UTRGV on Monday night.

Five Illini scored in double figures as Illinois improved to 6-1 ahead of a neutral-site matchup vs. #5 UConn at Madison Square Garden on Friday.

Andrej Stojakovic finishing with a game-high 24, the fourth 20-point outing of his Illini career, and his third straight. David Mirkovic posted 10 points, a career-high five assists, and four rebounds and has now scored in double figures in each of his first seven collegiate contests. Mihailo Petrovic secured 12 points for his first double-digit scoring effort of the season, while Zvonimir Ivistic logged 10 points and seven rebounds and Tomislav Ivistic tallied 10 points and five boards.

The sides traded baskets early in the first half before a 22-6 run fueled the Fighting Illini to their first double-digit lead of the night. Illinois held UTRGV to only one field goal during that seven-minute stretch, with the hosts establishing a 36-24 edge at the under-4 timeout.

Led by 14 first half points from Stojakovic, the Orange and Blue went into the break with a 42-31 advantage. Eight Illini corralled multiple rebounds in the opening half, while the home side held the Vaqueros to only four field goals across the final 10 minutes of the frame.

A 10-3 stretch early in the second half turned a six-point lead into a 13-point edge in less than three minutes. After the visitors trimmed their deficit to single digits, Illinois made its next five shots from the field to claim a 68-51 advantage with 10:39 to play.

The Vaqueros reduced the Illini edge to 11, but six straight points saw the hosts retake a 17-point edge with just over four minutes remaining. Illinois took its largest lead of the night shortly after, a 19-point advantage, before closing out the victory.

Game 8 Recap — #5 UConn 75, #13 Illinois 61

Kylan Boswell scored a game-high 25 points and combined with Tomislav Ivistic, on his way to a double-double, to lead #13 Illinois' second-half comeback effort. But it was not enough to overcome a cold-shooting performance by Illinois in a 74-61 loss to #5 UConn at Madison Square Garden.

The Illini shot a season-low 31.7% (19-60) from the field, including a team season-low with 20.7% (6-29) from 3-point range. After connecting on four of the their first seven 3-pointers, the Illini missed 11 straight and finished with just two makes from distance — one each from Boswell and Ivistic — during the team's comeback effort.

Ivistic was limited to just two points and two rebounds in the first period, but bounced back to post nine points (including 4-4 FTs) and eight rebounds in the second half on his way to record his first double-double of the season.

A 10-0 run helped UConn build a double-digit lead, 23-12, at the 12-minute mark of the first half, and the Illini wen into the break trailing 43-32.

Out of halftime, Illinois was held without a field goal for the first seven minutes, but hit eight free-throws before Boswell's triple at the 12:40 mark pulled them within 57-43. UConn used another quick 7-0 run to reach their biggest lead of 21 points, 64-43, at the midway point of the second half.

Boswell (5 points) and Ivistic (6) combined to lead the Illini on an 11-0 scoring run that pulled the team back within 10, 64-54, with just more than five minutes to play. The Illini held the Huskies without points for nearly five minutes during that run. Ivistic's 3-pointer at the 2:56 mark cut the Illini deficit to just seven points, 59-66, before a controversial four-point play by the Huskies all but ended the Illini's comeback effort.

The Illini forced an errant shot off the backboard by UConn's Alex Karaban with less than four seconds on the shot clock, which was erroneously reset as the offensive rebound was cleared out to Malachi Smith with two seconds left. Smith then drew contact against Jake Davis on a 3-point heave that banked in. The officials reviewed the shot clock error but determined that Smith's attempt would have fallen within the duration of the original shot clock, and Smith added a free throw to make it 70-59.

Game 9 Recap – #14 Illinois 75, #13 Tennessee 62

No. 14 Illinois used a balanced attack to deal the knockout blow in a 75-62 victory over No. 13 Tennessee in a physical, back-and-forth Music City Madness bout Saturday night at Bridgestone Arena.

Illinois (7-2) was led by four players in double-figures scoring, including 16 each from junior **Tomislav Ivisic** and freshman **Keaton Wagler**. Senior **Kylan Boswell** (15 points) and freshman **David Mirkovic** (10) also hit double-digits as the Illini outshot Tennessee (7-3) 48% to 37% in the contest.

The win, Illinois' 29th top-25 victory of the Brad Underwood era and its 20th in a ranked-vs.-ranked matchup since 2019-20, snapped a five-game skid for the Orange and Blue in neutral-site games vs. ranked opponents. It also marked the Illini's first win away from State Farm Center this season, and moved Illinois to 2-2 on the year against Top-25 opponents.

The Orange and Blue led by as many as six points in the first half, but were held to just one field goal over the final three minutes as the Volunteers went to the locker room clinging to a 34-32 lead. Out of the break, however, The Illini went on a 10-3 run, capped by a pair of **Wagler** 3-pointers, to regain the lead, 42-37 with 16 minutes to play. The Volunteers briefly regained a 49-48 lead at the 11:03 mark in the second, before Illinois answered with a 15-3 run to push the lead to double-digits for the first time at 63-52 with just under 7 minutes remaining.

Tennessee cut the Illinois lead to six points twice over the next few minutes, but **Zvonimir Ivisic** answered each time with 3-pointers on back-to-back Illini possessions to push the Illini advantage back to nine points. The triples from Zvonimir Ivisic jump-started a 12-5 run that allowed the Illini to close out the ranked win.

The 62 points surrendered by the Illini marked the team's fewest points allowed in a top-25 win vs. a nonconference opponent since a 75-59 victory over #25 Missouri on Dec. 23, 2008.

Game 10 Recap – #13 Illinois 88, Ohio State 80

No. 13 Illinois opened Big Ten play with a hard-fought 88-80 road victory over Ohio State on Tuesday night at Value City Arena.

Keaton Wagler finished with a career-high 23 points, making three 3-pointers while going 8-for-9 from the free throw line. He tied a career high with five assists.

David Mirkovic finished with 22 points while knocking down a career-high four 3-pointers. He corralled a game-high nine rebounds while converting all eight of his free throw attempts.

Andrej Stojakovic added 17 points, four rebounds, and an assist, while Zvonimir Ivisic totaled 13 points, eight rebounds, and a block off the bench.

The Illini went 29-for-32 at the free throw line as a team while recording 11 3-pointers.

Up by as many as 10 in the first half, the Orange and Blue eventually went into halftime with a 48-42 advantage, despite OSU's Bruce Thornton pouring in 24 of his game-high 34 points in the first half.

With the game tied at 53 early in the second half, the Illini pieced together an 8-2 scoring stretch go ahead once again. OSU ended a 3-minute scoreless drought before the Orange and Blue claimed the game's next five points to take a 66-58 advantage halfway through the final frame.

A Wagler 3-pointer, his third of the night, ended a three-minute stretch without an Illinois field goal, lengthening the lead to eight with just under three minutes remaining. After Ohio State trimmed its deficit to three, 79-76, with 1:19 to play, Tomislav Ivisic knocked down a 3-pointer which pushed the Illini advantage to 82-76 with 46 seconds left on the clock.

The Illini closed out the victory from the free-throw line to improve to 1-0 in conference play and 8-2 overall.

Game 11 Recap — #23 Nebraska 83, #13 Illinois 80

No. 13 Illinois fell to No. 23 Nebraska, 83-80, on a last-second 3-pointer in its Big Ten home opener at State Farm Center on Saturday afternoon.

Kylan Boswell finished with a team-high 20 points after tallying 12 points during the first period of play. Boswell grabbed three rebounds, including two on the offensive glass, while dishing out three assists.

Andrej Stojakovic scored 12 of his 19 points in the second half while grabbing a game-high 10 rebounds for his first double-double as an Illini. He tacked on an assist and a block.

Keaton Wagler collected 19 points, a career-high 10 assists, one block, and one steal en route to his first-career double-double. It marked the first points-assists double-double by an Illini since last march when Kaspars Jakucionis posted 16 points and 10 assists in the team's NCAA Tournament first round victory over Xavier.

Pryce Sandfort scored a game-high 32 points for Nebraska, and opened the game with 26 in the first half on 10-for-13 shooting and 6-for-8 from the three-point line.

Nebraska led by as many as 14 points in the first half, and on Sandfort's final triple of the game took a 37-24 lead with 4:15 in the period. The Illini stormed back to close the half on a 13-0 run to knot the game, 37-37.

Out of halftime, the Huskers held the Illini at arm's length and eventually pushed their lead back to double-digits, 61-51, with 11:40 to play. The Illini kept pace behind Boswell, Stojakovic and Wagler, and pulled within two points, 76-74, at the 1:40 mark.

After a pair of Nebraska free-throws, **Ben Humrichous** hit a triple to pull the Illini within one, 78-77, with 1 minute to play. Following a Nebraska tipin with 22 seconds on the clock, **Tomislav Ivisic** tied the game at 80 with 17 seconds on the clock. On Nebraska's final possession, Jamarques Lawrence hit a game-winning 3-pointers at the buzzer, snapping the Illini's eight-game home win streak.

Game 12 Recap — #20 Illinois 91, Missouri 48

No. 20 Illinois cruised to a 91-48 win over Missouri in the annual McBride Homes Braggins' Rights game at Enterprise Center in St. Louis on Monday night. The Fighting Illini outscored the Tigers 50-23 in the second half to post their largest margin of victory against the Tigers and extended their winning streak in the series to three games.

Ten Illini scored in the game led by **Keaton Wagler** who finished with a game-high 22 points. Knocking down a career-high five 3-pointers, the freshman guard also tallied eight rebounds, four assists, two blocks, and two steals. **Andrej Stojakovic** posted 16 points on 5-for-8 shooting, logging three rebounds, two assists, and a block, and **Tomislav Ivisic** turned in his eighth double-digit scoring effort of the season, going for 14 points with three 3-pointers. He also added five rebounds and an assist.

David Mirkovic collected nine points, five rebounds, five assists, a block, and a steal, **Ben Humrichous** buried three 3-pointers en route to a nine-point performance, and **Zvonimir Ivisic** secured eight points, a season-high 11 rebounds, and three rebounds off the bench.

Shooting 52% from the field, the Illini also dominated the glass, outrebounding the Tigers, 43-24, margin while scoring 29 second-chance points on 15 offensive boards.

After a slow start to the first half that saw neither side led by more than three through the opening eight minutes. With the game tied, at 14, the Illini outscored the Tigers 27-11 through the end of the half to take a 41-25 lead into the lockerroom.

Illinois' offensive onslaught and the team's most complete defensive effort of the season allowed the Orange and Blue to steadily pull away throughout the second half.

The lead surpassed 20 points during as part of an 8-0 run between the 18:34 mark and the 17:40 mark of the second period that saw the Illini build a 52-28 lead. Later in the half, a 6-0 Illinois run pushed the lead past the 30-point mark, 69-37 with 6:24 to play.

The Illini then closed out the game on another 8-0 run over the final 86 seconds of play to push the lead past 40 points en route to the 43-point victory.

The Illini shot 57.7% from the field across the first half while knocking down eight 3-pointers during the frame.

Holding the Jaguars to only one field goal in the span of six-and-a-half minutes in the second half, the Illini pieced together a 12-2 run, which extended their edge to 58-30 with 13:26 remaining.

That advantage climbed to 30 with 11 minutes left, and a 10-2 run soon after lengthened that lead to 74-38 with eight minutes to go.

The Illini lead grew as large as 36 as the Orange and Blue closed out the victory for their 10th triumph of the season.

After Penn State (9-5, 0-3) pulled within four, 17-13, the Illini opened up their largest lead of the first half with a 10-0 run to stake to a 27-13 advantage with 8:50 to play. The Illini went into the locker room leading by that same margin, 40-26.

Early in the second half, **Wagler** was called for his fourth personal foul and Penn State slowly chipped away at the deficit with the Illini's leading scorer on the bench. The Nittany Lions eventually pulled back within single digits, 46-37, at the 16:32 mark of the second period.

With the lead cut to eight points, 57-49, at the 7:27 mark, the Illini mounted another 7-0 run to reach the Orange and Blue's largest lead of the game to 15 points, 64-49, with 5:24 to play.

Down the stretch, the Illini hit 9-of-10 free-throws over the final five minutes to finish 23-of-28 from the stripe for the game and close out the road win.

No. 16 Illinois outlasted a late-game surge by No. 19 Iowa, to close out a 75-69 Big Ten road win in a Top-20 matchup on Sunday at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Illinois (13-3, 4-1 B1G) never trailed in the contest and built a 17-point lead at the 11-minute mark of the second half before a furious comeback effort by the host Hawkeyes (12-3, 2-3) cut the advantage to as close as four points, four times in the final two minutes.

Three Illini scored in double-figures, led by a game-high 19 points (16 in the second half) from freshman **Keaton Wagler**. Senior **Kylan Boswell** and junior **Andrej Stojakovic** each added 17 points, while freshman **David Mirkovic** posted team highs with 12 rebounds and five assists in the win.

The victory runs the Fighting Illini's season-long win streak to five straight since the team's Dec. 22 Braggin' Rights victory over Mizzou, and gives the Orange and Blue their first 3-0 road start to Big Ten play since the 2021-22 season.

The Illini knocked down 10 3-pointers in the game — four from **Wagler**, two from **Zvonimir Ivisic**, and one each from **Boswell**, **Mirkovic**, **Stojakovic** and **Tomislav Ivisic** — and outrebounded Iowa by a 38-31 margin.

Leading 47-38 with 14:30 to play, Illinois mounted an 11-3 run which included both of **Zvonimir Ivisic's** key 3-pointers and was capped by **Boswell's** triple at the 11:25 mark that gave the Orange and Blue a 58-41 advantage.

Iowa answered with seven straight points to pull back within 10, 58-48, with just under 10 minutes to play, but **Wagler** and **Boswell** held the Iowa comeback at bay. **Wagler** scored 11 of his 17 over the final 9 minutes, and **Boswell** tallied six of his 17 in the last 3 minutes to close out the win.

Game 17 Recap – #13 Illinois 79, Northwestern 68

No. 13 Illinois captured a 79-68 road win at Northwestern on Wednesday night, extending the Fighting Illini's season-long win streak to six games behind 22 points from Keaton Wagler and 21 from Tomislav Ivisic.

With the win, the Illini (14-3, 5-1 B1G) are off to their best 17-game start since the 2012-13 and improve to 4-0 on the road in Big Ten play for the first time since 2004-05.

Wagler poured in 20 of his 22 points in the second half – the most by a Big Ten freshman in a single stanza this season – including 3-for-5 from 3-point range and 3-for-3 from the free-throw line. Ivisic scored 14 points after the break, also knocking down three of his four 3-pointers after the intermission. He finished as the Illini's top rebounder with seven total rebounds. He and Wagler (five total rebounds) each posted three offensive rebounds in the contest.

Kylan Boswell also finished in double-figures scoring with 13 points for the Illini, while adding four rebounds and a game-high six assists and two steals.

The first half was a back-and-forth battle that featured eight lead changes before an Illini run to close the period gave the Orange and Blue a lead they would not relinquish. Trailing 27-25, the Illini closed the period by outscoring the Wildcats 13-6 over the final four minutes of action to take control. Boswell accounted for the Illini's final five points of the half.

Back-to-back threes from Wagler and Ivisic pushed the Illini lead to 46-35 with 18 minutes to play. And a 9-0 Illini run that included a triple from Jake Davis followed by six straight points from Wagler extended the lead to 62-47 at the 9:43 mark.

Northwestern answered with a 10-0 run of their own to pull back within five points, 62-57. But Ivisic (11 points), Wagler (four), and Boswell (two) combined to score all 17 of the Illini's points over the final 7:12 to close out the double-digit road win.

Illinois outscored Northwestern, 34-18, in the paint. The Orange and Blue also knocked down 11 3-pointers, the team's Big Ten-leading 12th game of the season with at least 10 triples.

Game 18 Recap – #13 Illinois 77, Minnesota 67

No. 13 Illinois posted a 77-67 victory over Minnesota, extending its winning streak to seven games after pulling away in the second half.

Zvonimir Ivisic finished with a team-high 18 points while going 5-for-8 from the field and 6-for-6 from the free throw line. Coming within a rebound of a double-double, he grabbed four of his nine boards on the offensive glass while also tallying three blocks and two steals.

Keaton Wagler continued his strong start to conference play with 17 points, five assists, four rebounds, and two steals. He knocked down a team-most four 3-pointers while dishing out all five assists, all in the second half.

David Mirkovic ended the afternoon with 12 points, eight rebounds, two assists, and a block, while Tomislav Ivisic totaled 10 points, seven rebounds, and an assist.

The Golden Gophers opened the game with a 6-0 lead before the Illini got on the board with an 8-0 run, the first of seven lead changes to go with 11 ties in the contest.

Minnesota re-established a six-point edge late in the frame, though Illinois closed the half on an 8-2 run as the sides entered the break knotted at 34.

With the Illini holding a one-point advantage midway through the second half, Illinois knocked down 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions to fuel a 10-0 run. That three-minute stretch helped the home side take a double-digit lead, 66-55, with 7:54 remaining.

A 7-0 Minnesota scoring stretch cut the Illini edge to four, but Illinois responded with an 8-0 run of its own, propelling the Orange and Blue to a 12-point edge with three minutes to go.

Getting stops on the other end of the floor, the Illini closed out the game from the free throw line while improving to 15-3 overall and 6-1 in Big Ten play.

No. 11 Illinois earned its eighth win in a row on Wednesday, cruising to an 89-70 victory over Maryland at State Farm Center. Leading by as many as 27 points, the Illini improved to 16-3 overall and 7-1 in Big Ten play behind four scorers in double figures.

Andrej Stojakovic was firing on all cylinders, scoring a season-high 30 points with nine rebounds and two blocks. It marked the fifth 30-point game of his career.

Keaton Wagler stepped up in **Kylan Boswell's** absence, recording 13 points and seven rebounds while dishing out a team-leading eight assists, his third 10/5/5 stat line of the the season, and his first since Dec. 29 vs. Southern.

David Mirkovic put up 15 points and nine rebounds, marking the fourth time he has scored 15+ points this season. His nine rebounds tied Stojakovic for the team lead.

Jake Davis, earning his fourth start of the season in place of Boswell, was efficient from beyond the arc, shooting 4-6 from deep for 12 points. **Tomislav Ivisic** contributed nine points and seven rebounds, while **Ben Humrichous** chipped in six points off 2-for-3 shooting from deep.

Illinois and Maryland traded buckets to start off the night. The Terrapins sank six of their first seven field goals, but Stojakovic responded with eight quick points to tie the score at 11 with 15:40 on the clock.

Maryland held a 24-19 lead at the midpoint of the half, but Illinois shut down the Terrapins with an explosive 28-6 run to close out the period. Mirkovic led the charge with 10 of those points, while the Illini entered the break with a 47-30 advantage.

Stojakovic stayed on a heater in the second half, scoring 12 points and grabbing four rebounds within the first six minutes after the break. Illinois' lead reached as high as 27 points, 86-59, and the team cruised to the 19-point victory.

Game 20 Recap — #11 Illinois 88, #4 Purdue 82

Freshman **Keaton Wagler** poured in 46 points, including a school-record nine 3-pointers, to lift No. 11 Illinois to a key 88-82 road win at No. 4 Purdue on Saturday afternoon.

Wagler scored early and often for Illinois, tallying in the team's first 14 points, to ignite an historic performance that marked the most points ever scored by an opponent at Purdue's Mackey Arena, and the most in a road win over a top-10 opponent in AP Poll history.

The win moves Illinois (17-3) to 8-1 in Big Ten play to keep pace in a tie for second with Michigan (18-1, 8-1 B1G) and Michigan State (18-2, 8-1) behind undefeated league-leader Nebraska (20-0, 9-0), while the Boilermakers (17-3) fall a game behind the Illini at 7-2 in league play in their only matchup of the regular season.

Purdue led by as many as 11 points in the first half, staking to a 35-24 lead at the 6:52 mark. Facing a 10-point deficit, **Zvonimir Ivisic** and **Wagler** each buried 3-pointers in the final minute of the half to keep the Orange and Blue within striking distance, 43-39.

Coming out of the locker room, **Wagler** scored the first five and a **Jake Davis** layup capped a 7-0 Illini run as Illinois swung the first of 12 second-half lead changes in their direction. Neither team led by more than five for the remainder of the contest until **David Mirkovic's** free-throws shut the door with five seconds to play.

Purdue was led by senior guard Braden Smith who tallied 27 points and a game-high 12 assists. Smith broke a 68-68 tie at the 5:18 with a 3-pointer and knocked down a jumper in the paint with go give the Boilermakers a 73-68 edge with 4:36 left in the game.

The Illini answered with a 5-0 run, capped by a Tomislav Ivisic 3-pointer at the 3:31 mark. Following a bucket by Purdue's Trey Kaufman-Renn, the Illini got back-to-back triples from **Davis** and **Mirkovic** to take a 79-75 lead inside of 2 minutes on the clock and never trailed again in closing out the win.

No. 9 Illinois extended its Big Ten-leading winning streak to 10 with a 75-66 victory over Washington at a sold-out State Farm Center Thursday night in the Fighting Illini's annual Krush Cancer game.

The Illini moved to 18-3 overall and 9-1 in Big Ten play, keeping pace in a four-way tie atop the conference standings at the midway point of the league race.

Keaton Wagler led all scorers with 22 points on 7-for-13 shooting. He saw the floor for 38 minutes and also recorded eight assists, five rebounds, and two steals.

Wagler was joined in double-figures scoring by classmate David Mirkovic, who put up 19 points and six rebounds. It marked Mirkovic's highest-scoring game since his 22-point night at Ohio State on Dec. 9.

The Illini knocked down 11 3-pointers as a team, led by Ben Humrichous, who knocked down four triples on six attempts to finish with 14 points.

Andrej Stojakovic contributed eight points and grabbed three rebounds while Tomislav Ivusic recorded seven points and six rebounds. Zvonimir Ivusic contributed to the win with five boards in 15 minutes.

Washington opened the game with a 7-0 run, but Illinois quickly responded with a 10-0 stretch over the next four minutes and never trailed again. The Orange and Blue held a 16-11 lead at the 9:36 mark, with all 16 points — eight each — coming from the freshman duo of Wagler and Mirkovic.

The Illini led by as many as seven points in the opening half and went into the locker room holding a 33-26 lead.

Out of the break, the Illini pushed their lead to 10 points twice in the first eight minutes of the half, but UW climbed back to within five points each time. Humrichous' final triple of the contest, at the 1:33 mark, gave the Illini a 72-61 lead, and was followed by another Wagler 3-pointer just 30 seconds later to put the game out of reach.

Game 22 Recap — #9 Illinois 78, #5 Nebraska 69

Freshman point guard Keaton Wagler scored 28 points — 23 in the second half — to lift No. 9 Illinois to its second top-5 road win in eight days with a 78-69 victory over No. 5 Nebraska at Pinnacle Bank Arena on Sunday afternoon.

Wagler, who scored 46 points last Saturday in Illinois' win at No. 4 Purdue, helped the Fighting Illini overcome a six-point halftime deficit vs. the Huskers to secure the team's 11th straight win. It marks the first time that Illinois has won consecutive road matchups against top-5 opponents in program history.

With the win, the Illini (19-3, 10-1 B1G) keep pace with No. 3-ranked Michigan at the top of the Big Ten standings, moving a game ahead of the Huskers who are tied with No. 7 Michigan State at 9-2 in league play.

Wagler was joined in double-figures scoring by juniors Jake Davis and Tomislav Ivusic with 13 and 12, respectively, and fellow freshman David Mirkovic who tallied 10 points. Mirkovic and Ivusic also tied for the game-high with eight rebounds as the Illini posted a 40-27 edge on the glass.

The contest featured six ties and nine lead changes but the Illini controlled the action for most of the game despite a 14-2 scoring run for Nebraska that allowed the Huskers to turn a six-point deficit into a 39-33 lead at the break.

A Wagler layup opened the second half scoring, and the Illini erased the halftime deficit for good on his three-pointer with just more than 13 minutes to play.

Davis' 3-pointer at the 8:52 mark ignited a 10-0 Illini scoring run that included a bucket from Mirkovic and the final five points from Wagler. His triple at the 6:45 mark gave the Illini an 11-point lead, 63-52.

Game 23 Recap — #5 Illinois 84, Northwestern 44

No. 5 Illinois (20-3, 11-1 B1G) soared past Northwestern (10-13, 2-10 B1G), 84-44, to earn the program's largest victory in a Big Ten matchup since 2004. The victory extends Illinois' winning streak to 12.

A balanced offensive effort led to five Illini scoring in double-digits as the team knocked down 17 threes. Illinois dominated the rebound battle 50-23.

On the defensive end, the Illini shut down the Big Ten's leading scorer, Nick Martinelli, holding him to just four points while the Wildcats shot 19-of-65 as a group.

Andrej Stojakovic led Illinois in the scoring column, putting up 17 points on 4-for-6 shooting aided by a 9-for-10 night at the charity stripe. This marks Stojakovic's 10th 15+ point outing this season.

Ben Humrichous, Keaton Wagler and Zvonimir Ivisic all recorded 13 points and seven rebounds against the Wildcats. Wagler dished out five assists.

David Mirkovic put up 12 points and tied his career-high with four threes; he also secured seven rebounds.

Tomislav Ivisic grabbed a team-high 12 rebounds in just 24 minutes while contributing five points, and Jake Davis sank three triples to tally nine points.

Illinois opened the floodgates early in the night, going on a monstrous 33-4 run highlighted by seven threes in a six-minute stretch. The Illini were brilliant on both sides of the floor, holding the Wildcats to 8-for-31 shooting while Illinois shot 14-for-28.

Mirkovic, Humrichous, Wagler and Davis all sank multiple threes in the half to lead Illinois to a season-high 11 first half threes.

The Illini stayed hot coming out of the locker room, going on a 16-2 run right out of the half. After the Wildcats scored seven points over a two-minute stretch before Illinois responded once again with another 11-0 run.

Game 26 Recap — #8 Illinois 71, Indiana 51

No. 8 Illinois powered past Indiana, 71-51, at the State Farm Center Sunday. The Illini (21-5, 12-3 B1G) secured the victory with a dominant 33-20 second half and a 38-25 rebounding advantage over the Hoosiers (17-9, 8-7 B1G).

David Mirkovic led the offensive charge with 25 points, shooting an efficient 10-for-16 from the field and sinking three 3-pointers. His 25 points marked a career-high against a Big Ten opponent. **Mirkovic** was also dominant on the glass, grabbing seven rebounds, including a pair of offensive boards.

Keaton Wagler recorded 18 points, six rebounds, three assists and a career-high three steals. **Wagler's** 18 points marks his 18th consecutive outing scoring in double-digits. Tomislav Ivisic scored 14, 12 in the second half. He grabbed six boards, four on the offensive end.

Returning to the floor following a seven-game absence with a broke right hand, **Kylan Boswell** tallied nine points, seven rebounds, two assists and a steal. He pulled in four rebounds on the offensive glass.

Ben Humrichous made a big impact on the win with eight rebounds and two steals. His team-leading eight boards is a season-high, and the most he's had in a game since January 2025.

Indiana opened the contest with a hot hand on 6-for-10 shooting to take a 15-14 lead. A 10-0 Illinois run, capped by 3-pointers from **Boswell** and **Mirkovic**, gave the Illini a lead they would not relinquish for the remainder of the game.

The Illini bullied the Hoosiers in the first half, using an 18-12 rebounding advantage and 15 points from **Mirkovic** to create a 38-31 edge going into the locker room.

Illinois dominated the early minutes of the second half, holding Indiana without a field goal for the first four minutes and eventually going on a 4-minute, 11-0 run to push their lead to 54-36 with 12 minutes to play. The Illini left no doubt, closing out the game on an 11-3 run to secure the 20-point victory.

Game 27 Recap — #10 Illinois 101, USC 65

No. 10 Illinois stormed out to an early lead and never looked back, using a balanced scoring attack en route to a dominant, 101-65 road win over USC at the Galen Center Wednesday night.

The Illini (22-5, 13-3 B1G), received double-digit scoring contributions from seven different players — the most by a Big Ten team in a road win over another power conference opponent since at least 2010-11. The 36-point victory over the Trojans (18-8, 7-8 B1G) marked Illinois' largest in a Big Ten road win in 80 years since a 70-28 win at Chicago on Jan. 19, 1946.

Andrej Stojakovic, in his return from a two-game absence due to an ankle injury, poured in a game-high 22 points in just 18 minutes off the bench. Stojakovic shot 6-for-7 from the field, including hitting his only 3-point attempt of the contest, and went 9-for-9 from the free-throw line,

Behind **Stojakovic**, **David Mirkovic** tallied 14 points, **Kylan Boswell** and **Jake Davis** recorded 12 each, **Ben Humrichous** scored 11, and **Tomislav Ivisic** and **Keaton Wagler** each added 10.

Davis (4-for-4) and **Humrichous** (3-for-6) combined for seven of the Illini's 13 3-pointers on the night. **Ivisic** and **Mirkovic** each added a pair of 3-pointers.

In addition to his perfect shooting night, **Davis** also recorded a team-high seven rebounds, his best effort of the season on the boards, for the Illini. It marked his first game as the Illini's top rebounder over the last two seasons.

As a team, Illinois shot 52% from the field, 45% from 3-point range, and 92% from the charity stripe, becoming the only Big Ten team to post 50-40-90 shooting splits in a 100+--point effort since at least 2000.

Game 28 Recap — UCLA 95, #10 Illinois 94 (OT)

No. 10 Illinois led by as many as 23 in the first half and battled through a back-and-forth second half to force overtime before falling, 95-94, on a buzzer-beater Saturday night at UCLA's Pauley Pavilion.

Five Illini scored in double-figures, paced by 19 from **Keaton Wagler** who broke Illinois' freshman season record for total points, while adding a game-high eight rebounds (six offensive) and a team-leading six assists. Wagler broke record of 494 — set by Corey Bradford in 1998-99 and tied last year by Kaspas Jakucionis — with a layup at the 16:38 mark on the second half. He sits at 509 points this season.

Wagler scored 16 of his 19 points in second half and overtime, including an offensive rebound and putback with just under five seconds left in the overtime period that gave the Illini a 94-93 lead. However, on the ensuing play, UCLA inbounded to Donovan Dent who raced up the floor, weaving through the Illini defense in 4.9 seconds to convert the game-winning layup as time expired.

Tomislav Ivisic recorded 16 points and six rebounds, and **Ben Humrichous** added 15 points on a career-best five 3-pointers. **Kylan Boswell** posted 13 points, six rebounds and five assists, and **Zvonimir Ivisic** recorded 11 points.

Illinois (22-6, 13-4 B1G) has now fallen in overtime in each of the team's last three losses to Big Ten foes over the last two weeks, and the Orange and Blue's four Big Ten losses have come by a combined nine points.

Four of **Humrichous'** five 3-pointers came in a 20-0 run by the Illini that pushed a 13-10 lead to a 33-10 Illini advantage just past the midway point of the first half. UCLA chipped away at the Illini's lead over the remainder of the period and closed the half on a 8-2 run to cut the Illini lead to 50-43 at the break.

Out of the break, the Illini lead once again reached double-figures before UCLA a 13-2 UCLA run knotted the game, 56-56 with 14:45 left in regulation. The rest of the second half included nine more ties, including Wagler's free-throws with 1

Game 29 Recap — #3 Michigan 84, #10 Illinois 70

No. 10 Illinois came up short in a top-10 matchup with No. 3 Michigan on Friday night, falling 84-70 in front of a sold-out crowd at State Farm Center.

Illinois (22-7, 13-5 B1G) entered the contest on a nine-game win streak vs. the Wolverines, but Michigan (27-2, 17-1 B1G) pulled away throughout the second half to secure their first win at State Farm Center in seven seasons.

Keaton Wagler led Illinois in scoring with 23 points, his ninth 20-point game of the season. He also recorded four rebounds, three assists and two steals.

David Mirkovic recorded his sixth double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Kylan Boswell finished with 15 points, two assists and a steal to mark his fourth straight game scoring in double figures. This is his 22nd time doing so this season, and the 38th time of his career.

Illinois built an early lead, 16-11, just seven minutes into the contest. An Illini scoring drought over the next four minutes resulted in an 11-0 Michigan run that put the Orange and Blue in a six-point hole, 22-16, just more than halfway the period.

Trailing 38-31 at halftime, Illinois battled to begin the second period, and trailed 53-48 following a **Wagler** 3-pointer with 13:09 to play. Michigan went on another run, however, scoring 22 of the game's next 28 points to push the Illini deficit to 21 points, 75-54, with 6:49 to play.

The Wolverines outshot the Illini, 52.5% to 41.3%, including a blistering 60% (18-for-30) in the second half. Michigan also won the rebounding battle, 34-30, outboarding the Illini for just the fourth time this season.

Game 30 Recap — #11 Illinois 80, Oregon 54

No. 11 Illinois (23-7, 14-5) used a dominant first half to cruise by Oregon (11-19, 4-15), 80-54, in front of a Senior Night sellout crowd at the State Farm Center. The win finishes off Illinois' season at home with a record of 14-3.

Andrej Stojakovic (21 points) and **David Mirkovic** (19) teamed up to put 40 points on the board. **Stojakovic** turned in his second double-double of the season with a game-high 12 rebounds.

Oregon won the tip and built a 6-0 lead before **Mirkovic** knocked down a three to get Illinois on the board three minutes into the game. After missing their first five shot attempts of the night, the Illini heated up to take their first lead, 11-9, at 13:43 when **Zvonimir Ivisic** converted a three-point play after being fouled on a layup.

Illinois exploded with a monstrous 24-2 run over a seven-minute span. The Illini locked up the Ducks on defense, holding them to 1-for-16 shooting over that stretch while the Orange and Blue shot 11-for-17, to build a 27-11 lead at the 8:30 mark before pushing the lead to 20 points, 41-21, at halftime.

While Oregon opened the second half with a 16-7 stretch to narrow their deficit to 50-37, Illinois was quick to put its foot on the gas. The Illini went on their second huge run of the day, going 15-0 over three-and-a-half minutes, including seven straight points from **Stojakovic**, to take a 65-37 lead.

Illinois held Oregon without a field goal for 7:38 late in the second half, going on a 23-6 run over that span. The Illini closed out the night with a flurry of five points from senior AJ Redd, a career-high mark.

Game 31 Recap — #11 Illinois 78, Maryland 72

No. 11 Illinois outlasted host Maryland on Sunday afternoon at XFINITY Center, capturing a 78-72 road win to close out the regular season and secure a top-four seed and a triple-bye into the quarterfinals at the upcoming Big Ten Tournament.

Three Illini scored in double-figures, led by a clutch 22-point, 11-rebound double-double from freshman F **David Mirkovic** that proved to be the difference in a back-and-forth battle. Mirkovic's performance buoyed the Illini early in the game, and held off Maryland throughout the second half while starting guards **Keaton Wagler** and **Kylan Boswell** worked their way to 11 points each.

Illinois (24-7, 15-5 B1G) and Maryland (11-20, 4-16 B1G) fought for 40 minutes, to the tune of 13 ties and four lead changes. Though they shot just 21% (5-14) from 3-point range, the Illini dominated down low with a 42-20 scoring edge in the paint, overcoming a 30-point outburst by UM freshman G Andre Mills.

Jake Davis, **Zvonimir Ivisic**, and **Andrej Stojakovic** all chipped in with eight points and two rebounds in the contest. **Davis** and **Ben Humrichous** (6 points) each hit a pair of 3-pointers for the Illini, and **Boswell** connected on one. The team's five makes from distance tied a season-low.

Illinois posted a 33-30 rebounding edge in the contest, and turned a slim 12-11 edge on the offensive glass into a 19-6 advantage in second-chance points. Illinois also shot 81% (21-26) from the free-throw line, registering 10 more makes than the Terps (11-for-15 FTs).

After more than 35 minutes of game time in which neither team led by more than two possessions, it was at the line where the Illini closed out the win. A pair of **Zvonimir Ivisic** free-throws at the 4:42 mark gave the Orange and Blue their largest lead of the day, 70-62. That started a closing stretch in which Illinois shot 8-for-10 from the free-throw line over the final 4:42 to secure the victory.

Game 32 Recap — #23 Wisconsin 91, #9 Illinois 88 (OT)

Ninth-ranked and No. 4 seed Illinois fell to No. 5-seeded Wisconsin, 91-88, in overtime in the Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals Friday afternoon at United Center.

The freshman duo of **Keaton Wagler** and **David Mirkovic** each scored 19 points to lead the Illini. Wagler also led the Illini with eight assists in the game, while Mirkovic added five rebounds (three offensive) and five assists. Junior G **Andrej Stojakovic** added 17 points and tied **Zvonimir Ivisic** for the team lead with seven rebounds.

Zvonimir, his brother **Tomislav Ivisic**, and **Kylan Boswell** all chipped in with nine points.

The Illini fell behind early as the Badgers built a 10-5 edge to open the game. The Orange and Blue answered with a 23-3 run to take control of the game, 28-13, with nine minutes left to play in the first half.

A 12-0 Badgers run cut the Illini lead to 32-29 before the teams headed into the locker room with Illinois leading, 36-30.

Out of the break, Illinois pulled away steadily to rebuild a 15-point lead, 60-54, with 11:30 left in regulation. But Wisconsin responded, tying the game at 67-67 with just under five minutes on the clock. Neither team lead by more than three points the rest of the way, and the game headed to overtime.

Mirkovic scored all 10 points for the Illini in the extra period. Wisconsin's lead reached as high as seven points with 14 seconds to play before a Mirkovic 3-pointer and a quick layup just two seconds later kept the Illini within striking distance, 90-88. After a free-throw miss by Wisconsin, Wagler's game-tying 3-point attempt rimmed away.
