Game Six – Panthers Welcome Rival Florida Atlantic to Ocean Bank Field at FIU Stadium

Coming off a Conference USA opener victory at UAB, the FIU football team welcomes the Florida Atlantic Owls to Miami, marking the 13th ever matchup between the two teams. Kickoff is set for 7:05 p.m. and will be televised live on FSN. Fans can also listen to the contest on 1210AM ESPN Deportes with **Mike Levine** (play-by-play) and **Pete Pelegrin** (color analyst) calling the action.

FIU used a strong defensive effort and big plays on offense to earn a 34-20 victory at UAB on Saturday. FIU tied a school record by forcing six turnovers and also scored touchdowns on offense of 85 and 75 yards in the victory.

The school record of six turnovers in a game has happened twice in the history of the FIU Football program. FIU also forced six turnovers vs. Florida A&M on Nov. 27, 2004. Of the six turnovers on Saturday, four came on interceptions. The four interceptions by the FIU defense are tied for second most in a single game in school history. FIU also had four interceptions at Texas A&M on Sept. 18, 2010 and at Gardner Webb on Nov. 15, 2003. Redshirt junior **Richard Leonard** had two of the interceptions versus the Blazers, returning one for a score, while **Demarkus Perkins** also took one back all the way.

Offensively, the Panthers used two big plays on offense that helped set the tone in the game, tallying the second and sixth longest pass plays in school history. Freshman quarterback **Alex McGough** recorded his second career 200-yard passing game in the victory. McGough threw for 204 yards and two scores, while the FIU offense did not turn the ball over in the win. Sophomore **Jonnu Smith** (75 yards) and redshirt senior **Glenn Coleman** (85 yards) were responsible for the big scores.

A Quick Look at Florida Atlantic

With 2:15 left in the game and the Florida Atlantic University football team trailing UTSA 37-34, quarterback Jaquez Johnson pieced together a 9-play, 93-yard drive and threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to freshman Nate Terry to give the Owls a 41-37 win on Saturday, Sept. 27.



Johnson ended his night with 24 completions on 34 attempts with 295 yards and three touchdowns through the air. He also rushed for 37 yards and a score. Whitehead tallied 169 total yards, including 86 yards of kick returns.

Defensively, Andrae Kirk had the game of his career with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss, two passes broken up, and an interception. Damian Parms tied his career high with 11 tackles and also had two for loss.

Leonard Named C-USA Defensive Player of the Week

FIU's **Richard Leonard** was been named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week for the week of Sept. 28.

Leonard had a career day, helping FIU pick up its first Conference USA victory of the season, with a 34-20, victory over UAB in Birmingham, Ala. The contest pitted the league's top offense (UAB) versus C-USA's top defense (FIU) with the Panthers coming out on top thanks in part to a school-record six turnovers forced. Leonard accounted for two of those, picking off two passes versus the Blazers. One of those interceptions resulted in a touchdown; Leonard's second pick-six of the season.

The award marks the second weekly conference award for Leonard this season (C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week) and the third during his FIU career.

Credentials

Credentials for FIU home football games are for working media only. Requests for media credentials should be made in writing on organizational letterhead at least one week prior to home games. Requests should be directed to Greg Kincaid, Director of Sports Information - 11200 Southwest 8 Street FIU Arena, Room 211 Miami, FL 33199. Requests from media covering visiting teams will be confirmed first with each opponent's sports information contact.

Spouses, dates, children under 18 and other non-workers are not permitted in working media areas in compliance with the working code of the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). All media services (statistics, telephones, game information, etc.) will be readily available for your convenience.

All credentials that cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call, which is located Gate 11 (just north of the Field House). Will call will open one-and-a-half hours prior to kickoff. Members of the media picking up credentials at Will Call must provide photo identification and the name must match the name on the credential.

Photographers

Photo credentials are issued on a game-by-game basis. FIU will adhere to all NCAA guidelines regarding sideline photography that limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines.

Parking

Preferred parking at FIU Stadium is extremely limited. Media requesting parking should contact Athletic Media Relations well in advance.

Press Policies

Working space in the press box is limited and assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Credentials will be issued according to the following criteria:

- 1.) Local and state newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponents' area and student newspapers from FIU and opponents' schools.
- 2.) Other daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 3.) Radio and television personnel not broadcasting but considered reporting.
- 4.) Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 5.) Scouts.

Freelance bloggers and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be requested as verification of writers' status.

Telephones

A limited number of telephone lines are available in FIU Stadium's press box for working media. These phones require collect calls or a credit card for billing.

FIU provides an ISDN and one business telephone line free of charge to the primary visiting radio outlook.

Wireless Internet

The FIU Stadium press box offers free wireless Internet service to media members. Instructions will be provided in the press box on game day.

E-Mail/Fax Services

Following each FIU home game, the Athletic Media Relations office will e-mail and/or fax whatever information media members need to their respective agencies. Please ask any member of the FIU athletic media relations staff for assistance on this matter.

Post-Game Interviews

After a cooling off period, FIU Head Coach Ron Turner will be brought to a designated interview room, along with requested players. THE FIU LOCKER ROOM IS CLOSED TO THE MEDIA.

Each visiting team will set its own post-game interview policy.

Practice Policies

During the season practices are normally conducted at Ocean Bank Field at FIU Stadium. Practice are generally closed to the media. Photographers and videographers should contact the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department for days and times to shoot practice.

Student-Athlete Interviews

Selected FIU players will be made available following practices on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons throughout the season. Telephone interviews can also be arranged through the FIU Athletic Media Relations office. No players' phone numbers will be given out.

Ron Turner Interviews

Head Coach Ron Turner is available for on-field interviews at the end of practices, Tuesday through Thursday. For out-of-town interviews with Coach Turner, please contact the FIU Media Relations office.

Conference USA Media Services

Conference USA produces a weekly football release on Mondays throughout the season, which includes updated standings, statistics, results and previews. The conference also selects Offensive, Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week each Monday during the season. Defense Halts Potent UAB Offense

Entering last Saturday's contest at UAB, FIU was stepping into a challenge, facing one of the toughest offensive teams in Conference USA. UAB came into the game averaging 507 yards of total offense and 41 points per game. While FIU held the Blazers to 20 points in the matchup, the Panthers limited UAB to just 380 total yards of offense, a team that pounded out 490 yards vs. Troy, 516 vs. Mississippi State and 483 vs. Alabama A&M in its previous three games. In addition, UAB came into the game averaging 215.3 yards on the ground. FIU held the running game to 183 yards in the win. This came after FIU held Louisville to 12 net rushing yards the previous week on Sept. 20.

Leonard Leaping up the Returns List

The interception return for a touchdown by **Richard Leonard** in the second quarter at UAB was his fourth total return for a touchdown in his career (1 kickoff, 1 punt, 2 interceptions). Leonard's four career touchdown returns rank tied for second all-time in FIU history, joining **Nick Turnbull** (2002-05) and **Lionell Singleton** (2004-07). On seven different occasions now, an FIU player has recorded two returns for a touchdown in a single season. Leonard did it for the second time in his career, as he tallied two returns during the 2012 season as well. The only other FIU player to have two or more returns for a touchdown in a single season on two different occasions is T.Y. Hilton, who accomplished the feat in 2008 and 2010.

Big Plays in Birmingham

It wasn't just the defense making its mark in Birmingham on Sept 27. The FIU offense had its share of big plays, including a pair of touchdown passes equaling 75 and 85 yards. Freshman quarterback **Alex McGough** found sophomore **Jonnu Smith** barreled down the sideline for 75 yards and the school's sixth-longest reception in school history. It was a then-career-high for McGough. That changed in the third quarter when the Tampa native hit redshirt senior **Glenn Coleman** for an 85-yard touchdown pass to break the game wide open. The touchdown pass was the second-longest reception in FIU history.

The Takeaway Game

The school record of six turnovers in a game has happened twice in the history of the FIU Football program. FIU also forced six turnovers vs. Florida A&M on Nov. 27, 2004. Of the six turnovers on Saturday, four came on interceptions. The four interceptions by the FIU defense are tied for second most in a single game in school history. FIU also had four interceptions at Texas A&M on Sept. 18, 2010 and at Gardner Webb on Nov. 15, 2003. Redshirt junior **Richard Leonard** had two of the interceptions versus the Blazers, returning one for a score, while **Demarkus Perkins** also took one back all the way.

A Closer Look at the Turnover Numbers

The FIU defense has forced 17 turnovers through the team's first five games. The Panthers are second in the nation in total turnovers (Virginia – 18) and are tied for first with the Cavaliers in fumble recoveries with 10. The 10 fumble recoveries for the Panthers already ranks as the fourth-most in a single season at FIU with seven games remaining. The Panthers had a total of seven fumble recoveries during the 2013 season.

With the team's four-interception outing last Saturday at UAB, FIU is currently No. 11 in the nation in interceptions with seven.

Controlling the Ground Game Versus Louisville

On Saturday, Sept. 20, the FIU defense held the Louisville Cardinals to just 12 net rushing yards. The Cardinals totaled 12 yards on 35 carries for an average of 0.3 yards-per-carry. The total yards were the third-fewest allowed by an FIU defense, while 0.3 yards-per-carry ranked the second best in program history. It was the ninth-lowest rushing total by a Cardinal squad in the 96-year history of Louisville football.

Panther Defense Continues to Be Dominant

Through five games, FIU's defensive unit has been one of the tops in the nation statistically. Entering this Thursday's game, the Panthers rank No. 23 in total defense (317.8 yards-per-game), No. 59 in rushing defense (139.8 yards-per-game), No. 20 in passing defense (178.0 yards-per-game), No. 14 in team sacks (3.60 per game), No. 5 in turnover margin (+2.00) and No. 2 in turnovers gained (17).

Juniors **Michael Wakefield** and **Denzell Perine** lead the team in sacks and tackles for loss both among the nation's leaders in the respective categories. Wakefield is No. 9 in sacks (1.10 per game) and No. 21 in tackles for loss (1.5 per game) in the nation while Perine is No. 37 in sacks (0.90 per game) among all FBS players.

The Panthers lead the nation in fumbles recovered (10) with Wakefield rated No. 4 in the nation with two fumble recoveries. Including Wakefield, nine Panthers have recovered fumbles this season.

Weather Delays

The FIU football team has experienced back-to-back games in which there were weather delays. In total the Panthers have been delayed 1:52 combined versus a pair of ACC foes (Pittsburgh – 49 minute delay; Louisville – 1:02 delay).

NCAA Record Set for Safeties

On Saturday, Sept. 13, FIU and Pittsburgh combined for three safeties (1 for FIU, 2 for Pitt). That tied the NCAA record for safeties recorded in a contest which has happened four other times (Penn State vs. Maryland – Sept. 17, 1966; Arizona State vs. Nebraska – Sept. 21, 1996; North Texas vs. Louisiana-Lafayette – Sept. 27, 2003; Bowling Green vs. Miami [Ohio] – Nov. 15, 2005).

Gardner Sets Record in First-Career Start

Freshman running back **Alex Gardner** earned his first-career start versus Wagner and entered his name into the FIU record books. With 138 yards rushing, the Jacksonville, Fla., native set the record for an FIU freshman for rushing yards in a game, passing **Silas Spearman III**, who ran for 136 at Southern Miss on Oct. 5, 2013. Gardner became the fourth FIU true freshman to rush for over 100 yards in a game, joining Spearman, **Darriett Perry** (2008) and **Kedrick Rhodes** (2010). Gardner's 61-yard rush in the second quarter against the Seahawks was the second longest non-scoring rush in school history and is tied for the seventh longest rush from scrimmage in school history, along with **T.Y. Hilton** who recorded a 61-yard rush at Troy on Nov. 13, 2010.

Smith Tallies First 100-Yard Receiving Game

With 127 receiving yards versus Wagner, sophomore tight end **Jonnu Smith** notched his first-career 100-yard receiving game. Smith became the first FIU player to tally over 100 yards receiving in a game since **Willis Wright** versus WKU (128 yards) on Oct. 27, 2012. Smith's 41-yard touchdown reception that put FIU up 7-0 early in the contest was the longest reception of his career. With the 127 receiving yards, the sophomore passed **Joe Struyf** (2002-03, 05) for second all-time for receiving yards by a tight end. Smith now has 699 career receiving yards. He has recorded at least one reception in each of his first 17 career games.

Forcing the Issue

During FIU's 34-3 win over Wagner on Saturday, Sept. 6, the Panthers forced six turnovers, resulting in 20 points. The six turnovers (4 fumbles and 2 interceptions) were the most since FIU recorded six takeaways versus Florida A&M (11/27/04). The four fumble recoveries tied a school record (Florida A&M – 11/27/04) with junior **Michael Wakefield** tying the program record for fumbles recovered by one player (2).

First-Time Opponents in 2014

- ▶ FIU will face four first-time opponents in 2014. The first-time matchups include Wagner (9/6), at UTSA (10/11), Rice (11/1) and at Old Dominion (11/8).
- ▶ FIU is 1-0 versus first-time opponents this season (34-3 win over Wagner).
- ▶ In its history, 2002-14, FIU is 16-38 in first-time meetings with its 54 all-time opponents.

punt return yards versus Florida Atlantic on Nov. 12, 2011. The 148 punt return yards also rank tied for third in C-USA history (Travis Williams – East Carolina vs. Memphis – 11/20/2004).

► Leonard also returned a punt for 71 yards versus Bethune-Cookman, which set up a touchdown late in the fourth quarter for the Panthers. The 71-yard punt return was the fifth-longest in school history and the longest non-scoring punt return in program history.

► His 148 yards combined with teammate **Clin-ton Taylor's** 14 yards in the punt-return game, set the school record for punt return yards in a game with 162 (previous was 105 vs. Florida Atlantic – 11/12/11).

► Leonard's performance gave FIU an average starting field position of their own 42-yard line, including an average of Bethune-Cookman's 47-yard line in the fourth quarter.

► For his career Leonard has recorded 18 punt returns for 281 yards with one touchdown and 39 kick returns for 1,101 yards and one score.

More on Jonnu Smith

► His nine catches versus Wagner were one shy of his career-best (10) which the second-year Panther recorded versus East Carolina last season.

► Has caught at least one pass in 17-straight games.

► A C-USA All-Freshman selection last season, Smith has led the team in receptions in 11 of the 17-career games he has played at FIU.

► His 75-yard touchdown reception at UAB was a career-high and the sixth-longest reception in FIU history.

FIU Football Making an Impact in the Community

During the 2012-2013 academic year, the football team completed 187.5 hours of community service. The Panthers almost tripled their hours in 2013-2014 by completing 524.75 hours.

Making the Grade

Since the spring semester of 2013 the FIU football team has embarked on a steady climb when it comes to its grade-point average.

The Panthers football team had a combined GPA of 2.1 in the 2012 fall semester. The following fall term (Coach Turner's first fall term at FIU), the team earned a 2.35 GPA. In the 2013 spring term, the Panthers notched a 2.43 GPA and a 2.58 GPA in the most recently completed spring term. The team also progressed in the summer semesters. In summer 2013, the Panthers had a combined 2.68 GPA, culminating with a team-best 3.01 GPA this past summer.

Home is Where the Heart is

During the 2014 season, FIU will host a school-record eight home games. Prior to 2014, the most home games the Panthers have had in a single season was seven (2002). That year, the team went 5-2 at home.

Returning a lot at Catches

FIU enters the 2014 season, returning the second-highest percentage of receptions from last season. The Panthers return 92.2 percent from a year ago (141-of-153) and are one of only four schools to have a percentage higher than 90 percent (Akron - 96.6; FIU - 92.2; UTSA - 91.1; Auburn - 90.2).

► **Jose Laphitzondo:** Will be playing football for the first time in his life. He has been a rugby player since the age of eight, serving as a kicker in all three disciplines (kickoff, clearance, kick for points). He played on the FIU rugby club team prior to joining the football team

► **Jeremiah McKinnon:** Cousin, Cedric McKinnon, played at Bethune-Cookman, spent nine seasons in the Arena Football League and was an All-AFL player.

► **Luke and Sam Medlock:** Father, Ricky, was a former MVP soccer player in 1975 at Jacksonville University, and spent time in Europe playing professionally.

► **Wonderful Monds II:** Father, Wonderful, Jr., was a First-Team All-American at Nebraska and played for the San Francisco 49ers. His oldest brother, also named Wonderful, played baseball in the Atlanta, Colorado, and Cincinnati organizations. His brother, Mario, played for the Cincinnati Bengals and Miami Dolphins.

► **Shug Oyegunle:** Brother, Yemi, played football at The Citadel with FIU Assistant Coach Cameron Turner.

► **Fred Porter:** An impressive story of determination and perseverance. Came to FIU in 2011 as a walk-on quarterback and redshirted the season. He was moved to wide receiver during spring 2012 to add depth to the position. A year later, he worked his way up the depth chart into a starting role. He earned a scholarship following the Bethune-Cookman game in 2013.

► **Sergio Sroka:** Father, Roberto, was a kicker for the St. Louis Cardinals in 1981 and 1982.

Head Coach Ron Turner (Second Season)



Ron Turner was named FIU's head football coach on January 4, 2013, bringing with him an outstanding resume from coaching at the collegiate and professional levels.

Entering his second season with the Panthers, Turner's 37 years in coaching have included nine as a head coach with Illinois and San Jose State. During his 24 previous seasons in college football, Turner's career was highlighted with participation in eight bowl games: Rose, Fiesta, Sugar, Aloha, Citrus and Micron PC.

After he led an impressive turnaround at the University of Illinois, which resulted in the school's 2001 Big Ten championship, the league unanimously voted him that season's Big Ten Coach of the Year.

In 12 seasons coaching in the National Football League, Turner spent the majority of those seasons with the Chicago Bears, in addition to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Indianapolis Colts.

His NFL resume includes being named the 1995 Pro Football Weekly Assistant Coach of the Year; four playoff appearances; Offensive Coordinator during the Bears' 2006 NFC Championship and Super Bowl season; an assistant with the Colts' 2010 AFC South title team; quarterbacks coach with a 2012 Tampa Bay squad that netted team records for total yards, passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Prior to becoming FIU's third all-time head football coach last January, Turner the previous season with the Buccaneers where he coached quarterback Josh Freeman to franchise records in passing yards (4,065) and passing touchdowns (27). In just one season with the Bucs, Turner helped Tampa Bay amass team records in total yards (5,820) and total points scored (389).

Turner spent the two previous seasons with the Colts coaching quarterbacks in 2011 and wide receivers in 2010.

Overall, Turner coached for nine seasons in Chicago. For five years, 2005-09, he was Lovie Smith's offensive coordinator. From 1993-96, four seasons, Turner was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Dave Wannstedt.

In between his time with the Bears, Turner spent eight seasons as head coach at the University of Illinois (1997-2004), where he is the fourth-winningest coach in school history. Turner guided the Illini to two bowl bids, the Big Ten Championship in 2001 and a BCS Bowl bid to the Nokia Sugar Bowl.

In 2001, Turner was the unanimous selection for Big Ten Coach of the Year. He would preside over three of the top-six offenses in Illini history in terms of total yards, while four of his eight squads ranked in the school's top-11 for scoring. The 2001 unit had a school-record 390 points. Three of the top-six all-time leading rushers at Illinois and three of the school's top-10 all-time leading receivers played under Turner, as he helped place more than 20 players on NFL rosters.

The championship run in 2001 marked many firsts for the Illini. It was the first outright Big Ten title for Illinois in 18 years and the teams' first-ever berth in the Bowl Championship Series. The 10-win season was only the fourth for an Illini squad in its storied history.

For his efforts, Turner was unanimously named the 2001 Big Ten Coach of the Year. He also was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and the AFCA Coach of the Year awards. Illinois' No. 7 ranking in both the Associated Press and coaches' poll at the end of the regular season was the highest for an Illini squad since 1990. The team finished No. 12 in both final polls.

Aside from mentoring several notable quarterbacks at the NFL level, Turner is also known for his development of college quarterbacks.

At Illinois, Turner tutored Kurt Kittner, who was a Johnny Unitas Award finalist and a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist.

Kittner became one in a long line of successful Turner-coached quarterbacks at the college level including: John Congemi (Pittsburgh), Jeff Garcia (San Jose State), Rodney Peete (Southern California), Bucky Richardson (Texas A&M), Sean Salisbury (Southern California), Sandy Schwab (Northwestern) and Steve Stenstrom (Stanford).

Prior to the Bears, Turner coached for one season at San Jose State in 1992. In just one season at San Jose State, Turner led a remarkable turnaround, leading the Spartans to a 7-4 record and a second-place finish in the Big West Conference. Turner guided San Jose State to its best record in six years and directed a potent offense that churned out 400 yards per game while averaging 30 points per contest, good for 15th in the nation.

Turner was a second-team junior college All-America wide receiver at Diablo Valley Community College and was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame in 2009. He then earned a scholarship at Pacific, where he led the Tigers in receiving in 1975 and 1976.

Turner's sons Morgan and Cameron followed in their father's footsteps with Morgan coaching tight ends at Stanford and Cameron joining his father as wide receivers and quarterbacks coach at FIU.

Older brother, Norv, is one of the most respected offensive coaches in the NFL. Norv has been head coach for the San Diego Chargers, Oakland Raiders and Washington Redskins and has coordinated the offenses for the Cleveland Browns, San Francisco 49ers, Miami Dolphins and Dallas Cowboys.

MIAMI (Aug. 30, 2014) – The FIU football team (0-1) opened the 2014 season with a tough, 14-12, loss to the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats on Saturday night. Senior Richard Leonard broke the school's single-game punt return yards record in the effort.

The Panthers' explosive cornerback collected 148 yards on five punt returns, while his 71-yard punt return late in the fourth quarter also stands as the fifth longest in school history. It's also the longest non-scoring return in FIU history. The Miami native shattered the previous record of 97 punt return yards, which was set in 2011 against Florida Atlantic by now-NFL standout, T.Y. Hilton. Leonard also had a 54-yard kick return in the second quarter.

On the defensive side of the ball, junior Denzell Perine set career highs in sacks (3) and tackles for loss (3/9.0). In all, the Panthers backline was able to accumulate 40 yards on 10 tackles for loss.

Senior safety Justin Halley's pass breakup on B-CU's opening drive moved the Boca Raton, Fla., native three pass break-ups shy of No. 2 all-time in program history. On the Wildcats' opening drive, Halley got in front of the B-CU receiver, slicing through the center of the field, forcing a fourth down. Junior Lars Koht collected FIU's first sack of the season on the following play.

B-CU broke a scoreless game with 11:26 to go in the second quarter. A one-yard touchdown run by the Wildcats' Michael Jones on first and goal gave the Wildcats' the an early 7-0 lead.

FIU responded with six points on back-to-back drives that resulted in a field goal. In his first drive under center for the Panthers, true freshman Alex McGough guided FIU 36 yards on six plays, setting sophomore Austin Taylor up for a 25-yard field goal.

Taylor's second 25-yarder came on the Panthers following drive. In a series that saw McGough connect 28 yards with junior tight end Ya'Keem Griner, FIU covered 53 yards on 10 plays and cut the deficit to one point. B-CU entered halftime with a 7-6 edge.

The Wildcats pulled ahead, 14-6, 3:34 into the fourth quarter, as the team converted a deep pass on third and nine. FIU responded with a four-play, seven-yard drive, resulting in a touchdown, following a 71-yard punt return from Leonard. The five-yard pass from McGough to junior T.J. Lowder was the first of the Tampa, Fla., native's career.

The score stood, 14-12, with 5:16 to go in the game. A failed last-second field goal attempt by the Panthers ended the contest.

Sophomore Jonnu Smith's two catches in the game moved the Ocala, Fla., native into second place in school history for catches by a tight end with 41.

McGough finished his first game with the Panthers 13-of-27 for 117 yards and one touchdown. His connection with Griner for 28 yards stands as a benchmark career-long for the rookie. In all, five true freshmen saw action in tonight's game (Shermarke Spence, Alex McGough, Anthony Wint, Alex Gardner, Dennis Turner)

MIAMI (Sept. 6, 2014) – Capped off by 377 total yards of offense and six forced turnovers on the defensive side of the ball, the FIU football team (1-1) handed the Wagner Seahawks a 34-3 loss on Saturday evening.

Freshman Alex Gardner set a freshman single-game record for yards by a running back, as the Jacksonville, Fla., native finished with 138 yards on the ground. He's the fourth true freshman in Panther football history to rush for over 100 yards in a game.

Also etching his name in the FIU record book was sophomore Jonnu Smith, whose 127 receiving yards tonight moved him to second all-time for receiving yards by a tight end. A 20-yard catch from junior E.J. Hilliard in the third quarter gave the Ocala, Fla., native his first 100-plus yard game.

After junior Denzell Perine forced the Seahawks to go three-and-out on their opening driving, collecting his third and a half sack of the season, freshman quarterback Alex McGough led the Panthers down the field for a touchdown in 1:08. Covering 52 yards, McGough connected with sophomore Jonnu Smith for 41 yards, the longest reception of the tight end's career.

On Wagner's ensuing drive, reigning Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Week Richard Leonard ran back an interception untouched, putting the Panthers ahead, 14-0, with 9:58 to play. The 60-yard return is the sixth longest interception for a score in FIU history.

After the Seahawks responded with a 21-yard field goal, cutting their deficit to 14-3, a fumble recovery from junior Michael Wakefield set up sophomore Austin Taylor for a 34-yard field goal.

A 61-yard rush from freshman Alex Gardner then placed the Panthers at the 1-yard line. Redshirt senior Cory White grabbed his first career touchdown pass on McGough's second touchdown pass of the night. Entering halftime, FIU held a commanding, 27-3, lead.

Following a scoreless third stanza, Wakefield picked up his second fumble recovery of the night midway through the fourth quarter. Two drives later, the Panthers' defense forced a key turnover deep in its own zone. In all, Wagner committed six turnovers during the game, tying the FIU record for turnovers by an opponent (6, Florida A&M, 2004).

One final Panther scoring drive took FIU 57 yards on eight plays. A four-yard rush by redshirt junior Anthon Samuel capped of a series lasting just under three and a half minutes.

Splitting time under center, McGough finished the night 9-of-18 and threw for 60 yards. Hilliard went an impressive 14-of-15 for 169 yards in the win. Both quarterbacks had longs of 35-plus yards.

MIAMI (Sept. 13, 2014) – The FIU football team (1-2) fell to the Pittsburgh Panthers, 42-25, Saturday afternoon. The Panthers started the game with 16-straight points, while holding Pittsburgh scoreless for the first quarter.

Freshman quarterback Alex McGough threw for 224 yards (15-of-30), with two touchdowns and an additional rushing touchdown. Redshirt senior Glenn Coleman (76 yards) and junior T.J. Lowder (73 yards) paced the Panthers' offense, while sophomore Jonnu Smith added 62 yards in the effort.

Building off its success from its first two games, the FIU defense gave Pittsburgh a challenge in the first half. On the game's opening play, junior Michael Wakefield sacked Pittsburgh's Chad Voytik for a loss of seven yards. The Panthers were able to force Pittsburgh to go three-and-out twice in the first 15 minutes.

With Pittsburgh slowly chipping away yardage on its second drive, redshirt freshman Jordan Guest came up with a big-time stop, stripping Pittsburgh's James Conner of the ball on FIU's 9-yard line.

On the ensuing drive, freshman running back Alex Gardner nearly broke free on a 15-yard rush before being taken down.

FIU broke a scoreless game with 3:56 to go in the first quarter, tacking on 16 unanswered points. On Pittsburgh's opening play from its 8-yard line, the Panthers' defense called a blitz, with Jeremiah McKinnon taking down Voytik for two points.

The Panthers went on to score two touchdowns on back-to-back drives to close the first quarter. McGough, who got the start under center, connected with Lowder for 33 yards, pinning FIU at Pittsburgh's 3-yard line. A three-yard quarterback draw by McGough gave the Panthers a 9-0 lead. It's the first career rushing touchdown for the Tampa, Fla., native.

The FIU defense forced Pittsburgh to go three-and-out a second time with 1:40 to go, before McGough threw a deep ball to Coleman for 57-yards for an untouched touchdown. It also stands as the longest pass of McGough's career. With Pittsburgh within FIU's 10-yard line, redshirt junior Richard Leonard forced and recovered a fumble.

Pittsburgh was able to respond with 14 points and was heading towards the end zone with one minute on the clock before sophomore Wilkerson Myrtill picked off Voytik to stop a key drive. FIU entered halftime with a 16-14 edge over Pittsburgh.

Pittsburgh opened the second half with 12-straight points, giving the Panthers a 26-16 edge over FIU to start the fourth quarter. Junior quarterback E.J. Hilliard drove the Panthers 43 yards on nine plays to open the fourth quarter. The Miami native rushed for 19 yards during the series, including a 16-yard run. Sophomore Austin Taylor converted a 43-yard field goal, cutting the Pittsburgh lead to 26-19. It's a season long for the kicker out of Punta Gorda, Fla.

Senior Giovanni Francois came up with a key sack on third down, forcing a Pittsburgh punt with under 10 minutes remaining in the game. It's the first sack of the season for the defensive end.

McGough carried the Panthers 71 yards with the fourth quarter approaching three minutes. A 12-yard route to Smith resulted in the Panthers' third touchdown of the day. After a failed two-point conversion, Pittsburgh led, 35-25.

Pittsburgh capped off its day with one final touchdown.

FIU's defense sacked Voytik three times, while three Panthers finished with at least five solo tackles (Leonard, 8; McKinnon 6; Lars Koht, 5).

MIAMI (Sept. 20, 2014) – After an hour-plus weather delay, the FIU football team (1-3) fell to the Louisville Cardinals, 34-3, Saturday evening. Junior Michael Wakefield set a career-high for sacks and tackles for loss in the effort, while FIU's defense was able to stabilize the Cardinals' rushing offense, allowing just 12 rushing yards, which is the third-fewest in FIU history.

Louisville scored a quick seven points on its opening drive before the Panthers' defense settled down, limiting Cardinals quarterback Will Gardner to throwing just three-of-eight for the remainder of the first quarter. On second and six on the Cardinals' second drive, senior Giovani Francois sacked Gardner for a loss of 12 yards.

The Panthers defense was able to force its 10th turnover this season, with Louisville approaching the goal line. On third and goal, Wakefield sacked Gardner for a seven-yard loss while forcing a fumble. Junior Denzell Perine recovered the loose ball.

The Cardinals scored three times in the second quarter and led 28-0 going into the final seconds of the half. Freshman Alex McGough took the Panthers 54 yards on six plays on a drive lasting just over 1:20. On second and 11, McGough carried the ball 26 yards to the Cardinals' 40-yard line, before rushing for an additional 18 yards on the following play. An 11-yard route to sophomore Jonnu Smith set up sophomore Austin Taylor for a 28-yard field goal.

Wakefield came up with his second sack of the game on the Cardinals first drive of the second half, after their defense forced an FIU turnover on the Panthers' nine-yard line to start the half. On third down, Perine took down Gardner for a loss of 11 yards. FIU would only surrender a field goal on the drive, as the Cardinals took a commanding, 31-3 lead. Louisville tacked on one final field goal midway through the fourth quarter.

Junior E.J. Hilliard came in under center for FIU after the Panthers' first series of the second half, after McGough took a hard hit on a third down. He finished the night 8-of-12 for 70 yards, with a game-long 25-yard pass to redshirt senior Glenn Coleman.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (Sept. 27, 2014) – FIU football (2-3, 1-0 C-USA) used a strong defensive effort and big plays on offense to earn a 34-20 victory at UAB on Saturday in the squad's Conference USA opener. FIU tied a school record by forcing six turnovers, while also scoring touchdowns of 85 and 75 yards in the victory.

The school record of six turnovers in a game has happened twice in the history of the FIU Football program. FIU also forced six turnovers vs. Florida A&M on Nov. 27, 2004. Of the six turnovers on Saturday, four came on interceptions. The four interceptions by the FIU defense are tied for second in school history. FIU also had four interceptions at Texas A&M on Sept. 28, 2010 and at Gardner Webb on Nov. 15, 2003. Junior Richard Leonard had two of those interceptions, returning one for a score, while Demarkus Perkins also took one back all the way.

Offensively, the Panthers used two big plays that helped set the tone in the game, tallying the second and sixth longest pass plays in school history. Freshman quarterback Alex McGough recorded his second career 200-yard passing game in the victory. McGough threw for 204 yards and two scores, while the FIU offense did not turn the ball over in the win. Sophomore Jonnu Smith (75 yards) and redshirt senior Glenn Coleman (85 yards) were responsible for the big scores.

UAB got on the board first with a two-yard touchdown run by D.J. Vinson with 13:36 left in the first half. The score capped off a five-play, 74-yard drive which took 1:24.

Leonard tied the game in the second quarter with a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the half. The return for a touchdown was the second of the season for Leonard and fourth of his career. The Miami native is now tied for second all-time at FIU in return touchdowns (Nick Turnbull – 2002-05 and Lionell Singleton – 2004-07).

UAB responded on the ensuing drive, going 52 yards on eight plays, capped off by a 29-yard touchdown pass from Cody Clements to Gerald Everett with 5:38 left in the second half. The extra point attempt was blocked by Wakefield to put the score at 13-7.

With 3:37 left in the half, McGough connected with Smith for a 75-yard touchdown pass to give FIU a 14-13 lead. The reception was a career best for Smith, who has caught at least one pass in 17-straight games. The TD pass was the fifth-longest in school history.

FIU extended its lead in the second half to 21-13, following an 85-yard touchdown pass from McGough to Coleman with 9:30 left in the 3rd quarter. The connection was a career-best for McGough who bested his previous high set earlier in the game. The reception for Coleman set a personal best for the redshirt senior and was the second-longest reception in school history. The one-play drive took just 19 seconds.

The Panthers added three more points to make the score 24-13 after sophomore Austin Taylor converted a 35-yard field goal with 8:00 left in the third. Taylor made the score 27-13 with a 25-yard field goal with 14:17 left in the game, capping off a four-play drive that lasted 1:47. It marked the second-straight score by the Panthers set up after FIU forced a turnover.

Perkins recorded the team's fifth turnover of the game, returning an interception 31 yards for a touchdown. The score gave FIU a 34-13 lead with 13:40 left in the game.

The school-record tying sixth turnover came on an interception by sophomore cornerback Wilkenson Myrtill with 5:21 to go in the contest, as he kept a foot down in FIU's own end zone to bring UAB's potential scoring drive to a halt.

UAB cut the FIU lead to 34-20 when Cody Clements scrambled for a 15-yard touchdown run with 1:21 to go in regulation.
