QUICK HITS

■ FIU closes out its four-game home stand on Sunday when it faces cross-state rival Florida Gulf Coast University at 3:30 p.m. ... The game will be televised live on the America Sports Network (ASN).

■ The Panthers look to get back on the winning track after back-to-back losses to Stetson (81-75), on Nov. 30, and Elon (77-71) on Dec. 4.

■ Adrian Diaz and Daviyon Draper continue to lead the Panthers in scoring, netting 15.4 and 15.1 points-per-game, respectively ... Diaz also paces the team on the glass, grabbing 9.4 rebounds-per-outing.

■ Diaz leads Conference USA, and is No. 1 in NCAA Division I (through game of Dec. 4), in blocked shots per game, averaging 4.1 rejections-per-outing ... He also leads the nation in total blocked shots (33).

■ Diaz comes into the game with FGCU just four points shy of 700 for his career, and two rebounds shy of his 400th career rebound spanning his time at Kansas State and FIU.

■ Donte McGill is currently one of the hottest players on the team, averaging 20.3 points-per-game in his last three outings ... He has scored 20-plus points in two of his last three games, and in double figures in four of his last five.

HEAD COACH ANTHONY EVANS

■ Named the eighth head basketball coach at FIU on April 16, 2013.

■ Picked up his first win as the head coach at FIU with a 66-58 victory over Kennesaw State on Nov. 10, 2013. The win also marked the 100th-career victory for Evans.

■ In his first season at the helm, led FIU to a 15-win season. FIU picked up a big 72-61 victory over cross-state rival and 2012 Sweet Sixteen squad Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 7 at FIU Arena. FIU earned seven Conference USA wins in its inaugural season in the league, including two victories over rival Florida Atlantic.

■ During the 2014-15 campaign, Evans saw two of his players earn All-Conference USA honors. Dennis Mavin earned second team honors while Adrian Diaz was named to the All-C-USA Defensive Team. Diaz finished the year as the league leader in blocked shots per game (3.0 bpg), and was sixth in NCAA Division I in total blocked shots (99) and seventh in blocked shots per game.

■ Coached Tymell Murphy to a Second-Team All-C-USA honor for his play during the 2013-14 season. Murphy finished the year averaging 16.6 points-per-game (No. 4 in the conference) on 58.6 percent shooting from the floor (No. 4 in the conference; No. 18 nationally).

■ During his time with the Spartans, Evans amassed a 99-94 record, including back-to-back, 20-win seasons (26-10 in 2011-12 & 21-12 in 2012-13).

■ During the 2012-13 season, led Norfolk State to an undefeated Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference regular season mark (16-0) en route to being named the MEAC Coach of the Year and the team's second-straight post-season berth with an automatic bid to the 2013 National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

■ Was finalist for the Ben Jobe Award for the 2012-13 campaign, presented to the top minority coach in Division I basketball. He was also named a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award, presented to the top mid-major coach in Division I, and the Jim Phelan Award, presented to the top Division I coach.

■ In 2011-12, took the Spartans to new heights with the program's first-ever Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title and perhaps the biggest upset in NCAA Tournament history. In the 2012 NCAA Tournament, the Evans-led Spartans knocked off the No. 2 seed Missouri Tigers, 86-84, becoming the fifth No. 15 seed (at the time) to defeat a No. 2 seed.

■ FGCU comes into Sunday's game with a 4-4 record, following a 75-66 loss at Texas A&M on Dec. 2 ... It was the second Southeastern Conference opponent that the Eagles faced in a six-day stretch ... They also played at Florida in Gainesville on Nov. 27, losing to the Gators, 70-50 ... FGCU has dropped three-of-its last four games after starting the year, 3-1.

■ Marc-Eddy Norelia leads the team in both scoring and rebounding, averaging 14.5 points- and 8.5 rebounds-per-game, respectively ... Christian Terrell is the only other player averaging double figures in the scoring column, netting 13.5 points-per-outing ... He is also grabbing 5.1 rebounds-per-game.

THE SERIES AGAINST FGCU

■ Sunday's game between FIU and FGCU will be the eighth meeting all-time in the season series ... The Eagles lead the series 3-2, although the actual on court record has the Panthers holding a 4-3 edge ... FIU had two wins vacated - from the 2002-03 season and the 2003-04 season - due to NCAA sanctions.

■ Following Sunday's game with FGCU, the Panthers will get a couple of days off before beginning a three-game road stretch at North Florida on Dec. 14 at 7 p.m.

■ FIU is 1-0 all-time against UNF, despite having played the Osprey three times previously ... The Panthers' actual on-court record is 3-0, however, FIU had two wins vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

■ FIU will then head on the road for on a two-game road trip, facing Northern Illinois (Dec. 19, 3 p.m.) and Binghamton (Dec. 22, 7 p.m.) during that stretch.

LAST TIME OUT FOR THE PANTHERS

■ FIU lost back-to-back games for the first time this season when it came out on the short end of a 77-71 decision against Elon on Dec. 4.

■ The Panthers shot better than 50 percent for the second straight game, and for the third time this season ... FIU shot 50.9 percent (29-of-57) from the floor and 38.5 percent (5-of-13) from three-point range ... The Panthers found themselves down 36-31 at the half, with 30 of Elon's 36 points coming from behind the three-point arc.

■ FIU lost the turnover battle, handing the ball over 16 times as opposed to just seven miscues by the Phoenix ... The Panthers' 16 turnovers would lead to 21 Elon points on the night.

■ Donte McGill scored a career-high 25 points on 10-of-13 shooting from the field, including 1-of-1 from three-point range, and 4-of-6 from the free-throw line ... He also led the team in rebounding - from the guard position - with eight boards ... Adrian Diaz was the Panthers' only other player in double figures with 15 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the field.

GETTIN' IN THEIR FACE

■ With defense being one of its cornerstones, FIU has made it very difficult for its opponents to get good looks at the basket ... In five of their eight games, the Panthers' have held their opposition to no better than 38.6 percent shooting from the field ... During those five games, FIUs opponents have averaged 22.9 made field goals-per-game.

■ Wright spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Mercer, where he joined the staff in 2008-09 ... He worked in that capacity for two seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in July 2010.

■ Wright was side-by-side with Head Coach Bob Hoffman as the pair presided over the most successful seven-year stretch in program history ... Since his arrival at Mercer, the Bears produced a 146-98 record, including a 27-9 season in 2013-14, highlighted by the NCAA Tournament second round upset of No. 6 Duke ... The win over Duke was the latest in a series of high-major victories claimed by Wright's Mercer teams ... In addition to the Blue Devils, the Bears also topped Ole Miss, Seton Hall, Tennessee, Alabama (twice), Florida State, Georgia Tech and Auburn during his time ... In his final four years at Mercer, Wright was on the sidelines for March wins in the NCAA, NIT, CIT and CBI tournaments.

■ At his previous position with the Rio Grande Vipers of the NBA D-League, Wright worked with NBA first-round draft picks Aaron Brooks, Shannon Brown, C.J. Watson, Steve Novak and Desmond Farmer, as well as second-round pick Cedric Simmons.

■ Capko comes to FIU after spending two seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations for the USC men's basketball program ... During his two seasons at USC, Capko played an integral role in helping guard Jordan McLaughlin earn a spot on the All-Pac 12 Rookie Team ... In addition, he helped

oversee the team's academic success in 2014-15 as they set a program record for highest team GPA ... Capko also assisted the rest of the USC staff in establishing strong recruiting classes during his two seasons ... USC's 2015 class was ranked 20th nationally by Rivals, 22nd by Scout and 30th by ESPN. In 2014, the Trojan class was ranked 12th by Scout, 16th by ESPN and 23rd by Rivals.

■ Before his time at USC, Capko spent the previous two seasons as an assistant men's basketball coach at Georgia Southern, and prior to that at he served as assistant coach at Stetson for two seasons (2010 and 2011) ... During the 2010-11 season, Stetson recorded victories over Wake Forest and Atlantic Sun Conference Champion East Tennessee State.

■ As a player, Capko spent his first semester in the basketball program at the University of Florida under former Gator Head Coach Billy Donovan, before transferring to USF in Tampa where he played for three years ... As a junior he was fifth in the Big East in assists and as a senior he was the Bulls' team captain.

This is the first C-USA Player of the Week honor of the season for Diaz and the second of his career (March 9, 2015).

■ Just 40 seconds into the second half against Stetson, on Nov. 30, Adrian Diaz blocked a Brian Pegg layup and in doing so became FIU's all-time leader in blocked shots, surpassing Dwight Stewart (1988-93) and his 126 career rejections ... Diaz had a season-high six blocks against the Hatters to go along with a season-best 24 points ... Diaz currently stands at 130 career blocked shots.

DIAZ ABOUT TO HIT CAREER MILESTONES

■ Adrian Diaz is right on the cusp of reaching two milestones for his collegiate career spanning his time at Kansas State and at FIU ... Diaz has 696 career points and is just four points

shy of the 700-point plateau ... In addition, he currently stands with 398 career rebounds, just two shy of plugging down his 400th career rebound.

ADRIAN DIAZ NOTES

■ Adrian Diaz has started off the 2015-16 season with a bang, proving that he will continue to be one of the top players in Conference USA during his senior campaign ... The Miami native currently leads the team in scoring, netting 15.4 points-per-game, and on the glass grabbing 9.4 rebounds-per-contest ... He is also shooting an impressive 61.7 percent (50 of-81) from the floor, while also logging 31.5 minutes-per-game.

■ Diaz also finds himself in the top 10, in Conference USA, in several statistical categories (through games of Nov. 28) ... Diaz leads C-USA in blocked shots (4.1 bpg) is second in rebounding (9.4 rpg), fourth in field goal percentage (61.7 percent), offensive rebounds (2.9) defensive rebounds (6.5), and is 10th in minutes played (31.5)

■ Diaz's presence on the floor is felt in many ways, but not the least of which is on the defensive end of the floor ... Diaz has recorded 33 blocked shots this season for an average of 4.1 blocks per game ... That not only leads C-USA, but is also tops in NCAA Division I ... In addition, Diaz's 33 total blocks on the year leads the nation.

■ Diaz has recorded three or more blocks in seven of the Panthers' eight games this season, and 22 times in 41 career games played at FIU ... In addition, Diaz has blocked at least one shot in 12 straight games, dating back to last season, and in 24-of-25 games dating back to last year.

■ Last year Diaz set a FIU single-season record for blocked shots with 99 ... His blocked shot average (3.0 bpg) led C-USA, and was good enough for seventh in Division I.

■ The Miami native also set a school record for shots blocked in a single game, with 13 against UAB on March 7, 2015, and tied the C-USA mark with Hassan Whiteside, of Marshall, who accomplished the feat on Feb. 27, 2010 ... For his efforts against the Blazers, Diaz was named the Conference USA Players of the Week for the week ending March 9, 2015.

■ Dating back to last year, Diaz has shot better than 50 percent from the field in 10 of his last 12 games, in 14 of his- last 18, and 26 of his-last 30 times taking the court ... He also shot 58 percent (7-of-12) from the floor against Elon on Dec. 6.

■ Diaz got the 2015-16 campaign off to an impressive start against Trinity Baptist on Nov. 13 ... He recorded his seventh career double-double with a 15-point, 11-rebound effort ... He was 5-of-8 (62.5 percent) from the field and from the free-throw line ... In addition, Diaz had four blocked shots in 27 minutes.

■ Diaz followed up his season-opening performance with a 17-point, 14-rebound effort against Florida Memorial on Nov. 16 ... The output marked his second-straight double-double, and the eighth of his career ... His 14 rebounds mark a new career-high surpassing the 12 rebounds he hauled down on March 7, 2015.

■ In the Panthers' game against UAB on March 7, 2015, Diaz made school history recording FIUs first ever triple-double, in the 70-66 win over the eventual Conference USA Tournament champions ... Diaz scored 14 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to go along with his record breaking 13 blocked shots ... Diaz was only one of 14 players in Division I to record a triple-double last season ... Diaz also posted six double-doubles on the season.

■ Diaz has recorded 10 double-doubles during his career, with all of them coming during his time playing with FIU ... Diaz started his collegiate career at Kansas State.

Interviews - General

ALL INTERVIEWS, both on the local and national levels with the FIU men's basketball team are coordinated by Michael Hogan, men's basketball media relations contact.

The FIU Athletic Media Relations Department has the right to refuse any interview request. Contacting student-athletes, coaches and staff without permission from the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department is not permissible and may result in revocation of credentials.

Student-Athlete Interviews

Interviews should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance through the FIU Media Relations Department (305-348-1496). While several interviews are conducted over the phone, the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department will never give out student-athlete's cell phone numbers or private contact information. In-person interviews will take place, either in the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department (FIU Arena Room 211) or after practice. Please contact the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department for ALL interview requests. Other accommodations can be arranged through the Athletic Media Relations Department.

Coaches and Staff Interviews

Interviews with Head Coach Anthony Evans must come through the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department. Interviews should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance. No member of the FIU staff may be interviewed without permission by the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department. Personal numbers of both coaches and staff members will not be given out.

Covering Practice

All practices are closed to the media, as are walk-throughs, at FIU Arena on the day of all home games. Head Coach Anthony Evans and selected student-athletes will be made available after practice. Media members must contact the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department (Michael Hogan - Men's Basketball Contact) if they wish to attend post-practice or to set up interviews. No interview will be granted without the permission of the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department.

Pre-Game Interviews

FIU players will not be available for any media activities on game day.

Post-Game Interviews

The athletic media relations staff at FIU is aware of the importance of media coverage and places great importance on the role of the media insofar as it interacts with their respective duties. To ensure the most workable situation for members of both entities, the following procedures must be observed:

1. The FIU men's basketball program will observe a brief NCAA-prescribed cooling off period before beginning post-game interviews.

2. A post-game press conference will be conducted in Room 272 of FIU Arena with Head Coach Anthony Evans and selected student-athletes.

3. Post-game interviews will NOT be held on the court.

Each visiting team will set its own post-game interview policies and procedures, which will be announced on game day. Check with the opposing media relations staff if you have any further questions.

PLAYER NOTES

■ Draper has started the season scoring in double figures in six consecutive games played (missed one game - Oral Roberts on Nov. 22 - due to injury) which is his longest such streak of his career at FIU ... That stretch came to a halt on Dec. 4 against Elon, when he netted just eight points.

■ Draper has been consistent from the field hitting 45.6 percent (41-of-90) from the floor ... He has shot better than 50 percent in four of his first seven games played ... Including last season, Draper has shot better than 50 percent from the field in 17 of his 29 career games for FIU.

■ Draper shot a season-high 58.3 percent (7-of-12) from the field against Stetson, on Nov. 30, en route to his 15 points.

■ Draper fell just shy of recording a new career-high for points, twice, when he netted 19 points against Florida Memorial on Nov. 16 and against UT Martin on Nov. 21 ... Draper was 9-of-17 from the floor on the night in 31 minutes against FMU, and 5-of-13 from the field against the Skyhawks ... Draper's career-high is 21 points, set against UTEP on Feb. 7, 2015.

■ Dating back to last year, Draper has scored in double figures in nine of his last 12 games, which includes a 20-point outing against UAB on March 7, 2015.

■ Draper had a solid outing in the season opener for the Panthers against Trinity Baptist on Nov. 13 ... Draper scored 12 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field (54.5 percent) ... He also pulled down four rebounds.

■ Like his teammate, Adrian Diaz, Draper had a big season for FIU in his first year with the Panthers ... Draper is one of FIU's top two returning scorers and rebounders - third on the team in both - from last season, averaging 8.7 points-and 5.1 rebounds-per-game, respectively .

■ The Los Angeles native posted his only double-double of the year when he pulled down a career-high 11 rebounds to go along with his 15 points against WKU on Jan. 17, 2015.

RAY RODRIGUEZ NOTES

■ Ray Rodriguez comes into Sunday's game sixth on the team in scoring, averaging 4.8 points-per-game on the year and 1.3 assists per contest.

■ Rodriguez has logged solid outings in his past five games shooting 42.8 percent (9-of-21) from the field and 42.1 percent (8-of-19) from three-point range during that stretch ... The Miami native scored a season-high 10 points against UT Martin, on Nov. 21, on 3-of-5 shooting; all coming from behind the three-point arc.

■ Rodriguez has earned the starting nod in four games this season, and in three of the last four ... Dating back to last year, the Miami native has been in the starting lineup in 11 of his last 15 games played.

■ Rodriguez returns this season after averaging 4.8 points-per-game and was third on the team in assists-per-game dishing out 1.6 per outing ... He saw action in 32 games with seven starts, all coming in the last eight games.

■ He scored in double figures five times during the season including a season-high 14 points, four times, at Southern Miss (Feb. 12, 2015) and against UTSA (March 11, 2015) in the Conference USA Tournament first round.

■ Handed out four or more assists four times, including a career-high six in the third game of the year against Florida Memorial (Nov. 21, 2014).

■ Shot 35.9 percent (37-103) from behind the three-point arc on the year, however was ninth in Conference USA in three-point percentage in league games hitting 40.4 percent of his shots (21-52) from long range.

HASSAN HUSSEIN NOTES

■ Hassan Hussein saw 14 minutes of action in the season opener against Trinity Baptist on Nov. 13 and certainly made the most of his time ... Hussein recorded six points - on perfect 3-of-3 shooting from the field - grabbed four rebounds, and handed out one assist off the bench ... Hussein's four boards and one assist were both career-highs.

■ Hussein saw limited action during the 2014-15 season, seeing action in just 12 games, however got one start against UTEP on Feb. 7, 2015.

JASON BOSWELL NOTES

■ Jason Boswell comes into the FGCU game fourth on the team in scoring, averaging 7.9 points-per-game ... He has scored in double figures in three of the eight games that he has played in this year, including a career-high 14 points against Oral Roberts on Nov. 22.

■ Boswell has shot no less than 57 percent from the field in three of the past seven games for the Panthers. He is also shooting 40.9 percent (9-of-22) from the three-point arc on the year.

■ Boswell recorded a career-high five steals on Nov. 30 against Stetson ... His five thefts against the Hatters equaled his season total coming into the contest.

■ Boswell posted a perfect shooting night against Florida Memorial on Nov. 16 ... Boswell shot 3-for-3 from the field, including 2-for-2 shooting from behind the three-point arc, and 2-of-2 from the free throw line, for 10 points.

■ Jason Boswell scored seven points in the season opener against Trinity Baptist on Nov. 13, getting the starting nod.

■ Boswell continues to bring athleticism and length to the FIU backcourt ... He played in 29 games last year, getting the starting nod three times ... He averaged 1.1 points per game, netting a season-high seven points at Louisville on Dec. 5, 2014.

KIMAR WILLIAMS NOTES

■ Not only did Kimar Williams get substantial minutes in his first collegiate game, but also finished the contest in double-figures ... The freshman tallied 10 points on 3-of-4 (75.0 percent) shooting from the field and 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) from the free-throw line ... In addition to his 10 points, Williams also grabbed five rebounds, handed out five assists and recorded four steals in just 19 minutes of play.

■ After three sub-par games, Williams broke out again on Nov. 22 against Oral Roberts ... The Philadelphia native scored a career-high 11 points against the Golden Eagles, including the final six points for FIU in regulation ... Williams hit a three with 51 seconds left to cut the ORU lead to one-point, 69-59 ... After the Golden Eagles pushed the lead back to three, Williams sent the game to overtime after hitting the front-end of two free throws with 17 seconds remaining in regulation ... He then got his own rebound, on the missed second attempt, and converted a driving baseline layup with 14 seconds on the clock to knot the game at 62-all.

■ Williams fell just short of double-digits for the third time this season when he netted eight points against Elon on Dec. 4 ... Williams was 3-of-4 (75 percent) from the field and 2-of-3 (66.7 percent) from the free-throw line in a career-high 26 minutes of action.

DONTE MCGILL NOTES

■ Donte McGill continues to be one of the hottest players on the Panthers' roster ... McGill is averaging 13.9 points-per-game, which is good enough for third on the team, and 20.3 points-per-outing in his last three games ... He has poured in double-figure points in four of his last five games played ... In addition, he is shooting 50.0 percent (28-of-56) from the field during that stretch.

■ McGill is, surprisingly, second on the team in rebounding grabbing 5.6 boards per game on the year, which includes 2.3 rebounds per game on the offensive glass from the guard position ... His offensive rebounds per game is good enough for 10th in Conference USA.

■ McGill set a new career-high for points with a 25-point effort against Elon on Dec. 4 ... He shot 10-of-13 from the field (76.9 percent), including 1-of-1 from behind the three-point arc, and was 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) from the free-throw line in 30 minutes ... He also paced the team - and shared game-high rebounding honors - with eight boards.

PLAYER NOTES

■ McGill surpassed his previous career-high of 24 points originally set against LIU Brooklyn on Nov. 25, 2015 ... He was an impressive 5-of-8 from the field, including 2-of-3 from three-point range, and 12-of-13 from the free throw line ... Five of McGill's career-high nine rebounds came on the offensive glass.

■ McGill earned his first career start for FIU on Nov. 16 against Florida Memorial, and responded with a nine-point and six-rebound effort in 27 minutes of action ... In addition, McGill also recorded three assists, one-blocked shot, and a steal in the win.

CAMERON SMITH NOTES

■ Cameron Smith poured in a career-high 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds in 41 minutes against Oral Roberts ... Smith also had two assists and two locked shots in the Panthers' overtime loss.

■ Smith has made his presence felt on the defensive end of the floor in the past three games ... During that stretch, he has recorded two blocked shots in each of the past three outings.

ERIC NOTTAGE NOTES

■ Eric Nottage has posted double-figure scoring games in two of his last three outings ... Nottage had an 11-point outing against Stetson on Nov. 30, shooting 4-of-10 (40.0 percent) from the field and 3-of-6 from three-point range (50.0 percent) ... That outing followed up a career-high 15-point effort against LIU Brooklyn on Nov. 25, shooting 4-of-4 from the field, including 3-of-3 from three-point range, and 4-of-4 from the free throw line.

■ Nottage surpassed his previous career-best of eight points, set against Oral Roberts on Nov. 22 ... His six rebounds against the Golden Eagles is still a career-high.
