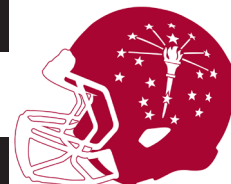

SETTING THE SCENE

- Looking to open the 2015 season 2-0, Indiana hosts the Florida International Panthers at Memorial Stadium (52,929; FieldTurf) on Saturday, Sept 12. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. EDT and BTN will broadcast the game.
- The Hoosiers and the Panthers are meeting for the first time.
- IU holds a 13-7-2 all-time mark against Conference USA opponents after a 49-24 victory over North Texas in Bloomington on Oct. 4, 2014.
- FIU is coming off of a 15-14 victory at Central Florida in its season opener on Thursday, Sept. 3.

THE COACHES

- Kevin Wilson** is in his fifth season as Indiana head coach. During his tenure, the offense has set 43 school records, including points, total yardage, passing yardage and rushing yardage in a single season. Sixteen IU standouts have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, highlighted by wide receiver **Cody Latimer**, the 56th pick by Denver (2014), and running back **Tevin Coleman**, the 73rd selection by Atlanta (2015).
- Ron Turner is in his third season as Florida International head coach, where he owns a 6-19 (.240) record. Turner coached at Illinois from 1997-2004 and San Jose State in 1992 and has a 48-80 (.375) overall mark.

NEWS & NOTES

- In their opening win over Southern Illinois, the Hoosiers surpassed 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards for the fifth time in the same game under **Kevin Wilson**, passing for 349 and rushing for 246.
- Ricky Jones** set career-highs with six receptions for 186 yards and a 57-yard touchdown. His 186 yards rank ninth on Indiana's single-game list and are the most since Cody Latimer (189 vs. Illinois on Nov. 9, 2013).
- The redshirt junior entered the game with four catches for 60 yards and zero TDs in his career.
- Junior **Jordan Howard** rushed for 145 yards on 20 carries (7.2 average) with a career-high three scores, including the game-winner from one yard out with :58 remaining in his IU debut.
- Since the start of 2013, Howard ranks first nationally among active backs with 471 attempts, second with 108.9 rushing yards per game, third with 2,613 rushing yards and 116.4 yards from scrimmage per game, and fifth with 2,793 yards from scrimmage.
- Nate Sudfeld** threw for 349 yards, the second-highest total of his career, on 19-of-32 passing, with the 57-yard touchdown. The senior added a career-high 46 rushing yards, including a career-long 21-yarder, for 395 total yards, just three shy of his career-high set against Navy on Sept. 7, 2013.
- Three Hoosiers reached double digits in tackles, led by linebacker **T.J. Simmons** and defensive end **Nick Mangieri's** (career-high) 11. Linebacker **Marcus Oliver** also set a career mark with 10 stops.
- Additionally, Oliver forced a pair of fumbles to give him five in just 15 career games.

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the Weight Room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

Working credentials for the 2015 Indiana football season must be requested via the web. To request credentials visit IUHoosiers.com and click on the media services link under "Athletics." A link to apply for football credentials will be at the top of the page.

All requests made during the week of the game will be held at Media Will Call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens three hours prior to kickoff.

OPENING ACT

In the Hoosiers season-opening win over Southern Illinois, 10 true freshmen made their debuts: CB Andre Brown, Jr., S Jameel Cook, Jr., S Jonathan Crawford, LS Dan Godsil, ATH Donovan Hale, ATH Mike Majette, DE Jacob Robinson, WR Leon Thornton III, WR Nick Westbrook and CB Devonte Williams.

• Indiana has fielded 58 true freshmen in head coach **Kevin Wilson's** tenure.

• Thirteen true freshmen played in 2014, eight in 2013, 11 in 2012 and 16 in 2011.

INSIDE THE OFFENSE

Indiana returned seven starters, 23 letterwinners and 129 career starts on offense. Game one's depth chart featured six seniors (two fifth-year), eight juniors, five sophomores and six freshmen (three true).

UNDER KEVIN WILSON INDIANA HAS...

In head coach **Kevin Wilson's** four years, the offense has set 43 school records, including points, total yardage, passing yardage and rushing yardage in a single season.

BALANCED ATTACK

A misconception about the Indiana offense is that it is only a passing attack. Since **Kevin Wilson** arrived in Bloomington in 2011, IU has rushed for 200 yards 22 times and passed for 300 yards 16 times.

• In the opening win over Southern Illinois, the Hoosiers reached both benchmarks for the fifth time in the same game under Wilson, passing for 349 yards and rushing for 246 yards.

• In 2014, Indiana sat ninth nationally (third in the Big Ten) with 263.6 rushing yards per game and fifth in the league with 405.0 total yards per game.

• IU gained 200 rushing yards in 10 of 12 games, averaged 5.9 yards per carry (eighth nationally, second in the Big Ten) and scored 29 times on the ground.

• The team's seven straight 200-yard games to open 2014 were a school single-season record.

• Dating back to the 2013 finale, the Hoosiers rushed for 200 yards in eight straight games, which tied a program record (1989-90).

• In 2013, Indiana set single-season program records with 6,102 total yards, 508.5 total yards per game, 461 points, 38.4 points per game, 36 passing touchdowns, 62 total touchdowns and 300 first downs.

• It marked the first time in school history IU averaged over 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.

• The Hoosiers joined Baylor and Florida State as the only three teams nationally to average 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.

• Indiana led the Big Ten in passing, finished second in scoring and total offense, and fourth in rushing.

• IU tied for ninth nationally in total offense, 17th in passing, 16th in scoring and 30th in rushing.

• The Hoosiers were just one of six teams in the nation to rank in the top 30 in total, passing, scoring and rushing offense.

SUDFELD BACK UNDER CENTER

Nate Sudfeld did not miss a beat after returning to action for the first time since Oct. 11 last season in the Hoosiers 48-point outburst against Southern Illinois.

• In his return, Sudfeld threw for 349 yards, the second-highest total of his career, on 19-of-32 passing, with a 57-yard touchdown.

• He added a career-high 46 rushing yards, including a career-long 21-yarder, for 395 total yards, just three shy of his career-high set against Navy on Sept. 7, 2013.

• Sudfeld now has five 300-yard games, 10 career 40-plus yard TDs and five career 50-yarders, including two 70-yarders (70, 76).

• The senior, who is on the watch lists for the Maxwell Award and the Utitas Award, suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in the second quarter at Iowa in week six last year.

• One of the most decorated quarterbacks in Indiana history, Sudfeld is second in completion percentage (60.5) and 300-yard games (5), tied for fourth in passing touchdowns (35), seventh in passing yardage (4,655) and completions (365), eighth in total offense (4,772) and ninth in attempts (603) on IU's career lists in just 26 career games (15 starts).

• In his career, Sudfeld is 365-of-603 (60.6) with 4,655 yards, 35 passing TDs, 13 INTs, three rushing scores and a 140.2 passing efficiency mark.

• Against North Texas last year, he went 23-of-29, a 79.3 completion clip, which is the second-best single-game total in Hoosiers history.

• Sudfeld also threw for three scores, his fourth career game with three-or-more touchdowns. Two of those strikes came from 40-plus yards (45, 76).

• The 6-6 gunslinger led the Hoosiers on their game-winning drive against No. 18 Missouri, covering 75 yards in six plays in 1:58 and culminating with D'Angelo Roberts 3-yard TD with :22 remaining.

• In the contest, he passed for 252 yards and a 33-yard score with zero turnovers.

• Sudfeld went 31-of-41 (75.6) for 347 yards to go along with one passing touchdown and two rushing TDs at Bowling Green.

• Indiana returned 129 career starts from 14 players on offense and 98 career starts from 10 players on defense for a total of 227 career starts from 24 different players.

• The Hoosiers offensive line is the team's most experienced unit with 86 career starts from seven different players.

• On defense, IU's linemen own the most career starts with 62 from six different players.

• He matched a career-high with 31 completions, which are eighth on IU's single-game list, and set a career-high with the two rushing scores.

• Before his injury, Sudfeld went 101-of-167 (60.5) for 1,151 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions.

SUMMER OF SUDFELD

Nate Sudfeld enjoyed a rewarding and busy summer. The senior quarterback received an invitation to serve as a counselor at the prestigious Manning Academy in July.

• He finished second among the college quarterbacks in the Papa John's Quarterback Challenge, a skills competition, and got the opportunity to talk some Xs & Os with Peyton and Eli Manning.

• Later in the month, Sudfeld received the opportunity to pick the brain of another all-pro, Andrew Luck.

• Luck hosted his annual Change The Play initiative in Bloomington, and Sudfeld worked the camp for the second straight year.

• He wrapped up his summer as one of the co-speakers at the Big Ten Kickoff Luncheon.

• Sudfeld talked about the service trip he took to Uganda over 2015 spring break, his second trip to the African country. He also traveled there with his family when he was 14.

• A two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Sudfeld is a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team, the National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Award and the Senior CLASS Award, and a member of the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List.

EARLY SUCCESS

In 2013, **Nate Sudfeld** completed 194-of-322 (60.2) for 2,523 yards with 21 touchdowns, nine interceptions and a 142.0 pass efficiency rating.

• He finished fourth in scores and completion percentage, seventh in yardage and ninth in completions on Indiana's single-season charts.

• A native of Modesto, Calif., Sudfeld set career-highs with 31 completions, 42 attempts, 363 passing yards, 398 total yards and four TDs (tied) against Navy.

• The 31 completions share eighth, 398 total yards are ninth and 363 passing yards are 10th all-time on the program's single-game lists.

• He earned his first career start against Bowling Green and finished with 335 yards on 17-of-26 passing with two passing strikes and one rushing score.

• Sudfeld became the third true freshman quarterback to play at IU in 2012. He threw for 632 yards, completed 51-of-82 (62.2) with seven touchdowns and one interception in seven games.

• The 14th-rated quarterback nationally by *ESPN.com* set school single-season records in passing yards (2,332), passing scores (29) and passing yards per game (233.2) at Modesto Christian High School.

• Sudfeld's brothers, Zach and Matthew, are twins and no strangers to football. Zach is a tight end for the New York Jets and starred at Nevada (2007-12). Matthew was a wide receiver at Brown (2007-11).

HOWARD HEADS NORTH FROM UAB

Looking to continue the ground dominance displayed in 2014, Indiana is off to a great start in 2015, led by junior **Jordan Howard**, a transfer from UAB. Howard joined the Hoosiers at the start of the spring semester.

• In his IU debut, Howard rushed for 145 yards on 20 carries (7.2 average) with a career-high three scores, including the game-winner with :58 remaining.

• Howard also added two receptions for 25 yards and now owns 12 career 100-yard games, five consecutive dating back to 2014, and five career multi-TD games.

• His 145 yards are the most for a Hoosier in his debut since Alex Smith posted 152 against Cincinnati on Sept. 3, 1994.

• Since the start of 2013, Howard ranks first nationally among active backs with 471 attempts, second with 108.9 rushing yards per game, third with 2,613 rushing yards and 116.4 yards from scrimmage per game, and fifth with 2,793 yards from scrimmage.

• He has averaged 5.5 yards per rush and scored 20 total touchdowns (18 rushing and two receiving).

• Howard earned first team All-Conference USA recognition in 2014, posting 1,587 yards on 306 carries (5.2 average) with 13 scores.

• Eighty-seven of his 306 attempts (28.4 percent) resulted in first downs.

• The Gardendale, Ala., native ranked seventh nationally with 132.3 rushing yards per game, 14th in rushing yards, 16th with 138.3 yards from scrimmage per game, 24th with 138.3 all-purpose yards per game, 25th with 1,659 yards from scrimmage, tied for 26th in rushing scores and tied for 30th with 14 total touchdowns.

• Howard tallied eight 100-yard games, including four straight to end the year, and five 150-yarders, with a career-high 262 yards in the win at Southern Miss.

• He also recorded five games with 30-plus attempts, including a career-high 39 vs. Marshall.

• En route to Conference USA All-Freshman team accolades in 2013, Howard collected 881 yards on 145 rushes (6.1) with two TDs.

SPRIGGS & FEENEY PACK A 1-2 PUNCH

Senior left tackle **Jason Spriggs** and redshirt junior right guard **Dan Feeney** anchor one of the nation's top offensive lines.

• During the Hoosiers spring testing, Spriggs ran a 4.82 40-yard dash (would have been 1st among 2015 NFL Combine participants), posted a 37.5 vertical leap (1st), benched 455 pounds and 33 reps on the 225-pound bench (fourth), and clean lifted 365 pounds.

• Spriggs is a three-time honorable mention All-Big Ten selection and was pegged a preseason second-teamer by Phil Steele.

• He started 28 consecutive games to begin his career and has made 35 starts in 36 games at left tackle.

• The Concord, Ind., native allowed just two sacks in 689 snaps and recorded 45 knockdowns in 2014.

• Feeney, an Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award Watch Lister, is also a *Steele* preseason fourth team All-America and first team All-Big Ten selection by *Steele* and *ESPN.com*.

• He has allowed just one sack in 25 career starts at right guard (1,810 snaps).

• The Orland Park, Ill., product started all 12 games in 2014 and led the offensive line with 80 knockdowns en route to honorable mention All-Big Ten accolades.

• Feeney also earned the team's Hoosier Iron Award (Outstanding Weight Room Performance).

• Spriggs and Feeney collected freshman All-America honors after starting all 12 games in 2012, an Indiana true freshman record for an offensive lineman.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

Greg Frey is in his fifth season as Indiana's offensive line coach. During his tenure, he has mentored some of the top lines in the country, and this year is no different.

- The unit owns 86 career starts and 138 games played among seven players led by left tackle **Jason Spriggs** (35 starts) and right guard **Dan Feeney** (25).
- Center Jake Reed (10) and right tackle Dimitric Camiel (6) round out the returning starters and redshirt freshman **Wes Martin** started at left guard in the Southern Illinois win.
- Guard **Jacob Bailey** (5) and center **Wes Rogers** (4) provide the Hoosiers with some experienced depth.
- Seven of the linemen can currently bench over 400 pounds and Martin paces the group with a 500 bench.
- Frey has coached 17 all-conference honorees in his career. Spriggs (2012-14), Feeney (2012, 2014), center Will Matte (2012) and center Collin Rahrig (2013-14) each have earned honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition at IU.
- Bailey and Rogers received freshman All-Big Ten accolades in 2013, joining Spriggs (2012), Feeney (2012) and Bernard Taylor (2011).
- From 2012-14, the Hoosiers ranked second in the Big Ten in passing yardage and total yardage per game, and fourth in rushing yardage per game.
- Indiana is the only conference team to rank in the top four in passing and rushing.
- During the same span, IU is one of two programs in the country to rank in the top 20 in fewest sacks allowed per game and rushing yards per carry.

INSIDE THE DEFENSE

Indiana returned five starters, 21 letterwinners and 98 career starts on defense. Game one's depth chart featured three seniors (two fifth-year), six juniors, 12 sophomores and seven freshmen (four true).

YOU ARE THE MAN...GIERI

Nick Mangieri started 10 times and played in 22 games at defensive end in his first two seasons. He returned to the line in a big way in the Southern Illinois win after playing the bandit position in defensive coordinator Brian Knorr's 3-4 system last year.

- The senior set a career-high and tied for game-high honors with 11 tackles, including a career-best nine solos, and the sixth sack of his career.
- In his first start at bandit, Mangieri picked up one sack in IU's season-opening win over Indiana State.
- Start number two also provided quality results: five stops, one sack, one interception (the second of his career), two quarterback hurries and one pass breakup.
- Overall in 2014, Mangieri started all 12 games and recorded 37 tackles, 19 solo, two sacks, two TFLs, one INT, three QBHs and two PBUs.
- He also picked up his second straight Academic All-Big Ten selection following the campaign.
- The Peoria, Ill., native made 10 starts in 2013 and collected 26 stops, 15 solo, three sacks (14 yards), six tackles for loss (22 yards), one pick, one forced fumble and five pass breakups.
- A three-time IU defensive player of the week, Mangieri was second on the team in sacks and TFLs.
- As a true freshman in 2012, Mangieri played in 10 games and finished with 12 tackles, one for loss.
- Mangieri's brother, P.J., was a long snapper at Nebraska (2009-12).

- His uncles, Ed and Dan Sutter, both played linebacker at Northwestern. Ed also played five seasons in the NFL (Cleveland, Baltimore and Atlanta).

SIMMONS SETTLED IN

T.J. Simmons is Indiana's leader with 151 tackles and 92 solo stops in his career. The junior, who has started 24 of the 25 games in which he has appeared, also owns three sacks, 10 tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

- Simmons opened 2015 in style with a game-high-tying 11 tackles, his second career game in double digits, to go along with seven solos, in the Southern Illinois win.
- He started 11 games in the middle last year and paced the team in tackles six times, including twice with game-high honors. He finished second on the Hoosiers with 72 stops and 46 solos.
- The four-time IU defensive player of the week added two sacks, 6.5 for loss, and his fumble recovery. Simmons topped Indiana and tied for eighth in the Big Ten with a pair of forced fumbles.
- Against Bowling Green, he set a career-high with 13 tackles and he posted a game-high nine stops and one sack vs. No. 8 Michigan State.
- Simmons became the first IU true freshman to start at middle linebacker since John Kerr (2002). He started all 12 games, which tied a Hoosiers freshman record.
- In 2013, he was the Big Ten's leading freshman tackler with 5.7 per game and made 68 stops overall, 42 solo, with one sack and 3.5 TFLs.
- *CollegeFootballNews.com* named Simmons an honorable mention freshman All-American and *ESPN.com* selected him freshman All-Big Ten.
- Simmons enrolled in the spring semester out of Lakeland (Fla.) High School, where he finished with 325 tackles and was a first team all-state selection.
- The 6-0, 240-pounder made an immediate impact, posting nine stops apiece in the opening two games against Indiana State (game-high) and Navy.
- Simmons has recorded at least seven tackles 10 times in his career.

- The four takeaways marked the program's highest total since it had four vs. Virginia on Sept. 20, 2011. Indiana last posted four-or-more in a Big Ten contest at Penn State on Nov. 14, 2009.
- The Hoosiers last recorded three INTs on Sept. 2, 2010, vs. Towson and against a Big Ten opponent at Iowa (five) on Oct. 31, 2009.
- IU finished with a season-high five sacks, from five different players, against Penn State, its highest total since seven at Illinois on Oct. 27, 2012, and matched a season-best with 11 tackles for loss.
- PSU's 13 points were the fewest allowed by Indiana in a league game since Oct. 8, 2005 vs. Illinois (13).
- Penn State's 330 total yards were the fewest surrendered by the Hoosiers in a Big Ten game since Nov. 27, 2010 at Purdue (310).
- IU picked off two passes in its victory over North Texas, the first time an Indiana team netted two interceptions since week four in 2013.
- In their 31-27 win at No. 18 Missouri, the Hoosiers held MU 14.1 points below its season average.
- The Tigers went 5-of-16 (31.3) on third down and scored just one touchdown in three red zone trips.
- IU also collected two sacks, 11 tackles for loss and one interception.
- Indiana's defense surrendered 170 total yards in its season-opening 28-10 victory over Indiana State, its fewest since Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Murray State (149).
- ISU rushed for only 30 yards, IU's lowest opponent total since Sept. 12, 2009 vs. Western Michigan (22).

STOUT UP FRONT

- The Hoosiers defensive line enjoyed the move to the 3-4 scheme last season.
- Linemen accounted for 12.5 of Indiana's 23 sacks and 32 of the team's 77 tackles for loss.
 - In 2015, five of those players returned along with senior **Nick Mangieri**, who moved back to the line after spending the 2014 campaign at bandit.
 - The six have started 52 games and played in 146 total in their careers.
 - Nose tackle **Nate Hoff** was named a 2014 honorable mention freshman All-American.
 - The redshirt sophomore started eight times and finished second on the team with 3.5 sacks (18 yards) and 8.5 tackles for loss (30 yards)
 - Hoff ranked third in sacks and shared third in tackles for loss among Big Ten freshmen.
 - Junior defensive tackle **Darius Latham** has started 10 times and appeared in 24 games in his career and owns 48 stops to go along with 3.5 sacks and 8.5 TFLs.
 - Fifth-year senior nose tackle **Adarius Rayner** leads the group having played in 31 games with 10 starts.
 - The Largo, Fla., native also has 8.5 stops for loss and four sacks.
 - A honorable mention freshman All-American in 2013, junior defensive tackle **Ralph Green III** has collected 44 tackles, two sacks and nine TFLs in 23 games (nine starts).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

- Three freshmen made an instant impact defensively in 2014 and earned postseason honors for their play.
- Sophomore Linebacker **Tegray Scales** shared the top spot (tied for ninth overall) among Big Ten freshmen and tied for the team lead with three interceptions en route to freshman All-America honors.

- He posted 46 tackles, including a career-high 11 at Bowling Green, 29 solo, with two sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and one pass breakup.
- The Cincinnati native earned Big Ten co-Freshman of the Week honors after he recorded five stops, one sack and one QBH in the Hoosiers win at No. 18 Missouri.
- IU's Defensive Newcomer of the Year collected the team's defensive player of the week honor twice.
- Scales picked off his first career pass in the North Texas win and snared his second against No. 8 Michigan State.
- He closed the year with six tackles, five solo, with one for loss and one interception in the Purdue victory, a week after he tallied eight stops and one sack at No. 7 Ohio State.
- **Chase Dutra** played in all 12 games with the first start of his career against Maryland.
- Dutra matched Scales with three interceptions (39 yards) and made 34 tackles, 26 solo, with two for loss, five pass breakups (tied for third on the team) and one forced fumble.
- The redshirt sophomore shared the top spot (ninth overall) in INTs and second in PBUs among Big Ten freshmen.
- A two-time IU defensive player of the week, Dutra posted a career-high six stops with one interception and one pass breakup in the Purdue win
- He snagged his first career pick against North Texas and the second he returned for 39 yards at Michigan.

EIGHT WALK-ONS AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS

- Fifth-year senior tight end **Michael Cooper**, redshirt sophomore cornerback **Ben Bach**, redshirt sophomore kicker **Griffin Oakes** and redshirt freshman running back **Ricky Brookins** were awarded scholarships as the Hoosiers broke preseason camp.
- Fifth-year senior punter **Eric Toth**, senior tight end **Anthony Corsaro**, senior wide receiver **Damon Graham** and redshirt junior wide receiver **Mitchell Paige** previously earned scholarships and have done so once again for the 2015 season.
 - A former walk-on himself at North Carolina, head coach **Kevin Wilson** awards scholarships on a yearly basis. Now in his fifth season, 40 players have been rewarded since his arrival in Bloomington.

NFL BOUND

- In head coach **Kevin Wilson's** first four full seasons, 16 Hoosiers have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, including four in 2015.
- Running back **Tevin Coleman** was selected 73rd overall by the Atlanta Falcons in the 2015 NFL Draft after the Denver Broncos picked wide receiver **Cody Latimer** 56th the previous year.
 - Latimer became the first Hoosier taken in the second round since St. Louis Rams offensive lineman **Rodger Saffold** in 2010 (33rd pick).
 - Tight end **Ted Bolser**, joined Latimer, as he went to the Washington Redskins with the second pick of the seventh round.
 - Wide receiver **Kofi Hughes** (Bears, Texans, Redskins), running back **Stephen Houston** (Steelers, Patriots) and kicker **Mitch Ewald** (Broncos) signed free agent deals in 2014, while center **Collin Rahrig** (Steelers), defensive tackle **Bobby Richardson** (Saints) and wide receiver **Shane Wynn** (Browns) inked free agent deals this year.

ALL-BIG HONORS

One year after boasting nine All-Big Ten honorees, the Hoosiers produced seven additional award winners in 2013. The 16 total marked the most for IU in a two-year span since 18 combined in 2000 (6) and 2001 (12).

- Indiana added seven more in 2014 for a three-year total of 23.
- Running back **Tevin Coleman** collected first team accolades last year.
- Right guard **Dan Feeney** (coaches and media), center **Collin Rahrig** (coaches and media), defensive lineman **Bobby Richardson** (coaches and media), offensive tackle **Jason Spriggs** (coaches and media) and wide receiver **Shane Wynn** (coaches and media) were honorable mention.

THE MISSOURI WIN

D'Angelo Roberts scored from three yards out with 22 seconds left to lift Indiana to a 31-27 victory over No. 18 Missouri on Sept. 20, 2014.

- The Hoosiers became the first Big Ten team to ever defeat a ranked SEC team on the road.
- IU claimed its first win over a top 20 team since 2006 (No. 15 Iowa, 31-28, Oct. 14) and its first on the road since 1987 (No. 9 Ohio State, 31-10, on Oct. 10).
- Indiana did not turn the ball over, snapping the Tigers streak of 47 consecutive games with a takeaway.

BACK-TO-BACK BUCKET WINS

With its 23-16 victory over Purdue in the 2014 season finale, Indiana claimed its second straight win over its in-state rival.

- The last time the program earned back-to-back victories over the Boilermakers came in 1993 and 1994.
- IU last carried the Bucket off the field three straight times from 1944-47.

COLEMAN REACHES 2,000

Tevin Coleman became the 18th player in FBS history to rush for 2,000 yards (2,036) last season. The total set a school record, is 15th on the FBS all-time list and sixth in Big Ten history.

- Coleman was Indiana's third unanimous and consensus All-American in 2014, finished seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting, was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award, earned an invitation to the 2015 NFL Combine and was drafted in the third round of the 2015 NFL Draft by the Atlanta Falcons.
- The Tinley Park, Ill., native finished second nationally in rushing yards (2,036), rushing yards per game (169.7), all-purpose yards per game (181.4) and yards from scrimmage per game (181.4), third in yards from scrimmage (2,177), fifth in all-purpose yards (2,177) and rushing yards per carry (7.54), tied for 19th in rushing touchdowns (15) and tied for 25th in total touchdowns (15).

- On the Hoosiers career lists, Coleman is first with 7.1 yards per attempt, fourth with 28 rushing TDs, fifth with 3,219 rushing yards and 4,292 all-purpose yards, and tied for sixth with 29 total scores.

- Coleman had 15 career 100-yard games, which is fifth in the Indiana record book, eight 150-yard games (third), five 200-yard games (first), one 250-yard game (tied for second) and one 300-yard game (tied for first).

YOUNG GUNS

In head coach Kevin Wilson's first four seasons, seven freshman have earned All-America status and 21 have collected All-Big Ten honors.

- Linebacker **Tegray Scales** carded All-America accolades one season ago.
- He was also recognized as an All-Big Ten performer along with safety **Chase Dutra**, wide receiver/return specialist **J-Shun Harris II**, nose tackle **Nate Hoff** and kicker **Griffin Oakes**.

TOP RECRUITING CLASSES

Kevin Wilson and his staff have assembled the highest-rated recruiting classes in school history over the past three seasons.

- The 2013 and 2014 classes were ranked in the top 40 nationally, which is also a program first.
- The hard work on the recruiting trail has paid off, as eight Hoosiers earned All-Big Ten freshman recognition in 2013 and five more collected honors in 2014.
- Wilson has coached seven freshman All-Americans and 21 freshman All-Big Ten honorees during his tenure in Bloomington.
- It would not be a surprise to see members of the 2015 recruiting class hit the field. The Hoosiers fielded 13 true freshmen in 2014, eight in 2013, 11 in 2012 and 16 in 2011.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

The football program set a school record with 26 Academic All-Big Ten recipients in 2013. Along with 24 honorees in 2011, 22 in 2012 and 21 in 2014, the program set a four-year school mark with 90 award winners in head coach **Kevin Wilson's** Era.

- **Adam Replogle** (2012) and **Mark Murphy** (2013, 2014) became the eighth and ninth IU players to collect Academic All-America honors. Murphy is just the third Hoosier to earn the honor twice.
- Murphy was one of 17 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athletes and the runner-up for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top scholar-athlete in college football.

- One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.

- Sixteen IU standouts have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, including four in 2015.

- Wide receiver Cody Latimer was selected 56th overall by the Denver Broncos in 2014 and running back Tevin Coleman was selected 73rd overall by the Atlanta Falcons in 2015.

- With its 31-27 win at No. 18 Missouri last season, the Hoosiers earned their first win over a top 20 team since 2006 and their first on the road since 1987. It marked the first time a Big Ten team defeated a ranked SEC team on the road.

- Indiana won the Old Oaken Bucket for the second straight year, the first time since 1993-94 the program has done so.

- In Wilson's four years, the offense has set 43 school records, including points, total yardage, passing yardage and rushing yardage in a single season.

- Coleman became the 18th player in FBS history to rush for 2,000 yards (2,036), which set a school record, is 15th on the FBS all-time list and sixth in Big Ten history. He was IU's third unanimous and consensus All-American, finished seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award.

- One year after boasting nine All-Big Ten honorees, the Hoosiers produced seven more in 2013. The 16 honorees marked the most for Indiana in a two-year span since 18 combined in 2000 (6) and 2001 (12). IU added seven more in 2014 for a three-year total of 23.

- The Hoosiers nine All-Big Ten players and six on offense, including three along the offensive line, were the program's most since 2001.

- Assembled the highest-rated recruiting classes in school history over the past three seasons. The hard work on the recruiting trail has paid off, as eight Indiana freshmen earned All-Big Ten freshman recognition in 2013 and five more collected honors in 2014.

- Coached seven freshman All-Americans and 21 freshman All-Big Ten honorees overall in his tenure.

- Adam Replogle (2012) and safety Mark Murphy (2013, 2014) became the eighth and ninth IU players to collect Academic All-America honors. Murphy is just the third Hoosier to earn the honor twice.

- Murphy was one of 17 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athletes and the runner-up for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top scholar-athlete in college football. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship.

- For the second time under Wilson, the program set a school record with 26 Academic All-Big Ten recipients in 2013.

- Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach (2002-05) and offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach (2006-10).

- Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).

- OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

- Over Wilson's time at Oklahoma, 26 offensive players were drafted in to the NFL, including seven first-rounders, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.

- Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).

- As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE - 2010), two sixth-round picks (James Hanna, TE - 2012; Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.

- Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award - awarded to the nation's top assistant coach, Wilson won the award in 2008. His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60-or-more points in five straight games and 716 total points, to average more than 51 points per contest.

- The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford. Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed for over 1,000 yards, Juaquin Iglesias caught 74 balls for 1,150 yards and Jermaine Gresham added 66 catches for 950 yards.

- Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman in 2007 and again in 2008, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.

- In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.

- Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.

- Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, which at the time was the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year. Peterson won the 2012 NFL Most Valuable Player Award after he rushed for 2,097 yards, just nine shy of the NFL's single-season mark.

- Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.

- Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami University after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hoeggner.

- Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.

- A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, Wilson earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games. He earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987).

- Wilson was a three-sport star at Maiden High School in Maiden, N.C.

- Kevin and his wife, Angela, have five children, including three daughters, Elaina (19), Makenzie (17) and Marlee (14), and two sons, Trey (15) and Toby (12).

DON FISCHER

This marks the 43rd year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 28 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio

Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 21 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 42 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 28 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 24 times, including the last five seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,600 Indiana University games - a total that includes seven bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 47 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 10 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson

and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year. Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have three grandchildren, Addy (5), Hayden (3) and Taylor (infant).



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 33rd year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

47th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

- Sophomore **Devine Redding** scored Indiana's first touchdown of the season, a 13-yard rush, at the 9:47 mark in quarter one. Redding added his second from three yards out to put the Hoosiers up with 2:34 remaining in the third.

- Redding finished the game with 57 yards on 16 carries (3.6 average)

- Fifth-year senior **Nate Sudfeld** threw for 349 yards, the second-highest total of his career, on 19-of-32 passing with a 57-yard touchdown. Sudfeld now has five 300-yard games and five career 50-plus yard TD passes. He added a career-high 46 rushing yards, which included a career-long 21-yard rush.

- Sudfeld moved into seventh in completions (365), seventh in passing yards (4,655), eighth in total offense (4,772), a tie for fourth in passing touchdowns (35), second in 300-yards games (5) and sixth in 200-yard games (11) in Indiana history.

- Redshirt junior **Ricky Jones** reached the end zone for the first time in his career, a 57-yard pass from Sudfeld, to open the second half scoring. Jones came into 2015 with 60 career receiving yards and four receptions. Today Jones pulled in six catches for 186 yards (both career-highs).

- Jones final reception of the day was for 71 yards, which set up the game-winning touchdown rush by Howard. His 186 yards rank ninth on IU's single-game list and are the most since Cody Latimer had 189 vs. Illinois on Nov. 9, 2013.

- Redshirt junior **Mitchell Paige** had career-highs in receptions (4) and yards (32).

- True freshman safety **Jonathan Crawford** blocked a 49-yard Southern Illinois field goal attempt in the opening stanza, which led to Indiana's first points. Bobby Richardson was the last Hoosier to block a field goal. Richardson's came against Penn State on Nov. 8, 2014.

- Crawford closed the game with eight tackles to go along with the block.

- Redshirt sophomore **Marcus Oliver** forced a pair of fumbles in the game, giving him five in just 15 career games. The linebacker finished with a career-high 10 tackles on the day.

- Freshman cornerback **Andre Brown, Jr.**, recovered the first fumble and redshirt junior linebacker Dawson Fletcher made his first career fumble recovery.

- Indiana is 39-17 all-time in Memorial Stadium openers. The Hoosiers have victories in 13 of their last 14 and wins in 30 of their last 34 home starters. **Kevin Wilson** owns a 4-1 mark in his five opening weekends.

- Junior linebacker **T.J. Simmons** and senior defensive end **Nick Mangieri** led the team with 11 tackles each. This is a career high for Mangieri, who added one sack as well.

- Griffin Oakes** nailed a 45-yard field in the third quarter and another from 22 yards with 9:08 left in the fourth. The redshirt sophomore also hit all six of his extra points. Oakes is 15-of-20 on field goals in his career, 4-of-5 from 40-49 yards, and 29-of-29 in extra points for his career.

- With 595 yards of total offense, this marks the 12th time in the **Kevin Wilson** era that the Hoosiers have accumulated at least 500 yards.

- Left guard **Wes Martin**, wide receiver **Ricky Jones**, wide receiver **Mitchell Paige**, running back **Jordan Howard**, linebacker **Marcus Oliver**, safety **Kiante Walton**, safety **Jonathan Crawford**, cornerback **Rashard Fant** and cornerback **Andre Brown, Jr.**, made their first career starts for the Hoosiers.

- Right guard **Dan Feeney**, defensive end **Nick Mangieri**, quarterback **Nate Sudfeld** and punter **Erich Toth** served as Indiana's game captains.

- IU won the toss and elected to defer.

- The Hoosiers wore the crimson state flag helmet.
