QUICK HITS

■ FIU closes out its two-game road trip when it faces UTEP on Saturday, Jan. 23 at 9:05 p.m. (ET) at the Don Haskins Center ... The Panthers are looking for their second straight win, their third win in their last four games and their seventh win in their last nine outings.

■ The Panthers are coming off an impressive 72-56 win at UTSA on Thursday night ... Donte McGill led three FIU players in double figures with a game-high 23 points ... Adrian Diaz scored 12 and Daviyon Draper added 11 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

■ McGill leads the team in scoring, averaging 17.0 points-per-game, while Diaz is netting 15.5 points-per-outing ... Draper rounds out the Panthers' double-digit scorers, averaging 14.3 points-per-contest.

■ McGill continues to be the hottest player on the team, averaging 22.7 points-per-game in his last four outings ... He has also scored 20-or-more points in six of his last nine games, averaging 20.7 points-per-game during that stretch.

■ Diaz leads Conference USA, and is tied for first in NCAA Division I (through games of Jan. 21), in blocked shots-per-game, averaging 3.2 rejections-per-outing ... He is also tied for the lead in Division I in total blocked shots (61).

HEAD COACH ANTHONY EVANS

■ Named the eighth head basketball coach at FIU on April 16, 2013.

■ Picked up his first win as the head coach at FIU with a 66-58 victory over Kennesaw State on Nov. 10, 2013. The win also marked the 100th-career victory for Evans.

■ In his first season at the helm, led FIU to a 15-win season. FIU picked up a big 72-61 victory over cross-state rival and 2012 Sweet Sixteen squad Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 7 at FIU Arena. FIU earned seven Conference USA wins in its inaugural season in the league, including two victories over rival Florida Atlantic.

■ During the 2014-15 campaign, Evans saw two of his players earn All-Conference USA honors. Dennis Mavin earned second team honors while Adrian Diaz was named to the All-C-USA Defensive Team. Diaz finished the year as the league leader in blocked shots per game (3.0 bpg), and was sixth in NCAA Division I in total blocked shots (99) and seventh in blocked shots per game.

■ Coached Tymell Murphy to a Second-Team All-C-USA honor for his play during the 2013-14 season. Murphy finished the year averaging 16.6 points-per-game (No. 4 in the conference) on 58.6 percent shooting from the floor (No. 4 in the conference; No. 18 nationally).

■ During his time with the Spartans, Evans amassed a 99-94 record, including back-to-back, 20-win seasons (26-10 in 2011-12 & 21-12 in 2012-13).

■ During the 2012-13 season, led Norfolk State to an undefeated Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference regular season mark (16-0) en route to being named the MEAC Coach of the Year and the team's second-straight post-season berth with an automatic bid to the 2013 National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

■ Was finalist for the Ben Jobe Award for the 2012-13 campaign, presented to the top minority coach in Division I basketball. He was also named a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award, presented to the top mid-major coach in Division I, and the Jim Phelan Award, presented to the top Division I coach.

■ In 2011-12, took the Spartans to new heights with the program's first-ever Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title and perhaps the biggest upset in NCAA Tournament history. In the 2012 NCAA Tournament, the Evans-led Spartans knocked off the No. 2 seed Missouri Tigers, 86-84, becoming the fifth No. 15 seed (at the time) to defeat a No. 2 seed.

■ Following its game at UTEP, FIU will return to Lime Court at FIU Arena, for two-straight, beginning on Thursday, Jan. 28, when it plays host to Charlotte ... The Panthers will then welcome Old Dominion to Miami on Saturday, Jan. 30 ... Both games will tipoff at 7 p.m.

SCOUTING THE MINERS

■ UTEP comes into Saturday's game with an 11-8 overall record and a 3-3 slate in Conference USA play ... The Miners are coming off a 71-56 win over Florida Atlantic on Thursday in El Paso ... The win snapped UTEP's three-game losing streak ... The Miners have dropped eight of its last 13 after starting the season 6-0.

■ Hooper Vint and Omega Harris led UTEP with 19 points apiece, and Terry Winn and Dominic Artis also grabbed a team-high six rebounds. .

■ Moore leads five players in double figures for UTEP on the year in the scoring column... He is netting 13.5 points-per-game followed Harris' 12.4 points-per-outing ... Earvin Morris (12.2 ppg), Artis (11.4 ppg) and Vint (11.3 ppg) round out the double-digit scorers.

■ Winn leads the Miners on the glass, grabbing 6.1 rebounds-per-game, with Vint a close second pulling down 5.9 boards-per-contest.

THE SERIES AGAINST UTEP

■ UTEP comes into Saturday's game with FIU holding a commanding 5-0 series lead, dating back to the 1998-99 season ... The Panthers are 0-2, both at home and in El Paso, and 0-1 in neutral site games with that contest taking place last season in the Conference USA quarterfinals ... The Miners handed FIU a season-ending 83-71 loss.

LAST TIME OUT FOR THE PANTHERS

■ FIU got back on the winning track with a 72-56 victory over UTSA on Thursday night in San Antonio ... The win was the Panthers' sixth in their last eight games.

■ Donte McGill led three players in double figures with a game-high 23 points, while Adrian Diaz and Daviyon Draper added 12 and 11 points, respectively ... Draper also grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds for his fourth double-double of the season, and the fifth of his career ... All 10 of the Panthers' players found the scoring column.

■ FIU shot 43.9 percent (25-of-57) from the field in the win, and outrebounded the Roadrunners, 44-32, including 11-7 on the offensive glass ... The Panthers' 11 offensive boards led to 14 second chance points.

DEFENDERS OF THE ARC

■ The Panthers have been pretty stingy in allowing their opponents to get open looks at the basket from behind the three-point arc ... In its 19 games this season, FIU's opposition has hit better than 35 percent just five times on the year.

■ FIU has also held its opposition to less than 19.2 percent from behind the three-point arc in seven of its 19 games, including four of the last nine, against Northern Illinois (3-of-16, 18.8 percent), Binghamton on Dec. 22 (4-of-28, 14.3 percent), Florida A&M on Dec. 29 (3-of-21, 14.3 percent) and UTSA on Jan. 21 (3-of-20, 15.0 percent).

■ In addition, the Panthers' foes are averaging 7.0 made three-point shots-per-game on 23.8 attempts-per-outing.

FIU HAS BEEN TREY-MENDOUS

■ The Panthers have been pretty impressive so far this season from behind the three-point arc, shooting 35.8 percent (114-of-318) from long-range, which is fifth in C-USA (through games of Jan. 21) ... FIU has hit eight or more three-point shots seven times this season, and in seven of its last 17 games, including a season-high 10 treys against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 14.

■ The Panthers have hit less than five treys just five times this year, with those coming in the season opener against Trinity Baptist (3) on Nov. 13, against North Florida (4) on Dec. 14, at Binghamton (3) on Dec. 22, at Marshall (4) on Jan. 9 and against Southern Miss (3) on Jan. 16.

THE BLOCK PARTY RETURNS

■ The Panthers are currently second in Conference USA (through games of Jan. 21) in blocked shots-per-game averaging 5.0 rejections-per-contest.

■ FIU has rejected six or more shots in a game eight times this season, including a season-high 10 against FGCU on Dec. 6 ... The Panthers' previous season-high was eight blocked shots against Stetson on Nov. 30 ... FIU has also blocked seven shots, four times, against Trinity Baptist (Nov. 13), Oral Roberts (Nov. 22), LIU Brooklyn (Nov. 25) and Florida A&M (Dec. 29).

■ During the 2014-15 season FIU continued its defensive dominance in the paint recording a school single season record 190 blocked shots, surpassing the old mark of 138 rejected during the 1999-2000 campaign.

■ The Panthers finished third in C-USA, last year, averaging 4.55 blocks-per-contest, and were 49th in Division I in blocked shots-per-game and 54th in total blocks (150).

■ FIU set a single game record for blocked shots with 14 vs. UAB on March 7, 2015 ... The Panthers tied the previous mark of 10 earlier in the year against UTSA on Feb. 5, 2015.

INCREASED PRESENCE ON THE BOARDS

■ In seven of its last 10 games, FIU has either outrebounded or tied its opponent on the glass, after only outrebounding - or tying - the opposition three times in the first nine games.

■ The Panthers have also recorded a positive double-digit rebounding margin in four of its last nine games, including a season-high +21 (46-25) against Florida Atlantic on Jan. 3 ... In the first nine games of the year, FIU had no better than a +5 rebounding margin (vs. Florida Memorial, Nov. 16, 44-39).

■ FIU has recorded double-digit offensive rebounds in six of the last 10 games, after accomplishing the feat just four times in the first nine games of the year ... The Panthers pulled down a season-high 19 offensive rebounds at North Florida on Dec. 14, 2015.

THE GLASS IS HALF FULL

■ With the Panthers shooting just 65.5 percent from the free-throw line on the year - 11th in Conference USA (through Jan. 21) - it's obvious that they haven't been blowing the world away from the charity stripe; that's why we prefer to look at the positive.

■ FIU's 75 percent (21-of-28) performance from the free-throw line against Southern Miss, on Jan. 16, marked the fifth straight game that the Panthers have shot better than 73 percent from the charity stripe, after shooting just 70 percent or better twice in the first 14 games of the season ... During its last six games, FIU is shooting at a 76.4 percent (97-of-127) clip which is good enough for second in Conference USA.

■ The FIU Panthers were picked to finish 10th in the Conference USA preseason poll which was selected by the leagues 14 head coaches.

■ Defending Conference USA Tournament champion UAB picked up 11-of-14 first place votes claiming the top spot ... Old Dominion, who received three first place votes was picked second, while Middle Tennessee, UTEP and Louisiana Tech were slated third through fifth, respectively ... DIAZ NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-C-USA TEAM

■ Senior forward Adrian Diaz was named to the preseason All-Conference USA first team as selected by the league's 14 head coaches.

■ Diaz averaged 13.0 points- and 6.9 rebounds-per-game last season, to go along with a C-USA best 3.0 blocked shots per game ... His blocked shot average was also good enough for seventh in NCAA Division I ... For his efforts on the defensive end of the floor, last season, Diaz was named to the C-USA All-Defensive Team at the conclusion of the season.

■ FIU Head Coach Anthony Evans also improved his career coaching record in season openers to 6-4 ... Evans was 3-3 in openers at Norfolk State, with two of the three losses coming at Marquette (99-68), to tip off the 2011-12 campaign, and at Baylor (86-58) to start the 2009-10 season.

■ FIU Arena has been very kind to the Panthers in season openers through the years ... With the victory over Trinity Baptist, the Panthers hold a 16-5 record (two wins - the season opener in 2004-05 vs. Florida Atlantic, and in 2003-04 vs. Morris Brown were vacated due to NCAA sanctions) all-time in season openers on their home floor ... The Panthers are 5-1 in its last six home-opening games with the only loss coming to Miami (73-50) on Nov. 11, 2006.

2015-16 SCHEDULE

■ FIU's 31-game schedule will feature 16 homes games on Lime Court at FIU Arena, with six of those games being against non-conference foes ... In addition, FIU will once again take on in-state rivals Stetson, Florida Gulf Coast, North Florida and Florida A&M, and will play in the James Madison University Men Against Breast Cancer Classic in Harrisonburg, Va.

■ FIU's schedule features nine opponents that reached post-season competition last season including: James Madison (CIT), Oral Roberts (CBI), Florida Gulf Coast (CIT) and North Florida (NCAA), and Conference USA foes: Louisiana Tech (NIT), UTEP (NIT), Old Dominion (NIT), UAB (NCAA) and Middle Tennessee (CIT).

WRIGHT AND CAPKO JOIN FIU STAFF

■ FIU Head Coach Anthony Evans added two veteran coaches to his staff during the offseason in Spencer Wright and Chris Capko.

■ Wright spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Mercer, where he joined the staff in 2008-09 ... He worked in that capacity for two seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in July 2010.

■ Wright was side-by-side with Head Coach Bob Hoffman as the pair presided over the most successful seven-year stretch in program history ... Since his arrival at Mercer, the Bears produced a 146-98 record, including a 27-9 season in 2013-14, highlighted by the NCAA Tournament second round upset of No. 6 Duke ... The win over Duke was the latest in a series of high-major victories claimed by Wright's Mercer teams ... In addition to the Blue Devils, the Bears also topped Ole Miss, Seton Hall, Tennessee, Alabama (twice), Florida State, Georgia Tech and Auburn during his time ... In his final four years at Mercer, Wright was on the sidelines for March wins in the NCAA, NIT, CIT and CBI tournaments.

■ At his previous position with the Rio Grande Vipers of the NBA D-League, Wright worked with NBA first-round draft picks Aaron Brooks, Shannon Brown, C.J. Watson, Steve Novak and Desmon Farmer, as well as second-round pick Cedric Simmons.

■ Capko comes to FIU after spending two seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations for the USC men's basketball program ... During his two seasons at USC, Capko played an integral role in helping guard Jordan McLaughlin earn a spot on the All-Pac 12 Rookie Team ... In addition, he helped oversee the team's academic success in 2014-15 as they set a program record for highest team GPA ... Capko also assisted the rest of the USC staff in establishing strong recruiting classes during his two seasons ... USC's 2015 class was ranked 20th nationally by Rivals, 22nd by Scout and 30th by ESPN. In 2014, the Trojan class was ranked 12th by Scout, 16th by ESPN and 23rd by Rivals.

■ Before his time at USC, Capko spent the previous two seasons as an assistant men's basketball coach at Georgia Southern, and prior to that at he served as assistant coach at Stetson for two seasons (2010 and 2011) ... During the 2010-

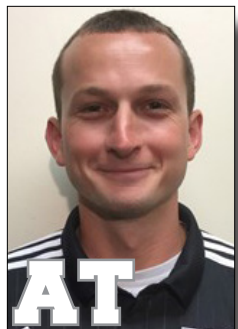

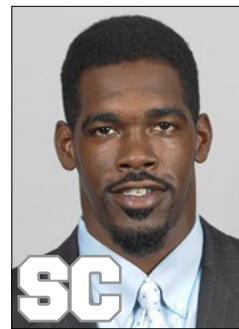

PLAYER NOTES

ONCE AGAIN, DIAZ NAMED C-USA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

■ Adrian Diaz became the league's first three-time recipient, this season, of the Conference USA Player of the Week honor (shared the honor), when he was recognized for the week ending Jan. 3 ... Diaz averaged 18.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocked shots-per-game in helping  FIU to a 2-0 record during the week ... This is the third C-USA Player of the Week honor of the season for Diaz and the fourth of his career (March 9, 2015, Nov. 23, 2015 and Dec. 2, 2015).

■ Diaz earned his second C-USA Player of the Week honor, when he was recognized for the week ending Dec. 6 ... Diaz averaged 19.3 points-per-game, 8.3 rebounds-, 5.0 blocked shots- and 35.0 minutes-per-game during the week.

■ Diaz earned his first honor of the year, when he was tabbed C-USA Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 22 ... The Miami native averaged 15 points-, 11 rebounds- and 4.3 blocks-per-game in four games during the week, as the Panthers logged a 2-2 record.

DIAZ BECOMES ALL-TIME BLOCKED SHOT LEADER AT FIU

■ Just 40 seconds into the second half against Stetson, on Nov. 30, Adrian Diaz blocked a Brian Pegg layup and in doing so became FIU's all-time leader in blocked shots, surpassing Dwight Stewart (1988-93) and his 126 career rejections ... Diaz had, a then, season-high six blocks against the Hatters to go along with a season-best 24 points.

■ Diaz recorded a season-high seven blocked shots against FGCU on Dec. 6 ... He currently has 159 rejections for his career at FIU.

■ Adrian Diaz reached another career scoring milestone against Western Kentucky on Jan. 7 ... With his 16 points, against the Hilltoppers, Diaz recorded his 800th career-point ... Diaz currently has 848 career collegiate points (at both Kansas State and FIU).

■ With his 19 points against Southern Miss, on Jan. 16, Diaz surpassed the 700-point plateau at FIU ... He currently has 723 career points with the Panthers in 52 games.

■ On Dec. 6 against FGCU, Diaz pulled down his 400th career-rebound with a nine-rebound performance ... He currently has 483 career rebounds, 389 with FIU.

Both of these milestones encompass his time at both Kansas State and FIU.

■ Diaz's presence on the floor is felt in many ways, but not the least of which is on the defensive end of the floor ... Diaz has recorded 61 blocked shots this season for an average of 3.2 blocks per game ... That not only leads C-USA, but is tied for first in NCAA Division I ... Diaz's 61 total blocks on the year also leads the nation (through games of Jan. 21).

■ Diaz has recorded three or more blocks in 12 of the Panthers' 19 games this season, and 27 times in 52 career games played at FIU ... In addition, Diaz has blocked at least one shot in 22 out of 23 games, dating back to last season, and in 33-of-36 games dating back to last year.

■ Diaz' 19-game consecutive blocked shot streak came to an end on Jan. 9 at Marshall ... Prior to that game against the Thundering Herd, Diaz last went without a blocked shot against Western Kentucky on Feb. 28, 2015 ... He seemed to recover nicely, however, rejecting four in the next game against Louisiana Tech (Jan. 14).

■ Last year Diaz set a FIU single-season record for blocked shots with 99 ... His blocked shot average (3.0 bpg) led C-USA, and was good enough for seventh in Division I.

■ With his one blocked shot against UTSA on Jan. 21, Diaz moved past Russell Hicks (2007-08) and into sole possession of second on FIU's single season blocked shot list ... He currently sits with 61 on the year.

■ The Miami native also set a school record for shots blocked in a single game, with 13 against UAB on March 7, 2015, and tied the C-USA mark with Hassan Whiteside, of Marshall, who accomplished the feat on Feb. 27, 2010 ... For his efforts against the Blazers, Diaz was named the Conference USA Player of the Week for the week ending March 9, 2015.

■ Offensively, Diaz has shot better than 60 percent from the field in 13 of the Panthers' 19 games this season, including a perfect 100 percent (6-of-6) from the field against Binghamton on Dec. 22, en route to 16 points.

■ Diaz has shot better than 66 percent in six of his last eight games, shooting 74.1 percent (43-58) during that stretch.

■ He also shot at an 83.3 percent (5-of-6) clip against James Madison (Nov. 20), 87.5 percent (12-of-14) vs. Stetson on Nov. 30, 85.7 percent (6-of-7) against Florida A&M on Dec. 29 and 80.0 percent (4-of-5) at UTSA on Jan. 21.

Interviews - General

ALL INTERVIEWS, both on the local and national levels with the FIU men's basketball team are coordinated by Michael Hogan, men's basketball media relations contact.

The FIU Athletic Media Relations Department has the right to refuse any interview request. Contacting student-athletes, coaches and staff without permission from the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department is not permissible and may result in revocation of credentials.

Student-Athlete Interviews

Interviews should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance through the FIU Media Relations Department (305-348-1496). While several interviews are conducted over the phone, the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department will never give out student-athlete's cell phone numbers or private contact information. In-person interviews will take place, either in the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department (FIU Arena Room 211) or after practice. Please contact the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department for ALL interview requests. Other accommodations can be arranged through the Athletic Media Relations Department.

Coaches and Staff Interviews

Interviews with Head Coach Anthony Evans must come through the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department. Interviews should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance. No member of the FIU staff may be interviewed without permission by the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department. Personal numbers of both coaches and staff members will not be given out.

Covering Practice

All practices are closed to the media, as are walk-throughs, at FIU Arena on the day of all home games. Head Coach Anthony Evans and selected student-athletes will be made available after practice. Media members must contact the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department (Michael Hogan - Men's Basketball Contact) if they wish to attend post-practice or to set up interviews. No interview will be granted without the permission of the FIU Athletic Media Relations Department.

Pre-Game Interviews

FIU players will not be available for any media activities on game day.

Post-Game Interviews

The athletic media relations staff at FIU is aware of the importance of media coverage and places great importance on the role of the media insofar as it interacts with their respective duties. To ensure the most workable situation for members of both entities, the following procedures must be observed:

1. The FIU men's basketball program will observe a brief NCAA-prescribed cooling off period before beginning post-game interviews.

2. A post-game press conference will be conducted in Room 272 of FIU Arena with Head Coach Anthony Evans and selected student-athletes.

3. Post-game interviews will NOT be held on the court.

■ In the Panthers' game against UAB on March 7, 2015, Diaz made school history recording FIU's first ever triple-double, in the 70-66 win over the eventual Conference USA Tournament champions ... Diaz scored 14 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to go along with his record breaking 13 blocked shots ... Diaz was only one of 14 players in Division I to record a triple-double last season ... Diaz also posted six double-doubles on the season.

■ Diaz recorded a career-high 18 rebounds at Binghamton on Dec. 22 ... He surpassed his previous mark of 14 rebounds, set earlier this season against Florida Memorial on Nov. 16.

■ Diaz has recorded double-figure rebounds in six games this season - including two of his last eight games - and in 14 games during his collegiate career, including his time at Kansas State (13 at FIU).

■ Diaz had his second-highest rebounding total of his career, 15, against Florida Atlantic on Jan. 3 ... Six of those 15 rebounds came on the offensive glass, and tied his season-high.

■ During his first season at FIU, after transferring from Kansas State, Adrian Diaz made his presence felt on the floor and in the record books in 2014-15 ... Diaz is the Panthers top returning leader in points (13.0 ppg), rebounds (6.9 rpg) and blocked shots-per-game (3.0 bpg), from 2014-15 ... He finished last season second on the team in scoring and tied for 18th in Conference USA.

■ Diaz scored in double figures in 22 of the 33 games he played in during 2014-15, and recorded 20 or more points four times, including a career-high 33 points at Georgia Southern (Nov. 24, 2014) ... During a three-game stretch, from Dec. 21, 2014 through Jan. 4, 2015, Diaz averaged 25.0 points per game against Hartford (29), Florida A&M (19) and Florida Atlantic (27).

DAVIYON DRAPER NOTES

■ Daviyon Draper is third in the scoring column, for the Panthers, averaging 14.3 points-per-game, and second on team in rebounding, grabbing 6.8 rebounds-per-game ... He is also tied for 15th in scoring in Conference USA (through games of Jan. 21).

■ Draper started the season scoring in double figures in six-consecutive games played (missed one game - Oral Roberts on Nov. 22 - due to injury) which is his longest such streak of his career at FIU ... That stretch came to a halt on Dec. 4 against Elon, when he netted just eight points.

■ Draper has been consistent from the field hitting 43.7 percent (101-of-231) from the floor ... He has shot better than 50 percent in nine of his 18 games played ... Including last season, Draper has shot better than 50 percent from the field in 23 of his 49 career games for FIU.

■ In his last three games, Draper is averaging 19.2 points-per-game, while shooting 50.0 percent (32-of-64) from the field and 85.7 percent (12-of-14) from the free-throw line.

■ Draper shot a season-high 61.5 percent (8-of-13) from the field against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 14, en route to his 18 points.

■ Draper set a new career-high, with a 25-point effort at Marshall on Jan. 9 ... Draper was 11-of-21 (52.4 percent) from the field and 3-of-4 (75.0 percent) from the free-throw line.

■ Just one-game prior to setting his new career scoring mark, Draper tied his career-high with a 21-point outing - including 14 points in the first half - versus Western Kentucky on Jan. 7 ... Draper was 10-of-19 (52.6 percent) from the field in helping the Panthers to the win.

■ Draper logged his fifth career double-double with a 11-point, 12-rebound effort at UTSA on Jan. 21

■ Draper recorded his fourth-career double-double - and his third in a four-game stretch - after logging 15 points and a career-high 15 rebounds against Florida Atlantic on Jan. 3.

■ Draper posted back-to-back double-doubles when he netted 10 points and 10 rebounds against Northern Illinois on Dec. 19, and then with a 13-point, 10-rebound effort at Binghamton on Dec. 22 ... He recorded his first career double-double with a 15-point, 11-rebound outing on Jan. 17, 2015 against Western Kentucky.

■ Draper fell just shy of recording a new career-high for points, twice, when he netted 19 points against Florida Memorial on Nov. 16 and against UT Martin on Nov. 21 ... He was 9-of-17 from the floor on the night in 31 minutes against FMU, and 5-of-13 from the field against the Skyhawks.

■ Dating back to last year, Draper has scored in double figures in 20 of his last 24 games, which includes a 20-point outing against UAB on March 7, 2015.

DONTE MCGILL NOTES

■ Donte McGill continues to be the hottest player on the Panthers' roster over the past six games ... McGill is averaging 17.0 points-per-game, which is tops the team - and fifth in Conference USA (through games of Jan. 21) ... ■ McGill poured in a career-high 29 points - 23 of which came in the first half - against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 14 ... McGill was 10-of-18 (55.6 percent) from the field, including 3-of-5 (60.0 percent) from three-point range, and a perfect 6-of-6 (100.0 percent) from the free-throw line ... McGill's 55.6 percent from the floor marked a career-high.

■ McGill's new career-high surpassed his previous career-best that was established with a 25-point effort against Elon on Dec. 4 ... He shot 10-of-13 from the field (76.9 percent), including 1-of-1 from behind the three-point arc, and was 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) from the free-throw line in 30 minutes ... He also paced the team - and shared game-high rebounding honors - with eight boards.

■ Against LIU, McGill logged, a then career-high, 24 points and was an impressive 5-of-8 from the field, including 2-of-3 from three-point range, and 12-of-13 from the free throw line ... Five of McGill's career-high nine rebounds came on the offensive glass.

■ McGill had a 22-point effort against Florida Atlantic, on Jan. 3, shooting 8-of-15 (53.3 percent) from the field, including 1-of-3 (33.3 percent) from three-point range, and 5-of-5 (100.0 percent) from the free-throw line.

PLAYER NOTES

■ On Jan. 7 at Western Kentucky, McGill logged 16 points, including the go-ahead - and eventually game-winning - three-point shot with 38 seconds left in the contest, putting the Panthers up 73-72 ... FIU would win the game 75-72.

■ McGill's third 20-point, or better, outing of the season came on Dec. 19, against Northern Illinois, when he posted a game-high 23 points, on 8-of-15 (53.3 percent) shooting from the field, including 4-of-5 (80.0 percent) from behind the three-point arc. He was also 3-of-4 (75.0 percent) from the free-throw line ... In addition, he grabbed seven rebounds in 41 minutes during the double-overtime affair.

KIMAR WILLIAMS NOTES

■ Kimar Williams is averaging 4.4 points-per-game in 19 games - including nine starts - for the Panthers.

■ Boswell has scored double-figure points in six of the 19 games that he has played in this year, including a career-high 14 points against Oral Roberts on Nov. 22 ... Recently, Boswell netted 11 points on 57.1 percent (4-of-7) shooting, from the field and 50.0 percent (2-of-4) shooting from three-point range against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 14.

■ Elmo Stephen played his first career collegiate game, for FIU on Dec. 14 against North Florida, after missing the first nine games of the year with a stress fracture in his right leg ... Stephen tallied three points and grabbed two rebounds in his debut.

■ Stephen has made a big impact already for the Panthers in his 10 games played ... He comes into the UTEP game averaging 7.7 points-per-game ... Against Florida A&M, on Dec. 29, Stephen poured in a career-high 18 points, on 6-of-10 (60.0 percent) shooting from the field; all coming from behind the three-point arc ... His six treys made also marked a career-high.

■ Stephen had a huge game in just his second outing with the Panthers, dropping in a, then, career-high 15 points on 5-of-11 (45.4 percent) shooting from the field and 4-of-8 (50.0 percent) from three-point range ... Stephen hit the game-tying three-point shot at the end of regulation that put the game into overtime.

■ Most recently, Stephen netted nine points against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 14, and nine points and a career-high eight rebounds at Marshall on Jan. 9.
