SCOUTING FURMAN

Furman comes into its season opener with FIU after posting an 8-5-6 record last year (6-2-2 Southern Conference) and winning the Southern Conference Tournament championship - its second consecutive - with a 2-1 win over East Tennessee.

Last year's trip to the NCAA Tournament marked the Paladins' second straight and 10th overall ... After ending extra time 1-1, Furman dropped a tough decision to No. 21 - and in-state foe - South Carolina in a penalty kick shootout, 2-1.

Furman returns its top five point scorers from last season ... Lewis Hawke paced the Paladins last year with 12 points (5G, 2A), while Eli Pinner (eight points, 3G, 2A) and Bobby Edet (seven points, 3G, 1A) were second and third, respectively.

THE SERIES HISTORY VS. THE PALADINS

Friday will mark the fifth meeting all-time between FIU and Furman dating back to the 1979 season ... The Paladins hold a 3-1 series lead and have won three-straight after the Panthers won the first meeting, 7-1, on Sept. 29, 1979 ... Furman has outscored FIU 9-4 in its three wins ... The two teams last met on Sept. 14, 2012 when the No. 21 Paladins defeated the Panthers 2-1.

SCOUTING THE COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON

The Cougars boast a veteran lineup that features eight seniors and nine juniors, and will look to use that wealth of experience to their advantage ... Five players from the College garnered All-CAA acclaim, and all five make their return to this year's team ... First team keeper Kevin Shields headlines the group, and does so for a team that allowed the fewest goals (22) in the CAA last season thanks in large part to his heroics in the frame ... Joined by second and third team defenders Cesar Murillo and Leland Archer, the Cougars will once more look to clamp down on defense.

THE SERIES HISTORY VS. THE COUGARS

FIU and the College of Charleston will meet for the seventh time all-time on day two of the Nike/Aaron Olitsky Memorial Soccer Classic ... The Cougars have outscored the Panthers 14-9 in the series since the first meeting in 1990, and have defeated FIU twice in overtime tilts.

FIU HEAD COACH SCOTT CALABRESE

Scott Calabrese enters his third season in 2016 as head coach of the FIU men's soccer program and has guided the Panthers to a 18-16-2 record in his two seasons on the sidelines for FIU, including the program's first Conference USA Tournament championship and an appearance in its ninth NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Tournament ... Calabrese also guided the Panthers to its 450th all-time win with a 2-1 triumph over Princeton on Sept. 12, 2015 ... Calabrese came to FIU after a successful six-year stint as head coach at East Tennessee State ... He currently boasts an 75-60-18 career coaching record.

THE LOWDOWN

The FIU men's soccer program begins its 44th season this weekend as the Panthers take part in the Nike/Aaron Olitsky Memorial Soccer Classic, Aug. 26-28, at the College of Charleston in Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina ... FIU will kick off the regular season against Furman on Aug. 26 at 5 p.m. and then face the homestanding Cougars on Aug. 28 at 2:30 p.m. ... This weekend's matches will mark two of three matches that the Panthers will play away from the friendly confines of the FIU Soccer Stadium in its first five matches ... Following the final match of the Classic, the Panthers will return to Miami and get ready for their opening weekend at home against Wisconsin on Sept. 2 at 7 p.m. and Niagara on Sept. 4 at 2 p.m. ... The match against Niagara is the second match of a women's and men's doubleheader ... The women will face Miami (Ohio) at 12 p.m.

CALABRESE MOVING IN ON ANOTHER CAREER MILESTONE

FIU Head Coach Scott Calabrese is closing in on his 80th career win as he enters his ninth season as a head coach, at both East Tennessee State and with the Panthers ... Calabrese comes into Furman match with an impressive 75-60-18 career coaching record.

Calabrese won his 70th career match last season at UCF, 2-1, on Sept. 29 ... And three wins prior to his 70th career victory, Calabrese guided the Panthers to their 450th all-time win with a 2-1 triumph over Princeton on Sept. 12 at the FIU Soccer Stadium.

HEZEL & BETANCUR EARN PRESEASON ALL-C-USA ACCOLADES

Prior to the beginning of the season Marvin Hezel and Luis Betancur were named to the Preseason Conference USA All-Conference team ... In addition, Hezel was also named the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year as voted on by C-USA's nine men's soccer head coaches.

Hezel, a senior defender from Waldshut, Germany, started in all 20 matches last year for FIU, leading a defensive corps that allowed just 1.3 goals-per-game, and posted four shutouts on the year ... Two of those four clean sheets came in the Conference USA Tournament against No. 11 Kentucky (1-0) in the semifinals and Marshall (1-0) in the title game ... Offensively he accumulated six points, with two goals and two assists, in his 1,783 minutes ... He was named to the 2015 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-Southeast Region First Team, the All-C-USA First Team and the C-USA Championship All-Tournament Team.

Betancur, a senior forward from Parkland, Florida, saw action in 17 matches while getting the starting nod in 12 contests ... He finished the season tied for the team lead in points with 19, on nine goals and one assist ... He also finished the 2015 campaign fifth in C-USA in points and fourth in goals scored ... Early in the season, Betancur was named C-USA Offensive Player of the week (week ending 9/28) after notching the program's first hat trick since 2005, doing so in a 7-0 win against Florida Atlantic ... At the conclusion of the season, Betancur received All-C-USA Second Team recognition, as well as being named to the NSCAA All-Southeast Region Team.

FIU TRIO PLAYS WITH PUERTO RICAN NATIONAL TEAM

Three FIU men's soccer players spent part of their summer with the Puerto Rican National Team when the team faced the U.S. National Team in the first-ever meeting between the two countries ... Luis Betancur, Patrick Lopez and Daren Rios all took the pitch for Puerto Rico at Juan Ramon Loubriel Stadium in Bayamon, Puerto Rico on May 22, with Betancur and Lopez getting the start.

Betancur added to the historic meeting, by making a bit of history himself, taking

a pass from Joseph Marrero – following a U.S. turnover – and lofting the ball over goalkeeper Brad Guzan's head and into the top right corner of the goal in the 42nd minute to cut the U.S. lead to 2-1 ... It marked the first goal to be scored by Puerto Rico against the U.S.

BOOTH TRAINS WITH JAMAICA U20

In addition to Luis Betancur, Patrick Lopez and Daren Rios all playing for the Puerto Rico National Team during the summer, redshirt freshman Andrew Booth also spent time with the Jamaican U20 National Team during training camp for the Caribbean Football Union Tournament slated for June 13-19, 2016.

SCHOLASTIC HONORS PILE UP FOR ROOKIE CALVO

Esteban Calvo will begin his freshman campaign at FIU with some pretty impressive credentials ... Following his scholastic career at Montverde Academy (MVA) in Montverde, Florida, Calvo was named the Florida Gatorade Player of the Year and was tabbed a TopDrawerSoccer.com High School All-American.

Calvo comes to FIU after playing two seasons at MVA – the two-time defending national champion – as part of MVA's Soccer Institute at Montverde Academy (SIMA) Program ... During his two campaigns he helped guide the Eagles to a 49-0 record; a 26-0 slate in 2014-15 and a 23-0 mark in 2015-16, and No. 1 final rankings at the conclusion of both seasons in the USA Today Super 25 ... As Calvo's scholastic career came to a close, MVA finished the season in the midst of a national record 136-match unbeaten streak dating back to the 2010 campaign ... Calvo helped to guide the Eagles to two Montverde Academy Soccer Tournament (MAST) championships, and was tabbed the MAST best defender and 2016 Most Valuable Player ... The MAST is widely considered as the premier high school soccer tournament in the country ... As one of the top defensive midfielders on the team, Calvo led a defensive corps that allowed just four goals scored and posted 19 shutouts during 2015-16 ... Offensively, Calvo recorded five goals and eight assists.

Off the pitch, Calvo has maintained a weighted 3.58 GPA in the classroom at MVA, and has volunteered locally with the Johan Cruyff Foundation, organizing and coaching at sporting events for children from underprivileged backgrounds and with special needs.

FIU STARTS 2016 AMONG THE NATIONS BEST

FIU begins the 2016 season appearing in three of the four preseason national polls ... The Panthers are tabbed No. 23 in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the College Soccer News Top 30 rankings ... In addition, TopDrawerSoccer.com has FIU as one of five teams receiving votes in its poll, three of which are Conference USA members.

PANTHERS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN C-USA PRESEASON POLL

The defending C-USA conference tournament champion Panthers have been picked to finish third in the Preseason C-USA Coaches Poll, behind only Kentucky and Charlotte who were chosen first and second, respectively ... New Mexico and South Carolina are in a tie for fourth, rounding out the top five schools.

Old Dominion was picked to finish sixth followed by UAB in seventh and Marshall and Florida Atlantic, eighth and ninth, respectively.
