SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana kicks off its 132nd year of football on Thursday, Sept. 1, against Florida International at Ocean Bank Field at FIU Stadium (20,000; FieldTurf). Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. EDT and ESPNU will broadcast the game.
- IU returns 17 starters from 2015, including eight on offense, eight on defense and one on special teams. The Hoosiers are multiple on offense and defense.
- FIU returns 17 starters from 2015, including nine on offense, five on defense and three on special teams. The Panthers run a pro set offense and a multiple 4-3 defense.
- Florida International ended the 2015 season with a 5-7 overall record, a 3-5 mark in Conference USA play and a 4-1 record at home.
- The teams are meeting for the second time with Indiana winning the first matchup, 36-22, on Sept. 12, 2015.

THE COACHES

- Kevin Wilson** is in his sixth season as Indiana head coach. Wilson led IU to the 2015 New Era Pinstripe Bowl, the program's first postseason appearance since 2007. He has mentored three first team All-Americans, 23 players who have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites and a five-year program record 111 Academic All-Big Ten honorees. The offense has set 54 school records during his tenure.
- Ron Turner is in his fourth season as Florida International head coach, where he owns a 10-26 (.240) record. Turner coached at Illinois from 1997-2004 and San Jose State in 1992, and he has a 52-87 (.375) overall mark.

NEWS & NOTES

- Kevin Wilson** is 4-1 in openers with four straight victories.
- Indiana is opening on a Thursday night for the fourth time (2009, 2010, 2013) in eight years.
- The Hoosiers have won 12 of their last 13 season openers.
- Since 2012, IU is first in the Big Ten in passing, second in total, third in scoring and fourth in rushing offense per game. Indiana is the only conference team to rank in the top four in each category.
- The 2015 Hoosiers became the fourth team in FBS history with a 3,500-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and one 1,000-yard receiver in the same year, joining 2005 Southern California, 2008 Oklahoma (Wilson was the Sooners offensive coordinator) and 2015 Southern Miss.
- IU also led the Big Ten in total offense, scoring offense and passing offense, the first team since the 1995 Ohio State Buckeyes to do so.
- Indiana has won seven of its last eight non-conference games. The Hoosiers went 4-0 in 2015 and opened the season 4-0 for the first time since 1990.

Practices are closed to the media. Requested coaches and players will be available in the Team Room in the North End Zone complex for post-practice interviews on Tuesdays. Wilson, Allen and players made available at Monday's press conference will not be available on Tuesdays.

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the Weight Room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

TEAM

• Indiana appeared in the 2015 New Era Pinstripe Bowl, the program's first postseason appearance since 2007.

• Offensive linemen **Dan Feeney** and Jason Spriggs in 2015, and Tevin Coleman in 2014, earned first team All-America honors. The three All-Americans are the most for the Hoosiers over a two-year period since 1968-69 (3).

• Spriggs and Feeney became the first offensive line tandem to secure first team honors in the same season in program history and just the sixth pair of teammates to ever accomplish the feat.

• Twenty-three IU standouts have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites in **Kevin Wilson's** tenure, including three draft picks - Spriggs (Green Bay, 48th overall), running back Jordan Howard (Chicago, 5th round) and quarterback Nate Sudfeld (Washington, 6th round), and seven overall in 2016.

• Wide receiver Cody Latimer was selected 56th overall by Denver in 2014 and Coleman was selected 73rd overall by Atlanta in 2015.

• IU has had at least one pick in the first three rounds three straight years for the first time since 1993-95, and six selections overall, the program's most since 1991-93.

• Thirty-eight Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors in the Wilson Era, highlighted by a school record 12 last season.

• In 2015, Indiana won its final two regular season games for the first time since 2001, its final two road games for the first time since 1982 and its final two games with both on the road for the first time since 1946.

• IU had not won back-to-back Big Ten games since 2012, two B1G road games in the same year since 2001, back-to-back league road games since 1993 and three road games in a single season since 1994.

• Wilson has assembled the highest-rated recruiting classes in school history over the past four seasons. The hard work on the recruiting trail has paid off, as eight freshmen earned All-Big Ten freshman recognition in 2013, five in 2014 and three in 2015.

• Nine freshmen have garnered All-America honors and 24 have netted freshman All-Big Ten recognition in Wilson's five seasons.

• A five-year program record 111 Hoosiers have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors under Wilson.

• Twelve Hoosiers hail from the Sunshine State: LB **T.J. Simmons** (Lakeland), WR **Ricky Jones** (Sarasota), WR **Nick Westbrook** (Lake Mary), DB **Tony Fields** (Tallahassee), DB **Khalil Bryant** (Jacksonville), LB **Reakwon Jones** (Lynn Haven), RB **Clyde Newton** (Punta Corda), DL **Greg Gooch** (Longwood), OL **Grayson Stover** (Spring Hill), OL **Delroy Baker** (Ocala), WR **Phil Benker** (Jacksonville) and DL **Brandon Wilson** (Winter Garden).

OFFENSE

• IU returns eight starters, 25 letterwinners and 153 career starts on offense. Game one's depth chart features six seniors (6 fifth-year), six juniors, six sophomores and five freshmen (1 true).

• In head coach **Kevin Wilson's** five years, the Hoosiers offense has set 54 school records.

During Wilson's tenure (2011-present), the Indiana offense has:

- Scored 30+ points 29 times
- Scored 35+ points 24 times
- Scored 40+ points 16 times
- Scored 45+ points 11 times
- Scored 50+ points 5 times
- Reached 500+ total yards 19 times
- Reached 550+ total yards 17 times

- Thrown for 350+ yards 13 times
- Thrown for 400+ yards 5 times
- Posted 200+ rushing yards 29 times

• A misconception about the IU offense is that it is only a passing attack. Since Wilson's arrival in Bloomington in 2011, Indiana has rushed for 200 yards 29 times and passed for 300 yards 22 times.

• Since 2012, the Hoosiers are first in the Big Ten in passing yardage (263.9), second in total yardage (465.8), third in scoring (32.8) and fourth in rushing yardage (201.9) per game. Indiana is the only B1G team to rank in the top four in each category.

• During the same span, IU is one of two programs (Georgia Tech) in the country to rank in the top 25 in sacks allowed and rushing yards per carry.

• Indiana has topped the Big Ten in passing offense in 2012, 2013 and 2015. The Hoosiers have ranked second (2015), third and fourth in rushing offense over the last three seasons and first (2015), fifth, second and second in total offense over the last four.

• Since the start of the 2014 campaign, IU has rushed for 200-plus yards 18 times, which shares seventh nationally. Indiana has had at least one 100-yard rusher 22 times over that span.

• Under offensive coordinator **Kevin Johns**, the 2015 Hoosiers became the fourth team in FBS history with a 3,500-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and one 1,000-yard receiver in the same year - 2005 Southern California, 2008 Oklahoma (Wilson was the Sooners offensive coordinator) and 2015 Southern Miss.

• IU also led the Big Ten in total offense, scoring offense and passing offense, the first team since the 1995 Ohio State Buckeyes to do so.

OFFENSE (CONT.)

• Indiana set school marks in total points, total yardage, passing yardage, passing first downs, total first downs and total plays in 2015.

• Jordan Howard (1,213), a first team All-Big Ten honoree, and **Devine Redding** (1,012) each eclipsed 1,000 yards, the first time two runners have done so in the same season in program history.

• The Hoosiers were one of two Power Five programs (Baylor) to accomplish that feat in 2015.

• In 2014, IU sat ninth nationally (3rd in the Big Ten) with 263.6 rushing yards per game and fifth in the league with 405.0 total yards per game.

• Indiana set program records with 508.5 total yards per game, 38.4 points per game, 36 passing touchdowns and 62 total touchdowns in 2013.

• It marked the first time in school history IU averaged over 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.

• The Hoosiers were one of only three teams nationally to average 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.

• Indiana was just one of six teams in the nation to rank in the top 30 in total, passing, scoring and rushing offense.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Assistant head coach **Greg Frey** enters his sixth season guiding the Hoosiers offensive line. A 2015 Broyles Award nominee, Frey has mentored some of the top lines in the country, and this year is no different.

• Right guard **Dan Feeney**, an Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lister for the second straight season, anchors the line. The fifth-year senior is a consensus preseason first team All-American after earning first team honors one season ago.

• During the offseason, Feeney has been recognized as the 37th-best player in country by ESPN, the 10th-best senior by NFL.com and the top guard in the country by Phil Steele, Lindy's, USA Today and 247Sports.

• Feeney has started 37 career games and allowed just one sack (2,719 snaps).

• He did not allow a sack in 475 called pass attempts and finished with a team-best 102 knockdowns in 1,069 snaps one season ago.

• In addition to Feeney and his 37 starts, Indiana returns three additional fifth-year seniors in guard **Jacob Bailey** (12 starts, 19 games), right tackle **Dimitric Camiel** (18 starts, 37 games) and center **Wes Rogers** (4 starts, 16 games).

• Sophomore left tackle **Brandon Knight** (11 games) and redshirt sophomore guard **Wes Martin** (6 starts, 13 games) bring additional experience.

• In 2015, Feeney and left tackle **Jason Spriggs**, the school's first Outland Trophy semifinalist, became the fifth and sixth first team All-American offensive linemen in program history last season.

• The duo became the first offensive line tandem to secure first team honors in the same season in school history and just the sixth pair of teammates to accomplish the feat.

• Spriggs was selected by Green Bay in the second round (48th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft. He became the highest Hoosiers pick since fellow offensive tackle Rodger Saffold (33rd) in 2010.

• Twenty of Frey's charges have reached the NFL, including five from IU - Spriggs, Andrew McDonald (Houston), Collin Rahrig and Jake Reed (Atlanta), and Will Matte (Kansas City).

• Frey has coached 19 all-conference honorees in his career, including Spriggs (2012-15), Feeney (2012, 2014-15), Matte (2012) and Rahrig (2013-14).

• Martin, a 2015 freshman All-American, also received freshman All-Big Ten accolades, joining Bailey (2013), Rogers (2013), Spriggs (2012), Feeney (2012) and Bernard Taylor (2011).

• Over the last four years, Indiana is one of two programs (Georgia Tech) in the country to rank in the top 25 in sacks allowed and rushing yards per carry.

• The line allowed 13 sacks, tied for the seventh-fewest nationally, in 2015.

RUNNING BACKS

- **Devine Redding** became the 17th rusher in Indiana history to reach 1,000 yards with his 1,012 as a sophomore in 2015. He averaged 4.5 yards on 226 carries to go along with nine touchdowns.
- Redding, a 2016 Doak Walker Award Watch List member, ranked third in the Big Ten in attempts, fifth in rushing yards, seventh with 77.8 rushing yards per game, tied for seventh in rushing TDs and tied for ninth in scoring (4.2 points per game).
- He closed out the campaign with three straight 100-yard games, the first of his career. Over the three games, Redding rushed for 517 yards on 81 carries (6.2 average) and averaged 167.0 per game.
- The Youngstown, Ohio, native set an Indiana bowl game mark and the New Era Pinstripe Bowl record with career-highs in yards (227) and attempts (35) in addition to one touchdown vs. Duke.
- In running backs coach **Deland McCullough's** five-plus years, IU has set 19 school rushing records.
- Tevin Coleman (2015) and Jordan Howard (2016) became the first Indiana running backs to be drafted in consecutive years since 1990-92. Coleman was picked in the third round by Atlanta and Howard in the fifth round by Chicago.
- Coleman, Howard and Stephen Houston (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore) each have reached the NFL under McCullough.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Indiana returns 185 receptions, 2,809 yards and 17 touchdowns from seven receivers this season.
- IU was the only Big Ten team in 2015 with three wideouts - fifth-year seniors **Ricky Jones** and **Mitchell Paige**, and junior **Simmie Cobbs, Jr.** - in the top 16 in receptions and yardage.
- Jones and Cobbs each earned a spot on the 2016 Biletnikoff Award Watch List. The Hoosiers are one of only two Big Ten teams (Nebraska) and seven Power Five teams overall with multiple wideouts on the list.
- Cobbs, also a 2016 Maxwell Award Watch Lister made 60 receptions (8th in the Big Ten) for 1,035 yards (3rd) and four touchdowns in 2015. He became the sixth Hoosier with a 1,000-yard season and ranks sixth all-time.
- The Oak Park, Ill., native averaged 79.6 yards (3rd in the Big Ten), 4.6 receptions per game (9th) and 17.2 yards per catch (3rd).
- Cobbs posted four 100-yard games, which shared third in the B1G and fifth on Indiana's all-time list.
- In league games only, he finished first with 18.1 yards per catch, second with 670 yards and 83.8 per game, and tied for ninth with 37 receptions and 4.6 per game.

- Howard (1,213), a 2015 first team All-Big Ten honoree, and Redding each eclipsed 1,000 yards, the first time two runners have done so in the same season in program history.
- Indiana was one of two Power Five programs (Baylor) to accomplish that feat in 2015.
- Coupled with Coleman (2014), it is the third time in school history two different backs have earned first team All-Big Ten honors in back-to-back years: Marv Woodson (1962) and Tom Nowatzke (1963-64); Vern Huffman (1936) and Corby Davis (1937).
- The Hoosiers became the first Big Ten team with different running backs earning first team honors in back-to-back years since Ohio State in 2006 and 2007 (Antonio Pittman and Chris Wells).
- IU set a program single-season record with 3,163 rushing yards and averaged 263.6 rushing yards per game (9th nationally, 3rd in the Big Ten) in 2014.
- Coleman became the 18th player in FBS history to rush for 2,000 yards (2,036 in 2014), which set a school record, is 16th on the FBS all-time list and is sixth in Big Ten history.
- The Tinley Park, Ill., native was Indiana's third unanimous and consensus All-American in 2014, finished seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award.

- Cobbs posted 20 20-yard grabs (2nd in the Big Ten), 11 30-yarders (2nd), four 40-yarders (3rd) and a career-long 55-yarder.
- Jones finished second on the team with 906 yards (6th in the Big Ten) and five touchdowns (T-11th), and was third with 54 receptions (13th) in 2015. The 906 yards rank ninth on IU's single-season list.
- He also was second on the Hoosiers with 16.8 yards per catch (4th in the Big Ten) and 69.7 yards per game, and third with 4.2 receptions per game.
- The Sarasota, Fla., native collected three 100-yard games and reached 80 yards four times.
- Jones snagged 11 20-yard catches and five 30-yarders (38-TD, 50, 57-TD, 69, 71). He shared the B1G lead with two 60-plus yarders and four 50-yarders, shared third in 40-yarders, and tied for sixth in 30-yarders.
- Paige led the team with six touchdowns (T-6th in the Big Ten), finished second with 57 receptions (T-10th) and third with 684 yards (16th).
- He collected 11 20-yard grabs and three 30-yarders (34, 36, 45), and he recorded his first career 100-yard game with 126 yards on eight grabs against Rutgers.

TIGHT ENDS

- **James Patton** is in his fourth season at Indiana and his third overseeing the tight ends.
- He owns 17 years of experience in the Midwest - seven as a player and coach at Miami (Ohio), seven as an assistant at Northwestern and three as an assistant with the Hoosiers. Additionally, he coached the offensive line at Oklahoma from 2006-12.
- Patton has been a part of 11 bowl teams and six conference championship teams.
- Michael Cooper earned 2015 honorable mention All-Big Ten and is currently a member of the Pittsburgh

Steelers after signing a free agent contract with the Washington Redskins.

- Redshirt junior **Danny Friend**, one of the team's 12 leaders in 2016, headlines the returnees.
- Friend provided strong blocking and collected three receptions for 39 yards in four games last year before suffering a season-ending injury.
- Junior **Jordan Fuchs** has caught seven passes for 69 yards and three touchdowns in his two campaigns.

QUARTERBACKS

- One of the most decorated quarterbacks in Indiana history, Nate Sudfeld was drafted in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Washington Redskins.
- Sudfeld closed his career first in passing touchdowns (61), passing yardage (7,879), 350-yard games (6), 300-yard games (11), 250-yard games (13), 200-yard games (19), four-touchdown games (5) and three-touchdown games (10), tied for first in 400-yard games (1), second in completion percentage (60.3) and completions (593), third in total offense (8,011) and fourth in attempts (983) on IU's career lists.
- Redshirt junior **Richard Lagow** enrolled in 2016 spring classes and participated in practice.

- Lagow played two seasons at Cisco (Texas) Community College, where he left as the top-ranked, pocket-passing junior college quarterback by ESPN.
- He threw for 2,285 yards with 21 touchdowns and 10 interceptions in 2015. Lagow completed 66 percent (175-of-265) en route to Southwest Junior College Football Conference honorable mention accolades.
- Junior **Zander Diamont** has passed for 681 yards with one score and rushed for 269 with four TDs in his two seasons in Bloomington.
- Diamont recorded the longest rush ever by an Indiana quarterback, a 79-yard touchdown, in relief against No. 1 Ohio State last year.

DEFENSE

- Indiana returns eight starters, 27 letterwinners and 118 career starts on defense. Game one's depth chart features three seniors (2 fifth-year), nine juniors, nine sophomores and one freshman.
- **Tom Allen**, a New Castle, Ind., native joined IU as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016. Allen, a 24-year coaching veteran, was the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida in 2015.
- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 points per game in league play).
- He served as head coach at Ben Davis (Ind.) High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion (Ind.) High School (1997), and he earned his master's degree at Indiana (2002).
- Over the last 21 years, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 216-62 (.777).
- Allen spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss. He coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.

- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-3 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the AP top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- In 2014, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8) and allowed a national low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5), 12th in turnovers gained (28), 13th in total defense (321.2) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- He worked with defensive coordinator Dave Wommack to help guide a huge improvement in the Rebels defense, which ranked last in the SEC in total defense before their arrival in 2011. Under their stewardship Ole Miss consistently ranked among the top teams in the SEC and nationally in tackles for loss and sacks.
- Nkemdiche earned Freshman All-America honors and second team AP All-SEC after leading the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3) in 2012.

LINEBACKERS

• In 27 career games, redshirt junior **Marcus Oliver** has assisted on 10 takeaways with a team-best seven forced fumbles, fourth all-time in IU history, to go along with two interceptions and one fumble recovery.

• Indiana's 2015 Defensive Teammate of the Year became the first Hoosier since Matt Mayberry in 2009 to record 100 tackles and ranked seventh in the Big Ten with 112 stops and fifth with 65 solos.

• Oliver led the team with four forced fumbles, which ranked fourth in the conference and tied for ninth nationally. He added one sack, 6.5 tackles for loss (4th on the team), one fumble recovery (T-1st), two interceptions (46 yards, T-2nd) and four pass breakups (T-4th) en route to honorable mention All-Big Ten.

• The Hamilton, Ohio, native started all 13 games at weak-side linebacker and led the Hoosiers in tackles six times, including twice with game-high honors, and posted six double-digit tackle games (and his career).

• Oliver displayed a knack for finding the ball before his arrival in Bloomington. At Hamilton High School, the two-time first team all-conference selection forced seven fumbles, recovered five and picked off a pass for 13 takeaways.

• Junior **Tegray Scales** recorded 64 tackles, 40 solo, three sacks (13 yards), 5.5 tackles for loss (21 yards), two interceptions (37 yards) and four pass breakups in 11 games one season ago.

• Scales tied for second on the team in INTs and fourth in tackles, sacks (tied) and PBUs (tied). He paced IU in stops three times and recorded at least seven tackles six times, including each of the final four games.

• The Cincinnati native shared the top spot (T-9th overall) among Big Ten freshmen and tied for the team lead with three picks en route to freshman All-America honors in 2014.

• **T.J. Simmons** is Indiana's active career leader with 213 tackles and 122 solo stops. He has appeared in all 37 games in his career with 35 starts.

• The senior closed out 2015 third on the team with 73 tackles, 34 solo, tied for fourth with three sacks (20 yards) and fifth with six tackles for loss (26 yards).

DEFENSIVE LINE

• Assistant defensive coordinator/defensive line coach **Mark Hagen** returns to Bloomington for his second stint under head coach Kevin Wilson.

• Hagen worked on the Hoosiers staff in 2011 and 2012 before he moved on to Texas A&M (2013-15).

• A Carmel, Ind., native, Hagen was a four-year letterwinner (1987, 89-91), two-time second team All-Big Ten selection, three-time Academic All-Big Ten winner and a captain at linebacker for the Hoosiers.

• He owns 20 years of coaching experience, including 16 in the Big Ten and the SEC, and he has coached in 10 bowl games.

• A honorable mention freshman All-American in 2013, fifth-year senior **Ralph Green III** has collected 61 tackles, three sacks and 12.5 TFLs in 35 career games (12 starts).

• Redshirt junior **Nate Hoff** appeared in all 13 games last season and owns 33 stops, 3.5 sacks and 8.5 TFLs in 25 career games (9 starts).

• Hoff also was a honorable mention freshman All-American, in 2014, and finished second on the team with 3.5 sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss.

• He made 29 tackles, which ranked second among IU defensive linemen, and he ranked third in sacks and shared third in TFLs among Big Ten freshmen.

• Along with Hoff, sophomore **Jacob Robinson** is one of the Hoosiers' 12 2016 team leaders. He appeared in all 13 games at defensive end as a true freshman last year.

• Indiana returns 153 career starts from 13 players on offense and 118 career starts from 14 players on defense for a total of 271 career starts from 27 different players.

• The offensive line is the team's most experienced unit with 77 career starts among five different players.

SECONDARY

- The Hoosiers started 11 different players in the secondary one season ago - all underclassmen - four sophomores, one redshirt freshman and six true freshmen.
- Ten of the 11 started their first game and the 11th entered 2015 with just one start.
- Nine of the 11 bring 114 games of playing experience and 48 starts with them into the 2016 campaign.
- Redshirt juinoir cornerback **Rashard Fant** led the Big Ten and finished second nationally with 22 pass breakups in 2015.
- Fant made 52 tackles, 48 solo (T-2nd on the team), with 1.5 tackles for loss, one interception and one fumble recovery.
- He collected his first career INT in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl vs. Duke.
- Safety **Chase Dutra** finished fifth on the team with 61 tackles and 38 solos despite missing five games due to injury one year ago.
- Dutra was second on the team and 19th in the Big Ten in league play only with 7.4 tackles per outing.

- The redshirt junior recorded three double-digit tackle games, the first of his career, and he collected a career-high 13 stops at No. 7 Michigan State
- In 2014, he shared the team lead with three interceptions to go along with five pass breakups (T-3rd on the team) en route to honorable mention freshman All-Big Ten honors.
- Dutra shared the top spot (9th overall) in INTs and second in PBUs among Big Ten freshmen.
- As a true freshman last season, safety **Jonathan Crawford** was a honorable mention on the Campus Insiders Freshman All-America team as well as an ESPN.com and BTN.com All-Freshman team selection.
- Crawford led IU with four interceptions, the third-most for a true freshman in program history, and he finished second with 76 tackles and 48 solos (tied).
- The Largo, Fla., native shared third in the Big Ten and 35th nationally in INTs. His four picks ranked first among all conference freshmen and tied for fourth among all freshmen nationally.
- Crawford topped B1G true freshmen in overall (2nd among all freshmen) and solo stops (1st among all freshmen).

SPECIALISTS

- Last season's Big Ten Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year **Griffin Oakes** enters 2016 seventh with 37 field goals and 76 extra points on IU's career lists.
- The redshirt junior and member of the 2016 Lou Groza Award Watch List is 37-of-47 on field goals (78.7 percent) and 76-of-80 on extra points.
- Oakes became the first Indiana kicker to collect the Big Ten's Kicker of the Year honor and the first Hoosiers kicker to earn first team All-Big Ten honors since Austin Starr in 2007.
- Lindy's sixth-rated kicker nationally hit 24-of-29 field goals (82.8 percent) and 53-of-57 extra points. He averaged 62.9 yards on 91 kickoffs with 52 touchbacks.
- Oakes set a single-season IU record in field goals and total points for a kicker (3rd overall with 125) and was second in PATs. He sits second in B1G single-season history in total points for a kicker and is tied for fifth in field goals.
- The Greenwood, Ind., native finished first in the league in field goals (6th nationally). Oakes was first

- among kickers (T-6th) and second among all players (T-15th) with 9.6 points per game, and second in field goal percentage (27th).
- He led the conference in touchbacks (T-10th nationally), and ended second in touchback percentage (57.1, 21st) and kickoff average (62.9, 27th).
- **Mitchell Paige** was one of the most dynamic punt returners in college football last year.
- Paige returned 18 punts for 199 yards (5th in the Big Ten, 30th nationally), good for an 11.1 average (5th, 22nd), with two touchdowns (T-1st, T-2nd).
- The fifth-year senior's two punt return scores share a program record and fifth in Big Ten history for a single season, and are tied for the second-most in school history overall.
- **Dan Godsil** served as the team's long snapper as a true freshman in 2015 and made seven tackles, five solo, in 13 games.
- Godsil is a Phil Steele preseason second team All-Big Ten selection this year.

NEWS & NOTES

NFL BOUND

- In head coach Kevin Wilson's tenure, 23 Hoosiers have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, including seven in 2016.
- Currently, 14 former Hoosiers appear on NFL rosters. RB Tevin Coleman (Atlanta), TE Michael Cooper (Pittsburgh), RB Stephen Houston (Baltimore), RB Jordan Howard (Chicago), DT Darius Latham (Oakland), WR Cody Latimer (Denver), OL Andrew McDonald (Houston), CB Tracy Porter (Bears), OL Collin Rahrig (Atlanta), DE Bobby Richardson (New Orleans), OL Rodger Saffold (Los Angeles), OL Jason Spriggs (Green Bay), QB Nate Sudfeld (Washington) and WR Shane Wynn (Jacksonville).

OPENING ACT

- Indiana has fielded 60 true freshmen in head coach **Kevin Wilson's** tenure. Sixteen true freshmen played in 2015, 13 in 2014, eight in 2013, 11 in 2012 and 16 in 2011.

ALL-AMERICA HOOSIERS

- For the first time ever, a pair of Indiana offensive linemen earned first team All-America status in the same season. Left tackle Jason Spriggs collected recognition from the Football Writers Association and junior right guard **Dan Feeney** received accolades from ESPN.com in 2015.
- They are the first IU o-linemen to garner first team honors since Gary Cassells in 1967.
- Spriggs was also honored by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Sporting News, Associated Press and SI.com, while Feeney secured additional honors from CBS Sports, Associated Press and SI.com.
- The duo gave the Hoosiers three All-Americans over the past two seasons, joining 2014 unanimous and consensus selection and current Atlanta Falcons running back Tevin Coleman.

- IU's 12 honorees were a school record.
- Coupled with Tevin Coleman (2014), it is the third time in school history two different IU running backs have earned first team honors in back-to-back years: Marv Woodson (1962) and Tom Nowatzke (1963-64); Vern Huffman (1936) and Corby Davis (1937).
- IU became the first Big Ten team with different running backs earning first team honors in back-to-back years since Ohio State in 2006 and 2007 (Antonio Pittman and Chris Wells).
- **Dan Feeney** was the first IU first team offensive lineman since 1989 (Ian Beckles and Ron Vargo).
- It was the first time two IU offensive linemen have made one of the teams since 1989.
- It was the first time IU has had four offensive players make one of the teams since 1989 (Beckles, Todd Oberdorf, Anthony Thompson and Vargo).

- **Griffin Oakes** was the first IU first team kicker since 2007 (Starr).
- Oakes was the first IU kicker to ever win the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- Nate Sudfeld was the first quarterback to make one of the teams since 2007 (Kellen Lewis, 2nd team).

- Three Indiana freshmen were recognized on the BTN.com All-Big Ten Freshman team. Safety **Jonathan Crawford** and offensive guard **Wes Martin** earned a spot on the team, while tight end **Brandon Knight** collected honorable mention honors. Twenty-four freshmen have been recognized under **Kevin Wilson**.
- Crawford and Martin received honorable mention All-America honors from Campus Insiders, giving Wilson nine Freshman All-Americans since 2011.

• One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.

• Led the Hoosiers to the 2015 New Era Pinstripe Bowl, the program's first postseason appearance since 2007.

• Wilson has mentored three first team All-Americans - offensive linemen Dan Feeney and Jason Spriggs in 2015, and Tevin Coleman in 2014. The three All-Americans are the most for Indiana over a two-year period since 1968-69 (3).

• Twenty-three IU standouts have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, including three draft picks - offensive tackle Jason Spriggs (Green Bay, 48th overall), running back Jordan Howard (Chicago, 5th round) and quarterback Nate Sudfeld (Washington, 6th round), and seven overall in 2016.

• Wide receiver Cody Latimer was selected 56th overall by Denver in 2014 and running back Tevin Coleman was selected 73rd overall by Atlanta in 2015.

• Indiana has had at least one pick in the first three rounds three straight years for the first time since 1993-95, and six selections overall, the program's most since 1991-93.

• Thirty-eight Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors, highlighted by a school record 12 last season. Griffin Oakes was named the 2015 Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year and first team All-Big Ten.

• Wilson's offenses have set 54 school records, including single-season points, total yardage, passing yardage and rushing yardage.

• The 2015 Hoosiers became the fourth team in FBS history with a 3,500-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and one 1,000-yard receiver in the same year, joining 2005 Southern California, 2008 Oklahoma (Wilson was the Sooners offensive coordinator) and 2015 Southern Miss.

• Indiana also led the Big Ten in total offense, scoring offense and passing offense, the first team since Ohio State in 1995 to do so.

• Howard (1,213) and Devine Redding (1,012) each eclipsed 1,000 yards, the first time two runners have done so in program history. IU was one of two Power Five programs (Baylor) to accomplish that in 2015.

• In 2014, Coleman became the 18th player in FBS history to rush for 2,000 yards (2,036), which set a school record, is 16th on the FBS all-time list and sixth in Big Ten history. He was Indiana's third unanimous and consensus All-American, finished seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award.

• With its 31-27 win at No. 18 Missouri in 2014, IU earned its first win over a top 20 team since 2006 and its first on the road since 1987. It marked the first time a Big Ten team defeated a ranked SEC team on the road.

• Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach (2002-05) and offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach (2006-10).

• Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).

• OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

• Over Wilson's time at Oklahoma, 26 offensive players were drafted in to the NFL, including seven first-rounders, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.

• Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).

• As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE - 2010), two sixth-round picks (James Hanna, TE - 2012; Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.

• Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award - awarded to the nation's top assistant coach, Wilson won the award in 2008. His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60-or-more points in five straight games and 716 total points, to average more than 51 points per contest.

• The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford. Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed for over 1,000 yards, Juahin Iglesias caught 74 balls for 1,150 yards and Jermaine Gresham added 66 catches for 950 yards.

• Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman in 2007 and again in 2008, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.

• In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.

• Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.

• Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, which at the time was the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year. 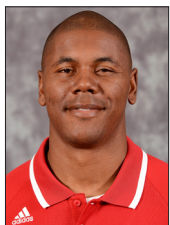

Headquartered in Jefferson City, Mo., Learfield Communications owns the multimedia rights to nearly 100 collegiate properties throughout the country in addition to the Big Ten Conference.

For 44 years, Learfield has excelled in administering the multimedia rights for a host of reputable colleges and universities. It provides exclusive sports programming to close to 1,200 radio stations throughout the country. Learfield's strategic affiliation with Team Services, LLC, also affords its partners a distinct advantage in the areas of venue consulting, naming rights and market research.



DON FISCHER

This marks the 44th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 29 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the Indiana University Radio

Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the academic year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 22 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 43 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 28 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 24 times, including the last five seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,800 Indiana University games - a total that includes eight bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 49 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 10 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson

and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year. Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have three grandchildren, Addy (6), Hayden (4) and Taylor (1).



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 34th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

48th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

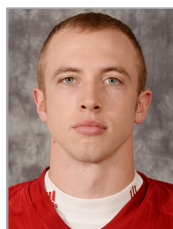
