## QUICK HITS

- The Texans continue on the road with a Thursday night contest against the FIU Panthers.
- Gillispie welcomes back five Texans from its 2022-23 roster and has added 16 newcomers, the most among all men's D1 Institutions. The 21-man roster is the largest D-1 roster in the nation.
- The Texans dropped their season opener to Virginia, 80-50. Devon Barnes and Izzy Miles led the team in scoring off the bench.
- Last season, Tarleton State earned its first WAC Tournament win in its first season eligible knocking off seventh-seeded UTRGV.
- Tarleton also earned its first national postseason berth earning a bid to the 16-team CBI in Daytona Beach, Florida as a seven seed.
- Shakur Daniel became the second Texan from its D1 era to sign a professional contract.
- Gillispie added three assistant coaches to his staff including former player Luke Adams, father of two former players, Damon Archibald and Randy Pulley.
- Tarleton State will be road warriors to begin the season with six of its first seven regular season contests away from home and all outside of Texas.
- The Texans will return home to Stephenville on Saturday for its only home game of November against NAIA UNT Dallas at 7 p.m.

## ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- The Texans return to the state of Florida for just the third time in the Division I era.
- Thursday will be the first matchup against the Panthers.
- Head coach Jeremy Ballard is in his sixth year as a D1 head coach, all at the helm of the Panthers program. He is one of 56 active D1 head coaches to have only coached at a single D1 program for at least six seasons.

## LOOK WHO'S HOT



### 13 DEVON BARNES

Barnes was one of a few bright spots in the Texans first game of the season, His 11-point effort off the bench led the team while he played just 15 minutes. He's the third Texan in their last six games dating back to last season to lead the team in scoring off the bench.



### 11 BUBU BENJAMIN

Benjamin co-led the Texans in rebounds (five) and led the squad with three assists and two blocks in his collegiate debut. He was the only freshman to start the season opener and led all players with 37:36 total minutes played.



### 0 IZZY MILES

Miles was the only other Texan to record a double-digit scoring total. The freshman was the first man off the bench for coach Gillispie. His 28 minutes was the most of any bench player and more than two starters. He also fouled out in his first collegiate contest.

## 2023 NCAA TOURNAMENT OPPONENTS



### TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS (def. by FAU in Sweet 16)

Tennessee earned the fifth seed in the East Region. The Vols dropped to eventual National Runner-Up, Florida Atlantic, 62-55. This season, the Vols are ranked ninth in the AP Top 25. Rick Barnes is in his ninth season at the helm of the program. He returns a pair of starters from last year's team, Santiago Vescovi and Zakai Zeigler.



### VIRGINIA CAVALIERS (def. by Furman in Round of 64)

Tennessee earned the fourth seed in the South Region. The Cavs fell victim to Cinderella Furman in the Round of 64, 68-67. Tony Bennett will look to repeat the past as UVA was the National Champions the year after their last Round of 64 loss. Bennett returns one starter from a season ago and his squad received votes in the first AP Top 25.



### GRAND CANYON LOPES (def. by Gonzaga in Round of 64)

The 2023 WAC Tournament Champions fell to the Bulldogs, 82-70. The Lopes led by as many as seven in the first half, but were unable to upset the third-seeded Zags. Bryce Drew returns the 2023 WAC Preseason Player of the Year, Ray Harrison headlining the squad picked as WAC Champs. The Texans will take on the Lopes in a home-and-home.

### C-USA X WAC BATTLE

- Tarleton State at Florida International will be the first tip off of the C-USA x WAC battle this season.
- Utah Valley will take on former WAC member, Sam Houston at 6:30 central time.
- Abilene Christian will tip off against Middle Tennessee an hour after the Texans.
- The Texans will play its second and final game of the battle against Jacksonville State in Stephenville on Dec. 18.
- The battle will consist of 18 total men's games with all nine CUSA schools and nine of the 11 WAC members. UTRGV and UT Arlington will not be participating in the battle this season from the WAC.

### HARD DEFEAT IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

- Last season, the Texans earned the seventh seed in the WAC Postseason Tournament in their first season eligible to appear.
- The Texans drew 10-seeded UTRGV and knocked them off for the first time of the season in the third meeting, 74-70.

### BENCH PLAY FACTOR

- For the sixth straight game dating back to last season, the Texans had at least one player post double digits off the bench.
- Barnes became the third of the stretch to lead the Texans in scoring playing off the bench.
- Barnes is the second straight junior college transfer to lead the team in scoring on opening night in his first game as a Texan.

### MOST NEWCOMERS IN THE NATION

- The Texans welcome 16 new faces to their roster, the most among any Division I program in the nation.
- Last year, seven were playing in high school, six at a junior college, one at a different WAC school, one at a Division II and one at a Division II school.
- New Mexico State is second with 15 and Northwestern State brought in 14.

### NEW HOME FOR TEXAN BASKETBALL

- Earlier this year, Tarleton State and the Texas A&M system announced plans for a 110 million, 148,000 sq-foot facility.
- The new events center is expected to hold at least 8,000 basketball fans.
- Tarleton broke ground on the building in August and its anticipated completion date of fall of 2023.
- The multi-use center is expected to hold future commencements, concerts and conventions.

### 2ND TEXAN TO SIGN PRO CONTRACT

- Shakur Daniel became the second Texan from the Division I era to sign a professional contract.
- Daniel signed with AD FENIKS 2010 of the Macedonian Superleague.
- Posted his first professional double-double with 10 points and 10 boards on Oct. 9 against Vardar.
- Daniel has played in six games averaging 8.2 points, 6.7 rebounds and 3.2 assists while playing 34.5 minutes per game.

### AMONG THE YOUNGEST IN THE GAME

- Freshman Kaya Mutambirwa is the 15th youngest NCAA Division I player this season.
- The Geneva, Switzerland, native, was born on June 20, 2005 and will be 18 years, four months and 17 days young to begin the season.
- The Swiss school system typically lasts 11 years, making him a whole year younger than most US high school graduates.

### NEW NUMBERS RULE

- The NCAA announced that any numbers from 0-99 are now all legal.
- Previously, only number 0-5, 10-15, 20-25, 30-35, 40-45, and 50-55 were allowed.
- Seven of the Texans 21 players are currently wearing previously illegal numbers for the first time in program history.
- Four of the five returners elected to change their numbers after last season, with Jakorie Smith choosing number 6.

### FIRST WAC TOURNAMENT WIN

- Last season, the Texans earned the seventh seed in the WAC Postseason Tournament in their first season eligible to appear.
- The Texans drew 10-seeded UTRGV and knocked them off for the first time of the season in the third meeting, 74-70.
- Jakorie Smith posted a season-high 26 points dominating the Vaquero defense.

### FIRST POSTSEASON TOURNAMENT APP.

- After a first round win at the WAC Tournament, the Texans earned their first invite to a national postseason tournament.
- Tarleton State accepted its bid to the CBI and received a seven seed.
- The Texans faced 10-seeded Radford. The Highlanders got the best of the Texans in OT, 72-70. Radford reached the final four of the 16-team tournament before falling to the eventual champion, Charlotte.
- The Texans were one of two WAC schools to accept the invite with the other being Southern Utah, earning the number four seed.

### MEET THE ASSISTANTS

- Gillispie added three new faces to his staff over the summer: Damon Archibald, Luke Adams and Randy Pulley.
- Damon Archibald is familiar with Gillispie as two of his sons played for Gillispie in the past few years. Tydan played at Tarleton last season.
- Luke Adams enters the staff after playing for Gillispie at Texas Tech.
- Randy Pulley is the most recent hire coming to the Texans after two seasons at Virginia State University. He played a season at each Saint Louis and Missouri in the early 2000s before entering the coaching ranks.

### POWER FIVE HISTORY

- Since its inception to the D1 era, the Texans have never trailed by more than nine at the half against a power five opponent, until Monday at Virginia.
- This list includes, #3 Kansas, #20 Michigan, #3 Gonzaga, and #12 Baylor all on the road.
- The Texans have been up at the half against Texas A&M, Stanford, and Boston College.
- In the past two season openers the Texans led Stanford by two at the half and trailed Arizona State by three.

### ROAD WARRIORS

- Six of the Texans first seven regular season games will be on the road.
- Tarleton will open on the road for the third straight year, but the first in the Eastern United States.
- TSU will compete in the SoCal Challenge during Thanksgiving Week
- The Texans will host UNT Dallas on Nov. 11 as the first home game of the season and the only home game during the month of November.

### LEGENDARY REISMAN SET TO RETIRE

- Tarleton State Athletic Director, Lonn Reisman announced that he will be retiring in the spring of 2024.
- Lonn Reisman is Tarleton's all-time wins leader with 654 victories after 30 years as the head men's basketball coach.
- Reisman will conclude his 31-year tenure as AD as Tarleton finishes its reclassification process in July.

### 2023-24 SEASON OUTLOOK

- For the fourth straight season, the Texans are set to face a tough non-conference schedule featuring a pair of national powers.
- 2018 National Champion, Virginia Cavaliers and Rick Barnes' Tennessee Volunteers, headline the Texans' schedule.
- Tarleton will host UNT Dallas on Nov. 11 to open its regular season home slate.
- The Texans will host Jacksonville State on Dec. 18 in their only Division I non-conference home game.
- The Texans will open the conference season, the earliest in program history, on Nov. 29 at SFA.

### 2022-23 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Last season, highlighted by the squad's first CBI appearance and WAC appearance and win, the Texans were 17-17 overall and 9-9 in conference play.
- Freddy Hicks earned second team All-WAC and defensive standout Shamir Bagues earned his second consecutive selection to the All-WAC defensive team.
- The Texans big home win was against Grand Canyon 82-61, giving the Lopes trouble inside Wisdom Gym.
- Coach Gillispie finished his 11th season as an NCAA head coach totaling 189 wins.

### TEXANS FORCING TURNOVERS

- The Texans have developed a reputation for having tight defense.
- In 73 of the 86 Division I games in program history, Tarleton has forced the same or more turnovers than its opponents.
- The Texans have won 38 of those games.

### PRESEASON NUMBER SIX

- The Texans were ranked sixth in the WAC in the preseason coaches poll.
- With the WAC Tournament only taking the top eight teams this season, the Texans will need to avoid the bottom three as projected in order to earn a bid to the mid-March Tournament in Las Vegas.
- The preseason ranking is better than the previous two seasons, but is tied for the highest with its Division I debut season in 2020-21.

### WIDE DYNAMIC

- The Texans come from all across the country and the world, representing five countries and nine states.
- Freshman Traivar Jackson became the first Alaskan to attend Tarleton State, making the University have at least one student from 49 of the 50 states.
- The four countries represented outside of the US are Switzerland, Italy, Egypt and Canada.
- Tarleton has eight Texan natives on its roster, followed by two Alabama natives as the second most popular pipeline.

### FAMILIAR BACKGROUNDS

- Coach Gillispie and coach Ballard have never shared the floor in a coaching battle.
- However, both spent seasons at Tulsa, Gillispie from 1997-2000 and Ballard from 2007-12.
- No Golden Hurricanes shared the sideline with both of them.

### TEAM EGYPT FIBA WORLD CUP

- Adam Moussa was selected to play for Team Egypt in the 2023 FIBA World Cup.
- Moussa averaged 2.0 points in 11.8 minutes while playing in five games.
- Moussa shared the court with current NBA player, Patrick Gardner.

### 20-GAME CONFERENCE SEASON

- Last season with 13 WAC teams, each program played six teams twice and six teams once.
- With the departure of Sam Houston and New Mexico State, the WAC has shrunk to 11 teams.
- As a result, the WAC elected to play a double-round robin in conference play totaling 20 games, the most in the history of the WAC.
- The Texans will play each team in a home-and-home for the first time as a member of the WAC.

### MIDNIGHT MADNESS

- Tarleton State hosted its annual Midnight Madness, a tradition since 1994.
- Fans packed Wisdom Gym on the first day of Homecoming to support both the men's and women's teams in their season opening celebration.
- Jakorie Smith and Devon Barnes reached the finals of the hot shot competition. Devon Barnes took the victory 42-39 knocking down 14 three-pointers in 30 seconds.
- In an abbreviated dunk contest, Izzy Miles landed three perfect 10s in his first dunk to take the championship over newcomer Zaakir Sawyer.
- The men's team ended the night with a five on five scrimmage to close the night just before 1 am.

### AMONG THE BEST IN TEXAS AT HOME

- In 2023, the Texans two home losses were the fourth lowest among D1 Texas school. The two were fewer than Baylor, TCU and Texas Tech
- Last season, the Texans were seventh among Texas D1 schools in home win percentages (.857), ahead of Baylor, TCU and Texas Tech.
- The Texans 12 home wins were eighth among D1s in Texas just more than Texas Tech.
- In the past two seasons the combined winning percentage (.759) ranks tenth, ahead of TCU.

### HEY I REMEMBER YOU

- Adam Moussa played against FIU's Petar Krivokapic.
- The two played together and against one another until they were 15.
- With two in foreign backgrounds, they played together in the US.

### EXHIBITION BEGINNING

- Tarleton knocked off Division III Howard Payne, 105-42 in the first contest of the season on Oct. 30
- Returners Jakorie Smith and KiAndre Gaddy each scored 27+ for the first duo in program history. The duo's 57 points was the most by a pair since 2017.
- Gaddy grabbed 15 rebounds to earn himself a double-double.

# BILLY GILLISPIE

## HEAD COACH • FOURTH SEASON

Four-time NCAA Tournament and 12-time Coach of the Year head coach Billy Gillispie will begin his fourth year as the head coach of the Tarleton Men's Basketball program in 2023-24.

In Gillispie's third campaign with the Texans, he guided the squad to their first postseason as a member of NCAA Division I and its first WAC Tournament. Tarleton earned a bid to the College Basketball Invitational as a seventh seed for the first time in program history. In their first WAC Tournament game, the Texans took down tenth-seeded UTRGV, 74-70. Tarleton dropped the following day to second-seeded Utah Valley at the New Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. He touted a 12-2 home record, Tarleton's best winning percentage since 2016-17 and the most wins since 2017-18. The Texans knocked off eventual NCAA Tournament team, Grand Canyon, 81-62 as part of its four games against eventual 2023 NCAA Tournament teams. In the preseason, the team traveled for its first games outside of the continental United States at St. Thomas of the U.S. Virgin Islands.

At the 2022 Paradise Jam, Gillispie's team reached the finals after a pair of victories over Belmont and Boston College. The Texans fell by seven to Drake to finish as runner-ups in their first appearance in the invitational. Tarleton's top opponent of the season came in December when the Texans traveled to Waco for a matchup with the 12th ranked team in the country, Baylor. Tarleton finished its non-conference slate, 8-8 while touting a 4-0 record at Wisdom Gym. The Texans won their first five conference home games to be one of the last two teams in the WAC to be undefeated at home. Tarleton finished its conference campaign, 9-9 in part of a 17-17 overall season record. In conference play the Texans swept the home-and-home matchups with UT-Arlington and Southern Utah.

At the season's end two of Gillispie's players were honored by the WAC, both of which were sophomores. Freddy Hicks was named second team All-WAC and Shamir Bogues earned a selection to the WAC All-Defensive team. Bogues earned the honor in each of his first two seasons with the Texans. Additionally, Hicks was the only Texan to receive a weekly honor from the conference. Following averaging 23.5 points per game in the first two games of the Paradise Jam, he was named the WAC Player of the Week on November 21.

Once again, Gillispie's defensive team prevailed as one of the best in the league. Tarleton led the WAC in steals (9.71) and largest positive turnover margin (+5.68), allowed the third fewest rebounds per game (33.29) and allowed the fourth fewest points per game (67.88).

Gillispie started his second season by emitting Tarleton in full across the national radar. The Texans began the 2021-22 campaign by playing six of their first seven games away from home in a series of high-profile matchups. Tarleton's November slate included a trip to Allen Fieldhouse to face eventual National Champion Kansas, a showdown in Spokane with No. 1 overall seed Gonzaga and visits to Sweet 16 participant Michigan, Stanford and Wichita State. The Texans firmly held serve in each matchup and captured the imaginations of the college basketball world with near-upsets of the Wolverines and Bulldogs.

Tarleton built one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country in 2021-22. The Texans were one of only four teams to face two No. 1 seeds in the NCAA Tournament (Kansas, Gonzaga). Following the Texans' game at Gonzaga on Nov. 29, the program ranked No. 1 in strength of schedule according to the Pomeroy College Basketball Ratings. The Texans finished the season ranked 15th nationally and tops among all mid-major programs in the category. Additionally, Tarleton's 2021-22 opponents combined for 11 combined NCAA Tournament victories, by far the most in the WAC.

The robust start to non-conference play carried over into December and the start of WAC play. Tarleton won seven of its next nine games following its trip to Spokane. The Texans went on to finish .500 in conference play at 9-9. The team's conference victories came via a memorable home sweep of east Texas rivals Sam Houston and Stephen F. Austin, season sweeps of Chicago State, Lamar and UTRGV and a road win at Dixie State.

Individually, Gillispie coached Shamir Bogues to the All-WAC Defensive Team and mentored Montre Gipson to All-WAC second team recognition. Bogues became the first player in Tarleton basketball history to be selected to the All-Defensive Team and was one of five players to receive the honor. Gipson's accolade signified the third postseason All-WAC honor of his two-year Texan career. Tarleton also cleaned up a trio of weekly WAC accolades under Gillispie's leadership. He coached Noah McDavid to two sets of WAC Freshman of the Week credentials (Jan. 10, Jan. 29) and saw Tahj Small receive WAC Player of the Week recognition on Jan. 10 following the Texans' home sweep of SHSU and SFA.

Gillispie's defensive mettle was on full display once again. The Texans finished the season fifth among all D1 programs in turnover percent differential (+6.4), ninth in turnover margin (+4.1), 11th in turnovers forced (505) and 14th in turnovers forced per game (16.3). Tarleton ranked second in the WAC in all four categories.

In Gillispie's first season with the Texans to a .500 record (10-10) in the inaugural Division I season while going 5-7 in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The five conference wins ranked fifth in the WAC.

In an unprecedented season trying to navigate coaching during COVID-19, Gillispie and the Texans won seven of their last nine games, including three straight conference wins to end the season. Tarleton had nine games canceled due to COVID-19 on the season, including games against eventual national champion Baylor and road games at then-No. 1 Gonzaga and then-No. 1 Kansas. The nine cancellations were top 10 in the country for a program.

Tarleton's first Division I victory came on Nov. 25 with a 103-48 victory over Dallas Christian. The first Division I and WAC victory came on Jan. 29 in a 70-62 road win at Utah Valley. Tarleton also dunned three-time defending WAC champion New Mexico State, 64-55, on Feb. 27 inside Wisdom Gym and followed the victory up with a road sweep at UTRGV to close out the regular season.

Due to NCAA Division I transition rules, Tarleton does not qualify for NCAA statistical rankings. Had they been eligible,

the Texans would have ranked first in the nation in steals per game (10.5), second in the nation in turnovers forced per game (19.5), and 15th in the nation in points allowed (62.3).

Individually, Gillispie recruited and coached four All-WAC selections, including the Freshman of the Year in Freddy Hicks. Montre' Gipson was selected to the All-WAC Newcomer Team while Gipson, Shakur Daniel and Tahj Small were named Honorable Mention All-WAC.

Gillispie became Tarleton's 15th head coach on March 30, 2020 as the Texans began their transition to NCAA Division I and joined the WAC. Gillispie has served in the same capacity at Kentucky, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and Texas-El Paso (UTEP). The veteran head coach has 13 years of experience as a collegiate head coach with eight of the years coming at the NCAA Division I level. Gillispie has a career Division I record of 148-108 while taking three different teams to the NCAA Tournament (Kentucky, Texas A&M, UTEP). Gillispie is a two-time Big 12 Coach of the Year (2005, 2007), co-SEC Coach of the Year (2008), WAC Coach of the Year (2004), a finalist for the NABC National Coach of the Year (2004), and the National JUCO Coach of the Year (2019). He's also a three-time NIT/CAC and five-time TABC Coach of the Year.

"Coach Gillispie has shown to truly be genuine in the way he cares about helping student-athletes achieve great success both on and off the court," said Dr. Hurler. "After a national search and an extensive interview process, we are confident that Coach Gillispie's experience and commitment to Tarleton and our community make him the right person to build on the storied success of Texan basketball."

"I would like to welcome Billy Gillispie to Tarleton and back to The Texas A&M System family," said Chancellor Sharp. "Coach Gillispie had tremendous success at Texas A&M and I am confident we will see that same level of success at Tarleton."

Known as an elite recruiter, Gillispie once managed to put together four straight national top-25 recruiting classes from 2005-09. He also had the sixth-ranked recruiting class at Baylor as an assistant in 1996. In Gillispie's career, he has helped recruit over 30 players that advanced to the NBA and NFL and 102 players that played professionally.

With 20 years of experience as a high school head coach in Texas and a Division I assistant, including under legendary head coach Bill Self at Tulsa and Illinois, Gillispie got his first collegiate head coaching job at UTEP from 2002-04. In just his second year leading the Miners, Gillispie lifted the team to an 18-win improvement – the best in the NCAA – and claimed the WAC regular season title, the WAC Coach of the Year award, and advanced to his first NCAA Tournament. It was UTEP's first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1992.

After two seasons at UTEP, Gillispie was hired by Texas A&M where he once again had one of the biggest turnarounds in the country. In his first season with the Aggies, Gillispie led his new team to a 21-10 record – a 14-win increase from the season before – and advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals. The turnaround garnered his first career Big 12 Coach of the Year award. In year two (2005-06), Texas A&M finished 22-9 and fourth in the Big 12 while claiming a No. 12 seed in the first NCAA Tournament appearance for the Aggies since 1987. Gillispie picked up his first tournament win in an opening-round upset over Jim Boeheim's No. 5-seed Syracuse Orangemen.

Gillispie's best season came in 2006-07 when he won a career-high 27 games with the Aggies, finished second in the Big 12, and won his second Big 12 Coach of the Year award in three seasons. Gillispie led the Aggies into storied Allen Fieldhouse to take on the defending Big 12 Champion No. 6 Kansas Jayhawks and became the first visiting team from the Big 12 South Division to leave with a victory. Less than 48 hours later, Gillispie topped the Kevin Durant-led No. 25 Texas Longhorns for his second straight ranked victory. The Aggies finished the season ranked No. 6 by ESPN/USA Today, which was a then-Texas A&M record.

Texas A&M advanced to its second straight NCAA Tournament, this time as a No. 3 seed. The Aggies topped Penn in the opening round and followed with a second-round win over Rick Pitino's No. 6-seed Louisville Cardinals to advance to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 1980.

In his three seasons at Texas A&M, Gillispie coached three future NBA players, including a pair of first-round picks in Acie Law IV (11th pick) and Antoine Wright (15th pick). He also coached a future NFL second-round draft pick in dual-sport athlete Martellus Bennett.

After three seasons at Texas A&M, Gillispie was hired to lead the Kentucky Wildcats where he racked up a 40-27 record over two seasons and reached his fourth NCAA Tournament, including his third straight appearance. In his first season, Gillispie led the Wildcats to a 12-4 mark in the SEC and was named the Co-SEC Coach of the Year. Gillispie coached six future NBA draft picks, including first-round selection and current Los Angeles Clipper Patrick Patterson (14th pick).

After Kentucky, Gillispie signed on at Texas Tech but resigned after one season due to health reasons. In 2018, Gillispie underwent a successful kidney transplant.

A rejuvenated Gillispie made a triumphant return to the sidelines at his alma mater Ranger Junior College. Over the last four seasons at Ranger College, Gillispie went 103-24 and took the Rangers to the NJCAA national title game in 2019, where he was named the JUCO National Coach of the Year.

"I cannot wait to get started," Gillispie said. "At Tarleton, we will be inheriting an ultra-successful program that Lonn and Chris Reisman established as well as countless others that have poured their hearts and souls into Texan Basketball for more than 30 years. No program has been more successful during that time. We will try our hardest every day to honor the efforts that have been made as we move into a new era of Division I basketball and make every one of the Tarleton faithful proud."

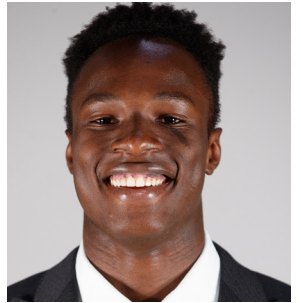

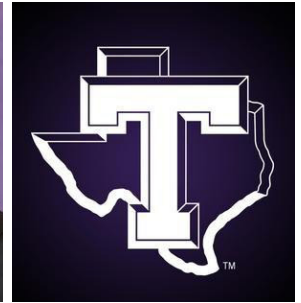
