PANTHERS TRAVEL NORTH TO BATTLE OWLS

The Panthers will be playing their second consecutive road game as well as their final away contest of the season when they travel to Kennesaw State on Saturday afternoon.

FIU and Kennesaw State will be meeting for the first time in program history. The Owls officially became a member of Conference USA this season after playing at the FCS level since the program's inception in 2015.

Saturday's game will be aired on ESPN+ and called by Nolan Alexander (pxp), Barclay Miller (analyst) and Maria Martin (sideline).

The pregame show on The Panther Online Network will start 15 minutes prior to kickoff and a postgame show will follow the conclusion of the contest.

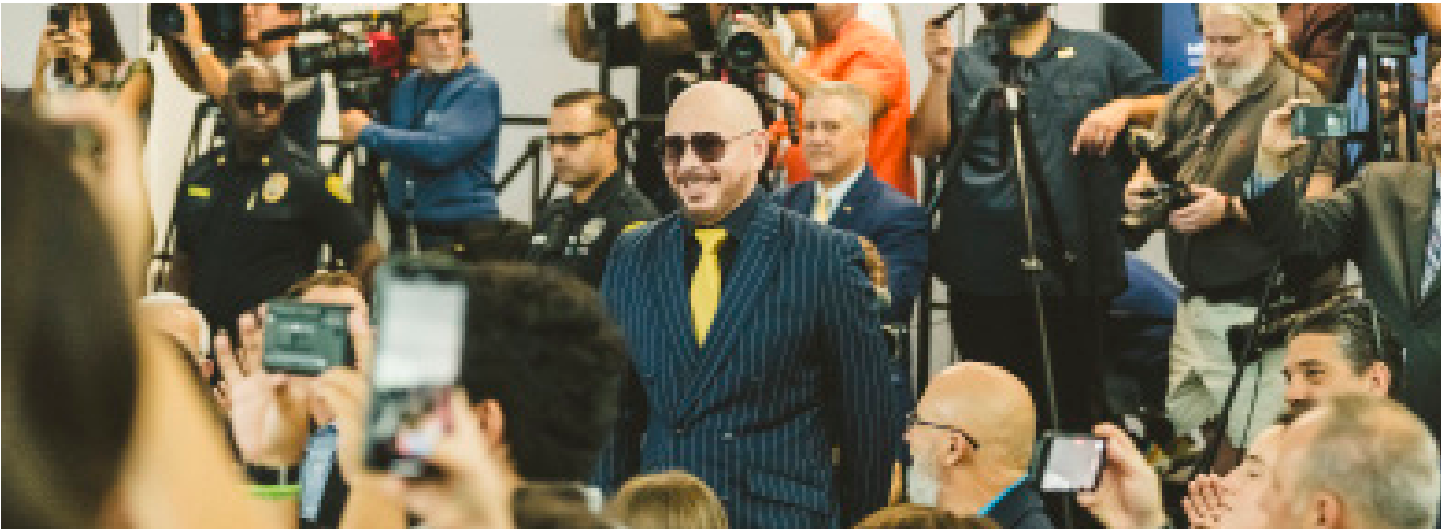

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING KENNESAW STATE

Kennesaw State enters Saturday's meeting with FIU with one win over the initial 10 games this season – a 27-24 victory over Liberty at home on Oct. 23.

The Owls have lost each of their last three games entering Saturday's clash with the Panthers – with losses coming at Western Kentucky, at UTEP and at home against Sam Houston.

The Owls are averaging 17.1 points per game and allowing an average of 31.5 to their opponents. Kennesaw State is posting an average of 114.5 rushing yards and 136.2 passing yards per contest.

Defensively, the Owls allow 170.5 rushing and 241.0 passing yards per game to their opponents.

Kennesaw State has forced nine turnovers and committed 16 for a minus seven margin and have totaled 16 sacks over the first 10 games of 2024.

FRESHMAN DEVONTE LYONS SEES ACTION IN BACKFIELD

FIU freshman running back Devonte Lyons saw the first action of his collegiate career at running back in the Panthers' game at Jacksonville State on Nov. 16.

The true freshman carried 12 times for 88 yards and an 11-yard touchdown run against the Gamecocks.

Lyons had a standout prep career at St. Augustine High – rushing for 1,558 yards and 27 touchdowns as a senior while leading the Yellow Jackets to the Florida State 3S Championship Game. For his career he rushed for 3,857 yards and 57 touchdowns, including a pair of 1,000-yard seasons.

PATTERSON HAS CAREER-DAY AT JAX STATE

FIU junior wide receiver Dean Patterson hauled in career-high nine passes for a career-best 116 receiving yards in the Panthers' game at Jax State on Nov. 16,

It marked his first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the second of his career.

Patterson has tallied 1,237 receiving yards for his career at FIU and has amassed 516 this season and four touchdowns.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS FROM JAX STATE

- Junior offensive lineman John Bock II saw his first action of the season and started at center.
- Each team scored on their opening two possessions of the game.
- FIU running back Shomari Lawrence scored his first rushing touchdown of the season in the second quarter.
- Each team only punted once in the first half.
- FIU didn't trail until the 4:44 mark of the second quarter and as late as 9:56 of the fourth.
- FIU junior linebacker Eddie Walls II finished with a career-best two sacks.
- Redshirt freshman tight end Antonio Ferguson hauled in a 39-yard scoring catch for his first career touchdown reception in the third quarter.
- The Panthers played the game without starting linebacker Travion Barnes.
- The game featured three ties and five lead changes.

RECORD-SETTING NIGHT FOR RIVERS

FIU junior wide receiver Eric Rivers hauled in 11 passes for a record-setting 295 yards as the FIU football team posted a 34-13 victory over New Mexico State on Oct. 29 in Miami.

Rivers’ 295 receiving yards marked the second-highest total by any FBS player this season. 113 of Rivers’ 295 receiving yards came after the catch.

Rivers’ 295 receiving yards marked the highest single-game total in FIU annals, surpassing the previous record of 201 set by both Kris Mitchell (2023) and Tyrese Chambers (2022).

Rivers leads Conference USA with nine touchdown receptions, including a career-high three in the win over New Mexico State. He tabbed scoring grabs of 52, 51 and 62 yards in the win over the Aggies.

His three touchdown catches also marked a career best and he is the first FIU player with three TD catches in a game since Rivaldo Fairweather vs. Middle Tennessee (2022).

RIVERS NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST

FIU junior wide receiver Eric Rivers has been added to the 2024 Biletnikoff Award Pre-season Watch List, it was announced by The Tallahassee Quarterback Club (TQC) Foundation, Inc., the Florida-based creator and sponsor of the prestigious Biletnikoff Award announced.

The Chattanooga, Tenn., native leads Conference USA with eight touchdown receptions this season and ranks ninth among all players in FBS. His 930 receiving yards this season also sits tops in CUSA and ranks 12th nationally. Rivers is averaging 93.0 receiving yards per game – which leads the league and is the 12th-best total in FBS.

He has recorded a total of 12 catches that have went for over 30 yards this season – including six touchdown grabs that went for more than 30 yards.

The Biletnikoff Award annually recognizes the college football season’s outstanding FBS receiver. Any player, regardless of position (wide receiver, tight end, slot back, and running back) who catches a pass is eligible for the award. As such, the Biletnikoff Award recognizes college football’s outstanding receiver, not merely college football’s outstanding wide receiver.

The semifinalists, finalists, and award recipient are selected by the highly distinguished Biletnikoff Award National Selection Committee, a group of 600 prominent college football journalists, commentators, announcers, Biletnikoff Award winners, and other former receivers. Foundation trustees do not vote and have never voted.

Rivers was one of two players added to the list, which now totals 70 candidates for the prestigious honor.

Recently, the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation opened the 2024 FanVote. Every fan may vote once daily on the Biletnikoff Award FanVote page. The aggregate fan tally will be counted as one official vote to determine semi-finalists, finalists (three receivers), and the winner.

RIVERS NAMED CUSA CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

FIU junior wide receiver Eric Rivers has been selected as the Conference USA Co-Offensive Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 2, conference officials announced.

Rivers, who shared the weekly honor with Jacksonville State running back Tre Stewart, hauled in 11 passes for a FIU single-game record 295 yards and three touchdowns in the Panthers' 34-13 victory over New Mexico State on Oct. 29 in Miami.

The 295 receiving yards represented the second-highest total among all players in FBS this season and each of his three touchdown catches came from distances of 51 yards or longer. He tabbed scoring grabs of 52, 51 and 62 yards in the win over the Aggies and 113 of his 295 yards came after the catch.

Rivers' weekly CUSA honor marks the fourth overall for FIU this season and he is one of three Panthers to be recognized with a weekly conference honor in 2024, joining Travion Barnes, who has earned the Defensive Player of the Week honor twice this season and Keyone Jenkins, who was selected as CUSA Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 9.

JENKINS NAMED TO MANNING STARS OF THE WEEK

FIU sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins was honored as one of eight players selected as the Manning Award Stars of the Week following the Panthers' win over New Mexico State on Oct. 29.

Jenkins completed 18-of-27 pass attempts for 338 yards and matched a school-record with four touchdown passes in a 34-13 win over New Mexico State. Three of his four touchdown tosses came from over 50 yards with scoring passes that stretched 62, 52 and 51 yards respectively.

The Manning Award was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in 2004 to honor the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. It is the only quarterback award that includes the candidates' bowl performances in its balloting. Since the Manning Award started recognizing Stars of the Week in 2011, 563 different quarterbacks from 135 schools have been recognized. Sixty-six players were honored during the 2023 season and 61 quarterbacks have been recognized

so far in 2024.

The other eight members of this edition of the Manning Stars of the Week included Kaden Anderson (Wyoming), Zeon Chriss (Houston), Jaxson Dart (Ole Miss), Jalen Kitna (UAB), Maddux Madsen (Boise State), LaNorris Sellers (South Carolina) and Cam Ward (Miami).

CLOSE CALLS

FIU has only been outscored by a total of three points by its opponents over the first 10 games with the Panthers scoring a total of 255 points and allowing 258.

The Panthers seven losses have come by a combined total of 66 points and four of their last five defeats have come by seven points or less.

JENKINS MOVES UP CAREER TD CHART

FIU sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins tossed his 26th and 27th career touchdown passes in the Panthers' game vs. Jax State on Nov. 16 - which places him in sixth all-time among FIU career leaders.

Jenkins' 16 TD passes this season currently rank as tied for the fifth-highest total in program annals.

BARNES HITS DOUBLE-DIGIT STOPS AGAIN

Junior linebacker Travion Barnes finished with 10 tackles in the win over New Mexico State on Oct. 29 – **upping his career total to 109 – which ranks tied for sixth among FIU's all-time single season leaders.**

His 10 tackles also marked his fifth-consecutive game with double-figure tackles and his seventh in nine games this season.

BARNES LEADING THE WAY

Junior linebacker Travion Barnes has wasted no time in establishing himself as a leader of the FIU defense.

He currently ranks third among all FBS players in total tackles with an average of 12.1 per game – which is also tops in Conference USA.

In addition, Barnes sits fifth among FBS leaders and first in CUSA with an average of 5.7 solo tackles per contest through the opening 10 games of 2024.

BIG PLAY RIVERS

Junior wide receiver Eric Rivers is averaging 19.38 yards per catch through the opening 10 games of 2024 – which ranks second in CUSA and 19th among all FBS players.

Rivers has notched a total of 16 catches of at least 20 yards or more in 2024.

JENKINS MATCHES SINGLE GAME TD MARK

FIU sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins tossed four touchdown passes in the Panthers' win over New Mexico State, matching the program's single game record for most touchdown tosses in a single game.

Jenkins four TD passes marked the seventh time it has been accomplished in FIU history and he is the sixth player to hit the mark.

NM STATE NOTES

- Tonight's game marked the first ever meeting between FIU and New Mexico State in Miami after the initial three games in the series (dating back to 2004) were played in Las Cruces.
- The teams played to a scoreless opening quarter – FIU's second consecutive game with no points in the opening 15 minutes by either team.
- The 52-yard touchdown pass from Keyone Jenkins to Eric Rivers in the second quarter marked the Panthers' longest offensive play of the season. It was surpassed later in the game by another Jenkins-Rivers scoring connection that went for 62 yards.
- The 30 passing yards in the game for New Mexico State marked the third-fewest ever allowed by FIU to an opponent.
- Sophomore Hezekiah Masses recorded his first interception of the season and the second of his career in the third quarter.
- FIU senior place kicker Alejandro Prado blasted a career-best 38-yard field goal in the third quarter.
- Freshman tight end Antonio Ferguson caught a 21-yard pass in the fourth quarter – his longest of the season.

JOJO EVANS POSTS 19 TACKLES AT UTEP

FIU junior defensive back JoJo Evans tabbed a career-best 19 tackles at UTEP on Oct. 16 – which ranked tied for the third-highest single game total in FIU history.

He also forced a fumble and added a QB hurry and pass breakup in game vs. Miners.

JONES FILLS IN AT UTEP

Sophomore quarterback Amari Jones saw his first extended playing time in the Panthers' game at UTEP on Oct. 16.

Jones entered the game after starting signal caller Keyone Jenkins was injured in the first quarter and completed his first collegiate TD pass on a 33-yard strike to Eric Rivers in the second quarter.

Jones entered the contest with one career completion – he finished 6-of-11 for 92 yards and a touchdown.

SALLA SNAGS FIRST PICK AT UTEP

FIU junior Bobby Salla Jr. hauled in the first interception of his career with 43 seconds left in the third quarter on Oct. 16 at UTEP.

He promptly returned it 32 yards to set up a FIU touchdown one play later.

- FIU junior Eric Rivers caught his team-leading fourth TD catch in the second quarter.
- The game featured a total of five lead changes.

PANTHERS RALLY FOR NEAR UPSET AT LIBERTY

FIU erased a 14-point deficit in the final 10:43 of regulation before eventually coming up just short in a 31-24 overtime loss at defending conference champion Liberty on Oct. 8.

The Flames, who entered the game with the nation's longest regular-season winning streak at 15 games, led by a 24-10 margin with under 11 minutes in the fourth quarter prior to the Panthers' rally.

FIU sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins ran for a one-yard touchdown with 1:42 left in regulation to force overtime.

The Panthers drove 61 yards in 3:44 to deadlock the score after opening the critical drive with 5:36 left and trailing 24-17.

The push was keyed by a pair of catches by junior wide receiver Eric Rivers – who snagged a 23-yard catch before hauling in a crucial 17-yard gain to convert a fourth and four and set the Panthers up at the Liberty four-yard line.

Jenkins followed two plays later with the one-yard scoring run to force overtime and after the FIU defense held firm on Liberty's final possession of regulation.

Liberty escaped with the victory after scoring on a nine-yard run by Kaidon Salter on its first overtime possession and then forcing and recovering a fumble on the Panthers' possession in the extra period.

The Panthers got within 24-17 with 6:23 left in regulation on a three-yard rushing touchdown by Kejon Owens. The drive was sparked by a 40-yard completion from Jenkins to Rivers.

LIBERTY NOTES

- FIU made its second-ever visit to Liberty and its first since 2020.
- FIU and Liberty each lost a turnover on their opening possession of the second half. Liberty fumbled inside the FIU one-yard line and it was recovered by the Panthers just shy of the goal line.
- The Liberty fumble was forced by CJ Christian and recovered by Travion Barnes.
- Junior linebacker Barnes finished with a career-high 16 tackles – including a career-high two sacks and three TFLs. He has recorded double-figure stops in four of the last five games overall and has led FIU in tackles in each of the last five games.
- Junior wide receiver Dean Patterson caught six passes for a career-best 90 yards.
- Liberty entered the game with the longest current regular-season winning streak among all FBS teams nationally at 15 games.

- FIU is now 8-7 all-time in overtime games and the loss snapped a three-game win streak in extra time.

BARNES NAMED CUSA DEFENSIVE POW AGAIN

Junior linebacker Travion Barnes was honored as the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week, for the period ending Oct. 12 – marking his second honor this season after previously being honored on Sept. 30.

The junior linebacker tabbed a career-best 16 tackles, including seven solo stops, along with two sacks, three TFLs and a fumble recovery in the Panthers' 31-24 overtime loss at Liberty on Oct. 8.

For his initial CUSA Defensive POW Award, Barnes led the FIU defense with a game-high 14 tackles, including a sack and two TFLs in the Sept. 28th win over Louisiana Tech in the Conference USA opener for both teams.

The Panthers' defense limited the Bulldogs to 10 points and held them scoreless for the final four possessions and last 17:43 of regulation.

Barnes is the second FIU player recognized with a weekly conference honor this season, joining Keyone Jenkins, who was recognized as CUSA Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 9.

GOALINE STAND SPARKS LA TECH WIN

The FIU defense came up with a huge goal line stand to help give the Panthers momentum in its 17-10 win over Louisiana Tech in the CUSA opener on Sept. 28.

With 3:37 left in the second quarter and FIU leading 7-0, the Bulldogs had a first and goal at the FIU one-yard line.

The Panthers didn't budge as they stopped Louisiana Tech four consecutive plays for no gain and force a turnover on downs.

Five different players were in on the critical stops.

D POSTS FIRST SHUTOUT HALF SINCE 2019

The FIU defense shutout Louisiana Tech in the opening half of its 17-10 win on Sept. 28.

It marked the first shutout in a half for the Panthers' defense since blanking UMass on Oct. 5, 2019.

FEWEST RUSH YARDS ALLOWED IN CUSA

The FIU defense limited Louisiana Tech to 79 rushing yards in its 17-10 win on Sept. 28.

That marked the fewest allowed to a CUSA foe since holding Charlotte to 60 on Oct. 22, 2022.

WIN IN CUSA OPENER FIRST TIME SINCE 2018

FIU's win over Louisiana Tech in its CUSA opener marked the first time it has opened with a win in conference play since defeating Old Dominion (28-20) on Sept. 8, 2018.

OTHER TAKEAWAYS FROM LA TECH WIN

- Junior wide receiver Eric Rivers caught his third touchdown of the season in the first quarter.
- A roughing the passer call against Louisiana Tech early in the second quarter negated an interception return for a touchdown by the Bulldogs' defense.
- FIU's 13-play, 84-yard drive in the first quarter marked its longest in terms of both plays and yardage this season.
- FIU's defense forced a key fumble with 13 seconds left in the third quarter. Junior Hezekiah Masses stripped the ball and junior JoJo Evans recovered at the FIU 41.
- Senior Alejandro Prado connected on a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter – his first made field goal as a member of FIU.
- The FIU defense held Louisiana Tech scoreless for each of the final four possessions and the final 17:43 seconds of regulation.
- Junior linebacker Travion Barnes totaled a game-high 14 tackles – his third double-digit tackle performance over the last four games. He also recorded 2.5 TFLs and a sack.

BARNES SETS INT RETURN RECORD

FIU junior linebacker Travion Barnes returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown with 9:53 left in the first quarter of the Sept. 21 game vs. Monmouth – breaking the record for the longest interception return in FIU history.

The 85-yard pick six bested the previous long of 82 yards by Marshall McDuffie vs. Florida Atlantic on Nov. 26, 2005.

NOTABLES FROM MONMOUTH

- FIU's defense and offense both scored touchdowns during their respective opening drives of the game. Barnes ran back the interception for a record 85 yards en route to a touchdown before the Panthers' offense put together an eight-play, 58-yard march for a touchdown on their first possession of the game.
- Sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins connected with sophomore wide receiver JuJu Lewis for a 42-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter – it marked the Panthers' longest pass play this season at the time.
- FIU junior JoJo Evans was ejected from the game for targeting with 2:54 left in the second quarter.
- The FIU and Monmouth offenses combined for four consecutive touchdowns (two each) during a stretch in the opening half.
- Monmouth attempted a total of six fourth-down conversions in the first half – and were successful on four of those chances. Monmouth finished the game 5-for-7 on fourth down opportunities.
- The game featured a total of three ties.
- FIU tight end Josiah Miamen fumbled on the FIU 39 with the score tied at 42-42 and 5:03 left in regulation.
- Quarterback Keyone Jenkins finished with a career-high 362 passing yards – his first 300-yard passing performance.
- Wide receiver Eric Rivers finished with 101 receiving yards – matching his career high set last week at Florida Atlantic.
- The Panthers were flagged for 12 penalties and a total of 108 yards – its most since getting 15 penalties for 127 yards at Liberty on Sept. 26, 2020.

DEFENSIVE SCORES

The FIU defense ranks 15th nationally with a pair of defensive touchdowns through the opening nine games of 2024.

The Panthers have run back two interceptions for scores this season – one by Brian Blades against Central Michigan and a second by Travion Barnes vs. Monmouth.

DEFENSIVE PICKS

The FIU defense also ranks 36th nationally and second in Conference USA in passes intercepted with nine through nine games.

Eight different players have intercepted a pass for the Panthers this season – two of which have been run back the distance for touchdowns.

PANTHERS PULL OFF FIRST AT FAU

FIU blocked a punt and a field goal in the same game for the first time in program history at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 14.

Junior Eddie Walls III blocked a 39-yard field goal attempt by Florida Atlantic with 1:49 left in first half.

Prior to that, redshirt freshman Luby Maurice Jr. blocked a punt at the 10:48 mark of the first quarter, it marked the first blocked punt for FIU since Sept. 25, 2021 at Central Michigan (Rishard Dames).

NOTABLES FROM FLORIDA ATLANTIC

- Contest marked the 22nd all-time meeting between FIU and Florida Atlantic in the Shula Bowl.
- Game was delayed by one hour and 42 minutes due to lightning and storms in the area.
- Senior C'Quan Jnopierre opened the game with a 31-yard kickoff return – his longest of the season at the time.
- Sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins was a perfect 3-for-3 on the opening drive of the game for 64 yards and a 32-yard TD pass to junior Eric Rivers.
- The FIU defense forced Florida Atlantic to punt on each of its first four possessions.
- FIU had four turnovers in the first half – two fumbles lost and two interceptions. The miscues resulted in a total of 17 of Florida Atlantic's 24 points in the first half.
- Junior linebacker Travion Barnes finished with a season-high 15 tackles to lead the FIU defense.
- FIU wide receiver Eric Rivers finished with six catches for 101 yards – his first career 100-yard receiving performance.
- FIU sophomore JuJu Lewis scored his first career touchdown on a 16-yard catch with 9:42 left in regulation.

THE SHULA BOWL CONTINUES...

FIU and Florida Atlantic University have agreed to play in a four-game non-conference series beginning with this season's meeting in Boca Raton.

The Panthers and Owls will next square off on FIU's Miami campus in 2025.

The final two games will take place at FAU (2026) and FIU (2027).



GAMES NOTES

The rivalry, which dates back to the 2002 season, is known as 'The Shula Bowl'. The game's annual winner receives the Don Shula Award, which is named after former Miami Dolphins head coach Don Shula.

Shula, who led the Miami Dolphins for 26 seasons and is the NFL's all-time winningest coach with 347 career victories, was connected to both FIU's and FAU's first head coach.

Florida Atlantic's first head coach Howard Schnellenberger was an assistant of Shula in the 1970s, while FIU's initial head coach Don Strock, was a quarterback under Shula in the 1970s and 1980s.

'The Shula Bowl' pays homage to Shula, South Florida football and the ties and history of both FIU and Florida Atlantic universities.

FIU DEFENSIVE BOSS DEWITT NAMED COORDINATOR OF WEEK

FIU football defensive coordinator Jovan Dewitt was honored as the Conference USA Defensive Coordinator of the Week by 247Sports following the Panthers' 52-16 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7.

The Panthers' defense matched program records with six total turnovers and five interceptions in the Week 2 win over the Chippewas.

PANTHERS DEFENSE TIES RECORD FOR MOST TURNOVERS

The FIU football team forced a total of six turnovers in the 52-16 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7 - tying the most turnovers forced in a single game in program history.

The Panthers posted a total of five interceptions in the win over the Chippewas, by five different players and forced one fumble.

The six turnovers mark the third time that FIU has pulled the trick - matching totals at UAB on Sept. 27, 2014 and vs. Florida A&M on Nov. 27, 2004.

FIVE INTERCEPTIONS VS. CENTRAL MICHIGAN TIE PROGRAM MARK

The Panthers pulled down five interceptions in the win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7 - tying the program record for most in a single game.

A total of five different players hauled in picks for the Panthers, including Jamal Potts, Percy Courtney Jr., JoJo Evans, Antonio Patterson and Brian Blades II.

Blades also ran his interception back 22 yards for his first career touchdown.

The interceptions for Courtney Jr., Blades and Patterson marked the first of their respective collegiate careers. Evans marked his first since joining FIU.

The five interceptions tied the total the Panthers posted against Florida Atlantic on Nov. 26, 2005.

PANTHERS RACE OUT TO BIGGEST LEAD SINCE 2019

The Panthers opened its win over Central Michigan with an early 28-0 advantage - its largest lead since defeating UMass 44-0 on Oct. 5, 2019.

KEYONE JENKINS EARNS FIRST CUSA POW

Sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins was selected as the Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week, for the period ending Sept. 7.

Jenkins led the Panthers' offense to their highest single-game point total since 2018 in FIU's 52-16 win over Central Michigan at Pitbull Stadium on Saturday night.

Overall, Jenkins accounted for three touchdowns and a two-point conversion in the convincing victory over the Chippewas. He threw for a pair of touchdowns, as well as a successful two-point conversion and also posted another score on a four-yard rush. He also logged a career-long 34-yard run in the home-opening win.

Jenkins finished the game 10-of-18 through the air for 124 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He was also a factor on the ground as he rushed for 42 yards and a score on five carries.

The 52 points scored marked the most by FIU vs. a FBS foe since notching 66 vs. UMass on Sept. 15, 2018 and marked the most ever by the Panthers in a home opener.

FLEX FINDS THE END ZONE

Graduate running back Lexington Joseph scored on a 35-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter of the Panthers' 52-16 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7.

It marked his first score since Oct. 28, 2022 vs. Louisiana Tech after missing the entire 2023 season due to a knee injury.

MOST POINTS SINCE 2018

FIU's 52 points in its win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7 marked its highest single-game point total since posting 63 vs. UMass on Sept. 15, 2018.

FIU IN HOME OPENERS

The Panthers improves to 10-13 all-time in home openers and have won their last four straight following its 52-16 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 7.

Junior safety JoJo Evans had a solid debut in his opening game at FIU as he paced the Panthers with a team-high 11 tackles during the season opener at Indiana on Aug. 31.

NEW DUO AT LINEBACKER

The Panthers featured a fresh pair of faces on at the inside linebacker slots during the season opener at Indiana as junior Dwight Nunoo and Travion Barnes made their debuts for FIU.

Nunoo tabbed seven tackles and his first career sack in the meeting with the Hoosiers, while Barnes chipped in three stops.

PANTHERS OWN SOUTH FLORIDA

The Panthers' roster is loaded with student-athletes that hail from the Sunshine State and specifically South Florida.

FIU has a total of 91 players from the state of Florida - including a total of 58 combined from Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties.

The Panthers boast a total of 28 players from Miami-Dade, 20 from Broward and 10 from Palm Beach.

FIU's roster also includes a total of 33 players who are from Florida but outside of the South Florida region.

WELCOME TO SOUTH DADE KIA FIELD AT PITBULL STADIUM

Earlier this summer, FIU Athletics announced a groundbreaking partnership with international superstar and entrepreneur Armando Christian Pérez, better known as Pitbull.

The 10-year agreement will see FIU Stadium rebranded as Pitbull Stadium, making it the world's first-ever athletics venue with an artist possessing the naming rights.

The unrivaled collaboration includes multi-faceted marketing and promotional opportunities between Pitbull, a Miami native, and FIU - the only public Division-I institution in Miami.

FIU IN SEASON OPENERS

SIGNAL CALLER JENKINS BACK FOR SECOND SEASON

FIU sophomore quarterback Keyone Jenkins returns under center for his sophomore season following a rookie campaign that marked one of the best performances by a FIU freshman quarterback.

Jenkins finished with 2,414 passing yards - the most by a true freshman at FIU and the fifth-highest total by any freshman last year nationally in FBS.

Jenkins one-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter at Arkansas on Nov. 16, 2023, marked his sixth of the season and broke the FIU program record for most rushing scores by a signal caller - surpassing Alex McGough's total of five in 2017.

In addition, Jenkins has scored a rushing touchdown in a

stretch of five consecutive games (Sept. 16-Oct. 18) – the program record for most consecutive games with a rushing touchdown by any player is six (6) – set by Darriet Perry in 2009.

Jenkins finished the 2023 season with 11 passing touchdowns.

In addition, Jenkins had a knack for the big play with an average of 12.44 yards per completion – 40th best total among all FBS quarterbacks.

Jenkins has known little but winning as a prep as a starting signal caller dating back to his prep career at Miami Central.

Jenkins won each of his last 26 starts at Miami Central while also guiding the Rockets to three consecutive state titles from 2020-22.

He opened 3-0 as a starter for FIU prior to a loss against Liberty on Sept. 23.

FIRST TRUE FRESHMAN QB START SINCE 2014

Keyone Jenkins became the first true freshman to start a game at quarterback for FIU – when he opened under center vs. Maine on Sept. 2, 2023 – since Nov. 22, 2014 when Alex McGough opened under center at North Texas – he started 11 games as a true freshman in 2014.

Jenkins start vs. Maine on Sept. 2 marked the first in a span of 93 games which saw a true freshman start at quarterback for the Panthers.

JENKINS SETS FRESHMAN PASSING RECORD IN DEBUT

Keyone Jenkins had a record-setting debut as his 292 passing yards vs. Maine last season and eclipsed the FIU program record for the most passing yards ever by a true freshman.

He surpassed Jamie Butler, who tossed for 258 yards vs. Butler on Sept. 14, 2002 – during the inaugural season of the program.

Jenkins tossed the first touchdown pass of his collegiate career at 8:12 of the first quarter on a 19-yard toss to junior Kris Mitchell – his first of two to Mitchell – which also included a 62-yard scoring strike.

WHAT IS BACK

The Panthers return a total of 20 starters from last season's squad – with a total of eight offensive, six defensive and four special teams starters returning to the fold in 2024.

MINIMUM OF FIVE NATIONALLY TELEVISED GAMES

The Panthers will play before a national television audience at least five times during the 2024 season.

The Panthers' television schedule features three games televised on CBS Sports Network (CBSSN) and their first ESPNU national broadcast since 2020, when they host Sam Houston on Tuesday, Oct. 22 (7:30 p.m.) at Pit Bull Stadium in Miami.

FIU will have a regular-season game nationally televised on one

of ESPN's primary networks for the second consecutive season – marking the first time since the 2011 and 2012 campaigns.

The Panthers' three games on CBS Sports Network all take place during the October weeknight portion of the schedule. The trio of national telecasts begins with a match up at defending CUSA Champion Liberty in Lynchburg, Va., on Tuesday, Oct. 8 in a 7 p.m. ET start.

FIU follows with a clash at UTEP on Wednesday, Oct. 16 in a 9 p.m. ET kickoff, before hosting New Mexico State in its final CBS Sports Network broadcast in October on Tuesday, Oct. 29 at 7 p.m. in Miami.

The Panthers will also kickoff the 2024 campaign before a national audience when they travel to battle Indiana in the season opener in Bloomington, Ind., on Saturday, August 31 in a 3:30 p.m. ET start on the Big Ten Network.

FIU ANNOUNCES FRESH BROADCASTING TEAM

FIU football broadcasts will have a new look in the booth and audio streams will air on the newly formed Panther Online Network, which will make its debut for the 2024 season opener, when FIU travels to battle Big Ten member Indiana on Saturday, August 31.

FIU football audio broadcasts will be moving exclusively to the new Panther Online Network, a free service free which can be accessed by phone, laptop, tablet or any device with internet access. All audio streams will begin 15 minutes prior to kick off with a pregame show and concluded with a 15-minute post-game wrap up.

The Panther Online Network can be accessed by visiting fiuports.com/listen.

All audio broadcasts will be archived and available on demand shortly after the completion of each contest.

FIU football telecasts will also have a new look this season as a new rotation of play-by-play announcers and analysts familiar with south Florida sports fans will take to the air to call Panthers' games in 2024.

Joining the broadcast team for select games will be Steve Goldstein, the veteran play-by-play voice for the reigning Stanley Cup champion Florida Panthers and voice of the Miami Dolphins preseason telecasts. Former Miami Dolphins' standout and current analyst for the Dolphins' preseason games, Kim Bokamper, will also be a part of select FIU football television and audio telecasts this fall.

Other new additions include Zach Letson, who has served as a commentator for FIU Athletics over the past year for numerous sports and previously served as a broadcaster for the Division I Junior College World Series and NAIA Lacrosse Championships. Finally, former FIU football tight end Jackson McDonald will also join the mix as an on-air analyst.

The new members of the broadcast teams will join the returning voices of the Panthers' AJ Ricketts and Corey Brooks, who both will return to call Panthers' games on both select television and radio broadcasts. In addition, guest analyst Billy Gil will return after appearing on a number of broadcasts in 2023. Gil is a former FIU track and field standout and currently is a senior

FIU FINALIZES SERIES WITH USF

The Panthers have finalized a two-game non-conference series beginning in 2026.

The Panthers and Bulls will begin the two-game series during the 2026 campaign (at USF), before following with a second contest in 2029 (at FIU).

"We are excited to be able to add another in-state opponent to our future football schedules," FIU Director of Athletics Scott Carr said. "We look forward to continuing to build these rivalries against in-state programs and I would like to thank USF Director of Athletics Michael Kelly for his help making this series happen."

FIU and South Florida have met a total of two times previously – with the most recent match up coming during the 2008 season.

PENN STATE SERIES FINALIZED

The FIU football program will travel to face Penn State in a non-conference matchup during the 2025 season.

The Panthers and Nittany Lions are scheduled to play on Saturday, Sept. 6, 2025 at Beaver Stadium in University Park, Pa., which seats 106,572 and ranks as the second-largest stadium in college football.

The two programs will be meeting for the second time in their history – having previously played on Sept. 1, 2007, also in University Park.

The Panthers have played a total of six previous games against members of the Big Ten Conference, including contests against Iowa (2008), Indiana (2015, 2016, 2018), Maryland (2016) and Penn State (2007). FIU is also slated to face Indiana in the 2024 season opener on Saturday, August 31 in Bloomington, Ind.

COACHING STAFF UPDATES

FIU named Kenechi Udeze as an assistant coach to the Panthers' coaching staff. Udeze, a former collegiate standout at the University of Southern California and a first round selection (20th overall) in the 2005 NFL Draft, will coach the FIU outside linebackers.

Udeze, who was officially hired just prior to the start of 2024 Spring Practice, brings a wealth of previous coaching experi-

ence to the Panther staff, both at the collegiate and NFL levels.

Most recently a pass rush specialist on the staff at the University of Houston (2023), Udeze was previously a member of the staffs at Vanderbilt (2020/LBs) as well as a defensive analyst with LSU during its run to the 2019 National Championship. He was also a defensive line coach at his alma mater USC from 2016-18.

During his stretch with the Trojans, USC led the nation in sacks (46) in 2017 and was fourth nationally in red zone defense. In 2016, USC limited opponents to just 139.6 yards rushing per contest.

Udeze's NFL experience includes a run with the Tennessee Titans as an assistant defensive line coach (2021-22) as well as a stint with the Seattle Seahawks as an assistant defensive line coach in 2012.

He began his coaching career as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Washington for three years (2009-11), where he also worked with the defensive line. The Huskies played in the 2010 Holiday Bowl and 2011 Alamo Bowl. Udeze also held the role of assistant strength and conditioning coach at USC (2015) and Pittsburgh (2014).

In 2013, Udeze completed the Bill Walsh NFL Minority Coaching Fellowship program with the Minnesota Vikings.

During his illustrious playing career, Udeze was a three-year (2001-03) starting defensive end at USC, recording 135 tackles, 51 tackles for loss, 28 sacks, an NCAA record-tying 14 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in his career.

As a junior in 2003 on USC's national championship team, he was a consensus All-American first teamer, as well as a Hendricks Award finalist, the Washington D.C. Pigskin Club National Defensive Player of the Year, an All-Pac-10 first team selection and USC's Defensive Lineman of the Year.

That season, he led the nation in sacks (16.5 for a 1.3 average), was fourth in tackles for loss (26 for a 2.0 average) and was ninth in forced fumbles (5 for a 0.4 average), the only player in the nation in the top nine in each of those categories.

His 26 tackles for loss and 16.5 sacks in 2003 were the most by a Trojan defensive lineman since 1989 and he was the first Trojan with double digits in sacks since 1992 (Willie McGinest). He also had 56 tackles, five forced fumbles, a fumble recovery (for a touchdown), three deflections and a blocked field goal in 2003.

Udeze was a Freshman All-American second team pick in 2001 when he had 35 tackles, nine tackles for loss, four sacks, a fumble recovery, three forced fumbles and a deflection as USC played in the Las Vegas Bowl.

As a sophomore in 2002, he made All-Pac-10 second team and was USC's Defensive Lineman of the Year when he had 44 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, a school record six forced fumbles, a fumble recovery, an interception and a blocked field goal (the Trojans won the 2003 Orange Bowl and finished ranked fourth nationally).

He declared for the NFL Draft after his 2003 junior season and was a first round selection (20th overall pick) by the Vikings in 2004. He started 47 of 51 games in his four years (2004-07) with the Vikings, compiling 117 tackles, 11 sacks, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles.

As a rookie in 2004, he recorded 36 tackles, five sacks, a forced fumble and a deflection while starting 15 games for the Vikings playoff squad. He started 15 times in 2006, getting 29 tackles, then had 47 tackles, five sacks a deflection and forced fumble with another 15 starts in 2007.

He was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia (a blood cancer) in 2008 and placed on injured reserve that season. He received chemotherapy treatments and had a bone marrow transplant from his brother. He was the Vikings' recipient of the 2008 NFL Ed Block Courage Award, as voted by his teammates. After attempting to return to the playing field in 2009 but struggling with peripheral neuropathy in his feet as a result of chemotherapy, Udeze retired from the NFL that summer.

He earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from USC in 2010. He was a prep All-American lineman at Verbum Dei High in Los Angeles (Calif.), where he also was a shot putter on the track team.

MACINTYRE NAMED SIXTH COACH AT FIU

Mike MacIntyre was officially announced as the sixth coach in the history of the FIU football program on Dec. 9, 2021.

The consensus 2016 national coach of the year, MacIntyre was born in the Magic City and resided in the area while his father was an assistant coach for the University of Miami.

"Throughout this process, Coach MacIntyre rose to the top," Carr said. "He has a passion for student-athletes and building genuine relationships with them. He's a builder, with proven success taking two struggling programs and elevating them to national relevance. He is a two-time national coach of the year. He's a brand builder who will promote FIU throughout the South Florida community and the state of Florida. We could not be more excited to bring his energy and passion to campus."

RETURN OF PANTHER WALK

Join the spirit squads, the band, and all of Panther Nation, as the team makes its way to the stadium with Panther Walk. Starting approximately two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, the Panthers will walk through Tamiami Promenade and through Gate 6 at the northeast corner of the stadium to prepare for the game. Come on out and cheer on the squad!

It's about inspiring the community, creating opportunities and showing the world that with determination and a clear vision, anything is possible. We're making history together, and we're just getting started. Why dream when you can live it?"

When he steps on the stage at Pitbull Stadium, the GRAMMY®-winning artist will be the first entertainer in history to perform in an athletics facility bearing his name.

"Pitbull's career trajectory mirrors FIU's ascent as one of the nation's top public research universities," said FIU President Kenneth A. Jessell. "Like FIU, he started out very 305 and became worldwide."

The partnership also marks Pitbull's participation in FIU football's Vice Night, featuring Miami-style colors and merchandise, with the Panthers donning their nationally acclaimed Vice uniform. This year's game – which will feature a new Vice uniform – will take place on Oct. 22 at 7:30 p.m. against Sam Houston State and will be broadcast across the country on ESPN.

"This is a historic day for FIU Athletics to uniquely partner with a world-renowned artist and amazing person who truly values relationships and his community," FIU Director of Athletics Scott Carr commented. "Armando's financial support is program-changing, but him providing a microphone to amplify FIU will be even more beneficial to growing our brand. I couldn't be more excited about our partnership as this will take us to another level. We can now officially say: 'Paws Up, Dale!'"

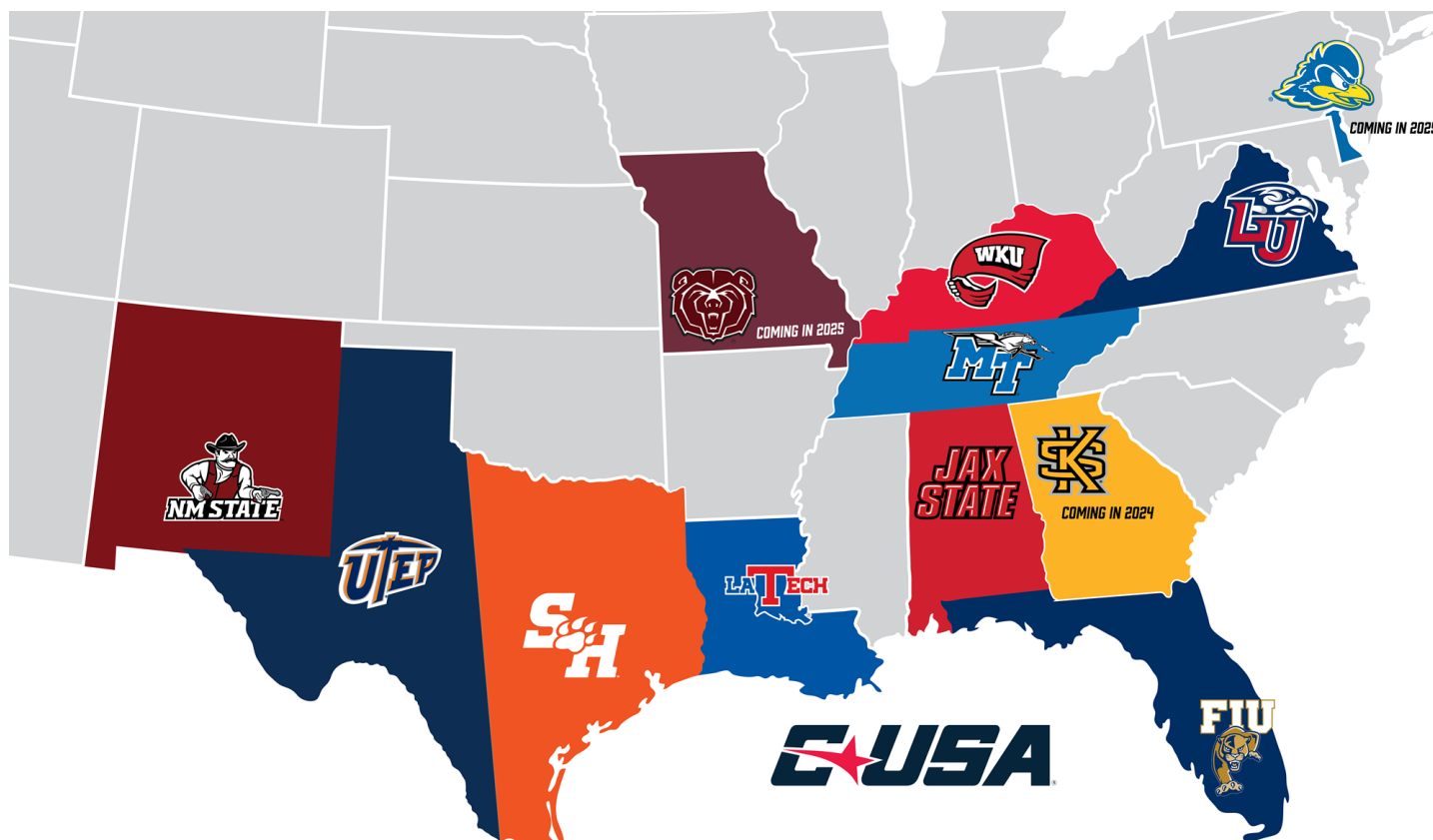

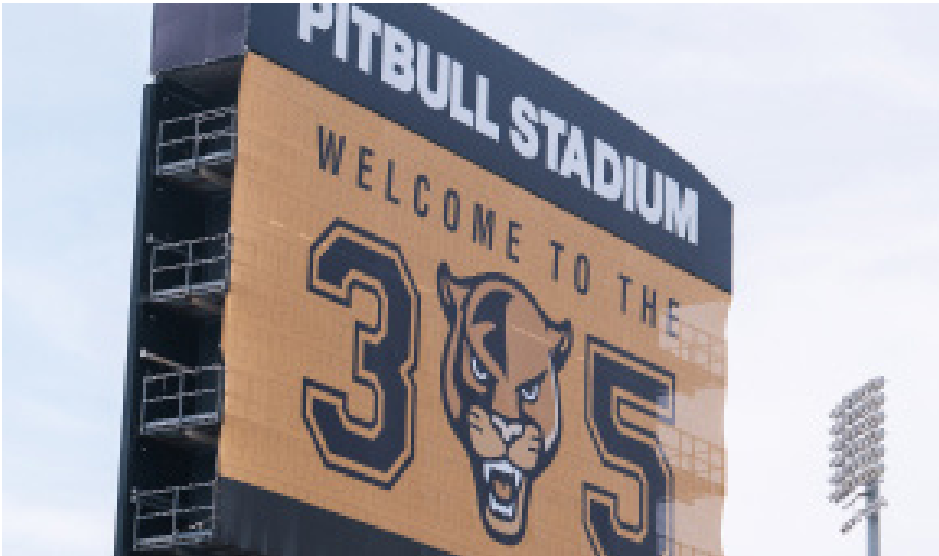

Mike MacIntyre is entering his third season with the Panthers after being named head coach of the FIU football program on Dec. 9, 2021.

MacIntyre wasted no time upon arrival in changing the culture of the FIU program as the 2022 Panthers posted a 400 percent increase in victories from the previous season and recorded the most wins since 2019.

A total of eight Panthers earned All-Conference USA status in 2022 - with another four honored with mention to the Conference USA All-Freshman squad, highlighted by defensive back Demetrius Hill, who became the first FIU player since 2018 to be named to the FWAA Freshman All-America Team.

Always with an eye on the future, MacIntyre has elevated the recruiting aspect of the program as the Panthers were recognized as having the top recruiting class among all returning Conference USA programs during the 2023 early cycle.

A Miami native, MacIntyre was born in the Magic City and resided in the area while his father was an assistant coach for the University of Miami.

MacIntyre is a 33-year veteran of collegiate coaching and has previously served as the head coach at the University of Colorado (2013-18) and San Jose State University (2010-12) – where he led both programs to nationally recognized turnarounds in wins during his tenure. MacIntyre also has experience coaching in the NFL under legendary coach, Bill Parcells.

He was the consensus national coach of the year in 2016 after guiding Colorado to a 10-4 finish and the Pac-12 South Division Title. While with San Jose State, MacIntyre led the Spartans to the program's first ranking in the final BCS standings (No. 24) following a 10-2 mark in 2012.

MacIntyre arrived at FIU after holding the position of defensive coordinator at Memphis for two seasons (2020-21).

The 2021 season saw MacIntyre's defense lead the American Athletic Conference in defensive touchdowns and ranked 23rd nationally.

During the 2020 campaign under MacIntyre, the Tigers ranked 13th in the nation in turnovers gained (20), 17th in the country in interceptions (12) and 19th in red zone defense (.744).

Under his guidance, Memphis defensive lineman O'Bryan Goodson was named First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and defensive back Quindell Johnson earned second-team all-conference accolades. Defensive lineman Morris Joseph earned honorable-mention all-league.

MacIntyre spent the 2019 season as Ole Miss' defensive coordinator and did a tremendous job in turning around the defense in his lone campaign in Oxford, Miss. It was MacIntyre's second stint at Ole Miss, as he also coached there from 1999-02.

Ole Miss made impressive jumps in several defensive statistical categories. The Rebels held opponents to nearly 10 fewer points in 2019 than in 2018 and

also held foes to nearly 100 fewer rushing yards per game over those same two seasons.

Ole Miss' total defense under MacIntyre jumped nearly 40 spots in the NCAA rankings. The Rebels limited opponents to just under 70 fewer total yards per game.

MacIntyre has made turnarounds a trademark of his career, which was evident in his six seasons as the head coach at Colorado. In 2013, he took over a Colorado team that was coming off a 1-11 season. Four years later he directed the Buffs to a 10-4 mark and their first appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game.

In 2016, Colorado was tied with five other programs for the most improved overall nationally and the most improved all-time in Pac-12 league games. The Buffaloes became just the ninth team among Power-5 schools since 1972 to win 10 or more games after finishing the previous season with four or fewer wins.

For his efforts in 2016, MacIntyre earned consensus National Coach of the Year honors after leading the Buffaloes to their first 10-win season in 15 years.

In 2015, the Buffs defense improved by as many as 50 spots nationally in many major defensive areas. The biggest jump came in points allowed per game, slicing off 11.5 from the previous year, the fifth-best improvement in all of FBS.

The turnaround at Colorado came just a few years after MacIntyre similarly resuscitated a San Jose State team from a 1-12 record in 2010 to one that finished 10-2 in 2012 and was nationally ranked. MacIntyre garnered Grant Teaff National Coach of the Year recognition that season. His San Jose State teams won 12 of his final 14 games there.

In recording their first 10-win season since 1987, the Spartans did it with a defense that ranked among the national leaders in numerous statistical categories. The opportunistic Spartans were the co-national leaders with 20 fumble recoveries and were tied for fourth in turnovers gained (33).

MacIntyre arrived at San Jose State after two years as the defensive coordinator at Duke, where he was reunited with



David Cutcliffe, who was the Rebels' coach during MacIntyre's first stint in Oxford.

In his first season in Durham (2008), the Blue Devils allowed 67.4 fewer yards and 9.8 fewer points per game than the previous season. The AFCA named MacIntyre its 2009 FBS Assistant Coach of the Year as his defenses were among Duke's best statistically over a 20-year span.

Prior to returning to college ball, MacIntyre spent five seasons in the National Football League with the New York Jets (2007) and Dallas Cowboys (2003-06), where he coached defensive backs.

Working for legendary coach Bill Parcells, the Cowboys returned to the NFL playoffs in 2003 and again in 2006 after missing out on postseason competition during the 2000 through 2002 seasons.

MacIntyre served as Ole Miss' secondary coach during the 2001 and 2002 seasons after spending his first two years in Oxford as the wide receivers coach. The Rebels posted a 29-19 record in that time with bowl appearances in the 1999 and 2002 Independence Bowls and the 2000 Music City Bowl. The 2001 Rebels ranked fifth nationally in pass defense, allowing just 161.3 yards per game.

At Ole Miss, among his recruits were two high-profile student-athletes, quarterback Eli Manning and linebacker Patrick Willis. He has mentored many current and former NFL players, including recently retired former Dallas and Cincinnati safety Roy Williams, a five-time Pro Bowl player.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Georgia, working two years (1990-91) in that capacity. He then coached one year as the defensive coordinator at Davidson (1992), four years at UT Martin (1993-96) and an assistant coach two seasons at Temple (1997-98).

A 1989 Georgia Tech graduate, he lettered twice (1987-88) at free safety and punt returner for legendary head coach Bobby Ross. Prior to becoming a Yellow Jacket, MacIntyre played two seasons (1984-85) at Vanderbilt for his father, George, the head coach of the Commodores from 1979-85.

MacIntyre earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Georgia Tech and his master's in education with an emphasis on sports management from Georgia in 1991.

MacIntyre and his wife, Trisha, have three children: Jennifer, Jay and Jonston.
