KICKING OFF CONFERENCE USA PLAY

- FIU and Delaware meet for the first-ever time in what will double as the Blue Hens' **first-ever CUSA game**.
- FIU is looking for its **second-straight win** in a Conference USA Opener after defeating Louisiana Tech last season, 17-10, on Saturday, Sept. 28, 2024.
- **Willie Simmons** played against Delaware as quarterback for the Citadel on Sept. 6, 2003 in Newark. Simmons completed 14 passes for 194 yards in a 41-7 defeat.
- Both FIU and Delaware are entering the matchup following big victories, over Fla. Atlantic and UConn, respectively, and are **receiving votes** in this week's HeroSports Group of Five Top 25 poll.
- The contest will feature FIU's **Biscayne Blue** jerseys as part of its Noche Latina in conjunction with the start of Hispanic Heritage Month. This game will also be the Panthers' annual Family Weekend.

// KEY STORYLINES

- Quarterback **Keyone Jenkins** is in his third full season as QB1 for the Panthers, set to make his 27th career start at FIU [more on p. # 10]. Jenkins now sits **third all-time** in passing yards with 5,469 career passing yards.
- Jenkins sits tied-fourth in **school history** with 34 passing touchdowns for his career.
- Kick returner/wide receiver **C'Quan Jnوپierre** returns after being one of the nation's top kick returners in 2024. Jnوپierre was named All-CUSA Second Team in 2024 and was the 2025 Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year. His average of 28.3 yards per return ranked third in all of FBS last season.
- FIU enters 2025 in search of its first winning season since **2018**, when the Panthers went 9-4 and won the Bahamas Bowl, 35-32, over Toledo.
- Of the Panthers' eight losses in 2024, **six** came by 10 points or less and **five** were within seven points.
- The Panthers bring in **25** transfer athletes onto the 2025 roster. 15 of those appear on the week four depth chart, **nine** on offense, **three** on defense and **three** on special teams.
- FIU defeated Florida Atlantic 38-28 in the **Shula Bowl** last Saturday, its first win over its rivals from Boca Raton since 2016.
- **Kejon Owens** is currently ninth in the nation in rushing yards and second in both rushing yards and all-purpose yards in CUSA. Owens also is tied for the conference lead with four total touchdowns.

// DELAWARE NOTES

■ Delaware is in its first season as a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) program after enjoying success at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level.

■ The Blue Hens enter this matchup following a dramatic, overtime 44-41 victory over UConn (FIU's next opponent) at home on Saturday. The win marked the first FBS victory for Delaware as an FBS program.

■ Delaware quarterback Nick Minicucci has nine total touchdowns, five through the air and four on the ground, of which is the second-most combined for any CUSA QB.

■ Minicucci's dual-threat nature is apparent as he has 34 rushing attempts, two more than starting running back Jo Silver.

■ Delaware's Jake Thaw (88.5 YPG) and Kyre Duplessis (87.7 YPG) are the top two receivers in CUSA in yards per game.

■ Blue Hen running back Jo Silver (8.1 YPC) has the second-best yards per carry in CUSA.

■ Delaware won an FCS National Championship in 2003 under head coach K.C. Keeler. Keeler has ties to CUSA as he went on to be the head coach at Sam Houston from 2014-24 before being hired at Temple.

PANTHER NOTES

// MR. 305

■ South Dade Kia Field at Pitbull Stadium is the first of its kind, the world's first-ever athletics venue with an artist possessing the naming rights. Debuting in 2024, Pitbull signed a 10-year agreement, of which is worth \$1.2 million per year, to attach his name to FIU's football stadium.

■ Pitbull, otherwise known as Armando Perez, has strong ties to FIU and the City of Miami, with Miami being his hometown and FIU being Miami's only Division-I public institution. This unrivaled collaboration includes multifaceted marketing and promotional opportunities between Pitbull and FIU. Pitbull and his enterprise will be the official game sponsor of the VICE Night game on Oct. 21 as the Panthers take on Kennesaw State.

// BRIGHT LIGHTS ON LYGHTZ OUT

■ FIU's QB1 Keyone Jenkins, otherwise known as 'Lyghtz Out', has the spotlight firmly on him headed into his junior season, his third as the FIU starting quarterback.

■ Jenkins has received a multitude of national recognition during the 2025 preseason, most notably being selected as the Conference USA (CUSA) Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. The junior quarterback also was tabbed to the following national watchlists: Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award.

■ He also earned a selection as a Group of Five Preseason All-American from Hero Sports and Preseason All-Conference Status from both Phil Steele and Athlon Sports. The Opa-Locka, Fla.-native and Miami Central prep also continues to climb the overall career charts at FIU, sitting sixth in career passing yards (4,971) and overall completions (382) and fifth in passing touchdowns (33).

// BACK IN THE DEN

■ FIU brought back several players and coaches for 2025 that have prior experience at FIU.

■ Safety Demetrius Hill earned Freshman All-America status for the Panthers in 2022 before spending the following two seasons at Illinois, but now the Miami Springs prep and 305 native has made his return home.

■ Offensive Lineman Julius Pierce returns to FIU as well following two seasons with CUSA-foe Middle Tennessee. Pierce, who appeared in 10 games as a Panther in 2021, can be expected to be a mainstay on the offensive line this season.

■ Coaches Frank Ponce and Edwin Pata also have made their way back to their '305' and FIU roots. Ponce started his collegiate coaching career as the Wide Receivers Coach at FIU from 2007-12. Pata both played for FIU and served as a Graduate Assistant Coach with the Panthers from 2010-13.

// OH, THE PLACES YOU'LL GO

■ FIU will be racking up the airline points in the 2025 with its overall round trip travel distance being the 20th-most miles traveled in all of FBS. The Panthers will travel approximately 11,914 miles this season with its longest trip being to UConn in Week Six, which covers a distance of 2,380 miles.

■ FIU also has three more 2,000+ miles trips, first when it travels to Penn State (2,298 miles) in Week Two. The Panthers will also trek over 2,000 miles to Springfield, Mo. to take on Missouri State (Week 10) and to Houston for its Sam Houston State tilt (Week 14).

// DEUCE ISLAND

■ Brian "Deuce" Blades II was graded as the 35th-best cornerback in the nation and second-best in CUSA by overall defense from Pro Football Focus (PFF) last season, receiving a rating of 82.1 for the 2024 season. Blades'

coverage grade of 83.2 was the 36th-best nationally and the third-best in CUSA.

■ Additionally, Blades' 824 snaps played in 2024 was the most among corners in CUSA (sixth-most overall) and 21st-most among corners in the nation (86th-most overall).

// ALL IN THE FAMU-LY

■ Coach Willie Simmons brought over many of the staffers, both coaching and personnel, whom which he had unprecedented success with during his time at Florida A&M.

■ The following staff members all spent time with Simmons at FAMU and were called on to reunite with 'Shotgun' here at FIU: LaTroy Johnson, Jelani Berassa, Ayeobele Randolph, Bryan Crawford, Kenneth Gilstrap, Ryan Smith, Donald Reed, TJ Demas, Joe Henry, Brooke Thomas.

// VICE, VICE BABY

■ FIU's VICE Uniforms have become a national phenomenon and the Panthers will debut another edition of them here in 2025, of which will be worn for FIU's matchup with Kennesaw State on Oct. 21. The Panthers and Owls will play in a nationally-televised contest on ESPN2.

■ The VICE campaign has received recognition from many national outlets including ESPN and UniSwag with each edition of the jersey being voted on as one of CFB's best in both 2023 and 2024. The VICE initiative easily exceeded one million impressions each of the past two seasons when the jersey was revealed. The VICE Uniforms will also be featured on display at the College Football Hall of Fame for its annual Fan Fest.

// SHOTGUN. SET. HIKE.

■ Coach Simmons earned the nickname 'Shotgun' for his strong arm and quick release as a player during his high-school days in Quincy, Fla. Simmons was a high-school All-American QB at James A. Shanks High School before earning a scholarship to Clemson University. He was the 10th-ranked quarterback overall in his recruiting class and led James A. Shanks to its first district title in 22 years as a prep

// FLAWDA BOYZ

■ FIU has 80 total players on its roster who were born in the Sunshine State.

■ 21 of those players call Miami their hometown.

// TAKE IT TO THE CRIB!

■ Brian Blades II was one of just eight players in CUSA to have a pick-six last season, returning an interception for a 21-yard touchdown against Central Michigan in the inaugural game at Pitbull Stadium on Sept. 7, 2024.

// SUNSHINE STATE OF MIND

■ The Panthers have several members of the coaching staff that have roots and ties to both Florida and, more specifically, Miami. Head Coach Willie Simmons hails from the Tallahassee-area and was a standout for Gadsden County during his high school playing days before receiving a scholarship to play quarterback at Clemson University.

■ Assistants Frank Ponce, Jelani Berassa, Anthony Gaitor, Benedick Hyppolite and Edwin Pata are all natives of the Magic City. They attended and coached at the following Miami-area high schools: Ponce - Miami Senior, Coral Gables (Coach), Miami Northwestern (Coach), Miami Central (Coach), Miami Killian (Coach), Gaitor - Miami Northwestern, Jelani Berassa - Miami Killian, Benedick Hyppolite - Booker T. Washington, Edwin Pata - North Miami

PANTHER NOTES

// THE TRANSFER PORTAL

■ FIU's activity in the transfer portal was well-documented as Simmons and his staff continued to rebuild this roster.

■ In total, the Panthers welcomed 25 new players from the transfer portal between the winter / spring signing periods.

// HIT THE QUAN!

■ C'Quan Jnopierre burst onto the scene last season, after transferring from NAIA-school St. Thomas, and made an immediate impact in the return game. Jnopierre had 15 returns of 30-plus yards in 2024 and finished sixth in the country in yards per return (28.3) and 11th-overall in kickoff return yards.

// NEW LEADER OF THE OFFENSE

■ Nick Coleman arrived to FIU upon the hiring of Willie Simmons this Winter and will take over the reigns as the Panthers' Offensive Coordinator. Prior to FIU, Coleman was highly-successful as the quarterback coach at UAB, guiding Blazer quarterback Jacob Zeno to the most prolific single season by a UAB QB in school history. Zeno set the school records for single-season completions (279) and completion percentage (73.6) while passing for 3,126 total yards.

// STERLIN'S HEART OF GOLD

■ Redshirt-freshman safety Shamir Sterlin is making a major impact off the field as FIU's nominee for the AllState AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Award. Sterlin has worked with several charitable organizations (E.N.D. IT, Grace Way Village, Pick Up for Cancer, Inc.) in an effort to help those in the community.

// NEW FACES, NEW PLACES

■ Of the Panthers' six road contests, two of them will be played in stadiums that are brand new to FIU Football. The Panthers will play their first-ever games in Missouri State's Robert W. Plaster Stadium and Sam Houston's temporary home, Shell Energy Stadium, the home of the Houston Dynamo.

// HUSTLING ON AND OFF THE FIELD

■ FIU has several players with intriguing businesses/interests off of the football field. Linebacker Orlando Syph-Timmons cuts hair in his spare time and has been known to provide 'cuts' for a good number of players on the FIU team. Follow/check out his page on Instagram ([landothebarber](#)) for more details and to book an appointment.

■ Longsnapper Trent Sims, known as RedShnappa on Instagram, produces and makes his own music, recently dropping his first single "Never Cared" on July 13th, which is available on all streaming platforms.

■ Running back Anthony Carrie has a highly-successful active wear clothing brand (SWIFT6IX on IG and [SWIFT6IX.com](#)). Carrie's brand has over 7.5k followers on Instagram and just debuted its Vice Summer Collection.

// BEST IN STATE

■ FIU and Pitbull Stadium are the proud hosts of the Florida High School State Championships. At the 2024 State Championships, the Panthers had the following incoming players that participated in the event at their home facility: Matthew Pointer (Chaminade Madonna), Anthony Smith (Chaminade Madonna), Samson Chazulle (St. Thomas Aquinas), Matias Garcia (St. Thomas Aquinas), King Massey (Raines).

// TACKLING MACHINE

■ Percy Courtney Jr. returns and will play a key factor for FIU in its linebacking corps for 2025. Courtney was the 12th-best linebacker in CUSA, as rated by PFF, in 2024

and had an overall defensive grade of 71.4. Courtney's tackling grade of 88.0 was the best in all of CUSA and his coverage grade of 74.9 was the fifth-best in the league.

// HOME COOKIN'

■ FIU enjoyed its first winning season at home since 2019 in 2024, posting a 4-2 record inside the newly-minted Pitbull Stadium. Additionally, FIU's two home defeats came by a combined six points while all four home victories were by seven points or more.

// ROCKET POWER

■ Quarterback Keyone Jenkins won three-straight State Championships with the Rockets of Miami Central from 2020-22. Running back Kejon Owens and newcomer Jeremy Smith also hail from Miami Central. Central boasts a distinguished class of alumni that went on to have strong NFL careers such as Antonio Brown, Willis McGahee, Devonta Freeman, James and Dalvin Cook along with many others.

// FAMILY TIES

■ Brian Blades II comes from an accomplished football family, highlighted by his father, Al Blades, a wide receiver for the University of Miami (Class of '88) and the Seattle Seahawks from 1988-98.

■ Blades Sr. was a two-time National Champion with the Hurricanes in 1983 and 1987 and earned Second Team NFL All-Pro Status and a Pro Bowl selection with the Seahawks in 1989.

■ Blades' Uncles, Al and Bennie, were also NFL players following their graduation from UM. Al played for the 49ers in 2001 and 2002. Bennie was the winner of the Jim Thorpe Award in 1987 and was inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame in 2006. Bennie was also a three-time Second Team All-Pro and was named to the Detroit Lions' 75th Anniversary and All-Time Teams.

// KJ1K

■ FIU Running Back Kejon Owens eclipsed 1,000 yards for his career in FIU's matchup at Penn State. Owens was the team's leading rusher in 2024, amassing 392 yards in 11 games, an average of 4.3 yards per carry. Owens currently has 1,077 career yards and was the Panthers' second leading rusher with a season-high 453 yards on the ground in 2023. Additionally, Owens has scored five rushing touchdowns in back-to-back seasons for FIU, of which led the team among running backs in both 2023 and 2024.

// WINNING ON THE RECRUITING TRAIL

■ FIU currently has the second-ranked recruiting class for 2026, according to 247 Sports, among all CUSA schools with 20 players verbally committed for next season.

// F IS FOR...

■ Coach Simmons prides himself on his philosophies and uses seven 'Fs' as the pillars for his program. The seven 'Fs' are as follows: Faith, Fundamentals, Fast, Fight, Finish, Fun and Family.

// INSIDE THE TOP-10

■ As a collective University, it was recently announced that FIU was ranked 8th in the nation by Washington Monthly and first in Florida -- based on access, affordability, outcomes and service.

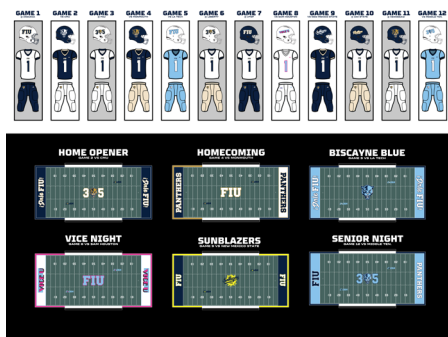


// STUDENT-ATHLETE

■ Head Coach Willie Simmons, who grew up with an educational background as his mother was a teacher, completed his undergraduate degree at Clemson in just three years. At the time, he was the fastest-ever football student-athlete to graduate from Clemson.

// SO FRESH AND SO CLEAN

■ FIU is the country's only program that will be featuring a different uniform combination every week and different field designs for all home games. See below for an example of the 2024 season. The Panthers will be unveiling the weekly uniform combos and field designs on their social media during the 2025 season.



// LEAGUE THEM!

■ Several of FIU's assistant coaches were invited to take part in the National Football League's (NFL) Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship this Spring/Summer.

■ Kenechi Udeze worked with the defending-Super Bowl Champion Philadelphia Eagles. Anthony Gaitor stayed in the Sunshine State and assisted with the Jacksonville Jaguars. Edwin Pata received an opportunity to work with the hometown team, the Miami Dolphins.

■ Both Udeze and Gaitor are NFL alums as Udeze played for the Minnesota Vikings (2004-08) and Gaitor played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2011-13).

// RATTLER RUMBLE

■ Coach Willie Simmons was able to snag some of his former players from Florida A&M after his hiring, reuniting with Johnny Chaney Jr. and Trey Wilhoit back in the Sunshine State.

■ Chaney made a pit-stop for one year with Coach Deion Sanders at Colorado in 2024 before joining FIU while Wilhoit chose to spend his final season back with his old coach, this time in the '305'.

// LEAGUE ON NOTICE

■ The Panthers had five players recognized on the 2025 Conference USA Preseason Watchlist. Offensively, Quarterback Keyone Jenkins and Offensive Lineman Jaheim Buchanon earned nods. Defensively, Brian Blades II and Kenton Simmons were tabbed to the list. On Special Teams, Kick Return ace C'Quan Inopierre appeared as one of the league's best.

// GET OFF THE FIELD!

■ FIU ranked first in CUSA and 20th-nationally in third down defense last season, allowing opponents to convert on just 31.3 percent of third down opportunities.

// NO FLY ZONE

■ FIU allowed just 184.0 yards per game through the air last season, of which was the best in CUSA and 26th-best nationally.

// SPECIAL TEAMS, SPECIAL PLAYERS

■ FIU blocked three kicks in 2024, the fifth-most nationally and the most in CUSA.

// AIRING IT OUT

■ FIU's single-season receiving yards record has been broken in three of the past four seasons (2021, 2023, 2024). Tyrese Chambers eclipsed T.Y. Hilton's school record 1,038 yards with 1,074 yards in 2021. Kris Mitchell then set a new benchmark in 2023 with 1,118 yards during Keyone Jenkins' first season as the starting quarterback. Eric Rivers then topped that mark in 2024, again with Jenkins as his counterpart, finishing the season with 1,172 yards.

// WINNIN' WILLIE

■ In Willie Simmons eight years as a head coach (Prairie View A&M, Florida A&M), he has coached his team to a winning record each season.

■ Additionally, Simmons has been able to make an instant impact in Year One. Simmons took over a Prairie View team that went 5-5 in 2014 to an 8-2 record in 2015. At Florida A&M, the Rattlers went 2-9 in 2017 before Simmons led them to a 6-5 record in 2018 and 5-2 mark in conference play.

// PRO PANTHERS

■ FIU has a total of 13 NFL alumni that have played for the program since its inception in 2002. Nine players were selected in the NFL Draft, highlighted by Jonathan Cyprien, who was picked 33rd overall in 2013.

■ Currently, the Panthers have three active players in the NFL: Maurice Alexander (Chicago Bears), Jonnu Smith (Pittsburgh Steelers), Tear Tart (Los Angeles Chargers).

// GOING BOWLING

■ FIU alumni Jonnu Smith, who racked up 884 receiving yards and eight TDs for the Miami Dolphins, was recognized as one of the NFL's best tight ends last season and selected for the Pro Bowl.

■ Smith joined T.Y. Hilton as the second-ever FIU Football alumni to make the Pro Bowl.

// HALL OF FAMER

■ T.Y. Hilton was announced as the first-ever FIU Football player to be inducted into the FIU Athletics Hall of Fame and was enshrined in a ceremony on campus on Sept. 12. Hilton and the other members of the Class of 2025 will also be honored on-field during the football game against Florida Atlantic on Sept. 13.

// HOLLYWOOD PRODUCTION

■ FIU's creative media team have published multiple series this off-season chronicling the FIU Football Program and its coaches/student-athletes.

■ Beyond the Whistle is a short-form series which features an inside look at each assistant coaches journey with both first-hand accounts from the staff and student-athletes inside the program. Each are featured in the coaches' bio on fhusports.com and can also be accessed via fhusports.com/watch and FIU Athletics Youtube and FIU Football's Social Media.

■ Uncaged is a series that debuted with the hiring of Coach Willie Simmons and gives fans exclusive access, in a 'Hard Knocks' type of style, to all things this offseason and the buildup to the 2025 campaign. // THE SOCIAL NETWORK

■ FIU has made waves in the creative content space with innovative content and progressive strategy with both the Football and Athletics' accounts since the establishment of the Creative Content team in 2022.

■ FIU's Football Instagram page experienced an increase of 15.2% followers from January 2025 to June 2025, of which is the second-biggest increase by percentage in the nation during that time period.

■ Overall, FIU's Football account on Instagram was 10th-nationally of 134 FBS Programs in follower growth during 2024-25. The account has also experienced 159% increase and growth in followers since 2022 and now has over 43k followers.

■ FIU's growth rate of 52.7% is far and away the top of any Florida FBS school surpassing FAU, USF, Miami, UCF, Florida and Florida State by a wide margin.

// ATTENDANCE NOTES

■ The Panthers played in front of the home crowd six times in 2024.

■ FIU's two crowds of 17,000+ were the first time eclipsing that mark in back-to-back home games in school history.

■ Through the six home games last season, the Panthers averaged 12,814 fans per game.

■ FIU's first two home games of the season featured nearly 18,000 fans at each game.

// 24TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

■ The 2025 season marks the 24th season for the Panthers, 22 of which have come at the NCAA Division I FBS level. FIU competed in the FCS for its first two years as a program.

■ With the program starting in 2002, the 2026 campaign will mark FIU's Silver Anniversary of Football, marking its 25th overall season.

■ FIU competed in the Sun Belt Conference from 2005-12 before joining Conference USA in 2013.

■ The Panthers won the 2010 Sun Belt Conference title under Mario Cristobal, finishing the season 7-6, but 6-2 in conference play. FIU went on to play in its first bowl game that season, the Little Caesar's Bowl, where FIU defeated Toledo, 34-32.

// POSTSEASON POTENTIAL

■ In the case that would FIU would earn bowl-eligible status, the following bowls are officially partnered with Conference USA and could be a potential destination for the Panthers: Bahamas Bowl, Frisco Bowl, Hawaii Bowl, and the R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

// JOHNNY 'CHAINSaw' CHANEY

■ Johnny Chaney Jr. is currently the eighth-ranked linebacker in the nation by PFF in total defense. Chaney Jr. has 17 total tackles in his two games as a Panther, including two tackles for loss and one sack.

// TOUGH COMPETITION

■ FIU has six teams on the schedule in 2025 that earned bowl game berths in 2024, highlighted by second-ranked Penn State, which qualified for the College Football Playoff (CFP) and advanced to the semifinal round.

// MORE NOTES TO COME!

// BETHUNE-COOKMAN (G1) (FIU def. BCU, 42-9)

■ This is the first time that FIU didn't surrender a touchdown in a game since a 44-0 win over UMass on Oct. 5, 2019.

■ A school record 13 different receivers caught passes for FIU.

■ The win is FIU's first season-opening win since a 38-37 win over Bryant on Sept. 1, 2022.

■ The win marks Willie Simmons first victory as an FIU head coach.

■ Six rushing touchdowns ties the school record from Dec. 2, 2017 vs. UMass.

■ The Panthers won a game with zero passing touchdowns for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 vs. New Hampshire.

■ Keyone Jenkins had two rushing touchdowns, his first-ever career game with multiple touchdowns on the ground.

// PENN STATE (G2) (PSU def. FIU, 34-0)

■ Kejon Owens eclipsed 1,000 career yards with a two-yard rush on the opening drive of the game.

■ Keyone Jenkins moved into fourth all-time in passing yards at FIU, passing Paul McCall (5,189), and now has 5,285 career passing yards.

■ Jenkins' interception was his first of the season and his first since Nov. 23, 2024 at Kennesaw State.

■ Johnny Chaney Jr. racked up nine tackles to lead the defense, his second-straight game with eight or more stops.

// FLORIDA ATLANTIC (G3) (FIU def. FAU, 38-28)

■ FIU claimed the Shula Bowl Trophy, its first victory since 2016 in the annual rivalry matchup with Fla. Atlantic.

■ Keyone Jenkins moved into third all-time in passing yardage, passing James Morgan (5,375) with a two-yard pass in the second half.

■ Jenkins threw for one passing touchdown, FIU's first passing score of the season, moving him into fourth all-time in passing touchdowns at FIU.

■ FIU's defense allowed just seven points in the second half after allowing 21 points in the first two quarters.

■ FIU now has won five Shula Bowls at home.

■ The Panthers had 10 plays (including Special Teams) of 20+ yards.

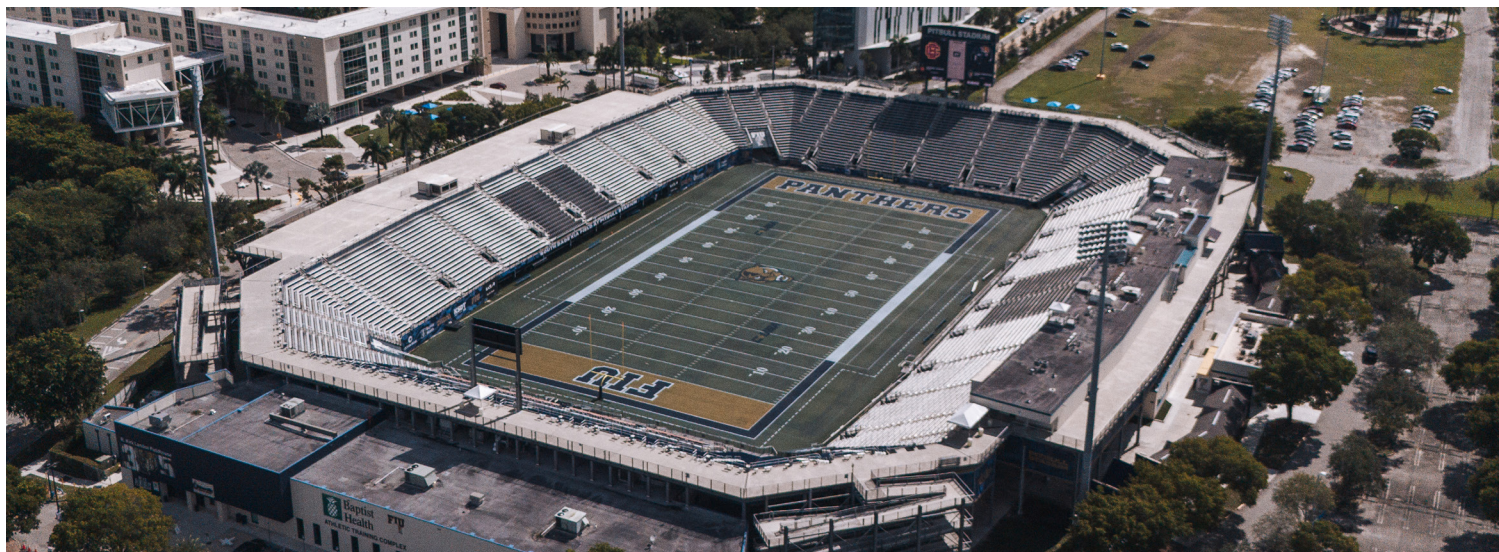

SOUTH DADE KIA FIELD AT PITBULL STADIUM

FIU Community Stadium was the first dedicated sports facility at the school, replacing Tamiami Field. Construction officially began on July 24, 1994, and the facility opened on Sept. 24, 1995, as a 7,500-seat football and track stadium.

It was built as a joint venture between FIU, Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Miami-Dade Parks and the Miami-Dade County Youth Fair. In anticipation of the inaugural FIU Football season in fall 2002, FIU placed movable bleachers around the stadium in 2001, which increased the stadium's capacity to 17,000 seats.

In 2007, FIU announced a major expansion and redesign for FIU Stadium. For the first phase of the expansion, the school demolished a large portion of the original 1995 stadium. The west, south and east sides of FIU Stadium were taken down and construction began on the new, permanent stadium. The expansion was completed in September 2008 for the 2008 football season. Phase one increased the stadium's capacity from 17,000 fans to 18,000, including 1,500 club seats.

In 2009, FIU began the second phase of the stadium expansion, which included the construction of a new football field house. Renovations were completed in 2012 and the capacity increased to 20,000 seats.

// SOUTH DADE KIA FIELD AT PITBULL STADIUM NAMING RIGHTS

Florida International University (FIU) Athletics announced a groundbreaking partnership on August 5, 2024 with international superstar and entrepreneur Armando Christian Pérez, better known as Pitbull.

The 10-year agreement will see FIU Stadium rebranded as Pitbull Stadium, making it the world's first-ever athletics venue with an artist possessing the naming rights.

Pitbull kicked off his music career in the South Florida rap scene. Since his debut in 2004, he has skyrocketed to global stardom, becoming one of the most successful recording artists worldwide. His hits like "I Know You Want Me (Calle Ocho)" and the RIAA Diamond Certified "Give Me Everything" have dominated charts and united fans across the globe.

The unrivaled collaboration includes multi-faceted marketing and promotional opportunities between Pitbull, a Miami native, and FIU – the only public Division-I institution in Miami.

Van Wagner College, FIU Athletics' 3rd-party multimedia rights partner since 2016, assisted with the collaboration. Their efforts also helped attract additional partners to further enhance the partnership, including South Dade Kia which will be the presenting sponsor of the field: South Dade Kia Field at Pitbull Stadium.

HEAD COACH WILLIE SIMMONS

Willie Simmons was named as the seventh head coach in the history of the FIU Football Program on Saturday, Dec. 7, 2024.

Simmons, spent the 2024 season as an assistant coach overseeing the running backs at Duke, helping guide the ACC member to a 9-3 record. Prior to that, the Florida native transformed the Florida A&M program, serving six years (2018-23) as head coach of the Rattlers, compiling a 45-13 (.776) overall record and a 34-5 (.872) mark in Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) and Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) play.

Additionally, Simmons – a former starting quarterback at Clemson – led the Rattlers to two HBCU National Championships (2019, 2023) and their first SWAC Championship and Celebration Bowl title in 2023.

Before his tenure at Florida A&M, Simmons spent three seasons (2015-17) as the head coach at Prairie View A&M where he accumulated a 21-11 overall record (.656) and a 19-6 showing (.760) in SWAC play. He held a winning record in all three seasons, making him the first Panthers head coach in more than 55 years to achieve that feat.

At both FAMU and PVAMU, Simmons turned around programs en route to his career 66-24 record (.733). In the three seasons prior to Simmons' arrival at Prairie View A&M, the Panthers went 14-19 (.424); in Simmons' three seasons in Prairie View, Texas, they went 22-11 (.667). In five seasons prior to Simmons' arrival at Florida A&M, the Rattlers went 14-43 (.246) on the field; in Simmons' five seasons (FAMU did not play in COVID-impacted 2020) in Tallahassee, they went 45-13 (.776).

Simmons received consecutive AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year honors (2022 & 2023) and was tabbed the 2023 SWAC Coach of the Year. Florida A&M finished with four-straight top-25 rankings, including 2023 when they posted a No. 5 rank in the final FCS poll, to register their highest national ranking since 1998 and their first ten-win season since 1999.

During his tenure, Simmons mentored numerous players to All-MEAC and All-SWAC honors, including quarterback Ryan Stanley, who finished his career at FAMU as the school's all-time leader in passing yards (8,424), pass attempts (1,187), pass completions (636) and passing touchdowns (67). Additionally, Stanley graduated second all-time in MEAC history for passing yards and pass completions and was named the 2019 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year.

Additionally under Simmons, linebacker Isaiah Land earned the 2021 Buck Buchanan Award Winner, which is given annually to the FCS National Defensive Player of the Year. Land, the 2021 SWAC Defensive Player of the Year, led the nation in sacks (19) and tackles for loss (25.5) en route to an All-America caliber season. He later signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys in May 2023.

In 2023, Simmons guided four players to All-America nods, including the SWAC Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Isaiah Major. The Oklahoma City, Okla., native finished 2023 with a team-best 106 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss, while also adding two sacks, two interceptions, three pass breakups, five quarterback pressures, one fumble recovery, and a pick-six. On the offensive side of the ball, quarterback Jeremy Moussa was selected the 2023 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year after completing 214-of-371 pass attempts (.577) for 2,893 yards with 22 touchdowns against 10 interceptions.

In 2023, the Rattlers ranked in the top-20 nationally in 17 categories – first in pass efficiency defense (102.48), second in third down defense (.282) and total defense (260.80), third in scoring defense (15.2) and tackles for loss (7.8), fourth in defensive touchdowns (4), passes intercepted (17) and rushing defense (94.0), eighth in passing yards allowed (166.80), ninth in red zone defense (.714), 10th in turnovers gained (24) and sacks (2.85), 12th in first down offense (265), 16th in punt returns (14.04) 18th in time of possession (31:49), 19th in passing yards per completion (13.49) and 20th in sacks allowed (1.31). Additionally, FAMU ended the year with 11 consecutive wins, including a 35-14 victory over Prairie View A&M University in the SWAC Championship and a 30-26 win over Howard University in Celebration Bowl.

Prior to his tenure at Florida A&M, Simmons spent three seasons (2015-17) as the head coach at Prairie View A&M where he compiled a 21-11 overall record (.656) and a 19-6 mark (.760) in SWAC play.

From 2007-2011, Simmons served five years on staff at Middle Tennessee State in a variety of different roles. He began his tenure with the Blue Raiders as the running backs coach from 2007-09 before being promoted to the pass game coordinator and running backs coach in 2010. He spent his final season in 2011 as the offensive coordinator and running backs coach.

During his lone season as offensive coordinator, the Blue Raiders offense ranked 45th nationally in FBS with a mark of 401.08 yards per game. Simmons' offense led the Sun Belt in total offense, rushing offense (146.75) and third down conversion percentage (.401).

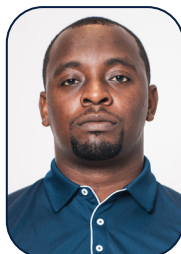

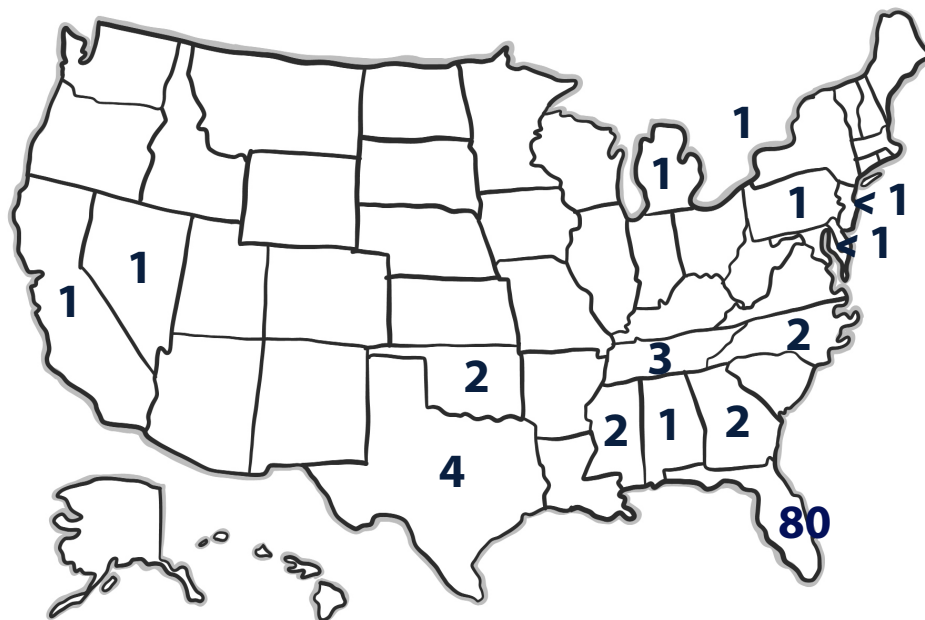
