COMMON CONNECTIONS

FIU SID **Tyler Gallo** is from Hockessin, Delaware and lived there until 2023. He also worked with Martin Ingelsby's staff when he worked for the Fightin' Blue Hens during the 2022-23 season.

AMONG THE BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Not only was **Corey Stephenson**'s effort of 34 at Middle Tennessee a career-high and the sixth-most points in a game in FIU history, but it was tied for the second most in a road game in program history as well, just behind Carlos Arroyo's record-setting 39 at North Texas on 12/30/00. The 13 field goals he made were also second-most in a game at FIU, and he was the first Panther to score 30 in a game since 2023. The last 34-point effort was by Elmo Stephen in 2017, and both Dwight Stewart (2/3/93 at UCF) and Ruben Colon (2/22/90 at U.S. International) also had 34 on the road.

MIDDLE OF NOWHERE

Using 34 from **Corey Stephenson**, the fourth-career double-double from **Eric Dibami** as well as two clutch free throws by **Brit Harris** to force overtime, FIU defeated MTSU in Murfreesboro for the first time in five years. It was also their first back-to-back road wins since 2019-20, and it was win #109 for **Jeremy Ballard**, making him the winningest coach in FIU men's basketball history.

NO MORE ROAD RAGE

FIU snapped multiple streaks in its nailbiting 71-68 win in Las Cruces - a five-game overall streak, a 17-game road losing streak (12/7/24 at Stetson) and 21-game CUSA road losing streak (3/4/23 at Rice). In addition, the Panthers earned their first-ever win at the Pan American Center in six tries, and swept the Aggies this season, winning for the first time all year when trailing with two minutes left and holding them to a conference opponent-low 34.7 FG%.

SHOOK THEM TO THE CORE-Y

Corey Stephenson's stat line of 25 points and 12 rebounds had not been achieved by a Panther on the road in nearly 16 years, joining J.C. Otero at FAU on Jan. 30, 2010. He also added two assists, blocks and steals, scoring FIU's last ten points of the game in the takedown of the Aggies.

LARRY LEGENDARY

Hamed Olayinka went for his third double-double of the season at UTEP, recording 19 points and a career-best 14 boards. No Panther has gone for 19 and 14 against a DI opponent since Adrian Diaz did it in 2016 against FAU, and none on the road since Osasumwen Osaghae had 15 at Marshall on 1/19/19.

VALIANT EFFORT

Result aside, FIU had some very strong performances on the road at Kennesaw State - notably, the 47th 20-point game of **Zawdie Jackson**'s career and the fourth double-double (15 points, 12 rebounds) by **Eric Dibami** in his career.

DOUBLE BUBBLE

A second-half surge over UTEP was aided by FIU's two bigs - **Eric Dibami** and **Hamed Olayinka**, who each had double-doubles in the win. They are the first Panthers duo to record double-doubles in the same game since Clevon Brown and Denver Jones did it on 12/11/21 at Eastern Michigan. Dibami recorded his third double-double in the last four games.

RINGIN' IN THE NEW YEAR

The first game of the 2026 calendar year was extremely kind to FIU, who earned their first victory over New Mexico State since the 2023-24 season and just the second in the series history. Five Panthers had 10 or more points for the fourth time this season - **Corey Stephenson** had 21, **Eric Dibami** had a double-double and **Ashton Williamson** added 14. FIU out-rebounded the Aggies 38-26 and shot 52.5 percent from the field in the win.

E FOR ERIC

After a week where he averaged a double-double of 16.5 ppg and 10.5 rpg, **Eric Dibami** was named CUSA Freshman of the Week. He had his first double-double of his career against Trinity College, followed with a career-high 21 and nine rebounds against Liberty in his CUSA debut. He was the first Panthers freshman with 21 and 9 in a game since Jerome Frink on 11/12/12, and first Freshman of the Week for the team since 2023.

FRESH FACES

In a game where eight scored 10 or more points, it was the freshmen that showed out for the Panthers in their win over Trinity. **Eric Dibami** had his first career double-double, the first freshman with 12 and 12 since Denver Jones in 2021, and **Thiago Sucatzky** had a career day with 15 points, six assists and three steals, the first freshman to do that since Arturo Dean in 2023. Also, **Aydan Clinton** made his season debut, knocking down a free throw and grabbing a rebound.

SHARK BAIT, HOO-HA-HA

Using 52 points in the paint, a 52.5% field goal percentage and 22 assists, FIU took down LIU in its final non-conference game against a D-I team. **Julian Mackey** had 22 points off the bench and **Eric Dibami** had 12 points and 7 rebounds.

THREES A CROWD

Dropping 11 of 16 three-pointers in the game against Jacksonville, FIU shot 68.8 percent from three, the highest mark in a game since they went 16-23 (.696) against UAB on 1/16/20. The last time they had a percentage that high on less than 20 attempts was 1/21/17, also against UAB, where the team shot 10-14 (.714) from three.

EVEN STEPHENSON

Corey Stephenson was named Conference USA Player of the Week for his performance in Week 5, averaging 16.0 ppg, 6.5 rpg and shooting 64.2 percent from the field. He has scored 14 or more points in all but one game this season, and was the first Panther to get CUSA POTW since Jawaun Hawkins did it at the end of 2023-24.

CAMEROON CRAZY

Against Jacksonville, **Eric Dibami** had quite the game, scoring a career-high 14 points while recording 5 rebounds, 5 steals and 3 blocks. He's the first Panther to reach all those in a game since at least 2004-05, first Panther freshman since Arturo Dean in 2022-23 to have 5 steals in a game and 8th since 2004-05 to have 3 or more blocks in a game, which he also did at Nebraska.

GULF COURSE MANAGEMENT

In a strong win over FGCU, who had won four of their last five, six different Panthers had ten or more points for the second time this season. It was **Zawdie Jackson's** 46th career 20-point game, and the Panthers' 30-35 mark from the line was the best this season by a wide margin after entering the day second to last in the country in FT%. Jackson went 10-11 from the line.

BRIT POP

In the thrilling win over Omaha, **Brit Harris** had a breakout night, scoring a season-high 24 points on 9-16 shooting, knocking down four threes. He was one off his career-high in points, which he did with Grand Valley State in 2023-24.

IM-MACK-ULATE

Against Fort Lauderdale, **Julian Mackey** tied the program record for free throw makes without a miss in a game, going 12-12. He's the third Panther to do that, joining Donte McGill (2016) and Fred Taylor (2011).

BALLARD BALL

Jeremy Ballard surpassed 100 career wins against Fort Lauderdale, becoming the second FIU coach to do so. He broke the all-time wins record of 108 on Feb. 4 at Middle Tennessee.

JU AND COREY TELL THE STORY

At LSU, **Corey Stephenson** (25) & **Julian Mackey** (24) became the first Panthers teammates to each have at least 24 points in a road game since 3/23/19, when Brian Beard Jr. & Devon Andrews each had 29 in an 87-81 win at Texas State.

COREY IN THE HOUSE

In the loss in Baton Rouge, **Corey Stephenson** became the first FIU player to have 25 points, 10 rebounds and 6 assists in a game since Ivan Almonte on 12/28/04 (25, 10 & 7 against Ohio). He's also the first Panther to lead the team in all those categories in a game this season.

FRESH PRINCE OF BEL ERIC

Freshman **Eric Dibami** had a breakout game at Nebraska, scoring 10 points, seven rebounds and swatting three blocks in the loss. He is the first FIU freshman to record such a stat line since Freddy Asprilla had 16, 11 & 3 against South Alabama on 12/20/08. In addition, he's just the fourth Panther freshman since 2004-05 to do so.

LIVIN' LIKE LARRY

Against Florida National, **Hamed "Larry" Olajuwon** had the greatest day of his career so far, scoring 25 points and adding 12 rebounds, four blocks and four steals. He's the eighth NCAA player since 2005-06 to record a stat line like that and first Panther since Taurance Johnson had 23, 12, four and three at North Texas on 1/10/02.

ACTION JACKSON

In his first game as a Panther, **Zawdie Jackson** couldn't have had a much better night, going 8-of-9 from the field and scoring 19 points. The last Panther to shoot 85 pct. or better, min. 9 attempts, was Petar Krivokapic in 2023 vs. Akron.

FEEL THE POWER

FIU played three Power Conference teams this season in non-conference, battling Nebraska, LSU and Miami. It's the first time they played three in one season since 2008-09, where the team played Washington, UCLA and Miami.

YOU MUST BE NEW HERE

The Panthers will play six different first-time opponents this season: Nebraska (Nov. 8), LSU (Nov. 13), Fort Lauderdale (Nov. 13) and Omaha (Nov. 26) in the non-conference & Missouri State (Jan. 10) and Delaware (Feb. 12) in CUSA play. It's their highest total of new opponents in a season since 2022-23, and first time having six or more since 2013-14, where they had nine.

Jeremy BALLARD

HEAD COACH | 8TH SEASON | COLGATE '03 | 109-136 RECORD

Jeremy Ballard was officially introduced as the ninth head coach in the history of the FIU men's basketball program on April 23, 2018, at a press conference in the Ocean Bank Convocation Center, and in his eighth season at the helm of the Panthers, Ballard has established a new culture of winning while also starting to re-write the program's record books. Ballard, who surpassed Rich Walker to become the winningest coach in school history, earned win #109 on Feb. 4, 2026.

He earned his 100th career win on Nov. 18, 2025 against Fort Lauderdale and became FIU's all-time Division I wins leader following a 74-59 win over LIU on Dec. 2, 2023.

During his first year on the sidelines at FIU, Ballard guided the Panthers to a 20-14 record and a 10-8 mark in Conference USA (C-USA) play. The team's 20 wins marked just the third time in school history that FIU logged 20-or-more victories and were tied for the second most in a single season, while the 10 C-USA wins was the most since joining the conference. In addition, the Panthers advanced to only their second postseason tournament in program history taking part in the Collegeinsider.com Tournament (CIT) and advancing to the second round. During the first round of the CIT, the Blue and Gold won their first-ever postseason tournament game with an 87-81 victory at Texas State.

As a team, the Panthers set several single-season school records, including points (2,798), rebounds (1,218), assists (491) and steals (359), led the nation in steals-per-game (10.6), turnover margin (5.6) and turnovers forced (19.6), and was second in total steals.

Because of the Panthers' efforts, Ballard was named a finalist for the Joe B. Hall National Coach of the Year Award, given to America's top first year head coach in Division I, and the Ben Jobe Award, presented to the top minority coach in Division I.

Ballard's winning ways continued during the 2019-20 season when the Panthers went 19-13 before the remainder of the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

During his second season at FIU, Ballard's squad finished with a 9-9 league record, earning the fifth seed for the program's highest ever seeding for the C-USA Tournament. During the conference tournament, the Panthers Took down Rice 85-76 for the programs second ever win during the conference tournament.

The FIU squad led the nation in blocked shots (210) and swats per contest (6.6) during the 2019-20 campaign. The team also ranked 11th in three-point defense (28.8) and total steals (280). The Panthers

8.8 steals per game ranked 13th nationally.

A pair of FIU players earned Conference USA Second Team Honors with Osasumwen Osaghae and Devon Andrews taking home the honors during Ballard's second season. Along with the award, Osaghae was named to the all-defensive team and earned FIU's first ever Conference USA superlative after being named the Defensive Player of the Year.

During the 2020-21 season, FIU went 9-17 overall and 2-15 against C-USA opponents. Ballard mentored a team that broke a pair of program records during the squad's dominant 111-34 victory over Carver. The Panthers' 34 assists and 20 made three-pointers were the new program records set. The previous mark for assists was set in 1990, while the last record from three was set at Cleveland State in 2019.

In 2021-22, the Panthers finished 15-17 and 5-13 in CUSA, matching up with Marshall in the opening round of the CUSA Tournament. Newcomer Denver Jones had a standout freshman campaign under Ballard's tutelage, averaging 12.5 ppg in his first year in blue and gold.

The 2022-23 season saw Ballard's Panthers finish with a 14-18 overall record and 8-12 record in CUSA play, an increase of three conference wins for the second-straight season. Following the season, Jones became the first Panther to notch First Team All-C-USA recognition in program history, becoming just the ninth first-team selection overall at FIU, while marking the program's first first-team selection since Tymell Murphy in 2013 (Sun Belt).

Ballard coached the Panthers to an 11-22 record and 5-11 mark in CUSA play during the 2023-24 season, highlighted by a first round victory at the CUSA Tournament over Jacksonville State, the program's first CUSA Tournament win since 2018. Following the season, Dean was named Third Team All-CUSA and to his second-consecutive All-Defensive Team while guard Javaunte Hawkins earned Honorable Mention status.

Ballard arrived at FIU after serving as associate head coach at VCU in 2017-18. He has spent 14 seasons as an assistant coach at the Division I level with coaching stints at Pitt, Illinois State, VCU, Tulsa and his alma mater Colgate.

His most successful stretch came with the Rams from 2012-15. Ballard helped lead VCU to a 79-28 mark and three straight NCAA Tournament appearances during his initial tenure in Richmond from 2012-15. During that time, VCU won at least 26 games each season and finished each season ranked in the Associated Press Top-25. In all,

Ballard coached three eventual NBA players at VCU, including Troy Daniels, Briante Weber and Treveon Graham.

Ballard served as an assistant on Kevin Stallings' Pitt staff during the 2016-17 season, where he coached All-ACC Third Team and USBWA All-District II forward Michael Young and All-ACC Honorable Mention selection Jamel Artis.

In 2015-16, Ballard helped guide Illinois State to an 18-14 overall record and a 12-6 Missouri Valley Conference mark, which tied for second place and signified ISU's highest league finish and most conference wins since 2007-08. Working primarily with Illinois State's forwards, Ballard helped MiKyle McIntosh earn MVC Most-Improved Team accolades. McIntosh was also a 2016 All-MVC Honorable Mention Team selection.

In 2014-15, Ballard helped VCU to its first Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament title. VCU was ranked as high as No. 10 in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll during that period, and on his watch, the Rams earned five all-conference accolades, including two first-team honors.

Ballard's three seasons on Smart's staff at VCU (2012-15) were preceded by five seasons at Tulsa (2007-12) where he helped guide the Golden Hurricane to 109 victories, including three 20-plus win seasons.

In his first season, Tulsa piled up 25 wins and a berth in the Conference USA championship game. The Golden Hurricane eventually won the inaugural College Basketball Invitational Championship and that postseason appearance was followed by back-to-back National Invitation Tournament showings.

Prior to his time with the Golden Hurricane, Ballard was an assistant at his alma mater Colgate University (2004-07). During his time as a student-athlete at Colgate, Ballard won the prestigious ECAC Merit Medal Award twice, becoming only the third player in Colgate history to do so. He twice earned Patriot League Academic Honor Roll recognition and was given the title of the team's best defensive player by the coaching staff during his senior season. Ballard also served as a captain during his senior season.

An Atlanta native, Ballard graduated from Colgate in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in English and a minor in religion. He has a son, Khalif Jamal.






