## The University

**F**ounded in 1970, Francis Marion University is one of South Carolina's 13 state-supported, coeducational universities. Classified by the Carnegie Foundation for Education as a comprehensive University, FMU takes pride in providing a strong liberal arts foundation in a broad range of undergraduate majors. The University also offers two professional schools in education and business. FMU offers a bachelor's degree program in nursing. At the graduate level, FMU offers programs in business, education and psychology. The School of Business offers the MBA with a concentration in health management. While 95 percent of its 3,700 students come from South Carolina, the University enrolls students from 31 states and 24 foreign countries, allowing students to experience the diversity of people from other cultures. FMU has an outstanding faculty of 216 professors – 173 who are full-time. Nearly 85 percent of full-time faculty members hold doctoral or terminal degrees from America's leading universities, and 60 percent of the faculty are tenured. The student-faculty ratio is 17 to 1, and classes are taught by professors, not graduate assistants. The average class size is 20.

FMU has the look and feel of a small, liberal arts college with all the benefits of a state-supported, comprehensive University. FMU offers an excellent learning environment, small enough to afford students personalized attention from faculty and staff, and large enough to let students expand their intellectual curiosities. The University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), and a number of its departments or programs are accredited by specialized accrediting agencies.

Located about seven miles east of Florence, the 400-acre campus is known for its beautiful foliage and landscaping. The campus features modern classroom buildings, laboratories and residence facilities to provide a safe, comfortable learning environment for students. These facilities are set amongst 100 acres of mixed pine-hardwood and bottomland forests accessed by a series of trails. Several acres have been set aside as an Arboretum that is being developed into a resource with many of the native species of the area.

### FMU Patriot Athletics.....

Francis Marion University is affiliated with the NCAA and is a member of the Division II Peach Belt Conference. The school sponsors six sports for men and six for women. The men's golf and women's soccer programs compete as NCAA Division I independents.

Men's Sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, and tennis.

Women's Sports: basketball, cross country, soccer, softball, tennis, and volleyball.



Over the past decade, 11 of the university's 12 sports have participated in post-season NCAA competition, including the golf team winning the 2003 Division II national championship, the men's basketball team reaching the 2004 Sweet Sixteen, and the baseball team advancing to the 2006 College World Series. The men's tennis team has earned 11 invitations to the NCAA Division II tournament over the past 13 years.

FMU is a two-time winner of the Commissioner's Cup, which signifies the best all-around athletic program in the Peach Belt Conference, one of the nation's premier Division II conferences. FMU's outstanding athletic program recruits athletes from South Carolina as well as the nation and world. Francis Marion regularly ranks among the conference leaders for placing student-athletes on the PBC Presidential Honor Roll, which requires a 3.0 grade point average for the academic year. Over the past decade, nearly all of the Patriot athletic squads have appeared in national poll rankings.

## *New faces abound as Patriot Men enter 2007-08 Campaign*

New faces abound as the Francis Marion University men's basketball squad readies itself for the 2007-08 campaign. Second-year head coach Gary Edwards welcomes back six lettermen, including two starters, from last year's 9-19 squad that tied for third in the PBC's North Division standings. But the roster also includes 10 newcomers, including five players who have played at the NCAA Division I level.

Leading the returnees is the starting backcourt of senior shooting guard Nate Morley (5.4 ppg) and sophomore point guard Cortne' Baker (6.4 ppg, 2.6 apg). Also returning is senior swing player Rodrick Burton (7.4 rpg, 4.6 rpg), who has started on and off during his career, and senior guard Larnelle Peterson (3.9 ppg). Altogether, the Patriots return only 24.4 ppg and 12.0 rpg from last season, so newcomers will also be counted on heavily.

"Last year, I thought it was important that we established a culture of hard work and discipline," Edwards said. "We did not have as much success on the court as I would have liked, but we were pouring a foundation. Sometimes you have to take a step backward to move forward with confidence and purpose. We are now ready to begin building earnestly on that foundation.

"We brought in 10 new players and each one, I believe, will bring a strength to our program that was not previously here. We brought in players who love to play and who have a desire to improve. We have more height, more strength, and more quickness, a good start right there. I also believe we have players who are unselfish and will make the necessary sacrifices for the good of the team and the program. When you are building a program, a coach needs these

types of players and young men, and I think we have found them.

"We have players who come from all walks of life and who have played at a variety of levels. We have our high school players and our junior college transfers and our Division I transfers. All of them have a story and all of them have strengths and weaknesses. It is our challenge to bring this diverse group together into



a cohesive unit. John Cheyney used to say a team was like a stew. 'You put in some potatoes and some carrots and some spices and you have to mix it all together to get a good stew.' So it is with our team.

"Players like 6-5 junior forwards Sam Smith and "Z" (Ziyadah Carter) will give us more athleticism and they will give us an ability to play above the rim. Guys like 6-10 Carter Stiglbauer and 6-7 Kevin Clark give us a wing-span around the basket. Junior guard Houston Power and sophomore Mike Laney bring an ability to shoot the ball from long-range. All of our newcomers and all of our returning players bring something to the table; they all bring something we can put in our stew.

"Lastly, our schedule is much im-

proved with 16 home games. Good programs play at home a lot and we want to be a good program. I am especially excited about the season-opening Zaxby's Peach Belt/Conference Carolinas Challenge."

The Patriots' 28-game schedule includes the 16 home games and a 20-game PBC slate.

FMU was picked to finish eighth in the preseason PBC coaches' poll.

The Patriots have outrebounded 92 of their last 141 opponents, and only 40 of FMU's last 140 opponents have shot above 46 percent from the floor. Coach Edwards is two victories shy of 400 wins for his career, and Francis Marion is eight wins shy of 500 in the program's history.



# FRANCIS MARION UNIVERSITY HEAD COACH



## **HEAD COACH - Gary Edwards**

Gary Edwards, a native of Virginia Beach, Va., enters his second season at the helm of the Patriot men's basketball program, and his 24th year as a college head coach needing only two wins to reach the 400 victory plateau.

His career coaching mark stands at 398-275 in 23 seasons,

including a 7-4 mark in NCAA Tournament games and an 8-1 mark when playing for a conference or regional championship.

Edwards, 49, took over the reigns of the Francis Marion University men's basketball program on April 26, 2006, replacing John Schweitz, and became the sixth head coach in the program's 38-year history.

He guided FMU to a 9-19 mark in 2006-07, and a third-place finish in the Peach Belt Conference's North Division.

Edwards came to Francis Marion after 10 seasons as head coach at NCAA Division II Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He guided the Indians to a 206-88 mark, including five 20-win campaigns, three Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, and four trips to the Division II national tournament. Under his guidance, IUP advanced to the Elite Eight twice (2000 and 2002) and participated in the 2002 Final Four. He left IUP as the winningest coach in that program's long history.

Edwards returned to South Carolina, where he still ranks

as the winningest coach at Division I Charleston Southern University. In nine seasons, he guided the Buccaneers to 121 wins (against 133 losses). His 1995 CSU squad won the Big South Conference title, and he twice earned Big South Conference "Coach of the Year" honors.

He also previously coached at Atlantic Christian College (now known as Barton College), compiling a 62-35 mark in three seasons and leading the Bulldogs to two NAIA national tournament appearances. Prior to his arrival, the Bulldogs had recorded only one winning season in the previous 17 years.

Edwards received a B.A. degree in English (magna cum laude) from Virginia Wesleyan College in 1979, where he was recognized as an academic All-American on the basketball court in 1979. He later earned a master's degree from Old Dominion University.

His coaching career began in 1979 as an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach at his alma mater, Virginia Wesleyan. He then served as an assistant coach at Hofstra University for two years before taking over the Barton program.

While coaching at IUP, he served as a weekly columnist for the *Indiana Gazette* in Indiana, Pa. He has been a coach at the Eastern Invitational Basketball Camp (2004-05) and the Portsmouth Invitational Tournament (1979-82), as well as a head coach in the Summer Professional League of Puerto Rico (1993-95). He served as director of the "Four Great Days of Summer" basketball camps (1987-96).

Edwards is married (Corinne) and has two teenage children: Grady (18) and Casey (17). He is the director of the Patriot summer basketball camps (team & individual).

## Jonathan Holmes

Jonathan Holmes, 27 of Bloomington, Ind., begins his second year as an assistant coach on the Patriot bench.

Holmes is a graduate of the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill. His primary responsibilities include recruiting, on-floor coaching, individual player workouts, pre- and post-season workouts, and helping

in the area of academic support for team members.

Holmes came to FMU after one year as an assistant at Montreat College, during which the Cavaliers compiled a 22-10 mark, won the Appalachian Athletic Conference regular-season and tournament titles, and reached the second round of the NAIA Division II national tournament.

He is a 2003 graduate of UNC, where he was a four-year member of the Tar Heel basketball squad. He played in 76 career games and recorded a nearly two-to-one assists to turnovers ratio. He appeared in the 2000 Final Four against the University of Florida and in the 2003 NIT post-season tournament. He was named to the 2003 ACC All-Academic Team.

After graduation, he played professional basketball for two seasons: 2003-04 with the Leicester (England) Riders and 2004-05 with the IC Horsens (Denmark) squad.

He has worked as a counselor at each of the past eight North Carolina Men's Basketball Camps, as well as at his own Jonathan Holmes Basketball Camp in Bloomington, which started in 2002.

He was co-valedictorian at Bloomington South High School, and was the runner-up for Indiana Mr. Basketball in 1999. He left as that school's all-time leader in points, assists, games started, and free throw percentage. He was also the recipient of the John Wooden Citizenship Award in 1999 and was named a Nike High School All-American in the summer of 1998.

Jarron Hinton begins his second season as an assistant coach at Francis Marion.

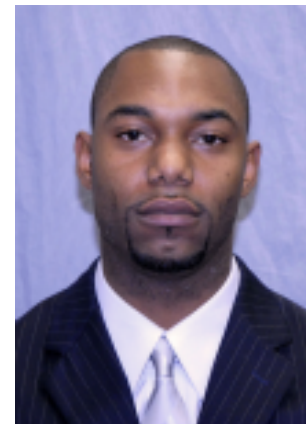
He played for the Patriots during the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. From the point guard spot, he averaged 7.1 points and 5.3 assists per game with a school-record 66 steals as a senior, while helping lead FMU to a 27-4 record

and an appearance in the round of Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA Division II National Tournament. His senior season assists total of 164 was the third-highest tally in the program's history.

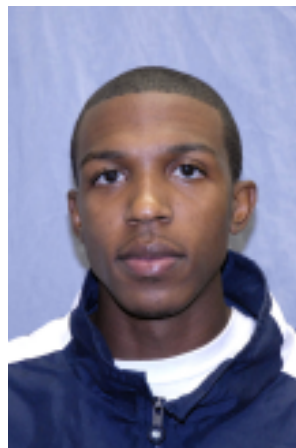
His two-year total of 309 assists stands fourth on the FMU career list, and he owned a career assists-to-turnovers ratio of 1.5. As a junior, he ranked 23rd in NCAA Division II in assists per game.

Prior to coming to Francis Marion, the Lima, Ohio, native played two seasons at Mercyhurst College.

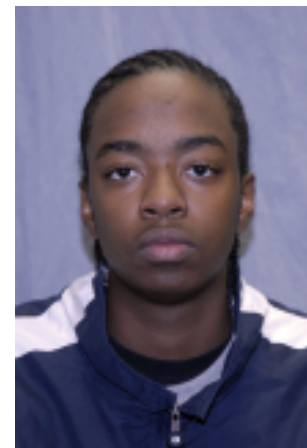

# PEACH BELT CONFERENCE

Francis Marion University is a member of the 11-school NCAA Division II Peach Belt Conference (formerly the Peach Belt Athletic Conference). Other PBC members include Armstrong Atlantic State University (in Savannah, Ga.), Augusta State University (Augusta, Ga.), Clayton State University (Morrow, Ga.), Columbus State University (Columbus, Ga.), Georgia College & State University (Milledgeville, Ga.), Georgia Southwestern State University (Americus, Ga.), Lander University (Greenwood, S.C.), UNC Pembroke, North Georgia College & State University (Dahlonega, Ga.), and USC Aiken.

Headquartered in Augusta, Ga., the PBC conducts championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. They are men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, baseball, softball and men's golf.

Since its inception, the Peach Belt Conference has worked tirelessly to become one of the elite conferences in NCAA Division II. Now entering its 17th season with 24 national championships and 24 national finalists, the PBC has accomplished that goal. Starting with only two championships in 1991, men's and women's basketball, the conference has expanded to 12 sports. The conference traces its roots back to November of 1988 when 11 schools first met in Greenville, S.C., to form a Division II conference. Following a second meeting on Dec. 3, 1989, five of those 11 schools, plus two others, formed the Peach Belt and began play in 1991. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January of 1990 and modified to Peach Belt Conference in May of 2000.

David Brunk was named the second PBC commissioner in May of 2007. Brunk replaced Marvin Vanover, who was the first PBC commissioner from 1991 to 2007. Diana Kling enters her second year as Director of Compliance for the conference and also serves as the Senior Woman Administrator. Ken Gerlinger enters his seventh year as the Director of Media Relations, while Dr. Dorothy Leland, president of Georgia College & State University, is the president of the Peach Belt for 2007-08.



The 2007-08 Peach Belt men's and women's basketball tournaments will be held March 5-9, 2008, in the new 3,468-seat Convocation Center on the campus of USC Aiken in Aiken, S.C.

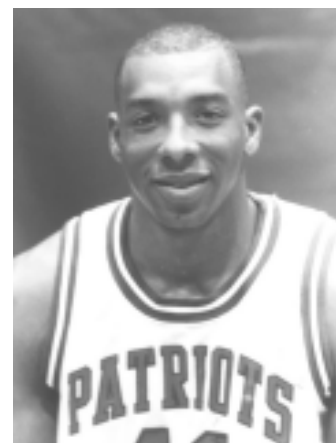

# FRANCIS MARION UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

Francis Marion University, founded in 1970, prides itself on providing a strong liberal arts education.

Named for Revolutionary War hero, General Francis Marion, who was nicknamed the “Swamp Fox” for using the South Carolina terrain to outfox the British, the University enrolls nearly 4,000 students. The University offers a broad range of undergraduate degrees and a select number of graduate programs in serving the needs of communities, businesses and industries of the Pee Dee region. Francis Marion is the only state university serving the Pee Dee region, and many of its students are the first in their families to go to college.



The campus features modern classroom buildings, laboratories and residence facilities to provide a safe, comfortable learning environment for students. The campus also features a number of recreational facilities that are available for use by students, faculty, staff and alumni, and for use in intramural and intercollegiate athletic competition.



Most buildings have been constructed or renovated since 1970. Facilities are equipped with ramps, and those of more than one story are equipped with elevators. Though each building has its own unique design, all are planned for architectural harmony.



The campus facilities include: Wallace House (President’s Home), J. Howard Stokes Administration Building (above photo), Office Services Building, Facilities Management/Campus Police Building, Walter Douglas Smith University Center, The Edward S. Ervin III Dining Hall, John K. Cauthen Educational Media Center, Founders Hall, Peter D. Hyman Fine Arts Center, Hugh K. Leatherman Sr. Science Facility (bottom right photo), Frank B. Lee Nursing Building (top left photo), Robert E. McNair Science Building, The Observatory, James A. Rogers Library, Thomas C. Stanton Academic Computer Center, The Grille (top right photo), and the BB&T/Amelia Wallace Faculty/Alumni Cottage.



On campus housing includes The Village, Residence Halls, Forest Villas Apartment Complex, Forest Villas Community Center, and the Allard A. Allston Housing Office Complex.

In addition to the Walter Douglas Smith University Center, which houses the gymnasium, raquetball courts, weightroom, and an olympic-sized swimming pool, other on campus athletic facilities include Clifford S. Cornell (baseball) Field, John Kassab (tennis) Courts, FMU Soccer Field, FMU Softball Field, a reslite eight-lane track, two natural grass intramural fields, an outdoor recreational field near the housing area, and an outdoor recreational pool.



## FMU CAMPUS HOUSING

Living on campus is a once in a lifetime experience, and campus life is the best way to fully immerse yourself into life as a college student.

FMU works hard to make sure the residence halls and apartments are an inviting and comfortable place to live and learn.

Francis Marion University offers a progressive residence life program, offering both residence halls and apartment buildings. Freshmen live in the residence halls. The new Forest Villas complex provides an additional housing option for upperclassmen. FMU campus life promotes academic success in a safe, attractive, modern and well-maintained environment. All facilities have air-conditioning, telephone, cable TV, and Internet connections. Each room is equipped with a smoke/fire detector.

Student Housing consists of the Forest Villas Apartments (top and bottom photos), Resident Halls, and the Village Apartments.

## FMU'S SMITH UNIVERSITY CENTER

### FMU'S SMITH UNIVERSITY CENTER

Named in honor of the university's first president, Dr. Walter D. Smith, the Smith University Center provides comprehensive facilities for student services and activities as well as for recreation and athletic programs to serve students, faculty, and staff. Opened in 1974, the center's gymnasium seats 3,027 for basketball and has recently undergone a renovation project. Improvements include a new hardwood floor, new scoreboards, a new lighting and sound system, and a new paint job.

The FMU men's basketball team owns a 255-165 (.607) record in the Smith University Center. The Patriot women have compiled a 353-103 (.774) mark in the building, including a 115-35 run in the past 150 games.

In addition to numerous sporting events, the building has hosted musical concerts, an appearance by Miss America 1994 Kimberly Aiken, U.S. Presidential candidates, and both college and high school commencement exercises. Francis Marion hosted the 1978 AIAW Division II National Women's Basketball Tournament, and in 1988, the U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team played an exhibition game against the Cuban National Team. In 1998 and 1999, FMU hosted the NCAA Division II women's basketball South Atlantic Regional Tournament.



## ELITE EIGHT CLUB

There are eight regions in NCAA Division II basketball. The champions of each region, known as the Elite Eight because they signify excellence in college basketball, advance to one site to compete for the national championship.

The Patriot men's program has begun the necessary steps to one day arrive at "Elite Eight" status. The purpose of the Elite Eight Club is to provide individuals and businesses the opportunity to support our men's basketball program in extraordinary ways. These elite supporters receive special benefits, including a recognition plaque in the men's basketball locker room, recognition in the men's basketball game program, Swamp Fox Club membership at the VP's Club level, an opportunity to meet scholarship recipients at an on-campus reception, and special Elite Eight apparel.

# FMU MEN'S BASKETBALL PROGRAM NOTES

- Bob Hogsett, a 6'8" 250-pound former NBA player was Francis Marion's first head coach
- Freshman forward David Riggins scored the Patriots' first points from the foul line with 16:37 left in the first half of the school's opening game, Nov. 20, 1970, against the College of Charleston in Charleston's Tip-Off Tournament. Riggins is currently the athletic director at Mars Hill College.
- Francis Marion's first victory was a 76-68 decision over the University of North Carolina at Wilmington freshmen squad, Dec. 7, 1970, in the Southside High School gym.
- Because Francis Marion lacked an on-campus gymnasium, the Patriots played their home games for the first four years in local high school gyms.
- Patriot forward Allen Floyd ranked second in the state among all collegiate players in scoring for both the 1971-72 (21.9 ppg) and 1972-73 (22.4 ppg) seasons. He finished his career as the school's career scoring (1,599) and rebounding (933) leader.
- The on-campus 3,027-seat Smith University Center opened in 1974 and the Patriots won their first official "home" game, a 93-56 victory over Coker College, Nov. 22, 1974.
- During the 1975-76 season, sophomore guard Bobby Shaw produced six consecutive 30-point games.
- On April 5, 1976, Lewis Hill took over the Patriot coaching reigns from Tim Watson.
- Jay McDermott, a 6'8" center, was the first Patriot to dunk the basketball after the shot was reintroduced to the college game in 1976.
- The 1977-78 campaign was a "season to remember" for Patriot fans with the team making its first-ever post-season appearance in the NAIA District Six playoffs and recording its first-ever winning record (20-8) and first-ever 20-win season.
- On Nov. 25, 1977, sophomore guard Tracy Oxendine scored the points that put Francis Marion into triples figures for the first time ever (a span of 169 games) in a 117-73 win over Averett College.
- On a snowy Jan. 14, 1978, Francis Marion recorded its first win over a perennial in-state "small college power," a wild 105-102 overtime victory over Newberry College. After regulation ended 80-80, the Patriots outscored the Indians 25-22 in OT.
- To open the 1979-80 season, Francis Marion won 13 of its first 14 games, including a 90-79 road victory over NCAA Division I Tennessee Tech University on Dec. 11, enroute to a program-best 24-7 record.
- Senior forward Robert Moore earned second-team All-America recognition and was named the NAIA District Six "Player of the Year" following the 1979-80 campaign. Moore is now the team doctor.
- Guard Cleveland Lawson became the first Patriot to score a three-point field goal, during an 88-76 loss to Georgia Tech on Jan. 26, 1983, in Atlanta, Ga.
- Between 1983 and 1988, the Patriots won at least 19 games each of the five seasons.
- During the 1983-84 season, Francis Marion finished ninth in the NAIA in team scoring defense (57.5 ppg) and defeated two NCAA Division I opponents: The Citadel and East Carolina University.
- The Patriots opened the 1985-86 campaign by winning their first eight games and 11 of their first 12, and were ranked as high as sixth in the nation (NAIA) in January of that year. Among the team's 22 wins (8 losses) was another victory over The Citadel (a team that listed on its roster a guard named Ed Conroy, who is now the head coach at Francis Marion).
- On Jan. 13, 1987, Francis Marion defeated Shaw University 122-108 in the highest scoring game in the program's history.
- In their next-to-last season as an NAIA member (1990-91), Francis Marion posted a 22-10 record and won its first-ever NAIA District Six championship, thus earning the right to advance to Kemper Arena in Kansas City, Mo., for the famed NAIA National Tournament.
- In 1992, Francis Marion moved from college to university status and from NAIA to full-fledged NCAA Division II affiliation.
- Included among the team's 19 wins in 1992-93, was a 52-50 victory at USC-Spartanburg that ended the Rifles' 50-game home-court winning streak, longest in the nation (any division) at that time.
- Guard-forward Carlton Farr was named the Peach Belt Athletic Conference "Player of the Year" following the 1994-95 season, during which he set the current Patriot career scoring record of 1,863 points.
- FMU head coach Lewis Hill announced his decision to step down following the 1996-97 season, bringing to a close a successful 22-year stint at FMU that saw him post a 339-276 record.
- On April 3, 1997, FMU names Ed Conroy, cousin of author Pat Conroy, as its new head basketball coach, the fourth in the program's history.
- Conroy directs the Patriots to a 66-58 upset of his alma mater The Citadel in his first game on the FMU bench. He goes on to lead Francis Marion to a 16-11 record and the biggest turnaround (13-win improvement) in NCAA Divisions I and II men's basketball during the 1997-98 campaign.
- Junior guard Yaron Lahat records the second triple-double in team history (13 pts, 10 reb, 10 ast) as the Patriots defeat 21st-ranked Georgia College & State University 69-55 on Feb. 13, 1999 (also FMU's 400th all-time win). Seven months later, he would return to his native Israel to fulfill a military commitment.
- On July 14, 2000, John Schweitz was named the fifth head coach in the program's history, succeeding Ed Conroy, who resigned to take an assistant's position at Division I University of Tulsa.
- Brothers Will and Wade Tucker conclude their playing careers as the most prolific scoring brothers' tandem in team history with 1,959 points: Will with 1,464 and Wade with 495.
- FMU loses its 2002-03 season opener at NCAA Division I Campbell University 65-64 on a 37-foot shot at the buzzer. However, the 13-14 team's nine-win improvement over the 2001-02 season was tops in the Peach Belt Conference. The Patriots ranked 8th nationally in field goal percentage defense and 30th in scoring defense.
- Only two years removed from a 4-23 campaign, FMU has its best season ever with a 27-4 record, a No. 5 national ranking in the final regular season poll, a first-ever NCAA II national tournament invitation, and an appearance in the round of Sweet 16 where the team lost to the eventual national champs. Numerous team and individual honors follow. The team ranked 7th in field goal percentage defense (39.1%) and 39th in scoring defense. The team opened the season with a school-record 10-game winning streak, and went on to record the first perfect home mark (13-0) in the program's history.
- During the summer of 2004, FMU swingman Louis McCullough, half-brother of NBA star Kevin Garnett, declares himself eligible for the NBA draft. He withdraws his name prior to the draft and returns to school, where he is named a first-team preseason All-American by *Street & Smith's College Basketball*.  
  
McCullough finished his career second on the Patriot all-time scoring list (1,714), rebounding list (811), and blocked shots list (152).
- On April 26, 2006, Gary Edwards is named the sixth head coach in the program's history.
