FMU is named in honor of South Carolina's Revolutionary War hero, General Francis Marion, who was nicknamed the "Swamp Fox," for using the terrain to out-fox the British. Located about seven miles east of Florence, in the beautiful northeast section of South Carolina, the 400-acre campus is about 90 miles from the state capital of Columbia, 60 miles from the shores of Myrtle Beach, and 180 miles from the mountains of the Carolinas.



Francis Marion University placed a record 91 student athletes, including eight men's soccer players, on last year's Peach Belt Conference Presidential Honor Roll (minimum 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale during the academic year), 51 percent of all our student athletes. FMU also placed a record 126 student athletes, including 10 men's soccer players, on its own Swamp Fox Athletic-Academic Honor Roll.

## Francis Marion University Men's Soccer Head Coach



### Kevin Varnado - FMU Men's Soccer Coach

Kevin Varnado is heading into his second season as head men's soccer coach, and sixth year overall, at Francis Marion University. He succeeded long-time head coach Murray Hartzler in 2006, who retired to concentrate on his duties as director of athletics.

In his first season as head coach, the Patriots finished 2007 with a 5-12-1 record that included seven one-goal losses. The squad finished the regular season strong with a 2-1 win over Catawba College and 1-1 tie on the road at 13th-ranked Clayton State University. That squad produced three Peach Belt Conference All-Conference performers and one Daktronics NCAA Division II All-Southeast Region Team (second team) member.

Varnado joined the FMU staff in 2002 as an assistant coach and as the university's equipment manager. As an assistant, his primary coaching responsibilities included recruiting, on-field coaching, individual player workouts, pre- and post-season workouts, and helping in the area of academic support for team members. During his four years as assistant coach, FMU posted a 40-36-2 record.

He has also been instrumental in the program's participation in The Passionately Pink for the Cure™ program, organized by the Susan G. Komen for the Cure group, and held in conjunction with the observance of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Varnado came to Francis Marion from St. Andrews Presbyterian College where he served as assistant men's coach during the 2001 season. He earned a B.S. degree in exercise science from St. Andrews in 2000. He was a three-year letterman on the Knights' soccer team, earning team MVP honors each season and twice being named to the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference first-team All-Conference Team. He played one season at the University of Central Florida before transferring to St. Andrews.

## Joel Person - FMU Assistant Coach

Joel Person of Mobile, Ala., enters his first season as assistant coach for men's soccer and the university's equipment manager.

Person's primary coaching responsibilities will include recruiting, on-field coaching, individual player workouts, pre- and post-season workouts, and helping in the area of academic support for team members.

He comes to Francis Marion after serving one season as an assistant women's coach at the University of Mobile. He served two years as a state coach with the Alabama Youth Soccer Association Olympic Development Program.

He owns the United States Soccer Federation National B License and the USSF National Youth License. He previously earned the NSCAA State Goal Keeping Diploma and the NSCAA State Diploma.

He was director of coaching with the Mobile Soccer Club in 2006-07, was the head boys' varsity coach at the UMS-Wright Preparatory School in Mobile for three seasons with a 41-16-4 record and three playoff appearances, and assisted with the University of Mobile men's program from 2002 to 2006. That final stint included the Rams' 2002 NAIA national championship season.

A native of Fairbanks, Alaska, he earned the B.A. degree in history and religion (magna cum laude) from Mobile in 2002. He played four seasons for the Rams, while the program made three NAIA Final Four appearances during his career.

He also played several seasons in the USL Premier Development League.



For each of the past two seasons (2006, 2007), the FMU men's soccer team, in conjunction with Zeta Tau Alpha sorority and McLeod Regional Medical Center, has hosted a Passionately Pink for the Cure™ match. **The 2008 match will be Oct. 14 at 4 p.m. against Barton College.** The Passionately Pink for the Cure™ program has been organized by the Susan G. Komen for the Cure group, and the annual match is held in conjunction with the observance of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Fans attending the matches have been encouraged to wear pink, and donations were taken during the match, and on-line, with all contributions going to Komen for the Cure.

# FMU 2008 Men's Soccer Pre-Season Outlook

## *Youthful Patriots open 2008 campaign in Banner Elk*

The Francis Marion University men's soccer team will open its 2008 season on Friday evening (Aug. 29) when the Patriots travels to Banner Elk, N.C. to battle Lees-McRae College in a 7 p.m. match-up.

Second-year head coach Kevin Varnado welcomes back 10 lettermen, including six starters, from last year's 5-12-1 squad. This year's roster also includes 10 newcomers, nine of whom are freshmen. The Patriots were picked to finish fifth according to the 2008 PBC coaches' preseason poll, and two sophomores, goalkeeper Clark Richeson and Juan Rivas, were named to the preseason All-Conference Team.

"I feel much more at ease entering this season, compared to 2007," said Varnado. "We have fewer injuries and we are a more complete team, more well-rounded, from front to back."

Richeson had a successful freshman campaign after recovering from an injury. He started the final six matches of 2007 and posted a 2.09 goals against average and ranked sixth in the PBC for saves per match (6.17). "With Clark, junior Nick Krywyj and freshman John Beck, we have depth at the keeper position and two options should an injury occur. Clark is an extremely talented keeper and has all the tools to excel at that position.



Rivas was an All-Conference and All-Region selection as a freshman last fall. He led FMU with nine goals, five assists, and 23 points despite missing several matches. He ranked sixth in the conference in goals and seventh in assists and points.

Other returning starters include the team's lone senior, back Willie Hunt (3 goals 2 assists in 2007); junior midfielders Kyle Clinton (6 g, 2 a ; upper photo), Alden Brooks (1 a), and Jared Beauchamp (1 g); sophomore midfielder Ivan Juric (8 g, 1 a ; bottom photo); sophomore back Justin Kibler (1 g); and sophomore midfielder Chris Foltanski.

"The midfield has been our strength over the past few seasons and that will again be true this year," Varnado said. "This area will dictate how we play and will influence the match both offensively and defensively. Up front, we do not have a proven finisher, but several players who can create opportunities to score. Obviously Juan has proven he can put the ball in the net, but if he receives additional defensive attention this year, others will have to step up and help.

"In the defensive back, we are improved from last year, despite the fact that three newcomers (sophomore Julian Ramjohn, and freshman Adrian Williams and Cameron Mabee) will play alongside sophomore Justin Kibler." Kibler is currently recovering from a practice injury and Hunt will fill his slot temporarily.

Varnado also pointed to freshman forward Emerson Peredo and freshman midfielder Adrian Sikorski as two newcomers who will have an effect on the Patriot squad. "Emerson has a 'dynamicism' that no one else on the roster creates, and Adrian adds a different dimension to the flow of a match."

Seven of the Patriots' losses last season were by one goal, and three others were to nationally ranked opponents. FMU ended the regular season strong with a home win over Catawba and a road tie with 13th-ranked Clayton State.

The team's 2008 slate consists of 18 regular season matches, including 10 home contests. FMU will play its home opener on Sept. 5 against Queens University of Charlotte at 4 p.m.

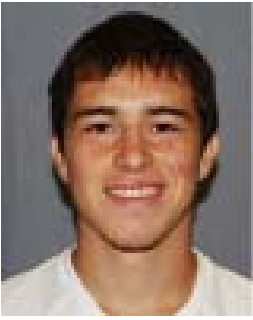

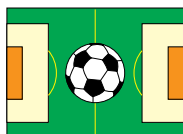

## FMU SOCCER FIELD.....

The FMU Soccer Field is home to both the Francis Marion men's and women's squads. The field, with a seating capacity of 300 is located behind the Smith University Center at the southern end of the campus. To reach the field, enter Robert C. Scott Drive (4th gate) and park in either of the right-hand or left-hand parking lots. The university has added several features to the field over the past few years, including a new scoreboard and fencing around the field.



The Patriot men's team owns an all-time home mark of 123-112-17 (.522), while the Patriot women are 88-16-5 (.830) all-time on the FMU Soccer Field. The FMU Soccer Field has hosted the Peach Belt Conference Men's Tournament Final Four three times (1993, 2000, and 2002) and the PBC Women's Tournament Final Four once (2004). The field hosted two NCAA Division II National Men's Tournament matches in 2000, including an Elite Eight (national quarterfinals) match, and in 1998 was the host to a first-round NCAA women's tournament first-round match.

The field also hosted a men's exhibition match between Francis Marion and the Trinidad and Tobago national team in 1990. The Trinidad and Tobago squad trained at FMU for a couple of days prior to playing a match against the U.S. national team in North Carolina. Prior to building the current field, the Patriot men's team played its home matches on the university's Cornell (baseball) Field, which at that time included an astroturf infield.



Francis Marion University is a member of the 11-school NCAA Division II Peach Belt Conference (formerly the Peach Belt Athletic Conference). Other PBC members include Armstrong Atlantic State University (in Savannah, Ga.), Augusta State University (Augusta, Ga.), Clayton State University (Morrow, Ga.), Columbus State University (Columbus, Ga.), Georgia College & State University (Milledgeville, Ga.), Georgia Southwestern State University (Americus, Ga.), Lander University (Greenwood, S.C.), North Georgia College & State University (Dahlonega, Ga.), UNC Pembroke, and USC Aiken. Formed in December 1989 and headquartered in Augusta, Ga., the PBC conducts championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. Only seven of the Peach Belt members sponsor men's soccer. The 2008 PBC men's soccer tournament will be held Nov. 4, 7, 9 at sites of the higher seeds.
