FMU is named in honor of South Carolina's Revolutionary War hero, General Francis Marion, who was nicknamed the "Swamp Fox," for using the terrain to out-fox the British. Located about seven miles east of Florence, in the beautiful northeast section of South Carolina, the 400-acre campus is about 90 miles from the state capital of Columbia, 60 miles from the shores of Myrtle Beach, and 180 miles from the mountains of the Carolinas.



Francis Marion University placed 88 student athletes, including six men's soccer players, on last year's Peach Belt Conference Presidential Honor Roll (minimum 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale during the academic year), 50 percent of all our student athletes. FMU also placed a record 129 student athletes, including 10 men's soccer players, on its own Swamp Fox Athletic-Academic Honor Roll.

## Francis Marion University Men's Soccer Head Coach



### Kevin Varnado - FMU Men's Soccer Coach

Kevin Varnado is entering into his third season as head men's soccer coach, and seventh year overall, at Francis Marion University. He succeeded long-time head coach Murray Hartzler in 2006, who retired to concentrate on his duties as director of athletics.

In only his second year, Varnado guided the Patriots to a 14-5-3 record, the Peach Belt Conference regular season and tournament championships, and an appearance in the second-round of the NCAA Division II National Tournament. For his accomplishments, he was named the 2008 PBC Coach of the Year.

That 2008 squad produced six All-Conference selections and three All-Region picks, in addition to earning the PBC Team Sportsmanship Award for men's soccer. The Patriots also made their first appearance in the Top 25 poll in five seasons. After opening the campaign 1-4-1, FMU put together a 15-match unbeaten streak, second-longest in team history.

In his first season as head coach, the Patriots finished 2007 with a 5-12-1 record that included seven one-goal losses. The squad finished the regular season strong with a 2-1 win over Catawba College and 1-1 tie on the road at 13th-ranked Clayton State University. That squad produced three Peach Belt Conference All-Conference performers and one Daktronics NCAA Division II All-Southeast Region Team (second team) member.

Varnado joined the FMU staff in 2002 as an assistant coach and as the university's equipment manager. As an assistant, his primary coaching responsibilities included recruiting, on-field coaching, individual player workouts, pre- and post-season workouts, and helping in the area of academic support for team members. During his four years as assistant coach, FMU posted a 40-36-2 record.

He has also been instrumental in the program's participation in The Passionately Pink for the Cure™ program, organized by the Susan G. Komen for the Cure group, and held in conjunction with the observance of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Varnado came to Francis Marion from St. Andrews Presbyterian College where he served as assistant men's coach during the 2001 season. He earned a B.S. degree in exercise science from St. Andrews in 2000. He was a three-year letterman on the Knights' soccer team, earning team MVP honors each season and twice being named to the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference first-team All-Conference Team. He played one season at the University of Central Florida before transferring to St. Andrews.

Following his graduation, he spent one year as assistant athletic trainer at Alabama State University. He holds a USSF "B" license, and has served as a member of the South Carolina Olympic Development Program (ODP) coaching staff, most recently with the 1990 State Team. He also directs the annual summer Patriot Soccer Academy camps.

### Tony Falvino - FMU Assistant Coach

Tony Falvino is beginning his first year at Francis Marion as assistant coach for men's soccer and equipment manager for the university's athletic department.

Falvino's primary coaching responsibilities will include recruiting, on-field coaching, individual player workouts, pre- and post-season workouts, and helping in the area of academic support for team members.

A native of Johnsonville, New Zealand, he comes to Francis Marion after working one year in the Wingate University athletic department, while also working on his master's degree in sports administration.

He earned his undergraduate degree from Greensboro College, where he was a four-time All-Conference selection on the soccer field. He was named the USA South Conference Rookie of the Year in 2002 and later earned conference Player of the Year honors as a senior in 2005.

Falvino also played two seasons with the Premier Development League's Carolina Dynamo squad.

He served as an assistant coach at High Point University for two seasons (2006, 2007) prior to taking a position at Wingate.

He has worked three years with the North Carolina Youth Soccer Association as an Olympic Development Program (ODP) scout and coach, and has coached with the Twin City Soccer Association in Winston Salem, the Greensboro Soccer Club, and the Carolina Dynamo. He has been on summer camp staffs at Wake Forest University, Elon University, and Roanoke College.

He was a member of the New Zealand Under 17 and 20 squads before attending Greensboro.



For each of the past three seasons (2006, 2007, 2008), the FMU men's soccer team, in conjunction with Zeta Tau Alpha sorority and McLeod Regional Medical Center, has hosted a Passionately Pink for the Cure™ match. **The 2009 match will be Oct. 21 at 4 p.m. against USC Aiken.** The Passionately Pink for the Cure™ program has been organized by the Susan G. Komen for the Cure group, and the annual match is held in conjunction with the observance of October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Fans attending the matches have been encouraged to wear pink, and donations were taken during the match, and on-line, with all contributions going to Komen for the Cure.

## FMU 2009 Men's Soccer Pre-Season Outlook

The 22nd-ranked Francis Marion University men's soccer team will open its 2009 season on the road at Wingate University on Thursday evening (Aug. 27) at 7 p.m. The contest opens an 18-match slate for the Patriots in 2009. FMU's home opener will be Saturday at 2 p.m. against St. Andrews Presbyterian College, the alma mater of current Patriot head coach Kevin Varnado. FMU will be looking for its first season-opening win since 2005. The Patriots lead the all-time series with Wingate 12-4-1 and own a 19-8-1 advantage over St. Andrews, although this will be Varnado's first encounter with the Knights as FMU's head coach.

Varnado welcomes back 17 of 20 lettermen, including all but one starter, from last year's 14-5-3 squad that won both the Peach Belt Conference regular-season and tournament championships and then advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division II National Tournament. The team also earned the PBC's Team Sportsmanship Award for men's soccer. For these accomplishments, Varnado was named the PBC's Coach of the Year.

FMU was also recently picked as a preseason co-favorite in the race for the 2009 PBC title. "Our keys for this season will be to stay healthy, stay humble, and stay hungry," Varnado said. "As a young squad last year, we experienced a lot of success. We must keep doing the things to get better in order to maintain growth."

"The squad is anxious to start the season. We have trained hard, battled pre-season injuries, and played one exhibition (a 3-0 loss at NCAA Division I UNC Wilmington).

"We understand that this season we will not be a 'surprise team.' With a pre-season national ranking, what we did last year, and being co-favorites in the Peach Belt, we will have more of a target on our backs. That being said, we return an experienced group, one that became familiar with each other and our opponents. They learned what it took to win, and they know what to expect this year."

After being picked fifth in the 2008 pre-season PBC poll, FMU opened the year 1-4-1, but then went unbeaten in the next 15 matches to reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Among the returnees are three seniors: All-Region and All-Conference forward/midfielder Kyle Clinton, midfielder Alden Brooks, and back Jared Beauchamp. Clinton led Francis Marion last fall with 10 goals and 25 points, while tying for third on the team with five assists. In 57 career matches, he has tallied 22 goals and eight assists.

Among the other scoring targets Varnado will look to are junior Juan Rivas, an All-Region and All-Conference choice after tallying nine goals and five assists in 2008; sophomore Adrian Sikorski, another All-PBC pick after recording six goals and nine assists as a freshman; junior Chris Foltanski (2 goals, 3 assists), and sophomore Emerson Peredo (2 goals, 3 assists).

"Last year, I felt we were probably better at the defensive end of the field," said the third-year coach. "This year we want to improve our goal scoring without focusing on just one target and at the same time find scoring from every area of the field."

In the midfield, key players will include Brooks, Clinton, junior Julian Ramjohn, sophomore Cameron Mabee, and freshmen Ryan Lucas and Gentry Johnson. "With this group, we will have both experience and youth directing our offense."

On the defensive end, the Patriots must replace All-Region center back Willie Hunt. To do this, Varnado has shuffled his line-up slightly. He will move junior Ivan Juric, an All-PBC selection in 2008 after compiling eight goals and seven assists, from the midfield to left back. Beauchamp will play right back, while junior Justin Kibler and sophomores Adrian Williams and Sawyer Frank will take turns patrolling the center of the defensive line. "These five will give us a strong, yet versatile, back line with more balance from left to right."

Junior goalkeeper Clark Richeson, an All-PBC pick last year, returns to mind the net. In his first full season, after an injury-plagued freshman year in 2007, he posted a 1.37 goals against average with six shutouts. During the team's 15-match unbeaten streak, the Patriots surrendered only 11 goals. "He and I both feel more comfortable with his position in goal," said Varnado. "He has had a great week of practice as we look to start the season and I feel he is where he needs to be. Now as a junior, we will look to him for more leadership in his role as keeper."

Both Clinton and Juric were picked to the 2009 preseason All-PBC squad by a poll of the conference's coaches.

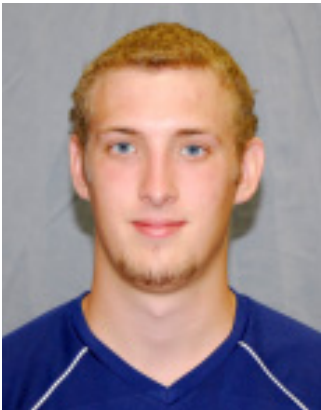

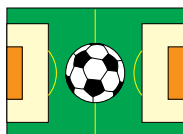

## FMU SOCCER FIELD.....

The FMU Soccer Field is home to both the Francis Marion men's and women's squads. The field, with a seating capacity of 300 is located behind the Smith University Center at the southern end of the campus. To reach the field, enter Robert C. Scott Drive (4th gate) and park in either of the right-hand or left-hand parking lots. The university has added several features to the field over the past few years, including a new scoreboard and fencing around the field.



The Patriot men's team owns an all-time home mark of 129-114-18 (.529), while the Patriot women are 93-18-6 (.821) all-time on the FMU Soccer Field. The FMU Soccer Field has hosted the Peach Belt Conference Men's Tournament Final Four three times (1993, 2000, and 2002) and the PBC Women's Tournament Final Four once (2004). The field hosted two NCAA Division II National Men's Tournament matches in 2000, including an Elite Eight (national quarterfinals) match, and in 1998 was the host to a first-round NCAA women's tournament first-round match.

The field also hosted a men's exhibition match between Francis Marion and the Trinidad and Tobago national team in 1990. The Trinidad and Tobago squad trained at FMU for a couple of days prior to playing a match against the U.S. national team in North Carolina. Prior to building the current field, the Patriot men's team played its home matches on the university's Cornell (baseball) Field, which at that time included an astroturf infield.



Francis Marion University is a member of the 13-school NCAA Division II Peach Belt Conference (formerly the Peach Belt Athletic Conference). Other PBC members include Armstrong Atlantic State University (in Savannah, Ga.), Augusta State University (Augusta, Ga.), Clayton State University (Morrow, Ga.), Columbus State University (Columbus, Ga.), Flagler College (St. Augustine's Fla.), Georgia College & State University (Milledgeville, Ga.), Georgia Southwestern State University (Americus, Ga.), Lander University (Greenwood, S.C.), University of Montevallo (Ala.), North Georgia College & State University (Dahlonega, Ga.), UNC Pembroke, and USC Aiken. Formed in December 1989 and headquartered in Augusta, Ga., the PBC conducts championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. Nine of the Peach Belt members sponsor men's soccer. The 2009 PBC men's soccer tournament will be held Nov. 3 at sites of the higher seeds and Nov. 6 and 8 in Evans, Ga..
