

- The Rams continue their 2016 schedule by hosting the Yale University Bulldogs on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday at 1:00 p.m.
- This will be the eighth meeting between Fordham and Yale with the Bulldogs leading alltime series, 5-2, but the Rams have taken two of the past three matchups
- The Rams won the last meeting, 52-31, in New Haven in 2013 as Mike Nebrich completed 19 of 26 passes for 421 yards and four touchdowns and Sam Ajala had ten receptions for a school record 282 yards and three scores
- The Rams are looking to improve their non-conference record to 20-7 over the past four
- Junior running back Chase Edmonds named STATS NCAA FCS Offensive Player of the Week after setting a Patriot League and school record with 359 rushing yards against
- The Rams are the winningest New York area football team since 2012 with 41 wins
- Fordham has not lost back-to-back games since 2011

Chase Edmonds Picks Up the Hardware

Junior running back Chase Edmonds, a 2016 preseason All-American and Preseason Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year, has already picked up a number of awards over his first two years:

- 2014 Jerry Rice Award as the top NCAA FCS freshman
- 2014 Consensus All-America
- 2014 CFPA National Rookie of the Year
- 2014 ECAC Rookie of the Year
- 2014 Patriot League Rookie of the Year
- 2015 Consensus All-American
- 2015 Patriot League & ECAC Offensive Player of the Year
- 2015 STATS NCAA FCS Player of the Year Finalist (finished fourth)

Statistically, Edmonds:

- Set the Fordham single season rushing record with 1,838 yards and Fordham rushing touchdown mark (23) in 2014
- Has top two single season rushing seasons in school history
- Set Fordham and Patriot League single game rushing mark with 359 yards against Lafayette on October 8
- Ranks second on career rushing yards (4,430)
- Has set the school career touchdown (62) and career rushing touchdown (55) marks



THE GAME

- The Fordham University Rams continue their 2016 season, Fordham's 116th varsity season, by hosting the Yale University Bulldogs on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, October 15, at 1:00 p.m.
- Fordham enters the game with a 3-2 record after a 58-34 Patriot League win over Lafayette College on Jack Coffey Field last Saturday while Yale stands at 1-3 this year following a 21-13 Ivy League win over Dartmouth in New Haven last Saturday.

THE SERIES

- This will be the eighth meeting between Fordham and Yale on the gridiron.
- The Bulldogs lead the all-time series, which started in 1950, 5-2.
- Fordham took the last meeting, 52-31, in New Haven in 2013 as Mike Nebrich completed 19 of 26 passes for 421 yards and four touchdowns and Sam Ajala had ten receptions for a school record 282 yards and three scores.
- Fordham has won two of past three meetings after Yale won the first four matchups.
- The Rams are 1-1 against the Bulldogs on Jack Coffey Field.
- Fordham is 28-48 all-time against Ivy League schools, 24-41 on the NCAA FCS level, but have won the past nine meetings with Ivy League schools, including a win over Penn earlier this year.

<u>CHASE EDMONDS NAMED</u> NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Fordham junior running back **Chase Edmonds** was named STATS NCAA FCS and CFPA NCAA FCS Offensive Player of the Week as well as Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week following the Lafayette game.
- It is the first weekly honor of 2016 for Edmonds and the fourth for the Rams.
- In a 58-34 Patriot League win over on Jack Coffey Field last Saturday, Edmonds continued his assault on the Patriot League and Fordham record books, rushing for a league and school record 359 yards with four touchdowns.
- He surpassed his own school and Patriot League record of 347 yards, set last year against Lehigh.

EDMONDS RUNNING WILD – SETS NATIONAL AND SCHOOL RECORDS

- In the Rams' 58-34 win over Lafayette on October 8, junior running back **Chase Edmonds** rushed for a Patriot League and school record 359 yards and four touchdowns.
- He surpassed his own Patriot League and school mark of 347 yards set last year against Lehigh.

RAMS AMONG FCS LEADERS

Over the past four years, the Fordham University football squad is fourth in the NCAA FCS in overall wins with 35 and sixth in winning percentage at .778 (35-10).

- What makes Edmonds' day ever more remarkable is that he gained the 359 yards (the most by an NCAA Division I player this year) on just 17 carries, averaging 21.1 yards per carry, setting an NCAA FCS record for most yards gained per rush in a game. The former mark was 19.07 set by VMI's
- For his exploits, Edmonds was named STATS and CFPA NCAA FCS National Offensive Player of the Week as well as Patriot League offensive player of the week.

EDMONDS LOOKING TO BE FASTEST TO 1,000 YARDS

- Junior running back Chase Edmonds is 56 yards shy of recording his third straight 1,000-yard rushing season.
- If he gains the 56 yards in the Yale game on Saturday he will become the fastest Rams to hit the 1,000-yard mark, doing so in his sixth game of the year.
- In 2014 and 2015 Edmonds surpassed the 1,000-yard mark in seven games while Carlton Koonce accomplished the feat in eight games in 2012.

FORDHAM AMONG LEADERS IN NCAA FCS HOME WINS SINCE 2012

- Over the past four years, the Rams have become very adept at protecting their home turf, winning 26 of the 28 home contests over that time, including the 22 of the last 23.
- The only home losses for Fordham under former head coach Joe Moorhead were the season finale in 2012 when the Rams missed a two-point conversion in the closing seconds that would have sent the game with Colgate to overtime and a 14-7 setback to #2 Villanova on September 12.
- The seven home wins in 2013 and 2014 broke the school record for most wins on Jack Coffey Field. The former record of six was set by the 1987 squad (the Pams have use

record of six was set by the 1987 squad (the Rams have used Jack Coffey Field since 1970).

- A 2006 graduate of Lock Haven (Pa.) University, is in his fifth year on the Fordham staff after serving as the pass game coordinator/quarterback coach the first fouer years.
- Under his tutelage the Fordham offense has ranked at the top of the NCAA FCS the past four years.
- Last fall, the Rams led the Patriot League and were ninth in the NCAA FCS in scoring, averaging 36.8 points per game, and led the league and were second in the NCAA FCS in passing efficiency (168.30).
- Fordham was also second in the league and 20th in the NCAA FCS in passing yards/game (272.3), 19th in the NCAA FCS in first downs and third in the conference and 42nd in the NCAA FCS in rushing yards/game (180.9).
- In 2014, the Fordham offense enjoyed another record-breaking season with seven offensive players earning All-America honors and ten receiving All-Patriot League accolades, including quarterback Mike Nebrich, who was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season.
- The 2014 Fordham offense set school marks for rushing yards with 2,353, shattering the former mark of 2,162 set in 2013, and scoring with 569 points, surpassing the 2013 record of 526. Included in the scoring total was a school-record 31 rushing touchdowns.
- The Rams led the 2014 Patriot League in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense while on the national level the Rams ranked fourth in passing offense (326.1 yards/game) in the NCAA FCS and ranked among the top ten in scoring offense (40.6 points/game fifth), team passing efficiency (156.23 third), total offense (494.1 yards/game seventh) and first downs (331 ninth).
- For the second straight year, Fordham had a 1,000 rusher (Edmonds) and three 1,000-yard receivers (Brian Wetzel, Tebucky Jones, Jr., and Sam Aiala).
- Served as a graduate assistant at UConn before joining the Fordham staff (2009-11).
- Prior to his stay at UConn, served as an assistant coach at Allegheny College in Meadville, Pa., for two seasons, working with the quarterbacks in 2008 and the wide receivers in 2007.
- Began his coaching career in 2006 at Lock Haven, when he sustained a career-ending injury midway through his senior year and began working with the wide receivers.

Fordham Football Adds New Teammate -Jonah Shainberg Becomes A Ram

Despite the fast start to the 2013 season, the Rams were still looking for new players. One such player joined the team on September 12 last fall as 12-year-old Jonah Shainberg was officially adopted by the Rams through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation.

Shainberg and his father, Joshua, attended practice on Thursday where they got to see the Rams as they prepared for their game with Temple in Philadelphia on Saturday. At the end of practice, head coach Joe Moorhead called Jonah out to midfield to meet the team and then had the squad run a play where

Jonah took the ball from quarterback Mike Nebrich and raced 60 yards for the score. The team met Jonah in the end zone and carried him to the locker room on their shoulders.

In the locker room, Michelle Deleso, Executive Director, and Katie Johnson, Adoption Coordinator, from the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation spoke to the team before handing the floor over to Jonah. He explained the history of his illness to the team and spoke of how excited he was to be involved with the Rams.



Jonah led the team breakdown and the four captains led Jonah to his locker, which was full of Fordham football gear, including t-shirts,

sweatshirts, hats and a signed football.

While the players showered for dinner, Jonah went to the football offices where Moorhead spent time showing him how the Rams break down film from the games for the coaches.

Following an interview with News 12 Bronx, Jonah was escorted by the captains to The Marketplace for dinner.

Jonah, a student at The Child School on Randall's Island, was diagnosed with a brain tumor six years ago and underwent numerous treatments for two years. The

tumor caused Jonah to suffer a stroke, which left the right side of his body weakened. He is undergoing therapy to regain control of his right side.

"This was a tremendous honor for our team," said Moorhead. "We are thrilled to be able to add a person like Jonah to our roster. He has been through so much in life and maintains such a positive attitude. We are looking forward to having him with us in meetings and on the sidelines and will look to him for inspiration as the year goes on."

The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, a 501(c)(3), non-profit, charitable organization that improves the quality of life for children suffering with pediatric brain tumors and their families. FOJ is all about love, support, and friendship. FOJ matches a child with a college or high school sports team based on geographic location. Once the team and child have been matched.

there is a ceremonial adoption. The child is surrounded by 20 or 30 new friends that rally around him or her. A deep bond is formed between the child, the child's family and the sports team. The relationship is a priceless gift. The gift is in the relationship; a child is gaining a loving support network and the team is gaining an insight into the value of life and the power of love. The result of this connection is mutual respect, support, friendship and love.



<u>EDMONDS CHASING THE</u> <u>FORDHAM RUSHING RECORDS</u>

- Fordham junior running back **Chase Edmonds** is already second on the Fordham career rushing yard list and set school career marks for both touchdowns and rushing touchdowns.
- He set the school career records for most touchdowns (62) and rushing touchdowns (55) this year.
- Edmonds needs 187 rushing yards to tie Kirwin Watson's career rushing record of 4,617 yards.
- Edmonds has the top two single season rushing marks, setting the school record with 1,838 as a rookie in 2014 and then rushing for 1,648 last season.
- **Edmonds** also has the two best rushing touchdowns seasons for the Rams, scoring 23 times as a freshman and 20 times on the ground last fall.
- Edmonds's Patriot League record 359-yard rushing performance vs. Lafayette on October 8 was his sixth career 200-yard game, tops all-time at Fordham, while he also has 18 career 100-yard games.

• Edmonds would be the second Ram to record three 1,000-yard rushing seasons, joining Kirwan Watson who did it in 2001, 2002 and 2003.

FORDHAM SETS SCHOOL AND PATRIOT LEAGUE SCORING RECORDS

• In the Rams' 83-21 win over Elizabeth City State University on September 10, Fordham set a new school and Patriot League record with the 83 points, surpassing the former Fordham record of 78 set against New Haven in 1977 (the Rams' NCAA FCS record was 63 set at Rhode Island in 2003) and the former Patriot League record of 69 set by Lehigh against Georgetown in 2002.

FORDHAM SETS & RESETS SCHOOL RUSHING RECORDS

- In the Rams' 83-21 win over Elizabeth City State University on September 10, Fordham set a new school record with 393 rushing yards in the game, bettering the old mark of 379 set last year against Lehigh.
- That record didn't last long, however, as Fordham shattered that mark, gaining 516 rushing vards in the win over Lafayette on October 8.
- In the Elizabeth City game, three Rams rushed for over 100 yards, led by **Chase Edmonds**, who picked up 155 yards on 16 carries.
- **D'Angelo Palladino** (116 yards on 19 carries with one touchdown) and **Kendall Pearcey** (115 yards on 12 carries with two scores) also went over 100 yards.
- It is believed to be the first time the Rams have had three 100-yard rushers in a game.
- In the Lafayette game, Edmonds rushed for a school and Patriot League record 359 yards

On September 30, 1939, Fordham hosted Waynesburg College at Triboro Stadium on Randall's Island. The game was the season opener for the Rams, who beat Waynesburg, 34-7. Announcer Bill Stern called the contest over station W2XBS (now WNBC) as a demonstration of this new medium at the World's Fair. Two iconoscope cameras, which had just been patented by RCA, were used to televise the game with the images

being sent to a relay station 10 miles from the stadium and then, by cable, to the top of the Empire State Building, where a large transmitter broadcast the game to the lucky few who owned a television in those days. A top-of-the-line set in 1939, a Clifton, sold for about \$600.

Notable Fordham players who appeared in the game include Len Eshmont and Dominic Principe, who went on to play in the professional ranks, as well as Ralph Friegden, father of former Maryland head coach Ralph Friedgen, who scored twice in the game and Donald Lambeau - son of Green Bay Packer legend Earl Louis "Curly" Lambeau.

REDD SETS SCHOOL AND PATRIOT LEAGUE RECORDS

- Senior placekicker **Makay Redd** set a school and Patriot League record with eleven PATs in the win over Elizabeth City State on September 10, breaking the former Fordham record of nine, set by Micah Clukey against Rhode Island in 2003. The former Patriot League record was also nine, set by Holy Cross in 1987 and matched four times, the last being the Rams' game at Rhode Island.
- Redd added two field goals in the game to score 17 total points
- Redd now has 52 career PATs, good for eighth on the Fordham career list.



TAKE IT AWAY

- The 2015 Fordham Rams were adept at forcing turnovers, ranking fifth in turnover margin (1.18) and seventh in the NCAA FCS in turnovers gained (28), including five in the win over Lehigh on October 24 (four interceptions and one fumble recovery).
- Included in the 28 takeaways were 16 interceptions, 12th best in the NCAA FCS.
- The Rams have continued their success with turnovers, ranking first in the Patriot League in turnover margin (2.20) and turnovers gained (17)
- Nationally the Rams are second in both turnover margin and turnovers gained.

RUNNING WILD

- After setting numerous passing records the past three years, the 2016 Fordham Rams have taken to the ground game.
- The Rams lead the Patriot League and are fourth in the NCAA FCS in rushing average, gaining 318.2 yards/game.
- The ground game has also helped the Rams find the endzone as Fordham leads the Patriot League and is third in the NCAA FCS in scoring, averaging 45.8 points per game.

KEVIN ANDERSON CLIMBING RECORD BOOK

- Senior quarterback **Kevin Anderson** threw for 3,183 yards last year, the fourth best single season in school history, in his first year as a starter.

Roddy Roche a Perfect Match

Don't blame Fordham University football student-athlete Roddy Roche if he starts playing the lottery. He has already beaten some long odds... as a bone marrow donor. Roche was selected from over nine million bone marrow registry members to donate his bone marrow to a 60-year old woman who is suffering from cancer last December.

Roche started the process by registering at annual Fordham football "Be the Match" registry in April of 2014. He completed a quick registration form and then submitted a swab of cheek cells us-



ing a cotton swab to determine tissue type and his results were stored in a database, awaiting a match.

"Everyone on the team was registering and we were encouraging others to register too" said

"Everyone on the team was registering and we were encouraging others to register too," said Roche. "I had no idea that I would be a match and get a phone call about helping to save someone's live."

The call for Roche came in August, at the beginning of the football season. Roche was asked to submit to further testing to determine if he would be compatible with the person in need, with the odds still being about one in ten for Roche being a perfect match.

In September, Roche got the call that would change his life. He was told that he was a match for someone in need of bone marrow. Even though it was in the middle of another successful football season, Roche didn't hesitate when asked to donate, even if it meant he would have to miss football activities for a period of time.

"When I got the call and heard the other person say 'thank you for your donation, you are a match' a lot went through my head," said Roche. "But it wasn't very difficult to agree to do it, knowing that I could help someone in need."

The original plan was to have Roche donate in October but he received a phone call that the recipient had taken ill and they would have to delay the procedure. A few weeks before Thanksgiving, Roche was told that the donation was a go and on November 30, he started a four-day stretch in which he received shots in his arm and abdomen to prepare his marrow for donation. Then on December 3, he went to a blood center in Manhattan for the five-hour process.

"It was relatively painless," said Roche. "They hook you up to a machine that removes your blood and separates out the marrow before returning the rest of the blood back into your other arm. The toughest part of the whole process was having to sit completely still the entire time."

Roche was told that the recipient is now his "blood sister", and that they both now have the same type of blood and genetic traits. "They told me that if I was allergic to anything that the recipient would now also be allergic to the same thing," commented Roche, who also noted that he has no known allergies.

FORDHAM'S IRON MEN

- Senior linebacker **George Dawson** and senior punter **Joe Pavlik** have appeared in every game at Fordham since arriving as freshmen in 2013 (45 games).
- They are looking to become the Fordham career leaders in games played. The currently record is 47, set by Javarus Dudley (2000-03) and matched by Joe Sullivan (2011-14).

THE FORDHAM CAPTAINS

- Fordham will be represented by three captains in 2016: senior quarterback **Kevin Anderson**, senior linebacker **George Dawson** and senior punter **Joe Pavlik**.
- Anderson and Dawson are serving as a captain for the second straight year.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- After graduating the top five pass catchers from 2014, the 2015 Rams didn't know where the receptions would come from.
- The answer was receiver by committee as 12 different receivers had at least one catch in 2015, five of those true freshmen.
- More so, five receivers had between 31 and 37 catches on the year.

THIS IS FORTY

- Fordham scored more than 40 points three times in 2016, in five of the 12 games in 2015 and 23 times since 2012.
- The 83 points scored by the Rams against Elizabeth City State on September 10 was a Patriot League record.
- The Rams scored 154 points over a three game stretch last fall (48 at Penn, 47 versus Holy Cross and the 59 against Lehigh), the highest three-game total in school history.
- The Rams won three straight games in 2015 despite surrendering 40 points or more in each (48-45 over Penn, 47-41 over Holy Cross and 59-52 versus Lehigh) prior to the Penn game the last time it happened was a 49-40 win over Georgetown in 1998).

NO EXPERIENCE – NO PROBLEM

- The Fordham Rams entered the 2015 season opener at Army West Point without a quarterback on the roster who had attempted a pass in a college game (the lone player to have attempted a pass in a college game was punter **Joe Pavlik**, who threw a touchdown pass to Marc DeSisto in the 2014 Army game). But not to worry. **Kevin Anderson** completed 15 of 23 passes for 322 yards in the 37-35 win.
- On the season, Anderson completed 229 of 342 passes for 3,183 yards and 32 touch-downs and he rushed 158 times for 341 yards and one score. He led the Patriot League and was third in NCAA FCS in passing efficiency (170.2), is second in Patriot League, and eleventh in the NCAA FCS in total offense (293.7) and he was second in the league and 12th in the NCAA FCS in passing yards per game (265.3) as well as being third in the NCAA FCS in passing touchdowns (32).
- It wasn't just quarterback where the Rams lacked experience heading into the 2015 opener. Fordham also did not have a player on the roster who had attempted a field goal or extra point in a college game. Not to worry. **Makay Redd** was two-for-two in field goals, hitting one for 22 and one for 27 yards, and three-for-three in PATs.

FORMER RAMS IN THE NFL

- Defensive back **Isa Abdul Quddus** is starting his first year with the Miami Dolphins after playing the past two seasons in Detroit. He originally signed as a free agent with the New Orleans Saints in 2011 and spent three years with the Saints.
- Placekicker **Patrick Murray** is on the Cleveland Browns roster, although he was placed on IR on September 23. He signed as a free agent with the Tampa Bay Bucs in 2014, connecting on 20 of 24 field goals attempts, before missing the 2015 season with an injury.
- Additionally, wide receiver **Greg Wilson** is a member of the Calgary Stampeders of the CFL. He was also a member of the Denver Broncos in 2014.

- Fordham junior running back **Chase Edmonds** became the Patriot League's and Fordham's all-time leading scorer this fall as well as setting new school career marks for most touchdowns and most rushing touchdowns.
- **Edmonds** has 372 career points, surpassing Kirwin Watson's former mark of 300 set from 2000-03 and the Patriot League mark of 358 points by Colgate's Jordan Scott (2005-08).
- He has the top two single season scoring marks in school history with 150 points in 2015 and 144 points in 2014.
- **Edmonds** became the school's career touchdown leader in the Penn game when he scored his 51st touchdown, surpassing Watson's record of 50.
- He has the top two single season touchdown marks in school history with 25 in 2015 and 24 in 2014.
- Edmonds set the school career rushing touchdown record at Monmouth with his 49th.

The U.S. Navy is part of the Department of Defense. But today it was the Navy offense that did the Fordham Rams in as the Midshipmen accumulated 550 yards of total offense in a 52-16 win over the Rams in the season opener for both teams at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

While the Fordham offense was able to move the ball the Rams couldn't seem to stop the triple option attack of Navy as the Midshipmen consistently came up with big plays to prevent Fordham from gaining any momentum in the contest. The Rams gained 464 yards of offense, thanks to senior quarterback Kevin Anderson, who completed 26 of 45 passes for 302 yards and one score, and junior running back Chase Edmonds, who gained 70 yards on 18 carries and caught two passes for 25 yards.

The Rams fell behind early as Navy took advantage of a Fordham fumble on the opening kickoff, covering seven yards on the first play from scrimmage for a 7-0 lead 12 seconds into the game.

GAME 2

Elizabeth City 21 Fordham 83

September 10, 2016 - Jack Coffey Field



The thermometer read a sizzling 87 degrees on a humid Jack Coffey Field when the Fordham University Rams kicked off with the Elizabeth City State Vikings on Saturday. Little did those in attendance know that the Rams' offense would come close to matching the temperature as Fordham scored a school and Patriot League record 83 points en route to an 83-21 win over the Vikings.

The 83 points surpassed the former Fordham record of 78 set against New Haven in 1977 (the Rams' NCAA FCS record was 63 set at Rhode Island in 2003) and the former Patriot League record of 69 set by Lehigh against Georgetown in 2002.

The Rams also set a school record with 393 rushing yards in the game, bettering the old mark of 379 set last year against Lehigh.

Individually, senior placekicker Makay Redd set a school and Patriot League record with eleven PATs, breaking the former Fordham record of nine, set by Micah Clukey against Rhode Island in 2003. The former Patriot League record was also nine, set by Holy Cross in 1987 and matched four times, the last being the Rams' game at Rhode Island.

The Fordham ground game was three-headed monster today with senior Chase Edmonds (155), freshman D'Angelo Palladino (116) and senior Kendall Pearcey (115) all rushing for more than 100 yards in the game. It is believed to be the first time in school history that the Rams had three 100-yard rushers in a game. Pearcey scored twice on the ground while Edmonds and Palladino each scored once.

GAME 3

Penn 17 Fordham 31

September 24, 2016 - Jack Coffey Field



Despite rushing for 225 yards over the first two games of the year, there was one thing that Fordham junior running back hadn't done too much of this season, find the end zone. That changed today as Edmonds scored all four Ram touchdowns, three on the ground and one through the air, to lead Fordham to a 31-17 win over Penn on Jack Coffey Field on Homecoming Weekend.

The four touchdowns brings Edmonds' career total to 53 as he surpasses Kirwin Watson's school record of 49, set from 2000-03. The three rushing scores gives Edmonds 47 for his career, one shy of Watson's school record of 48. He finished with 152 rushing yards on 29 carries in the game.

The defense also played a major role in today's win, forcing three turnovers (two fumble recoveries and one interception) and coming up with big stops in key situations. The unit was paced by senior linebacker George Dawson, who led the Rams with 12 total tackles, eight solo, including one for loss and he had an interception and two pass breakups, and freshman linebacker Max Roberts, who finished with ten stops, five solo, including three sacks and he forced two fumbles.

The defense limited Penn senior quarterback Alek Torgersen to completing 17 of 31 passes for just 125 yards, sacking him five times.

GAME 4

Fordham 41 Monmouth 42 (ot)

October 1, 2016 - Monmouth Stadium



In the movie The Big Lebowski, The Stranger explains to The Dude "Sometimes you eat the bear, and sometimes the bear eats you" which is applicable today's football game between Fordham and Monmouth. Over the course of the game, the Rams felt at times as if they were eating the bear and, moments later, being eaten by the bear. In the end it was a Monmouth two-point conversion on the first possession in overtime that made the difference as the Hawks defeated Fordham, 42-41, in Monmouth Stadium.

Despite the loss, junior running back Chase Edmonds continued his assault on the Fordham record book, rushing 25 times for 208 yards and four touchdowns. The four scores give Edmonds 51 in his Fordham career as he surpasses Kirwin Watson's school record of 48 set from 2000-2003. He also adds to his school career touchdown record which now stands at 57.

Fordham led 27-13 at the half but saw Monmouth score once in the third and then twice in the fourth to take a 34-27 lead with 5:03 remaining in regulation.

But Edmonds made sure the Rams were in it at the end, taking it to the end zone from 55 yards out to knot the game at 34 with 2:14 left.

Lafayette 34 Fordham 58

October 8, 2016 - Jack Coffey Field



At the postgame press conference Fordham head football coach Andrew Breiner was asked if there was anything junior running back Chase Edmonds couldn't do. He thought awhile and responded, "Cook?" Edmonds may not be at home in the kitchen but he is definitely at home on the gridiron as he rushed for a school and Patriot League record 359 yards and scored four touchdowns to lead Fordham to a 58-34 Patriot League in over Lafayette College on Jack Coffey Field.

What makes Edmonds' day ever more remarkable is that he gained the 359 yards (the most by an NCAA Division I player this year) on just 17 carries, averaging 21.1 yards per carry, setting an NCAA FCS record for most yards gained per rush in a game. The former mark was 19.07 set by VMI's Gene Brown in 1988.

After scoring just once over the first two games of the year, Edmonds has made up for lost time, scoring four times in each of the past three games. His scoring runs today covered 29, 19, 74 and 67 yards.

The four scores brings Edmonds' scoring total this year to 78 points and his career total to 372, a new Patriot League record. He surpasses the former record of 358 points by Jordan Scott (2005-08) of Colgate. The four touchdowns now give him 62 career scores and 55 career rushing touchdowns, both school records. He surpasses Scott's Patriot League touchdown record of 58 while he is two rushing scores behind the Patriot League record of 57, also set by Scott.

Edmonds and Kevin Anderson, who rushed for 108 yards, helped Fordham set a new school single game rushing record as the Rams gained 516 yards on the ground, easily surpassing the previous mark of 383 yards set earlier this year against Elizabeth City State.






