Setting the Scene

The Fordham women's basketball team (1-1) advanced to play the number one team in the country, Notre Dame, after defeating Furman last Friday night in the opening round of the Preseason WNIT. The Rams traveled to South Bend and kept the Fighting Irish under 50 points through three quarters but ultimately fell, 67-36, on the night. With the loss, the Rams were dropped into the consolation bracket and paired with the Little Rock Trojans for this Saturday afternoon in the third of three guaranteed games.

Ways to Watch/Listen

Last Time Out at #1/#2 Notre Dame (11/14)

Fordham acquitted themselves well against the number one team in the land, holding the hosts to under 40% shooting from the field and 50 points through the first three quarters. The Rams trailed by just eight after the first quarter and, after trailing by 14 at halftime, cut the deficit to single digits and outscored Notre Dame for nearly the entire third period until the hosts' third and-one of the quarter gave them a 13-12 advantage heading into the fourth. A 20-4 offensive explosion by the Fighting Irish in the fourth quarter sealed a 31-point victory.

Despite the solid defensive performance against one the nation's top offenses, the Rams could themselves only muster 23.1% from the field, finishing each half with exactly six field goals in 26 attempts. Junior forward G'mrice Davis led the way with nine points, a career-high 15 rebounds, three assists, and four steals in a career-high matching 36 minutes. Fordham held reigning ACC Player and Defender of the Year Brianna Turner to 10 points in 28 minutes and didn't allow a single Irish player to eclipse 13 points scored.

Notre Dame has been held at 67 points or lower in just 21 home contests in the last 10 years, excluding Monday's contest, and have a 12-9 record in such contests. Last season, the Fighting Irish averaged over 80 points per game.

Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll

The Fordham Rams were selected to finish sixth in the annual preseason coaches' poll, announced at A-10 Media Day, held in Richmond, Va., the site of the 2017 A-10 Championship. The Rams finished last season tied for sixth, with an 8-8 conference record, and reached the second round of the conference postseason. Saint Louis, who tied for last year's regular season title and reached the third round of the WNIT, garnered nine first-place votes. Dayton and last year's runner-up Duquesne tied for second in the poll with 166 points apiece, with the latter receiving three first-place votes. Two-time defending champion, George Washington, gathered the remaining two first-place votes and is predicted to finish fourth. Following the Colonials are VCU, Fordham, Richmond, and Saint Joseph's to round out the top eight. Rhode Island, St. Bonaventure, George Mason, La Salle, Davidson, and Massachusetts rounded out the preseason rankings, respectively.

Series History

This is the first time Fordham and Little Rock have ever faced each other.

Scouting the Trojans

The Trojans are one of the up-and-coming mid-major programs in the country, having reached postseason play in eight of the last nine seasons, including four NCAA Tournament berths and four WNIT trips, and

enjoying nine 20-win seasons in the last 10 years. Little Rock was picked to finish second in this year's preseason coaches' poll with 121 points, four shy of Troy, despite garnering the most first place votes, with five. Senior forward Kaitlyn Pratt was named Preseason First Team All-Conference and senior guard Sharde' Collins was named to the Second Team.

Pratt is one of Little Rock's all-time great frontcourt players, already third all-time with a .547 shooting percentage and fifth all-time with 237 offensive rebounds. Keanna Keys is right up there with her for efficiency, totaling a .506 field goal percentage over her career.

Like Fordham, the Trojans pride themselves on defense. Little Rock had the 24th-best scoring defense in the land last season, holding opponents to just 55.5 points per game.

G Grabs Career-High 15 Boards

Junior forward G' mrice Davis racked up a career-high 15 rebounds at #1 Notre Dame on Monday night while matching her career-high 36 minutes played. Davis picked up her fourth foul late in third quarter but still played the majority of the fourth period. Davis also led the team with nine points, three assists, and four steals, the latter of which was one short of her previous career-high.

Fordham & Gaitley in the WNIT

This is Fordham's first-ever appearance in the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Rams have previously appeared in the 2013 & 2015 postseason iterations, reaching the Round of 16 two seasons ago. Stephanie Gaitley has appeared in the annual postseason tournament six times in her career.

563 and Counting

Stephanie Gaitley, among active coaches, has the 20th-most career wins in Division I, with 563 after Friday's win over Furman. All-time, the 31-year veteran coach is 41st. Notre Dame's head coach, Muffet McGraw, is sixth among active coaches, with 821.

Defense, Defense, Defense

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Fordham has held its opponents to less than 50 points 31 times resulting in 31 victories. Under Gaitley, Fordham is 41-4 in such instances and have now won 32 straight with the most recent win over Furman, limiting the Paladins to 47 points.

Missry For Three!

Hannah Missry tied and broke the all-time Fordham career three-point record last season against St. Bonaventure (2/24/16) with two timely second-half bombs, tying and moving past Heather Donlon (1989-93) on the all-time list. Missry finished her season with five more long-range efforts over the next three contests and began her senior campaign with 239. Missry has hit one three-pointer in each contest so far this season but is shooting just 20% from deep overall.

98 To Go

Missry is 98 three-pointers away from breaking Jessica Jenkins' all-time Atlantic 10 record of 338 threes set at St. Bonaventure from 2009-12. Missry recently passed Andrea Hoover (Dayton 2012-15) for 12th-most all-time. Eight more for the senior and she will tie April Robinson's recently-set mark of 249 (Duquesne 2013-16), and seven more after that and Missry will join both Amra Mehmedic (Saint Joseph's 2001-04) and Erin Shields (Saint Joseph's 2011-14) in the top-10. Missry has averaged 79.7 three's over her three seasons in the Bronx.

New Faces

There are six players new to the Fordham program and three of them made their debuts against Furman. Kate Kreslinda, who redshirted last year, entered the starting lineup and played a team-high 35 minutes while tallying 10 points and eight rebounds. Sophomore transfer Mary Goulding and freshman Anna Kelly came off the bench and totaled four and seven points, respectively. Transfers Nicole Floyd and Tiffany Suarez are currently out with injury, while freshman Breanna Cavanaugh is also out.

Five Sign NLIs in 2016-17 Recruiting Class

Coach Gaitley announced this past week the additions of five student-athletes to national letters of intent: Halei Gillis, Kendell Heremaia, Zara Jillings, Ralene Kwiatkowski, and Vilisi Tavui. Fordham's global reach under Coach Gaitley continues with two players from North Carolina, two from New Zealand, and one from Fiji. The three international players all have experience playing within their countries iunior ranks.

Gillis, a 6'4 forward/center from Asheville, North Carolina, played basketball

with Kwiatkowski at Carolina Day School and at the club level with the Western North Carolina Lady Royals. Gillis averaged 11.1 points, 10.5 rebounds, and three blocks per contest over her high school career and is a two-time state champion.

Heremaia is a 5'9 wing from Whangarei, New Zealand, was a dominant two-way player the past two seasons at St. Peter's high school in Cambridge, averaging 25.4 points, 14.3 rebounds, 6.3 assists, and 8.2 steals per game and has featured extensively for the New Zealand junior ranks, playing at the U15, U17, U19, and U23 levels. Of Heremaia, Gaitley says, "she is one of the best passers I've ever seen".

Jillings is a 5'11 combo guard that reminds Gaitley of former Ram standout Erin Rooney. The Auckland native played at Westlake Girls high school for the last four years, at the club level with the North Harbour Basketball Association's various junior programs, and internationally where she has captained the U16, U17 and U19 Kiwis. As a 14-year old, Jillings captained the U16 team to an Australian State Championship was was a reserve at the FIBA Oceania Championships. In 2014, Jillings helped North Harbour to a national championship and Westlake to the Auckland Premiere Championship. Last year, Westlake successfully defended their title as Jillings compiled averages of 22 points, seven rebounds, five assists, four steals, and two blocks per game. 2016 was more of the same as Jillings helped Westlake to fourth at nationals, averaging over 20 points per contest, and helping North Harbour U19s to a national title.

Kwiatkowski, a 5'8 combo guard from Biltmore Lake, N.C., has averaged 12.4 points, four rebounds, five assists, and there and a half steals per game over her high school career with the Wildcats. She is also a bonafide track star, winning state and conference championships as a freshman and sophomore in the 800 meter, 1600 meter, and 3200 meter, and defending her conference titles successfully as a junior and senior. She was also state champion as a freshman and junior in cross country and conference champion each year except her sophomore campaign.

Tavui is a 6' 4 center from Nausori, Fiji, and attended Lelean Memorial high school. She has won a national club championship with the Raptors of the Fiji Amateur Basketball Association in 2013 and in 2014, she joined the international ranks as a member of the U18 Fiji National team, playing in FIBA Oceania qualifiers and points 11.7 points and 19.7 rebounds per game while leading the team in minutes. A year later, she participated in the Pacific Games Women's Basketball Championship in Papua New Guinea where Fiii won gold. This summer, she played alongside Fordham's video coordinator. Valerie Nainima, with the Fiji Select Women's Basketball team in two friendlies against the Chinese National U18 squad. Tavui was also chosen to represent her country at the first-ever FIBA-organized Oceania Pacific Youth Leadership Basketball Camp, held in Australia, and is also one of the top talents of her age group in netball, one of the most popular sports in her homeland.

Kreslina on the International Scene

Redshirt freshman Kate Kreslina spent part of this past summer helping Latvia to a seventh place finish at the 2016 FIBA U20 Women's European Championship. Kreslina averaged 9.6 points per contest, third-most on her team. Latvia finished with a 1-2 record in the group phase but had a higher margin of victory than the Netherlands and advanced. Kreslina was named the top performer among her teammates in the opening match against the Dutch with a 6-4-2 line. In the next game, a win over Greece, Kreslina piled up 19 points, five rebounds, and a team-high four assists in 21 minutes, making 6-of-12 from the field and 6-of-8 from the line. Rounding out group play, Kreslina had 11 points on 4-of-7 shooting in a loss to France. Latvia impressively knocked off Germany in the round of 16, with Kreslina chipping in 12 points in 28 minutes, but fell to eventual runner-up Italy in the quarterfinals despite Kreslina's 10 points in a team-high 37 minutes. Kreslina only played 14 minutes in the seventh-place match-up with Poland. This wasn't the first international tournament for the Latvian guard, as she's also participated in four others: the 2013 U18 Euros, the 2013 U20 Euros, the 2012 U16 Euros, and the 2011 U16 Euros.

2015-16 Season Review

The Rams finished last season 14-17 and 8-8 in conference play, defeating Massachusetts in overtime in the first round of the A-10 Championship but falling to eventual runner-up Duquesne in the next round. New Director of Player Development Samantha Clark was named Second Team All-Atlantic 10 as well as to the All-Defensive Team after a fantastic senior campaign where she led the squad with 12.5 points and 9.6 rebounds per game, also chipping in a team-high 36 blocks and 30 steals. Clark led the A-10 in minutes played per contest (37.2). Fordham will return the other four starters from last season, with three of them averaging between nine and 10 points per game, Junior G'mrice Davis tallied 9.7 points and 7.4 rebounds per contests with 10 blocks and 21 steals during a solid sophomore season, while Danielle Burns scored 9.6 points per game on 39.8% shooting from the field and led the team with 76 assists. Hannah Missry continued her volume three-point shooting and set the school record for most career long-range makes as a junior, finishing the year with 239. She has averaged 79 threes over her three seasons but will need 100 to break the A-10 career record. Sophomore Lauren Holden solidified her spot as the team's starting point guard as a freshman by averaging 6.3 points per game with 55 assists and 35% shooting from deep, good for third-best on the team. Danielle Padovano and Asnate Fomina were both vital cogs in the rotation off the

Head Coach Villanova '82 Sixth Season at F

Sixth Season at Fordham (98-64) Overall Record: 562-334 (31st Year)



When Stephanie Gaitley inherited the Fordham women's basketball program, the Rams had gone nearly two decades without a winning record and were just three years removed from a 0-29 campaign.

In just five seasons at the helm of the Rams, Stephanie Gaitley has transformed Fordham from a perennial doormat into a national power, compiling three consecutive 20-win seasons and bringing home the school's first-ever Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball Championship in 2013-14.

The winner of 562 career games and the third winningest coach in Atlantic 10 history, two shy of Theresa Grentz's 156, and most among active coaches, Gaitley has led a team to the NCAA Tournament on eight occasions, compiling 15 20-win seasons and five conference titles over her 30 years as a head coach.

After compiling a 12-18 record in her first season at Fordham, Gaitley entered her second campaign with a few key additions. With Marah Strickland and Erin Rooney finally ready to play and star recruit Samantha Clark in maroon and white, Gaitley had all the pieces that the 27th year head coach would need to put together an historic campaign.

Gaitley's Fordham squad put up the best record the program had seen in over 30 years, finishing the season 26-9 and falling in the Atlantic 10 title game by just one point to Saint Joe's. Earning a berth in the WNIT, Fordham advanced to the Round of 16, picking up the school's first postseason victories since 1980.

Playing her signature style of smart, yet aggressive defense, Gaitley's team finished the season ranked first in the Atlantic 10 and 16th in the nation in scoring defense. The 2012-2013 Rams also finished the year ranked 15th in the country in free throw percentage.

For her efforts, Gaitley was named the 2013 Maggie Dixon Metropolitan Coach of the Year by the Met Basketball Writers Association.

With the success of the previous year still fresh in her team's mind.





In just five seasons, Gaitley has brought Fordham to two Atlantic 10 title games, winning it all in 2014, and three consecutive postseason appearances from 2012-15

the 2013-14 Rams put together the most memorable season of Fordham women's basketball in over three decades, winning the program's first-ever Atlantic 10 Championship and securing an NCAA Tournament berth for the first time since 1994. In claiming the title, Gaitley guided the Rams to wins over three teams against whom they had gone 0-4 during the regular season.

In addition to advancing to the NCAA Tournament, Gaitley's squad also accomplished a number of feats during the regular season, including a school-record 12-game winning streak, a school-record 11 nonconference wins and the program's first-ever Thanksgiving tournament victory at the Lady Rebel Round-Up played at UNLV.

The 2014-15 season saw the Rams win at least 21 games for the third straight season (the first time since 1977-1980 that a Ram team has won 20 or more games three years in a row) earn their third consecutive postseason appearance (as they made the second round of the WNIT before falling at St. John's), and finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 standings to earn the #4 seed in the conference tournament (where they lost to top seed and nationally-ranked George Washington in the semifinals). Gaitley also became the second-winningest coach in program history with 84 wins. The Rams led the conference in scoring defense (55.5), which was good enough for 18th nationally, and three-point field goal percentage defense (.274), which ranked 15th in the nation.

Gaitley, who led Monmouth University to 23 wins and a WNIT appearance in 2011, was named head coach at Fordham University on April 1, 2011 and set out to begin a new chapter in the Rams' women's basketball program, a chapter marked by hard work, an international flavor, a stifling defense and an emphasis on family values.

Gaitley, the winningest active coach in the A-10, arrived at Rose Hill with extensive experience as a head coach, guiding teams at Monmouth, Long Island University, Saint Joseph's University and the University of Richmond over a 25-year span. She compiled a 464-270 career record (.630 winning percentage) over that time, including 12 20-win seasons.

Gaitley coached three players who earned conference Player of the Year accolades including Long Island's Valerie Nainima (now part of the staff at Fordham), who was the first player in Northeast Conference history to win the league's Rookie and Player of the Year honors in the same season when she accomplished the feat in 2007. The other two are Jana Lichnerova and Susan Moran, the 2000 and 2002 Atlantic 10 Player of the Year at Saint Joseph's, respectively. Both Lichnerova and Moran were also named Atlantic 10 Student-Athletes of the Year for women's basketball.

Nainima, a member of the Fiji women's national basketball team, Lichnerova, who played for the Slovakia Olympic Team at the 2000 Games, and Moran, one of the top women's basketball players from Ireland, are a good example of Gaitley's international roots that have served her so well in her career. Gaitley has had three of her former international players either drafted or in camp with WNBA teams, and has conducted SVG camps all over the world for the past 20 years.

Gaitley also has experience with the United States national team, serving as an assistant in 2000 at the Jones Cup and helping the team to the gold medal. She also served as head coach of the West Team at the 1995 U.S. Olympic Festival, winning a silver medal.

An underlying theme for Gaitley-coached teams has been an unyielding defense, as evidenced by her Blackbirds squad that led the Northeast Conference in scoring defense from 2006-08, including holding the opposition to 54.8 points per game in 2007-08. In fact, from 1989-2000, Coach Gaitley's teams ranked in the top-10 in the nation in scoring defense nine times. In 2012-13 and 2013-14, her Rams finished 16th and 12th, respectively in the nation in that category.

One of the most apparent attributes about Coach Gaitley is her likeable demeanor strongly influenced by family values. Gaitley has an outgoing personality that is contagious throughout her program. She has maintained a longstanding, successful career based around her attitude and ability to convey her beliefs as a coach and as a mentor to her players.

In 2010-11, Gaitley led Monmouth to a 23-10 overall record, 13-5 in the Northeast Conference, and helped the Hawks tie the school record for wins in a season and advance to the title game of the NEC Championship. Following the championship game loss, Monmouth received its first ever WNIT bid and its first postseason appearance since making the 1983 NCAA Tournament.

Gaitley spent three seasons at Monmouth, recording a winning slate each year. She accomplished this with her trademark tough defense, allowing fewer than 60 points per game each year, including an NEC-best 55.7 in 2010-11.

Gaitley's Monmouth teams also were successful in the classroom, with the 2009-10 squad honored by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) as one of the top academic squads in the nation. The Hawks ranked 15th in the country with a 3.4 team GPA in the WBCA's annual Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll, which is based on the highest grade point averages (GPA) for the entire season.

Prior to her three years at Monmouth, Gaitley served as the head coach at Long Island University for six seasons, accumulating a 95-82 record at the helm of the program. She left the Brooklyn school as the winningest coach in LIU women's basketball history. In her final season at the school, 2007-08, she guided the Blackbirds to a school-record 24 wins and the top seed in the Northeast Conference Tournament. In her time in Brooklyn, she led LIU to a pair of 20-win seasons, the first NEC Regular Season title and first WNIT bid in program history and was named the 2006-07 NEC Coach of the Year.

Prior to her stint with Long Island, Gaitley was the head coach at Saint

Joseph's in Philadelphia, Pa. for ten seasons (1992-01). She led the Hawks to five 20-win seasons and two Atlantic 10 Championships in her time there while earning five NCAA Tournament bids, including three at-large berths. Her teams advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament three times and she earned both a preseason and postseason WNIT bid. She finished her time in Philly with a 196-88 mark and 109-39 in conference play.

In 1992-93, Gaitley's second season with Saint Joseph's, she went 21-8, which kick-started a run of qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in three of the next four years. Gaitley's teams in 1993-94 and 1994-95 went a combined 39-18 at Saint Joseph's. Her teams qualified for the NCAA Tournament in each season, and her 1999-2000 team went 25-6 and won the Atlantic 10 Conference Championship.

Gaitley got her start as a head coach at the University of Richmond from 1985-1991 where she compiled a 116-63 record, the most wins for any Richmond women's basketball coach, while winning 20 or more games in a season four times. During her last two seasons with the Spiders, she went a combined 51-10 and won the Colonial Athletic Association Championship each season while advancing to the NCAA Tournament in both years. Gaitley was named the CAA Coach of the Year in 1989-90 and also led the Spiders to a WNIT bid.

A native of Ocean City, N.J., Gaitley graduated from Villanova in 1982 with a Bachelor of Science degree in education and was an academic All-American that season. She was named to the Eastman Kodak All-America Team in 1981-82 and is currently sixth on the Villanova all-time rebounding list. She also received a Master of Science degree in secondary education at Villanova in 1983. The school inducted her into its Hall of Fame in 1993, three years after she was enshrined into the Philadelphia Big Five Hall of Fame.

Gaitley and her two sisters, Courtney and Coco, hold a piece of NCAA history. During the 1981-82 season, Stephanie and Courtney, while playing for Villanova, played against Coco, who played for FDU, marking the first time in NCAA history that three sisters competed in the same game.

Gaitley learned early on in her basketball career about success, as she was a member of the Ocean City High School girl's basketball team that went 100-0 in league play from 1974-78 under head coach Pat Dougherty. She is a member of the South Jersey and Ocean City High School Halls of Fame.

Gaitley and her husband, Frank, have three sons, Dutch, a video coordinator with the San Antonio Spurs, D.C., who graduated from Fordham in 2015 after playing four years of basketball for the men's program, and Jordan "Coop" Gaitley, a senior at Fordham Prep.



Gaitley reached 500 career wins in the semifinals of the 2013 Atlantic 10 Championship and two years ago became one of seven coaches to bring three different schools to the NCAA Tournament.
