## #RAMBLINGS

• The Fordham University Rams continue the 2022 season, Fordham's 122nd varsity season, by hosting the Stony Brook University Seawolves on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, October 15, at 6:00 p.m. in the Rams' final nonconference game of the year.

• The game will be streamed on ESPN+ and broadcast live on WFUV (90.7 FM) and WFUVSports.org.

• Fordham, ranked 17th in the latest NCAA FCS Coaches Poll, enters the game with a 5-1 record, 2-0 in the Patriot League, after a 40-28 league win at Lehigh University last Saturday, while Stony Brook is 0-5 overall on the year, 0-4 in the CAA, after a 24-14 CAA loss at New Hampshire last week.

• This will be sixth meeting between Fordham and Stony Brook on the gridiron.

• The Seawolves lead the all-time series, 3-2, but Fordham won last year's meeting.

• Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat and sophomore linebacker James Conway were named Patriot League Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week, respectively.

• Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat, the 2022 Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, was named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List.

• DeMorat, who tied a school record with six touchdown passes at Monmouth and matched at Ohio, has a school-record 97 career touchdown passes.

• DeMorat, who has been named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week five times in 2022, also has 865 career completions and 11,216 career passing yards, both school records.

• Grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen was named a Preseason All-American and to the Buch Buchanan Award Watch List.

• The Rams are the winningest New York area college football team since 2012 with 68 wins.

• After a week off, Fordham travels to Worcester, Mass., to face the Holy Cross Crusaders on Fitton Field on Saturday, October 29, at 1:00 p.m.

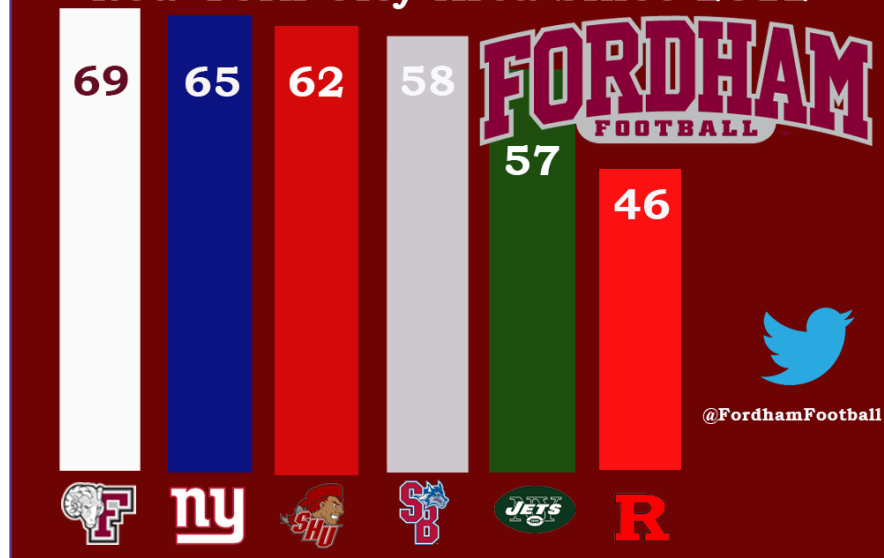

### THE GAME

- The Fordham University Rams continue the 2022 season, Fordham's 122nd varsity season, by hosting the Stony Brook University Seawolves on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, October 15, at 6:00 p.m. in the Rams' final nonconference game of the year.
- Fordham, ranked 17th in the latest NCAA FCS Coaches Poll, enters the game with a 5-1 record, 2-0 in the Patriot League, after a 40-28 league win at Lehigh University last Saturday, while Stony Brook is 0-5 overall on the year, 0-4 in the CAA, after a 24-14 CAA loss at New Hampshire last week.

### THE SERIES

- This will be sixth meeting between Fordham and Stony Brook on the gridiron.
- The Seawolves lead the all-time series, 3-2, but the Rams took last year's meeting, 34-14, at Stony Brook on September 25 as Tim DeMorat completed 21 of 33 passes for 280 yards and four touchdowns.
- It will be the fourth meeting on the NCAA FCS level as the first two meetings occurred on the NCAA Division III level.
- Fordham took the first meeting, 14-6, on Jack Coffey Field in 1987 while the Seawolves won the second, shutting out the Rams, 3-0, at Stony Brook in 1988.
- It will be the third game this year for the Rams against a CAA opponent (Monmouth and Albany).
- The Rams are 31-45-5 against teams currently in the CAA (5-4 vs. UAlbany, 4-1 against Delaware, 1-1 vs. Maine, 0-1 against New Hampshire, 8-5 against Rhode Island, 1-1-1 vs. Richmond, 2-3 vs. Monmouth, 2-3 vs. Stony Brook 4-4 against Towson, and 4-22-4 vs. Villanova).

### DEMORAT PUTTING UP NUMBERS

- Through the first six games of the season, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** has been putting up video game numbers.
- He has completed 159 of 236 passes (67.4%) for 2,652 yards and 30 touchdowns.
- DeMorat leads the NCAA FCS in passing yards/game (442.0), passing touchdowns (30), and total offense (450.2), and is second in points responsible/game (32.0) and passing efficiency (200.3), and fourth in completions/game (26.5).
- His 30 touchdown passes are already tied for fourth most in a season at Fordham.
- DeMorat threw for over 400 yards in four of the past five games, including a career-best 503 at Ohio, and tied his school-record with six scoring strikes at

- Through the first six games of the season, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** has completed passes to 12 different players, with ten of them catching at least one touchdown pass.
- Senior **Fotis Kokosioulis** leads the Fordham receivers with 52 catches for 768 yards

## **FORDHAM AMONG LEADERS IN NCAA FCS HOME WINS SINCE 2012**

- Over the past eleven years, the Rams have become very adept at protecting their home turf, winning 39 of the 54 home contests over that time.
- The only home losses for Fordham under former head coach Joe Moorhead were the season finale in 2012 when the Rams missed a two-point conversion in the closing seconds that would have sent the game with Colgate to overtime and a 14-7 setback to #2 Villanova on September 12.
- The seven home wins in 2013 and 2014 broke the school record for most wins on Jack Coffey Field. The former record of six was set by the 1987 squad (the Rams have used Jack Coffey Field since 1970).

- Named head football coach at Fordham University on December 22, 2017.

- Served as associate head coach/offensive coordinator at Yale for the previous four years.

- Yale improved from 3-7 in '16 to 9-1 in '17 and its offense improved in nearly every key statistical category under Conlin's leadership.

- In 2017, the Yale offense ranked 12th in the NCAA FCS in total offense.

- Arrived at Yale as the offensive line coach in 2013 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2014.

- Also served as the offensive line coach at Yale with his 2013 (and 2014) starting five starting every game..

- Arrived in New Haven after spending the 2011 season as the offensive line coach at Harvard, helping the Crimson win an Ivy League title while setting a school scoring record.

- Also served as an assistant at FCS power New Hampshire, where he helped the Wildcats to seven straight NCAA playoff appearances from 2004 to 2010.

- During his tenure at UNH, served as the offensive line coach in 2009 and 2010 but also worked with the defensive line, safeties and special teams for a program that went 65-25 and won one conference championship.

- A three-year starter at defensive tackle at the University of Pittsburgh, he coached the defensive line at West Virginia Tech in 2003, a year after graduating.

- Also gained coaching experience at Greensburg Central Catholic High School from 2002-03 where he worked with the tight ends and defensive ends while also handling strength and conditioning.

## **DEMORAT/CONWAY NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

For the fifth time this year, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** was named GEICO Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week when the League office announced honors on Monday. Joining DeMorat in garnering weekly honors was sophomore linebacker **James Conway** who was named the GEICO Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week, his second weekly award of the season.

In a 40-28 Patriot League win at Lehigh on Saturday, DeMorat, the Patriot League preseason offensive player of the year, completed 26 of 37 passes for 499 yards and four touchdowns. The game was DeMorat's 28th career 200-yard passing game, bettering the Fordham record of 26 set by John Skelton (2006-2009), and his 16th career 300-yard passing game, breaking Mike Nebrich's (2012-2014) school record.

Conway led the Fordham defense last Saturday, making nine total tackles, eight solo, including 2.0 for loss, as the Fordham defense allowed Lehigh just 14 points and 94 net rushing yards.

- He leads the NCAA FCS in receptions/game (8.7) and receiving yards/game (128.3).

### **KOKOSIOULIS SETS PATRIOT LEAGUE RECORD**

- Senior wide receiver **Fotis Kokosioulis** grabbed 13 passes for 320 yards and four touchdowns at Ohio on September 24 to earn FedEx Ground FCS Offensive Player of the Week as well as Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- The 320 receiving yards is a Fordham and Patriot League record.
- He broke the former League mark of 319 by Lehigh's Jason Cristino against Lafayette in 1991 and the former Fordham mark was 282 set by Sam Ajala versus Yale in 2013.



- Kokosioulis also tied the Fordham record with the four touchdown catches.
- To put the 320-yard game in perspective, there were three NCAA FBS teams that hadn't thrown for 320 yards at that point in the season (UMass, San Diego State, and Air Force) along with four FCS schools (The Citadel, Cornell, Dartmouth, and Sam Houston State).
- On the year, Kokosioulis has 52 catches for 768 yards and eight touchdowns.
- He leads the NCAA FCS in receptions/game (8.7) and receiving yards/game (128.3).
- His 768 receiving yards are more than eight NCAA FBS teams and 16 NCAA FCS teams.

### **KOKOSIOULIS & CARTER MOVING UP RECEIVING LISTS**

- Senior wide receiver **Fotis Kokosioulis**, who set a Fordham record with 15 receptions at Monmouth this year, set another school and Patriot League record with 320 receiving yards at Ohio while also tying a Fordham mark with four touchdowns against the Bobcats.
- Kokosioulis finished with 13 catches for 320 yards and four scores at Ohio.
- He now has 29 career touchdown catches, third all-time at Fordham, and 2,452 career receiving yards, fifth all-time at Fordham.
- He is three touchdown catches behind Brian Wetzel (2011-2014) for second place.
- Last year, Kokosioulis led the Patriot League and was fourth in the NCAA FCS in touchdown receptions with 13.
- The 13 scoring catches tied for second most in a season in school history.
- Right behind him was junior wide out **Dequene Carter**, who had eleven touchdown

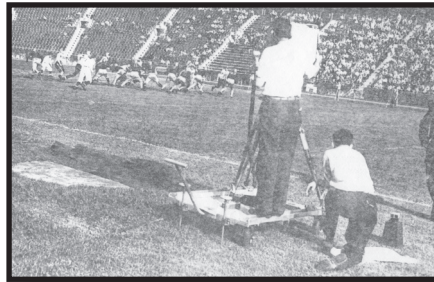

## Did You Know?

### Fordham Appeared in the First Televised College Football Game Over 80 Years Ago



On September 30, 1939, Fordham hosted Waynesburg College at Triboro Stadium on Randall's Island. The game was the season opener for the Rams, who beat Waynesburg, 34-7. Announcer Bill Stern called the contest over station W2XBS (now WNBC) as a demonstration of this new medium at the World's Fair. Two iconoscope cameras, which had just been patented by RCA, were used to televise the game with the images

being sent to a relay station 10 miles from the stadium and then, by cable, to the top of the Empire State Building, where a large transmitter broadcast the game to the lucky few who owned a television in those days. A top-of-the-line set in 1939, a Clifton, sold for about \$600.

Notable Fordham players who appeared in the game include Len Eshmont and Dominic Principe, who went on to play in the professional ranks, as well as Ralph Friegden, father of former Maryland head coach Ralph Friedgen, who scored twice in the game and Donald Lambeau - son of Green Bay Packer legend Earl Louis "Curly" Lambeau.

catches last year, good for a tie for second in the League and eleventh in the NCAA FCS.

- This year Carter has 20 catches for 491 yards and four scores.
- Over his career, Carter has 22 touchdown receptions, fifth all-time for the Rams, while his 2,358 career receiving yards is seventh best and his 140 career receptions ranks eleventh all-time at Fordham.

#### DOUBLE TROUBLE IN THE OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

- The 2022 Rams have a powerful one-two punch in the offensive backfield in grad student **Trey Sneed**, and sophomore **Julius Loughridge**.
- Their stats are almost identical with Loughridge rushing 83 times for 542 yards and four scores and Sneed rushing 1-1 time for 503 yards and four touchdowns.
- They are ranked one-two in the Patriot League in rushing yards/game (Loughridge – 88.7/ Sneed – 83.8).

#### LAST TIME OUT

- There are many adjectives that can describe the 2022 Fordham University Football squad. Boring is not one of them. For the second straight week, the Rams found themselves down 14 in the first quarter and for the second straight week they came back, defeating Lehigh University, 40-28, in a Patriot League game in Goodman Stadium.
- Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat had another stat-filled game, completing 26 of 37 passes for 499 yards and four touchdowns. His favorite receiver on the day was senior Dequece Carter, who caught four passes for a career-high 208 yards and two scores while MJ Wright hauled in three passes for 147 yards and a touchdown.
- For the second consecutive week, the Rams had a 100-yard rusher as sophomore Julius Loughridge gained 104 yards on ten carries with a touchdown.
- Defensively, Fordham surrendered just 14 points. The defense was led by sophomore linebacker James Conway, who finished with nine tackles, eight solo, including two for loss, while grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen added seven solo stops, including two for loss.
- Lehigh returned the opening kickoff for a score and then collected a fumble and returned it for a touchdown to take a 14-0 lead just four minutes into the game.
- The Rams managed to tie the game later in the quarter on two long plays, a 42-yard run from Loughridge and a 48-yard connection from DeMorat to Wright.
- Fordham trailed 21-17 at the half but scored just two plays into the second half to take the lead for good, 24-21, 51 seconds into the period.

- The Rams also lead the NCAA FCS in passing yards/game (442.0) and first downs (176), and are among the top ten in team passing efficiency (200.33 – second), and third down conversions (.519 – seventh).
- Last year the Rams averaged 33.6 points/game, 15th best in the NCAA FCS.
- They scored 66 points in the Bucknell game, tying a school record against a Division I team (the Rams scored 66 in 1936 and 1937 against Franklin & Marshall).
- The week prior to the Bucknell game the Rams put up 56 points on Wagner, marking the first time in school history that the Rams scored more than 50 points in back-to-back games.

### FORDHAM OFFENSE ON A SCORING SPREE

- After scoring 48 points in the season opener, Fordham bettered that mark with 52 at Monmouth and then scored 48 against UAlbany before matching its season-high with 52 at Ohio and then setting a new season-high with 59 versus Georgetown.
- The 299 points in the first six games of a season are the most for the Rams in their history (previous high was 272 by the 2016 squad).
- The last time Fordham scored 100 points in its first two games against Division I opponents was 1937 when the Rams defeated Upsala (47-0) and Waynesburg (53-0).

### DEMORAT SETS SCHOOL MARKS

- With his six passing touchdowns at Monmouth, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** brought his career total to 78, moving ahead of Kevin Anderson (2014-2017) and into first on the Fordham career list (Anderson's previous record was 73).
- DeMorat threw four more against Georgetown to bring his school-record total to 93.
- The six passing touchdowns at Monmouth and Ohio tied the school single game mark, set by Kevin Eakin at Rhode Island in 2003 and matched by Mike Nebrich versus Penn in 2014 and DeMorat against Wagner last year.
- DeMorat completed 27 of 35 passes for a career-best 503 yards and six scores at Ohio.
- The 503 passing yards is the best single game in the NCAA FCS this year (the second best game is DeMorat's 464 versus UAlbany and the third best is his 452 yards at Monmouth).
- DeMorat also has 865 career completions, breaking John Skelton's (2006-2009) Fordham career record of 802.
- His 11,215 career passing yards is also a school record, besting the former mark of 9,923 set by John Skelton (2006-2009).
- DeMorat set a school freshman mark with eleven touchdown tosses in 2018, including a freshman record four versus Bryant.

### CONWAY SECOND IN NCAA IN TACKLES

- Freshman linebacker **James Conway** finished his rookie campaign second in the NCAA FCS in tackles/game, averaging 11.9.
- He was also second in the Patriot League and 16th in the NCAA FCS in solo tackles/game with 5.7.
- This year Conway has 55 total tackles, 29 solo, and ranks third in the League in tackles/game (9.2).

### GREENHAGEN SETS NCAA DIV. I TACKLES RECORD

- Fordham senior linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen** set an NCAA Division I record with 31 total tackles against the Cornhuskers last September 4 at Memorial Stadium.
- For his efforts he was named the Stats Perform FCS National Defensive Player of the Week as well as the Patriot League Football GEICO Defensive Player of the Week.



• Greenhagen had 14 solo tackles and 17 assists. The previous record of 30 was accomplished three times previously since the NCAA made tackles an official statistic in 2000. Others to achieve the feat include Chattanooga's Josh Cain (2001), Norfolk State's Kevin Talley (2004) and Stetson's Donald Payne (2014).

• According to cbssports.com Greenhagen's 31 tackles were the most by any player against an FBS opponent since the NCAA began keeping records. The record was previously

held by former Oklahoma linebacker Kenneth Murray, who had 28 tackles against Army. NFL Hall of Fame linebacker Mike Singletary notably recorded 35 tackles against Houston and 33 tackles against Arkansas in 1978 for Baylor, but both of those games occurred before stats were considered official.

- Greenhagen broke a 31-year-old Patriot League single-game tackles record, a mark that was held by Lehigh's Lee Picariello against William. & Mary in 1990.
- Greenhagen followed the 31-tackle game with a 28-stop contest against Monmouth on September 11.
- He recorded double figures in tackles in four of the five games he played for the Rams in 2021 (he recorded nine in the first half at Lafayette before missing the second half with an injury).
- Greenhagen led the NCAA in tackles/game (20.2) and solo tackles/game (9.2) before suffering a season-ending injury in the Lafayette game.
- This year Greenhagen leads the Rams with 60 total tackles, 36 solo, and is second in the League in tackles/game with 9.8.

### GREENHAGEN GETS IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM TOO

- Fordham senior linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen** is not only turning heads on the field, but he's also doing it in the classroom.
- Last year, Greenhagen was named a Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American®, for the second straight year.
- He has been nominated for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded by the National Football Foundation to the American college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance.
- He first Ram to earn CoSIDA Academic All-American® honors

## FORDHAM vs. FBS

- The Rams have played 13 NCAA FBS opponents over the past 12 years (a 2020 game at Hawaii was canceled due to COVID).
- The Rams have won two of the games, a 30-29 win at Temple in 2013 and a 37-35 victory at Army West Point in 2015.
- The Rams are scheduled to play at Buffalo in 2023.

- After averaging 296.7 passing yards/game in 2021, tops in the Patriot League and eleventh in the NCAA FCS, the Rams are averaging 442.0 passing yards/game in 2022, best in the NCAA FCS.
- The 503 passing yards against Ohio is the top game for an NCAA FCS program this fall.



### TEN RAMS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE

- Seven members of the 2022 Fordham football squad were named to the 2022 All-Patriot League Preseason Team.

- The 2020-2021, 2021, and 2022 Patriot League Football Offensive Player of the Year was a finalist for the award in the spring.
- 2022, 2021, and 2020-21 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.
- 2021 Phil Steele Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.
- First Team All-Patriot League.
- Completed 234 of 400 passes for 3,214 yards and 31 touchdowns.
- Also rushed for 92 net yards and four scores.
- The 31 passing touchdowns is the third most in a season for a Ram while the 3,214 passing yards is fourth best.
- Led the Patriot League and ninth in the NCAA FCS in passing touchdowns.
- Led the Patriot League and 13th in the NCAA FCS in passing yards.
- Led the Patriot League and ninth in the NCAA FCS in passing yards/game (292.2).
- Led the Patriot League and 13th in the NCAA FCS in passing yards/completion (13.7).
- Led Patriot League and 17th in the NCAA FCS in completions/game (21.3).
- Led League and eleventh in the NCAA FCS in total offense (300.5 yards/game).

### THE FORDHAM CAPTAINS

- Fordham will be represented by five captains in 2022: grad student linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen**, grad student running back **Trey Sneed**, senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat**, senior defensive lineman **Jonathan Coste**, and grad student offensive lineman **Phil Saleh**.
- Sneed, a transfer from Rutgers, serves as a captain for the second straight year (he was limited to five games last year due to injury).

### RAMS IN THE PROS

- Three former Fordham football Rams appeared in the NFL training camps in 2022.
- Running back **Chase Edmonds**, who was drafted in the fourth round by the Arizona Cardinals in the 2018 draft, played four years with the Cardinals before signing a free agent contract with the Miami Dolphins in 2022.
- Offensive lineman **Nick Zakelj**, a four-time All-Patriot League selection, was drafted in the sixth round of the 2022 NFL draft by the San Francisco 49ers.
- Defensive back **Dylan Mabin** entered 2022 camp with New Orleans Saints but was cut during camp. He was signed to the Atlanta Falcons practice squad on September 13.

### RAMS IN CONFERENCE PLAY

- Fordham is 34-13 against Patriot League opponents over the past nine years (the Rams were 4-2 last fall, 2-1 in the spring of 2021, 2-4 in 2019, 3-3 in 2017, 5-1 in 2015 and 2016, a perfect 6-0 in 2014, 5-1 in 2013, though the games in 2013 did not count in the league standings).

### RAMS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- Over the past nine years the Fordham Rams are 25-17 in non-conference play (not including the five NCAA FCS Championship games).
- In 2013 the Rams were unbeaten against non-conference opponents with a perfect 6-0 record, the most non-conference victories for the Rams since the 2003 squad won five non-conference games.

### WHAT'S NEXT?

- After a week off, the Rams return to Patriot League action by traveling to Worcester, Mass., to face the College of the Holy Cross Crusaders on Fitton Field on Saturday, October 29, at 1:00 p.m. for the annual Ram-Crusader Cup game.
- It will be the 60th meeting between Fordham and Holy Cross on the gridiron.
- The Crusaders lead the all-time series, which started in 1902, 32-25-2, including a 52-24 win last year on November 13 on Jack Coffey Field as Matthew Sluka gained 104 yards on the ground with two touchdowns and he threw for 272 yards and two scores.

# The 2002 Patriot League Champions

Twenty years ago this year, Fordham won its first Patriot League title. This year we're taking you on a week-by-week look back at that magical season.



## GAME 6 FORDHAM 24 BROWN 17 October 12, 2002 Jack Coffey Field

Kevin Eakin completed 20 of 30 passes for 191 yards and a touchdown and Kirwin Watson carried 25 times for 85 yards and a touchdown to lead Fordham University (5-1) to a 24-17 win over Brown University (0-4) on a wet Jack Coffey Field. The win is the third straight for the Rams,

who also broke a six-game losing streak against Brown.

The 5-1 start for Fordham is Fordham's best start on the NCAA I-AA level and the best overall since the 1988 squad started out 6-0.

Prior to the game, the Rams had a moment of silence to honor Bill Tierney, a former football player who passed away prior to the Fordham-Lafayette game six years ago on October 12, 1996. Following the moment of silence, Billy's sister, Ryann, a senior at Fordham, sang the National Anthem. And after the game, the Rams honored Billy and the Tierney family by presenting the game ball to Ryann.

Fordham and the field conditions held Brown wide receiver Chas Gessner to two catches for 12 yards. Gessner, who appeared to injure his hand in pre-game warm-ups, entered the game leading the NCAA I-AA in receptions/game (15.0) and receiving yards/game (175.0). Last week, he tied Jerry Rice's I-AA record with 24 catches in a 38-28 loss at Rhode Island.

The Bears got on the board first when Fordham's Dan McGrath fumbled a punt return, giving Brown the ball on the Fordham, 27. The Bears did all of their damage on the ground as Tristan Murray gained 24 yards on five carries before quarterback Kyle Slager scored from two yards out to give Brown a 7-0 lead with 10:22 left in the first.

Fordham responded by taking the ensuing kickoff and driving 74 yards on eight plays, tying the game on a two-yard rush from Watson with 6:52 left in the quarter. Eakin completed all three of his passes on the drive for 49 yards.

The score remained tied at seven until the half as each offense struggled with the field conditions.

On Fordham's second possession of the third quarter, McGrath returned a punt 20 yards to give Fordham the ball on the Brown 32. A five-yard rush from Watson and a seven-yarder from Eakin put the ball on the Brown 20. But the drive stalled on the Brown 15 three plays later, and Matt Fordyce came on to boot a 32-yard field goal to give Fordham a 10-7 lead with 7:30 left in the quarter.

The Bruins immediately responded, using two big pass plays to move the ball to the Fordham four where Paul Christian kicked a 21-yard field goal to tie the game at ten with 3:01 remaining in the third. The big play was a third-and-eight completion from Slager to Ian Malepeai that brought the ball from the Brown 30 to the Fordham 41.

Early in the fourth, Fordham drove from the Brown 43 to the one where Fordyce missed a 17-yard field goal. But on the first play from scrimmage on Brown's subsequent possession, Akeem Greenfield picked off a Slager pass and returned it to the Brown 28. Five plays later, Eakin found Dudley with a perfectly thrown ball in the endzone for a 17-10 Fordham lead with 9:09 left in the game.

After the Rams held the Bears to three plays on their next possession, McGrath returned a punt 24 yards to the Brown 31. The Rams made short work of the 31 yards as on the third play, Eakin hit Steve Porco to put the ball on the one and on the next play Eakin scored on a keeper to put Fordham up 24-17 with 5:39 remaining.

But Brown refused to give-in. Later in the quarter, Matt O'Malley returned a punt 57 yards to give Brown the ball on the Fordham 33 with

Four plays later, Slager came back into the game and found Malepeai with a 15-yard touchdown pass to cut the Brown deficit to seven, 24-17, with 1:32 remaining.

Brown then attempted an onside kick but Travis Johnson recovered the ball for the Rams and Fordham ran out to clock for its third straight win.

Defensively, NaQuinton Gainous led the Rams with eleven tackles, including two for a loss, while Gerome Robinson and Colby Khuns each registered five, including a sack for Khuns.

The good news for Wagner is that Fordham quarterback Tim DeMorat will be out of eligibility after this year. The bad news for the Seahawks is they still had to play the Rams signal caller tonight. DeMorat completed 18 of 25 passes for 386 yards and five touchdowns, and ran for another, as Fordham mounted a strong second half to defeat Wagner, 48-31, on Hameline Field.

The Rams trailed 28-20 midway through the third quarter before DeMorat connected on back-to-back scoring strikes, the first a 44-yarder to Fotis Kokosioulis, and the second a 44-yarder to Garrett Cody, to put the Rams up 34-28 with 30 seconds left in the third.

DeMorat let his feet do the work on the next score, scampering in from two yards out with just over four minutes remaining and Trey Sneed finished off the scoring for the Rams with a four-yard run with 2:12 on the clock, giving Fordham a 48-28 lead.

Kokosioulis finished with nine catches for 150 yards and the score while MJ Wright also caught a pair of touchdowns.

On the ground, Julius Loughridge picked up his first career 100-yard rushing game, gaining 114 yards on 20 carries.

Defensively, Ryan Greenhagen led Fordham with nine total tackles, including 1.5 for loss and one sack, while Jonathan Coste added seven stops, including a sack.

## GAME 2

Monmouth University is located close to New Jersey shore. But it was no day at the beach for the Fordham Football Rams as the game came down to the last play and when Natani Drati knocked down a Hawks pass in the end zone the Rams could finally celebrate a 52-49 win over Monmouth at Kessler Stadium.

Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat put his name in the record book twice, becoming the career passing touchdown leader with 76, as well as tying his own single game mark with six scoring strikes.

DeMorat connected on 34 of 51 passes for a career-high 452 yards and the six touchdowns with senior wide receiver Fotis Kokosioulis grabbing a school-record 15 passes for 130 yards and two scores. Kokosioulis broke the mark of 14 set by Kendall Creer in 1999 and matched by Brian Wetzel in 2012. Senior MJ Wright hauled in eight passes for 97 yards and junior Mekai Felton added three catches for 55 yards and two touchdowns.

The Hawks took a 49-45 lead with 5:01 remaining before DeMorat led the Rams downfield, finding Kokosioulis in the left side of the end zone with a 14-yard scoring strike to put the Rams up for good, 53-49, with 56 seconds on the clock.

Fordham head football coach Joe Conlin entered the 2022 season 43 years old. If the Rams have any more games like the ones they had over the past two weeks, Conlin may be ready to apply for Social Security when the season ends. Trailing by eleven after three quarters, Fordham rallied for 21 fourth quarter points to get by the University at Albany Great Danes, 48-45, before a Homecoming crowd on Jack Coffey Field.

Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat was the story of the game for Fordham, completing 33 of 53 passes for 464 yards and five touchdowns. It was the second straight 400-yard passing game for DeMorat who brought his Fordham career record for touchdown tosses to 83.

DeMorat completed passes to nine different receivers, led by seniors Fotis Kokosioulis, who caught nine passes for 81 yards and MJ Wright, who hauled in seven balls for 99 yards and one score. Senior Garrett Cody made the most of his four catches, amassing 123 yards and two scores.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker James Conway recorded 15 total tackles, seven solo, including one sack, while grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen added eight stops, including 1.5 for loss.

Stop us if you've heard this one before. Fordham senior quarterback Tim DeMorat threw for over 500 yards and tied his school record with six touchdown passes, while senior wide receiver Fotis Kokosioulis set a school record with 320 receiving yards and tied another mark with four receiving touchdowns. Only difference for this game is that it was Ohio who scored in the final minute to hand the Rams their first loss of the year, 59-52, on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium.

DeMorat completed 27 of 35 passes for a career-high 503 yards and the six scores with Kokosioulis catching 13 passing for a school and Patriot League-record 320 yards and four touchdowns. DeMorat also became Fordham's career leader in completions and passing yards in the game, surpassing the former marks set by John Skelton.

The Rams took a 49-38 lead on Kokosioulis' fourth touchdown catch of the game late in the third.

After Ohio made it 49-46 with 14:13 remaining, a Brandon Peskin field goal bumped the Fordham lead to six, 52-46, at the 10:36 mark.

But the Bobcats scored with 52 seconds remaining to take a one-point lead, 53-52, and then scored on the final play of the game.

There are many adjectives that can describe the 2022 Fordham University Football squad. Boring is not one of them. For the second straight week, the Rams found themselves down 14 in the first quarter and for the second straight week they came back, defeating Lehigh University, 40-28, in a Patriot League game in Goodman Stadium.

Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat had another stat-filled game, completing 26 of 37 passes for 499 yards and four touchdowns. His favorite receiver on the day was senior Dequece Carter, who caught four passes for a career-high 208 yards and two scores while MJ Wright hauled in three passes for 147 yards and a touchdown.

For the second consecutive week, the Rams had a 100-yard rusher as sophomore Julius Loughridge gained 104 yards on ten carries with a touchdown.

Defensively, Fordham surrendered just 14 points. The defense was led by sophomore linebacker James Conway, who finished with nine tackles, eight solo, including two for loss, while grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen added seven solo stops, including two for loss.

Fordham trailed 21-17 at the half but scored just two plays into the second half to take the lead for good, 24-21, 51 seconds into the period.
