#RAMBLINGS

- The Fordham University Rams close out the 2022 Patriot League season, Fordham's 122nd varsity season, by hosting the Colgate University Raiders on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, November 19, at 1:00 p.m.
- The game will be streamed on ESPN+ and broadcast live on WFUV (90.7 FM) and WFUVSports.org.
- Fordham, ranked 14th in the latest NCAA FCS Coaches Poll, enters the game with an 8-2 overall record, 4-1 in the Patriot League, after a 45-10 Patriot League win over Lafayette on Jack Coffey Field last Saturday, while Colgate is 3-7 overall on the year, 2-3 in the Patriot League, after a 36-33 League loss at Lehigh last week.
- This will be 34th meeting between Fordham and Colgate on the gridiron.
- The Raiders lead the all-time series, which started in 1989, 25-8, and took last year's meeting, 45-31, in Hamilton
- Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat, the 2022 Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, was named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List and was joined there by senior wide receiver Fotis Kokosioulis.
- DeMorat, who tied a school record with six touchdowns passes at Monmouth and matched at Ohio, has a school-record 114 career touchdown passes, 47 this year, a Fordham and Patriot League record.
- DeMorat, who has been named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week eight times in 2022, also has 974 career completions and 12,670 career passing yards, both school records.
- Grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen, who was named a Preseason All-American and to the Buch Buchanan Award Watch List, was named a Walter V. Campbell Trophy Award finalist.
- The Rams are the winningest New York area college football team since 2012 with 72 wins.

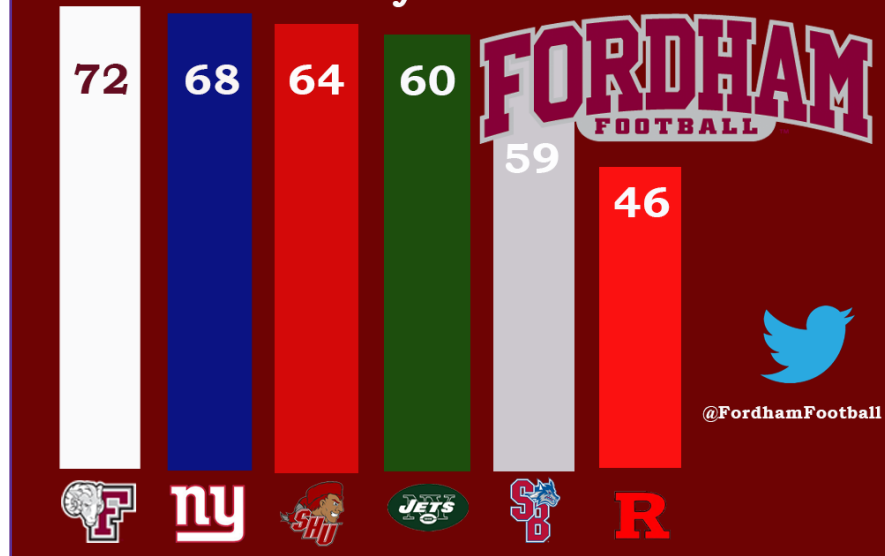

THE GAME

- The Fordham University Rams close out the 2022 Patriot League season, Fordham's 122nd varsity season, by hosting the Colgate University Raiders on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, November 19, at 1:00 p.m.
- Fordham, ranked 14th in the latest NCAA FCS Coaches Poll, enters the game with an 8-2 overall record, 4-1 in the Patriot League, after a 45-10 Patriot League win over Lafayette on Jack Coffey Field last Saturday, while Colgate is 3-7 overall on the year, 2-3 in the Patriot League, after a 36-33 League loss at Lehigh last week.

THE SERIES

- This will be 34th meeting between Fordham and Colgate on the gridiron.
- The Raiders lead the all-time series, which started in 1989, 25-8.
- The Raiders took last year's meeting, 45-31, in Hamilton, N.Y., on November 20 as Michael Brescia rushed 28 times for 162 yards and two touchdowns and threw for two other scores.
- Fordham won the matchup in the spring of 2021, 40-8, on Jack Coffey Field on April 3 as Tim DeMorat completed 22 of 31 passes for 274 yards and ran for two scores while Trey Sneed rushed 23 times for 93 yards and two touchdowns.
- The win snapped a three-game Colgate winning streak in the series.
- Fordham is 8-25 against Colgate since joining the Patriot League.

LOOKING TO STAY PERFECT AT THE JACK

- With a win on Saturday, the Fordham Rams will record a perfect 5-0 record on Jack Coffey Field this year.
- The 2022 team will join the 2016 (5-0), 2015 (5-0), 2014 (7-0), and 2013 (7-0) squads as the only undefeated Fordham teams on Jack Coffey Field since moving to the NCAA FCS in 1989.
- The only other Fordham teams to go without a regular season home loss since 1970 are the 1970 (4-0) and 1987 (6-0 but fell to Wagner in the NCAA Div. III championships) teams.

FORDHAM OFFENSE ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- The 2022 Fordham offense is one of the top offense's in the history of the NCAA FCS.
- Entering Saturday's game, the Rams' scoring average of 50.0 ppg is second only to the 1984 Mississippi Valley team (led by Jerry Rice) who averaged 60.9 points/game.
- The 2022 Ram offense is averaging 600.5 yards/game, again second only to that

RAMS AMONG FCS LEADERS

Since 2013 the Fordham University football squad is eleventh NCAA FCS in overall wins with 66 and is among the leaders in winning percentage at .617 (66-41).

- Fordham's passing offense (418.1 yards/game) is the fourth best in NCAA FCS history while the team passing efficiency is third best (187.0).

DEMORAT BREAKING RECORDS

- The season has been a record-setting year for Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat**.
- His 47 touchdown passes is a Fordham and Patriot League record, surpassing the former mark of 35 set by Fordham's Mike Nebrich in 2013.

FORDHAM AMONG LEADERS IN NCAA FCS HOME WINS SINCE 2012

• Over the past eleven years, the Rams have become very adept at protecting their home turf, winning 41 of the 56 home contests over that time.

• The only home losses for Fordham under former head coach Joe Moorhead were the season finale in 2012 when the Rams missed a two-point conversion in the closing seconds that would have sent the game with Colgate to overtime and a 14-7 setback to #2 Villanova on September 12.

• The seven home wins in 2013 and 2014 broke the school record for most wins on Jack Coffey Field. The former record of six was set by the 1987 squad (the Rams have used Jack Coffey Field since 1970).

• Named head football coach at Fordham University on December 22, 2017.

• Served as associate head coach/offensive coordinator at Yale for the previous four years.

• Yale improved from 3-7 in '16 to 9-1 in '17 and its offense improved in nearly every key statistical category under Conlin's leadership.

• In 2017, the Yale offense ranked 12th in the NCAA FCS in total offense.

• Arrived at Yale as the offensive line coach in 2013 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2014.

• Also served as the offensive line coach at Yale with his 2013 (and 2014) starting five starting every game..

• Arrived in New Haven after spending the 2011 season as the offensive line coach at Harvard, helping the Crimson win an Ivy League title while setting a school scoring record.

• Also served as an assistant at FCS power New Hampshire, where he helped the Wildcats to seven straight NCAA playoff appearances from 2004 to 2010.

• During his tenure at UNH, served as the offensive line coach in 2009 and 2010 but also worked with the defensive line, safeties and special teams for a program that went 65-25 and won one conference championship.

• A three-year starter at defensive tackle at the University of Pittsburgh, he coached the defensive line at West Virginia Tech in 2003, a year after graduating.

• Also gained coaching experience at Greensburg Central Catholic High School from 2002-03 where he worked with the tight ends and defensive ends while also handling strength and conditioning.

GREENHAGEN NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALIST

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced on October 26 the finalists for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award that annually recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. The 15 finalists, which include Fordham grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen, will each receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 2022 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class Presented by Fidelity Investments®.



Greenhagen, a preseason All-American, graduated with a degree in Business Administration (Finance) with a minor in Business Law & Ethics with a 3.85 GPA. He is currently completing a master's degree in Business Analytics. Greenhagen is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American® and three-time Academic All-Patriot League selection.

A four-year starter for the Rams, Greenhagen is second on the team with 75 total tackles, 45 solo, including 6.0 for loss and 3.5 sacks, ranking third in the Patriot League in tackles/game (9.2). He has been named to both the 2022 Buck Buchanan watch List (top FCS defensive player) and the 2022 Reese's Senior Bowl watch List.

- Over his career, DeMorat has thrown a school-record 114 touchdown passes, breaking Kevin Anderson's (2014-2017) record of 73 (the Patriot League record is 117 by Holy Cross' Dominic Randolph).
- DeMorat has completed 974 career passes for 12,670 yards, both school records.
- He is second on the Patriot League career passing yards and completions LISTS.

GREENHAGEN BREAKING CAREER RECORDS

- Fordham grad student linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen** is putting his mark in the Fordham record book.
- Greenhagen has amassed 48.0 career tackles for loss, breaking the former school record of 45.0 set by Carl Barbera (1993-1996).
- He also has 238 career solo tackles, breaking Ian Williams' (2011-2014) mark of 232.

DEMORAT NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** was named the GEICO Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week it was announced by the league office on Monday. It is the eighth weekly honor for DeMorat, the 2022 Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year.

In a 45-10 Patriot League win over Lafayette on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, DeMorat completed 32 of 45 passes for 482 yards and four touchdowns and he also ran for two scores. The game was DeMorat's 32nd career 200-yard passing game, bettering the Fordham record of 26 set by John Skelton (2006-2009), and his 19th career 300-yard passing game, breaking Mike Nebrich's (2012-2014) school record of 15, and his fifth 400-yard passing game of the season, his seventh overall, tying Nebrich's school record.

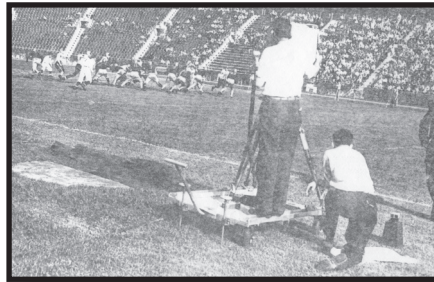

Did You Know?

Fordham Appeared in the First Televised College Football Game Over 80 Years Ago



On September 30, 1939, Fordham hosted Waynesburg College at Triboro Stadium on Randall's Island. The game was the season opener for the Rams, who beat Waynesburg, 34-7. Announcer Bill Stern called the contest over station W2XBS (now WNBC) as a demonstration of this new medium at the World's Fair. Two iconoscope cameras, which had just been patented by RCA, were used to televise the game with the images

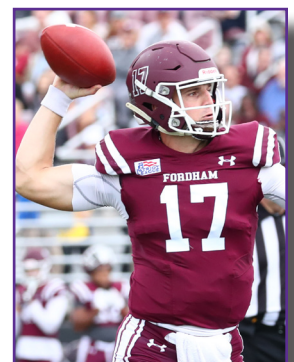
being sent to a relay station 10 miles from the stadium and then, by cable, to the top of the Empire State Building, where a large transmitter broadcast the game to the lucky few who owned a television in those days. A top-of-the-line set in 1939, a Clifton, sold for about \$600.

Notable Fordham players who appeared in the game include Len Eshmont and Dominic Principe, who went on to play in the professional ranks, as well as Ralph Friegden, father of former Maryland head coach Ralph Friedgen, who scored twice in the game and Donald Lambeau - son of Green Bay Packer legend Earl Louis "Curly" Lambeau.

- Next up for Greenhagen is the career total tackles record as he has 405, four behind the school record of 409 held by Mark Blazejewski (1988-1992).
- Greenhagen is also tied for third with 20.0 career sacks.

KOKOSIOULIS IS GRAND/WRIGHT IS NEXT

- Senior wide receiver **Fotis Kokosioulis** became the sixth player in school history to amass more than 1,000 receiving yards in a season.
- He leads the Fordham receivers with 84 catches for 1,110 yards and 12 touchdowns.
- Kokosioulis joins Javarus Dudley and Brian Wetzel (who each did it three times), Tebucky Jones, Jr. and Sam Ajala (who did it twice), and Jason Caldwell in recording 1,000-yard seasons.
- Senior **MJ Wright** could become the seventh as he enters Saturday's game with 978 receiving yards this year.



DEMORAT PUTTING UP NUMBERS

- This season Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** has been putting up video game numbers.
- He has completed 268 of 407 passes (65.8%) for 4,119 yards and 47 touchdowns.
- DeMorat leads the NCAA FCS in passing yards/game (410.7) and total offense (412.9), and passing touchdowns (47), points responsible/game (31.2) and is second in passing efficiency (185.8), and third in completions/game (26.8).
- His 43 touchdown passes are a Fordham and Patriot League record (former record was 35 by Mike Nebrich in 2013).
- DeMorat threw for over 400 yards in four of the past eight games, including a career-best 503 at Ohio, and tied his school-record with six scoring strikes at Monmouth and at Ohio.

DEMORAT SHARES THE WEALTH

- Through ten games of the season, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** has completed passes to 12 different players, with ten of them catching at least one touchdown pass.
- Senior **Fotis Kokosioulis** leads the Fordham receivers with 84 catches for 1,110 yards

KOKOSIOULIS SETS PATRIOT LEAGUE RECORD

• Senior wide receiver **Fotis Kokosioulis** grabbed 13 passes for 320 yards and four touchdowns at Ohio on September 24 to earn FedEx Ground FCS Offensive Player of the Week as well as Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honors.

• The 320 receiving yards is a Fordham and Patriot League record.

• He broke the former League mark of 319 by Lehigh's Jason Cristine against Lafayette in 1991 and the former Fordham mark was 282 set by Sam Ajala versus Yale in 2013.

• Kokosioulis also tied the Fordham record with the four touchdown catches.

• On the year, Kokosioulis has 84 catches for 1,110 yards and ten touchdowns.

• He is second in the NCAA FCS in receiving yards/game (111.0) and receptions/game (8.4).

• His 1,110 receiving yards are more than four NCAA FBS teams and one NCAA FCS teams.

• He is second on the team in touchdown receptions, tied for 12th in the NCAA FCS, and is sixth in the FCS in receiving yards/game (96.1).

DOUBLE TROUBLE IN THE OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

- The 2022 Rams have a powerful one-two punch in the offensive backfield in grad student **Trey Sneed**, and sophomore **Julius Loughridge**.
- Their stats are almost identical with Loughridge rushing 121 times for 849 yards and seven scores and Sneed rushing 150 times for 762 yards and four touchdowns.
- Loughridge leads the Patriot League in rushing yards/game (84.1) while Sneed is fourth (77.2).
- Twice this season each has rushed for more than 100 yards in a game (Georgetown and Holy Cross).

LAST TIME OUT

- It's becoming easy to lead football game stories with the exploits of the 2022 Fordham University offense. And today was no exception. But we interrupt this exaltation of the Fordham offense with a story about the Rams' defense, a unit that held Lafayette College to 180 total yards, as Fordham defeated the Leopards, 45-10, in a Patriot League game on Jack Coffey Field.
- Sophomore linebacker James Conway paced the Fordham defense with nine total tackles, three solo, including 1.5 for loss and 1.0 sacks, and he also had a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Senior defensive back B.J. Ferguson and grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen each added seven stops, with Ferguson having one for loss.
- Of course, the offense had its share of highlights too, led by senior quarterback Tim DeMorat who completed 32 of 45 passes for 482 yards and four touchdowns. He also ran for a pair of touchdowns.
- Three Fordham receivers registered more than 100 receiving yards, led by senior MJ Wright, who had eleven catches for 155

yards while senior Fotis Kokosioulis grabbed seven balls for 117 yards and senior Dequeue Carter added six receptions for 117 yards with both Kokosioulis and Carter hauling in a pair of scoring strikes.

SENIOR LOADED

- The 2022 Fordham football roster is full of seniors and grad students, 35 to be exact.
- Among the 35 are five who are fifth-year seniors, taking advantage of the NCAA rule allowing student-athletes an extra year due to COVID.
- The 2022 roster also has six grad students (**Anthony Diodato**, **Natani Drati**, **Ryan Greenhagen**, **Phil Saleh**, **Trey Sneed**, and **Anthony Tony-Itayah**).
- 24 of the seniors/grad students are listed on the Fordham two-deep.

FORDHAM IS WINNINGEST NYC COLLEGE FOOTBALL TEAM

- No New York area college football team has won more games since 2012 than Fordham, who has amassed 72 victories over that stretch.
- The closest collegiate competitors are Sacred Heart (64), Stony Brook (60), and Rutgers (46), while the NFL's Giants lead all NYC area professional teams with 68 wins over the past eleven years and the Jets have 60.

FORDHAM OFFENSE FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS

- The Fordham offense is putting up numbers this fall.
- The Rams are averaging 600.5 total yards/game, tops in the NCAA FCS, and 50.0 ppg, second in the nation.
- Fordham's 706 yards of total offense at Monmouth is a Patriot League season-high and the fifth most by an NCAA FCS team this year.
- Fordham has the top three NCAA FCS passing yardage games

- They scored 66 points in the Bucknell game, tying a school record against a Division I team (the Rams scored 66 in 1936 and 1937 against Franklin & Marshall).
- The week prior to the Bucknell game the Rams put up 56 points on Wagner, marking the first time in school history that the Rams scored more than 50 points in back-to-back games.

FORDHAM OFFENSE ON A SCORING SPREE

- After scoring 48 points in the season opener, Fordham bettered that mark with 52 at Monmouth and then scored 48 against UAlbany before matching its season-high with 52

at Ohio and then setting a new season-high with 59 versus Georgetown.

- The 500 points in the first ten games of a season are the most for the Rams in their history (previous high was 404 by the 2016 squad).
- The last time Fordham scored 100 points in its first two games against Division I opponents was 1937 when the Rams defeated Upsala (47-0) and Waynesburg (53-0).

DEMORAT SETS SCHOOL MARKS

- With his six passing touchdowns at Monmouth, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** brought his career total to 78, moving ahead of Kevin Anderson (2014-2017) and into first on the Fordham career list (Anderson's previous record was 73).
- DeMorat threw four more at Lafayette to bring his school-record total to 114.
- The six passing touchdowns at Monmouth and Ohio tied the school single game mark, set by Kevin Eakin at Rhode Island in 2003 and matched by Mike Nebrich versus Penn in 2014 and DeMorat against Wagner last year.
- DeMorat completed 27 of 35 passes for a career-best 503 yards and six scores at Ohio.
- The 503 passing yards is the best single game in the NCAA FCS this year (the second best game is DeMorat's 464 versus UAlbany and the fourth best is his 452 yards at Monmouth).
- DeMorat also has 974 career completions, breaking John Skelton's (2006-2009) Fordham career record of 802.
- His 12,670 career passing yards is also a school record, besting the former mark of 9,923 set by John Skelton (2006-2009).
- DeMorat set a school freshman mark with eleven touchdown tosses in 2018, including a freshman record four versus Bryant.

CONWAY SECOND IN NCAA IN TACKLES

- Freshman linebacker **James Conway** finished his rookie campaign second in the NCAA FCS in tackles/game, averaging 11.9.
- He was also second in the Patriot League and 16th in the NCAA FCS in solo tackles/game with 5.7.
- This year Conway has 101 total tackles, 49 solo, and is second in the Patriot League, and ranked tenth in the NCAA FCS, in tackles/game (10.1).

GREENHAGEN SETS

NCAA DIV. I TACKLES RECORD

- Fordham senior linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen** set an NCAA Division I record with 31 total tackles against the Cornhuskers last September 4 at Memorial Stadium.
- For his efforts he was named the Stats Perform FCS National Defensive Player of the Week as well as the Patriot League Football GEICO Defensive Player of the Week.
- Greenhagen had 14 solo tackles and 17 assists. The previous record of 30 was accomplished three times previously since the NCAA made tackles an official statistic in 2000. Others to achieve the feat include Chattanooga's Josh Cain (2001), Norfolk State's Kevin Talley (2004) and Stetson's Donald Payne (2014).
- According to cbssports.com Greenhagen's 31 tackles were the most by any player against an FBS opponent since the NCAA began keeping records. The record was previously held by former Oklahoma linebacker Kenneth Murray, who had 28 tackles against Army. NFL Hall of Fame linebacker Mike Singletary notably recorded 35 tackles against Houston and 33 tackles against Arkansas in 1978 for Baylor, but both of those games occurred before stats were considered official.
- Greenhagen broke a 31-year-old Patriot League single-game tackles record, a mark that was held by Lehigh's Lee Picariello against William & Mary in 1990.
- Greenhagen followed the 31-tackle game with a 28-stop contest against Monmouth on September 11.
- He recorded double figures in tackles in four of the five games he played for the Rams in 2021 (he recorded nine in the first half at Lafayette before missing the second half

with an injury).

- Greenhagen led the NCAA in tackles/game (20.2) and solo tackles/game (9.2) before suffering a season-ending injury in the Lafayette game.
- This year Greenhagen is second for the Rams with 94 total tackles, 54 solo, and is third in the League in tackles/game with 9.3.

GREENHAGEN GETS IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM TOO

- Fordham senior linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen** is not only turning heads on the field, but he's also doing it in the classroom.
- Last year, Greenhagen was named a Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American®, for the second straight year.
- He has been nominated for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded by the National Football Foundation to the American college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance.

- He first Ram to earn CoSIDA Academic All-American® honors since 2014.
- Greenhagen was also named Academic All-Patriot League the past three years.

**TEN RAMS NAMED
PRESEASON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE**

- Seven members of the 2022 Fordham football squad were named to the 2022 All-Patriot League Preseason Team.
- The seven were led by senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat**, who was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, for the second straight season.
- Joining DeMorat on the preseason all-conference team were grad student running back **Trey Sneed**, grad student offensive linemen **Phil Salah**, senior wide receivers **Fotis Kokosioulis** and **Dequece Carter**, grad student linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen**, and senior defensive lineman **Jonathan Coste**.

THE FORDHAM CAPTAINS

- Fordham will be represented by five captains in 2022: grad student linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen**, grad student running back **Trey Sneed**, senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat**, senior defensive lineman **Jonathan Coste**, and grad student offensive lineman **Phil Salah**.
- Sneed, a transfer from Rutgers, serves as a captain for the second straight year (he was limited to five games last year due to injury).

RAMS IN THE PROS

- Three former Fordham football Rams appeared in the NFL training camps in 2022.
- Running back **Chase Edmonds**, who was drafted in the fourth round by the Arizona Cardinals in the 2018 draft, played four years with the Cardinals before signing a free agent contract with the Miami Dolphins in 2022.
- Offensive lineman **Nick Zakelj**, a four-time All-Patriot League selection, was drafted in the sixth round of the 2022 NFL draft by the San Francisco 49ers.
- Defensive back **Dylan Mabin** entered 2022 camp with New Orleans Saints but was cut during camp. He was signed to the Atlanta Falcons practice squad on September 13.

RAMS IN CONFERENCE PLAY

- Fordham is 36-14 against Patriot League opponents over the past nine years (the Rams were 4-2 last fall, 2-1 in the spring of 2021, 2-4 in 2019, 3-3 in 2017, 5-1 in 2015 and 2016, a perfect 6-0 in 2014, 5-1 in 2013, though the games in 2013 did not count in the league standings).

RAMS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- Over the past nine years the Fordham Rams are 26-17 in non-conference play (not including the five NCAA FCS Championship games).
- In 2013 the Rams were unbeaten against non-conference opponents with a perfect 6-0 record, the most non-conference victories for the Rams since the 2003 squad won five non-conference games.

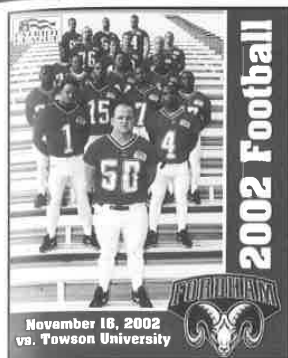
FORDHAM vs. FBS

The 2002 Patriot League Champions

Twenty years ago this year, Fordham won its first Patriot League title. This year we're taking you on a week-by-week look back at that magical season.



GAME 10 FORDHAM 42 TOWSON 14 November 16, 2002 Jack Coffey Field

Junior quarterback Kevin Eakin completed 17 of 29 passes for 313 yards and three touchdowns while junior running back Kirwin Watson rushed 26 times for 150 yards and two touchdowns to lead Fordham University (8-2, 5-1) to a 42-14 Patriot League win over Towson University (6-4, 3-

3) on Jack Coffey Field. The win, coupled with Colgate's win over Georgetown, leaves the Rams tied for first place in the Patriot League with one game remaining. Fordham closes out the season at Bucknell next Saturday.

The eight wins are the most for a Fordham team on the NCAA Division I-AA level (the Rams moved to I-AA in 1989) and the most overall since the 1988 team went 9-2. The five Patriot League wins ties Fordham's league-high, accomplished last year when the Rams finished 5-2 in the league.

The 150-yard rushing day was Watson's seventh 100+-yard game of the year, breaking the Fordham record of six set by Juan Pacheco in 1980. It is also the eleventh of his career, breaking the Fordham record of ten set by Rick Hollawell from 1986-89.

The 150-yard game brings Watson's season total to 1,228 yards, the second-best total in Fordham history. He is 36 yards shy of breaking the single-season record of 1,263 yard set by Chip Kron in 1984.

The 313 passing yards for Eakin is his fourth 300+-passing yard game of the season, breaking the Fordham record of three set by Joe Moorhead in 1995 and matched by Matt Georgia in 1999.

The 313 yards also gives Eakin 2,452 yards on the year, the third best total in Fordham history. Eakin is 249 yards short of breaking Fordham's single-season record of 2,700 set last year by Mark Carney.

The Fordham defense held the Tigers to 295 yards of total offense while sacking Towson quarterbacks four times and intercepting them once.

Fordham got on the board early, scoring on its first two possessions of the game. The Rams took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards on seven plays; the big play was an eleven-yard reception by Javarus Dudley on third and ten from the Towson 25. Eakin capped the drive by finding Steve Porco in the endzone with an eleven-yard scoring strike to put the Rams up 7-0 2:05 into the game. Eakin completed four of his six passes on the drive to account for all 75 yards.

After the Fordham defense held the Tigers at the Fordham 39, the Rams drove 80 yards on five plays, with Watson covering the first 69 yards himself on two rushes. Watson started the drive with a 28-yard rush to put the ball on the Fordham 48 and then followed that with a 41-yard run to bring the ball down to the Towson 11. Two plays later, Eakin scored on a keeper to give Fordham a 14-0 lead with 6:53 left in the first.

Early in the second the Rams moved 79 yards on six plays with Eakin completing three of four passes for 66 yards, the last one a seven-yard pass to Alemayo Whyte for a touchdown and a 21-0 Fordham lead 1:58 into the second quarter.

Late in the quarter Fordham took over on the Towson 40 following a short punt and the Rams covered the 40 yards on four plays, the last a 19-yard touchdown run from Watson to take a 28-0 lead with 2:08 left in the half.

The 28-0 lead would hold until Towson took the second half kickoff and drove 71 yards on 13 plays, all rushing plays, to cut the deficit to 28-7 with 8:18 left in the third. Matt Romeo did most of the damage on the drive, gaining 67 yards on 11 carries, including a two-yard touchdown rush. Fordham responded immediately on the first play after the ensuing

kickoff, as Watson gained one yard on a carry to put the ball on the Fordham 30 and Eakin then found tight end Travis Johnson open at the Towson 40 and Johnson raced to the endzone for a 35-7 Fordham lead with 7:19 left in the third.

The Tigers took the ensuing kickoff and went on another long drive, covering 73 yards on 18 plays with Brian Fleury hitting Jon Grubb with a six-yard touchdown pass 44 seconds into the fourth quarter to make it a 35-14 game.

The Fordham defense then dug in, allowing the Tigers just two first downs the rest of the way.

The Rams scored their final touchdown after Mario Rossi recovered a fumbled punt return on the Towson 20. Two plays later, following a penalty on the Rams, Watson took it in from 25 yards to give the Rams a 42-14 lead with 4:02 remaining in the game.

Kevin Eakin threw for 313 yards in the Towson win.

The good news for Wagner is that Fordham quarterback Tim DeMorat will be out of eligibility after this year. The bad news for the Seahawks is they still had to play the Rams signal caller tonight. DeMorat completed 18 of 25 passes for 386 yards and five touchdowns, and ran for another, as Fordham mounted a strong second half to defeat Wagner, 48-31, on Hameline Field.

The Rams trailed 28-20 midway through the third quarter before DeMorat connected on back-to-back scoring strikes, the first a 44-yarder to Fotis Kokosioulis, and the second a 44-yarder to Garrett Cody, to put the Rams up 34-28 with 30 seconds left in the third.

DeMorat let his feet do the work on the next score, scampering in from two yards out with just over four minutes remaining and Trey Sneed finished off the scoring for the Rams with a four-yard run with 2:12 on the clock, giving Fordham a 48-28 lead.

Kokosioulis finished with nine catches for 150 yards and the score while MJ Wright also caught a pair of touchdowns.

On the ground, Julius Loughridge picked up his first career 100-yard rushing game, gaining 114 yards on 20 carries.

Defensively, Ryan Greenhagen led Fordham with nine total tackles, including 1.5 for loss and one sack, while Jonathan Coste added seven stops, including a sack.

Monmouth University is located close to New Jersey shore. But it was no day at the beach for the Fordham Football Rams as the game came down to the last play and when Natani Drati knocked down a Hawks pass in the end zone the Rams could finally celebrate a 52-49 win over Monmouth at Kessler Stadium.

Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat put his name in the record book twice, becoming the career passing touchdown leader with 76, as well as tying his own single game mark with six scoring strikes.

DeMorat connected on 34 of 51 passes for a career-high 452 yards and the six touchdowns with senior wide receiver Fotis Kokosioulis grabbing a school-record 15 passes for 130 yards and two scores. Kokosioulis broke the mark of 14 set by Kendall Creer in 1999 and matched by Brian Wetzel in 2012. Senior MJ Wright hauled in eight passes for 97 yards and junior Mekai Felton added three catches for 55 yards and two touchdowns.

The Hawks took a 49-45 lead with 5:01 remaining before DeMorat led the Rams downfield, finding Kokosioulis in the left side of the end zone with a 14-yard scoring strike to put the Rams up for good, 53-49, with 56 seconds on the clock.

Fordham head football coach Joe Conlin entered the 2022 season 43 years old. If the Rams have any more games like the ones they had over the past two weeks, Conlin may be ready to apply for Social Security when the season ends. Trailing by eleven after three quarters, Fordham rallied for 21 fourth quarter points to get by the University at Albany Great Danes, 48-45, before a Homecoming crowd on Jack Coffey Field.

Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat was the story of the game for Fordham, completing 33 of 53 passes for 464 yards and five touchdowns. It was the second straight 400-yard passing game for DeMorat who brought his Fordham career record for touchdown tosses to 83.

DeMorat completed passes to nine different receivers, led by seniors Fotis Kokosioulis, who caught nine passes for 81 yards and MJ Wright, who hauled in seven balls for 99 yards and one score. Senior Garrett Cody made the most of his four catches, amassing 123 yards and two scores.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker James Conway recorded 15 total tackles, seven solo, including one sack, while grad student linebacker Ryan Greenhagen added eight stops, including 1.5 for loss.

Stop us if you've heard this one before. Fordham senior quarterback Tim DeMorat threw for over 500 yards and tied his school record with six touchdown passes, while senior wide receiver Fotis Kokosioulis set a school record with 320 receiving yards and tied another mark with four receiving touchdowns. Only difference for this game is that it was Ohio who scored in the final minute to hand the Rams their first loss of the year, 59-52, on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium.

DeMorat completed 27 of 35 passes for a career-high 503 yards and the six scores with Kokosioulis catching 13 passing for a school and Patriot League-record 320 yards and four touchdowns. DeMorat also became Fordham's career leader in completions and passing yards in the game, surpassing the former marks set by John Skelton.

The Rams took a 49-38 lead on Kokosioulis' fourth touchdown catch of the game late in the third.

After Ohio made it 49-46 with 14:13 remaining, a Brandon Peskin field goal bumped the Fordham lead to six, 52-46, at the 10:36 mark.

But the Bobcats scored with 52 seconds remaining to take a one-point lead, 53-52, and then scored on the final play of the game.

It was billed as one of the top games of the week in NCAA FCS football. And it lived up to the hype. Holy Cross scored a two-point conversion in the first overtime to defeat Fordham, 53-52, on Fitton Field in the annual Ram-Crusader Cup game.

Fordham senior quarterback Tim DeMorat completed 19 of 38 passes for 256 yards and five touchdowns. The five touchdowns brings his season total to 38, breaking the Fordham and Patriot League single game mark set by Fordham's Mike Nebrich in 2013.

DeMorat's favorite receiver on the day was senior Dequece Carter, who caught four passes for 107 yards and three touchdowns, while junior Mekai Felton grabbed four passes for 92 yards and two scores.

The Fordham offense also two 100-yard rushers with sophomore Julius Loughridge carrying 15 times for 126 yards and one score and grad student Trey Sneed gaining 104 yards on 18 carries.

Fordham scored on the first play of overtime, on a 25-yard pass from DeMorat to Carter, but Holy Cross managed to tie it with a 9-yard scoring strike. The Crusaders then decided to go for the two-point conversion which they made for the 53-52 win.
