**Today's Game** • The Blue Devils play their final road game of the season this afternoon on the road at St. Francis U. For the third time this season the Blue Devils will play on ESPN3, as the league has chosen this as the NEC Wild Card game. The Red Flash can clinch at least a share of the NEC title and the league's automatic berth to the FCS playoffs with a victory today. The Blue Devils are looking for their second straight win after topping Sacred Heart 37-35 at home last weekend. They'll finish their season next weekend at home on SENIOR DAY, hosting second place Duquesne at 12 pm.

**Trio Honored by NEC** • Following a 37-35 home victory over Sacred Heart on Arute Field last weekend, a trio of Blue Devils earned Northeast Conference weekly awards on Monday. On Monday the league announced that junior Joey Fields, sophomore Tymir Hinton and senior Ed Groth earned week honors. Fields shared Offensive Player of the Week honors, Hinton was named the Defensive Player of the Week and Groth took home Special Teams Player of the Week honors for their efforts in the home victory. Fields had his best game in a CCSU uniform in a 37-35 victory at home over Sacred Heart on Saturday. Field caught a career-high eight passes for a career-high 122 yards and a touchdown in the victory. He also produced 103 kick return yards on three kick returns to help the Blue Devils win the field position battle. Fields caught a 37-yard touchdown in the third quarter to push the Blue Devil lead to 31-21 late in the quarter. Fields also had kickoff returns of 37, 36 and 30 and gave the Blue Devils starting position of the SHU 41, CCSU 45 and CCSU 40 yardlines on those returns. All three led to CCSU scores, including the game-winner. Of his eight catches, five went for first downs. Groth made the most out of his first career attempt at a game-winning field goal on Saturday. He hit the game-winning 35-yard field goal with 15 seconds on the clock to give the Blue Devils the win. Groth finished the game 3-of-3 on field goals, including a 29-yarder and a 39-yarder in the game. Groth is now 10-of-13 on the year after starting the season 1-of-3 in the first week. His three field goals gave him 13 points in the game, and 130 in his career, good for 10th in school history. His 24 career field goals in third in school history. Hinton provided the game's first points, intercepting an RJ Noel pass and returning it 11 yards for a defensive touchdown and the 7-0 lead. The pick 6 was the second of the season for Hinton, and the third for the Blue Devils. Hinton finished the game with eight tackles, and two pass break-ups. With one final play, Noel sent the ball to the end zone as time expired and Hinton knocked it down to secure the win.

**Groth's Season to Date** • Senior placekicker Ed Groth was 3-for-3 last week in the win over Sacred Heart, including the game-winning 35-yard field goal with 15 seconds to play. It was the second time this season that Groth had hit three field goals in a game. Groth, now 10-of-13 in FG attempts on the season. Groth now has 130 career points, 10th all-time in scoring at CCSU. His 24 career field goals is third in school history.

**LaGuerre Continues to Produce** • Junior captain Randall LaGuerre continues to produce defensively for the Blue Devils this year. He leads the Blue Devils with 91 tackles this season, including 13 or more in a game three times. He had 13 in the opener vs. Lafayette, 13 on the road at Bryant and then 14 in the home loss to Wagner on Oct. 15. He has a pair of sacks on the year and has not posted fewer than eight tackles in a game all season long. LaGuerre leads the NEC in tackles and is 15th in the country at 10.1 tackles per game.

**Dolegala Sets a New Record** • Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala set a new single season yardage record last week. Dolegala enters today's game with 2,325 yards passing this season, first in the conference and 14th in the country in total yards passing. He leads the league and is 36th in the country in completion percentage (60.0%) and leads the league and is eighth in the country in completions per game (23.67). Dolegala passed Sam Tirone (2,116 yards in 1994) on the single season yardage list last week. He is the third Blue Devil to eclipse 2,000 yards in a single season (Tirone, Nick SanGiacomo twice in 2013, 2014).

**Pick 6x3** • The Blue Devils returned an interception for a touchdown for the third time this season in the win over Sacred Heart last weekend. Sophomore safety Tymir Hinton picked off a pass and returned it 11 yards for the game's first touchdown. It was his second pick 6 of the season. He also had one in the loss on the road at Bryant. Earlier this season junior Najae Brown returned an interception in the loss at James Madison.

**Rushing Defense** • For the third time this season the Blue Devils held their opponent to under 100 yards rushing two weeks ago at Robert Morris. The Colonials managed just 87 yards on the ground (and 219 yards of total offense) in the game. The Blue Devils also held Bowie State (13) and Lafayette (22) under 100 yards on the ground this season.

**Passing Offense** • The Blue Devils threw for 328 yards in the win over Sacred Heart at home on Saturday, marking the sixth consecutive game (and the seventh time this season) with 200 or more yards passing in a game. The Blue Devils have passed for 2,330 yards this season, just 232 yards shy of the school record of 2,562 yards set during the 1994 season.

**Fumbles Recovered** • The Blue Devils have recovered nine fumbles this season, the second-highest number in the conference and good for 22nd in the country in total fumble recoveries. Senior Carlton Nash and junior Randall LaGuerre, who have both recovered two fumbles on the year, are third in the conference and 15th in the country in that category.

**Last Time Out** • Senior placekicker Ed Groth kicked his third field goal of the game with 15 seconds left and the Central Connecticut football team topped Sacred Heart 37-35 on Arute Field on Saturday afternoon. The win moves the Blue Devils to 2-7 overall on the season and 1-3 in Northeast Conference play. Sacred Heart is 6-3 overall and 1-3 in the league. Groth hit from 29, 39 and 35 in the victory and is now 10-of-13 on the season. The game-winner came after the Blue Devils fell behind 35-34 on a four-yard pass from R.J. Noel to Moses Webb with 1:28 left in the fourth quarter. The Blue Devil offense, led by junior quarterback Jacob Dolegala, went 47 yards on eight plays to set up the game-winner from Groth. After a Sacred Heart timeout he struck his third field goal of the game and gave the Blue Devils the win, their second straight over Sacred Heart. Dolegala finished the game 25-of-43 for 328 yards and one touchdown. He set the single season yardage record for the Blue Devils in the process, and now has 2,325 on the year. His 300 yard performance on

Saturday was the second of his career. Junior Joey Fields caught eight passes for 122 yards and a score. Junior running back Cameron Nash had 24 carries for 78 yards and a touchdown in the win. Central got the scoring started in the first quarter when they pinned the Pioneers at the SHU four-yard line after being forced to punt on their opening possession. On third down, sophomore Tymir Hinton picked off Noel's pass at the 11-yard line and returned it for the touchdown. The extra point made it 7-0. The Pioneers went 69 yards over nine plays late in the first quarter to tie the score. Noel hit Moses Webb off a play-action pass for 21 yards and the extra point made it 7-7. Central scored on consecutive drives to take a 10-point lead heading into halftime. First, the Blue Devils went 51 yards over 11 plays and got to the Sacred Heart 12 yard line. Groth converted a 29-yard field goal to make it 10-7 with 12:21 left in the second quarter. On the next SHU possession the Blue Devils forced a three-and-out to take over on their own 32-yard line. CCSU went 68 yards in 12 plays and Nash capped the drive with a two-yard run for the touchdown to make it 17-7 with 5:09 to play before halftime. Sacred Heart began the second half with a scoring drive that took just two plays and 22 seconds. Jay Croom scored from 29 yards out to cut the Blue Devil lead to 17-14. The Blue Devils answered as Dolegala scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season to push the lead back to 24-14. His run capped a quick seven-play, 41 yard drive that was aided by a big kickoff return from junior Joey Field and an SHU penalty. The Pioneers had their own answer as they went 80 yards in eight plays to score again and cut the lead to 24-21 with 5:39 to play in the third quarter. Noel hit Andrew O'Neill from 39 yards out for the score. Central pushed the lead to 31-21 with 22 seconds left in the third quarter when Dolegala hit Fields from 37 yards out for a touchdown and the 10 point lead. Dolegala was 2-for-2 for 84 yards on the drive, including the touchdown. With 7:53 left in the fourth quarter the Pioneers cut the lead to 31-28. Noel rushed it in from one yard out to cap a 66-yard drive that took nine plays and cut the lead to three. A 39-yard field goal from Groth pushed the Blue Devil lead to 34-28 with 4:53 to play in the fourth quarter. The Pioneers took the 35-34 lead with 1:28 left in the fourth quarter on a four yard pass from Noel to Webb. Groth hit the game-winner with 15 seconds on the clock and the Blue Devil defense knocked down a late hail mary from Noel to secure the victory.

**25 or More Almost Perfect** • Since the start of 2004 the Blue Devils are 54-15 when scoring 25 or more points in a game. They are 64-30 when scoring at least 20.

# PETE ROSSOMANDO

Head Coach • 3rd Season



Head Coach Pete Rossomando begins his third season as the head coach at Central Connecticut State University in 2016. Rossomando was named the 13th head coach of the CCSU football program on January 22, 2014 after spending five seasons at the University of New Haven in the same position.

The Blue Devils started 2014 on a high note by traveling to Towson University and defeating the defending national runner-up Tigers, 31-27, on the road. Central

posted a 3-9 season in Rossomando's first year in New Britain, including a home win over CAA opponent Rhode Island, the second CAA win of the year for the Blue Devils, and a road victory in the final

game of the year at St. Francis University.

The Blue Devils posted a 4-7 record a year ago and were 3-3 in conference play. With two weeks left in the season the Blue Devils were in a virtual tie for first place as they chased their fifth-ever conference title. Rossomando is now 7-16 in his two seasons in New Britain, 4-8 in league please.

Prior to his arrival in New Britain, Rossomando spent five seasons as the head coach at the University of New Haven. Over that time he led the Chargers to a 42-13 record, two NCAA Playoff appearances and coached numerous all-conference and All-America student-athletes. Rossomando was named head coach of the Chargers in December of 2007 as New Haven reinstated its Division II football program after a five-year hiatus. He rebuilt the Chargers into one of the best Division II programs in the country. In his last three seasons, 2011-13, the Chargers posted an overall record of 29-6 and a 20-2 mark in Northeast-10 action, including two consecutive 8-0 regular seasons in league play (2011, 2012). New Haven was ranked as high as No. 3 in the 2012 Division II national polls.

Rossomando was named Liberty Mutual NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year following the 2012 season. He also earned three Northeast-10 Coach of the Year awards as the head coach of the Chargers (2010-12).

Prior to being named head coach at New Haven, Rossomando was an assistant coach at the University at Albany for seven seasons, serving as associate head coach, offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for his final three seasons with the Great Danes. Albany won three Northeast Conference Championships (2002, 2003, 2007) with Rossomando on the sidelines. The Great Danes posted a record of 46-32 in his seven seasons, including 36-12 in NEC play.

Rossomando has also served as an assistant at Northeastern (1999) and Cortland State (2000). His collegiate coaching career began in 1994 as an assistant at New Haven under head coach Tony Sparano. While an assistant at UNH the Chargers advanced to the NCAA Playoffs in 1995 and again in 1997 when the team reached the National Championship game.

In all, Rossomando brings 20 years of collegiate coaching experience to CCSU.

As a student-athlete, Rossomando played at the FCS level (then I-AA) for Boston University, seeing action on the offensive and defensive lines for the Terriers from 1990-93. He helped the team to the 1993 Yankee Conference Championship and a trip to the NCAA Playoffs with an undefeated record.

A native of Staten Island, NY, Rossomando was a decorated student-athlete at Port Richmond High School being named the 1989 Staten Island Player of the Year.

Rossomando and his wife, Jessica, have three children, Reese (18), Gianna (12) and Nicholas (10).

## at CCSU 10, LAFAYETTE 24 - Sept. 2, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team erased an early deficit to tie the game in the second half before falling, 24-10, to Lafayette in the season-opener on Friday night at Arute Field. The Blue Devils tied the game at 10-10 before the Leopards scored 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to win the opener.

The Leopards forced turnovers on the Blue Devils' first four possessions to build a 10-0 lead in the first half. Lafayette recovered a CCSU fumble on its own 38 to begin its first drive. An 18-yard touchdown pass from Drew Reed to Matt Mrazek capped the 62-yard drive and the extra point made it 7-0.

An interception on the ensuing drive gave the Leopards the ball back on the CCSU 25. A 35-yard field goal from Jacob Bissell made it 10-0.

After the Central defense forced a three-and-out, junior Najae Brown returned the punt 38 yards to set CCSU up on the Lafayette 27. Senior Ed Groth got the Blue Devils on the board three plays later with a 43-yard field goal to make it 10-3.

Central would tie the score with a six-play 75-yard drive in the third quarter. Redshirt freshman Drew Jean-Guillaume ripped off a 21-yard rush on second down to move the ball to the LU 46 yard line. Three more rushes by Jean-Guillaume moved the ball to the 25 yard line. On first-and-10, sophomore Jacob Dolegala sent a pass to the left side of the endzone where he found sophomore Alex Jamele for the touchdown. Groth's PAT made it 10-10.

The Leopards responded on their next possession with a 14-play, 89-yard drive over 5:06 to retake the lead. Reed connected with Mrazek for a 21-yard strike and the PAT made it 17-10 with 12:53 left in the game.

Reed would hit Mrazek for their third touchdown connection of the night with 5:12 to play. The 15-yard pass capped a nine-play, 81-yard drive and extended the Leopards' lead to 24-10.

The Blue Devils finished with 354 total yards, including 269 yards through the air. Senior Dan Hebert collected eight passes for 79 yards, while Jamele finished with three catches for 64 yards and a touchdown. Jean-Guillaume led the Blue Devils on the ground with six carries for 49 yards.

The Leopards totalled 338 yards, including 316 yards passing. Reed went 31-of-42 with three touchdowns. Mrazek caught all three touchdown passes and finished with six catches for 93 yards. DeSean Brown ran for 30 yards on 12 carries. Lehigh finished with 445 total yards, including 263 yards passing. Shafnisky completed 19-of-27 for 263 yards and a touchdown. He threw one interception. Shafnisky led the rushing attack as well with 83 yards on 17 carries and a touchdown.

## CCSU 21, at #12 JAMES MADISON 56 - Sept. 10, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team dropped to 0-2 on the season with a 56-21 loss at #12 James Madison on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium in Harrisonburg, VA. The Blue Devils fall to 0-3 all-time vs. the Dukes, with all three meetings coming since the 2011 season.

The Dukes scored on all five first half possessions and took a 35-7 lead at the break. Junior quarterback Bryan Schor completed 15 of 16 passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns to lead the offense. JMU racked up 359 total yards in the half and held the Blue Devils to just 109.

The Dukes led 21-0 before the Blue Devils scored their lone points of the half. Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala hit classmate K.J. Smith for a four-yard score to cut the lead to 21-7 with 12:41 left in the second half. The Blue Devil scoring drive went eight plays for 84 yards and took just 3:38 as Central got on the board for the first time.

Dolegala was 9-of-14 for 88 yards and a touchdown in the first half. Central ran for just 21 yards on the ground, led by 18 from senior Brenden Lytton.

James Madison ran for 178 yards on 21 rushes in the half and Schor threw for 181 and three scores.

JMU returned a punt for a touchdown to make it 42-7 to open the second half before the Blue Devils put together a solid offensive drive to cut the lead to 42-14. Dolegala hit junior Joey Field for a 17-yard touchdown strike to cap an 80-yard drive. It was his second scoring pass of the game.

The Blue Devils cut the lead to 42-21 with under two minutes to play in the third quarter when junior Najae Brown intercepted a Schor pass and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown. JMU answered with a quick scoring drive to make it 49-21 with 13:58 to play.

Dolegala finished the game 19-of-31 for 152 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Smith led the receivers with four catches for 65 yards. Nash also had four catches. Lytton rushed for 33 yards to lead the rushing attack.

Schor finished the game 17-of-21 for 205 yards and three touchdowns. Cardon Johnson rushed for 121 yards and two scores while Khalid Abdullah had 113 yards and a score.

Defensively the Blue Devils were led by Brown who had 10 tackles and the interception for the score. Junior Randall LaGuerre added eight stops. Senior Joel Maddock had a sack.

## at CCSU 44, BOWIE STATE 35 - Sept. 17, 2016

The Central Connecticut offense came alive as the Blue Devils scored the most points in a single game in the Pete Rossomando era with a 44-35 win at home vs. Bowie State University. The win is the first of the season for the Blue Devils who are now 1-2 overall on the season. Bowie State is also 1-2. Senior Brenden Lytton rushed for 99 yards three touchdowns and Central rushed for 248 yards as a team in the home victory. Lytton's backfield mate junior Cameron Nash rushed for a game-high 118 yards in the victory, to go along with a touchdown. The Blue Devil defense held Bowie State to just 13 yards on the ground, on 21 total carries. The 44 points are the most in a game for the Blue Devils since they scored 52 in a win over Wagner in the 2013 season. The Blue Devils finished the game with 430 total offensive yards.

Bowie took the lead after an early interception for the Blue Devils. Following the turnover the Bulldogs needed just one play to take a 7-0 lead. Amir Hall hit Brandon Britton from 13-yards for the early lead for the visitors. The Blue Devils answered with 2:37 left in the first quarter, capitalizing on a long punt return from senior Dan Hebert. Following the 64-yard return, the Blue Devils needed just five plays to move 26 yards for the tying scoring. Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala rushed it in from four yards out to tie the game.

The Bulldogs wasted little time retaking the lead, driving 77 yards in nine plays to take a 14-7 lead. Brandon Abrams ran it in from one yard out for his first score of the game. The Blue Devils took advantage of the first miscue of the game from the Bulldogs on their next scoring drive. Forced to punt, the punt hit the back of a Bulldog player and was recovered by the Blue Devils deep in Bulldog territory. Lytton ran it in from five yards out to tie the game 14-14.

Central took a 17-14 lead on a 37-yard field goal from senior Ed Groth with 43 seconds to play before the half. The Blue Devils forced the second turnover of the game to open the third quarter, and Lytton rushed for his second touchdown of the game to push the lead to 23-14. The Blue Devils went for two but were unsuccessful.

Following an interception from sophomore Tymir Hinton, Dolegala rushed for his second touchdown of the game to push the lead to 30-14. The rushing score was the fifth career rushing touchdown for the sophomore, all coming again Bowie State. The touchdown marked 23 straight points for the Blue Devils after trailing 14-7. Hall ran it in from six-yards out to put an end to the Blue Devil run and cut the lead to 30-21 with one minute left in the third quarter. Nash scored his first touchdown of the season from 16-yards out to push the Blue Devil lead to 37-21 with 13:33 left in the fourth quarter. The key play in the drive was a 3rd-and-14 pass completion to Hebert that went for 22-yards and a first down. Bowie State answered again with a 75-yard drive that resulted in a touchdown pass from Hall to Nyma Mannis cut the lead to 37-29 with 10:06 left to play. The two-point conversion attempt for the Bulldogs was good, making it an eight point game. Lytton's third touchdown of the game came from 31-yards out and capped a quick three-play drive that went 65 yards for the score. Central led 44-29 after the extra-point.

## CCSU 25, at BRYANT 45 - Sept. 24, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team opened Northeast Conference play with a road loss at Bryant University on Sept. 24, falling 45-25 to drop to 1-3 overall on the season and 0-1 in the league. The Bulldogs are now 2-3 overall and 1-0 in the league.

Bryant scored on four of five first half possessions to take a 28-3 lead at halftime. They began the day with an eight-play, 71-yard drive and took a 7-0 lead after their first possession. Jean Constant ran it in from 20-yards out for the score and the early lead.

The Blue Devils put their best first half drive together on their first possession, as they drove 86-yards on 12 plays but were stopped short of the goal line and settled for a 20-yard Ed Groth field goal.

The Bulldogs would put together 21 straight points to end the half and take the big lead into halftime. Quarterback Dalton Easton ran for one score and threw for one as the Bulldog offense scored on all four trips inside the red zone. Easton was 13-of-17 for 155 yards before halftime.

Central sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala was 11-of-19 for 110 yards before halftime but the offense was forced to punt three times on its five first half possessions. The offense drove to the Bulldog 30-yardline just before the half but a ball to the end zone went incomplete as the half ended.

The Blue Devils cut into the lead in the third quarter, scoring their first touchdown of the game on defense. Sophomore strong safety Tymir Hinton intercepted an Easton pass and took it 65 yards for a Blue Devils touchdown. It was the second interception for a touchdown this season by the Blue Devils. The two-point conversion made it 28-11.

But the Bulldogs answered immediately, going 65-yards in just seven plays to push the lead back to 35-11. They made it 38-11 on a Ricky Perez field goal from 38 yards with 33 seconds left in the third quarter.

Dolegala hit sophomore K.J. Smith with a three yard touchdown pass to cut the Bulldog lead to 38-18 with 10:16 left in the fourth quarter. The touchdown was the first for the offense on the day and capped an impressive 19-play drive that went for 75 yards. It was helped by a roughing the kicker penalty on a punt from Groth.

Following a Bryant score, Dolegala threw his second touchdown pass of the game, this time to sophomore running back Drew Jean-Guillaume to make it 45-25 with seven seconds left in the game.

## CCSU 16, at PENN 28 - Oct. 8, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team fell to 1-4 overall this season with a 28-16 road loss at Penn on Saturday. Penn is now 2-2 overall on the season. Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala completed 25-of-39 passes for a career-high 341 yards and a touchdown in the loss. Classmate K.J. Smith caught four passes for 120 yards, a career-high, including a touchdown. His touchdown went for 62 yards.

Central rushed for just 22 yards in the loss, and had 341 yards in the air. They turned the ball over twice and finished the day 0-for-4 on fourth down conversions. Penn had 389 yards of total offense and also turned the ball over twice. Each team had a pair of sacks. The Quakers took a 14-0 lead at the end of the first quarter with scoring drives on each of their first two possessions. The first drive took eight plays and went for 76 yards as quarterback Alek Torgersen rushed it in from seven yards out for the early lead.

Following a Central Connecticut fumble, the next Penn drive went for just 30 yards and took only three plays as Torgersen hit tight end Nicholas Bokun for the 19-yard score and the 14-0 lead. The Blue Devils cut the lead in half with 13:28 to play in the second quarter. Dolegala hit Smith for a 62-yard touchdown, the longest play from scrimmage for the Blue Devils this season. The Penn lead was 14-7 after Smith's third touchdown of the season.

Senior Ed Groth kicked a 39-yard field goal following a second Penn turnover and cut the Quaker lead to 14-10 with under 10 minutes to play in the first half. The Quakers pushed the lead to 21-10 with 6:26 left before halftime on a 29-yard scoring strike from Torgersen to Jimmy Gimmell. The drive went 10 plays and 75 yards, and the scoring play came on a fourth down play from the 29.

Penn opened the second half with an 80-yard drive capped by a Tre Solomon touchdown to push the lead to 28-10. Those would be their last points of the game. Groth's second field goal, this time from 27-yards out, cut the lead to 28-13 with under three minutes to play in the third quarter. With 11:22 left in the fourth quarter Groth hit again, this time from 26-yards out, to cut the Penn lead to 28-16.

Central was driving in the middle of the fourth quarter but a holding penalty on a big screen pass brought the Blue Devils back to midfield and they failed to convert on a fourth down conversion attempt.

## at CCSU 21, Wagner 25 - Oct. 15, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team fell to Wagner, 25-21, on Homecoming at Arute Field on Saturday afternoon. The Blue Devils led 21-10 at the half, but the Seahawks scored 15 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to remain unbeaten in Northeast Conference place.

Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala finished the game 18-of-36 for 243 and a pair of touchdowns. He also threw two interceptions. Junior Cameron Nash rushed 13 times for 97 yards and a touchdown in the loss. Junior Joey Fields finished the game with four catches for 98 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Jose Garcia had four catches for 88 yards and a touchdown, all career-highs. Junior captain Randall LaGuerre led the defense with 14 total tackles in the game. Junior Jarrod Cann, senior Carlton Nash and sophomore Kenneth Keen all had 11 stops in the game. Freshman Tajik Bagley posted his first career interception for the Blue Devils.

Wagner scored first on a 70-yard run from Denzel Knight near the end of the first quarter. Knight surpassed 120 yards on his first four carries in the first quarter and gave the visitors the 7-0 lead. The Blue Devils answered with a 10-play, 83-yard drive that ended on the first play of the second quarter, a two-yard touchdown run by junior Cameron Nash. Nash's score, his second of the season, tied the score with 14:56 left in the second. Wagner took a 10-7 lead on a 37-yard field goal from James Cooper with 12:39 to play in the quarter. Central took its first lead of the game on a 74-yard scoring strike from Dolegala to Fields. The play was the only play of the drive, and the longest play from scrimmage for the Blue Devils this season. It made the score 14-10. The Blue Devils increased the lead 21-10 on a 25-yard throw and catch to Garcia with 9:53 left before the half. The scoring catch was the first of Garcia's career and the second touchdown pass of the game for Dolegala. Cooper's second field goal of the game, this time from 30 yards, cut the Blue Devil lead to 21-13 on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Following a failed fake field goal attempt by the Blue Devils, Wagner drove the length of the field for another score. Alex Thomson hit Brandon Peoples from five yards out to cut the Blue Devil lead to 21-19. The score capped a 13-play, 90-yard drive. The two point conversion attempt came up short and the Blue Devils kept the two point lead. The Blue Devils could not pick up a first down on their next drive and were forced to punt. Wagner used a nine-play, 54-yard drive to score the game-winning touchdown and make it 25-21. Matthias McKinnon ran it in from one yard out for the score and the lead. The two point conversion was no good.

## CCSU 25, at Coastal Carolina 33 - Oct. 22, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team used an explosive second half but could not overcome a 20-point halftime deficit as #17 Coastal Carolina held on for a 33-25 Homecoming victory in Conway, SC. Central falls to 1-6 overall on the season while the Chanticleers improve to 5-2 overall on the season.

The Blue Devils turned the ball over three times in the first half leading to 17 Coastal Carolina points and they trailed 23-3 at halftime. Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala finished the game 24-for-40 for 293 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the loss. He was 15-of-21 for 190 and two scores in the second half. He had a pair of first half interceptions.

Coastal got on the board first when Dolegala's pass was deflected by Alex Searce at the four-yardline and Searce caught the deflection in the end zone for the 7-0 CCU lead in the first quarter. It was the first of two first half interceptions for Searce. Following a Blue Devil punt in the second quarter, quarter Tyler Keane hit Bruce Mapp for a 22-yard touchdown to cap a 14-play, 85-yard drive for the home team and push the lead to 14-0.

Searce struck again as Coastal scored for the second time on defense to push the lead to 20-0. Searce recovered a Cameron Nash fumble in the end zone for his third touchdown of the season. He posted his second interception of the game later in the quarter that eventually led to a field goal for Coastal. Senior Ed Groth's 32-yard field goal was the only scoring of the half for the Blue Devils. They trailed 23-3 at the break. Following a Coastal field goal the Blue Devils cut the lead to 26-10 with 5:25 left in the third quarter on a 12-play, 75-yard drive. Dolegala capped the drive with one yard touchdown run and was 5-of-5 for 60 yards on the drive.

The Blue Devils forced a Coastal punt and then posted their second straight scoring drive to cut the lead to 26-17 with 13:31 left in the fourth quarter. The drive went 10 plays for 82 yards and was capped by a 14-yard scoring strike to sophomore Jose Garcia. It was Garcia's second touchdown in as many weeks and cut the lead to nine. The Chanticleers answered with a score of their own and pushed the lead 33-17 with 9:13 left in the game. Keane hit Chris Jones for the score to push the lead back to 16. Central answered with another scoring drive to cut the lead to 33-25 with under eight minutes to play in the fourth. Junior Joey Fields caught a six-yard touchdown to get the Blue Devils within one score, after a two point conversion attempt to Brian Kowalczyk was successful.

## CCSU 6, at Robert Morris 19 - Oct. 29, 2016

The Central Connecticut football team fell to 1-7 overall and 0-3 in Northeast Conference play with a 19-6 loss on the road at Robert Morris on Saturday. The Blue Devils avoided their first shutout since 2014 with a score with under five minutes to play in the fourth quarter. Robert Morris moves to 2-8 overall and 1-3 in NEC play with their second home victory of the season.

RMU took the early lead after a stellar punt by the Colonials pinned CCSU deep in their own territory. On the second play from scrimmage Cameron Nash was tackled in the end zone for the safety and the Colonials took a 2-0 lead.

The Colonial lead stretched to 9-0 with 2:02 left before halftime with just their third rushing touchdown of the season. The score by Malik Wells capped a nine-play, 57-yard drive by the Colonials after the two teams had punted a total of nine times in the first two quarters.

Robert Morris pushed the lead to 12-0 with 6:43 left in the third quarter on a 47-yard field from Connor Shennan.

The Blue Devils were driving on their first drive of the fourth quarter, but a quick turn of events turned a possible CCSU touchdown into a defensive score for RMU. Sophomore quarterback Jacob Dolegala threw deep to junior Joey Fields in the end zone, but Fields was unable to bring in the potential first score for CCSU. A few plays later Dolegala was intercepted and RMU's Ryan Richards went 75-yards for the touchdown, making it 19-0.

The Blue Devils had four turnovers in the loss, including the interception return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It was the second in as many weeks against the Blue Devils.

Dolegala finished the game 30-of-50 for 253 yards but he threw a pair of interceptions in the game. Nash finished with 67 yards on the ground and 33 through the air. The Blue Devils outgained the Colonials 285-219 and had 21 first downs vs. just 11 for RMU. Sophomore Kevin Loschiavo led the defense with eight tackles in the loss. LaGuerre had seven to go along with his interception in the first half.

## at CCSU 37, Sacred Heart 35 - Nov. 5, 2016

Senior placekicker Ed Groth kicked his third field goal of the game with 15 seconds left and the Central Connecticut football team topped Sacred Heart 37-35 on Arute Field on Saturday afternoon. The game-winner came after the Blue Devils fell behind 35-34 on a four-yard pass from R.J. Noel to Moses Webb with 1:28 left in the fourth quarter. The Blue Devil offense, led by junior quarterback Jacob Dolegala, went 47 yards on eight plays to set up the game-winner from Groth. After a Sacred Heart timeout he struck his third field goal of the game and gave the Blue Devils the win, their second straight over Sacred Heart. Dolegala finished the game 25-of-43 for 328 yards and one touchdown. Junior Joey Fields caught eight passes for 122 yards and a score. Junior running back Cameron Nash had 24 carries for 78 yards and a touchdown in the win. Central got the scoring started in the first quarter when they pinned the Pioneers at the SHU four-yard line after being forced to punt on their opening possession. On third down, sophomore Tymir Hinton picked off Noel's pass at the 11-yard line and returned it for the touchdown. The extra point made it 7-0. The Pioneers went 69 yards over nine plays late in the first quarter to tie the score. Noel hit Moses Webb off a play-action pass for 21 yards and the extra point made it 7-7. Central scored on consecutive drives to take a 10-point lead heading into halftime. First, the Blue Devils went 51 yards over 11 plays and got to the Sacred Heart 12 yard line. Groth converted a 29-yard field goal to make it 10-7 with 12:21 left in the second quarter. CCSU went 68 yards in 12 plays and Nash capped the drive with a two-yard run for the touchdown to make it 17-7 with 5:09 to play before halftime. Sacred Heart began the second half with a scoring drive that took just two plays and 22 seconds. Jay Croom scored from 29 yards out to cut the Blue Devil lead to 17-14. The Blue Devils answered as Dolegala scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season to push the lead back to 24-14. His run capped a quick seven-play, 41 yard drive that was aided by a big kickoff return from junior Joey Field and an SHU penalty. The Pioneers had their own answer as they went 80 yards in eight plays to score again and cut the lead to 24-21 with 5:39 to play in the third quarter. Noel hit Andrew O'Neill from 39 yards out for the score. Central pushed the lead to 31-21 with 22 seconds left in the third quarter when Dolegala hit Fields from 37 yards out for a touchdown and the 10 point lead. Dolegala was 2-for-2 for 84 yards on the drive, including the touchdown. With 7:53 left in the fourth quarter the Pioneers cut the lead to 31-28. Noel rushed it in from one yard out to cap a 66-yard drive that took nine plays and cut the lead to three. A 39-yard field goal from Groth pushed the Blue Devil lead to 34-28 with 4:53 to play in the fourth quarter.
