NEWS, NOTES, AND STORYLINES

The American University men's basketball team will look for its first win of the season on Saturday, when they meet Saint Francis University at 2 p.m.

NO POLITICS. JUST BASKETBALL

• American is 2-1 in games after Thanksgiving under head coach Mike Brennan. The Eagles won their first game last season on the road at New Hampshire (68-50) on Nov. 28. In 2014, the Eagles fell to Columbia (52-43) and in his first season, defeated Saint Francis (75-43). This is the first post-Thanksgiving home game under Brennan.

ALL-TIME SERIES RECORD

• American is 12-6 all-time against the Red Flash of Saint Francis. Last season, SFPA defeated the Eagles, 68-48, on Nov. 21.

IN SEARCH OF 50

• Head coach Mike Brennan is searching for his 50th career win as head coach of the Eagles. He surpassed the 100-game mark last Thursday at Akron. His career record is 49-52.

BREAKING DOWN THE WAGNER LOSS

• Wagner forced American into a tough defensive matchup, sliding into a 1-3-1 and running its own version of the Havoc defense made famous by Shaka Smart. Despite a season-best 24 points by Sa'eed Nelson and 19 from Mark Gasperini, Wagner forced the Eagles to take 29 shots from the outside. The Seahawks scored 40 points inside the paint and showed a balanced lineup with 23 bench points.

SAINT FRANCIS SCOUT

• The Red Flash dropped their first two games to A-10 opponents Saint Bonaventure and Duquesne. In their last two games, the Red Flash defeated Chatham and Longwood. Josh Nebo leads the team in scoring (13.8), rebounds (9.0) and block (8). Keith Braxton is second on the team in both points (12.3) and rebounds (7.3). Jamaal King has scored in double figures in three of four games. In the Chatham contest, SFPA scored a season-best 119 points against the D3 school.

MEN'S BASKETBALL INTERVIEW POLICY

Head Coach Mike Brennan and players are generally available for interviews before or after practice. All interview requests must be coordinated through Nick Guerriero, Assistant Director of Athletics Communications (nickg@american.edu). Players will not grant interviews unless they are scheduled through the Athletics Communications Office. **PLEASE DO NOT CONTACT THEM DIRECTLY.** Coverage of practice must be cleared through Athletics Communications. No interviews will be granted prior to tip-off on game day.

COMMON FOE

• American and Saint Francis have one common foe this season with both sides facing Wagner. The Red Flash and Seahawks will joust twice in Northeast Conference play.

DEBUT TO REMEMBER

• Sa'eed Nelson scored a season-best 24 points in his Bender Arena debut against Wagner. Nelson played his first full 40-minute contest and shot 7-of-13 from the field and 8-of-10 from the free throw line. He added five rebounds, two assists and one steal.

MARKY MARK AND THE FUNKY BUNCH

• Mark Gasperini scored 19 points on Tuesday against Wagner. He moved into double figure scoring per game at 11.5. He leads the team in rebounding at 5.0 per contest and is shooting 47 percent from the field and 40 percent from the outside and free throw line.

BASKETBALL JONES

• Delante Jones continues to soar for the Eagles on the offensive side of the ball. Through four games, Jones is averaging 13.5 points per game and had back-to-back 18-point performances against Texas A&M and Akron. Jones is third on the team in rebounds at 4.5 per contest.

AND HERE'S TO YOU, MR. WASHINGTON

• James Washington finished with a season-best 18 points against Akron on Thursday. The shooting guard made 6-of-8 from the field, 2-of-3 from the outside and 4-of-5 from the line. Washington has 12 of his 18 in the second half against the Zips. This season, he joins Jones and Nelson in double figures scoring at 10.0 per game.

POINT GUARD POWER

• Sa'eed Nelson is turning out to be a smart, hard-working offensive minded point guard that is averaging 13.8 points per game. He had a pair of 12-point games to begin his career with the Eagles and then added seven against the Zips. Nelson's assist/turnover ratio this season is 1.25 with 10 assists on eight turnovers.

TOUGH ON D

• American has forced 13.0 turnovers a night with 6.0 steals per game. Despite allowing 70.8 points against, the Eagles matched up well against Maryland in the season opener.

IORIO, LAMONT SIGN NLI'S FOR 2017-18 SEASON

• American University head men's basketball coach Mike Brennan has announced the signings of Sam Iorio and Drew Lamont to National Letters of Intent for the 2017-18 season.

Iorio, a 6'6" guard/forward hails from Allentown, Pennsylvania. He attends Parkland High school coached by Andy Stephens. Iorio plays AAU for Jersey Shore Warriors coached by Tony Sagona. As a junior, Iorio averaged 19.0 point, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game. He was named the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference Player of the Year and was voted to the Second Team All-Pennsylvania. At Parkland, Iorio has led the Trojans to three straight District XI Championships.

Lamont, a 6'8" forward out of American Heritage in Plantation, Florida, is coached by Brent Maffet. Lamont plays his AAU ball for Team Breakdown. As a junior, Lamont averaged 16.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. Last season, American Heritage lost in the regional quarterfinals. His brother Drake is a junior at Western Michigan.

ONLY ONE UNDERCLASSMEN

• Sophomore Delante Jones was the only underclassman selected to the Preseason All-Patriot League Team. Jones, selected as the 2015-16 Patriot League Men's Basketball Rookie of the Year, is the top returning scorer, scoring 12.0 points per game as a rookie. A pure shooter, Jones shot 43 percent from the field and connected on 39 attempts from the outside. Jones worked on his ball-handling skills over the summer to try and lessen his turnovers after having the most giveaways last season with 79. The Chantilly, Virginia, native came on down the stretch by scoring in double figures in 13 of his final 14 games, and his performance had a great impact for his team as American won nine of its final 12 Patriot League games to finish at .500 in League action after a 0-6 start. Jones placed eighth in scoring (14.2 ppg) during Patriot League action and in the top 20 for the season at 12.0 ppg, leading all freshmen in both categories. He scored 18 points or more eight times during the season, with seven of those coming in Patriot League games. He became American's third Patriot League Rookie of the Year recipient, and first in a decade since Derrick Mercer won the honor in 2006. Jones will be asked to carry the load this season with the graduation of Jesse Reed after four years of service to the Eagles.

PAIR OF EAGLES TURNS PRO

• 2016 graduates Jesse Reed and Paris Maragkos have signed professional contracts for the 16-17 season. On Oct. 24, Reed signed in Luxembourg with Residence Walferdange. He is one of three American-born players on the squad. Although he played one season with American, Maragkos obtained his degree at American before signing a four-year deal with Greek club Olympiacos. Maragkos joins a roster filled with professional players from all over the world, including Erick Green (Virginia Tech / Reno (NBA D-League)), Nikola Milutinov (San Antonio Spurs), Kostas Papanikolaou (NY Knicks/Denver Nuggets) and former Maryland guard D.J. Strawberry.

TRANSFER IN WAITING

• Laurynas Motuzis will have to sit out the 16-17 season after transferring from Saint Xavier University (NAIA). Motuzis is a sharp-shooting specialist who shot 41 percent from the field and 38 percent from the outside. He was born in Lithuania.

FIFTH PLACE EXPECTATIONS

• Patriot League coaches and sports information directors have picked American to finish fifth in the Patriot League. This was the same spot AU was selected last season before finishing the season tied for fourth place.

AU HOOPS ON CSN

• Thanks to a continuing partnership with CSN Mid-Atlantic, four American University men's basketball home games will be seen live on CSN Plus for the 2016-17 season. The four games will be Wagner (11/22), Youngstown St. (12/10), Army West Point (Jan. 14) and Lehigh (Feb. 4). Veteran broadcaster and AU Alumnus Al Koken and Bram Weinstein and renowned author and Washington Post columnist John Feinstein will handle the CSN broadcasts.

Koken, a 1975 graduate of AU, has been a part of CSN since 1984. He is the reporter for Washington Capitals games on CSN. Weinstein, a 1995 graduate of AU, is the radio host of the Bram Weinstein show on ESPN 980 in D.C. weekdays from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. Feinstein, a distinguished author, radio host and print columnist returns for another season of AU Hoops on CSN.

• Mike Brennan is entering his fourth season at the helm of American University. He was named the 17th head coach of the American University men's basketball program on April 30, 2013.

• Brennan was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year and was honored as a finalist for the Joe B. Hall (top first-year head coach) and Hugh Durham (top mid-major head coach) Awards.

• Brennan goes down as one of the greatest first-year coaches ever at AU, winning more conference games (13) than any other coach, and tying Ed Tapscott for most overall victories (20). He is the only coach to lead his squad to the NCAA Tournament in his first season.

• Came to AU from Georgetown and previously his alma mater, Princeton University. He spent four seasons with the Hoyas after two as an assistant with the Eagles from 2007-09. Prior to that, he spent seven seasons with the Tigers, guiding the squad to three Ivy League titles as the top assistant.

• Spent a total of 12 years with Ivy League institutions, serving one season as a volunteer assistant coach at Columbia University after culminating an impressive playing career at Princeton.

• Was a four-year starter as an undergraduate at Princeton under legendary head coach Pete Carril. Brennan helped lead his team to Ivy League championships and the NCAA Tournament in 1991 and 1992. He was named Second Team All-Ivy in 1994.

• After earning his bachelor of arts in English from Princeton in 1994, Brennan went on to play professionally in the European Basketball League for teams in Germany, Belgium and Portugal.

• Married to Alana Woodard of Seattle, Wash. They currently reside in Northwest, D.C.

Fourth Season

Scott Greenman is entering his fourth season as an assistant coach at American University in 2016-17. Greenman played a major role in recruiting the 2015-2016 freshmen class — comprising of two 3-star recruits — including Patriot League Rookie of the Year, Delante Jones. Prior to his rookie season with the Eagles, Jones was named the league's preseason top freshman by Lindy's Sports and

CollegeSportsMadness.com.

The four-person freshmen class played 42% of the team's minutes in league play and accounted for over 45% of the team's points. Similar to the previous two seasons, the young Eagles finished the year playing their best ball, going 10-4 in their last 14 games.

In Greenman's three seasons at American, the Eagles have gone 6-2 in the Patriot League Conference Tournament.

In his first two seasons as Brennan's top assistant, Greenman helped lead the Eagles to back-to-back Patriot League Championship games, winning the league and advancing to the NCAA Tournament in 2013-2014, and upset top-seeded Boston University, 55-36, to claim AU's third Patriot League Championship.

The Eagles were ranked nationally in the top-10 in field goal percentage (.495) and points allowed per game (59.1), finishing seventh in each category. The Eagles were also 37th in the country with 15.1 assists per game.

Prior to coming to American, Greenman spent three seasons at Georgetown, being promoted from Assistant Director of Basketball Operations after just one season with the Hoyas. He worked directly with Brennan, then an assistant, all three years. Greenman was involved in

all aspects of the day-to-day operations of the program including scouting, film breakdown, on-campus recruiting and camps.

Georgetown won at least 21 games in each of his three seasons, securing 10-plus Big East wins and berths into the NCAA Tournament every season as well as the conference regular season title in 2013.

Prior to Georgetown, Greenman was an assistant coach at Princeton from 2007-10, where he helped orchestrate the biggest two-year turnaround in the history of the program. He was instrumental in building a team that would eventually win the Ivy League Championship and play in the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

In 2009, Greenman was selected as the head coach of the U.S.A. U-18 Maccabiah Team. The team spent the month of July in Israel competing in the Maccabiah Games, where they won a silver medal.

Greenman spent the 2006-07 season playing professionally in Israel for B'nei Ha'sharon, helping lead his team to a final four finish in both the Israeli Premier League Championship and the Israeli Cup.

Greenman played collegiately at Princeton from 2002-06 for current Georgetown head coach John Thompson III. In his senior year, he was named a unanimous first team All-Ivy selection in 2006 and named to the Academic All-Ivy League Team. During Greenman's sophomore year, he started every game and made a team-high 42 three-pointers en route to helping Princeton win the Ivy League and reach the 2004 NCAA tournament.

Greenman earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Princeton in June 2006. He currently resides in Falls Church, Va., with his wife Caitlin and their son, Jordan.



Matt Wolff

Assistant Coach

Boston Univ. '09

Seventh Season

Matt Wolff is entering his seventh season with American University men's basketball and his fourth under head coach Mike Brennan.

Brennan promoted Wolff to an assistant coach in May of 2013 after spending three seasons as the director of operations under former head coach Jeff Jones.

Wolff is responsible for scouting, recruiting and working with the forwards. Wolff has been instrumental developing the AU underclassmen and been part of three recruiting classes that saw over 10 forwards join the team.

In his first season as a coach Wolff helped lead the Eagles to the top of the Patriot League. After a second-place regular season finish, American upset top-seeded Boston University, 55-36, in Boston, to claim American's third-ever Patriot League Championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

The Eagles were transformed in 2013-14, surpassing a ninth-place preseason prediction, improving its win total by 10 games to make it first Tournament berth since 2009. American was ranked nationally in the top-10 in field goal percentage (.495) and points allowed per game (59.1), finishing seventh in each category. The Eagles were also 37th in the country with 15.1 assists per game.

In Wolff's first season as an assistant coach, four Eagles earned All-Patriot League honors, while senior center Tony Wroblecky had a career year, earning PL Defensive Player of the Year Honors. Junior guard Pee

Wee Gardner also flourished with Brennan's tutelage, being selected as the Patriot League Tournament MVP.

American was also successful off the court as sophomore guard Jesse Reed earned Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors to lead five Eagles on the conference Academic Honor Roll. Junior guard John Schoof was also named to the NABC Honors Court.

As director of operations, handling the day-to-day operations of the basketball office, including film exchange and breakdown, team travel, on-campus recruiting and team camps.

American won 52 games in Wolff's three seasons, going .600 (24-16) in Patriot League play. The Eagles won 20 games in both 2010-11 and 2011-12, making an appearance in the College Insider Tournament.

Wolff was a member of the Boston University men's basketball team, playing under his father, former head coach Dennis Wolff. Wolff started 54-of-94 games for the Terriers and was named the America East Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete his senior year. He was also named to the America East All-Defensive Team in his final season and ranked seventh in the conference in both assists per game (3.1) and assist/turnover ratio (1.2).

In 2005 Wolff and BU played in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT). Wolff was also a two-time captain, leading the Terriers in his junior and senior seasons.

Wolff graduated from Boston University in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. He currently resides in Arlington, Va.

Eddie Jackson begins his ninth season as a member of American University men's basketball staff and his second under head coach Mike Brennan.

Initially, Jackson served as American's director of basketball operations for three seasons. As director of operations, Jackson

was responsible for team travel, film exchange, film breakdown, community outreach programs and team camp. After doing a great job and contributing to the success of the 2008 & 2009 Patriot League Champions, he was promoted to Assistant Coach.

As an assistant with the Eagles, Jackson was responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, player development, and created the Jeff Jones Elite College Prospect camp. In his seven years, Jackson contributed to the development of nine All-Patriot First Team and eight All-PL Second Team members.

He also helped American to the highest winning percentage in the Patriot League during that time. As the head recruiter, Jackson's efforts played an integral part in the recruitment of Vlad Moldoveanu (two-time First Team All-Patriot), Charles Hinkle (First Team All-Patriot), John Schoof (All-Patriot and four-time All-Patriot Academic) and Darius "Pee Wee" Gardner (two-time Second Team All-Patriot and 2013 Patriot Tournament MVP).

His efforts later contributed to a minor role in the success of the 2014 Patriot League Championship team and the 2015 PL runner-up squad.

Jackson came to American in 2006 after spending time coaching at both the high school and AAU level. He served as an assistant varsity coach at South Lakes High School in Reston, Va., under the leadership of Virginia High School Hall of Fame head coach Wendell Byrd. While, with the Seahawks, he was in charge of scouting, preparing scouting reports, and on-court demonstration. In three seasons, he helped the Seahawks to a 58-24 overall record and a spot in the Virginia High School League State Quarterfinals.

Jackson also served as a head coach with Nova UNITED AAU Basketball Club in the D.C. Metropolitan area. In his last three years with the program, he assisted with the development and recruitment of over 30 scholarship players, including 24 Division I players.

In addition to his coaching experience, he created and served as a co-director of the East Coast Basketball Coaching Clinic. He also spent several summers working as a camp counselor at Eastern Invitational Basketball Camp and Top-100 Clinics throughout the East Coast. Jackson received dual bachelor degrees in economics and criminology from Ohio State in 2000.

Jackson resides in Maryland with his wife, Ewunike.

Second Season

Tommy Strine begins his second season at American in 2016. Prior to American, Strine spent one year at Richmond as the Video Coordinator and five years in administrative and coaching roles at the AAU and high school levels.

In 2015, Strine handled all travel, budget and equipment needs for the Eagles while also assisting the coaching staff with practice plans and video scouting. Strine helped coach Brennan run the Mike Brennan Camp and Elite Camp during the summer.

At Richmond, Strine oversaw all the video tasks under head coach Chris Mooney. In his only season with the Spiders, the team advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT as one of the top four seed in the postseason tournament. Strine also collaborated practice plans with the staff and was heavily involved in recruiting and scouting.

Prior to his stop in with the Spiders, Strine coached at Marion High School in Indiana where he led the tradition-rich school's JV team and was an assistant coach on the varsity team. His responsibilities included player development, scouting and game-plan preparation. Marion was ranked in the top 10 in Indiana's AP poll and finished the season with 18 wins. Strine helped coach and develop McDonald's All-American and Indiana freshman James Blackmon Jr. while at Marion.

Strine began his coaching career as the President of Teams for Spiece Basketball in Fort Wayne, Indiana. During his time at Spiece, he oversaw the logistics and development of over 100 AAU teams, grades 3-12. He coached teams at all age levels while also running camps and providing individual workouts to the top players in Indiana.

Strine played one year collegiately at Anderson University before injuries cut short his career. He ranks in the top 50 in Indiana high schools all-time scoring list, scoring over 1,600 points. He has worked camps throughout the country, while also working with the Fort Wayne Mad Ants of the NBDL.

He graduated from Fort Wayne in June of 2014 and was married in August 2014 to his wife, Sarah. They reside in Arlington, Virginia.

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Neil Kerwin President



Dr. Cornelius M. Kerwin became American University's 14th president in September 2007. He leads an institution of about 13,000 students, 1,300 faculty, and 2,000 staff in the nation's capital; oversees a \$548 million budget and \$434 million endowment; and led the \$200 million capital campaign to a successful conclusion of more than \$213 million raised.

Dr. Kerwin joined AU in 1975 and holds a faculty appointment in the School of Public Affairs, Department of Public Administration. He was dean of the School of Public Affairs from 1988 to 1997; provost from 1997 to 2005; and acting—then interim—president of American University from 2005 to 2007.

A nationally recognized specialist in public policy and the regulatory process, Dr. Kerwin is actively engaged in research and regularly teaches courses in administrative process, policy implementation, and American government. He founded AU's Center for the Study of Rulemaking and is the author of *Rulemaking: How Government Agencies Write Law and Make Policy* and co-author of *How Washington Works: The Executive's Guide to Government*.

Dr. Kerwin is a fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration; a former president of the National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration; and founding chair of the Section on Public Law and Administration of the American Society for Public Administration. He received degrees from American University (BA), the University of Rhode Island (MA in political science), and Johns Hopkins University (PhD in political science).

Dr. Kerwin is a member of the board of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities and was named a 2009 Washingtonian of the Year by Washingtonian magazine in its January 2010 issue. He was also named to the inaugural Irish Education 100 List, comprised of the 100 most influential Irish educators at colleges and universities throughout the U.S. and Canada and compiled by the Irish Voice. In 2011, he received the Educator of the Year Award from the World Affairs Council.

Before retiring in 2007, Dr. Kerwin's wife, Ann (BA 1971), was the director of Human Resources at the Corcoran Gallery of Art, one of the nation's oldest museums.

Dr. William Walker Director of Athletics



On February 28, 2014 Dr. William (Billy) Walker, then-deputy director of athletics at the United States Air Force Academy, was named the university's 14th director of athletics and recreation.

At the Academy, Walker most recently served as professor and head of the Physical Education Department and deputy director of athletics. He was responsible for day-to-day operations of the Academy's athletic department, including 190 employees, 23 NCAA Division I Olympic sports, and a multifaceted program involving physical education, cadet fitness testing and evaluation, and an intramural program for more than 4,000 cadets.

In his various appointments at the United States Air Force Academy, he also served as a physical education instructor, assistant wrestling coach, and director of the Fitness Testing and Evaluation Division. In 1993, he earned the Academy's highest instructional award. In 2001, Walker was appointed by President Bush as the first Permanent Professor of Athletics and Physical Education.

A recognized expert in intercollegiate athletic issues, Walker has served as chair of the NCAA Division I Wrestling Committee and is a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey Committee. An expert panelist for the U.S.

Department of Education and a key participant in the merger between two lacrosse leagues, he also spearheaded the formation of the Western Wrestling Conference in 2005, and still serves as its commissioner.


A native of Wisconsin, Walker graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 1983 with a Bachelor of Science. He earned a Master of Arts from California State University and his doctorate in physical education and sports administration at the University of Northern Colorado.

A command pilot with nearly 3,000 hours of helicopter flight time, Walker's professional responsibilities have included deputy command of the 89th Operations Group, an organization of 800 people responsible for directing the safe transport of the President of the United States, Vice President, Cabinet Secretaries, members of Congress, foreign heads of state, and other dignitaries around the world. His roles at Andrews Air Force Base also included commander of the 1st Helicopter Squadron and experience as a military assistant to the Presidential Inaugural Committee.
