2005-06 SEASON REVIEW

Under first year Head Coach Tim Army, the Providence College men's hockey team posted a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East, which was good for fifth-place in the league. The Friars were picked to finish eighth in the Hockey East preseason coaches poll, however they won 14 league games, one shy of a school record, en route to finishing fifth.

The return of Tim Army '85 to his alma mater brought plenty of excitement to the hockey program. The Friars began the season with two losses at Clarkson (5-2 on Oct. 14) and St. Lawrence (5-3 on Oct. 15). PC then won its next three games (all Hockey East contests). In that three-game win streak, the Friars recorded two shutouts (3-0 on Oct. 21; 4-0 on Oct. 22), in a home-and-home series against UMass Lowell. It marked the first time since 1976 that the Friars recorded back-to-back shutouts. Sophomore goalie Tyler Sims (Fort Worth, Texas) became the first Friar goalie to record shutouts in consecutive games. For his efforts, Sims was named Hockey East Player and Defensive Player of the Week.

The Friars recorded a 3-4-1 mark over the next eight games, including a home-and-home series sweep against Massachusetts (4-2 on Nov. 4; 3-2 on Nov. 5) and losses to Nebraska-Omaha (4-2 on Nov. 25) and RPI (3-2 on Nov. 26) at the Rensselaer/Bank of America Holiday Tournament. The Friars then went on a six-game winning streak as they outscored opponents, 30-8, in those six games. In that six-game win streak, the Friars posted impressive wins over No. 7 Maine (4-2 on Dec. 2), No. 18 Boston University (4-1 on Dec. 8) and No. 20 Boston University (5-1 on Jan. 6). In the six game span, the Friars captured two pieces of hardware. PC defeated Brown, 5-1, on Dec. 3, to claim the Mayor's Cup for the first time since 2003. The Friars also captured the Provi-

dence College Holiday Classic with victories over No. 11 Colgate (7-1 on Dec. 21) and Sacred Heart (5-1 on Dec. 22). Senior Torry Gajda (Westfield, Mass.) was named MVP of the tournament as he totaled one goal and four assists in the two games. Following PC's impressive run, the Friars were ranked No. 11 nationally on January 9.

After losing their next two games, the Friars won a historic game in Orono, Maine on Jan. 20. PC defeated No. 12 Maine, 4-0,

marking the team's first ever shutout win at Alford Arena. Sims made 20 saves to earn the shutout which tied a PC record. The following night, PC completed its two-game series at Maine with a 5-2 loss against the Black Bears. In their next game, the Friars skated to a 3-1 win over No. 10 New Hampshire on Jan. 27. That win enabled the Friars to vault to No. 9 in the national polls, their highest ranking since 2002.

The Friars persevered as they battled injuries to senior assistant captains James Pemberton (Cumberland, R.I.) and Nate Meyers (Maple Glen, Pa.), but the team struggled down the stretch, going 3-5-2 in their final 10 regular season games. PC's fifth-place finish set up a meeting against fourth-place New Hampshire in a best-of-three Hockey East quarterfinal series. It marked the second time in three seasons that the two teams met in the quarterfinals. UNH went on to defeat PC, two-games-to-none, including a 2-1 double overtime victory in the second game. Sims made a career-high 59 saves to lead the Friars. In addition, Sims' 59 saves marked the fifth highest total in PC history.

Despite the early finish to their season, the Friars enjoyed a strong campaign in 2005-06. PC scored 105 goals, 20 more than the previous season. In addition, the Friars scored 35 power-play goals, 13 more than they had in all of 2004-05. PC had nine players who reached a career high in points, led by Gajda who was tops on the team with 34 points (14 goals, 20 assists). Junior Chase Watson of Media, Pa. (33 pts.), sophomore Jon Rheault of Deering, N.H. (30 pts.), junior Colin McDonald of Wethersfield, Conn. (28 pts.), junior Tony Zancanaro of Trenton, Mich. (19 pts.), Meyers (15 pts.), senior James Pemberton (15 pts.), junior Dinos Stamoulis of Carle Place,

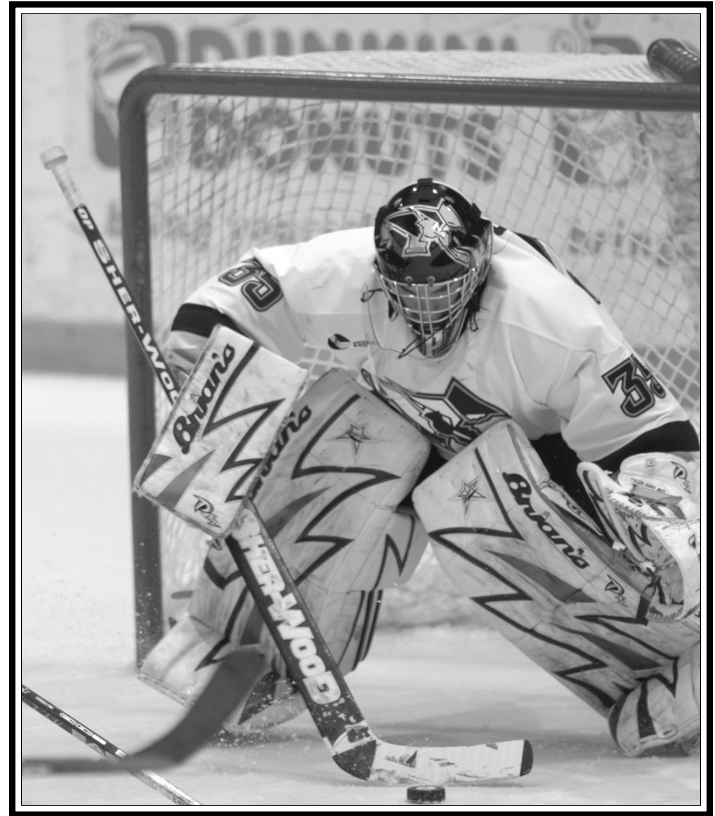

N.Y. (12 pts.) and sophomore Marc Bastarache of Lynn, Mass. (four pts.) all enjoyed career years in 2005-06.

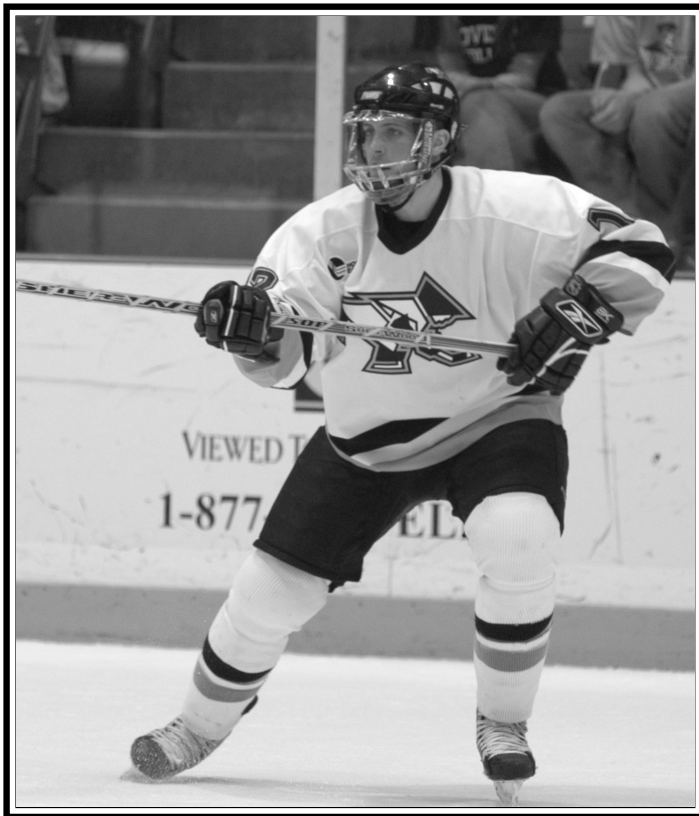
Army's offensive, aggressive style paid off in 2005-06. The Friars had six players record 20 or more points as opposed to having only two last season. Gajda, who last season finished with 13 points, nearly tripled his output this season, while Rheault came on strong toward the end of the season to lead the team in goals scored (16). Rheault finished third of the team with 30 points. The Friar defensemen, who totaled seven goals in 2004-05, tallied 16 goals in 2005-06. In addition to Pemberton who scored six goals and added nine assists, rookie Cody Wild (North Providence, R.I.) made a strong impact on the Friar squad as he tallied 21 points on six goals and 15 assists. He also led the team with four game-winning tallies. For his efforts, Wild was named to the Hockey East All-Rookie Team and was the runner-up for the league's rookie of the year award. Stamoulis also had an impressive season for the Friars totaling 12 points (three goals, nine assists).

Sims was the other Friar to garner a Hockey East honor as he was named All-Hockey East Honorable Mention. He finished the season with a 17-15-2 mark, a 2.32 goals against average and a .916 save percentage while playing in 34 of the team's 36 games.

Zancanaro, McDonald, Watson and junior Jamie Carroll (Andover, Conn.) were among PC's top scorers this season. Zancanaro's 11 goals was third on the team, while his 19 points ranked him seventh. McDonald had 19 assists, which was the third highest on the team and he finished with 28 points, which was the
