TEAM NOTES

- FSU improves to 46-12 and 22-7 on the road in ACC games under Head Coach Jimbo Fisher.
- Today marks the 11th straight game in which FSU has thrown for a TD.
- FSU continued to play stellar third down defense allowing just 4 of 14 third down conversions today (.285). The Seminoles came into today's game allowing opponents only a .286 success rate on third down.
- On Wake Forest's two field goal scoring drives, the FSU defense allowed a total of 27 yards. Both drives started inside the FSU 30.
- After Keith Gavin's 81-yard kickoff return, FSU started the drive on the Wake Forest 16-yard line. It was the best starting field position for FSU this season.
- Kyle Meyers had FSU's first turnover of the season with 5:09 remaining in the second quarter. It was his first career interception.
 Meyers also forced a Wake Forest fumble in the third quarter that was recovered by Jalen Wilkerson.
- The interception was the first of the season for Wake QB John Wolford, while the lost fumble was the first of the year for the Demon Deacons.
- FSU's 149 rushing yards were a season high.
- FSU's 15-play, 60-yard drive in the third quarter was the longest drive in plays this season. It took 8:22 off the clock as well, the longest in time for a scoring drive this season.
- -- FSU finished 4-for-4 in the red zone against the Demon Deacons. On the year, FSU is now 10-for-12 when reaching the opponent's 20-yardline.

PLAYER NOTES

- Auden Tate had one catch for seven yards entering the final minute of the fourth quarter but his 40-yard reception for the game-winning touchdown extended his streak to three straight games with a TD catch.
- Freshman QB **James Blackman** engineered the first game-winning touchdown drive of his FSU career with just 00:53 remaining in today's game.
- Jacques Patrick's 69-yard run from the FSU 1-yard-line was the longest of his career and FSU's longest of the season. It highlighted a 120-yard game for Patrick.
- Patrick crossed the 100-yard mark on his first run of the second half. It was his third career 100-yard game and first of 2017. Patrick added 26 yards receiving.
- Patrick's previous career-long rush was 41 yards against Louisville in 2016. It was the longest run the Demon Deacons have allowed this season.
- Patrick scored FSU's first rushing touchdown of the season in the second quarter. It was his tenth career rushing touchdown.
- True freshman **Cam Akers** added 58 yards. His 27-yard run on FSU's first drive of the third quarter was a career long.
- Kicker Ricky Aguayo added four field goals in the game. His first, from 51 yards, was the longest of his career. It was his second straight game with four made field goals.
- Aguayo has made eight straight field goals over the past two weeks. That is the longest streak of his career.
- Playing in place of injured offensive lineman Derrick Kelly, **Brock Ruble** recovered his first career fumble in the first quarter.
- **Logan Tyler**'s 57-yard punt in the second quarter tied his career high. His first 57-yarder came against Miami last season.
- **Keith Gavin**'s 81-yard kickoff return, after Wake Forest scored to take a nine-point lead, was FSU's longest since Kermit Whitfield's 100-yard return against Auburn in the 2013 BCS National Championship Game.
- Gavin also had FSU's longest kick return in 2016, a 66-yarder against Michigan in the 2016 Orange Bowl.
- Matthew Thomas had two 13-yard sacks on Wake QB John Wolford. It was Thomas's third and fourth career sacks and first two-sack game.
