SEMINOLES FACE COLORADO STATE IN SECOND ROUND OF JAMAICA CLASSIC

Florida State, which defeated Fordham 67-43 on Friday, takes on Colorado State in the Jamaica Classic on Sunday, Nov 19, 2017 at the Montego Bay Convention Centre. The Seminoles are 2-0 for the third consecutive season and for the 13th time in 16 seasons under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE VS. COLORADO STATE – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State will face Colorado State in the second round of the Jamaica Classic. The game between the Seminoles and the Rams is the second meeting of the two teams in the sport of men's basketball and first since an 84-54 Seminole victory on December 30, 1975 in the final round of the Far West Classic in Portland, Ore. Head Coach Larry Eustachy, also formerly the head coach at Southern Miss, Iowa State, Utah State and Idaho is in his sixth season with the Buffaloes. The Seminoles faced Eustachy and his Utah State team in the second round of the Preseason NIT on November 15, 1997. The Seminoles earned a 66-55 win over the Aggies on their way to the finals of the event, where they would go onto to lose to Kansas in the championship game. Assistant coach Steve Barnes was an assistant to Eustachy on the Utah State team that faced the Seminoles in Tallahassee in 1997. Robbie Berwick, who averaged 2.4 points and 1.0 rebound as a freshman at Florida State during the 2014-15 season, transferred to Colorado State and is eligible to play for the Rams this season.

SEMINOLES ADD TO RECORD BOOK WITH DEFENSIVE EFFORT AGAINST FORDHAM

Florida State turned in one of the most dominating defensive performances in school history as it limited Fordham to 43 points on a .231 percent shooting from the field and defeated the Rams by a 67-43 margin. The Seminoles' .231 field goal percentage defense mark is tied for the fifth best in school history and was their best since limiting George Washington to a .226 shooting mark in a 67-48 win on Dec. 4, 2016. Florida State allowed the Rams to make only 12 field goals. The Seminoles have held their first two opponents to a .313 shooting percentage. Florida State led the nation in both 2010 and 2011 in field goal percentage defense and the 1998 Miami Hurricanes (also coached by Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton) led the nation in field goal percentage defense.

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSIVE NUMBERS AFTER TWO GAMES

Florida State limited its first two opponents to an average of 55.0 points per game, a .313 combined field goal shooting mark (36-118), a combined .167 mark from the 3-point line (eight of 48), have blocked 17 shots (8.5 blocked shots per game) and have earned 20 steals (10.0 steals per game). The Seminoles have blocked nearly 15 percent of their opponents' 115 shots and have forced 42 turnovers (21.0 turnovers per game).

DUNK YOU VERY MUCH

Florida State, which led the nation with 183 dunks in 2017, is looking to win the nation's dunk crown for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles have 13 dunks in their first two games (6.5 dunks per game) with junior Christ Koumadje leading the way with six dunks. Florida State averaged 5.2 dunks per game during the 2016-17 season.

DOUBLE DIGIT VICTORIES

Florida State defeated George Washington by an 87-67 margin (+20) on Tuesday and defeated Fordham by a 67-43 margin (+24). The Seminoles have held at least a 20-point lead in both of its first two games (+28 vs. Fordham and +20 vs. George Washington) and led both of its first two games by at least 17 points at the half (52-30, +18 vs. George Washington and 35-18, +17 points against Fordham).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Colorado State and win its third game to open the 2017-18 season. It would mark the second consecutive year and 11th time under Leonard Hamilton the Seminoles would have opened a season with a 3-0 record;
...Defeat Colorado State and gain a win over a team from the state of Colorado for the third time in school history. The Seminoles have wins over Denver (1971-72) and Colorado State (1975-76).

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16) and 26-9 (2016-17).

SEMINOLES WIN TWO EXHIBITION GAMES TO OPEN SEASON

Florida State defeated Central Missouri (116-68 on Oct. 26) and Thomas University (122-52 on Nov. 7) as it won both of its exhibition games to begin the 2017-18 season.

MANN NOW RANKED THIRD IN CAREER FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

Junior Terance Mann, who is averaging 15.5 points per game, begins Sunday's game against Colorado State ranked third in school history with a career field goal shooting percentage of .591. He made his first seven shots of the game against the Colonials and finished the game on an .800 percent clip (eight of 10) from the field in leading the Seminoles in scoring for the third time in the last two seasons. Mann then made seven of nine shots from the field (.778 percent) in scoring 14 points in Florida State's victory over Fordham. Mann enters Sunday's game shooting a team-leading and career-high .789 from the field (15 of 19).

KOUMADJE NEARS TOP-25 FOR CAREER BLOCKED SHOTS

Junior Christ Koumadje blocked a career-high five shots in Florida State's season-opening victory over George Washington and has blocked nine shots in the first two games of the season. He has blocked 68 shots in the first 63 games of his career for a 1.08 blocked shots per game average. He is only seven blocked shots from moving into a tie for 20th place on Florida State's career blocked shots list.

KABENGELE IMPRESSIVE IN WIN OVER FORDHAM

Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele played the best game of his short career in Florida State's 67-43 victory over Fordham with a team-leading 15 points and a team-leading nine rebounds. He was outstanding in all elements of the game with his 15 points (on five of eight shooting from the field, .625 percent), nine rebounds (five offensive and four defensive), two assists and one steal in just 12 minutes of playing time.

MANN AND KABENGELE ARE THE ONLY TWO IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN FIRST TWO GAMES

Junior Terance Mann (17 points against George Washington and 14 against Fordham) and redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele (10 points against George Washington and 15 against Fordham) are the two Seminoles who have scored in double figures in both of Florida State's first two games. A total of five different Seminoles (Mann, Kabengele, Phil Cofer, Christ Koumadje and M.J. Walker) have scored in double figures in at least one of the Seminoles' first two games of the season.

KOUMADJE AND OBIAGU ARE QUITE A PAIR IN THE PAINT

Junior Christ Koumadje (nine blocked shots in the first two games of the season) and freshman Ike Ogiabu (seven blocked shots) have combined for 16 of the Seminoles' 17 blocks in the first two games of the season. Sophomore Trent Forrest, who earned a blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Fordham is the only other Seminole with a blocked shot during the first two games of the 2017-18 season. Florida State has blocked 17 of its opponents' 115 shots (.148 percent) while having only two of its first 120 shots (less than two percent) of the season blocked.

FORREST PLAYS WELL IN HIS 2017-18 DEBUT

Sophomore Trent Forrest made his sophomore-season debut against Fordham and did, well, what he has earned his reputation for doing. He led the team in assists with five (one below his career-high), totaled six rebounds (three below his career-best), totaled three steals (one below his career-high) and blocked one shot while making his only field goal attempt of the game for a total of two points. Forrest became the first freshman since Charlie Ward in 1991 to lead the Seminoles in steals with 43 during the 2011-12 season.

FLORIDA STATE VS COLORADO STATE – DEC. 30, 1975

Harry Davis scored 21 points and pulled down 16 rebounds to lead Florida State to an 84-54 victory over Colorado State at the Portland Memorial Coliseum in the final round of the Far West Classic on Dec. 30, 1975 in the only previous meeting of the Seminoles and Colorado State. Herbie Allen scored 17 points and Larry Warren added 14 as the Seminoles jumped out early and won going away. Florida State led 37-23 at the intermission and outscored the Rams by a 47-31 advantage in the second half to gain the victory. Zach Perkins totaled 11 rebounds as the Seminoles outrebounded the Rams by a 52-43 margin. Florida State handled the basketball well with 19 assists and only nine turnovers and played well defensively as it limited Colorado State to a .333 field goal shooting percentage (22 of 66). Florida State finished the season with a 21-6 overall record including a 13-0 mark at home in Tully Gymnasium.

Christ Koumadje – From Chad To Tallahassee

Christ Koumadje has a name that's not easily pronounced nor easily forgotten. At a daunting 7-foot-4, Koumadje is the tallest athlete in Florida State's history, and that's probably the least interesting fact about the sophomore basketball breakout.

Koumadje grew up in N'djamena, the capital of Chad, Africa. With a mom at 6-2 and an uncle at 7-3, Koumadje revealed that his extraordinary height does, in fact, run in the family.

"N'djamena is just a normal African city. A lot going on, neighborhoods, kids playing soccer," Koumadje said. "I still get to keep in touch with my friends and family through Facebook and WhatsApp."

When he was just 16 years old, Koumadje left N'djamena to attend school in Senegal. Little did he know that this decision would change his life.

Upon his arrival in Senegal, Koumadje was encouraged to take up basketball.

At that point, Koumadje had very little basketball experience. He instead played a great deal of soccer growing up.

Within just one year, Koumadje had moved from Chad, to Senegal, and from Senegal to the United States.

"The biggest challenge at first was the language and my accent," said Koumadje. "I feel like sometimes I think I'm saying a word right, but to this day people will still ask me what I mean."

Soon after his basketball career in the United States began at Montverde Academy in Orlando, Koumadje was noticed for his burgeoning basketball skills. Seemingly in the blink of an eye, he had scholarship offers from Florida State, Connecticut, Louisville, Tennessee, UCLA.

The offer that caught his eye came from Florida State and head coach Leonard Hamilton.

"I liked Coach 'Ham' a lot, and also the tradition of their 7-footers," said Koumadje. "With the success of Boris Bojanovsky and Michael Ojo, I can't think of any other school that had that many successful 7-footers playing."

Koumadje couldn't have made a better decision for his basketball career, because although only a sophomore, he has improved his game immensely. In addition, he gained 30 pounds in his first two years in Tallahassee.

Koumadje says it's his teammates and the Seminole coaching staff that push him to become a better player.

"Playing at Florida State always has me going against really good players," said Koumadje. "It also helps to practice with other 7-footers, like Ojo, and he teaches me how to use my height."

Koumadje says he couldn't have asked for a better experience than his time spent at Florida State so far. His admiration and appreciation for his teammates and coaches is mutual.

Koumadje enjoyed a standout sophomore season as he helped lead the Seminoles to 26 wins, a second-place finish in the ACC and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. He played in all 35 games, averaged a career-high 10.1 minutes played, averaged 4.4 points and blocked 40 shots as a sophomore.

"I'm excited for the next few years with Christ," said guard CJ Walker. "His energy and passion for the game is something that gives all of our teammates energy. Along with Christ and all of the returning players, I am looking forward to the future for our team."

"The potential for Christ to keep improving is without limits," said Ojo. "He is going to keep working with Coach Ham and the assistant coaches to keep improving. I know that's his personality. He wants to keep working to improve. He works hard to continuously improve because that's what he has made up his mind to do."

Koumadje was presented with two awards as the Seminoles' honors banquet at the end of the season by the Florida State coaching staff. He earned the award as the Seminoles' top field-goal percentage shooter and was presented with the Sixth Man Award along with the members of the "Boom Squad" group of rotation players.

"'Big Christ' is one of the nicest, but most highly competitive young men I have ever coached," said associate head coach Stan Jones. "In fact, he has a bit of a mean streak when things get tough in the heat of a game. But you would never know that if you just see him on campus and spend time with him off the court. He has a tremendous sense of humor and is a great teammate. Christ really and truly wants to develop into an elite big man and as he gains more confidence through playing experiences, I think his future is unlimited as a basketball player."

Koumadje is even more excited for what lies ahead.

"The future for our team is very bright," said Koumadje. "The players joining our team are all going to contribute and keep our talent level among the best in college basketball. For me, I just want to work with my teammates to get better and help our team win games. We are all working to get better every day and our coaches are pushing us to be the best we can be. Next season has already started for me and my teammates."
