SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO FACE RUTGERS IN ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE

Florida State, which is 5-0 for the fifth time under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, travels to play at Rutgers in the 19th Annual Big/Ten Challenge at the Louis Brown Athletic Center in Piscataway, N.J. on Tuesday, Nov. 28, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised on ESPNU. Florida State enters Tuesday's game against the Scarlet Knights with wins over George Washington (Nov. 14, 87-67), Fordham, (Nov. 17, 67-43), Colorado State (Nov. 19, 90-73), Kennesaw State (Nov. 22, 98-79) and The Citadel (Nov. 24, 113-78) and will play its first true road game of the season against Rutgers. With its victories over Fordham and Colorado State the Seminoles won the championship of the inaugural Jamaica Classic. The Seminoles are 5-0 for the first time since the start of the 2011-12 season when the Seminoles also won their first five games of the season. Florida State is playing in its 19th consecutive ACC/Big Ten Challenge against its ninth different opponent with Minnesota (six times) as its most common opponent. The Seminoles defeated the Gophers, 75-67, in Tallahassee in the 2016 challenge. Following Tuesday's game against Rutgers, the Seminoles travel to Gainesville looking for their fourth consecutive win against No. 6 Florida.

FLORIDA STATE VS. RUTGERS – CONNECTIONS

Florida State will play its first true road game at Rutgers at the Louis Brown Athletic Center on November 28, 2017. The game between the Seminoles and the Scarlet Knights comes on the second night of the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. Florida State has a 1-0 all-time record against Rutgers with the only game in the series coming as an 87-77 win on December 22, 1967 in Tallahassee. Rutgers is coached by Steve Pikiell who has never coached against Florida State. As an assistant at Connecticut during the 1991-92 season, he helped the Huskies to a 2-0 record against Leonard Hamilton's third team at Miami. Karl Hobbs, the associate head coach at Rutgers, totaled a 1-2 record against Florida State as the assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Connecticut from 1993-00. Brandon Knight, who is in his second season as an assistant at Rutgers, helped Pittsburgh to a 3-2 record against Florida State as a member of the Panther Program from 2008-2016. Ben Asher, the special assistant to the head coach at Rutgers, spent two seasons (2014 and 2015) as a graduate assistant under Mark Gottfried at NC State.

FLORIDA STATE'S LEADS BY THE NUMBERS

Florida State has won each of its first five games by an average of +23.0 points per game with each of its wins coming by at least 17 points. The Seminoles have led by at least 17 points in each of their first five games, held a season-high 41-point advantage against The Citadel (103-62, 6:19 second half) and have led each of their five games at half time by at least 12 points. The Seminoles' largest first half lead of 19 points came against George Washington, Kennesaw State and The Citadel while its largest second half lead of 41 points came in its victory over The Citadel in Tallahassee. Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Rutgers averaging 91.0 points scored per game – the fourth highest scoring average in the ACC. The Seminoles' +23.0 scoring margin is tied for the third highest in the ACC and ranks them as one of five teams in the league with a +21 points per game or higher scoring margin.

MANN AND M.J. WALKER NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT JAMAICA CLASSIC

Junior Terance Mann (17.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman M.J. Walker (11.0 ppg, 1.5 spg) were both named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team as the Seminoles took home the championship of the event with victories over Fordham (67-43, Nov. 17) and Colorado State (90-73, Nov. 19, 2017). For Mann and Walker, it marked the first time both players had been named to an all-tournament team during their collegiate careers.

SEMINOLES' M.J. WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman guard M.J. Walker, a consensus top-25 high school player in 2017, is on the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award watch list as named by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Walker is the 12th McDonald's All-American in Florida State history. He is one of two true freshmen and one of five players from the ACC on the 2018 Jerry West Award watch list.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Rutgers and win its second consecutive game in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Seminoles defeated Minnesota, 75-67, on November 28, 2016 in Tallahassee;

...Defeat Rutgers and improve to 6-0 for the first time since the start of the 2008-09 season when it won its first seven games of the season. The Seminoles advanced to the championship game of the ACC Tournament and played in the NCAA Tournament at the end of that season;

...Defeat Rutgers and win on the road in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge for the first time since a 70-69 Seminole win at Minnesota on Nov. 30, 2004.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 5-0 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES WIN TWO EXHIBITION GAMES TO OPEN SEASON

Florida State defeated Central Missouri (116-68 on Oct. 26) and Thomas University (122-52 on Nov. 7) as it won both of its exhibition games to begin the 2017-18 season.

SEMINOLES ADD TO TROPHY CASE

Florida State's championship in the inaugural Jamaica Classic was the fifth for the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and first since the Seminoles won the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer classic during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles most memorable championship title under Hamilton came at the 2012 ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles' championship at the Jamaica Classic was the 16th title in an in-season championship in school history.

FLORIDA STATE VS. RUTGERS – THE LAST GAME

Jeff Hogan scored 29 points and Dave Cowens scored 26 and pulled down 18 rebounds to lead Florida State to an 87-77 win over Rutgers in Tully Gymnasium on the Florida State campus. Hogan made 11 of 18 shots from the field and each of his seven free throws to leads the Seminoles to the win. Cowens was playing in the eighth game of his collegiate career as a sophomore (freshmen were ineligible at that time by NCAA rule) against Rutgers and was just beginning his All-American career at Florida State. Jan Geis scored nine and Randy Cable scored 7 for the Seminoles who led 40-35 at the half and won going away. Rutgers was led by Dick Stewart and Bob Greacen who scored 19 points each and Doug Brittllle who scored 17 points and pulled down 14 rebounds. Florida State shot .437 from the field (31 of 71) and .714 from the free throw line (.714). Rutgers outrebounded the Seminoles by a 43-29 margin.

THE JAM WITH HAM WINNERS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.231 Florida State held Fordham to a .231 shooting percentage (12 of 52) in its 67-43 win over the Rams on Nov. 17 in the Jamaica Classic – tied for the fifth best field goal defense mark in school history.

.357 Sophomore CJ Walker has made at least one 3-point field goals in each of the Seminoles' last three games. He is five of 14 (.357) from the bonusphere and is averaging 10.7 points per game since scoring 11 points in Florida State's victory over Colorado State in the championship game of the Jamaica Classic.

1 Mfiondu Kabengele totaled 16 points and 12 rebounds in 14 minutes of playing time against The Citadel on Friday night to earn the first double of his career.

1 M.J. Walker, who is shooting .500 from the 3-point line (11 of 22) is the highest ranking freshman in the ACC from the 3-point line and is one of only four players in the ACC shooting 50 percent or better from the bonusphere.

3 Sophomore Trent Forrest is one of only three players in the ACC (also Markell Johnson of NC State and Trevon Duval of Duke) who is ranked in the top six in the ACC for both steals (tied for fourth, 2.0 spg) and assists (sixth, 4.0 spg).

4 Sophomore CJ Walker enters Tuesday's game against Rutgers having made four consecutive free throws and is shooting a career-high .800 from the free throw line through the first five games of the season.

5 Florida State is undefeated, 5-0, when it outscores its opponent.

5 Senior Phil Cofer has started as many games this season (five) as he did as a sophomore (three) and a junior (two) combined.

6 Sophomore Trent Forrest has made six consecutive free throws entering Tuesday's game against Rutgers.

7 Braian Angola's seven made 3-point shots in scoring 21 points in the Seminoles' 113-78 win over The Citadel are tied for the fifth highest 3-point shots made total in a single game in school history. He tied, among 11 other Seminoles, PJ Savoy who made seven shots from the bonusphere in scoring 27 points against Southern Miss on Dec. 6, 2016.

12 Freshman Ike Obiagu has blocked 12 shots in the first five games of his career for a 2.4 blocked shots per game average. He is ranked fifth in the ACC in blocked shots per game.

38 Florida State attempted 38 3-point shots in its victory over The Citadel (Nov. 24). The Seminoles' 38 3-point shots against the Bulldogs ranks as the second highest total for 3-point shots attempted in a game in school history. Florida State attempted a school record 39 3-point shots in a 91-84 double overtime win over Wichita State in the first round of the NIT on March 17, 2004.

PHIL COFER IN THE LAST TWO GAMES...

...Is shooting .800 from the field (16 of 20). He was a near perfect nine of 11 from the field in scoring 21 points in Florida State's win over Kennesaw State (Nov. 22) and was a near perfect seven of nine from the field in scoring 15 points the Seminoles' victory over The Citadel (Nov. 24). He is shooting a career-high .643 from the field entering Tuesday's game against Rutgers;

...Is averaging 18.0 points per game after tying his career-high with 21 points against Kennesaw State (Nov. 22) and totaling 15 against The Citadel. He has scored in double figures in consecutive for the first time in his career entering Tuesday's game against Rutgers.

COFER IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN THREE OF FIRST FIVE

Senior Phil Cofer has scored in double figures in three of the Seminoles' first five games of season and enters Tuesday's game against Rutgers averaging a career-high 13.2 points scored per game. Cofer was limited by injuries as both a sophomore and a junior but looks to be as healthy as he has been since his freshman year as the 2017-18 season begins in earnest.

The staff has called Brian Angola the Seminoles' best on-ball defender, Phil Cofer the best off-ball defender, Christ Koumadje the best rim protector and Forrest to the most complete defender on the Seminoles' roster.

...Has scored 18 points and is averaging 9.0 points scored per game. He scored his season high of 10 points in the Seminoles' victory over The Citadel on Friday night in Tallahassee. Forrest has now scored in double figures six times in 39 games during his Florida State career;

...He is shooting .600 from the field (six of ten) and has made three field goals in both of the last two games. He enters Tuesday's game against Rutgers shooting .538 from the field after shooting .473 from the field as a freshman;

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. Mfiondu Kabengele Looking To Turn Heads This Year

Emerging as one of the more recognizable players on the Florida State men's basketball team, redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele was often known by his good-natured attitude, enthusiastically supporting his teammates from the sidelines during every game last year.

This year, however, the former three-star recruit from Ontario, Canada will certainly have the prime opportunity to showcase his abilities—those of which he had improved quite substantially throughout his redshirt year.

"Sitting out a year really helped him understand what he has to do to become a better player. He's lost 20 pounds since we got back from Jamaica," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton says. "He seems to be really focused."

From last year to this year, the 6-foot-9, 235-pound forward has in fact grown an inch and shed 20 pounds, allowing him to become a more versatile player that could take on multiple positions. Enduring a rigorous off-season, Kabengele worked alongside assistant head coach Stan Jones to better his overall game and prepare him for the upcoming season.

Oftentimes the first one in and the last one out of the gym, Kabengele sought to improve on many facets of his game, including his three-point shot and his overall maturity.

"He's improved his ball-handling, passing, and more than anything else, he has improved his understanding of how to play. He is versatile—we can play him at the five, we can play him at the four or the three."

At the Seminoles' first exhibition game of the season against Central Missouri, Kabengele finally set foot on the hardwood for his very first game at Florida State. With a seven-foot wingspan, the redshirt freshman stunned many.

"He works hard. He worked very hard in the off season," junior guard Terance Mann says. "He was working on all aspects of his game. He thought that rebounding would keep him on the floor and it is working."

In his first collegiate appearance, Kabengele collected 11 points, nailing five of his eight shots—one of which came from behind the three-point line. Just a rebound short of a double-double, the Ontario, Canada native also notched three assists and recorded a block.

"We've tried to develop a system of position-less basketball, with the exception of a post player," Hamilton says. "When he comes into the game, he gives us another perimeter and post guy who is versatile enough to give us a chance to create some problems for our opponents."

Kabengele's length, swiftness and shooting abilities will certainly create mismatches against opponents this upcoming season. Looking to run a new strategy from last year, coach Hamilton will utilize his guard-heavy squad and have four shooters on the floor alongside a post player. Kabengele's versatility would allow him to play and thrive at any position on the floor, creating opportunities for the team around him as well as himself.

"He's done a lot of swimming, he does a lot of extra running, he is watching what he is eating," Hamilton says. "He seems to be really focused. He's shown that if you work hard and stay focused, you will get better—he is the perfect example. We are very pleased of the progress he has made."

Up next for the 'Noles is their final pre-season exhibition matchup against Thomas University. The Night Hawks head to Tallahassee this upcoming season, which will allow the newcomers to become acclimated with the intensity of college basketball prior to the start of the season.

“Any time you have six first-year players, you’re going to have some breakdowns in areas that you have been working on,” Hamilton says. “Our young kids were somewhat nervous—that’s why these games are good. It gives them a chance to get out in front of the public and get those nerves out.”
