GAME NOTES

» The game-time temperature of 27 degrees was the second-coldest in FSU history, behind only the 1983 Peach Bowl (24 degrees) against North Carolina in Atlanta, Ga. It was the third-coldest game in Notre Dame Stadium since 1980.

- » Defensive tackle Cory Durden made the first start of his career. He blocked an extra point in the second quarter, the first blocked kick of his career and FSU's first since Walvenski Aime blocked one at Florida in 2017.
- » FSU started its 9th different offensive line combination in 10 games, the most of any Power 5 team in the country.
- » Nyqwan Murray caught a 6-yard pass in the first quarter, his 28th straight game with a reception. He finished with 79 yards. His six receptions (121) are 19th most in FSU history.
- » Running back Cam Akers' had touchdown runs of 7 and 8 yards. It was his fourth career 2-touchdown game and his second of the season. His 8-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was out of the Wildcat formation.
- » Akers' first touchdown capped a 16-play, 75-yard drive that took 7:36 off the clock. It was FSU's longest drive in terms of plays and time on the season.
- » Zaquandre White returned his first career kickoff in the second quarter. It went 20 yards.
- » Sophomore Stanford Samuels III intercepted his third pass of the season and the fifth of his career, both team highs. FSU scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive and has 45 points off turnovers on the season.
- » Junior linebacker Dontavious Jackson had his first career interception in the third quarter. FSU has intercepted multiple passes in three games this season (Samford - 4; Louisville, Notre Dame - 2).
- » Quarterback Deondre Francois went 23-of-47 for 216 yards. He jumped to 10th on FSU's career passing list with 5,815 yards and 9th on the career completions list (448).
