- » Florida State had its four-game home winning streak snapped in a 27-10 loss to rival Miami in front of a season-high Doak Campbell Stadium crowd of 63,995. The Seminoles (4-5, 3-4 ACC) travel to Boston College (5-4, 3-3 ACC) next week for a 12 p.m. game that will be televised on the ACC Network.
- Cam Akers accounted for 113 of FSU's 203 total yards (66 rushing, 23 receiving, 24 passing) to lead the Noles. He was responsible for 56 of FSU's 62 total yards on the lone touchdown drive of the game, which he capped by converting a flare pass from Alex Hornibrook into an 18-yard scoring play. Akers rushed for 20 yards, passed for 18 yards and had 18 receiving yards.
- Akers' touchdown was his 16th of the season (12 rushing, four receiving), tying him with Warrick Dunn (1995) and Antone Smith (2008) for the fifth-best single-season touchdown producing campaign in program history.
- Hornibrook completed 17-of-24 attempts for 135 yards but was sacked eight times and had his season-long interception-free streak snapped when Miami came away with a theft off the hands of an FSU receiver. Hornibrook also collected his first reception with the Noles, a six-yard pass from Akers to convert a third-down play.
- Ricky Aguayo's 37-yard field goal in the second quarter, the 53rd of his career, and his PAT after the Akers TD gives him 307 career points; just one point shy of Gary Cismesia for No. 7 on FSU's all-time list.
- Aguayo's field goal capped a 17-play, 54-yard drive that took 6:48 off the clock and cut Miami's lead to 7-3. It was the longest offensive scoring drive of the season in terms of plays and time of possession.
- The FSU defense limited Miami to just 3-of-15 on third-down conversion attempts and recorded a season-high nine pass break-ups. Levonta Taylor and Akeem Dent had two each.
- Linebacker Amari Gainer forced his second fumble of the season and safety Hamsah Nasirildeen recorded his first career fumble recovery in the second quarter in the second quarter for one of the Noles' 12 third-down stops.
- The Seminoles surrendered a season-low 40 rushing yards on 24 carries (1.7 ypc) against the Hurricanes.
- Emmett Rice led the Noles with seven tackles and fellow linebacker Leonard Warner had six stops.
