NO. 5 SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT VIRGINIA IN SECOND MEETING OF SEASON BETWEEN TEAMS

No. 5/6 Florida State, which has won 10 consecutive and 17 of its last 18 games, travels to play Virginia at the John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va., on Tuesday, January 28, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN. The Seminoles' game against the Cavaliers is the second of the season (and second in a span of 13 days between the two teams). Florida State defeated Virginia, 54-50, on January 15, 2020 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles arrive in Charlottesville ranked No. 5 in the Associated Press poll for the second consecutive week. It their highest ranking since the preseason and the first two weeks of the 1972-73 season when they were ranked second nationally. It's the third season in the last four years Florida State has been ranked for at least two weeks in the nation's top-10. The Seminoles were ranked No. 6 (January 23, 2017) and No. 9 (January 9, 2017) during the 2016-17 season and ranked No. 9 in consecutive weeks (December 24 and 31, 2019) during the 2018-19 season. Florida State made its debut in the 2019-20 polls at No. 17 during week five this season. Following its game at Virginia, the Seminoles will play at Virginia Tech on Saturday, February 1, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. before beginning a two-game home stand against North Carolina on ESPN's Big Monday Extravaganza on February 3, 2019 at 7:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

A MILESTONE FILLED NIGHT FOR FORREST AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Senior Trent Forrest scored his 1,000 career point (he enters Tuesday's game against Virginia with 1,009 career points), pulled down his 500th career rebound (he enters Tuesday's game against Virginia with 503 career rebounds) and earned his 200th career steal (he enters Tuesday's game against Virginia with 200 career steals). Forrest is just the second Seminole in school history – along with All-American Bob Sura – to score at least 1,000 career points, pull down 500 or more career rebounds, earn 400 or more career assists (he enters Tuesday's game against Virginia with 412 career assists) and total 200 or more career steals.

SEMINOLES LOOK TO MOVE TO 18-2 AS THEY PREPARE TO FACE VIRGINIA

Florida State enters Tuesday's game at Virginia with a 17-2 record. A win would move the Seminoles to 18-2 and tie their best start to a season in school history. Head Coach Leonard Hamilton guided the Seminoles to an 18-2 start to the 2016-17 season. Florida State defeated Louisville on January 21, 2017 to improve to 18-2. The Seminoles lost their next two games to move to 18-4. They finished the 2016-17 season with a 26-9 record and a 12-6 record in ACC play – good for a second place finish in the ACC standings.

SEMINOLES RIDING 10 GAME WINNING STREAK HEADING INTO VIRGINIA

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Virginia having won 10 consecutive games – a streak that began with a 72-53 win over Clemson at the Donald L. Tucker Center on December 8, 2019. The Seminoles' 10 game winning streak is its longest since winning a school record 12 consecutive games from Nov. 25, 2016 (72-61 win over Illinois) through January 10, 2017 (88-72 win over Duke).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 46-10 overall (.821 winning percentage) and 20-6 in ACC play (.769 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. With its 3-1 record in the 2018 NCAA Tournament the Seminoles, are 49-11 (.817 winning percentage) since defeating Missouri on March 16, 2018.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Virginia and improve to 18-2 on the season. It would mark the second time in school history the Seminoles would have won 18 of their first 20 games. Florida State began the 2016-17 season with an 18-2 record;

...Defeat Virginia and improve to 8-1 in ACC play for the first time since joining the league for the 1991-92 season; ...Defeat Virginia and win its eighth consecutive ACC game. An eighth consecutive ACC win would mark their longest streak since winning eight straight conference games from January 22, 2019 (77-68 win over Clemson) through February 19, 2019 (77-64 win over Clemson);

...Defeat Virginia and sweep the two-game regular season series against the Cavaliers. It would mark the first time since the 2011-12 season that the Seminoles had defeated Virginia in two games during the regular season;

...Defeat Virginia and win its fourth consecutive ACC road game. The Seminoles have won (in order) games at Louisville (78-65, January 4), at Wake Forest (78-68, January 8) and at Miami (83-79 in overtime, January 18).

HAMILTON THE SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 351 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game at Virginia as the sixth winningest coach in ACC history. He needs just THREE wins to move into a tie for fifth place in ACC history (tying Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins) and became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 162 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020, at Miami on January 18, 2020 and against Notre Dame on January 25, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 162 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Including its 85-84 win over Notre Dame on Saturday night in Tallahassee, Florida State is 38-8 (.826 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship. Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on January 18 was the Seminoles' ninth consecutive overtime win.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

With its overtime victory over Miami in Coral Gables on January 18, Florida State has won nine consecutive overtime games. During that stretch of nine consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last nine overtime opponents by a 124-76 margin including a 14-10 margin over Miami on January 18.

SEMINOLES IN OVERTIME IN ACC PLAY

Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games against teams from the ACC. In addition to its streak of nine consecutive overtime wins, Florida State defeated Maryland, 73-70, on January 17, 2009 to begin its streak of 10 consecutive wins in overtime against teams from the ACC.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which shot .929 from the free throw line (13 of 14) in its victory over Notre Dame on Saturday night in Tallahassee, maintained its lead as the best free throw shooting team in the ACC. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Virginia with a .770 team free throw shooting percentage. Florida State is shooting .813 from the free throw line in their last four games – all wins. The Seminoles are shooting .782 percent from the free throw line (241 of 308) in their 17 wins. Senior Trent Forrest is shooting .900 percent from the free throw line in the last four games (18 of his 20) in victories over Wake Forest, Virginia, Miami and Notre Dame.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA -- THE LAST GAME

Devin Vassell scored 18 points, including a 3-pointer and a pair of free throws in the final seconds, and No. 9 Florida State won its eighth straight game, 54-50 over Virginia, on January 15, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Anthony Polite came off the bench to drill four 3-pointers for the Seminoles. Mamadi Diakite scored 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting for Virginia which turned it over 18 times and made just 21 shots from the floor. Tomas Woldetensae was 3 of 4 from 3-point range but the rest of the Cavaliers were 0 for 11 from beyond the arc. Trent Forrest had five points, seven rebounds, seven assists and four steals for FSU. The Seminoles had 10 steals and five blocks.

3 Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has named three captains for the 2019-20 season – Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker and Harrison Prieto.

4 Florida State is looking to play in its school-record tying fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

5 Redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray has made one 3-point field goal in five different games this season – at Florida, against Clemson, vs. USF, at Wake Forest and at home against Notre Dame – the Seminoles are 5-0 in those games.

6 Freshman Balsa Koprivica has made six consecutive free throws and enters Tuesday's game at Virginia shooting .741 from the free throw line. He was a perfect two of two in the first half of Florida State's 85-84 win over Notre Dame on Saturday night in Tallahassee.

8 Redshirt sophomore Anthony Polite and sophomore Devin Vassell are tied for eighth in the ACC with 31 steals each and 1.6 steals per game averages entering Tuesday's game at Virginia.

11 Redshirt sophomore Anthony Polite has 11 steals in the last three games – three in Florida State's wins over Virginia and Notre Dame and five in Florida State's victory at Miami. He is averaging 2.8 steals per game during that span.

14.0 Junior M.J. Walker is averaging 14.0 points scored per game with three double figure scoring games in his last five outings. He totaled his season-high of 23 points in Florida State's victory at Louisville on January 4, 2020.

17 Florida State is undefeated, 17-0, when it outscores its opponent.

44 Redshirt sophomore Malik Osborne has started 44 career games – 27 as a true freshman at Rice (2017-18 season) and 17 as a redshirt sophomore at Florida State (2019-20 season).

FLORIDA STATE AVERAGING NEARLY 10 STEALS PER GAME TO LEAD THE ACC

Florida State, which has earned 44 steals in the last four games (11.0 spg) enters Tuesday's game at Virginia as the ACC leaders in steals with 186 and a 9.8 steals per game average. The Seminoles are averaging 2.6 steals more per game this season than they did last season when they finished the season ranked third in the ACC in steals. With an 11.0 steals per game in 2006, Clemson was the last team to lead the ACC with a double digit steals average for an entire season. Maryland set the ACC record for steals in a game with a 12.7 steals per game average during the 1999 season.

Forrest was a perfect seven of seven from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Saint Francis on November 23.

It marked his third double figure scoring game of the season after back-to-back 11 point performances in victories over North Florida (December 17) and South Florida (December 21). Gray has now scored in double figures in four career games including the Seminoles' victory over Murray State in the second round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

RayQuan Evans – “My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.”

RaiQuan Gray – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

Anthony Polite – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

Trent Forrest – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

Balsa Koprivica – “My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.”

Malik Osborne – “My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father.”

M.J Walker – “My full name is James Michael Walker, Jr. I am named after my father who is James Michael Walker, Sr.”

Devin Vassell – “My full name is Devin Anthony Vassell. I got my first name from my grandmother. My parents were going to name me Anthony, but my grandmother preferred Devin, so that's what my family went with.”

Harrison Prieto – “My full name is Harrison Hansbrough Prieto. I'm named after my great-grandfather, Peter Harrison Hansbrough, but my mom liked the named Harrison more than she did Peter, so she chose to name me Harrison.”

NICEVILLE, Fla. – Trent Forrest scored 17 points to lead Florida State to a 63-60 overtime victory over Purdue in the Emerald Coast Classic championship game. The Seminoles outscored the Boilermakers 5-2 in the extra period by getting their points at the free-throw line including the final two with only one second left to play. CORAL GABLES, Fla. — No. 9-ranked Florida State forced 24 turnovers, including three in a row in overtime, and rallied Saturday to earn their ninth consecutive victory by beating Miami 83-79. Sophomore Devin Vassell set a career high for the third consecutive game by leading Florida State with 23 points while adding 11 rebounds and five assists. His two free throws with six seconds left sealed the win. Walker played only 23 minutes because of foul trouble but scored 19 points, all in the second half, Malik Osborne's three-point play with 2:25 left in overtime put the Seminoles ahead to stay. The Seminoles won despite shooting 42 percent and committing 16 turnovers. They compensated by scoring 21 points off takeaways. Not that Florida State's characteristically strong defense wasn't stout from the start. The Hurricanes had to call a timeout when they were trapped on the game's first possession. They blew a dunk, threw up air balls and had 10 shots blocked. But Miami stayed in the game early with a strong defensive effort of its own. DJ Vasiljevic sank a 3-pointer and then scored on a breakaway to give the Hurricanes their biggest lead with 5:20 remaining, 65-56. The Seminoles have won nine consecutive overtime games, including two this season. Their last OT loss came against Iowa in December 2016.

Florida State Basketball Guard Devin Vassell Becoming A More All-Around Player

Florida State guard Devin Vassell has ice in his veins.

As a freshman, the moment was never too big for him and he never backed down even during the Seminoles' run to the Sweet 16.

After playing the sharp-shooter role on last year's team, he wants to become an all-around player in his second year.

"Just play as hard as I can on defense and not really worry about offense," Vassell told the *Democrat*.

"Just try and get all the little things like the deflections, the steals, and rebounds and just all the little things to help our team win."

Despite being a freshman, Vassell was the top shooter on FSU's roster a season ago.

He knocked down 41.9% of the threes he took. No other player shot over 39% from beyond the arc last season.

Vassell connected on 26 of the 62 three-point shots he took, and all 26 were assisted. His ability to catch and shoot immediately is a valuable weapon for the FSU offense.

"It's a lot of hours I just did with coach C.Y. (Charlton Young) and coach (Stan) Jones and just with the whole coaching staff," Vassell said.

"I'll just say that credit to them to, you know, get me to where I am and I just keep working every day."

FSU needs Vassell to step up this season after losing half of last year's roster to graduation and the NBA.

With six newcomers, Vassell is one of the more experienced players on the roster, at least from a playing at FSU standpoint.

But he's not only stepped up his play on the court. He's become one of the leaders of the locker room despite being one of the youngest players on the roster.

"We expect him to continue the improvement that he showed us from the beginning of the season last year until now," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"The difference that I expect to see from Devin is his maturity, his confidence. He is a lot more vocal. He's becoming a guy who is the voice in the background who's consistently vocal enough to help guys remember exactly what he's supposed to do. He's been outspoken, as much as any sophomore that I've seen."

The system that FSU runs requires the players to be in top shape due to the effort that they have to play with when they're on the court.

The Seminoles rotate players constantly and players are supposed to give everything they have for around a four-minute stretch before coming off for the next wave of players.

The pace of the game and the effort that FSU requires was one of the things that were the hardest to adjust to last season, according to Vassell.

He's put in a lot of work this off-season to make sure he's ready for it as a sophomore.

"I probably gained about 10-15 pounds over the summer," Vassell said.

"I've just been really working on my defense to be able to guard one through four and just be able to switch it and be the match-up problem on offense and on defense."

Unselfishness, Toughness Help Vault FSU Into Associated Press Top-5 In Men's Basketball

Hugh Durham believes two qualities best exemplify the Florida State men's basketball team:

Unselfishness and toughness.

Durham, who led FSU to the 1972 NCAA Championship game and the team's last top-5 ranking during the 1972-73 season, says that's a difficult balance. He credits Seminoles coach Leonard Hamilton for the ability to get players - including those with their sights on the NBA - to commit to his system.

"Players accept their roles," Durham said Monday from his Jacksonville hometown.

"When you turn on the television, that's not what you see all the time. The perception might be this guy is not putting the team first. I think that's what is unusual about Florida State. Somehow, Leonard is able to get his players to buy in. I think that, along with the talent he recruits, he gets the talent buying into that concept."

FSU (16-2 overall, 6-1 ACC) continued its surge under Hamilton Monday, when it vaulted to No. 5 in The Associated Press men's college basketball poll.

It's the Seminoles' highest ranking since they were No. 2 in the opening weeks of the 1972-73 season under Durham. FSU was also ranked No. 6 in Monday's USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Seminoles haven't missed a beat from last season's Sweet 16 team that featured two NBA Draft picks.

Since its season-opening defeat at Pittsburgh, FSU has won 16 of 17 and is riding a nine-game win streak.

The Seminoles, who haven't lost since playing Indiana in the Big Ten-ACC Challenge the first week of December, are also in a first-place tie with Louisville in the ACC standings. Their next game is Saturday at home against Notre Dame (11-6, 2-4).

To say craziness abounds this season is an understatement.

Baylor, at No. 1 this week in the AP poll, is the seventh team on top this season. That matches the record set in 1983 for the most No. 1s in the history of the poll, which dates to the 1948-49 season.

"It's the first time when you can clearly say there are no favorites to win the NCAA Tournament," former FSU coach Pat Kennedy said Monday from his New Jersey home.

"It's not so much people getting beat, but how they are getting beat. This is one of Leonard's best overall teams I think since he has been there. They have tremendous experience. These kids are confident."

Seven top-25 teams in the Associated Press poll lost last Saturday, including three of the top-5. Six were steamrolled by double digits by unranked opponents.

FSU, meanwhile, jumped four spots in the poll after it beat reigning national champion Virginia at home and survived overtime at Miami, rallying from a nine-point deficit with five minutes remaining. The Seminoles won despite shooting 42 percent and committing 16 turnovers.

They may not always rely on style points, but it's difficult to argue with the results.

"When you watch them, they are tough, they are versatile, they are gritty – they get the job done," former Seminole (1988-93) and Tallahassee resident Byron Wells said.

"To me, it seems like somebody different is stepping up every game. When you think about our teams compared to this one. ... we didn't play defense like this one. The game was different when I played. It's so much more physical now."

Sophomore 6-foot-7 guard Devin Vassell has emerged as the Seminoles' go-to player. He is averaging 17.2 points, 7.2 rebounds and 1.8 steals while shooting 39.1% from 3-point range in the past five games. He finished with 23 points, 11 rebounds, 5 assists, 2 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Hurricanes.

Still, FSU has relied on the toughness and unselfishness Durham stressed.

Ten players are averaging double-digit minutes played. Three are averaging in double figures, led by Vassell at 13.2 points per game, followed by Trent Forrest (11.8) and M.J. Walker (11.6).

The Seminoles are outscoring opponents by 11.9 points per game (75.5 to 63.6) to rank third in the ACC behind Duke and Louisville. They are also 9-0 at home, 59-3 in their last 62 games.

NCAA Tournament bracket projections have pegged the Seminoles as high as a No. 2 seed. FSU has never won a national title in men's basketball.

"Leonard's team is one that always seems to find a way to win games," said Kennedy, who led the Seminoles to the Elite Eight in 1992-93. "Look what's already happened this season. Florida State is going to have a good shot at it (national title)."

Hamilton, in his 18th season at FSU, hasn't shown any signs of slowing down at age 71. FSU Athletics Director David Coburn told the Democrat last week that the school is working toward a contract extension for the winningest head coach in program history. Hamilton's contract expires in April.

"Leonard looks like he's 40," Wells said and laughed.

"We are blessed to have him here. I am so proud of the type of kids he has in the program. They represent the university so well. He has done such an amazing job of putting his program together and keeping it going."
