TOP 10 SEMINOLES RETURN HOME FOR GAME AGAINST DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION

No. 9/9 Florida State, which has won seven straight and 14 of its last 15 games since a 63-51 win over No. 6 Florida on November 10 in Gainesville, plays host to Virginia on Wednesday, January 15, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles defeated Wake Forest, 78-68, last Wednesday in Winston-Salem, N.C. and have won each of their games since a 72-53 win over Clemson on December 8. Florida State is ranked in the nation's top 10 (No. 9) for the second consecutive week and is included in the nation's top 25 for the sixth consecutive week. The Seminoles debuted in the national polls at No. 17 on December 2 after defeating both Tennessee and Purdue to win the championship of the Emerald Coast Classic. The Seminoles' No. 9 national ranking marks the third time in the last four seasons they have been ranked in the nation's top 10. Florida State was ranked as high as No. 6 during the 2016-17 season and as high as No. 9 during the 2018-19 season. Following Wednesday's game against Virginia, the Seminoles travel to play at Miami for the first of two games this season against the Hurricanes on January 18, 2020 at 1:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 57-3 (.950 winning percentage) in its last 59 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles earned a 15-1 record home record during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Virginia having won .950 percent of their games (57-3) and .903 percent of their ACC games (28-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) during the 2016-17, 15-1 at home during the 2018-10 season and are 8-0 at home this season.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Florida State is 36-8 (.818 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 43-10 overall (.811 winning percentage) and 17-6 in ACC play (.739 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. With its' 4-1 record in the 2018 NCAA Tournament the Seminoles, are 46-11 (.807 winning percentage) since defeating Missouri on March 16, 2018.

FLORIDA STATE ENTERS WEDNESDAY'S GAME WITH A 14-2 OVERALL RECORD

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Virginia with a 14-2 record and an .875 winning percentage. The Seminoles have won seven consecutive and 14 of their last 15 games since a 63-51 win over No. 6 Florida.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC

Florida State is 16-2 in regular season ACC games (.889 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson (77-68) on January 22, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won 12 of their final 13 regular season ACC games of the 2018-19 season and have won four of their first five ACC games of the 2019-20 season. During that stretch of games, Florida State is 9-0 at home and 7-2 on the road in ACC play with victories at Miami (January 27, 2019), at Syracuse (February 5, 2019), at Georgia Tech (February 16, 2019), at Clemson (February 19, 2019), at Wake Forest (March 9, 2019), at Louisville (January 4, 2020) and a Wake Forest (January 8, 2020).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Virginia and gain its fourth win over Virginia in the last six games between the two teams. The Seminoles are 3-2 against the Cavaliers since a 69-62 win at home on Jan. 17, 2016 and defeated No. 2 ranked Virginia, 69-59 in the semifinals of the 2019 ACC Tournament; ...Defeat Virginia and win its eighth consecutive game. It would mark the second consecutive season FSU has won at least eight consecutive games.

HAMILTON TIED AS THE SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 348 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Virginia tied as the sixth winningest coach in ACC history. He needs just six wins to move into a tie for fifth place in ACC history (tying Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins) and only two wins to become the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

HAMILTON ONLY ONE WIN FROM TOP FIVE ACC RANKING

With 159 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton needs only one ACC win to tie Frank McGuire and become the fifth all-time winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020 and at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 159 ACC wins during his career, and needs only two conference wins to move sole possession of fifth place in ACC history with 161 all-time ACC wins.

FLORIDA STATE WITH THREE VICTORIES OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State has won three games against ranked teams – all in games away from Tallahassee. The Seminoles have won two true road games against top-10 ranked teams – at No. 6/6 Florida and at No. 7/8 Louisville. They defeated No. 16/17 Tennessee on a neutral site in the third round of the Emerald Coast Classic at the Arena at Northwest Florida State College. Florida State's Leonard Hamilton has now led the Seminoles to victories over 24 teams ranked in the nation's top 10.

FLORIDA STATE TOUGH TO BEAT AT HOME

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Virginia having won 17 consecutive home games. The Seminoles won their final nine home games of the 2018-19 season and have won their first eight home games of the 2019-20 season. The Seminoles' current streak began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE'S DOUBLE DIGIT ACC WINS

Florida State has won each of its last four consecutive ACC games by double digits. It marks the first time since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 that the Seminoles have won four consecutive games by double figures. The Seminoles have defeated the Tigers, Yellow Jackets, Cardinals and Demon Deacons by an average of 13.5 points per game.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA – THE LAST GAME

David Nichols scored 14 points to lead Florida State to the championship game of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament for the first time since 2012 as the Seminoles defeated top-seeded and No 2 ranked Virginia, 69-59, on March 15 2019 at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, N.C. Phil Cofer had 11 points and 7-foot-4 center Christ Koumadje added nine points and nine rebounds for the Seminoles. De'Andre Hunter had 13 points for Virginia, which had its nine-game winning streak snapped and suffered its first loss to a team other than Duke. Florida State was in control from the start. The Seminoles built a 35-31 at halftime behind the inside play of Koumadje, who had seven points and nine rebounds in the first half after registering just two points and two rebounds in a 65-52 loss to Virginia earlier this season. Florida State broke open the game midway through the second half with a 13-1 run led by Nichols, a graduate transfer who scored on a drive, a low post move, and a turnaround jumper during the stretch. While Nichols was heating up, the Cavaliers couldn't score, going nearly 6 1/2 minutes without a field goal.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY AGAINST VIRGINIA

With a 3-2 record against Virginia since the beginning of the 2015-16 season, Florida State and Duke (4-1 against the Cavaliers) are the only two teams in the ACC with a winning record in the last four seasons against the Cavaliers. The Seminoles earned wins over the Cavaliers on January 17, 2016 in Tallahassee, December 31, 2016 in Charlottesville and March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament in Charlotte.

SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS

Florida State, which has earned double figure steals in nine of its first 16 games of the season, enters Wednesday's game against Virginia as the ACC steals leader. The Seminoles have earned 152 steals and are averaging 9.5 steals per game. Florida State has two players ranked in the top 10 of the ACC steals leaders (Devon Vassell, eighth; Trent Forrest, ninth) and ranks as the only team in the ACC with 150 or more total steals this season. Florida State earned a season-high 16 steals in its victory over Purdue in the Championship game of the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic.

Florida State averages 19.3 points off of its opponents' turnovers through the first 16 games of the season. The Seminoles have forced at least 13 turnovers and have earned at least nine points off of turnovers in each of their matchups entering Wednesday's game against Virginia.

SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Virginia as the No. 1 ranked team in the ACC in free throw shooting percentage with a .759 mark. The Seminoles have shot 75 percent or better from the line in eight different games including a .750 mark in their win at Wake Forest on January 8 (18 of 24). Florida State's 18 free throws made was the sixth time this season the Seminoles made 18 or more free throws in a game with its season high of 27 made free throws in its 113-56 victory over Chicago State on November 25, 2019 in Tallahassee. FSU Hoops Succeeds With Unselfish Players Putting Team First

Florida State's basketball program doesn't need a star to carry its program. The 10th-ranked Seminoles are succeeding by committee and doing things the way coach Leonard Hamilton wants them.

For a stretch of three-plus minutes to start the second half Wednesday against Wake Forest, the most annoying college basketball team in the country to play against did everything wrong.

They turned the ball over on three consecutive possessions. They missed all five field goal attempts. They were out of whack defensively, which led to Wake Forest going on a 11-0 run on its home floor and taking a 45-41 lead.

But as Florida State is wont to do, Leonard Hamilton's starless team awakened by using its athleticism and length, allowing the Seminoles to permanently regain control of the game they eventually won, 78-68. Just as it did in a 78-65 road win at Louisville four days earlier, FSU snapped out of a funk and went on a 17-5 run, never allowing its opponent to feel comfortable the rest of the game.

This is the FSU way. The Seminoles are an eminently beatable team in spurts, often aided by their own self-destruction, but outplaying them over 40 minutes is a difficult chore. They have a tendency to wear people down with a suffocating defense that clogs passing lanes, causing opponents to often rush shots and taking them out of their game plan.

FSU's current success — a seven-game win streak, going a league-best 16-2 in ACC games since last January — didn't happen overnight. It took Hamilton more than a decade of 18 seasons in Tallahassee for his game-winning formula to evolve, but the No. 10-ranked Seminoles (14-2, 4-1 in ACC) are on a pretty good roll now.

They come at opponents in waves, playing 10 or more players each game. You never know from one minute to the next whether guards Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker, Devin Vassell or a relatively unknown player will be the cold-blooded assassin.

That's because Hamilton trusts the second guy near the end of the bench almost as much as his starters on the floor.

Case in point: when FSU's frontcourt ran into early foul trouble at Wake Forest, he put seldom-used, walk-on Harrison Prieto in the game. Playing a career-high 10 minutes, the 6-foot-8 junior contributed two offensive rebound buckets and a steal that led to a Vassell three-pointer.

At that point, Prieto had played only 12 minutes all season in blowout wins. Yet Hamilton sent him out there in an ACC road game because he needed a big body to hold the fort until Patrick Williams, Malik Osborne and Dominik Olejniczak could return.

"We win by committee and most teams feature people," Hamilton said Thursday in a phone interview. "We don't feature one particular person. We let the game come to them. We have a system where we get everybody involved. I think that makes us more challenging to play. The go-to person is the guy with the highest percentage shot. Our guys all feel equal.

"We don't have a Zion Williamson that makes you [media] guys tickle your fancy. We're not quite as sexy. We are different. We're not like everybody else."

That's part of the appeal in Hamilton's recruiting pitch. He and top assistant Stan Jones — who has been with Hamilton for 25 years, dating back to his coaching stints with the NBA Washington Wizards and the University of Miami — have convinced players to accept their role. Even if it means reduced playing time.

Over the last four seasons, where FSU is 92-31 overall and 38-21 in ACC play, Hamilton's system has taken the 'Noles to three consecutive NCAA tournaments and a potential top-4 seed this year.

After a Sweet 16 and Elite Eight appearance the past two seasons, FSU again looks like someone nobody wants to play because Hamilton has a team — six of the top eight players by playing time are freshmen or sophomores — performing better than the sum of its parts.

"It's the vision the coaches have for us," said Forrest, a senior and the team's leading scorer at 12.1 points per game.

"Part of the reason you come to FSU is because you know you're going to play with other unselfish guys. It's a credit to the coaches for recruiting those players and then the players for buying into it.

"So far, everything they've said about this program has happened. It doesn't matter how you get the win. That's how we play. Some days, you play great. Other days, you can play the sorriest team in D-I and they can go on a run, but it's how you respond to it that matters."

The players tend to reflect Hamilton's unflappable sideline demeanor. When things go haywire, like it did briefly against Wake Forest, the Seminoles appear unfazed and just go about their business.

"You look over and see [Hamilton] calm, cool and collected," said Forrest. "That's a reason a lot of us don't get worried too much when we hit adversity."

The Seminoles certainly don't get rattled in tight games coming down to the final minute. Since winning at Duke on Michael Snaer's buzzer-beater in January 2012, FSU is 36-8 in games decided by one possession or overtime, where it has won eight straight the last three years.

Under Hamilton, 71, the fifth-longest tenured coach at any Power 5 school, FSU has gradually made the climb in recent years to challenge the ACC bluebloods, where Duke, North Carolina, Virginia, Louisville and Syracuse have long established traditions.

"When you're in a conference with rich programs that have Hall of Fame coaches, it challenges every fiber you have to compete at a consistent level," said Hamilton. "We've kind of figured out how to maintain who we are.

"There's a reason why all programs are where they are. Florida State had been inconsistent for a long time. The reality is nobody cares about the challenges you face. The bottom line is to get it done."

In the twilight of his coaching career, Hamilton — tied with Maryland's Lefty Driesell as the sixth-winningest coach in ACC history with 348 victories — has FSU basketball in a good place.

Just like Hamilton's milestone marriage to wife Claudette, with their 50th anniversary approaching in September, the patience he and the FSU administration have had with each other is now bearing fruit.

Not many ACC coaches would have survived going their first six years without making the NCAA tournament. Hamilton has taken his share of criticism over the years for in-game strategy and simply not winning enough.

His critics have quieted down, especially now that Hamilton is experiencing the kind of consistent success Seminoles' fans wish they could get back to in football.

FSU doesn't need a star player who can carry the program. It's doing just fine the Leonard Hamilton way.

The Unconquered Spirit of Trent Forrest

Imagine racing around on a hardwood basketball court, dribbling the ball at top speed and trying to beat players to the basket while experiencing excruciating pain in your big toe. Now think about doing that in 31 more games, over 900 minutes of playing time against elite talent in America's top basketball conference---the Atlantic Coast Conference---with that big toe throbbing all the time.

Got the picture? Then you are looking at FSU's Trent Forrest who coach Leonard Hamilton says: "represents what the Unconquered Spirit means." Playing with a bum toe last year Forrest averaged 9.3 points, had 138 assists and 69 steals in 37 games.

It is no wonder that a healthy Forrest's return as a senior leader precipitates high expectations that 2019-20 will be a stellar season for Florida State basketball.

Asked about his leadership role Coach Hamilton explains that it is a no-brainer: "Trent has always had the same role he had as a freshman. He came here as a leader and he displayed stronger, better and wiser leadership every year that he has been here. So, we are expecting more of the same."

In the 6th game of his junior season, playing Villanova, an on-court collision caused his big toe to bend way up, far beyond normal. It hurt a lot and at first seemed to be bad case of "turf toe" that was eventually determined to be torn cartilage. Every step hurt. Disdaining mid-season surgery that would have ended his season Forrest elected to play through the pain.

How could he manage that?

He says: "Kinda just wanting to play so bad for my teammates. I guess it's just a high pain tolerance is all I can say." Amazing! And the good news is, after off-season surgery, Trent is back, pain free and as he says; "ready to rock."

You gotta love the game to go through all that. It's obvious Trent loves basketball. As a baby, when his parents put different small balls in his crib he reached for the basketball.

Later, as a youngster he slept with his basketball every night.

Even though Forest grew up in the small town of Chipley, population 3,526, his talents did not go unnoticed despite playing in the state's smallest high school classification. When you score over 3,000 points the scouts will find you. He received offers from Georgia, Ga. Tech, Alabama, Wake Forest, Miami, Tennessee, Providence and Wichita State.

He elected to go to Florida State, just 86 miles from home via I-10, because he says: "I felt like I could relate a lot with the things Coach Ham was doing. It was just the relationship I had with the coaches. I was able to trust them, and they were able to trust me about things in their program and even things outside of the program."

Forrest says his biggest adjustment to college basketball was "the speed of the game and understanding the college game. It's more in-depth and teams are going to have scouting reports on you."

Four years later the Seminoles are looking to Forrest to lead a team that has made it to the NCAA Playoffs three years in a row. In 2018-19 Seminole Basketball had a sparkling, best-ever 29-8 record. This coming off two other stellar 26-win seasons that been topped only once (27 wins in 1971-72).

"Just that past experience, especially last year will definitely help me be a better leader this year," Forrest said.

Forward RaiQuan Gray, who played in 36 games as a freshman agrees: "Last year Trent was one of our leaders and we looked up to him. I feel like this year he will have an even bigger role. I think he will be a vocal leader who brings everybody together."

The late President Ronald Reagan once said: "There is no limit to the amount of good you can do, if you don't care who gets the credit." Except for the fact it was before his time the President accurately described Trent Forrest.

Coach Hamilton says: "Even though he scored close to 3,000 points in high school, he is such an unselfish player that he plays to win not to get statistics."

Even though he might not light up the scoreboard in his points column he does even better. Corey Clark explained on Warchant.com: "Forrest is one of those rare players who can dominate an opponent without taking shots. That's the beauty of his game. He puts his imprint on games in every way imaginable."

The basketball court is not the only place where Forrest makes an impact. Ashton Henderson, FSU's Assistant Athletic Director for Student-Athlete Development, says: "Trent hit the ground running when he matriculated to Florida State University. He has been doing everything with my office for community service. He constantly shows up for everything we have going on. He is there. I send him the text and he brings all the guys with him."

Henderson has been impressed with the way Trent relates with everyone and becomes just one of the group; "He's a guy who has all that attached to his name and seeing how humble he remains, his meekness and then he still remains so competitive on the court. He will speak to the janitor. He will speak to anybody who needs their day to be brightened. I have always respected that about him. Trent Forrest is somebody you want to model your program after."

Gene Deckerhoff, the Radio Voice of the Seminoles, for over 40 years calls Forrest "a tremendous basketball player" but is equally impressed with his off-court presence. "He's always got a smile when you see him. Not a moody kind of guy. His teammates love him. He's the real deal."

Forrest's upbringing accounts for many of his admirable personality traits. He grew up in a Christian home. His mother, Barbara Lee, is the pastor of *All Things New Worship Center* and Forrest played drums in the church. Both his mom and dad, Lester Forrest, played basketball for Chipola Junior College.

In the mornings when his mom got up at 5:30 a.m., Trent got up and started working on basketball drills. Then after school he worked out as well. That committed work ethic continues. This summer after having the foot operation, before he could walk around again, he would lift weights and practicing dribbling while sitting down. He was determined to be in shape when fall basketball practice rolled around.

The things he learned in the backyard, the playgrounds and high school gyms came with Forrest to college. Raquan Gray says: "Trent is a great driver. He is able to move around and find an opening and when he drives he sees everybody. You have to be ready."

In early 2018 the Seminoles were in possession on a 27-game home-winning streak against non-conference foes. That was in jeopardy in an ACC-Big 10 matchup with 19th ranked Purdue leading 72-71 when Forest caught a pass in the lane from Terance Mann, drove in and floated a shot into the basket with 5.2 seconds left to put FSU up 73-72. Not content to admire the shot, Forrest raced back down the court and stole a pass to seal the win and make it 28 in a row for FSU.

Those are the kinds of plays Seminole fans have come to expect from Trent Forrest. When the game gets tough Forrest rises to the occasion.

He said that he draws some strength from his coach when panic is about to set in: "In pressure situations you look over and Coach Ham has the same face he had at the beginning of the game. He is not showing any panic or

anything,” Forrest said. “You get a timeout, in the crucial time and he is always calm and collected. You see that, and you know there is no need to panic.”

Forrest is happy to be able to play basketball close to his home town where family and friends can come to the games. One favor he can do for his friends is to help keep the streak alive against their arch-rivals, the Gators. The Seminoles have won five in a row against them.

In 2018, a year that Forrest scored in double-figures 15 times, Forrest scored 13 points and had five assists in FSU’s 81-60 win over Florida. “I definitely want to be able to say I never lost to the Gators. Winning that game gives me lots of ammunition to take back home.”

Looking back on his college career Forrest feels like he has maximized the benefits and was able to give back. He is thankful that his scholarship made that possible. Forrest says: “The scholarship means a lot. You can’t thank the Boosters enough because they are investing in the student athletes here. It’s beneficial to people like me to be able to come here and chase their dreams.”

Trent Forrest’s scholarship was a sound investment by the Boosters for as Ashton Henderson said: “I am sure that Trent is going to be very successful and will make FSU proud.”

After all he embodies the true Seminole Unconquered spirit.
