NO. 5/6 SEMINOLES FINISH OUT COMMONWEALTH WEEK AT VIRGINIA TECH

No. 5 Florida State, which has been ranked in the nation's top 10 for three consecutive weeks, travels to play Virginia Tech at the Cassell Coliseum in Blacksburg, Va., on Saturday, February 1, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. The game marks the Seminoles' second consecutive contest in the Commonwealth of Virginia after playing at Virginia in Charlottesville on Tuesday. Florida State enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech having won 17 of their last 19 games including wins over three nationally ranked teams (No. 6 Florida, No. 17 Tennessee and No. 7 and previously No. 1 ranked Louisville) as well as seven wins in its first nine ACC games of the season. The Seminoles enter the month of February with three or fewer losses for just the third time in school history: 1969-70 (18-2 entering February), 1971-72 (16-3 entering February) and 2019-20, (17-3 entering February). Following Saturday's game at Virginia Tech, the Seminoles return home for two consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center against North Carolina (February 3, 7:00 p.m.) and Miami (February 8, 12 Noon).

SEMINOLES TIE SCHOOL RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS IN THE NATION'S TOP-10

Florida State has spent three consecutive weeks in the top-10 of the national polls – tying a school record of also three straight weeks in the top-10 during the first three weeks of the regular season during the 1972-73 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 46-11 overall (.807 winning percentage) and 20-7 in ACC play (.741 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. With its 3-1 record in the 2018 NCAA Tournament, the Seminoles are 49-12 (.803 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN THE ACC IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech with eight wins in its last 14 ACC road games since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles' eight wins have come at Miami (78-66, January 27, 2019), at Syracuse (80-62, February 5, 2019), at Georgia Tech (69-47, February 16, 2019), at Clemson (77-64, February 19) and at Wake Forest (65-57, March 9, 2019) during the 2018-19 season and as well as at Louisville (78-65, January 4, 2020), at Wake Forest (78-68, January 8, 2020) and at Miami (83-79 in overtime, January 18, 2020) during the 2019-20 season. The Seminoles are one of seven ACC teams with a winning road record in ACC play in the last two seasons. With a 2-1 record in the 2019 ACC Tournament, Florida State is 10-7 against ACC competition away from the Donald L. Tucker Center.

ALL-ACC CANDIDATE VASSELL IN THE LAST SEVEN GAMES

Sophomore Devin Vassell enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech having scored in double figures in a career-high seven consecutive games and averaging 16.3 points per game (114 total points) since scoring 14 points in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech on December 31. Vassell has scored nearly twice as many points in the last seven ACC games this season (114) than he did as a freshman in 16 ACC games (58 points).

ALL-ACC CANDIDATE FORREST IN SELECT COMPANY

Senior Trent Forrest is just the second Seminole in school history – along with All-American Bob Sura – to score at least 1,000 career points (he has scored 1,013 career points), pull down 500 or more career rebounds (he has 506 career rebounds), earn 400 or more career assists (he has 415 career assists) and total 200 or more career steals (he has 203 career steals). Forrest needs just 36 steals to become the all-time leader in the steals category at Florida State – surpassing the great Charlie Ward (238 steals, 1991-94).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

- ...Defeat Virginia Tech and win its third consecutive game against the Hokies. The Seminoles defeated the Hokies on March 5, 2019 in Tallahassee (73-74 in overtime) and on March 14, 2019 (65-63 in overtime) in the ACC Tournament at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte;
- ...Defeat Virginia Tech and win its eighth ACC game of the season for the school-record 12th consecutive season. The Seminoles have won at least eight ACC games each year since the 2008-09 season and won a school record 13 ACC games during the 2018-19 season;
- ...Defeat Virginia Tech and win its 96th game since the start of the 2016-17 season making this four-year period the second winningest in school history. The Seminoles won 98 games from 2016-2019.

HAMILTON THE SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 351 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game at Virginia as the sixth winningest coach in ACC history. He needs just THREE wins to move into a tie for fifth place in ACC history (tying Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins) and became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY

With 162 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020, at Miami on January 18, 2020 and against Notre Dame on January 25, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 162 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Including its 85-84 win over Notre Dame on January 25 in Tallahassee, Florida State is 38-8 (.826 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship. Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on January 18 was the Seminoles' ninth consecutive overtime win and 10th consecutive overtime win in ACC play.

SEMINOLES WITH NINE DIFFERENT LEADING SCORERS IN FIRST 20 GAMES

With his team-leading 17 points in Tuesday's night's game against Virginia, sophomore Devin Vassell has now led the Seminoles (or been tied for the team lead) in scoring in 10 of Florida State's first 20 games of the season. He is one of nine players who has led the Seminoles in scoring this season.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which has shot nearly 80 percent from the free throw line in its last 80 games (59-75, .787), enters Saturday's game as the ACC leaders in free throw percentage with a .766 team shooting mark. As a team, the Seminoles made 13 of 14 shots from the line in their win over Notre Dame (.927 percent) and were 15 of 18 in their win over Miami on January 18 (15 of 18). The Seminoles' .766 mark would rank second in school history for a single season should they maintain their percentage for the reminder of the season. Of the best free throw shooting teams in school history, four of the top five have come under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA TECH - THE LAST GAME

Terance Mann's shot with 1.8 seconds left in overtime helped the No. 12 Seminoles edge No. 16 Virginia Tech 65-63 in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament quarterfinals on March 14, 2019 at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte. Mann's shot broke a 63-all tie for the fourth-seeded Seminoles, who secured the win when Nickeil Alexander-Walker missed a long 3-pointer at the horn on a desperation inbounds play from the far end. Mann had the biggest shot of the game, but the Seminoles had two other big ones to secure this one in a testament to their balance. That included freshman Devin Vassell hitting a contested 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left in regulation to force overtime. Vassell scored 14 points to lead the Seminoles, who started the game with a 17-4 lead yet ended up in that tense finish. It finally came down to Alexander-Walker missing a contested shot in the paint with about 10 seconds left in overtime. The Seminoles didn't call timeout, opting instead to push the ball back the other way. Alexander-Walker finished with 21 points for the Hokies, including a 3 that bounced up off the front rim and dropped through the net for a 63-60 lead with 1:40 left in OT.

Wilkes Rewards Teammate's Faith With 3-Point Barrage in Win over Notre Dame By Tim Linafelt, Senior Writer Seminoles.com

As he watched the last of his five 3-pointers sink through the bottom of the net, Wyatt Wilkes backpedaled down the floor with an ear-to-ear grin on his face.

Applause from the sold-out crowd at the Donald L. Tucker Center poured down on him, and Wilkes' face seemed to be asking the same question that was one everyone else's mind:

What the heck is going on here?

"I couldn't believe I got another one, mostly," Wilkes said with a laugh. "It's just fun. It's fun to hit shots."

Wilkes did plenty of that during Florida State's 85-84 win over Notre Dame on Saturday night: 6-of-10 from the floor — including 5-of-6 from 3-point range — and two free throws for a career-best 19 points.

Count it as one of the most stunning performances in the program's recent history, maybe since Deividas Dulkys went off for 32 points against North Carolina in 2012.

Not because Wilkes isn't a great shooter – coach Leonard Hamilton believes that Wilkes could end up as one of the best that FSU basketball has ever seen.

But because, due in large part to Florida State's deep roster, Wilkes hasn't had all that many opportunities to show it.

The redshirt sophomore forward came into Saturday's contest averaging about nine minutes per game, and he had taken only 36 shots all season.

And, were it not for an injury to standout freshman Patrick Williams, Wilkes' breakout performance against the Fighting Irish might never have happened.

Williams, however, missed the game and Wilkes more than made the most of his expanded role.

"I was just so happy for him," Hamilton said, "because he's put the time in. There's no doubt that his teammates, they all have a tremendous amount of confidence in him. And I think you're just seeing the tip of the iceberg."

That confidence didn't come by accident, either.

Both Wilkes and his teammates credited FSU's internal culture with allowing something like what happened on Saturday to come about.

Not that Florida State's characteristically strong defense wasn't stout from the start. The Hurricanes had to call a timeout when they were trapped on the game's first possession. They blew a dunk, threw up air balls and had 10 shots blocked. But Miami stayed in the game early with a strong defensive effort of its own. DJ Vasiljevic sank a 3-pointer and then scored on a breakaway to give the Hurricanes their biggest lead with 5:20 remaining, 65-56. The Seminoles have won nine consecutive overtime games, including two this season. Their last OT loss came against Iowa in December 2016.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Wyatt Wilkes scored 19 points and No. 5 Florida State held off Notre Dame 85-84 for its 10th straight victory. Wilkes drilled 5 of 6 from 3-point range and the Seminoles made 12 of 18 from beyond the arc. Florida State missed its last nine shots from the floor and Notre Dame nearly took advantage. The Fighting Irish had a few chances in the final moments, including Rex Pflueger's desperation 3-pointer that fell short at the buzzer. Trent Forrest and RaiQuan Gray each scored 13 points for Florida State, which has also won 10 consecutive home games. Prentiss Hubb scored 24 points, hitting 5 of 11 3-pointers, and John Mooney had 16 points for Notre Dame. Mooney pulled down just four rebounds, halting his streak of double-doubles at 12 games. Notre Dame shot 22 of 27 (81.5%) from the free-throw line. Florida State's Balsa Koprivica returned after missing four games due to injury. Leonard Hamilton's Twitter Account Gives FSU Fans A Peek Into His Personality

If you only see Leonard Hamilton on game day, you probably think you have an idea of who the Florida State men's basketball head coach is.

For the better part of the last 20 years, the FSU men's basketball coach has patrolled the sidelines during games with a rarely-changing facial expression.

Emotions at either end of the spectrum -- happiness or anger -- rarely escape from behind Hamilton's stoic facade. As such, one might think just from watching him in this setting that he can be unpleasant to be around and hates fun.

Ask those who know him best and this couldn't be further from the truth.

"I have a lot of friends that always ask me, 'How's coach Ham? He always looks so serious, like he's mad.' I'm like, 'He's the complete opposite,'" FSU sophomore Devin Vassell said of Hamilton.

When you're around him, he's always making jokes and laughing. He always tells us that, in the games, he needs to have a serious face because how is he going to be able to yell at us and be laughing and everything. I respect it." While Hamilton's gameday demeanor hasn't changed this season, he's begun to show supporters that other side of him a bit more through the use of his Twitter account @FSUCoachHam.

Hamilton has had the account since 2009, but until recently, he used it just to talk about his team and former players and celebrate their accolades.

That changed this school year as Hamilton has embraced the modern-day internet, beginning to share funny images and show fans the personality that many may not have seen much throughout his time in Tallahassee.

"I do feel that it's important for people to know that I do have a little personality," Hamilton told the *Democrat*.
"I'm not the focused, intolerant guy that they see, intense guy on the sidelines all the time. I have lots of fun with my players."

The first-such image dropped the day of FSU's 2019 football opener, Aug. 31. When FSU fans noticed the turnover backpack was no longer on the sidelines, Hamilton quote tweeted a photoshopped image of him holding up the turnover backpack with the caption, "I promised Willie (Taggart) I would take good care of it."

The timing of Hamilton's Twitter emergence has been in tune with the Seminoles' re-emergence as a program. FSU has been to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament each of the last two seasons -- just the second time that has happened in program history -- and won 59 of its last 62 home games.

The Seminoles saw their 10-game win streak snapped Tuesday at Virginia, but remain all but assured of making their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament this season. That would also be tied for the longest streak of tournament appearances in FSU history.

Because of this successful run, Hamilton knew the interest would be there for him to start having a little more fun on his account.

"Basically all my coaching career, I've been kind of matter of fact, business approach, low-key approach to developing programs. And I've always been the underdog in certain situations and programs I've had to build so we've had to strategically operate under the radar," Hamilton said.

"But in this new age of social media, this is a movement that youngsters and young adults or just sports fans have gotten into that people are always looking for information about who you are and what you're doing...

"Even though my whole career, I've been somewhat reserved and laid back, I feel a need for people to know about who we are, how we do it and allow our fans and supporters more of an inside look at who we are and what we do in our program. It's been fun trying to decide what's important for fans to know and to try to have a little fun with it as well. We've kind of gotten a kick out of some of the things that we've done. It seems to have drawn a lot of attention."

The funny pictures on Hamilton's Twitter have ranged from a Space Jam parody to old pictures of himself.

A common theme among many of the images and jokes is his age. Hamilton turned 71 last August, but is praised by everyone in the business for how he looks far younger than he actually is.

In November, Hamilton participated in the decade challenge, sharing pictures of him from 2009 and 2019 that show minimal aging with the caption, "I promise these photos are accurate. Told y'all about the Ham Sauce."

Hamilton's personal favorite tweet, however, is a picture posted in December of him at three years old. He's decked out in a full suit with an accompanying caption that reads, "I don't know why I'm not considered one of the best-dressed coaches in college hoops. This is me at 3 years old. I'm just saying. #Smooth"

"That picture says a lot about what my life has been about. That was a picture on a Sunday where my grandmother dressed me up because we went to church every Sunday," Hamilton said.

"If you look at that picture, you'll see from head to toe, I'm probably three years old dressed like a grown adult going to church. That was my grown-up look, my Sunday best clothes going to church... Because I'm dressed so elegantly, I want people to know that I've been dressing well for a long time."

Even as long as he's had his Twitter account, Hamilton's players still aren't entirely how he gets it to work given his technical expertise.

But they're ok with the fact that the rest of the world is finally starting to see the full version of the coach they've known since they were recruits.

"Half the time he doesn't even know what's going on on Twitter, but he somehow tweets out stuff," FSU point guard Trent Forrest said.

"People have him all messed up because he's a hilarious guy. Everybody, they see him on game day and on TV and they see just the stern face, but coach Ham is hilarious."

The Unconquered Spirit of Trent Forrest

Imagine racing around on a hardwood basketball court, dribbling the ball at top speed and trying to beat players to the basket while experiencing excruciating pain in your big toe. Now think about doing that in 31 more games, over 900 minutes of playing time against elite talent in America's top basketball conference---the Atlantic Coast Conference---with that big toe throbbing all the time.

Got the picture? Then you are looking at FSU's Trent Forrest who coach Leonard Hamilton says: "represents what the Unconquered Spirit means." Playing with a bum toe last year Forrest averaged 9.3 points, had 138 assists and 69 steals in 37 games.

It is no wonder that a healthy Forrest's return as a senior leader precipitates high expectations that 2019-20 will be a stellar season for Florida State basketball.

Asked about his leadership role Coach Hamilton explains that it is a no-brainer: "Trent has always had the same role he had as a freshman. He came here as a leader and he displayed stronger, better and wiser leadership every year that he has been here. So, we are expecting more of the same."

In the 6th game of his junior season, playing Villanova, an on-court collision caused his big toe to bend way up, far beyond normal. It hurt a lot and at first seemed to be bad case of "turf toe" that was eventually determined to be torn cartilage. Every step hurt. Disdaining mid-season surgery that would have ended his season Forrest elected to play through the pain.

How could he manage that?

He says: "Kinda just wanting to play so bad for my teammates. I guess it's just a high pain tolerance is all I can say." Amazing! And the good news is, after off-season surgery, Trent is back, pain free and as he says; "ready to rock."

You gotta love the game to go through all that. It's obvious Trent loves basketball. As a baby, when his parents put different small balls in his crib he reached for the basketball.

Later, as a youngster he slept with his basketball every night.

Even though Forest grew up in the small town of Chipley, population 3,526, his talents did not go unnoticed despite playing in the state's smallest high school classification. When you score over 3,000 points the scouts will find you. He received offers from Georgia, Ga. Tech, Alabama, Wake Forest, Miami, Tennessee, Providence and Wichita State.

He elected to go to Florida State, just 86 miles from home via I-10, because he says: "I felt like I could relate a lot with the things Coach Ham was doing. It was just the relationship I had with the coaches. I was able to trust them, and they were able to trust me about things in their program and even things outside of the program."

Forrest says his biggest adjustment to college basketball was "the speed of the game and understanding the college game. It's more in-depth and teams are going to have scouting reports on you."

Four years later the Seminoles are looking to Forrest to lead a team that has made it to the NCAA Playoffs three years in a row. In 2018-19 Seminole Basketball had a sparkling, best-ever 29-8 record. This coming off two other stellar 26-win seasons that been topped only once (27 wins in 1971-72).

"Just that past experience, especially last year will definitely help me be a better leader this year," Forrest said.

Forward RaiQuan Gray, who played in 36 games as a freshman agrees: "Last year Trent was one of our leaders and we looked up to him. I feel like this year he will have an even bigger role. I think he will be a vocal leader who brings everybody together."

The late President Ronald Reagan once said: "There is no limit to the amount of good you can do, if you don't care who gets the credit." Except for the fact it was before his time the President accurately described Trent Forrest.

Coach Hamilton says: "Even though he scored close to 3,000 points in high school, he is such an unselfish player that he plays to win not to get statistics."

Even though he might not light up the scoreboard in his points column he does even better. Corey Clark explained on Warchant.com: "Forrest is one of those rare players who can dominate an opponent without taking shots. That's the beauty of his game. He puts his imprint on games in every way imaginable."

The basketball court is not the only place where Forrest makes an impact. Ashton Henderson, FSU's Assistant Athletic Director for Student-Athlete Development, says: "Trent hit the ground running when he matriculated to Florida State University. He has been doing everything with my office for community service. He constantly shows up for everything we have going on. He is there. I send him the text and he brings all the guys with him."

Henderson has been impressed with the way Trent relates with everyone and becomes just one of the group; "He's a guy who has all that attached to his name and seeing how humble he remains, his meekness and then he still remains so competitive on the court. He will speak to the janitor. He will speak to anybody who needs their day to be brightened. I have always respected that about him. Trent Forrest is somebody you want to model your program after."

Gene Deckerhoff, the Radio Voice of the Seminoles, for over 40 years calls Forrest "a tremendous basketball player" but is equally impressed with his off-court presence. "He's always got a smile when you see him. Not a moody kind of guy. His teammates love him. He's the real deal."

Forrest's upbringing accounts for many of his admirable personality traits. He grew up in a Christian home. His mother, Barbara Lee, is the pastor of *All Things New Worship Center* and Forrest played drums in the church. Both his mom and dad, Lester Forrest, played basketball for Chipola Junior College.

In the mornings when his mom got up at 5:30 a.m., Trent got up and started working on basketball drills. Then after school he worked out as well. That committed work ethic continues. This summer after having the foot operation, before he could walk around again, he would lift weights and practicing dribbling while sitting down. He was determined to be in shape when fall basketball practice rolled around.

The things he learned in the backyard, the playgrounds and high school gyms came with Forrest to college. Raquan Gray says: "Trent is a great driver. He is able to move around and find an opening and when he drives he sees everybody. You have to be ready."

In early 2018 the Seminoles were in possession on a 27-game home-winning streak against non-conference foes. That was in jeopardy in an ACC-Big 10 matchup with 19th ranked Purdue leading 72-71 when Forest caught a pass in the lane from Terance Mann, drove in and floated a shot into the basket with 5.2 seconds left to put FSU up 73-72. Not content to admire the shot, Forrest raced back down the court and stole a pass to seal the win and make it 28 in a row for FSU.

Those are the kinds of plays Seminole fans have come to expect from Trent Forrest. When the game gets tough Forrest rises to the occasion.

He said that he draws some strength from his coach when panic is about to set in: "In pressure situations you look over and Coach Ham has the same face he had at the beginning of the game. He is not showing any panic or

anything," Forrest said. "You get a timeout, in the crucial time and he is always calm and collected. You see that, and you know there is no need to panic."

Forrest is happy to be able to play basketball close to his home town where family and friends can come to the games. One favor he can do for his friends is to help keep the streak alive against their arch-rivals, the Gators. The Seminoles have won five in a row against them.

In 2018, a year that Forrest scored in double-figures 15 times, Forrest scored 13 points and had five assists in FSU's 81-60 win over Florida. "I definitely want to be able to say I never lost to the Gators. Winning that game gives me lots of ammunition to take back home."

Looking back on his college career Forrest feels like he has maximized the benefits and was able to give back. He is thankful that his scholarship made that possible. Forrest says: "The scholarship means a lot. You can't thank the Boosters enough because they are investing in the student athletes here. It's beneficial to people like me to be able to come here and chase their dreams."

Trent Forrest's scholarship was a sound investment by the Boosters for as Ashton Henderson said: "I am sure that Trent is going to be very successful and will make FSU proud."

After all he embodies the true Seminole Unconquered spirit.
